MARK BOSTICK GOLF COURSE

COURSE HISTORY

For more than 80 years, the Mark Bostick Golf Course has anchored the northwest corner of the University of Florida's Gainesville campus. Although the course was originally designed by renowned architect Donald Ross during the 1920s, it has evolved over the years to take on its own distinct personality, most recently completing a \$600,000 renovation in August of 2014.

Since 1962, the Mark Bostick Golf Course (formerly the Gainesville Golf and Country Club) has been home to the Gators. The Florida golf program moved into a new era in 2001, when it began playing on a fully renovated course. While improvements and additions have been made over the years, the \$1.8-million clubhouse renovation and a \$4-million course renovation in 2001 was the first full-scale renovation in 20 years.

The University of Florida hired Jacksonvillebased architect Bobby Weed to head up the renovation. With the help of an experienced staff, he constructed a challenging course for collegiate golfers.

Par at the course remained 70 after the renovation, but the yardage was increased to 6,701.

Some holes changed only slightly, keeping some familiarity, while others were completely redesigned to challenge golfers day-in and day-out. Both the men's and the women's golf teams host tournaments at Mark Bostick Golf Course in the spring of each year.

The Mark Bostick Golf Course plays host to the annual Gator Invitational and Gator Women's Golf Invitational, in addition to the yearly Gator Golf Day, where alumni and current PGA and LPGA Tour players return to give their time and money to continue the winning tradition of the UF golf program. The course has also hosted the Southeastern Conference championship, as well as various state tournaments.

COURSE FACTS

- •The Mark Bostick Golf Course and Guy Bostick Clubhouse (home of the men's and women's golf teams) is situated on 110 acres of treelined, softly rolling terrain.
- •A \$1.1-million clubhouse was completed in the summer of 1998 on the site of the original clubhouse, thanks to a donation from former UF student and Gator Booster Guy Bostick.
- •The course went through a \$4-million renovation in 2001, which included new tees and fairway surfaces, 140-plus bunkers, triplerow irrigation and a newly designed practice facility for the teams.
- •In the summer of 2008, the University Athletic Association spent \$1.8 million for renovations on the interior and exterior of the clubhouse. The updated clubhouse features renovated locker rooms for both UF teams with wooden lockers and a new team lounge area. New offices were added for the UF golf coaches and the pro shop, snack bar and public locker rooms were renovated and expanded. The new entryway features trophy cases that display UF golf championship trophies and highlight the program's success.
- •The Chris M. Kane Golf Practice Complex opened in the spring of 2012. The 56-by-32 foot state-of-the-art facility features fitness and club fitting/repair rooms, a putting lab and two separate, covered, hitting bays equipped with the latest swing analysis equipment.
- •The course went through a \$600,000 renovation in the summer of 2014, which included an overhaul of the putting greens, sand traps and team practice areas. The course now features state-of-the-art greens of Ultradwarf, a new turf that has become the standard for Florida putting surfaces. The renovation also resulted in re-sanded greens and friendlier shots at the flag, thanks to the removal of some trees in decline, plus some heavy-trimming of branches throughout the course.

PAR 4 - 376 YARDS

The course begins with a simple par-4 that offers golfers a chance for an easy birdie. A well-placed tee shot down the middle of the wide fairway will eliminate the large sand trap on the left from being a factor. The medium-size green is guarded by a series of traps to the right.





HOLE #2

PAR 3 - 176 YARDS

On the second hole, golfers face the first of five par-3s that are complicated by wind and overhanging trees. Water comes into play for the first time, and can play a factor in club selection. Although the green is large, it breaks sharply towards the water.



PAR 5 - 578 YARDS

At 578 yards, the third hole is Mark Bostick Golf Course's longest, and one of its most deceptive. A long drive toward the right side of the fairway will leave an uphill approach shot towards the two-tiered green.

HOLE #4

PAR 4 - 437 YARDS

The fourth hole has a wide fairway that bends toward the left. A tee shot placed on the right side will leave a difficult approach over the lining trees. There is plenty of open space to the right, which can present players with a difficult lie when the rough is high.



PAR 4 - 453 YARDS

This par-4 hole runs parallel to 34th Street, so a solid drive is crucial to avoid going out of bounds and to keep away from the trees on the left. The view from the tee box is obstructed by a short mound, creating a blind first shot.





HOLE #6

PAR 3 - 207 YARDS

This par-3 plays much longer than the 207 yards listed on the scorecard. Players need to be aware of the overhanging tree branches that can take distance off of a good shot. Balls that are hit too far will fall off of a steep hill that lurks in the back.



PAR 5 - 565 YARDS

The seventh hole begins with a downhill tee shot into a narrow valley that is guarded by bunkers to the left and trees to the right. Like No. 3, players will be faced with an uphill approach shot that appears closer than the distance listed. High mounds surrounding the small elevated green make this an ideal hole for an aggressive fairway shot and a possible birdie opportunity.

HOLE #8

PAR 3 - 191 YARDS

A large pond between the tee box and the green highlight this par-3 hole. The downhill tee shot adds another element of judgement into the mix here. The green is large and provides a safe surface for players to utilize.



PAR 4 - 379 YARDS

This short par-4 completes the front nine with an uphill climb toward a well-guarded green. The out-of-bounds area to the right can come into play on a windy day. A series of hidden traps to the right and left of the green make accuracy a crucial skill. The large tree on the left side of the fairway can also hinder an approach shot.





HOLE #10

PAR 4 - 418 YARDS

Players are faced with a difficult challenge on the opening hole of the back nine. The right side of the fairway is bordered by SW 2nd Avenue, as well as a large bunker. Precision becomes a factor on the second shot, when players are faced with the smallest green on the course.



PAR 3 - 145 YARDS

Yardage control is important on the shortest hole at Mark Bostick Golf Course. The turtleback green can cause shots to fall off into any one of the six surrounding bunkers.

HOLE #12

PAR 5 - 525 YARDS

This dogleg left requires a solid drive over the tree line for a clear approach shot. The green is reachable in two but will require a long iron uphill toward a raised green that is guarded by several bunkers in the front.



PAR 4 - 467 YARDS

No. 13 is a long par-4 that wraps around the driving range and teaching center. Trees were removed from the left side of the fairway during renovations to give golfers the impression of open space. The slight incline will test a player's ability to select the right club when approaching the green.





HOLE #14

PAR 4 - 371 YARDS

Depending on the location of the pin, players will have the option of going for the green from the tee or hitting to the safe area in front. Accuracy is key, as bunkers to the right and left guard the green and the slope on the back awaits stray shots.



PAR 3 - 198 YARDS

Pin placement will play an important part in how players approach this par 3. Designed to add distance to the course, this hole can play longer than the posted distance if the pin is in the back of the green.

HOLE #16

PAR 4 - 441 YARDS

The 16th hole was created during the 2001 renovation and uses an upward slant to create extra distance. The tee box is situated in the same location where the tee box for the fourth hole used to be. The green slopes towards the back, so players should try to place their second shot above the pin.



PAR 4 - 336 YARDS

During renovation, golf course designers incorporated several options for approaching the 17th hole. Players can reach the green with a well-placed drive onto the largest green on the course, or opt to leave it short for the simple chip. The fairway was intentionally widened to entice golfers to take a chance on reaching the green.





HOLE #18

PAR 4 - 438 YARDS

The final hole of the course runs uphill towards the clubhouse. A solid drive off the tee will leave for a short-iron onto a narrow green. There are many distractions surrounding this hole, including players going off on No. 1 and the practice green on the backside.

2015 TOURNAMENT RECAP

South Florida won the 2015 SunTrust Gator Invitational with a total score of 5-under 835. Bulls' freshman Claudio Correa took the crown in the individual competition, firing off rounds of 65-73-67 to complete the tournament with a 5-under 205.

The University of Florida finished the weekend in fourth place with a score of 14-over 854. Florida senior J.D. Tomlinson shot a 3-under 207 to earn a share of the runner-up position. Three Gators joined Tomlinson in the top 20, as Alejandro Tosti tied for 11th with a 4-over 214 and A.J. Crouch shot a 6-over 216 to earn a shared 18th spot. Competing as an individual, Ryan Celano tied for 15th with a 5-over 215.



HEAD COACH JC DEACON

Entering his second season as head coach, JC Deacon looks to expand on the success of his opening campaign with the Orange and Blue. Under his guidance, the 2014-15 squad placed fourth at the NCAA Regional Championship en route to qualifying for the NCAA Championships for the 51st time in school history. On the way to the postseason, Florida collected four runner-up performances.

In his initial year with the program, Deacon coached J.D. Tomlinson to spots on the PING Honorable Mention All-America Team, PING All-Southeast Region Team and second team All-SEC and led Alejandro Tosti to a place on the Freshman All-SEC Team. Under his watch, six Gators received SEC academic honors and two were chosen as Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-America Scholars.

Prior to his head coaching debut, Deacon served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, UNLV. A collegiate player for the Rebels from 2001-05, Deacon joined the UNLV staff in the spring of 2011 and helped the 2013 squad advance to match play at the NCAA Championships, where it tied for fifth. A pair of Rebels, Kevin Penner (2012 & 2013) and Derek Ernst (2012), earned All-America honors on his watch. Five Rebels collected a total of eight spots on the All-Mountain West Men's Golf Team under his guidance, with Ernst winning the 2012 Mountain West Conference individual title and Penner picking up the victory in 2013.

As a student-athlete, Deacon helped UNLV to a Mountain West title in 2002 by tying for second in the individual contest. He competed in the 2002-03 NCAA Championships and was a member of the GCAA All-American Scholar Team and the Academic All-Mountain West Team in 2004. Deacon graduated from UNLV with a bachelor's degree in communications in 2005.

Deacon played professionally on the Gateway Tour and Canadian Tour. He was a U.S. Amateur semifinalist in 2005 before capturing two Minor League Golf Tour Titles in 2007, taking top honors at the Emerald Hills Classic and the Miami Shores Shootout. Deacon played in 35 events over a three-year span (2008-10) on the Canadian Tour and made 17 cuts. His best finish was a tie for fourth at the 2008 Saskatchewan Open.



ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH JOHN HANDRIGAN

John Handrigan is in his fifth season coaching the Gators. He won the Jan Strickland Award in April of 2015 for being named national assistant coach of the year. In February of 2016, he was promoted from assistant coach to associate head coach.

The 2015-16 school year marks Handrigan's second working with JC Deacon after three campaigns assisting Buddy Alexander. Handrigan came to UF with 10 years of coaching experience at the Division I and II levels. Before arriving in Gainesville, Handrigan served as the assistant men's golf coach at the University of Kansas, and the head men's and

women's coach at Queens University of Charlotte in North Carolina, where he was named the Conference Carolinas 2009 Women's Golf Coach of the Year.

Before Queens, Handrigan was the head men's golf coach at Coker College, earning NCAA Division II Atlantic Region Coach of the Year and Carolinas-Virginia Athletics Conference (CVAC) Coach of the Year accolades. Handrigan went to Coker after serving as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Saint Francis University.

After earning his bachelor's degree in business management in 2000, he got into coaching immediately following a successful playing career. As a student-athlete for the Red Flash, Handrigan was named the school's 2000 Male Student-Athlete of the Year following his senior season. He earned his master's degree in business administration in 2002 while working as an assistant for the Red Flash.
