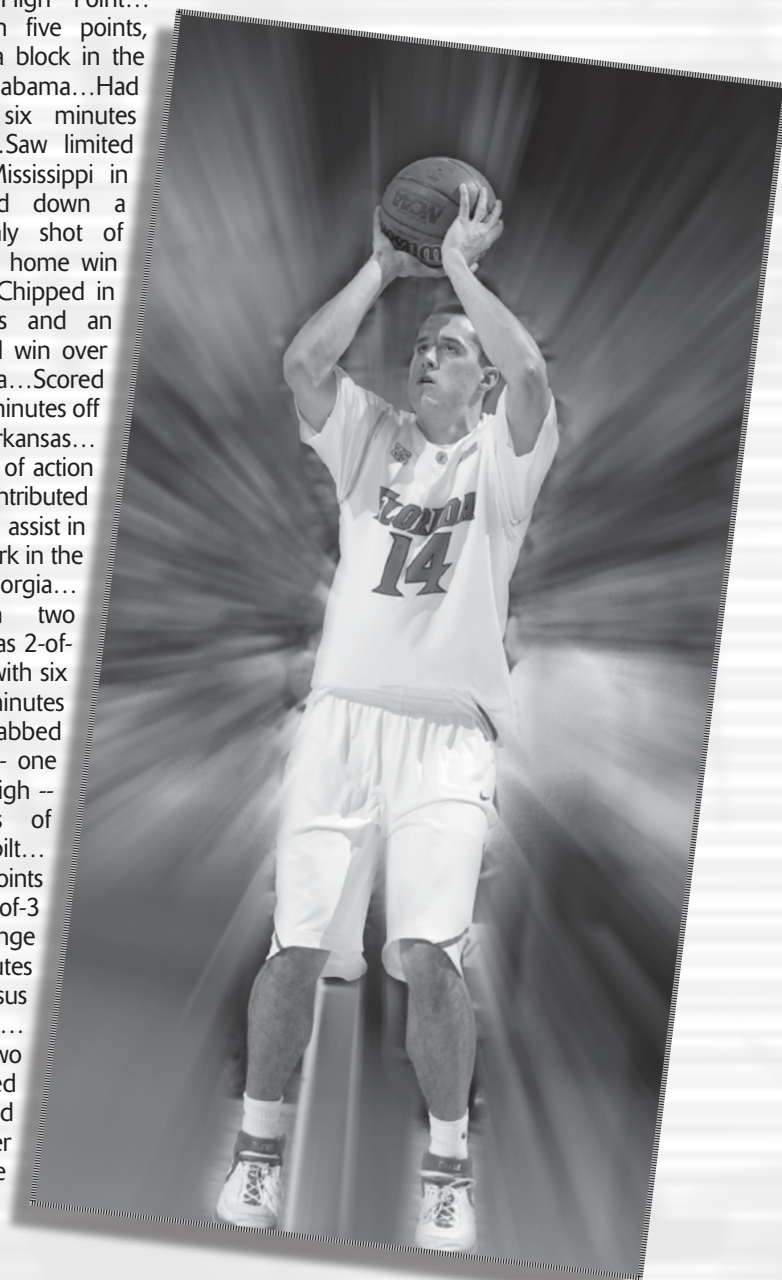

A versatile forward who can play either spot depending on whether the Gators are going bigger or smaller...Showed tremendous range his first year at Florida, hitting 42.1 percent of his attempts from three-point range, and 48.0 percent from the floor overall...A two-time *Pensacola News-Journal* Player of the Year and the runner-up for Mr. Basketball in the state of Florida to teammate Nick Calathes while in high school...Comes from a strong basketball background, his father Randy played collegiately at Florida State, in the NBA with the Sacramento Kings and overseas for seven years...**AS A FRESHMAN IN 2007-08:** Played in all 36 games his freshman year, averaging 4.0 points, 0.8 rebounds and hitting 42.1 percent from beyond the arc (second on the team)...Averaged 11.5 points per game during the exhibition season, shooting a team high 5-for-8 (.625) from three-point range...Recorded seven points in 13 minutes on the court against North Dakota State in the season opener, hitting 2-of-2 from three-point range... Scored 15 points against Tennessee Tech, shooting 6-of-9 from the field, including 3-of-6 from three-point range...Scored seven points and nabbed two defensive rebounds before fouling out against North Carolina Central...Shot 4-of-5 from the floor, tallying five points and two rebounds, in the win over Rutgers... Scored all nine of his points against North Florida in the second half, shooting 3-of-5 from beyond the arc, against the Ospreys...Also picked up his first career block and steal against UNF...Dished out

three assists, while scoring eight against the Seminoles...Shot 50% from the field, beyond the arc and at the free throw line for six points against Stetson...Saw limited playing time against Vermont... Made a three-pointer and snagged a rebound against Jacksonville...Scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-10 shooting, including 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, against Florida A&M...Saw limited playing time against Georgia Southern... Talled three points, while pulling down two rebounds and snagging a steal, in the win over CSU...Talled two points in 10 minutes at Ohio State...Saw limited time against Temple, playing four minutes... Finished with six points in nine minutes in the win over High Point... Chipped in with five points, a rebound and a block in the road win over Alabama...Had two points in six minutes versus Auburn...Saw limited action against Mississippi in Oxford...Knocked down a trey on his only shot of the game in the home win over Kentucky...Chipped in with four points and an assist in the road win over South Carolina...Scored five points in 11 minutes off the bench at Arkansas... Saw five minutes of action at Tennessee...Contributed five points and an assist in six minutes of work in the home win over Georgia... Knocked down two 3-pointers and was 2-of-2 from the field with six points in six minutes against LSU...Grabbed three rebounds -- one shy of a career high -- in 10 minutes of action at Vanderbilt... Erupted for nine points on a perfect 3-of-3 from 3-point range in only nine minutes of action versus South Carolina ... Contributed two assists and finished one 3-point field goal shy of a career high against the

Gamecocks...Saw limited playing time at Georgia, at home against Mississippi State and versus Tennessee...Recorded one rebound in seven minutes at Kentucky...Pitched in five points and a steal against Alabama at the SEC Tournament...Helped out with three points and two boards in the win over San Diego State in the opening round of the MasterCard NIT...Scored three points in the NIT second-round win over Creighton...Played four minutes in NIT quarterfinal at Arizona State...Scored four points in eight minutes of action versus UMass in NIT semifinal...**PREP:** Left Milton High School as the school's all-time leader in points (2,317), rebounds





rebounds, 1.8 steals and 2.8 blocks as a junior...He solidified his reputation as one of the top players in the state in 2006-07, averaging a career-best 24.7 points, 12.2 rebounds, 1.8 steals and 3.5 blocks per contest... Was a McDonald's All-American nominee in 2007...Was the MVP of the Glenn Academy (Ga.) Christmas Tournament (2005) and of the George Taylor (Ky.) Classic (2006)...At the George Taylor Classic, he set a tournament record, averaging 26.7 points per game...

**PERSONAL:** The oldest of four children, he is the son of Randy and Kelly Allen...His father Randy played basketball at Florida State and was a professional player for the Sacramento Kings and overseas for seven years...Two brothers, Brandon (15)

(1,200) and blocked shots (321)...The *Pensacola News-Journal* Player of the Year for 2005-06 and 2006-07...The runner-up for Mr. Basketball in the state of Florida in 2006-07 and the 4A State Player of the Year...He was the Milton High School Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2006-07... Earned first team all-area from his sophomore year on...Helped Milton High School to a 54-10 record of the last two years, going 27-6, winning the Region 1-4A Championship in 2005-06, reaching the state Final Four and finishing as the Class 4A state runner-up...Milton went 27-4 in 2006-07, reaching the Regional title game for the second straight year...Allen averaged 20.9 points, 10.2

and Drew (6) and a sister, Sydney (11)... Played high school basketball for Tim Short...A standout baseball player as well, he played first base and was a pitcher...His cousin, Ryne Jernigan, plays college baseball for South Alabama (began his career at Florida State)...Allen went up against Dwight Howard of the Orlando Magic when he was in the ninth grade and Howard was a senior and remembers the occasion as the first time he was ever dunked on (by Howard)... Player he admires most on the basketball court is Larry Bird...Enjoys hunting and fishing...Grew up on a farm in Milton and spends a great deal of his free time working on the farm, bailing hay and riding tractors...Born February 21, 1989.

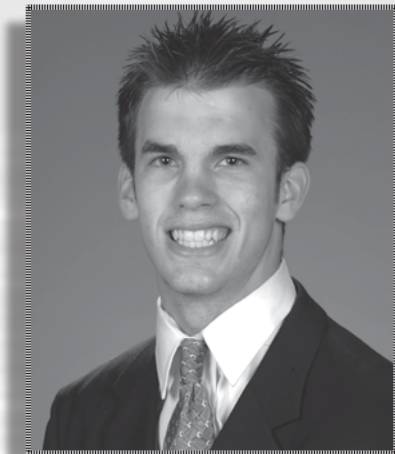

Enters his sophomore year after one of the most impressive debut campaigns in UF history...The SEC Newcomer of the Year and the SEC co-Freshman of the Year, Calathes led UF in scoring and assists...He broke UF's assists and assists per game marks and led the SEC in both categories as a freshman...Can play point guard, shooting guard or small forward and at 6-6 causes match-up problems... The fifth-leading returning scorer in the SEC this year...Earned MVP honors at the Chris Paul Camp in Winston-Salem in June among a group of 23 promising young college guards...Played for the Greek Under-20 National Team last summer...**ASA FRESHMAN IN 2007-08:** The SEC Newcomer of the Year and co-SEC Freshman of the Year (along with Patrick Patterson of Kentucky), Calathes led UF in scoring as a freshman with 15.3 points per game, the highest total ever by a Billy Donovan freshman...He set UF freshman records for points (552), assists (221), assists per game (6.1), free throws made (144) and free throws attempted (199)...Led the SEC in assists and assists per game, breaking the 20-year-old UF record for assists and the 25-year-old UF record for assists per game...A Second-Team All-SEC selection, he averaged a team-high 16.9 points per game in league play...Recorded just the second triple-double in school history on March 21 against Creighton (11 points, 13 rebounds, 11 assists)...An NABC and USBWA All-District selection...Scored in double-figures 31 times in 36 games as a freshman, leading UF in scoring 14 times

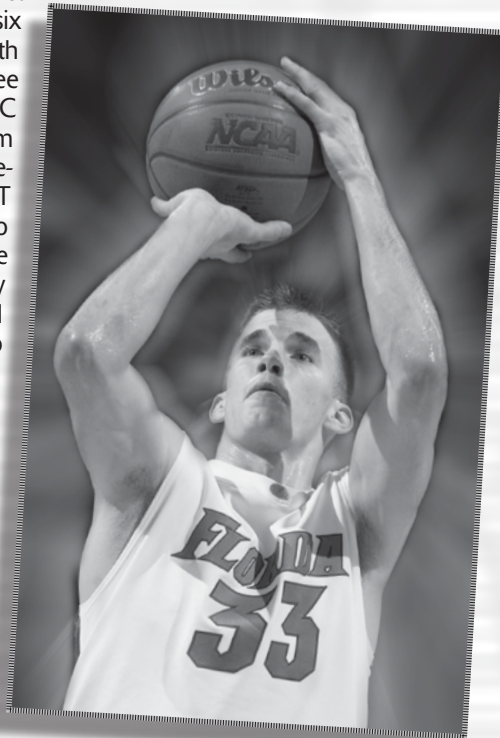


and in assists 30 times...Started all 36 games...Tied for the team lead with nine 20-point games, and had three double-doubles...Led the Gators with 60 minutes played and assists with 14 in two contests during the exhibition season, posting a double-double in the first game against Flagler...Led the team in scoring with 21 points in his collegiate debut against North Dakota State, shooting 8-of-15 from the field, while also snagging two steals and dishing out three assists... Handed out eight assists, to go along with 15 points and five rebounds, in the win over Tennessee Tech...Shot 7-of-14 (.500) to score 16 points, to go along with eight assists and four rebounds against North Carolina Central...Scored double-digits for the fourth consecutive contest, tallying 11 points in the win over Rutgers...Picked up six assists and rebounds, while scoring 14 against North Florida...Shot 3-of-9 from the field for seven points, to go along with four assists, against Florida State...Contributed seven points and assists, along with three steals and his first career block, in the win over Stetson...Shot 6-of-8 from the field, while sinking 9-of-11 from the free throw line,

for 21 points against Vermont... Marked a career-high with 24 points, shooting 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while dishing out nine rebounds and snagging six steals against Jacksonville... Talled eight rebounds and nine assists, to go along with 20 points and a block, against Florida A&M... Recorded a double-double in the win over Georgia Southern, totaling 15 points and 11 rebounds, including nine defensive boards and went 11-for-11 from the free throw line...Led all Gators in scoring with 18 points and nine rebounds, to go along with five assists, in the win over CSU... Grabbed four rebounds and tallied four points, to go along with six assists, in the Ohio State contest...Dished out eight assists while scoring 14 in the win at Temple...Hit 6-of-12 shots from the floor en route to a 15-point, six-assist, four-rebound night in the win over High Point...Powered the Gators to a win at Alabama in their SEC opener with a team-high 21 points, nine assists and seven rebounds...Tied his career-high with four three-point field goals in the home win over Auburn, finishing with 16 points and five assists...Shared team-high honors with 16 points at Mississippi, while also pulling down seven boards and pacing the Gators with five assists... Matched his career high with 24 points on the strength of a personal-best 13 free throws to lead UF to the home win over Kentucky and improve the Gators' record to 3-1 in the SEC...Flirted with a triple-double against the Wildcats, finishing the night with eight rebounds and eight assists...Poured in 21 points, including 13 in the first half, and dished out four assists in the road win over South Carolina... Registered his second career double-double with 15 points, a career-high 10 assists and seven rebounds at home versus Vanderbilt...Connected on 8-of-

11 free throws, all in the second half against the Commodores ...Scored a dozen points and chipped in seven assists and six boards at Arkansas...Nearly had a triple-double at Tennessee, registering 15 points, eight assists and nine rebounds...Finished with seven points and six assists in the home victory over Georgia...Scored 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting and added five assists and seven rebounds against LSU...Netted 11 points and contributed six assists and three steals at Vanderbilt...Scored a team-high 17 points, his highest output in seven games, with seven assists and three steals against South Carolina...Finished 6-of-11 from the field and 4-of-7 from the free-throw line versus the Gamecocks...Turned in a game-high 22 points – two shy of a career high – and contributed seven rebounds and four assists in road win at Georgia... Was an efficient 7-of-12 from the field, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range against the Bulldogs...Poured in 18 points, with seven rebounds and four assists, versus Mississippi State...Tied a career high with 24 points on 7-of-15 shooting versus Tennessee...Finished one assist shy of a double-double with nine, including seven in the first half, and was 8-of-9 from the foul line against the Vols...Registered 16 points and six assists at Kentucky...Finished with nine points, four assists and three steals versus Alabama in the SEC Tournament...Hit 7-of-11 shots from the field en route to a 16-point, five-rebound, five-assist night in the NIT first-round win over San Diego State...Treated the home fans to the second triple-double in school history against Creighton in the second round of the NIT, leading UF to victory with 11 points, a career-high 13 rebounds and a personal-best 11 assists...The performance was Florida's first triple-double since Corey Brewer turned the trick against Jacksonville on Dec. 18, 2005...Followed up historic performance with 11 points, nine assists and six rebounds in NIT quarterfinal win at Arizona State... Scored 12 points on a career-high 19 field goal attempts with seven

rebounds against UMass in NIT semifinal...**PREP:** A McDonald's All-American, a Parade All-American, Jordan All-American, the Gatorade Player of the Year and the two-time Mr. Basketball for the state of Florida...He became only the third player ever to win the Mr. Basketball award for the state of Florida twice...Left Lake Howell High School as the leading scorer in Seminole County History... Teamed with current Gator teammate Chandler Parsons to help Lake Howell to a 31-3 record and a state title in 2006-07 and reached the Final Four in each of his four years in high school...Averaged 27.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.6 assists per game during his senior year...The leading scorer in Lake Howell and Seminole County history and the third all-time leading scorer in Central Florida history... Played in the McDonald's All-American game in 2007, scoring 13 points, dishing out six assists and pulling down five rebounds...Also played in the Jordan All-American Capital Classic at Madison Square Garden...**PERSONAL:** The son of John Calathes and Dee McCord...Has two brothers, John and Pat...Played in high school for coach Steve Kohn... Committed to Florida as a sophomore.
