MARK BOSTICK GOLF COURSE

COURSE MAP



With a \$1.8-million clubhouse renovation and a \$4-million course renovation in 2001, Florida boasts one of the finest overall facilities in all of collegiate golf.

Since 1962, the Mark Bostick Golf Course (formerly the Gainesville Golf and Country Club) has been home to the Gators. The Florida golf program recently moved into a new era, playing on a full-renovated course which opened in November of 2001. While improvements and additions have been made over the years, this was the first full-scale renovation in 20 years.

The University of Florida hired Jacksonville-based architect Bobby Weed to head up the renovation. With the help of an experienced staff, he constructed a challenging course for collegiate golfers.

Par at the course remained 70 after the renovation, but the yardage was increased to 6,701. Some holes changed only slightly, keeping some familiarity, while others were completely redesigned to challenge golfers day-in and day-out. Both the men's and the women's golf teams host tournaments at Mark Bostick Golf Course in the spring of each year.

The Mark Bostick Golf Course plays host to the annual Gator Invitational and Gator Women's Golf Invitational, in addition to the yearly Gator Golf Day, where alumni and current PGA and LPGA Tour players return each year to give their time and money to continue the winning tradition of the UF golf program. Various state tournaments and the SEC Championships have also been held at Mark Bostick Golf Course.



COURSE FACTS

- Located less than a mile from campus, the University Golf Course and the Guy Bostick Clubhouse (home of the men's and women's golf teams) are situated on 110 acres of heavily tree-lined, softly rolling terrain.
- The Florida women's golf team plays the 18-hole, par-70 course to a length of 6,002 yards.
- The course went through a \$4-million renovation in 2001, which included new tees and fairway surfaces, 140-plus bunkers, triple-row irrigation and a newly-designed practice facility for the teams.
- The course went through a \$600,000 renovation in the summer of 2014, which included an overhaul of the putting greens, sand traps and team practice areas.



Par 4 • 358 Yards

The course begins with a simple par-four that offers golfers a chance for an easy birdie. A well-placed tee shot down the middle of the wide fairway will eliminate the large sand trap on the left from being a factor. The medium-size green is guarded by a series of traps to the right.



HOLE #2

Par 3 • 150 Yards

On the second, golfers face the first of five par-threes that are complicated by wind and overhanging trees. Water comes into play for the first time, and can play a factor in club selection. Although the green is large, it breaks sharply towards the water.



HOLE #3

Par 5 • 502 Yards

At 502 yards, the third hole is Mark Bostick Golf Course's longest, and one of its most deceptive. A long drive towards the right side of the fairway will leave an uphill approach shot towards the two-tiered green.



Par 4 • 400 Yards

The fourth hole has a wide fairway that bends towards the left. A tee shot placed on the right side will leave a difficult approach over the lining trees. There is plenty of open space to the right, which can present players with a difficult lie when the rough is high.





HOLE #5

Par 4 • 389 Yards

This par-four hole runs parallel to 34th Street, so a solid drive is crucial to avoid going out of bounds and to keep away from the trees on the left. The view from the tee box is obstructed by a short mound, creating a blind first shot.

HOLE #6

Par 3 • 177 Yards

This par-three plays much longer than the 177 yards listed on the scorecard. Players need to be aware of the overhanging tree branches that can take distance off of a good shot. Balls that are hit too far will fall off of a steep hill that lurks in the back.



Par 5 • 522 Yards

The seventh hole begins with a downhill tee shot into a narrow valley that is guarded by bunkers to the left and trees to the right. Like No. 3, players will be faced with an uphill approach shot that appears closer than the distance listed. High mounds surrounding the small elevated green make this an ideal hole for an aggressive fairway shot and a possible birdie opportunity.



HOLE #8

Par 3 • 158 Yards

A large pond between the tee box and the green highlight this par-three hole. The downhill tee shot adds another element of judgement into the mix here. The green is large and provides a safe surface for players to utilize.



HOLE #9

Par 4 • 355 Yards

This short par-four completes the front nine with an uphill climb towards a well-guarded green. The out-of-bounds area to the right can come into play on a windy day. A series of hidden traps to the right and left of the green make accuracy a crucial skill. The large tree on the left side of the fairway can also hinder an approach shot.



Par 4 • 380 Yards

Players are faced with a difficult challenge on the opening hole of the back nine. The right side of the fairway is bordered by SW 2nd Avenue, as well as a large bunker. Precision becomes a factor on the second shot, when players are faced with the smallest green on the course.





HOLE #11


Par 3 • 129 Yards

Yardage control is important on the shortest hole at Mark Bostick Golf Course. The turtleback green can cause shots to fall off into any one of the six surrounding bunkers.

HOLE #12

Par 5 • 475 Yards

This dogleg left requires a solid drive over the tree line for a clear approach shot. The green is reachable in two but will require a long iron uphill towards a raised green that is guarded by several bunkers in the front.



Par 4 • 403 Yards

No. 13 is a long par-four that wraps around the driving range and teaching center. Trees were removed from the left side of the fairway during renovations to give golfers the impression of open space. The slight incline will test a player's ability to select the right club when approaching the green.





HOLE #14

Par 4 • 345 Yards

Depending on the location of the pin, players will have the option of going for the green from the tee or hitting to the safe area in front. Accuracy is key, as bunkers to the right and left guard the green and the slope on the back awaits stray shots.

HOLE #15

Par 3 • 166 Yards

Pin placement will play an important part in how players approach this par three. Designed to add distance to the course, this hole can play longer than the posted distance if the pin is in the back of the green.



Par 4 • 388 Yards

The 16th hole was created during the 2001 renovation and uses an upward slant to create extra distance. The tee box is situated in the same location where the tee box for the fourth hole used to be. The green slopes towards the back, so players should try to place their second shot above the pin.





HOLE #17


Par 4 • 320 Yards

During renovation, golf course designers incorporated several options for approaching the 17th hole. Players can reach the green with a well-placed drive onto the largest green on the course, or opt to leave it short for the simple chip. The fairway was intentionally widened to entice golfers to take a chance on reaching the green.

HOLE #18

Par 4 • 385 Yards

The final hole of the course runs uphill towards the clubhouse. A solid drive off the tee will leave for a short-iron onto a narrow green. There are many distractions surrounding this hole, including players going off on No. 1 and the practice green on the backside.





Tournament History

The 2016 SunTrust Gator Women's Golf Invitational marks the tournament's 44th-annual event. Since its beginning in 1973, the Gator Women's Golf Invitational has consistently drawn quality teams and players to Gainesville. As a result, several prominent golfers appear in the Gator Women's Golf Invitational records, including three players who went on to earn Rolex Player of the Year honors on the LPGA Tour: Nancy Lopez, Pat Bradley and Betsy King.

The tournament began as a two-day event and originally drew schools from the state and surrounding areas. In 1975, the Gator Women's Golf Invitational was expanded to a three-day event until it returned to its previous two-day format in 2009. This year's tournament will again be a two-day event.

UF has claimed the Women's Golf Gator Invitational title seven times in the last 12 years, with 17 titles overall. In 2015, Florida took second place and had three Gator golfers in the top-10 individually.


