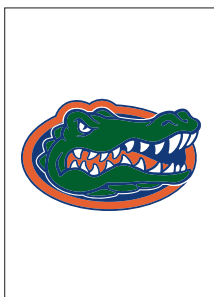

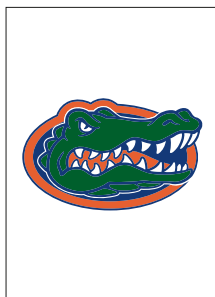

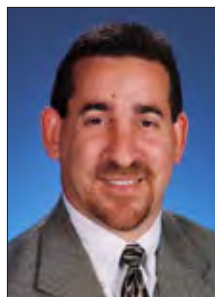

# JAN DOWLING

## UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA HEAD COACH

On June 15, 2009 Athletics Director Jeremy Foley announced Jan Dowling as the University of Florida's women's golf coach. Dowling enters her third year in Blue and Orange and is coming off the best team finish under lead after capturing a tie for 10th place at the 2011 NCAA Championships. She came to UF after spending one season as an assistant coach at Duke University and two seasons as an assistant at Kent State University. She also played as a professional for almost three years before entering the collegiate coaching ranks.

A 2002 graduate of Kent State, Dowling became the fourth full-time women's golf coach in UF history. She quickly got to work rejuvenating the women's golf program and with a first place finish at the 2010 Central District Invitational, brought the Gators their first tournament win in 16 events played. Florida claimed five top-five finishes in 2009-10



and only finished outside of the top-10 in two of its 12 tournaments. Under Dowling's tutelage, newcomer Isabelle Lendl was named to the All-SEC second team and the SEC All-Freshman team. The Gators excelled in the classroom as well, with seven student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Prior to joining the Gators, Dowling helped lead the 2008-09 Duke Women's Golf Team to a sixth-place finish at the 2009 NCAA Championships. She coached the Blue Devils to a team win at the NGCA National Match Play Championship in the absence of head coach Dan Brooks.

Following her stint as a touring professional, she returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach. She helped guide the Golden Flashes to their 10th consecutive Mid-American Conference (MAC) Championship with back-to-back titles in 2007 and 2008. She also guided individuals Kira Meixner (2007) and Kirby Dreher (2008) to MAC Individual Medalist honors.

Kent State maintained a top-25 ranking during Dowling's two years as an assistant and reached a school-record high of 13th. She coached two Golfweek All-Americans and three NGCA All-Scholar members as the Golden Flashes claimed five tournament titles during her time as an assistant.

In addition to her duties with the women's golf team at Kent State, Dowling assisted the men's team during the postseason in 2008, in which the team finished sixth at the NCAA Championships, its highest finish in school history.

From 2003-05 Dowling competed on the Futures Golf Tour and BMO Canadian Women's Tour, combining for six top-10 finishes. She also qualified for the 2005 LPGA Tour Canadian Women's Open. She won the 2000 Canadian Amateur and was named the SCORE Golf Canadian Female Amateur of the Year. Dowling was a member of the Canadian Team for the 2002 World Golf Amateur Championships and was a member of the Ontario Amateur Team in 1999.

Dowling was also a successful collegiate golfer while at Kent State. She was a member of the inaugural women's golf team at KSU and helped lead the team to four straight MAC Championships and three NCAA Regional appearances. She compiled five career victories with the Golden Flashes, second most in school history, and had a school-

record 25 top-10 finishes.

Dowling was the individual medalist two years in a row at the MAC Championship (1999, 2000). She was a four-time first team All-MAC selection and was named the 2000 MAC Player of the Year and the 1999 MAC Freshman of the Year.

Off the course, Dowling was just as successful, earning multiple academic honors. She was named to the Academic All-MAC Team three times, the NGCA Division I All-Scholar Athlete Team and the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV At-Large Team. Dowling was also a two-time member of the MAC Academic Honor Roll and was named a MAC Scholar-Athlete of the Week in 2001. In 2002, she was voted "Woman of the Year" at Kent State and received the Janet Bachna Award as the KSU Female Athlete of the Year that same season.

In the fall of 2007, it was announced that Dowling would be a part of the 2008 Varsity "K" Athletics Hall of Fame class. She was the first KSU women's golfer to earn that honor.

Aside from her playing career, Dowling is also an accomplished golf instructor. She has conducted numerous instructional clinics throughout the United States and Canada. She is a PGA of America Level I Apprentice and holds a Titleist Performance Institute Certification as a Golf Fitness Instructor (Level I).

The Bradford, Ontario, native participated in the hit reality television golf series Big Break III: Ladies Only, on the Golf Channel, in the fall of 2005. She holds a bachelor's degree in Leisure Studies from Kent State.

## UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA ASSISTANT COACH

On July, 21, 2011, University of Florida Women's Golf Head Coach Jan Dowling announced Thursday the hiring of former LPGA Tour player and collegiate All-American, Emily Bastel, as assistant women's golf coach. The Upper Sandusky, Ohio, native brings experience as a student-athlete, coach and professional.

Bastel joins Florida after acting as an instructor at The Golf Club at South Hampton in Jacksonville, Fla. Prior to her move to Jacksonville in July of 2010, Bastel served as assistant coach for Duke University's women's golf team during the 2009-10 season, filling the void left behind when Dowling accepted the head coaching job at Florida.



During her one season at Duke, the team finished third in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) and tied for eighth at the NCAA Championship.

"I've known Jan for many years. We played a bunch of college golf together," Bastel explained. "I know her passion for the game and what her goals are for the team. I feel like we will be able to work together very well and I'm happy and excited to work for someone who's so enthusiastic and has such great goals for the team."

Bastel, who played four years at Michigan State (MSU), was an NCAA All-American in 2002, a four-time All-Big Ten selection (1999-2002) and was the 2002 Big Ten Golf Athlete of the Year. She set the Spartan single-season record for stroke average at 74.81 during the 2002 season. She was a semifinalist at the 2001 U.S. Women's Amateur, played in three U.S. Women's Open Championships (2002, 2004 and 2005) and is a three-time Ohio State Women's Amateur Champion (1999, 2001 and 2003).

## COUGAR CLASSIC

### TOURNAMENT RECAP

University of Florida women's golf team captures third-place while Camilla Hedberg (Sitges, Spain) walks away with the lowest tournament total in school history at the 2011 Cougar Classic presented by Piggly Wiggly. Hedberg, who is golfing in her first NCAA tournament, finished tied for third-place individually with a final tournament score of 208 (71-67-70, -8). The Gators were consistent throughout the three-day tournament posting a final score of 856 (284-284-288, -8)

"We are starting to see what we can do as a team," head coach Jan Dowling shared. "Everyone has grown as players and people over the past year and we are out here to win. We gave ourselves a chance to win, and we would have liked to, but we are very happy about the way we started the season."

Hedberg, once again, put the Gators in good position with a score of 70 (-2) in the final round. Her 208 tournament total edges out Jessica Yadloczky's score of 209 at the 2009 UCF Challenge for tops in UF history.

"I'm very happy for Camilla to come out the way that she did," Dowling admitted. "She put herself in contention to win in her first tournament. Finishing third is a great accomplishment but I have a feeling we will see more from Camilla. I'm very proud of her."

Mia Piccio (Bacolod City, Philippines), a second-team All-SEC selection last spring, tied her low score for a tournament in Blue and Orange with a tournament total of 214 (71-72-71, -2). It also marks the second time in her UF career that she has shot under-par for an entire tournament. Piccio finished the tournament tied for 12th individually.

"Mia played a solid tournament. She felt like she left a few out there, especially with her scoring clubs, and she could have done better but to shoot at or under par every day is impressive," said Dowling

Evan Jensen (Belleair, Fla.) finished with a final round 76 (+4) giving her a tournament total of 219 (71-71-76, +3), her lowest total since the SunTrust Gator Women's Invitational last spring.

Isabelle Lendl (Goshen, Conn.), who played steady the entire tournament, carded a final round 75 (+3). She finishes 14-shots better than her 2010 Cougar Classic effort with a tournament total of 219 (71-73-75, +3). Lendl and Jensen both finished tied for 31st, overall.

Andrea Watts (Bradenton, Fla.) saved her best for last recording a final round 72 (E). She finishes with a tournament score of 229 (75-82-72, +13)

"We're excited to get back out and compete again but we will practice hard the next few weeks and will prepare to put ourselves in contention again," Dowling noted.

### TOURNAMENT NOTES

- 856 is the second lowest team tournament total in UF history.
- UF has opened the past two seasons with a top-three finish. Last season the Gators finished second in a shortened Labor Day Classic.
- Hedberg's second round 67 is tied for second in school history.
- With the first outing of the year, also comes the first top-3 finish, a feat that was accomplished only twice last season.

### TOURNAMENT RECAP

University of Florida women's golf team finished in 13th place at the 2011 Mason Rudolph Fall Preview. The squad shot a final round 306 (+18) and had a tournament total of 905 (+41). The Gators were led by senior Evan Jensen (Belleair, Fla.) on the last day of tournament who shot a three-over 75 to give her a final score of 228 (+12).

"Evan played well." Head coach Jan Dowling stated. "She wasn't striking the ball well but she figured out a way to put together a good score. She really worked hard today."

The 16th ranked Gators, who entered the final round in 11th place, have found some room for improvement in their games throughout the weekend.

"We could have played better," Dowling said. "We struggled with our short game today. We need to get better there and we will. It's no secret that we will be working on our short games the next few weeks."

The Legends Club, which will host the 2012 NCAA Championships next May, was the host of this weekend's Fall Preview.

"The biggest thing we can take from this tournament is our knowledge of this course," explained Dowling. "We had a chance to get to know this course and it should pay off down the road."

Freshman Camilla Hedberg (Sitges, Spain) finished tied for 22nd with a tournament total of 222 (+6) while junior Mia Piccio (Bacolod City, Philippines) carded a tournament total of 225 (+9).

Junior Isabelle Lendl (Goshen, Conn.) finished the tournament at 15-over and senior Andrea Watts (Bradenton, Fla.) ended at 22-over.

Dowling pointed out that the team isn't far from becoming a team that consistently performs at the highest level.

"It's encouraging to know that we aren't that far off. It's just a simple change of mentality. We need to know that we can score lower rather than hope we can score lower."

UCLA, the No. 1 ranked team according to Golf World/NGCA preseason women's coaches' poll, took home their first tournament win of the season, beating out second-place Alabama by six strokes. Lindy Duncan from Duke University captured the individual title with a tournament score of 212 (-4).

### TOURNAMENT RECAP

University of Florida women's golf team finished with their second top-10 finish of the 2011 fall season with an eighth-place finish at the 2011 SEC/PAC-12 Challenge in Knoxville, Tenn. As a team, UF posted a final round score of 296 to give them a tournament total of 893 (+29).

"We obviously came to win this tournament but a top-10 finish in this field is good," head coach Jan Dowling said. "Today was another OK day but it definitely wasn't because of lack of effort. Our team played hard the entire tournament."

Junior Mia Piccio (Bacolod City, Philippines), who added a team-best final round 72 on her birthday, played consistent throughout the tournament shooting a one-over 217 (73-72-72). Piccio finished the tournament in a tie for seventh place, her best finish since the Gator Women's Invitational last March.

"For Mia to finish in the top-ten in this field is great," Dowling pointed out. "I am proud of Mia's performance throughout the tournament. This should give her a lot of confidence going forward."

Freshman Camilla Hedberg (Sitges, Spain) had a bounce back performance on the final day to give her score of 223 (71-82-71, +7). Hedberg placed tied for 39th. Senior Evan Jensen (Belleair, Fla.) carded a final round 77 to give her a 54-hole total of 230 (+14) and put her in a tie for 70th.

Andrea Watts (Bradenton, Fla.) finished the tournament with a total 231 (+15) and tied for 79th place while Isabelle Lendl (Goshen, Conn.) finished 18-over (234) for the tournament.

# SUNTRUST GATOR WOMEN'S GOLF INVITATIONAL

The SunTrust Gator Women's Golf Invitational has earned a reputation as one of the nation's finest women's collegiate golfing events. 2012 will mark the 40th edition of this annual event. Since its beginning in 1973, the SunTrust Gator Women's Golf Invitational has consistently drawn top quality teams and players to Gainesville. As a result, several prominent golfers appear in the tournament record books, including three players who went on to earn Rolex Player of the Year honors on the LPGA tour: Nancy Lopez, Pat Bradley and Betsy King.

The tournament began as a two-day event and originally drew schools from the state and surrounding areas. In 1975, Gator Women's Golf Invitational was expanded to a three-day event but it reverted back to its previous two-day format in 2009. For 2012, the tournament will, once again, be a three-day event taking place March 16-18.

Last season, the team claimed its 17th SunTrust Gator Women's Invitational crown. They were boosted by three top-10 finishes. Evan Jensen, Isabelle Lendl and Mia Piccio all posted identical scores of 217(+7) that left them tied for seventh. The Gators have won the tournament seven times in the last 12 years.

It wasn't as easy as the year before, but UF took home the NCAA Championship trophy for a second straight year, matching Miami's back-to-back national titles in 1977-78. To add icing to the cake, Florida junior Page Dunlap claimed the individual crown with a one-stroke victory over New Mexico's Caroline Keggi and Arizona State's Michelle Estill. Florida fell three strokes behind intrastate rival Miami after the opening round, but moved into a tie with the Hurricanes after the second day and took a five-stroke edge into the final round. UF struggled on the front nine during the last day, but regrouped on the back nine to post an eight-stroke victory.

From 1981 to 1987, Florida Women's golfers claimed five of seven SEC Titles. Also during that reign, the 1983 and 1985 teams each came in second at the conference tournament. In addition, Florida golf teams brought home first-place hardware from two NCAA National Championships during the six-year span.



The 1984 Gators claimed the program's third SEC Championship with a six-stroke victory.



The 1986 team not only won the SEC Championship, but also claimed the NCAA Championship. The 1985-86 team still holds the school record for most tournament titles in a season (10). Karen Davies won the 1986 SEC Individual title as a sophomore.



The 1987 team successfully defended its SEC Championship with a two-stroke victory to earn back-to-back conference titles.



Florida's most recent SEC title came in 2008 at the Tennessee National Golf Club in Loudon, Tenn. The dominating 17-stroke margin of victory was the largest at the SEC Championship since Georgia won the crown by 18 strokes in 1999.

## UF ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

### KAREN DAVIES - 2000

- Came to the University of Florida as a freshman from England and would leave as one of the most decorated golfers in program history, a distinction she still holds to this day
- One of only six golfers in school history to win an SEC individual championship, which she accomplished in 1986 as a sophomore
- Three-time All-American who also helped the Lady Gators to two SEC team titles, in addition to being a member of back-to-back NCAA Championship teams (1985-86)
- Helped the European team retain the Curtis Cup twice from 1986-88

### PAGE DUNLAP - 1998

- Arrived in Gainesville in 1984, following her older brother Scott's footsteps to become a Florida golfer
- Made an immediate impact and was named a two-time All-American, while also being a member of two-straight NCAA Championship squads in 1985 and 1986
- Was an integral part of the 1986 Lady Gator golf team, the only team in the history of the program to win the state, conference and national titles all in the same season
- All-Conference selection and the first and only female golfer in school history to win an individual NCAA Championship in 1985
- Received the Broderick Award for golf in 1986, an award given annually to the nation's top female collegiate student-athlete in each sport

### MARY HAFEMAN - 1998

- Transferred to the University of Florida from the University of South Florida in 1977
- Named team captain and MVP two years in a row
- Twice ranked among the top-five amateur golfers in the country by Golf Digest
- Helped the U.S. Team retain the Curtis Cup in 1980 with a 13-5 victory over the Europeans
- Played professionally on the LPGA Tour until 1985 when injuries forced her to retire
- Was elected a member of PGA of America in 1987, becoming one of the few woman professionals in the country at that time
- Appointed Golf Director of the Ocean Hammock GC in Palm Coast, Fla. in 1990, where she is considered one of the top-50 female golf instructors in the nation

### DONNA HORTON - 1978

- Won the Tucker Invitational during her first season as a Gator and would follow the win with three more victories during the 1975 season
- Named to the U.S. Curtis Cup team (the female equivalent of the Walker Cup) in 1976 and the Horton-led United States team defeated the Europeans 11 ½-6 ½ to retain the cup
- Defeated Marianne Bretton to win the U.S. Women's Amateur Championship in 1976
- Went on to have a 15-year LPGA career before retiring in 1992 with more than \$900,000 in career-earnings

### SUZANNE JACKSON - 2006

- Named UF's Woman Athlete of the Year in 1974, while also earning team Most Valuable Player recognition twice
- Captured three collegiate tournament titles before graduating with a degree in journalism in 1974
- Became an instrumental figure at the LPGA, earning the rank of Director of Tournament Operations in 1984
- Was one of the first three women to officiate the U.S. Open Men's Championship, and she also served as an official at The Masters during her career
- Received the Patty Berg award, named after the founder of the LPGA and given in acknowledgement of her diplomacy, sportsmanship, goodwill and contributions to the game in 1996
- Prior to her passing in 1998, Jackson was widely regarded as one of the world's top experts on the Rules of Golf

### CHERYL MORLEY - 2009

- Member of the 1986 National Championship team
- 1988 SEC Individual Champion
- Member of the 1986 and 1987 SEC Championship teams and earned All-SEC status both years
- Played on the Futures Tour for two years and was inducted in the National Golf Coaches Association (NGCA) Hall of Fame in 2000
- Played two years in the U.S. Women's Open

### DEB RICHARD - 1995

- Only female golfer in school history to win multiple SEC titles, which she did three times in a row ('82-'84), winning all three by at least three strokes
- Helped the Gators to the SEC team title and won the U.S. Women's Amateur Championship in 1984
- Named the initial SEC Women's Golfer of the Year in 1985, her senior season
- Capped off her collegiate tenure by finishing second in the NCAA Championship and receiving the Broderick Award for golf
- Continued her success on the professional level where she has earned almost three million dollars during her 17-year LPGA career

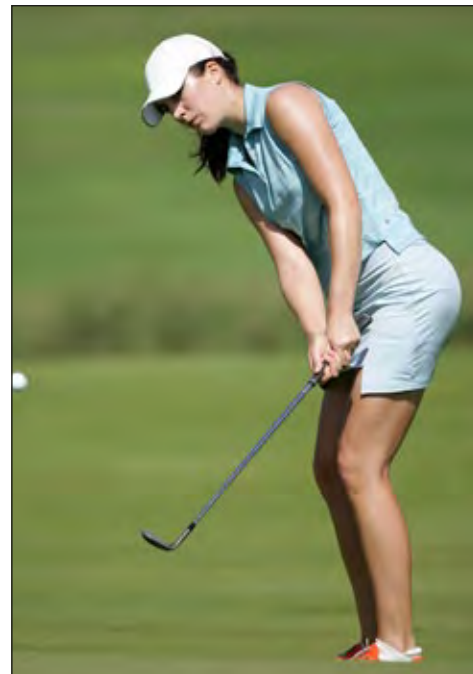

## FLORIDA'S AMATEUR SUCCESS

### SUMMER SUCCESS IN AMATEUR PLAY

During the offseason, members of the women's golf team used their free time to compete in amateur events.

Juniors Isabelle Lendl and Mia Piccio qualified for the 2010 United States Women's Amateur Championship as they each recorded top-five finishes in their respective sectional qualifying events.

Lendl—a member of the Southeastern Conference All-Freshman Team and a Second Team All-SEC selection last season—earned her spot in the field in qualifying played at The Ranch Golf Club in Southwick, Mass. She carded a 74 (+2) and finished in second place to cement her place.

Piccio, who has led the team in stroke average her first two years at UF, participated in the qualifying event at Sapona Country Club in Lexington, N.C. She overcame a two-and-a-half hour rain delay and registered a 71 (-1) to finish fourth and earn her spot.

The same duo also took part in the 108th North & South Women's Amateur, held at the par-72, 6,286-yard Pinehurst No. 2 in Pinehurst, N.C.—a single-elimination match play event in which 64 golfers compete head-to-head. Piccio advanced to the Round of 16, recording wins over Suzie Lee (South Carolina) 3 and 2, and Joy Kim (Virginia) before falling to Emma Lavy (Arkansas). Lendl made it to the semifinals, defeating Julie Carmichael (Indianapolis, Ind.) 3 and 2, Corrine Carr (South Carolina) 1-up, Lauren Greenleaf (Virginia) 6 and 4 and Marina Alex (Vanderbilt) 1-up before finally succumbing to the eventual champion, Cydney Clanton (Auburn) 4 and 3.

On August 1, 2010, Piccio won the Women's Trans Amateur Championship, located at the Country Club of Lincoln in Lincoln, Neb. by topping Agostina Parmigiani of Argentina 3 and 2 in the final. The Philippines native was the qualifying medalist, earning herself the number one seed in the match play bracket. She is one of 13 players in the history of the tournament to finish as a qualifying medalist en route to winning the title and was the first to accomplish that feat since Paige Mackenzie in 2005.

Former Gator Jessica Yadloczky and junior Evan Jensen teamed up from August 3-5, 2010 to record a fifth-place finish at the inaugural Hooters Women's Collegiate Team Championship, completing play with a 283 (-5). The three-day event, hosted at Achasta Country Club in Dahlonoga, Ga., featured 53 teams of two collegiate golfers from the same university. The opening round used an alternate shot format in which players alternated hitting the same ball. The second round featured a best ball format in which each player on a team plays her own ball throughout the round and the low score on each hole serves as the team score. The final round counted the aggregate score of each pair.

A week later, Lendl and Piccio qualified for the match-play bracket of the U.S. Women's Amateur after 36 holes of stroke play before dropping their respective first round matches.

While improvements and additions have been made over the years, this was the first full-scale renovation in 20 years.

The University of Florida hired Jacksonville-based architect Bobby Weed to head up the renovation and, along with an experienced staff, he constructed a course which is challenging for collegiate golfers.

Par at the course remained 70 after the renovation, but the yardage was increased to 6,701.

Some holes changed only slightly, keeping some familiarity, while others were completely redesigned to challenge golfers day in and day out. Both the men's and the women's golf teams host tournaments at Mark Bostick Golf Course in the spring.

The Mark Bostick Golf Course plays host to the annual Gator Invitational and Gator Women's Golf Invitational in addition to the yearly Gator Golf Day, where alumni and current PGA and LPGA Tour players return each year to give their time and money to continue the winning tradition of the Gator golf program. Various state tournaments and the SEC Championships have also been held at Mark Bostick Golf Course.

### COURSE FACTS :

- Located less than a mile from campus, the University Golf Course and the Guy Bostick Clubhouse, home of the men's and women's golf teams, is situated on 110 acres of heavily tree-lined, softly rolling terrain.
- The Lady Gator golf team plays the 18-hole, par-70 course to a length of 6,074 yards.
- The course went through a \$4 million renovation in 2001, which included new tees and fairway surfaces, 140-plus bunkers, triple-row irrigation and a newly-designed practice facility for the teams.
