

Tim Walton has established Florida softball as a national powerhouse in his 10 years at the helm of the Gators squad. Under Walton's tutelage, Florida became the first Southeastern Conference institution in history to earn four consecutive Women's College World Series berths (2008-11). The Orange and Blue have earned a total of seven WCWS berths since Walton's arrival, with four championship series appearances and the program's first and second national titles in 2014 and 2015.

Walton reached a career milestone when he earned career win No. 600 in just his 12th season as a head coach in 2014. Coming in his 774th game as a head coach, the Gators used an 8-0 mercy-rule victory at SEC rival Texas A&M to complete a three-game sweep on Easter Sunday, making Walton the fastest active head coach in the Southeastern Conference to reach 600 lifetime victories.

Walton enters his 11th season at Florida with a 552-121 (.820) record at the head of the Gator program and a 675-185 (.785) career record in 13 seasons as a head coach. Florida has seven 50-win and three 60-win seasons in program history, all under Walton.

In his 10 years at Florida, Walton has led the Orange and Blue to countless school and SEC records, and his squads have earned numerous firsts for the Gator softball program. In 2011, UF advanced to an unprecedented fourth straight Women's College World Series, including its second trip to the Championship Series. Working as a four-time SEC Coach of the Year, Walton has led the Gators to four SEC regular-season and three conference tournament titles. UF has made the NCAA Tournament every year of his tenure, hosted Regionals all 10 times and played host to NCAA Super Regionals seven times from 2008-15. Florida reached the pinnacle of college softball in 2014, capturing the national championship with a two-game sweep of Southeastern Conference rival Alabama in the finals. This past season in 2015, Walton and his squad won the program's second-straight national title, defeating Michigan two games to one in the final of the WCWS.

In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title. Florida joined UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.

On the softball diamond, Walton has tutored 14 Florida student-athletes to 29 NFCA All-America honors, 19 players to 44 NFCA All-Southeast Region honors, has produced 15 WCWS All-Tournament team selections (including three Most Outstanding Players), coached 19 Gator athletes to 41 All-SEC honors and racked up 17 SEC All-Tournament team honors, including three MVPs, three SEC Pitchers of the Year and four SEC Players of the Year. Most recently, Gators Kelsey Stewart and Lauren Haeger won the conference's Player and Pitcher of the Year awards in 2015, becoming UF's fourth and third honorees in program history. Additionally, Haeger brought home the 2015 Honda Sports Award, designating her as the nation's top collegiate female athlete in the sport of softball. Haeger was the second Gator to receive the Honda Award, as Kelsey Bruder was UF's first recipient in 2011. Shortly after Bruder claimed that honor, she was awarded the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award as one of the top eight NCAA athletes in the country during the 2010-11 school year.

Under Walton's direction, the Florida coaching staff has earned NFCA Southeast Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors four times and the team was one of Easton's Teams of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

In 2015, Walton and his staff were named the NFCA Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year, the first time in school history Florida has earned this accolade.

Under Walton's watch, the Gators have shattered over 300 University of Florida records since 2006. His 2008 squad recorded an NCAA-record 70 wins and posted the best SEC record in league history at 27-1. The Orange and Blue shattered its own SEC single-season wins record with 332 in 2013, while the Gators boasted a .981 fielding percentage in 2015 committing a program-record low 33 errors during the season. Florida's 2011 squad downed eight SEC records, including four team season records for runs (508), RBI (479) and walks (322), while extending its standing single-season homers record to 124. The 2012 Gator squad set the league record for slugging percentage (.627), while the 2009 Gators became only the second team to ever register a perfect conference road record (13-0).

After winning the program's first national championship in 2014, the Gators followed that by becoming just the third program in NCAA history to win back-to-back softball titles in 2015. In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title and Florida joined UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.

Florida's 2015 season began with victories in the first 28 games, marking the best season start in history. UF used the early momentum to earn its fifth SEC championship (also: 1998, 2008, 2009, 2013). The Gators' five SEC titles are tied with Alabama and LSU for the most in the conference.

In addition, the four league crowns for the Orange and Blue since 2008 are tied with the Crimson Tide for the most in the conference during that span. After a semifinals exit from the SEC Tournament, the Gators earned the No. 1 national seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, marking the third time in the program history that UF had been seeded first (also: 2008, 2009). In the Gainesville Regional, the Gators defeated Florida A&M, Hofstra and Florida Atlantic to advance to the NCAA Super Regional against SEC rival Kentucky, where they won the first two games of the three-game series to advance to the 2015 Women's College World Series.

In the WCWS, UF defeated Tennessee, LSU and Auburn on its way back to the Championship Series. This season, the Gators took on Michigan in the final and won Games 1 and 3 of the series to secure their second consecutive national title. won the crown after going 5-1 at the WCWS and defeating Michigan two games to one in the final.

Florida, ranked No. 1 on the 2015 ESPN/USA Today preseason poll, became the first team to win the NCAA title after beginning the season No. 1 since Arizona in 2007.

Along the way, the Gators set school records for on-base percentage (.439), stolen-base percentage (.892), fewest errors (T-1st, 40) and double plays (28). Individually, Lauren Haeger became the third softball player to win the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year, the WCWS Most Outstanding Player and the Honda Awards in the same season (also: Keilani Ricketts, Oklahoma – 2013; Danielle Lawrie, Washington – 2009). In addition, four Gators were named to the NFCA All-Southeast Region teams, highlighted by Lauren Haeger, Kirsti Merritt and Alesha Ocasio's First Team selection; in addition, Kelsey Stewart made the Second Team. Haeger, Stewart (First Team) and Ocasio (Third Team) went on to earn All-America honors.

The Orange and Blue ranked first nationally in winning percentage, they tied for first in wins, were first in fielding percentage (.981), fourth in ERA (1.63), 11th in on-base percentage (.438), 22nd in scoring (6.55 runs per game), 29th in slugging percentage (.514) and 32nd in home runs per game (1.19). Defensively, Florida's .981 fielding percentage was the best mark in school history, eclipsing the .979 mark set in 2013. The Gators committed just 33 errors in 67 games, seven fewer than any previous UF squad.

In 2014, the Orange and Blue reached the pinnacle of college softball when they swept five games at the WCWS to win UF's first national championship. Florida compiled a 10-1 record as the No. 5 National Seed in the NCAA Tournament, with the only loss coming in Game 2 of the Super Regional against Washington. The Gators shut out Florida A&M, Stetson and UCF by a combined score of 29-0 to win the Gainesville Regional as Delanie Gourley, Hannah Rogers and Lauren Haeger each pitched a complete game to blank the three Sunshine State opponents. Gourley pitched a no-hitter against the Rattlers, marking the Gators' first-ever

postseason "no-no." The next weekend, Florida run-ruled Washington in Games 1 and 3 of the Super Regional. After two lengthy rain delays, Kirsti Merritt launched a three-run walkoff home run in the third contest to send the Gators to Oklahoma City for the sixth time in seven years. At the WCWS, the UF defense turned a WCWS-record seven double plays, and Rogers pitched three straight shutouts against Baylor (twice) and top-ranked Oregon to set up a championship series clash with SEC rival Alabama. Florida's senior right-hander blanked the Tide in Game 1 before all three pitchers contributed in the clincher, with Gourley earning the win in relief of Haeger and Rogers recording the save to lock up WCWS Most Outstanding Player honors and bring home the national title. During the championship season, the Gators set school records for on-base percentage (.439), stolen-base percentage (.892), fewest errors (T-1st, 40) and double plays (28).

Six Gators were named to the NFCA All-Southeast Region teams, highlighted by Lauren Haeger's First Team selection; in addition, Hannah Rogers, Taylor Schwarz, Kelsey Stewart and Stephanie Tofft made the Second Team, while Kirsti Merritt was a Third Team choice. Stewart (First Team) and Rogers (Third Team) went on to earn All-America honors, with Rogers becoming Florida Softball's first-ever four-time All-American. The Orange and Blue ranked among the national leaders in fielding (third, .978), runs per game (fourth, 6.91), winning percentage (seventh, .821), home runs per game (seventh, 1.33), slugging percentage (seventh, .528), ERA (15th, 1.96), and stolen bases per game (19th, 1.73). Individually, Haeger ranked sixth in the country in home runs (20), while Rogers finished tied for sixth in shutouts (12) and ninth in wins (30), and Stewart was tied for sixth in triples (six) and 19th in hitting (.438). The Gators led the SEC in wins (55), runs scored (463), RBI (433), on-base percentage (.439), total bases (913), walks (321), steals (115), ERA and opponent's batting average (.196). Florida finished the year 22-11 against ranked opponents, including a 15-5 record against Top-25 foes after the calendar turned to April.

Walton picked up his fourth SEC Coach of the Year honor in 2013 after leading a young Gators squad to both the SEC regular-season and tournament titles en route to their fifth appearance at the WCWS in the last six years. UF played one of the most exciting WCWS games in history – a 15-inning thrilling victory against Nebraska – and finished the season ranked No. 5 in both national polls. Florida drew the largest home attendance in school history when 2,443 Orange and Blue faithful filled KSP Stadium for the showdown between the Gators and Noles, a game UF won, 7-3, in eight innings thanks to a walk-off grand slam from Briana Little. Florida paced the country with 58 wins, going 58-9, including 18-6 in Southeastern Conference play. Florida shattered its own SEC record for single-season walks (332), while downing 25 school records through the campaign. The Orange and Blue ranked second in the country in win-loss percentage (.866), fourth in fielding percentage (.979), seventh in triples per game (0.33), 11th in both ERA (1.83) and scoring (6.46) and 14th in the NCAA with 1.25 home runs per game.

The Gators earned the No. 2 National Seed, the sixth-straight national seed for UF and the third top-three tournament seed in school history.

Five Florida student-athletes were named NFCA All-Southeast Region Team members, with Lauren Haeger and Hannah Rogers representing on the First Team, both also named NFCA 2013 All-Americans, while Kelsey Horton, Kelsey Stewart and Stephanie Tofft were NFCA All-Southeast Region Second Team honorees. Freshman Kirsti Merritt became the first SEC Tournament MVP as one of UF's four SEC All-Tournament Team members alongside fellow freshmen Taylor Schwarz, Stewart and Tofft. Florida owned a 17-6 record against Top-25 opponents in 2013 and led the SEC in 14 categories, including wins (58), runs (43), walks (332), ERA (1.83) and ranked second in fielding percentage (.979).

The 2012 season was the end of an era for the two-time Gator All-American and Academic All-American Moultrie, who went out with a bang as the 2012 SEC Player of the Year and a finalist for two major college softball awards – the 2012 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award and USA Softball's Player of the Year Award. Moultrie helped lead the Gators to a 48-13 overall record and a 21-7 record in SEC play for UF's fifth-straight 20-win league campaign in school history. UF ranked seventh in the country in ERA (1.46), ninth in win-loss percentage (.787) and 15th in the nation in slugging percentage (.482). The Gators finished third in the league through the regular-season slate and advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship Game for just the fifth time in program history, the third under Walton's tutelage, as UF's victory over Tennessee propelled them to not only the league tourney championship game, but gave Walton his 500th career victory as a head coach.

The Orange and Blue received a NCAA Tournament bid for the 13th time in school history and the 10th straight season, as the Gators picked up the No. 5 national seed, their fifth consecutive top-five seed, and hosted a NCAA Regional for the ninth time in program history, the eighth consecutive year. UF boasted two All-Americans in Moultrie and Hannah Rogers, while Kelsey Horton and Lauren Haeger were NFCA All-Southeast Region selections. Moultrie and Horton also reeled in 2012 Academic All-America nods. The Gators had three All-SEC selections: Horton, Moultrie and Rogers, and school-record tying four All-SEC Freshman honorees. Florida set or tied eight school records through the 2012 season as Moultrie put her mark on three alone, including career batting average (.385) and career stolen bases (83) and attempts (99). Moultrie, Florida's lone senior, compiled the second-best senior class win percentage in the country, finishing her tenure 216-41 (.840) throughout her four years on campus. The 2012 Gators paced the league in ERA (1.44) and saves (8) and ranked second in the SEC in slugging percentage (.482), on-base percentage (.396), RBI (296), homers (68) and fielding percentage (.974).

Florida finished 2011 as the No. 2 team in the country and the national runners up behind the success of a 56-13 (.811) overall record, led by the winningest class of seniors in school history. SEC Player of the Year Kelsey Bruder, Stephanie Brombacher, Megan Bush, Tiffany DeFelicce and Aja Paculba put on a dominating four-year performance and concluded their careers boasting a 238-33 (.878) overall record and a 94-13 (.878) record in SEC play as UF tallied its fourth 50-win season in school history. UF paced the nation in Academic All-Americans, with four, and boasted a

nation-leading six All-Americans and Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region selections, the most possible for a single institution, to accompany seven All-SEC honorees, including two SEC All-Defensive team members. The 2011 Gators jumped out of the gates with a 24-0 start, the best in school history, and worked their way to a fourth straight SEC Eastern Division title, the fifth in Gator history, compiling a 21-7 league mark. The Gators downed over 40 University of Florida single-season, game and career records en route to a fourth WCWS appearance in Oklahoma City, where Cheyenne Coyle, Brittany Schutte and Bruder earned WCWS All-Tournament Team honors along with Moultrie, who was named the WCWS Most Outstanding Player.

Statistically, Florida turned in a nation-leading performance in 2011, checking in at first in the country in home runs per game (1.8) and second in slugging percentage (.588). The Gators' 124 homers ranks fourth all-time in NCAA history and their 508 runs check in at sixth in the NCAA record books. UF paced the SEC in wins (56), slugging percentage (.588), runs (508), hits (573), RBI (479), home runs (124) and walks (322). A freshman in 2011, Rogers ranked third in the NCAA in wins (36), second among freshmen, while Schutte turned in 22 homers to rank third in the NCAA. Bush, the UF and SEC career home runs leader (65), ranked fifth in the country with her 21 bombs in 2011 and first with nine sacrifice flies.

Walton's 2010 Gators finished 49-10 with a .831 winning percentage, fourth best in the country. They made the WCWS for the third straight year, were the fourth seed in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a top-five seed for the third straight year, while reaching the quarterfinals of the 2010 WCWS in Oklahoma City. Florida finished the season ranked sixth in both the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN.com/USA Softball polls. The Gators went 20-4 in the SEC, placing second overall and first in the East Division. The 2010 squad set 28 school records, including nine single-game records and seven single-season records. As a power-hitting team, Florida set records for runs (22), hits (21), RBIs (20) and home runs (six, twice) in a game while breaking the school record for batting average (.331), runs (433), RBIs (402), total bases (936) and on-base percentage (.432). While topping the SEC record book for slugging percentage (.627), they ranked second in the nation for the power-hitting percentage while averaging 7.34 runs per game. Their 109 home runs and 1.85 homers per game ranked third in the country. Seven different Gators hit 10 grand slams, the second most in program history, while six UF batters hit home runs nine times in the same game over the 2010 season. The Gators led the SEC in batting average and ranked second in ERA (2.20), on-base percentage, runs, RBIs and total bases, while playing between two and five games fewer than other top conference teams. Walton coached Florida past the 600-win mark in program history while his players garnered two All-Americans honors, five NFCA all-Southeast Region selections, five All-SEC honors, three SEC Freshman team awards, one SEC All-Defensive team selection, two SEC All-Tournament team nods and one WCWS All-Tournament team selection.

The 2009 season brought new accomplishments and challenges for Walton's Gators. Their .926 (63-5) winning percentage was the best in the country, as was their 0.69 ERA. Florida garnered the program's first-ever preseason No. 1 ranking in both the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN.com/USA Softball polls and returned to the top spot for 12 weeks, including three where they tallied unanimous first-place votes. The Orange and Blue then earned the No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament and for the second time in program history, Florida punched its ticket to the WCWS in Oklahoma City. UF soared to new heights with its first-ever berth in the championship series, going 8-0 in games leading to the showdown. The No. 2 final ranking was the highest in the program's history to that point.

Walton led the '09 team as it broke or tied 61 school records, including the two conference records. The Gators went 15-0 on the road and recorded only two home losses. They captured the SEC regular-season and tournament titles and set the country's longest win streak of the season at 29 games. In all, Walton coached five All-Americans, six NFCA All-Southeast Region selections, seven All-SEC honorees, the most in Florida history, two SEC Freshman team selections, four SEC All-Defensive team members, four SEC All-Tournament team members, including the tournament's MVP, two WCWS All-Tournament team members and the SEC Pitcher of the Year as Stacey Nelson repeated the accomplishment, all while earning his second SEC Coach of the Year award.

Walton set a few milestones of his own during the 2009 season, reaching 300 career wins on Feb. 27 with a 10-5 victory over Pacific in the Gators' sweep of the Cox Invitational. He also became the winningest coach in Florida's history when he tallied his 193rd victory on March 21 as the Gators downed Tennessee, 7-0. Walton surpassed former coach Karen Johns' (2001-05) previous high (192) in 76 fewer games. In the 11-2 win over Mississippi State on April 4, Walton became the first coach in program history to amass 200 wins.

Walton's third season was the true turning point for Florida softball, as the team racked up the NCAA-record 70 wins and set many firsts for the program. The 2008 squad was the first team in school history to reach the WCWS and finished 3-2 in their first appearance, notching a spot in the semifinals. The '08 Gators were also the first UF softball team to host a Super Regional, garnering the program's first-ever No. 1 seed. UF took the SEC Tournament Championship for the first time as the Gators defeated Alabama, 4-1, in the title game. They also captured the SEC title for the second time in program history with their 27-1 record, the best winning percentage (.964) and most conference wins in SEC history.

The 2008 season also saw the program's first No. 1 ranking while the team broke or tied 72 school records through the course of the year. The Gators tallied a program-high 37-game win streak and a 41-game home win streak, which spanned the 2007 and 2008 seasons. Walton also coached a school-record five players to Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region accolades and All-America honors. He also earned SEC Coach of the Year honors while coaching four All-SEC players, four SEC All-Defensive team members, four All-SEC Freshmen team members and the SEC Pitcher of the Year.

In Walton's second season, the Gators claimed the school's first 50-win (50-22) season and a NCAA Super Regional appearance. Florida also advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship game in 2007 for the first time since the inaugural 1997 season. In addition, two Gators earned Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region honors, as well as All-America accolades, becoming only the second and third players in program history to earn the high honor, with Kim Waleszonia being the first position player named to an All-America team. As a team, the Gators set 59 school records.

In his first season, Walton led the Gators to a 43-25 overall record, making him the winningest first-year head coach in program history. The 43 wins were the most by the Gators since 2000 and the .632 winning percentage was the second-best in program history. Walton led the Gators to set 26 school records. Four individuals were named to All-SEC teams, a then program high, and senior Kristen Butler became only the second Gator to earn SEC Player of the Year honors. The Gators tallied another first when they defeated a No.1-ranked team for the first time ever, beating defending national champion Michigan, 3-2, on Feb. 18, 2006.

The third head coach in the history of the Gator program, Walton came to Florida from Wichita State University, where he had been the head

coach for three seasons. In 2005, Walton led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 16 years as they earned the first at-large bid in school history. Wichita State finished the 2005 season with a school record 46-18 record and broke 30 school records in the process.

Walton began his tenure at Wichita State with a bang in 2003. The team put together one of the best turnarounds in the nation that year, improving its 2002 record by 18 wins to a 39-20 overall record. The Shockers' 39 wins was a school record at that point. Under Walton's watch, Wichita State ranked among the top 30 in the nation for ERA and fielding percentage, including the fifth-best fielding percentage in 2005 (.977).

Walton has been a part of national championship teams as a baseball player, an assistant softball coach and a head softball coach. Before heading to Wichita, Walton served as an assistant softball coach for the University of Oklahoma, as the hitting coach and outfielders coach. In his four seasons at OU, the Sooners won three Big 12 titles and made three consecutive WCWS appearances, including winning the 2000 NCAA title.

Walton played baseball for two years at Cerritos Junior College in his home town of Cerritos, Calif., before transferring to Oklahoma. Walton made two trips to the College World Series as part of the Sooners pitching staff, earning the win in the 1994 national title game in a 13-5 OU victory over Georgia Tech.

As a head coach, Walton stresses academics and community involvement with his teams, as well as on-field performance. Since arriving in Gainesville, Walton has engaged his teams in the community through Shands Hospital, March of Dimes, Climb for Cancer, Habitat for Humanity, the Major League Baseball Urban Youth Academies, Ronald McDonald House and Friends of Jaclyn, among other activities. In 2009, the Gators held the inaugural "Gators Swing for Cancer" event, which annually raises money and creates awareness for a number of different Shands hospital-affiliated charities. The Gators were awarded both the 2010 and 2011 UF Life Skills Cups for having the most community service hours of any Gator athletic team in back-to-back years.

In the classroom, Walton stresses the importance of academic success, and since his arrival in Gainesville, the Gators have placed a strong emphasis on their work in the classroom. In the summer of 2012, the University of Florida softball program received public recognition from the NCAA as one of 30 Division I women's softball program's to post multiple-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores in the top-10 percent of all softball teams across the nation. Florida was one of just two Southeastern Conference softball programs to be honored by the NCAA for the four-year period ending in the 2010-11 academic year. The Gators struck again in the summer of 2013, and for the second consecutive year earned public recognition from the NCAA for multiple-year APR success. Florida was the only Southeastern Conference institution recognized for the 2011-12 academic year. 2014 brought a third straight APR recognition, as the Gators were one of two SEC schools to earn the distinction.

In 2009, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association announced the Gators had the fifth highest GPA in the country with a 3.49 cumulative team GPA, its highest in program history thanks to a 3.53 fall average – the highest of any UF sport – and five individual 4.0s. Since Walton took over the helm of the Gator softball program in 2006, 47 Gators have earned 82 SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades, 33 freshmen have been named to the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, 11 players have been named Capital One Academic All-District selections 21 times and eight UF softball student-athletes have picked up 13 Capital One Academic All-America honors. The Gators have turned in one of the nation's top 16 GPAs in four years under Walton, while ranking in the top 30 among Division I programs two times. UF softball has a 100 percent graduation success rate for those student-athletes who started college in 2006, as calculated by the NCAA and released Oct. 25, 2013. The Gators were one of four Florida athletic teams to post a 100 percent GSR.

"The importance of academic and community involvement stresses life after softball," Walton said. "These student-athletes are going to be part of a community – it helps them learn what it takes to be good people. Being a student-athlete at the University of Florida makes you a role model. We want our team to be involved in the community and perform in the classroom to show young people that playing athletics in college is about more than what they do on the field."

In addition to his impact on the college softball, Walton's success has trickled to the national level as a school-record four Gators accepted

invitations to participate in USA Softball's 2011 Women's National Team Selection Camp, two of which were named to the Women's National Team – Moultrie and Schutte – and represented Florida and Team USA in 2011. Moultrie and Schutte reeled in the 2011 World Cup of Softball VI gold medal with the national team, and Moultrie went on to lead Team USA to a Pan American Games gold medal in October 2011 before making the Women's National Team roster again in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Three former Gators in Cheyenne Coyle, Jessica Damico and Haeger were members of the 2011-12 US Women's Junior National Team, which contributed to Team USA's gold medal at the IX ISF Junior Women's World Championship in Cape Town, South Africa, in December 2011. Haeger tossed the Junior World Championship Gold Medal Game, allowing just five hits, while fanning eight batters – including the last two – as Team USA defeated Japan to win its second consecutive Junior World Championship.

In July 2013, current UF senior Kelsey Stewart helped lead the Red, White & Blue Junior Women's National Team to a silver medal at the ISF X Jr. Women's World Championship, where Team USA squared off with Japan in the gold-medal game. Stewart batted .450 for Team USA with seven runs scored, four RBI and three triples.

Stewart was invited to the selection camp in 2014, and the rising junior was named to the 2014 USA Softball Women's National Team. Stewart is the fourth Gator to wear the Red, White and Blue at the senior level, joining Moultrie (2011-14), Schutte (2012) and Gator pitching standout Stacey Nelson (2009).

In 2015, current UF senior Kelsey Stewart and Moultrie helped the United States national team to a championship at the World Cup of Softball X, while Walton helped coach sophomore outfielder Nicole DeWitt and incoming freshman Kelly Barnhill to a Gold Medal at the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) Junior Women's World Championship (JWWC) that summer as well.

Walton additionally hit the national softball coaching scene in 2010 when he was honored by the USSSA Pride of the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) professional softball league by being named head coach of the Florida Pride (Orlando). Walton led the Pride to the 2010 NPF Championship title – the championship victory and NPF trophy was the first ever in Florida Pride history. Walton's 2011 squad won the 2011 regular-season title en route to the runner-up spot at the NPF Championship, while the coaching staff earned 2011 Coaching Staff of the Year honors.

Walton has tutored a total of nine Gators who have been drafted into and/or play in the NPF organization with the opportunity to continue their softball playing careers professionally, including Kristen Butler, Francesca Enea, Megan Bush, Kelsey Bruder, Aja Paculba, Michelle Moultrie, Stephanie Tofft, Hannah Rogers and Lauren Haeger.

After graduating from Oklahoma with a degree in history, Walton played in the Philadelphia Phillies organization from 1995-97.

Walton is married to the former Samantha Rhoten, who was a basketball player at Oral Roberts. The couple has two sons, Brooks (16) and Palmer (10), and a daughter, Camden (13).

OKLAHOMA '98 • ELEVENTH SEASON



Jennifer Rocha has made a name for herself as one of the top pitching instructors in the country. In her 10 seasons at Florida, Rocha has tutored five All-American hurlers in Stephanie Brombacher, Stacey Nelson, Hannah Rogers, Lauren Haeger and Aleshia Ocasio. In two of the last eight years, the

Gators have turned in the top team ERA in the country and the 2015 national championship season kept the bar high as Florida posted the top ERA in the SEC (1.63) for the third consecutive year, a figure that ranked fourth in the nation.

In addition, Rocha was named the 2015 NFCA Assistant Coach of the Year. It was the first honor of its kind received by a UF coach in program history.

During the fall of 2015, Rocha was announced as the new head coach of the National Pro Fastpitch League's Dallas Charge for the 2016 season by General Manager Kevin Shelton. The NPF League season runs from the beginning of June until mid-August, so this position will allow her to continue serving as Florida's assistant coach.

After tutoring both Nelson, Brombacher and Rogers to successful careers in Orange and Blue, Rocha led Haeger to becoming the best pitcher in the country in 2015.

After being a 2012 and 2014 NFCA All-Southeast Region First Team selection and 2013 NFCA All-America pick, Haeger boasted a modest 41-10 record in the circle, including a 10-9 record against top-25 opponents.

She was just getting warmed up.

During her senior season, not only did Haeger lead the Gators to their second-straight NCAA Championship but the Peoria, Ariz., product became the first Gator to win the USA National Player of the Year award, third to be named the WCWS Most Outstanding Player and second to garner softball's Honda Award. In addition, she was named the SEC Female Athlete of the Year and Pitcher of the Year.

In the circle, Haeger assembled a 32-2 record with a 1.23 earned run average after beginning the year with 24 consecutive victories to mark the best start to a campaign in Gator history.

Also in 2015, Rocha coached rookie Aleshia Ocasio to third team All-America honors, becoming the second freshman in Gator history to achieve that honor. In addition, Ocasio became the fourth Gator freshman in five years with 100+ strikeouts.

The first Gator rookie to earn All-America accolades was Rogers, who led Florida to its first NCAA title in 2014. The Lake Wales, Fla., native earned second-team All-America honors in 2011 after she shattered freshman records for wins, starts, complete games, shutouts, strikeouts, appearances and innings pitched. She became UF's second-ever freshman All-American and the first Florida pitcher to garner the accolade. Rogers led the Gators to their first national title in 2014, and in the process became Florida's first four-time All-American.

Rogers was at her best on the biggest stage, as she compiled a 7-0 record with seven complete games (six shutouts) in eight NCAA Tournament appearances (seven starts), with a save in the championship-clinching victory over Alabama. Rogers finished her career with 127 victories, a figure that ranks second in Florida history (Stacey Nelson - 136) and made her the NCAA active career leader when she finished her tenure for the Orange and Blue.

Rocha will next go to work in 2015 with freshman Kelly Barnhill, the No. 2 overall recruit and the No. 1 pitching prospect in the 2015 class by FullCountSoftball.com.

Along with Barnhill and Ocasio, Delanie Gourley will round out the Gators pitching staff for the 2016 season. This past season, Gourley earned five saves for UF after transitioning to a relief role on April 12. She earned fifth and final save of the season in Game 1 of the Women's College World Series Championship Series in Game 1 against Michigan. The southpaw went 10-2 on the year with four wins over ranked opponents.

In 2008 under Rocha's watch, Florida set a then-program-best 0.92 ERA for the second-lowest ERA in the nation and in 2009, UF's 0.69 ERA was the lowest in the nation, the Southeastern Conference and the Florida record book.

The 2008 and 2009 seasons were record-breaking years for the pitching staff. In 2008, 34 UF pitching records were broken, including 15 team records. Rocha's pitchers earned the top spot in program annals for wins (70) and tied for innings pitched (512.1). In 2009, the Gator staff broke 24 records, including 12 team records, such as ERA (0.69), strikeouts (547), shutouts (39) and hits allowed (250).

In 2010, Rocha coached a young pitching staff to the second-best ERA (2.20) in the SEC. UF allowed the second-fewest runs and earned runs in the league, Brombacher led the SEC in wins (35). Under Rocha, Brombacher tossed the fourth perfect game in UF history in 2010 and returned with her second perfect contest to kick off her senior season in 2011.

Pitchers under Rocha's tutelage grace many pages of the Florida record books. Nelson, the first pitcher in UF history to earn multiple All-American accolades (2007, 2008, 2009), holds 15 career pitching records and is on 12 other top-10 career lists. A four-year student under Rocha, Nelson left Florida with the lowest career ERA (0.99) and most strikeouts (1,116). She also tallied the most wins (136) in Florida history, among other records.

In 2008, Nelson garnered ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-America honors, becoming the first player in school history to earn both All-America and Academic All-America honors in the same season. She then repeated the feat as a senior. Nelson was also named SEC Pitcher of the Year and NFCA All-Southeast Region first team in 2008 and 2009.

Brombacher ranks third all-time for fewest walks allowed (1.78 per 7 innings) and second in strikeouts per seven innings (7.05) after her four years of suiting up in the Orange and Blue. She holds the highest winning percentage in UF history as she went 42-0 record in her first two seasons, 35-8 her junior year and 20-3 her senior year in 2011 for a 97-11 (.898) overall record. Brombacher was a two-time All-SEC selection, and garnered NFCA All-Southeast and All-American honors in 2009 and 2010. She was also the only sophomore on the ESPN The Magazine/Capital One Academic All-District III first team and the first Gator sophomore to be an Academic All-American. She earned repeat honors as a junior and senior with Academic All-American and District III honors.

In 2007, then-senior Stacey Stevens, with two season pitching under Rocha, finished her career as the program leader in nine categories including wins (74), strikeouts (624) and strikeouts looking (186), now ranking third in all three categories.

Rocha came to Florida and took a veteran junior pitcher and two freshmen and worked them into a confident and experienced staff able to help the Gators to wins over some of the nation's top ranked teams. With Rocha's guidance, Nelson set several Florida freshman

records, while earning SEC All-Freshman team honors. She also led the Gators to their first-ever win over a No. 1 team, as she recorded the win over defending national champion Michigan. Stevens led the pitching staff in several categories and put herself in position to break many school records in her final season.

Rocha made the trip to Gainesville with head coach Tim Walton, as the two have worked together for a decade. Under Rocha, the Wichita State pitching staff set several school records and posted an earned run average of under 2.00 in back-to-back seasons. Their 1.46 ERA in 2004 was the lowest in program history. The pitching staff struck out over 400 batters in each Rocha's final two seasons, with one individual recording over 200. In 2005, the Shockers' top pitchers registered records of 20-8 and 22-8 and each had a 1.52 ERA in 202.1 and 180.0 innings pitched.

"Jennifer is a great pitching coach," Walton said. "She has a calm, collected presence about her. She is a good teacher, as well as a good game-day coach."

Rocha was an assistant coach at Oregon for a year before going to WSU. She began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma in 1999.

Rocha is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma and played for the Sooners from 1996 through 1998. During her time as both a player and a coach, Rocha was a part of six consecutive NCAA Regional appearances, three Big 12 Conference titles, two Big 12 Tournament titles, two WCWS appearances and one national championship. She finished her playing career with a .721 winning percentage (43-17) and posted a 1.46 ERA.

Prior to arriving at Oklahoma, Rocha played for Long Beach City College (LBCC) softball team for one season. She earned California Junior College Athletic Association (CJCAA) All-American honors in 1995 after leading LBCC to the California State Championship. She posted a 24-0 record and a 0.42 ERA while at LBCC.

Rocha earned a degree in sociology from Oklahoma in 1999 and her master's in human relations in 2001. The former Jennifer Jaime married Paul Rocha in November 2006. The couple resides in Gainesville.

Sharonda McDonald was hired as the University of Florida's softball team's assistant coach on August 14, 2015.

The Houston, Texas native made four coaching stops prior to her arrival in Gainesville that include Texas Tech (2015; associate head coach), LSU (2013-14; volunteer assistant), Ohio (2010-12; assistant coach) and Texas Southern (2008; assistant coach).

- Coached the Texas Tech outfielders and lefty slappers while also serving as first base coach.
- Helped Tech finish the season with wins in a school record four-straight Big 12 series and nine of the final 12 games overall.
- Coached Kristi Belshe to All-Big 12 second team honors.

- Coached the LSU outfielders and left-handed slappers and helped oversee the Tigers camp operation.
- Helped lead the nationally-ranked Tigers to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances during her tenure.

Ohio (2010-12):

- Assisted the Bobcats to the 2011 Mid-American Conference (MAC) East Division title and an appearance in the 2011 MAC Championship Game.
- The Bobcats belted a combined 82 home runs during the 2011 and 2012 seasons, the top two single season marks in program history. Lauren Gellerman, a 2012 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Mideast Second-Team and All-MAC First-Team selection, along with Raven King shared a program single season record with 13 dingers apiece.
- Ohio had six different players' secure All-MAC accolades. Jillian Van Wagnen turned in a team leading .362 batting average, 64 hits and 30 stolen bases during the 2012 campaign as an All-MAC Second-Team pick. She finished her career with 69 total steals, second-most in program history.

Texas Southern (2009):

- Began her coaching career in her native city of Houston, Texas, as an assistant coach for Texas Southern in 2009.
- Under her supervision, the Tigers more than double their stolen base output from the season before sparked by Latrece Shello's 17 steals.

Playing Career

McDonald concluded her professional career after seven seasons, six of which were played in the NPF League. She spent the 2014 season with the USSSA Pride after playing the 2010-12 campaigns with the Akron Racers and the 2007-08 seasons with the Philadelphia Force. She spent the 2009 season playing with the Fiorini Softball Club of the Italian Professional League.

A three-time All-NPF selection during her career, McDonald garnered the prestigious Diamond Spikes Award in 2012 after hitting .303 with 13 stolen bases while with the Racers. She ended the 2014 season with a career average over .270 to go along with over 100 runs scored during her professional career. The Pride closed the year with a two-game series sweep over Akron to win its second-straight NPF Cowles Cup.

Her success professionally followed a stellar career at Texas A&M where she shared the field with Gregory during her freshmen and sophomore seasons (2004-05). One of the top hitters in A&M history, McDonald

compiled a .338 batting average throughout her four seasons from 2004-07, the seventh-highest clip in program history.

McDonald is the Texas A&M all-time leader for both runs scored (195) and stolen bases (153) and owns the top two single-season marks in both categories as well. She led the nation with 48 stolen bases during the 2005 season alone on her way to garnering the Golden Shoe Award that is presented annually to the nation's top baserunner.

McDonald, who also ranks second all-time at A&M for hits (249) and sixth for at-bats (737), is among the select few players to earn All-Big 12 honors all four years of her career. She was also a three-time NFCA All-Region recipient.

In addition, McDonald is still tied atop the NCAA record books with 73 consecutive stolen bases (4/21/04-3/4/06).

Texas A&M advanced to the postseason all four of McDonald's seasons, highlighted by a trip to the Women's College World Series as a senior in 2007. The Aggies claimed the program's first Big 12 title in 2005 en route to finishing 47-10 overall with the opportunity to host the NCAA College Station Super Regional.

Background

McDonald spent a year with A&M's strength and conditioning staff after exhausting her eligibility. She received her bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Texas A&M in 2008.

Doug Mirabelli was hired as the University of Florida's softball team's volunteer assistant coach on September 9, 2015.

Mirabelli, a two-time World Series Champion, was a fifth-round pick in the 1992 MLB Draft and spent 11 years in the Major Leagues, before retiring

after the 2008 season. A three-time All-America catcher at Wichita State, Mirabelli is the only Shocker baseball player to earn three team Gold Glove Awards (1990-92), as he threw out 46 percent of all stolen base attempts.

MLB Career

Mirabelli was a 1992 fifth-round draft pick of the San Francisco Giants, the 131st selection overall. Mirabelli eventually became a starter at Major League level and was a member of the 1997 and 2000 playoff teams. In 2000, Mirabelli recorded the lowest catcher's ERA in all of MLB.

After playing with the Texas Rangers and San Diego Padres, Mirabelli spent the final seven years of his career with the Boston Red Sox, where he helped end an 86-year span between world championships. In addition to his catching duties, Mirabelli worked on scouting and game strategy assignments.

He became the personal catcher for starting Red Sox pitcher Tim Wakefield, who specialized in the knuckleball. Mirabelli was considered one of baseball's top receivers.

College Career

Mirabelli played at Wichita State for three seasons. He was a 1992 American Baseball Coaches Association second-team All-America honoree and Collegiate Baseball third-team All-America catcher. He also earned 1991 Baseball America third-team All-America catcher honors and 1990 Baseball America Freshman second-team All-America honors. In 1991 and 1992, he was named Missouri Valley Conference All-Tournament catcher, and was honored on the 1992 NCAA Midwest Regional All-Tournament Team. He is the only Shocker baseball player to earn three team Gold Glove Awards (1990, '91, and '92) and was the clubs 1992 MVP. During his career, he threw out 46 percent of all opponents' stolen-base attempts, and was one of five Shockers invited to the Olympic Baseball Trials in 1992.

Background

Mirabelli and his wife, Kristin, have two daughters, Molly and Emma, and one son, Joseph. He graduated from Valley High School in Las Vegas, Nevada, in 1989 and studied Sports Business at Wichita State.



2015 YEAR-IN-REVIEW

TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Won the program's second straight national title, defeating Michigan two games to one in the final of the Women's College World Series.
- In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title. Florida joins UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.
- In the 11 years of the Regional-Super Regional-WCWS format, Florida is the fifth No. 1 seed to win the title (Florida - 2015; Oklahoma - 2013; Arizona State - 2011; Arizona - 2007; Michigan - 2005).
- Florida ranked No. 1 in the 2015 ESPN/USA Today preseason poll. The last preseason No. 1 team to win the NCAA title was Arizona in 2007.
- The Florida-Michigan meeting marked the fifth consecutive year a Southeastern Conference team appeared in the WCWS Championship Series.
- Finished the season 60-7 - tied with UM for the highest win total in the country.
- Notched the Gators' third 60-win season.
- Recorded Florida's seventh 50-win season.
- Advanced to the WCWS for the seventh time in the past eight seasons.
- Ranked first in the country in winning percentage; first in fielding percentage; 22nd in scoring; 29th slugging percentage and 32nd in home runs per game; 4th in ERA; and 11th in on base percentage.
- Recorded the 900th win in program history on April 26, a 9-1 win over Texas A&M.
- Head coach Tim Walton notched career win No. 550 at UF on the fourth day of the WCWS (May 31), when the Gators downed Auburn, 3-2, in nine innings to advance to the Championship Series.
- Picked up the No. 1 National Seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, UF's seventh-
- straight top-five national seed.
- Was one of five SEC teams in the eight-team WCWS field. Before this year, the Pac-12 was the last league to send five teams to the WCWS (1999).
- Received an NCAA Tournament bid for the 16th time in school history and hosted NCAA Regionals at KSP Stadium for the 11th straight season, including each year under Tim Walton.







Team Highlights

- Won the program's second straight national title, defeating Michigan two games to one in the final of the Women's College World Series.
- In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title. Florida joins UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.
- In the 11 years of the Regional-Super Regional-WCWS format, Florida is the fifth No. 1 seed to win the title (Florida - 2015; Oklahoma - 2013; Arizona State - 2011; Arizona - 2007; Michigan - 2005).
- Florida ranked No. 1 in the 2015 ESPN/USA Today preseason poll. The last preseason No. 1 team to win the NCAA title was Arizona in 2007.
- The Florida-Michigan meeting marked the fifth consecutive year a Southeastern Conference team appeared in the WCWS Championship Series.
- Finished the season 60-7 - tied with UM for the highest win total in the country.
- Notched the Gators' third 60-win season.
- Recorded Florida's seventh 50-win season.
- Advanced to the WCWS for the seventh time in the past eight seasons.
- Ranked first in the country in winning percentage; first in fielding percentage; 22nd in scoring; 29th slugging percentage and 32nd in home runs per game; 4th in ERA; and 11th



in on base percentage.

- Recorded the 900th win in program history on April 26, a 9-1 win over Texas A&M.
- Head coach Tim Walton notched career win No. 550 at UF on the fourth day of the WCWS (May 31), when the Gators downed Auburn, 3-2, in nine innings to advance to the Championship Series.
- Picked up the No. 1 National Seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, UF's seventh-straight top-five national seed.
- Was one of five SEC teams in the eight-team WCWS field. Before this year, the Pac-12 was the last league to send five teams to the WCWS (1999).
- Received an NCAA Tournament bid for the 16th time in school history and hosted NCAA Regionals at KSP Stadium for the 11th straight season, including each year under Tim Walton.
- Boasted four NFCA All-Southeast Region Team members: Lauren Haeger, Kirsti Merritt, Aleshia Ocasio (first team); Kelsey Stewart (second team).
- Lauren Haeger, Kelsey Stewart (first team) and Aleshia Ocasio (third team) went on to earn All-America honors, bringing the tally to 15 athletes with 29 honors under Tim Walton, as the Gators have had at least one All-American each of the last nine years, including a first-team selection for eight straight seasons.
- Had three All-SEC selections and two SEC All-Freshman Team members.
- Lauren Haeger was the 2015 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year and became the first Gator to receive the award, which is considered the most prestigious honor in Division I women's softball.
- Lauren Haeger was the 2015 SEC Female

Athlete of the Year - eighth Gator (and fifth female) to earn the league's Athlete of the Year honor.

- Led the Southeastern Conference in three major categories: wins (60), ERA (1.63) and fielding percentage (.981).
- The Gators and their opponents were caught stealing 11 and 12 times, respectively; however, UF had 81 more steals (94) than its foes (13).
- Florida's .981 fielding percentage in 2015 is the best mark in school history, eclipsing the .979 mark set in 2013.
- The Gators committed just 33 errors (UF record), which is seven fewer than any previous squad.
- Junior Kelsey Stewart and former Gator Michelle Moultrie both were selected to USA Softball's National Team following the season.
- Freshman Nicole DeWitt and incoming frosh Kelly Barnhill both were invited to USA Softball's Women's Junior National Team following the season.
- Walton completes the 2015 campaign with a 552-121 (.820) record at UF and boasts a 675-185 (.785) career record as a head coach. Walton is 64-23 (.735) in the NCAA Tournament as a head coach, while the Florida program moved to 32-18 (.640) in NCAA Regional play, 15-3 (.833) in Super Regional play and 22-12 (.647) in WCWS action.
- Walton, assistant coach Jennifer Rocha and former assistants Kenny Gajewski and Stacie Pestrak (volunteer) were named the 2015 National Fastpitch Coaches Association Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year.
- That was the first NFCA national honor received by the UF staff in program history. Walton and his staff were previously named NFCA Southeast Region Coaching Staff of the



Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium, located on the corner of Hull and Museum Roads, is the home of Gator Softball. Ground broke for the stadium on Feb. 1, 1996, just a year before holding the first-ever Florida Softball game on Feb. 8, 1997. Originally built at a cost of \$2.6 million, improvements to enhance the experience of Florida's fans and student-athletes have been made to the stadium since its opening.

Led by Chip Howard, UF's executive association athletic director for internal affairs, the University Athletic Association held its latest in a series of meetings to address the conception phase for major renovations to Pressly Stadium last summer.

The meeting focused on potential amenities that would be folded into the project to accommodate the growth of the team's fan base due to its phenomenal success under Coach Tim Walton. The committee first began its stadium renovation study in February of 2015.

Budget for the project is expected to be in excess of \$2 million. With plans only in the conception phase, no timetable has been set to begin construction.

Among the areas expected to be addressed:

Nearly doubling the current capacity of 1,200 by extending the bleachers into the current berm areas, plus the addition of more ADA seating.

Shade structure for the stands.

More concessions and larger restrooms.

Larger dugouts.

Expanded press box

Team video area in clubhouse

Renovated bullpen areas.

Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium opened in UF's inaugural 1997 season, but in nearly two decades has outgrown the popularity of a program that has been to the Women's College World Series seven of the last eight seasons.

In 2001, a 2,300 square-foot locker room, team room and equipment room building were added next to the existing training room and clubhouse building. Nets were extended from the backstop to the ends of both dugouts to protect fans from fly balls. Called the Florida Softball Stadium until the summer of 2007, the stadium was named Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium after a generous gift from Jamie and Katie Pressly of West Palm Beach. The Presslys are long-time supporters of Gator athletics, as Florida's track and soccer stadium is named for Jamie Pressly and his father.

Amenities for the student-athletes and coaches include a training room for treatment needs, a team room for team meetings, study space and equipment for reviewing video, locker rooms for players, coaches and umpires and a brand new all-weather batting cage facility. The press box affords room for home and visitor radio broadcasts and TV telecasts, as well as a multi-level media seating and game management area. For the fans, Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium seats 1,200 in amphitheater style with ample handicapped seating, large restrooms, concession and Gator Locker Room areas on the concourse.




