Locally, more than dozen media outlets regularly cover the Gators. In addition to daily coverage from the local media, many of the state's larger papers such as the Orlando Sentinel, Palm Beach Post, Miami Herald, Ft. Lauderdale Sun Sentinel, Florida Times Union and the Tampa Bay Times cover the Gator teams. The UF Communications Department also helps student-athletes' hometown media follow the careers of Gators from their area.

### ESPN AND THE SEC: BRING CONFERENCE ACTION TO THE NATION

The SEC Network's debut in August 2014 brought 24/7 coverage of Southeastern Conference sports on the cable channel. The SEC-ESPN contract is set to run for 20 seasons, giving the conference unprecedented national exposure.

The Gator soccer team will make a league-high four appearances on the SEC Network during the course of the 2015 regular-season.

All 18 University of Florida soccer matches will be broadcast over the internet in 2015, while 14 also can be heard on ESPN 850 AM.

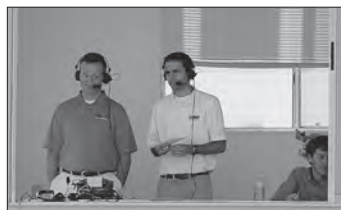

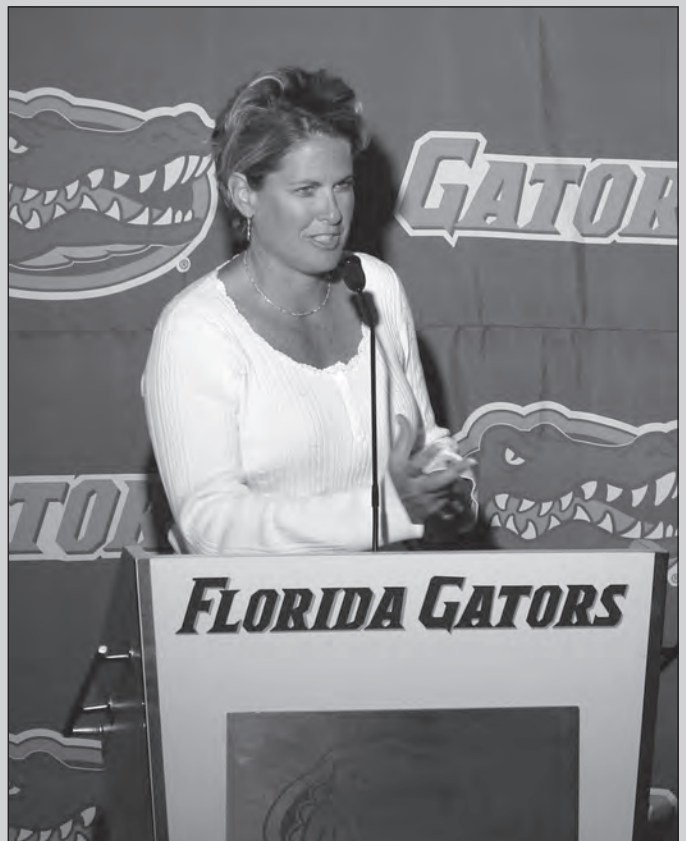

## HEAD COACH BECKY BURLEIGH



- **1998 NSCAA/ADIDAS NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR**

Few college coaches can match Becky Burleigh's ability to bring a team ready to challenge for each season's conference and national titles on such a consistent basis. There is no question that Burleigh stunned the soccer community when the Florida program she started in 1995 claimed the 1998 NCAA crown in just its fourth season of play. But focusing on that obvious achievement doesn't give due credit to the job Burleigh does year-in and year-out as a tactician of the sport, developing players and promoting the sport at local, state and national levels.

In 20 seasons at the helm of the UF soccer team, Burleigh, 47, has led UF to a NCAA Championship, two NCAA College Cup appearances, 13 Southeastern Conference titles and 18 NCAA Championships berths. Along the way, Burleigh picked up National (1998) and SEC Coach of the Year (2012, '10, '08, '00 & '96) honors. Her career winning percentage of 77.1 (436-117-36) ranks No. 4 among the NCAA Division I Active Coaches.

The 1998 season's culmination with a 1-0 victory over North Carolina for the NCAA Championship marked a remarkable job by Burleigh, as the program she built from its beginnings used a four-year fast track to the national crown. In 1998, Florida set season marks for best record (26-1), highest national ranking (No. 1), and highest NCAA Championships seeding (No. 2). Florida captured its third consecutive SEC Tournament title and advanced to its first-ever NCAA College Cup. By taking UF to the College Cup, Burleigh became only the second female coach to lead her team to the NCAA semifinals and the first to win the NCAA crown. Burleigh also received the 1998 NSCAA/adidas, College Soccer Weekly and Soccer Buzz National Coach of the Year awards.

Burleigh's Gator teams were overachievers from the beginning, setting impressive milestones each fall. After joining the Gator program in June of 1994, Burleigh had just over a year to put together the first Florida soccer team. Burleigh used the time wisely, and the team that she introduced to the crowd of more than 4,400 at the James

G. Pressly Stadium on Sept. 2, 1995 was a squad that was ready to step into the challenges of NCAA Division I soccer competition. Burleigh's second Gator team made it known early that they were ready to take a spot among the nation's elite, defeating then-No. 9 Virginia, 1-0, the opening week of the 1996 season for UF's first win over a ranked team. Florida quickly jumped into the top 10 of every national poll -- a position it would hold throughout the 1996 campaign. The 1996 UF squad became the first of four UF teams (1998, '99, '00) to sweep through the SEC regular season and Tournament undefeated. As a second-year program, Florida was the youngest in the 32-team field of the 1996 NCAA Championship, reaching the NCAA quarterfinal and finishing the season ranked in the nation's top 10. The 1997 Florida team defeated three top-25 teams and although the Gators finished second in the SEC Eastern Division, UF did defeat SEC Eastern Division champion Vanderbilt to win the program's second consecutive SEC Tournament title.

In the team's sixth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, the Gators again advanced to the NCAA College Cup in 2001, falling 3-2 in overtime to eventual NCAA champion Santa Clara.

Those early successes have evolved into the Gator soccer team being a regular among the nation's ranked teams. Over the course of the program's 20 years, Florida has:

- 18 NCAA Championships' berths (1996-2001; 2003-2014)
- Two NCAA College Cup appearances (1998, 2001), winning NCAA title in 1998
- 13 SEC team titles (1996-2001; 2006-2010; 2012-13)
- 10 SEC Tournament titles (1996-01; 2004; 2007, 2010, 2012)

Last season, Florida advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinal Round and was second in the SEC. On the final NSCAA poll of 2014, the Gators held the No. 7 spot.

Prior to being named Florida's first head soccer coach, Burleigh coached the Berry (Ga.) College Lady Fury for five seasons

(1989-93), when she compiled an 82-23-6 overall record. During her five-year coaching tenure at Berry, Burleigh guided the Lady Fury to two NAIA national championships (1990 and 1993) and was also named NAIA National Coach of the Year during the same two seasons. Burleigh was named NAIA Regional Coach of the Year in her first season as head coach at Berry in 1989, when her squad finished as the national runner-up. At Berry, Burleigh compiled a 76.6 win percentage, as she lost only seven games to NAIA opponents during her five seasons of coaching the Lady Fury.

In 25 seasons of coaching, Burleigh has compiled an overall record of 436-117-36 (.771) and her 436 wins already places her No. 3 among Division I coaches (all-time and active) for career victories. Burleigh earned her 200th career win with Florida's 2000 SEC Tournament semifinal win versus Kentucky, making her the second-fastest active Division I coach to reach the 200-wins milestone. The 300th win came at Mississippi in 2007. With Florida's win versus Florida Gulf Coast in the 2012 NCAA Opening Round, Burleigh earned her 400th win. Her 26 wins in 1998 marks a career high in single-season wins.

Burleigh has coached 19 NSCAA All-Americans, 11 NAIA All-Americans, 40 All-SEC players, 124 student-athletes on the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll, five CoSIDA Academic All-Americans with seven honors and 11 student-athletes honored as NSCAA Academic All-Americans.

As a student-athlete, Burleigh played her collegiate ball at Methodist College in Fayetteville, N.C., where she was a four-year letterwinner. In her senior year, the Tarpon Springs, Fla., native served as team captain and was named to the All-South team as well as the team's Most Valuable Player from her goalkeeper position. Burleigh graduated Magna Cum Laude from Methodist in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in biology. In the fall of 1999, Burleigh was inducted into the Methodist Hall of Fame. She earned her master's degree from Georgia State University in 1993.

She was inducted into the USA South Hall of Fame in the spring of 2015 and the Methodist University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999.

Vic Campbell, 54, enters his 21st season in 2015 with the University of Florida soccer program. Campbell was elevated to Associate Head Coach in the spring of 2003 after serving as an assistant coach for the previous eight seasons.

As a member of the Gator staff, Campbell works primarily with the backline players, while also assisting in recruiting, workout planning and opponent scouting.

Prior to arriving at UF, Campbell served as an assistant under current Old Dominion Head Coach Joe Pereira for seven seasons at Methodist College (1988-94).

As a student at Methodist from 1981-85, Campbell was named the school's 1985 Outstanding Male Senior Athlete after lettering in tennis for three years and in soccer for four, a remarkable achievement considering he did not begin playing soccer until he was 18 years old.

After graduating from Methodist in 1985 with bachelor's degrees in business administration and accounting, Campbell worked full-time as a Certified Public Accountant in Fayetteville, N.C. In addition to working as a CPA until 1994, Campbell spent two years volunteering as a coach on the Methodist staff before becoming Coach Pereira's top assistant in 1988.

Campbell, who has been an assistant coach for the South Region Olympic Development team, also served as a staff coach for the 1993 and 1994 North Carolina Olympic Development state teams. He is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Prior to attending Methodist College, Campbell, the native of Seoul, South Korea, lived in Wahiawa, Hawaii, for several years before graduating from Ft. Campbell High School in Kentucky. He and his wife, Kerri, were married in April of 2001. Ty Landon joined the family on Nov. 8, 2002, surprising Dad who was with the Gator soccer team at the Southeastern Conference Tournament. Elyse Michele joined the family on May 17, 2005.

### ALAN KIRKUP

ASSISTANT COACH



Alan Kirkup, one of the NCAA career coaching wins leaders and a former Manchester United FC player, will be patrolling the University of Florida sideline as an assistant coach for his 10th season in 2015.

Kirkup taps a great deal of experience to Florida as both a player and coach. He began his career as a player for Manchester United from 1972-76 and has been coaching soccer at different levels for the past 27 years. Kirkup is 52nd on the NCAA Division I Coaches All-Time-Wins list with his 224-137-19 (.614) career record earned in his 18 years as a collegiate head coach.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for the men's soccer team at Eastern Illinois, helping bring them to the 1981 NCAA semifinal round. Kirkup moved on to be an assistant coach for men's soccer at Southern Methodist in Dallas, Texas, in 1985 and began to simultaneously work as the SMU women's head coach in 1986.

In 1989, he solely worked as head coach of the women's team and held the position until 1996. While at SMU, he took the women's program to six NCAA Tournament appearances, which included reaching the 1995 NCAA semifinal. He was honored as the Southwest Conference Coach of the Year in 1995.

From 1996-99, Kirkup was head coach of Maryland's women's team. While with the Terrapins, he took his teams to the NCAA Tournament every year, setting school records for wins in a season (19), winning percentage (.769) and wins to begin a season (14). The 1996 Terrapins reached the NCAA quarterfinal round, their best showing ever in the tournament.

Kirkup began working in the Southeastern Conference the following year, joining Arkansas as their head coach in 1999. He resigned from Arkansas in 2004 and returned to England where he was a physical education and sports teacher at the Buckingham School and Taunton's College in Southampton. He also served as a Southampton FC Academy Coach, working in community development.

Following his soccer career, Kirkup graduated from Loughborough University in Loughborough, England with a degree in physical education and sports science in 1981. He continued his education at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, earning a master's degree in physical education in 1982. Kirkup is the father of two children, Molly, a recent graduate of Maryland, and Stephen, who is in his fourth year at the University of North Carolina, where he is a member of the lacrosse team. He and wife, Anna, reside in Gainesville.

Before joining the Gators for the 2014 season, Flaherty spent three seasons at Sam Houston State as an assistant coach for

the Bearkats.

The Bearkats' goalkeeper Kylie Hambleton earned Southland Conference recognition in both her seasons under Flaherty. Hambleton was the 2012 Southland Conference Freshman of the Year after allowing 17 goals in 16 matches with six shutouts. In 2013, Hambleton was an All-Southland Conference honorable mention selection after turning in the league's second-highest number of shutouts (6) in league play.

Flaherty was drafted to play professionally for the New York Power of the WUSA and played for the Hampton Roads Piranhas of the W-League.

She was a three-year starter and an All-ACC selection for Clemson from 1994-97 before transferring to Florida to begin graduate school in 1998. Flaherty was the 1998 NCAA College Cup Defensive Most Valuable Player after leading the Gators to a pair of 1-0 wins in NCAA semifinal and championship match action. She was a U.S. National Team pool member from 1996 to 2001.

Flaherty served as volunteer assistant women's soccer coach at the University of Florida (1999) and LSU before becoming director of coaching for the Manatee Soccer Club in Bradenton, Florida, from 2000 to 2003. For the next 11 years, she served as director of coaching for the Rush Soccer Club, serving eight years in Virginia and three in Texas.

Her duties in Virginia Beach included seasonal training and game programming for individual teams, player development for competition in the Elite Clubs National League and training and game day coaching of individual teams and players.

Flaherty served as regional goalkeeper coach for seven years, traveling with regional teams to national and international soccer events. She also served as the Virginia Youth Soccer State ODP team coach.

She also has served as coach of the Texas Rush Soccer Club.

Flaherty received her bachelor's degree in psychology from Clemson in 1997. She is a doctorate candidate in the University of Florida's Sports Management program.

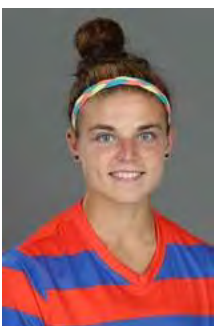

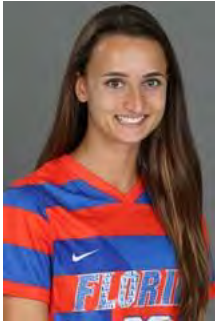

Long-time U.S. National Team standout Abby Wambach, the 2012 FIFA Women's Player of the Year, set the all-time international goals record with her 159th goal in a friendly versus Korea Republic on June 20, 2013. She has since pushed the record to 183 goals.

Wambach is one of four Gator Greats who are part of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL), which began its third season in March of 2015.

Tymrak was selected the NWSL's Rookie of the Year on August 20, 2013. She turned in six goals and four assists for FC Kansas City in 2013. She is the second Gator to be named professional women's soccer rookie of the year as Wambach claimed the 2002 Women's United Soccer Association (WUSA) honor.

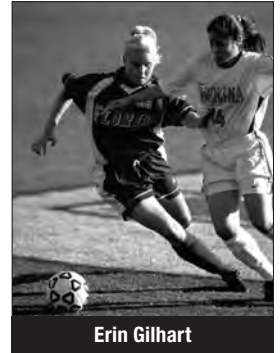

# NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The field for the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship expanded to 64 teams in 2001 after extending invitations to 48 teams in the three previous seasons. The 2015 field will be announced Monday, Nov. 9 with the first round of play set for the weekend of Nov. 13, 14 or 15. Campbell and the city of Cary will play host to the 2015 College Cup. The NCAA semifinal and final matches will be played Dec. 4 and Dec. 6 at the WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, N.C.

The University of Florida advanced to the NCAA College Cup in 1998 and 2001, claiming the 1998 NCAA Championship with its 1-0 win over North Carolina in the title match held in Greensboro, N.C. The Gators fell 3-2 in overtime to eventual NCAA champion Santa Clara in 2001 NCAA College Cup semifinal action held in Dallas, Texas. Florida has advanced to NCAA play 18 of the program's 20 seasons and has played host to tournament action for 16 seasons (1996-01, 2003-05, 2007-08, 2010-14).

# SEC SOCCER

Growing in popularity throughout the nation, women's soccer is one of the rising sports in the Southeastern Conference. The University of Florida won the SEC's first NCAA Soccer title in 1998 in just the fourth year of the program's history. The Gators also represented the league in the 2001 NCAA semifinals, marking the league's second NCAA College Cup appearance.

SEC women's soccer embarks on its 23rd year of existence in 2015 and has established its presence in the collegiate ranks. A league-record eight SEC teams advanced to the 2011 NCAA Championship and was equaled in 2014, with Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Missouri, South Carolina and Texas A&M advancing last season.

The Gators claimed a share of their league-leading 13th SEC team title in 2013 with a 9-2 record. UF has advanced to the SEC Tournament final 15 times, winning the title 10 times (1996-01, 2004, 2007, 2010, 2012).

The 2015 SEC Tournament makes its ninth appearance at the Orange Beach Soccer Complex in Orange Beach, Ala., Nov. 2-8. Teams seeded 7 and 10, 8 and 9 meet on Nov. 2 to play to advance to the eight-team SEC Tournament field. All matches of the SEC Tournament will air live on SEC Network with the final airing on ESPNU.
