SETTING THE SCENE

OPENING DRAW

- Furman begins its 2025 season on Friday hosting Old Dominion at 5 p.m. from Paladin Stadium.
- 2025 is the 11th season of women's lacrosse at Furman and is the program's fourth in the Big South Conference.
- The Paladins and Monarchs are meeting for the sixth time in program history with Old Dominion holding a 3-2 lead in the series.
- Furman, however, picked up a 9-8 victory in the last meeting back in 2023.
- The Paladins were picked third in the Big South Preseason Poll with Anna Roser earning Preseason Offensive Player of the Year honors. Roser was a preseason All-Big South pick along with Sophia Buzelis.
- Furman is under the direction of first-year head coach Gail Wallach.

ORIGIN OF THE PALADIN

Furman University athletic teams were known by different names until the 1961 school year. The baseball team was "Hornets," the football team "Hurricane," and the basketball team "Paladins."

The basketball team was dubbed "Paladins" by a Greenville sportswriter in the 1930s. By vote of the student body, all Furman athletic teams became the "Paladins" on September 15, 1961. A Paladin is a knight on a horse and the recognized mascot of Furman University's athletic teams.

LAST TIME OUT

- Furman saw its 2024 season end with a 19-14 defeat to second-seeded High Point in the semifinals of the Big South Women's Lacrosse Championship on May 3, 2024 in Macon, Ga.
- The Paladins concluded the game with 18 draws and 10 ground balls.
- For the second straight game, Anna Roser scored seven goals to lead Furman offensively.
- Sophia Buzelis, who went on to win a team best seven draws, added two goals and Reynolds Hester dished out a career high three assists.
- Three different Paladins picked up two ground balls and caused one turnover apiece.
- In goal, Lily Rathbun, who also became Furman's single-season ground ball leader, and Sailor Henderson combined for nine saves.

THE SERIES

SCOUTING THE MONARCHS

- Old Dominion enters Friday's matchup with a 2-0 overall record following a 14-10 victory on February 9 at Wofford.
- The Monarchs opened the season with three straight matchups against Big South Conference programs after starting the year on the road against Longwood and Wofford.
- Old Dominion began its season on February 7 with a 13-6 win over Longwood.
- Megan Hopfensperger leads the team offensively with seven points on three goals and four assists.
- Callie Culhane has scored a team high six goals.
- Sydney Taylor is also tied with Hopfensperger for first on the team with four assists.
- Three different players have picked up three ground balls each this season and five have caused two turnovers apiece.
- Sarah Murrell has won a team leading 13 draws.
- In goal, Brynn Bowen has 12 saves, a .522 save percentage, and 6.29 GAA.
- The Monarchs are under the direction of third-year head coach Theresa Walton.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Furman and Old Dominion are meeting for the sixth time in program history.
- The Monarchs own a 3-2 lead in the all-time series, but Furman has won each of the past two meetings dating back to 2017.
- The teams are meeting for the first time since March 11, 2023 when the Paladins held off Old Dominion for a 9-8 victory in Norfolk, Va.
- Furman last hosted the Monarchs at Paladin Stadium on April 7, 2017 when the Paladins recorded another one goal victory, 8-7.
- Friday marks the third all-time meeting in Greenville, with both teams having captured one game apiece.

A LOOK BACK

- Hannah Dintino scored a hat trick, and Lily Rathbun made a career high 16 saves, as Furman held off a late rally to defeat Old Dominion, 9-8, on March 11, 2023 at the L.R. Hill Sports Complex in Norfolk, Va.
- Dintino netted her first hat trick of the season to lead the Paladins offensively while Paige Harman contributed two goals.
- Katelyn Sousa, Anna Roser, Reynolds Hester, and Sophie Shaw all scored once.
- Harman won a then-career high eight draws while seven different players caused one turnover.
- In goal, Rathbun picked up six ground balls to go with her career best 16 saves.
- Sydney Taylor paced Old Dominion with four points on three goals and one assist, and goalie Jenna Peccia finished with 11 saves and four ground balls.
- Furman held a 20-19 advantage in ground balls and 12-9 in draws.
- For the second consecutive game, Furman forced its most turnovers of the season after the Monarchs compiled 19.

KEY MILESTONES TO WATCH

- There are several milestones to watch for this season.

Sophia Buzelis

- Sophia Buzelis is in a three-way tie for seventh place all-time in caused turnovers with 41. She is four away from passing Haley Gray (2015-17) for sixth place. Former teammate Katelyn Sousa (2021-24) is the all-time leader with 62.
- Buzelis ranks eighth all-time in draws with 106. She is six from passing Morgan Franklin (2017-20) for seventh place. Former teammate Meagan Beal (2020-23) is the all-time leader with 185.
- Buzelis sits ninth all-time in ground balls with 79. She is two away from passing Maggie Friel (2015-18) for eighth place. Former teammate Lily Rathbun (2022-24) is the all-time leader with 152.

Andrea Fisher

- Andrea Fisher is 10th all-time in caused turnovers with 40. She is two away from passing Molly Marshall (2015-17), Morgan Franklin (2017-20), and current teammate Sophia Buzelis (2022-Present) for seventh place. Former teammate Katelyn Sousa (2021-24) is the all-time leader with 62.

Paige Harman

- Paige Harman ranks eighth all-time in points with 143. She is 18 points away from passing former teammate Sophie Shaw (2021-24) for seventh place. Abby Shields (2016-19) is the all-time leader with 237.
- Harman is fourth all-time in assists with 65. She is 17 away from passing Paige Gamble (2015-17) for third place. Hannah Demis (2018-21) is the all-time leader with 126.

Anna Roser

- Anna Roser sits third all-time in goals with 136. She is two goals away from passing Abby Shields (2016-19) for second place. Former teammate Hannah

Dintino (2020-24) is the school record holder with 151.

- Roser ranks fifth all-time in points with 173. She is two points away from passing former teammate Meagan Beal (2020-23) for fourth place. Abby Shields (2016-19) is the all-time leader with 237.
- Roser is fifth all-time in shots with 261. She is 16 away from passing Abby Shields (2016-19) for fourth place. Former teammate Meagan Beal (2020-23) is the school record holder with 333.
- Roser sits tied for ninth all-time in assists with Sophie Brennan (2016-19) at 37. She is two away from passing Grace Pollak (2017-20) for eighth place. Hannah Demis (2018-21) is the all-time leader with 126.

A NEW ERA IN FURMAN WOMEN'S LACROSSE

- Furman enters a new era in 2025 as Gail Wallach begins her first season in Greenville.
- Wallach was named the program's fourth head coach on May 6, 2024.
- She has compiled a 114-50 record over 10 seasons at Anderson (S.C.), Alabama-Huntsville, and Emmanuel (Ga.).
- Wallach was hired as the first-ever head coach at Anderson (S.C.) and led the Trojans to a 24-11 record over two seasons.
- She also started the women's lacrosse program at Alabama-Huntsville and her teams led the nation in scoring in 2016, 2017, and 2018.
- Wallach began her coaching career at Emmanuel (Ga.) and led the program for two seasons.
- Has also made stops in her career as head women's basketball coach at Rutgers University-Camden, Drew University, and Washington College.
- Wallach graduated from Kean University and has her MBA from the University of Phoenix.
- She was a three-sport performer at Kean and is a member of the Cougars' Hall

FURMAN IN SEASON OPENERS

- Furman is playing its 11th season opener in program history.
- The Paladins are 2-8 in season openers.
- Furman's last win in a season opener came on February 7, 2020, when it defeated East Carolina, 14-11, at Paladin Stadium.

FURMAN TABBED THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL

- Furman enters the 2025 season projected to finish third in the Big South Women's Lacrosse Preseason Poll.
- The Paladins garnered 62 points in the preseason poll, as voted on by the league's head coaches, for the third-place projection.
- Defending champion Mercer is picked to win the Big South in 2025 after receiving seven first-place votes for 79 points.
- High Point comes in second place with two first-place votes and 73 points.
- Wofford follows the Paladins in fourth place with 55 points.
- Radford is picked fifth with 41 points and Longwood is sixth with 35 points.
- Winthrop (7th, 26 points), Presbyterian College (8th, 22 points), and Gardner-Webb (9th, 12 points) round out the preseason poll.

ROSER NAMED BIG SOUTH PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Anna Roser was named the Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year on January 21.
- Had one of the most productive offensive seasons in program history in 2024 after setting a school single-season record with 66 goals while her 77 points rank second all-time.
- Was a first team All-Big South selection after leading the conference in goals and was fifth in points.
- Earned Big South Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors after scoring a single-game record nine goals, also a career high, in a 19-15 win over Kennesaw State.
- Scored two or more goals in all but two games and ended the season with seven goals in back-to-back contests against Radford and High Point.

TWO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG SOUTH

- Two Paladins received preseason All-Big South citations for the 2025 season, the conference office announced on January 21.
- Sophia Buzelis and Anna Roser were both named preseason All-Big South.
- Roser was also voted the Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year.

19 NEWCOMERS TO THE SQUAD

- Along with 13 returning players to a veteran roster in 2025, Furman will welcome a total of 19 newcomers providing depth and experience.
- The Paladins' 19 newcomers consist of 13 freshmen and six transfers.
- The newcomers are: Taylor Bank, Madigan Brewer, Lexi Elkin, Nadine Galiano, Reeve Goldstein, Sophia Harcus, Skylar Hilmer, Marin Hodor, Anna Kelly, Charlotte Kent, Sam Melville, Zoe Milmoie, Ally Moore, Josie Mundell, Lily Pons, Caroline Rudy, Caroline Smith, Lily Toole, and Rachel Ward.

PALADINS IN THE BIG SOUTH

- Furman is in its fourth season as a member of the Big South Conference.
- The Big South is the Paladins' third conference affiliate since the program began in 2015.
- Furman was a member of the ASUN Conference from 2015-17 and Southern Conference from 2018-21.

- Furman hits the road for the first time this season next Saturday, February 22 traveling to Kennesaw State for a 2 p.m. opening draw.

GAIL WALLACH

HEAD COACH
1ST YEAR • KEAN, 1998

Gail Wallach was announced as the fourth head coach in the history of Furman women's lacrosse on May 6, 2024.

Wallach comes to Greenville with a decade of coaching experience and spent the previous two seasons leading the women's lacrosse program at Anderson (S.C.) University in Anderson, S.C.

"I am honored to be named the head women's lacrosse coach at Furman University," said Wallach. "I would like to thank President Davis, Athletic Director Jason Donnelly, and the entire leadership team for entrusting me and our future staff in leading the program. It is a privilege to join a university with such an outstanding academic reputation and an athletic department that has unprecedented momentum and success.



"The Big South Conference is a highly competitive conference that is full of talented players and coaches. I am excited to be a part of it as we build relationships with our extraordinary student-athletes, serve and mentor their personal growth, and cultivate our winning culture. I want our student-athletes, their families, our alumni, and our campus community to be a part of and take pride in the program we begin building today. Go DINS," Wallach added.

Wallach guided the Trojans to a 24-11 record over her two seasons, including a 15-3 mark in 2024, an appearance in the South Atlantic Conference Tournament semifinals, and the program's first-ever Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) Poll Top-25 ranking. She was hired as the program's first-ever head coach in 2021 and promptly guided Anderson to a 9-8 record in 2023.

The Trojans had the league's top scoring offense in 2024 with 302 goals and sported seven all-conference performers, including the SAC Attacker of the Year, Alicia Cannon, and the SAC Freshman of the Year, Rayne Dobson. Anderson scored over 20 goals in a game seven times highlighted by a 24-1 victory over Mars Hill.

In 2023, Wallach led Anderson to a 9-8 record in its first year as a program that was highlighted a 7-3 mark at home. She coached three all-conference selections in Cannon, who was also voted the SAC Freshman of the Year, Hannah Thomas, and Jackie Tiongco. As a team, the Trojans ranked second in the SAC in clears and ninth nationally in NCAA Division II.

"We are thrilled to welcome Gail Wallach and her family to Furman as our new women's lacrosse head coach," remarked Furman Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics Jason Donnelly. "Gail is an experienced, successful, and dynamic head coach who has built and led multiple programs to record-breaking success. She shares our vision for the program and our values, and we look forward to seeing the Paladin lacrosse program achieve new heights under Gail's leadership." Wallach was hired at Anderson after also starting the University of Alabama in Huntsville program from scratch and leading the Chargers for six seasons. Under her leadership, Huntsville posted a 74-22 (.771) overall record and made an appearance in the Gulf South Conference tournament championship five times. UAH claimed the league's regular season title in 2017 and won back-to-back GSC Tournament championships in 2019 and 2021. The team posted a program-best 16-3 record in 2019 and captured its first-ever GSC Championship.

During her time at Huntsville, Wallach's teams led the nation in scoring in 2016, 2017, and 2018. She coached one Alabama Sports Writers Association Small College Athlete of the Year, three Gulf South Players of the Year, a trio of GSC Freshmen of the Year, a GSC Defensive Player of the Year, one GSC Top Ten Award winner, and 22 All-GSC performers.

Wallach began her coaching career at Emmanuel (Ga.) College and led the Lions for two seasons. She coached four all-conference selections and one All-American in 2014 after leading to the team to a 9-10 record and semifinal appearance in the National Women's Lacrosse League (NWLL) tournament.

She has also made stops in her career as head women's basketball coach at Rutgers University-Camden, Drew University,

and Washington College. Wallach mentored 17 all-conference selections during her basketball coaching career.

Before taking over head coaching duties at Washington, Wallach served as an assistant coach for the women's basketball and lacrosse programs.

Wallach graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from Kean University and earned her MBA from the University of Phoenix.

She was a three-sport performer at Kean and is a member of the Cougars' Hall of Fame. Wallach served as team captain on the women's lacrosse squad while earning All-NJAC honors. She was a two-time All-NJAC and ECAC selection on the hardwood and was also selected a Kodak/WBCA D-III All-American following the 1996-97 season. She is tied atop the Cougars' record book for single season scoring average and owns the school record for most made free throws in a season. Wallach also lettered in field hockey.
