

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Cassie Peoples scored all of her game-high 18-points in the second half in helping Florida earn a 53-49 victory against Alabama at Foster Auditorium on Thursday evening in the final regular-season road game for the Gators.

The Florida junior scored eight points, including back-to-back three-point-plays, during a crucial 21-10 run after Alabama took a 32-24 lead with 15:53 remaining in the game.

Peoples' second three-point-play gave Florida a 45-42 lead with 4:12 left.

Alabama's Karyla Middlebrook, who scored a team-best 15 points, came back with a bucket and tied the score. The Tide then missed the front end of a one-and-one but collected the offensive board. The Gators weren't able to corral the miss board but after another Alabama field goal went awry, Ronni Williams skied for the rebound and the Gators capitalized when Peoples sank the first of two impressive drives that resulted in layups within a 36-second span.

Alabama scored twice more and fouled the Gators immediately after both makes. Florida stepped up to the line and Williams converted both of her one-and-one tries with 14.8 seconds on the clock and Peoples capped the game's scoring with two at the line with 3.6 ticks on the clock

The victory marked UF's fourth SEC road win of the season and the became the first Gator squad to win as many away from the O'Connell Center since the 2005-06 Florida team won as many.

Alabama closed the first half on a 10-2 run and extended it into the second half where the Tide scored six straight points after Peoples scored the first points of the period and took a 32-24 lead.

Brooke Copeland ended Florida's three-point shooting drought that extended back to the February 19 game against Vanderbilt and started a 7-2 swing for the Gators, who closed within three points, 34-31, with 12:58 remaining.

The teams traded scorers for the next two minutes and with Alabaman holding a 39-33 lead. Ronni Williams sparked a run of six consecutive points for the Gators, who got two free throws from January Miller and a bucket from Peoples.

After a bucket from Alabama, Peoples produced a pair of consecutive three-point-plays and put Florida in the lead for good.

Florida led by as many as six points twice during the first half and Alabama always answered with a bucket that kept the Gators close.

After Carla Batchelor converted a pair of free throws with 5:44 remaining in the first half, Alabama drilled a 3-pointer 13 seconds later and ended the period on a 10-2 run to take a 25-22 halftime

Williams also recorded a double-figure scoring effort, netting 10 points with a game-high-tying seven rebounds.

Home Away from Home?

- This was UF's fourth road win of the SEC season.
- Four of the Gator's five SEC wins this year have come away from the O'Connell Center. The 2005-06 Florida squad was the last to earn four or more conference road wins in a

- After a Tigers free throw pushed the lead back to six points, Williams hit a layup, cutting the deficit to four points. She then collected a crucial offensive rebound and made a put-back layup to make it a two-point game with 5:26 remaining in regulation.
- Another offensive rebound from Williams set up a three-pointer for Christinaki, giving the Gators a 42-41 lead with 4:38 remaining and they would not relinquish the rest of the way. Christinaki capped the run with a steal and a layup at the 4:01 mark.
- Florida went on to make five free throws in the closing 32 seconds of regulation to seal the win
- News and Numbers of Note:
- The Gator win improved the team's overall record to 15-3, tied for the third-best 18game start in program history, trailing only the 16-2 record posted by the 2008-09 and the 2000-01 clubs.

Senior Cassie Peoples scored 18 points, junior newcomer Simone Westbrook added 14 and Florida nearly erased a 20-point deficit but its comeback fell short in a 97-91 season-opening setback against Temple at the Liacouras Center Friday evening.

There were 56 free throw attempts and 49 personal fouls called during the game and it was the Owls who took advantage of some of the new rules implemented in women's basketball this

hosts converted 28-of-35 from the line compared to the 12-of-21 effort by the Gators, who shot 52.2 percent (35-67) from the floor during the game.

Free throw differential aside. Florida rallied from down 84-64 with 7:21 remaining in the game and got as close as three points, 92-89, with 24 seconds remaining.

The Gators seemed to have a real chance at the comeback after Westbrook dropped in a floater that had UF within six points, 86-80, with 3:31 on the clock.

The Owls worked the shot clock and Feyonda Fitzgerald, who finished with a game-high 32 points, scored underneath before collecting a steal and Tanaya Atkinson, who added 20 points, converted the fastbreak layup and pushed Temple's lead back to 10 points, 90-80, with 2:48 to go. Peoples missed underneath for the Gators and Fitzgerald corralled the rebound

Junior newcomer **Tyshara Fleming** then stole the ball, as the Temple bench was assessed a technical foul. Peoples made both free throws and the Gators had the ball with 2:26 remaining and down eight, but turned the ball over.

Neither team could connect offensively for the next minute until Fleming knocked down a free throw with 1:35 on the clock. TU followed with a pair from the line before Fleming scored under the basket. Westbrook stole the ball and found Fleming, who had the Gators within five, 92-87, with 61 seconds remaining.

Temple again worked the shot clock and after a miss with 29 seconds, Westbrook added a layup and the Gators were with three with 24 seconds left.

The Owls converted 5-of-6 free throws in the final 24 seconds to seal the decision.

Six different Gators scored during the furious span, with three newcomers leading the way. Redshirt-freshman **Isis Young**'s first collegiate points came from beyond the arc and ignited a 25-8 spurt that began as a 16-2 march. Westbrook scored six points during the entire rally, Fleming came off the bench for an impressive game that resulted in eight points – five during the rally, five blocked shots, six rebounds, two steals and two assists in 18 minutes.

Westbrook led the run with six points, while Peoples added five, Brooke Copeland contributed a three-pointer and Ronni Williams converted one free throw.

Good Start by Florida, Better Finish by Temple

Florida led 22-19 after the first quarter and used an 8-2 run to start the second, as the Gators assumed a 30-21 lead with 8:27 remaining in the opening half. Carla Batchelor nailed back-to-back three-pointers and Haley Lorenzen put back a tough inside bucket during the spree.

Temple slowly chipped away at its deficit and with the Gators holding a 38-32 advantage ripped off 16 straight points and ended the half on an 18-2 march to take a 50-40 halftime lead

Game 2: Florida 82. No. 6/7 Florida State 72 November 16, 2015 * O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla.

Junior Ronni Williams posted a double-double, newcomers Eleanna Christinaki and Simone Westbrook added double-figure scoring efforts and helped Florida overcome a 15-point

deficit to knock off No. 6/7 Florida State, 82-72.

The Gators (1-1) found themselves down 18-9 at the end of the first quarter and then by 15 points, 24-9 and again 26-11, the latter with 6:49 remaining the second quarter before staging their rally that ranked tied for seventh biggest comeback victory in program history.

The last time Florida overcame a deficit of at last 15 points was on Dec. 28, 2013, when the

Gators regrouped from a 16-point hole against Georgetown and earned a 67-65 overtime win. No such extra frame was required Monday, when the Gators turned the fourth quarter into their best 10 minutes of the early season, outscoring their instate rivals, 31-15. During that final frame, the Gators shot a sizzling 72.2 percent (13-18) from the floor, had six assists to just three turnovers and collected five steals, three of those by the freshman Christinaki, who finished the game with a career-best 13 points, seven assists and four steals in 28 minutes of work.

Westbrook tallied eight of her 14 points during the final 10 minutes, while Williams scored seven point and collected five rebounds during the frame en route to posting a game-high 21 points with 10 rebounds for her six career double-double.

Dyandria Anderson scored all of her career-high nine points during that final period, when

she hit all four field goal attempts that included a three-pointer.

The Gators went into the locker room trailing at halftime, 38-29. They chipped away at their deficit by winning the third quarter, 22-19, and carried that momentum into the deciding fourth.

How it Happened

Williams converted an acrobatic layup 40 seconds into the third quarter that sparked an 8-0 run. Christinaki followed Williams' layup with one of her own, the collected a steal and found Haley Lorenzen underneath for two more. Lorenzen came up a block on the other end, Westbrook corralled the loose ball and Lorenzen ran the floor and put back an offensive board that had the Gators within one, 38-37.

The teams traded baskets and Florida still wasn't able to take the lead, as Florida State

eventually pushed its lead back to double-figures, 57-46, with 2:06 remaining in the third.
Redshirt-senior Carlie Needles countered for Florida when she launched a deep threepointer that bounced high off the rim and dropped in with 1:44 on the clock and Williams closed the

pointer that bothered high or the first and orloped in with 1.44 of the clock and williams closed in frame with another layup as the Gators were within six, 57-51, entering the final period.

Not only did that three-pointer by Needles start a momentum swing for the Gators, it also marked her 161st career trey that tied her for fifth all-time at UF with Steffi Sorensen (2008-10). Williams began the fourth with another layup before Adut Bulgak, who finished with 20

points and 14 board, countered and put the Noles back up by six, 59-53. That's when Westbrook and Anderson came alive.

Anderson found Westbrook on the wing, where she nailed a three-pointer. After an FSU miss, Anderson got on the board with the first two of the Gator's 10 fastbreak points in the fourth.

Christinaki came up with a steal and dished to Anderson who converted with 8:06 remaining and Florida took its first lead since scoring the initial points of the game.

The Gators and Anderson didn't stop there, as the UF sophomore went on a personal 9-0 run over a 1:14 span that turned a three-point deficit into a six-point lead with 7:11 remaining. FSU stopped the march, but Williams countered with a three-point-play and the momentum

swung quickly back toward the Gators.

With the teams traded points for the next few minutes and with UF holding a 72-67 lead, the Gators outscored the visitors, 10-5, and closed out the game with their first win against a top-10 team since defeating then-No. 6 Kentucky, 83-73, in Lexington on January 5, 2014.

inior Ronni Williams posted her second consecutive double-double to lead Florida past Kennesaw State, 84-57, in a non-conference victory Saturday evening.

The Gators (2-1) used their size and quickness to create easy baskets inside, both on the drive and in the post, helping them outscore the Owls (1-3) by 44 points (60-16) in the paint. Florida also converted its season-high 24 offensive rebounds into 19 second-chance points.

Williams posted a game-high 14 points—which came on a steady 7-of-14 shooting—and snared 10 rebounds to collect her seventh career double-double

Three other Gators joined her in double figures. That trio was led by sophomore forward Haley Lorenzen, who scored 12 points and made five of her 10 field goal attempts. Redshirt senior guard Cassie Peoples and junior center Tyshara Fleming finished with 11 points apiece for the Gators. In addition to her career-best scoring night, Fleming pulled down eight rebounds

How It HappenedAfter falling behind by four points in the opening three minutes, the Gators rattled off a 12-2 run, with six of those points coming from sophomore guard Dyandria Anderson, to take an 18-12 lead at the 3:17 mark of the opening frame.

Hitting 10 of their first 17 shots from the field helped the Gators keep pace with the Owls' solid offensive output in the opening quarter and start of the second.

The Owls hung around for the majority of the second quarter, keeping the deficit to single digits until the closing four minutes of the second quarter, when the Gators hit their stride and closed the half by making five of their final six attempts. That sharp shooting allowed Florida to take a 48-34 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Following a brief run by Kennesaw State, aided by an uncharacteristic UF scoring drought in the first four minutes of the third quarter, the Gators pulled away for good, never letting the lead shrink to less than 13 points after the midway point of the third.

From there, Florida would led by as many as 27 points on three different occasions before the final buzzer sounded.

Behind an outstanding defensive effort and yet another barrage of points in the paint, Florida notched its third consecutive victory, routing Savannah State, 99-34.

The Gators held the Lady Tigers to just 28.6-percent shooting and forced a season-best 39 turn-overs, 22 of which were the result of steals. Florida converted those miscues and takeaways into 49 points, tallying 24 on fast breaks. Mostly the result of layups off of turnovers and fantastic interior passing, UF outscored SSU 58-22 in the paint.

Junior Ronni Williams and junior January Miller scored a game-high 16 points apiece for UF, which posted the largest margin of victory in the **Amanda Butler** era that began with the 2007-08 season and was just four shy of tying the all-time program record. Williams also recorded a seasonhigh three blocks and snared 10 rebounds for her third consecutive double-double

Freshman **Eleanna Christinaki**, who made her second consecutive start, and junior **Tyshara Fleming** were the only other Gators in double figures. Both finished with 11 points, while Christinaki added six assists and Fleming corralled eight rebounds.

How It Happened

Florida got off to a roaring start and never looked back.

The Gators forced six turnovers in the first three-plus minutes, including three on consecutive possessions that sparked a 12-1 run and gave them a 15-3 lead. Five of UF's six made baskets during the run were layups. Moreover, Florida overcame a poor shooting start during that time, as it went on to make seven consecutive field goals after missing five of its first six attempts.

Savannah State cut the deficit to seven, but a three from Christinaki sparked a 13-3 Gators surge that carried into the waning moments of the first quarter.

Everything at both ends of the floor clicked for the Gators in a dominant second quarter. Florida did not allow a single point during the 10-minute second frame, when its defense forced the Lady Tigers into 14 consecutive missed shots and nine turnovers.

After leading 50-13 at halftime, the lead swelled to as many as 66 points by the 2:03 mark of the

Game 5: Florida 85, Ball State 79

A number of significant individual performances and clutch free throw shooting propelled the Gators to a thrilling 85-79 victory against Ball State in the first game of the 29th Omni Hotels Classic played at the Coors Events Center on Friday evening.

Florida trailed by as many as seven points, 77-70, with 3:22 remaining before ending the

game on a 15-2 run to win its fourth consecutive game and earn a spot in Saturday's championship against host Colorado.

Sophomore Haley Lorenzen scored a game and career-high 20 points, hitting 9-of-12 from

the field that included several outside jumpers

Junior Simone Westbrook sparked the Gators off the bench with a career-high 17 points, as she converted 3-of-3 from beyond the arc, as well as all four free throw attempts. During the final 3:22 of the game, Westbrook scored seven points, including consecutive scores that featured a three-pointer and a scoop layin after Carlie Needles stole an inbounds pass and dished to West-brook who had the Gators with two points, 77-75.

Needles, a redshirt senior from Highlands Ranch, Colo., approximately 46 miles from Boulder, scored all of her 13 points during the first half en route to a season-high scoring output. She also finished with a game-high four steals and a pair of assists.

Junior Ronni Williams finished with 12 points for her fourth double-figure scoring game of the

season and 36th of her career.

Sophomore Dyandria Anderson had a stellar all-around game and flirted with a triple-double, recording nine points, 10 assists and eight rebounds, all of which were career-highs. It was the first time a Gator has dished double-figure assists since Brandi McCain handed out 11 against Kent State on Dec. 29, 2001.

Anderson also was clutch from the free throw line down the stretch for the Gators, who converted a season-best 23-of-26. Anderson hit all four of her attempts from the line in the final eight seconds to seal the victory.

How it Happened

Ball State charged back and tied the score on two different occasions in the third quarter, the second time as late as 25 seconds remaining. Westbrook, however, nailed a three-pointer with seven ticks left and the Gators carried a three-point lead into the final frame.

The Cardinals charged out to start the fourth quarter. After Lorenzen knocked down a 12 footer, BSU went on a 13-3 run over the next 5:23 and took a 77-79 lead with 3:22 remaining. Lorenzen again hit a tough jumper with 3:01 remaining to stop the BSU spree and spark a 9-0

Anderson came up with a defensive board and found then found Westbrook on the other end where she nailed a three-pointer and had the Gators within two, 77-75, with 2:36 on the clock.

Anderson again limited BSU to one shot as she corralled her sixth defensive board. She also provided the assist to Lorenzen, who was the recipient of Anderson's great inside pass. BSU's scoring drought continued, as Nathaline Fontaine, the Mid-American preseason conference player of the year who finished with a team-high 16 points, missed inside, but got the rebound and the Cardinals called a timeout. Lorenzen stole the inbounds pass and Westbrook was fouled

and the Cardinais called a timeout. Lorenzen stole the inbounds pass and westbrook was fouled with 28 seconds remaining. She knocked down both tries and Florida took an 81-77 lead.

Renee Bennett cut UF's lead to two with a layup and BSU quickly fouled Anderson, who sank both free throws with eight seconds left that gave UF an 83-79 advantage. The Cardinals again missed and had to foul Anderson, who had come up with the rebound. Anderson made both from the line to close the game's scoring

Game 6: Florida 83, Colorado 61 November 28, 2015 * Coors Events Center * Boulder, Colo.

Florida overcame early adversity and relied on its depth to defeat Colorado, 83-61, and win the 29th Omni Hotels Classic played at the Coors Events Center on Saturday evening.

The Gators were plagued with foul trouble from the opening minutes of the game, but turned to its bench which produced in 52 points, paced by a team-high 14 points from **Cassie Peoples** and 11 from **January Miller**, who also collected six rebounds and dished three assists.

In spite of her foul woes – picking up two in the first 1:52 of the game - sophomore **Haley Lorenzen** was named MVP of the event, as she followed her career-high 20-point performance against Ball State on Friday with six points, a game-high eight rebounds with two blocks and two steals in the championship game.

Simone Westbrook also earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team, as she scored a career-best 17 points against the Cardinals and continued to lead the Gator's defensive charge that came through with 20 fast-break points against Colorado, which had won its home tournament 18 of the previous 27 years.

How it Happened

Florida survived a foul-plagued first half where its starting frontcourt of Lorenzen and **Ronni Wil-liams** were on the bench early – Lorenzen just 1:52 into the game and Williams with 3:23 left in the

The Gators still managed to build an impressive 21-8 lead by the end of the first frame, going deep

The fouls continued to pile up for the Gators, who were whistled for a total of 19 first-half fouls. Colorado, which collected eight personals, took advantage by converting 14-of-16 free throws during the second quarter alone, 16-of-18 for the half, to fuel a 25-18 advantage during the second 10 minutes of play and reduced a 14-point deficit to six points by halftime, 39-33

Miller was certainly the offensive key for the Gators during the first half, when she scored seven points, collected six rebounds and dished three assists in nine minutes. She was, however, one of six Gators who collected at least two fouls during the opening half.

It was Miller who began the second-half scoring and Williams followed with a three-point-play to give Florida a 44-33 lead

That's when Colorado ripped off a seven straight points and cut UF's lead to four points, 44-40.

Peoples entered the second half at the 5:37 mark of the third quarter and that's when the game began to shift in Florida's favor for good.

eoples scored five seconds after stepping on the court and stopped CU's run.

After the team's traded scores, the Gator senior stole the inbounds pass and dished to Lorenzen underneath. Lorenzen followed with another bucket that ignited a 12-2 spurt and Florida held a 58-44 lead with 2:46 left in the third.

After four points from CU that cut the Gator lead to 10 points, Peoples went to work again, scoring five consecutive points and the Gators were never threatened, closing out the fourth quarter, 22-13

Game 7: Florida 72, South Alabama 60 December 1, 2015 * Mitchell Center * Mobile, Ala.

Carlie Needles scored a game-high 15 points, sophomore Dyandria Anderson notched her the first double-double of her career and the Gators overcame a sluggish start to win earn a 72-60 victory against South Alabama at the Mitchell Center Tuesday evening.

Tonight's win, which was Florida's sixth straight, represented the 199th career victory for UF Head Coach Amanda Butler, who is in her 11th year overall on the sideline

Florida trailed the entire first half and was within one points six times in the first half but couldn't manage to take the lead, as South Alabama took a 34-33 halftime lead.

Ronni Williams, who finished the game with 14 points and 12 rebounds for her fourth doubledouble of the season and ninth of her career, scored the first four points of the third quarter and gave the Gators their first lead of the game and they never trailed again, as Anderson tacked on two more points as part of that initial run of the frame.

The teams traded scores for the majority of the third quarter and South Alabama was within two points on three occasions, the latest with 34 seconds left.

That's when **Simone Westbrook** converted a slashing layup ignited a 21-9 run that gave the Gators a 70-54 lead with 2:35 remaining the fourth quarter and Florida won its third consecutive road game in a five-day span that covered two different states.

Second Quarter Momentum

Florida picked up the pace in the second quarter, thanks to nine points from Needles, as the Gators hit 7-of-16 shots during the frame and held a 13-6 rebounding edge

Viktorija Dimaite hit an inside jumper in the paint with three seconds remaining in the half to end

The Gators struggled in the first quarter, when they shot just 21.7 percent (5-23) from the floor and trailed 20-12 to the Jaquars, who hit 50 percent of their shot attempts.

To outrebound them in the fashion that we did, honestly, we the story of the game for us.

Game 8: Florida 76, Arkansas State 72 December 7, 2015 * Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla.

In what was its lone home game in a five-contest span, sophomore Haley Lorenzen's outstanding night and timely baskets from redshirt senior Cassie Peoples gave the Florida women's basketball team just enough to top Arkansas State, 76-72, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Monday.

The victory, which marked the 200th career win for UF head coach **Amanda Butler** who is in her ninth year with the Gators, featured 11 tied scores and six lead changes.

Lorenzen finished with 19 points, the second-highest total of her collegiate career, draining seven of her eight attempts from the field. The lowa City, lowa, native also collected six rebounds, two blocks and a steal for a well-rounded stat sheet

Peoples provided 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting, with three of those baskets coming at critical junctures of the game for the Gators. Her final basket, a driving teardrop in the lane, gave Florida a four-point lead with 41.8 seconds to play and all but sealed the win.

Freshman **Eleanna Christinaki** reached double figures for the third time this season, recording 11 points – the final two coming from the free throw line with 15 seconds remaining that gave UF a 76-72 lead - three assists and two steals. Sophomore **Dyandria Anderson** was the only other Gator to score in double figures, as she tallied 11 points, snared seven rebounds, nabbed two steals and dished out two assists.

How It Happened

Florida went to work in the paint right away, scoring 16 of its first 19 points inside.

Arkansas State fought off small scoring spurts by the Gators and made it a thrilling final five-plus minutes of action in the first half. During that time, there were five ties and four lead changes, with the two teams battling to a 33-33 tie at the break.

It remained a back-and-forth affair for the opening three minutes of the third quarter, when the Red Wolves strung together a 14-2 run to nab a 51-39 edge.

Trailing by 11 points with 4:47 left in the third, the Gators rattled off 12 consecutive points, with Peoples' layup and three-point play capping the run and retaining the lead (53-52) for the first time since the 1:05 mark of the second quarter

Arkansas State eventually tied things up in the final 90 seconds, but two free throws from junior small forward Ronni Williams and Peoples' dagger in the paint allowed Florida to close out its seventh consecutive victory

The Gators used a 28-9 run from the end of the first half into the third quarter - a span of 6:06 that flipped a five-point deficit into a 14-point advantage, 67-53.

UW battled back with an 8-3 run and got within four points, 77-72, with 5:48 remaining in the game.

Simone Westbrook, who finished with a career-best 18 points to accompany six steals, five rebounds and four assists, halted the run with a bucket and Ronni Williams, who totaled four points with four rebounds before fouling out, hit a tough jumper inside and Florida was back up eight with

Freshman Eleanna Christinaki scored a game and career-best 21 points, as she hit 7-of-9 from the field, including her only three-point attempt, and 6-of-8 free throws

Cassie Peoples hit a season-best 20 points on 7-of-13 shots, including all five free throw tries.

Senior January Miller added 10 points that included the 800th of her career.

Florida scored the final four points of the first half to cut its deficit to one, 44-43, and carried that momentum into the second half where the Gators scored the first eight points and took a 51-44

After a three-pointer from Cayla McMorris, Florida continued its march when Peoples converted a three-point-play that started a 14-6 spurt and the Gators extended their lead to 67-53 with 4:19 left

Florida carried a 70-62 lead into the fourth quarter, where Wisconsin staged a comeback early, getting within five points before Florida stepped up at the free throw line where the Gators scored their final eight points of the game.

Overall, UF hit a steady 21-of-27 from the line.

How It Happened Florida's defense was the prevailing theme of the day, and it created the team's lead through the first quarter.

The Gators forced six turnovers in the final four-plus minutes of the opening frame, building a fivepoint edge (14-9) by the end of the quarter. Although Robert Morris turned in an efficient second quarter, the Gators made seven of their nine attempts, including a perfect 3-of-3 shooting mark from distance. Points came early and often for the University of Florida women's basketball team on Sunday (Dec.

20) afternoon, when a pair of significant 20-year-old school records fell in a 122-65 victory over Saint Francis in the first round of the Gator Holiday Classic.

The Gators scored 30 of the game's first 32 points, eventually going on to score 70 points in the first half and shattering the previous UF record for points in a half. The 70 points were also the most by a team in any half of a game in the history of the O'Connell Center, topping the previous record of 65 points set by the Gators against Lynn University back on Feb. 16, 1995.

Florida's 122 total points broke the previous school record of 112 points, which it set against Lynn and at Florida Atlantic back on Jan. 11, 1995.

Five Gators logged double-digit scoring efforts. That group was highlighted by junior center Tyshara Fleming, who scored 20 points, her highest total in a UF uniform. Sophomore forward Haley Lorenzen posted 16 points for her fifth double-digit scoring game of the year, and it also marked the first time this year she's reached double figures in consecutive games.

Cassie Peoples dropped 12 points on 5-of-10 shooting to score in double digits for the sixth time this season, a figure that leads the team.

How It Happened

Florida scored the game's first 15 points and knocked down nine of its first 12 baskets to race out to a 21-2 lead before the halfway point of the first quarter.

The defense was stellar as well. Through the first 8:26 of the opening frame, Saint Francis missed all 14 of its field goal attempts and were forced into 10 turnovers before making its first basket

Later in the half, following a steal and 3-point play by junior guard Simone Westbrook, senior guard Carla Batchelor finished a layup to make it 66-26, breaking the O'Connell Center record for points in a half

At the 2:41 mark of the fourth quarter, sophomore guard Brooke Copeland sank a pair of free throws to score the 112th and 113th points of the game to break the school's single-game scoring

The first half may have been a struggle, but Florida seized control of the second half to topple N.C.

State and capture its 20th Gator Holiday Classic title in the tournament's 25 years of existence.

Redshirt senior guard Cassie Peoples scored 14 of her 16 points in the second half, including an 11-point outburst that helped the Gators outscore the Wolfpack by 14 points (25-11) in the third quarter. For her efforts, Peoples collected her second Gator Holiday Classic Most Valuable Player award, repeating the honor she earned in 2013.

Freshman guard Eleanna Christinaki continued her solid debut season with a game-high 18 points on 6-of-9 shooting. The Athens, Greece native, who also earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team, has scored in double figures in four of her last five outings.

Florida's defense was tremendous once again, as it forced 30 turnovers, amassed 17 steals and held N.C. State to 35 percent (21 of 59) from the floor.

How It Happened

By the first media timeout, which came at the 4:26 mark of the opening quarter, the Gators had built a 14-8 lead. Their early edge was created by the defense. During that game-starting stretch, Florida forced seven turnovers and created five steals, laying the foundation for the team's 32 points off

Florida led by as many as seven points in the first, but N.C. State battled back and retook the lead with an 8-0 run late in the quarter. Junior guard January Miller's jumper with three seconds left in the frame gave the Gators a lead they would only relinquish once more

Following a second quarter that saw the two teams combine for 19 points, Florida opened the second half on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes of the second half. Peoples, who scored a mere two points in the first half, recorded nine of UF's points during the run.

A triple from redshirt senior guard Carlie Needles near the end of the third frame put the Gators up by 16 (52-36)—their largest lead to that point.

After going on to lead by as many as 18 points, Florida never allowed the Wolfpack to get within less than five points of the lead.

December 30, 2015 * Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena * Jacksonville, Fla Freshman Eleanna Christinaki just missed a triple-double and the Florida outscored UCF 34-17 in the third quarter en route to a 93-79 victory in the Southeastern Conference-American Athletic Conference Challenge held at Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena Wednesday evening.

In the Gator's non-conference finale, January Miller scored 15 points and led a very balanced offensive attack for UF, as five players scored in double-figures, with Christinaki adding 14 points, a career-best 10 rebounds and a career-high nine assists. Ronni Williams and Haley Lorenzen recorded 13 points each, while Cassie Peoples ignited a cold-shooting Gator team early in the second quarter and she finished with 11 points for Florida which won its 12th consecutive game.

Florida hit just 30 percent of its shots in the first half, but converted 53.7 percent in the deciding second. The Gators also sank 9-of-21 from the three-point arc, with Christinaki (1), Carlie Needles (2), Miller (3) and Peoples (3) each hitting from deep.

In the other game of Wednesday's SEC-AAC Challenge, No. 8 Mississippi State defeated No. 20 South Florida, 68-58.

How It Happened

UCF built a 22-15 lead over the first 10:42 of the game, but it was all Gators the rest of the way.

After calling a timeout just 42 seconds into the second period, Florida ripped off a 17-4 run that flipped a seven-point deficit into a 32-26 lead.

Zykira Lewis, who finished with a game-high 28 points, hit consecutive three-pointers and tied the game at 32 for UCF, before Cassie Peoples responded with a trey for the Gators and Ronni Wil-liams ended the half with one free throw and Florida carried a 36-32 lead into the locker room.

UF managed to sink just 30 percent of their shots during the opening 20 minutes, while the Knights started off blazing and cooled off to a 39.5 percent mark by the end of the half.

The Gators scored the first five points of the second half and after another three-pointer by the

Florida outscored UCF 34-17 in the third frame that was highlighted by a 14-0 run with scores from six different players as the Gators extended their lead to 62-41 with 2:43 left in the third period.

During the commanding third quarter, eight Gators scored, paced by seven points inside from Haley

UCF rallied in the fourth quarter and outscored UF, 30-23, but the Gators held on and earned their 12th straight victory after a season-opening loss. The streak is tied for the second-longest in program history.

Early shooting woes and turnover issues were too much for the University of Florida women's basketball team to overcome on Sunday (Jan. 3) afternoon, as it dropped a 76-70 decision to No. 8 Mississippi State in the Southeastern Conference opener for both squads.

The loss snapped the Gator's 12-game winning streak which was the second-longest run in

Despite making seven of its 16 shots during a furious rally in the fourth quarter when UF outscored MSU 25-16, the Gators went just 22 of 68 (32.4 percent) from the field. They also committed a season-high 32 turnovers, making it even more difficult to chip away at Mississippi State's lead, which swelled to 19 points early in the third quarter.

Redshirt senior Carlie Needles, who appeared off the bench for the first time all season, scored a season-high 17 points. **Ronni Williams** recorded her fifth double-double of the year, finishing with 11 points and 12 rebounds.

Haley Lorenzen and Tyshara Fleming snagged seven rebounds apiece for the Gators. All seven of Lorenzen's boards came at the offensive end of the floor.

How It Happened

With Florida struggling to make shots, it made good use of the free throw line. In the first quarter alone, the Gators made seven freebies on eight attempts.

Needles scored 12 of UF's first 22 points, but it was not enough to keep the team from facing a 42-26 halftime deficit

Much of the same continued in the second half. Florida's shooting remained cold, though its opportunistic play created plenty of chances to score at the charity stripe. By the end of the day, the Gators were 21 of 28 at the free throw line.

Midway through the fourth quarter. Florida's offense sprung to life. An 8-0 run cut Mississippi State's lead to nine (68-59) by the 2:54 mark. The Gators went on to trim the deficit to seven—twice. And a momentum-shifting three from Needles slashed the Bulldogs' edge to four points (72-68) with only 49 seconds left.

Game 17: Georgia 71, #20/21 Florida 61

January 14, 2016 * Stehpen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla.

The No. 20/21-ranked Gators fought for all 40 minutes, but cold shooting was too much for them to overcome in a 71-61 loss to Georgia at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Thursday night.

The Gators shot just 34 percent (23 of 68) from the field and only made 10 of their 22 attempts at

Redshirt senior guard **Cassie Peoples** scored a team-high 15 points, while junior forward **Ronni Williams** finished with a solid all-around game, logging 12 points and team highs in rebounds (nine) and assists (four). Freshman guard **Eleanna Christinaki** was the only other Gator to reach double figures, as she posted a stat line of 11 points, five rebounds and two assists.

After the Gators raced out to an early lead. Georgia took over and held a nine-point edge (19-10) by the end of the first quarter. A 7-0 run by UF—which featured a layup from Williams, a three from Christinaki and a layup by **Simone Westbrook**—cut the deficit to two, but the Bulldogs eventually took a 33-22 lead into the halftime locker room.

Although UF trailed by as many as 21 points late in the third quarter, it staged a furious rally to get

Down 46-25 with 3:28 left in the third quarter, Peoples and Haley Lorenzen scored 13 of Florida's next 14 points to make it an 11-point game with 8:55 remaining in regulation. A corner three from Peoples brought the crowd to its feet at the 6:08 mark, as her triple chopped the deficit to single digits for the first time since the 1:05 mark of the second quarter.

Florida pulled within five points inside the final 30 seconds of play before the Bulldogs trumped its comeback efforts, as Georgia converted 11-of-14 free throws in the final minute.

Propelled by a 7-of-12 shooting, 20-point scoring effort in the fourth quarter, No. 20 Florida defeated LSU, 53-45, Sunday (Jan. 17) afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Led by freshman Eleanna Christinaki's 11 second-half points, Florida took control of the game in the fourth quarter, outscoring the Tigers, 20-7, and knocking down 58.3 percent of their shots in the final 10 minutes of action.

Florida's 53 points, 19 field goals, 38 field goal attempts and 32 rebounds were all season lows. Nevertheless, they all came in winning effort

Christinaki finished with a game-high 15 points, while junior **Ronni Williams** finished with 11 points and nine rebounds. Sophomore **Haley Lorenzen** added six points and six boards, while senior Carlie Needles chipped in seven points.

How It Happened

The first three quarters consisted entirely of back-and-forth basketball, resulting in six lead changes. Neither team led by more than five points until the fourth quarter.

With LSU leading 40-33 at the 8:45 mark of the fourth quarter, Lorenzen's layup sparked what would eventually be an 11-1 run.

After a Tigers free throw pushed the lead back to six points, Williams hit a layup, cutting the deficit to four points. She then collected a crucial offensive rebound and made a put-back layup to make it a two-point game with 5:26 remaining in regulation.

Another offensive rebound from Williams set up a three-pointer for Christinaki, giving the Gators a 42-41 lead with 4:38 remaining and they would not relinquish the rest of the way. Christinaki capped the run with a steal and a layup at the 4:01 mark.

Florida went on to make five free throws in the closing 32 seconds of regulation to seal the win
