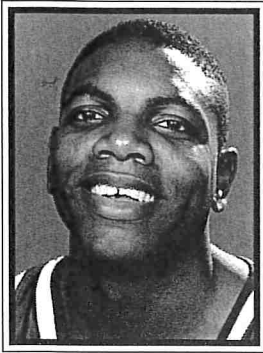

GENERAL: Experienced player who is expected will look to battled freshman Troy McCoy for backup work behind returning starting point guard...counts work as both a backup and starter during his tenure at Furman...joined the Furman program after transferring from Clemson following the 1990-91 school year.

AS A JUNIOR (1993-94): Saw action in all 28 games and gained 10 starts at point guard in his first full season of action in the Furman program...began the season as a backup at point guard but moved into the starting lineup four games into the season following an injury to starting point guard Bill Harder, who later transferred...started in 10 games before giving way to Anthony Smith...in all averaged 2.7 points and 2.4 assists per game...tallied a career-high seven points on three occasions...also notched a career high six assists in a 76-64 Furman win over Western Carolina in Greenville, and in a 57-55 decision over VMI in Greenville.

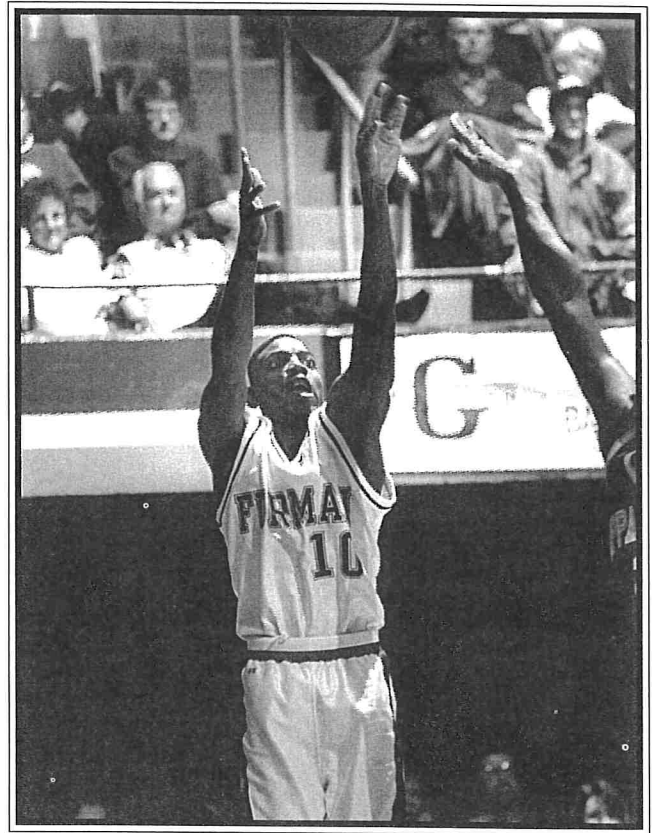
AS A SOPHOMORE (1992-93): Opened the season as Furman's starting point guard, but relinquished his starting job to freshman Bill Harder only three games into the season after sustaining a fractured right foot...fracture required surgery and the insertion of a pin...foot was casted, which sidelined him for the entire season...scored four points in 19 minutes in the Paladins' season-opening 100-75 loss to James Madison in Harrisonburg.

AS A REDSHIRT FRESHMAN (1991-92): Was ineligible for action due to NCAA transfer rules...did, however, practice with the team the entire season.

AS A TRUE FRESHMAN (1990-91): Averaged 1.2 points and 0.6 rebounds per game in 23 games at Clemson University...started in six games at point guard while at Clemson (all vs. Atlantic Coast Conference opponents)...starts came against Duke (twice), North Carolina (twice), North Carolina State, and Duke...scored a season-high seven points in 10 minutes of action against Samford in Clemson (96-56 win)...registered a season-high 25 minutes of action and scored five points in a 99-80 loss in Clemson to eventual national champion Duke.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Pincrest High School in 1990 following a fine basketball career...prep coach was Jerry Davis...earned his squad's Hustle Award his sophomore year and Pincrest's Most Valuable Player honor his senior year after averaging 18.0 points, 7.0 assists, and 5.0 rebounding per game...as a senior participated in the North Carolina State Game, playing on the North squad...was a starter all four years at Pincrest...also ran cross county and competed in track & field while in high school.

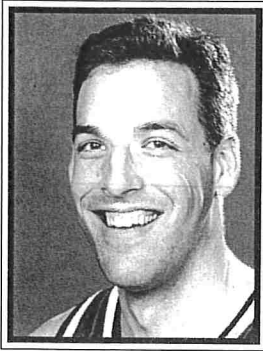

GENERAL: One of Furman's most experienced performers who is considered a big key to the Paladins' 1994-95 season...will likely start at center for the Paladins but could also see action at power forward...experience includes work at both positions and starting duty...will be counted on heavily for leadership this year...possesses a strong knowledge of the game and good offensive skills...will have to contribute big in the rebounding department this year due to Furman's lack of height on its front line...good passer who has worked hard in the off season in preparation for the season.

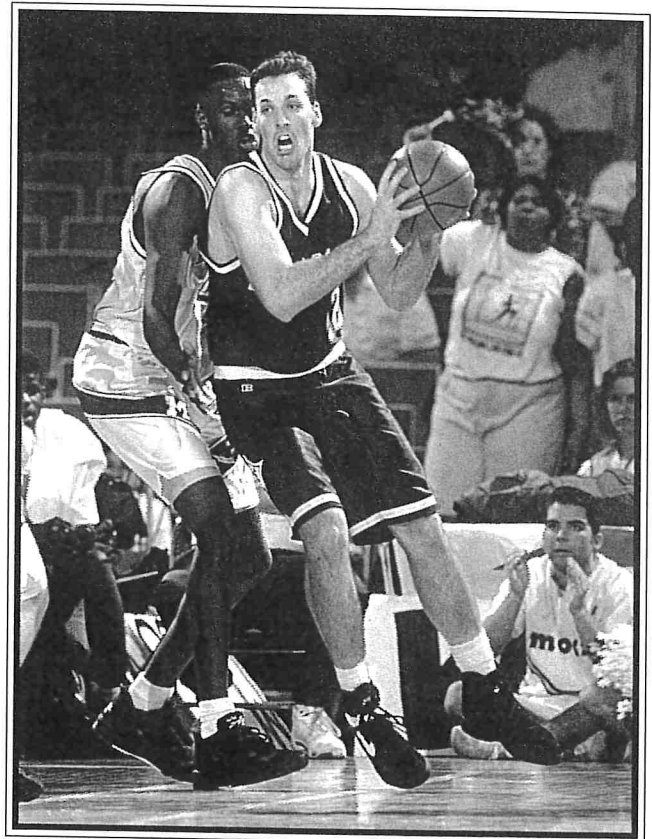
AS A JUNIOR (1993-94): Posted a solid junior season, earning nine starts at forward and averaging 8.2 points and 4.0 rebounds per game...starting duty was the first of his career and came in relief of Tazari Green...canned 8-of-16 shots and scored a career high 19 points in another career high 33 minutes of action in the Paladins' 71-63 win over The Citadel in Greenville...performance against The Citadel came in a non-starting role...scored a squad high 18 points in helping lead Furman to a 74-72 win over Appalachian State in Greenville...had a pair of 15-point performances against Marshall in Greenville (83-64 win) and Tennessee-Chattanooga (85-81 loss) in Southern Conference Tournament quarterfinal action.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1992-93): Registered playing time at forward in 25 of Furman's 28 games, all in a reserve role...averaged 9.2 minutes and 4.1 points per game...finest game of the year came in relief of injured starting forward Derek Waugh, when he canned 6-of-13 field goal attempts for a 12-point, 7-rebound effort in an 81-77 loss to Appalachian State in Boone.

AS A FRESHMAN (1991-92): Appeared as a reserve at center in 21 of Furman's 28 games and averaged 2.0 points and 0.6 rebounds per game...tallied a season-high seven points against both Samford (55-42 win) in Greenville and VMI (72-65 win) in Lexington...most productive performance, however, came in Furman's 103-94 win over East Tennessee State in Johnson City when, after coming on for a fouled-out Derek Waugh, he connected on 5-of-6 critical free throws in overtime to pace Furman to victory.

HIGH SCHOOL: Fashioned a brilliant prep career at Christian Brothers High School, where he lettered all four years under Bubba Lockett...landed team MVP honors in addition to all-region, all-district and honorable mention All-America accolades his senior year after averaging 26.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game, and leading his team to a district 1-AAAA runner-up finish...picked up MVP honors at the 1991 Coke-Wendy's Classic after pacing his team to the tournament championship.

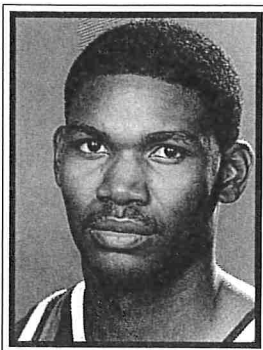

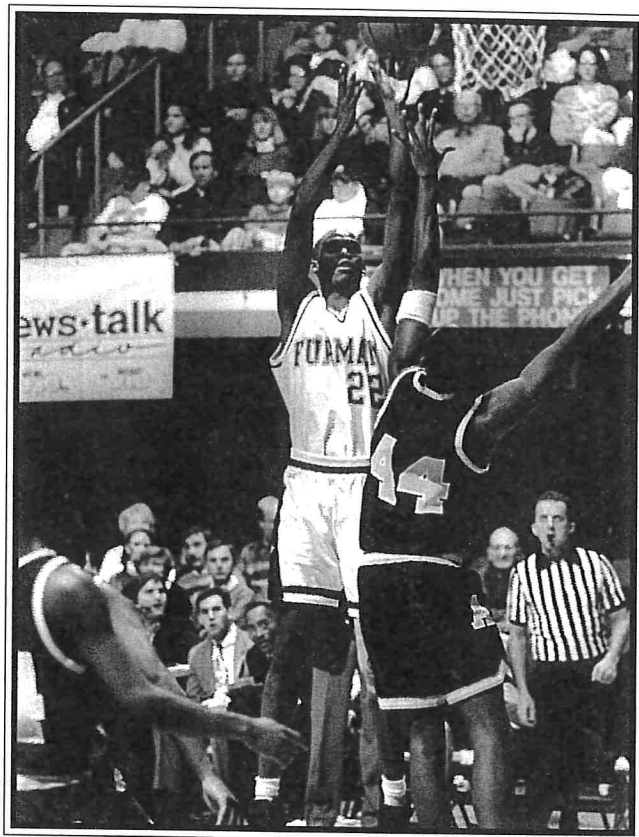
GENERAL: Talented left-hander who heads into the 1994-95 season locked in a duel with junior George Ward for the starting job at power forward...needs an impressive pre-season practice to reassert reputation as a key contributor, which was lost in a disappointing second half of the 1993-94 campaign...possesses the squad's best rebounding instincts and sports excellent shooting touch around the basket...rebounding ability is deemed critical to this year's squad...has good post defense ability...runs the floor well...will be looked to for increased offensive production this year.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1993-94): Began the season as Furman's starting power forward, where he performed impressively over the first month and a half of the season before being relegated to a reserve role behind Jeff Sexton, and later Steve Norton...hit on 9-of-10 shots for a career high 23 points in helping lead Furman to a 103-98 win over Charleston Southern in North Charleston...had 14 points in the Paladins' 85-70 win over Clemson in Clemson...in all had six double figure scoring performances in 13 starts...slumped at mid-season and thereafter served in a reserve role in 14 of Furman's final 15 games...in all averaged 6.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game...61.5% field goal percentage led team.

AS A FRESHMAN (1992-93): Displayed flashes of brilliance as a freshman, appearing primarily as Furman's top front court substitute in 25 games, and as the squad's starting center in three contests...three starts came at home against Georgia Southern (75-73 loss), Marshall (92-93 loss), and VMI (73-61 win) in place of regular center Brian Edwards, who was sidelined with the flu...made the most of starting opportunity, scoring 15 points against Georgia Southern in 29 minutes of action, nine points against Marshall in 27 minutes of playing time, and 14 points against VMI over 25 minutes...also hauled down nine rebounds in the win over VMI...in all averaged 12.7 points and 6.7 rebounds in his three starters...tallied nine points and had a season-high 11 rebounds in Furman's 95-71 rout of East Tennessee State in Greenville...scored 10 points and claimed eight rebounds in the Paladins' 76-51 victory over VMI in Southern Conference Tournament first round action...finished the season with the squad's highest field goal percentage (61.4%), and in all averaged 15.2 minutes, 5.0 points, and 3.3 rebounds per game.

HIGH SCHOOL: Enjoyed a stellar basketball career at Perry High School, where he played for Carl Thomas and averaged 14.6 points and 11.7 rebounds per game his senior year in helping lead Perry to a 21-5 record...earned All-Middle Georgia, All-Macon Metro, and all-state first team honors as a senior.

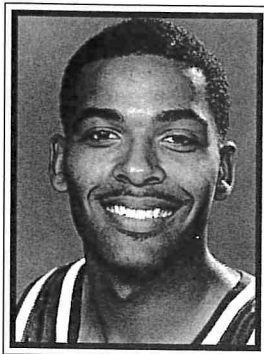

GENERAL: Solid, versatile performer who enters the 1993-94 season as Furman's returning starting point guard...joins second guard Pat Marshall, small forward Steve Harris, and power forward Jeff Sexton to form a contingent of four returning starters from a year ago...ranks as one of Furman's best athletes and is the squad's top outside shooter with outstanding range...performance at point guard this year should be enhanced due to almost full season of work at the position a year ago...hard-nosed player and excellent defender...joined the Furman program after transferring from Clemson following the 1992-93 school year...joins juniors Steve Harris and Jimmy Mason as one of three former Clemson signees now playing basketball at Furman.

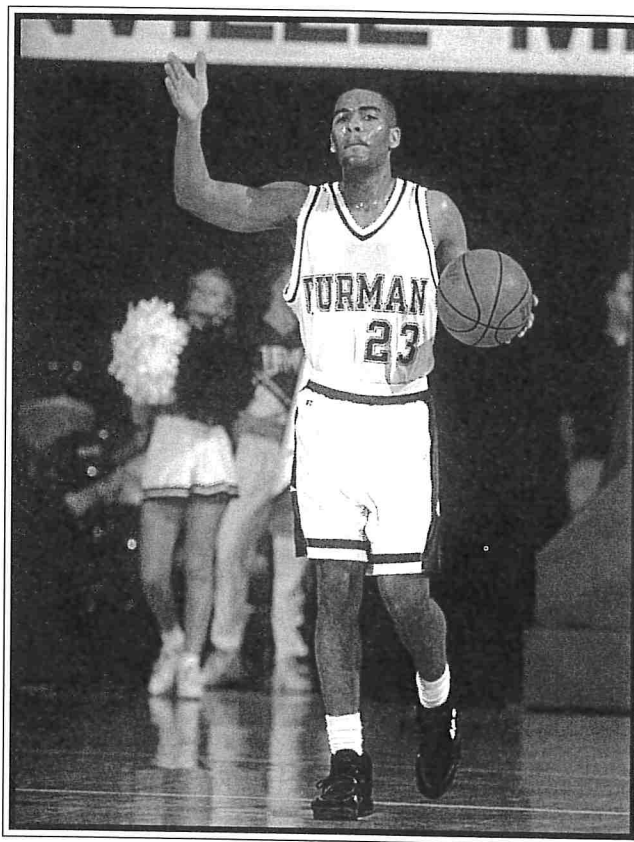
