THE FIRST PITCH

▶ No. 1 Florida returns to the diamond for the first time since capturing its second-straight NCAA Championship last June. The USF Wilson-DeMarini Tournament in Tampa, Fla., will kick off the 20th season of Gator Softball and the 11th season of Tim Walton's tenure as head coach.

QUICK HITS

- ▶ UF enters the season ranked first in the ESPN/USA Today preseason polls for the second consecutive year. Last season, Florida became the first team since Arizona in 2007 to be ranked No. 1 in the first and last polls of the year.
- The defending SEC Champion Gators have been picked by a vote of the league's head coaches as the preseason favorite for 2016, announced by the conference office on January 21. Florida received 10 first-place votes from the SEC's 13 head coaches, who were not allowed to vote for their own teams.
- Florida returns 14 letter winners from last year's squad, including eight starters (2015 average, HR, RBI) C Aubree Munro (.225, 2, 15), 1B Taylor Schwarz (.231, 2, 14), INF Kelsey Stewart (.435, 2, 41), UT Taylore Fuller (.276, 14, 56), OF Kirsti Merritt (.325, 9, 47), OF Justine McLean (.360, 0, 5), UT Nicole DeWitt (.331, 2, 28) and 1B Kayli Kvistad (.241, 6, 36).
- ▶ The Gators bring back two contributors from their 2015 pitching rotation (2015 record, Saves, ERA): UT Aleshia Ocasio (18-3, 2, 2.01) and LHP Delanie Gourley (10-2, 5, 2.13) are back from the 2015 title team
- ▶ The UF roster includes seven incoming freshmen RHP Kelly Barnhill, C Brooke Clemens, OF Amanda Lorenz, OF Lily Mann, INF Sophia Reynoso, INF Theresa Swertfager, INF Alex Voss
- ▶ UF will open the season with 14 neutral-site contests in its first 15 games before the Gators host the annual Aquafina Invitational at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium in the beginning of March.
- ▶ Florida excelled in neutral-site games in 2015, posting an 18-2 mark. Florida's lone two losses came against Tennessee in the SEC Tournament and in Game 2 of the Women's College World Series Championship Series against Michigan, before UF beat the Wolverines in Game 3 to claim its second-straight NCAA Championship.

SETTING THE STAGE: USF WILSON-DeMARINI TOURNAMENT

- ▶ 2015 marks the sixth time in the last seven years that the Orange and Blue have begun the season at a tournament hosted by USF (2010-12, 2014-16).
- ▶ The Gators have advanced to the Women's College World Series in four of the five previous years that they opened the season at the Bulls' tournament (all except 2012).
- ▶ Since 2010, UF is 24-1 when playing in Tampa/Clearwater during the season's first weekend (only loss: Feb. 13, 2010, 0-3 vs. Georgia Tech).
- ▶ UF comes to Tampa with winning records against Illinois State (4-2), Va. Tech (5-0) and USF (41-13).
- ▶ Despite defeating Michigan in the WCWS Championship Series last season, UM still holds a slight 9-8 advantage over UF in the all-time series.
- ▶ UF will face the Wolverines in its second game down in Tampa. Every NCAA Champion since 2009 has won its first rematch with its WCWS Championship Series opponent since Washington, who beat the Gators in the 2009, but then fell to UF in its first meeting since a few years later.
- ▶ The Orange and Blue faced three of this weekend's foes a season ago, compiling a 7-1 record:
- ▶ UF went 5-0 last season in Tampa, outscoring USF, Jacksonville, Illinois State, Michigan and Hampton 46-6.
- ▶ Kirsti Merritt led the Gators offense with a .545 average, three home runs and nine RBI: Ocasio and Gourley recorded three of the five wins.

Gators Hit the Road for 2016 Tourney Time

For the sixth time in the last seven years, Florida will begin its season with a USF-hosted tournament. The No. 1-ranked Gators will play four games in the three-day tourney this weekend. Matchups for UF at the USF Wilson-DeMarini Tournament include Illinois State, No. 2 Michigan, Virginia Tech and South Florida.

This weekend is just one of four tournaments the Gators are slated to participate in throughout the first month of the season. Florida will also travel to Orlando for the Diamond 9 Classic from Feb. 19-21 and to Palm Springs, Calif. for the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic at the end of the month (Feb. 25-27). The final tourney of this stretch will be the annual Aquafina Invitational at the beginning of March at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium in Gainesville.

Last year, UF defeated Illinois State three times, Michigan four times and USF once. UF comes to Tampa with winning records against Illinois State (4-2), Va. Tech (5-0) and USF (41-13). Florida last played Michigan in the Women's College World Series Championship Series last June to secure the Gators second-straight NCAA Championship.

Since 2010, UF is 24-1 when playing in Tampa/Clearwater during the season's first weekend (only loss: Feb. 13, 2010, 3-0 vs. Georgia Tech).

2015 Season Review

UF went 60-7 in 2015, taking the Southeastern Conference title as well as their second-straight NCAA crown. UF reached the 60-win plateau for just the third time in school history and posted its third-highest win percentage (.895).

In 2015, the Gators ranked first nationally in winning percentage, tied for first in wins, first in fielding percentage (.981), fourth in ERA (1.63), 11th in on-base percentage (.438), 22nd in scoring (6.55 runs per game), 29th in slugging percentage (.514) and 32nd in home runs per game (1.19). Defensively, Florida's .981 fielding percentage was the best mark in school history, eclipsing the .979 mark set in 2013. The Gators committed just 33 errors in 67 games, seven fewer than any previous UF squad.

Last Time Out

Behind a solid performance from Lauren Haeger in the circle, and clutch hits from the Gators offense, the University of Florida softball team won Game 3 of the Women's College World Series Championship Series over Michigan, 4-1, on Monday in front of a sell-out crowd at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium.

Still frustrated from being shutout for the first time all season in Game 2 of the WCWS Championship Series, the Gators wasted no time getting on the board. In the bottom of the first inning, Kelsey Stewart and Nicole DeWitt led off and each reached base by way of a hit-by-pitch and fielder's choice. Then, the 2015 National Player of the Year, Lauren Haeger, delivered an RBI single into center field to give UF a 1-0 lead.

Two batters later, DeWitt and Haeger were each in scoring position when Taylor Schwarz, who had just 12 RBI all season and was 1-for-11 in the NCAA Tournament, delivered a clutch two-out, two-run single to give UF a solid 3-0 advantage.

Michigan scored its lone run of the game in the top of the fifth inning on three singles.

In the circle, Haeger tossed seven innings, while giving up five hits and striking out five Wolverines. Her counterpart, UM's Haylie Wagner, who dominated UF in Game 2 of the WCWS Championship Series, started and surrendered four runs on four hits in just 2.0 innings pitched.

Preseason National Prominence

Coming off the program's second straight national championship, UF will open the 2016 season as the No. 1-ranked squad in the country, according to the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN. com/USA Softball polls.

The Gators received 26 first-place tallies (782 points) in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Poll and 17 first-place votes (495 points) in the ESPN.com Poll. Florida headlines the top five in each poll followed by Michigan, LSU, Auburn/Oregon and Alabama.

Entering his 11th season, Head Coach Tim Walton has the nation's preseason No. 1 team for the third time and second year in a row. Prior to last season, the Gators opened atop the rankings in 2009 following their record-setting 70-win campaign in 2008.

Trio of Gators Named to Preseason All-SEC Team

UF was well-represented on the preseason All-SEC with seniors Kirsti Merritt. Aubree Munro and Kelsey Stewart all making the list. Stewart is making her third consecutive appearance on the preseason team, while Merritt and Munro are making their debut.

UF and AU led all schools with three selections each. UA and LSU have two representatives apiece on the squad, while Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina and Tennessee each had one player named to the team. The list is comprised of two sophomores, one junior and 11 seniors.

Gator Duo Named to USA Softball Top 50 Watch List

Florida seniors Aubree Munro and Kelsey Stewart were named to the Top 50 "Watch List" for the 2016 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. Eight athletes, including Munro and Stewart, on the Top 50 "Watch List" will compete as a member of the 2016 USA Softball Women's National Team this summer. A season ago, Lauren Haeger became the first Gator to receive the award, which is considered the most prestigious honor in Division I women's softball.

Best of the Best (SEC Preseason Predictions)

The defending SEC Champion Gators have been picked by a vote of the league's head coaches as the preseason favorite for 2016. Florida received 10 first-place votes from the SEC's 13 head coaches, who were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

The Gators will look to win their second-straight SEC regular season crown in 2016, a feat UF last achieved in 2008 and 2009. In its history, Florida owns five regular-season SEC crowns (1998, 2008, '09, '13, '15) and three conference tournament championships ('08, '09, '13).

Back For More

Florida's senior class, top to bottom, has been one of the most successful classes in school history, boasting a 173-28 record (51-20 SEC) through three seasons at Florida. The Gator seniors were a part of two NCAA Championships (2014, 2015) and two SEC Championships (2013, 2014). The class boasts one All-American and two NFCA Academic All-Americans. Taylore Fuller has hit eight grand slams, which ranks third in NCAA history. Outfielder Kirsti Merritt is a two-time NFCA All-Southeast Region honoree and became the first freshman to ever be named the SEC Tournament MVP in 2013. Aubree Munro is a two-time WCWS All-Tournament Team selection and is regarded as perhaps the best defensive catcher in program history. Last season, Munro did not made an error in 354 chances behind the plate. Taylor Schwarz, another defensive stud for the Gators, enters this season ranked tied for fifth in career fielding percentage (.933) in Gator annals. UF's final senior is a two-time NFCA All-American and last season's SEC Player of the Year, Kelsey Stewart, who enters this season already first in Gator history for hits (293), triples (27) and steals (98) after three seasons.

Kelsey Stewart continues to rewrite Florida's record books. She owns three single season offensive records and appears in 11 top-10 offensive career lists. The Stewart three single season records are 102 hits (2014), 11 triples (2015) and 36 stolen bases (2013 & '14).

Taylore Fuller is ranked third in NCAA history in career grand slams with eight and second in UF lore. Gator Great Francesca Enea notched nine and Michigan senior Sierra Romero has the most all-time with ten.

Taylor Schwarz has turned 57 double plays and is three away from the school record set by Melissa Zick.

The longest home stand for the Gators is eight games (April 13-24). The longest road trip for the Gators is five games (Feb. 25-27) when the Gators head to Palm Springs, Calif. for the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic.

UF enters the season ranked first in the ESPN/USA Today preseason polls for the second consecutive year. Last season, Florida became the first team since Arizona in 2007 to be ranked No. 1 in the first and last polls of the year.

"When you're a highly successful program, it's about blending of competitive spirits and friendships, and getting the younger players to buy into the legacies left from class to class. The seniors to freshmen are such a big age difference, so there's a meshing period you have to go through. Our older players have been very welcoming from the beginning, but with that welcoming come expectations that you have to bring it every day." -- Tim Walton

Tim Walton has brought Florida softball to the pinnacle of success in his 10-plus years at the helm of the Gators squad. Under Walton's tutelage, Florida became the first Southeastern Conference institution in history to earn four consecutive Women's College World Series berths (2008-11). The Orange and Blue have earned a total of seven WCWS berths since Walton's arrival, with four championship series appearances and the program's first and second national titles in 2014 and 2015.

Walton reached a career milestone when he earned career win No. 600 in just his 12th season as a head coach in 2014. Coming in his 774th game as a head coach, the Gators used an 8-0 mercy-rule victory at SEC rival Texas A&M to complete a three-game sweep on Easter Sunday, making Walton the fastest active head coach in the Southeastern Conference to reach 600 lifetime victories.

Walton enters his 11th season at Florida with a 552-121 (.820) record at the head of the Gator program and a 675-185 (.785) career record in 13 seasons as a head coach. Florida has seven 50-win and three 60-win seasons in program history, all under Walton.

In his 10 years at Florida, Walton has led the Orange and Blue to countless school and SEC records, and his squads have earned numerous firsts for the Gator softball program. In 2011, UF advanced to an unprecedented fourth straight Women's College World Series, including its second trip to the Championship Series. Working as a four-time SEC Coach of the Year, Walton has led the Gators to four SEC regular-season and three conference tournament titles. UF has made the NCAA Tournament every year of his tenure, hosted Regionals all 10 times and played host to NCAA Super Regionals seven times from 2008-15. Florida reached the pinnacle of college softball in 2014, capturing the national championship with a two-game sweep of Southeastern Conference rival Alabama in the finals. This past season in 2015, Walton and his squad won the program's second-straight national title, defeating Michigan two games to one in the final of the WCWS. I

In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title. Florida joined UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.

On the softball diamond, Walton has tutored 14 Florida student-athletes to 29 NFCA All-America honors, 19 players to 44 NFCA All-Southeast Region honors, has produced 15 WCWS All-Tournament team selections (including three Most Outstanding Players), coached 19 Gator athletes to 41 All-SEC honors and racked up 17 SEC All-Tournament team honors, including three MVPs, three SEC Pitchers of the Year and four SEC Players of the Year. Most recently, Gators Kelsey Stewart and Lauren Haeger won the conference's Player and Pitcher of the Year awards in 2015, becoming UF's fourth and third honorees in program history. Additionally, Haeger brought home the 2015 Honda Sports Award, designating her as the nation's top collegiate female athlete in the sport of softball. Haeger was the second Gator to receive the Honda Award, as Kelsey Bruder was UF's first recipient in 2011. Shortly after Bruder claimed that honor, she was awarded the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award as one of the top eight NCAA athletes in the country during the 2010-11 school year.

Under Walton's direction, the Florida coaching staff has earned NFCA Southeast Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors four times and the team was one of Easton's Teams of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

In 2015, Walton and his staff were name the NFCA Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year, the first time in school history Florida has earned this accolade.

Under Walton's watch, the Gators have shattered over 300 University of Florida records since 2006. His 2008 squad recorded an NCAA-record 70 wins and posted the best SEC record in league history at 27-1. The Orange and Blue shattered its own SEC single-season walks record with 332 in 2013, while the Gators boasted a .981 fielding percentage in 2015 committing a program-record low 33 errors during the season. Florida's 2011 squad downed eight SEC records, including four team season records for runs (508), RBI (479) and walks (322), while extending its standing single-season homers record to 124. The 2012 Gator squad set the league record for slugging percentage (.627), while the 2009 Gators became only the second team to ever register a perfect conference road record (13-0).

After winning the program's first national championship in 2014, the Gators followed that by becoming just the third program in NCAA history to win back-to-back softball titles in 2015. In the 34-year history of the WCWS, 12 different teams have claimed the national title and Florida joined UCLA (2003, 2004 / 1988, 1989, 1990 / 1984, 1985) and Arizona (2006, 2007 / 1996, 1997 / 1993, 1994) as the only three programs to claim NCAA titles in consecutive years.

This season seniors Kelsey Stewart, Taylore Fuller, Kirsti Merritt, Aubree Munro and Taylor Schwarz are the elders of a squad that will start the season No. 1 and seek to join UCLA (1988-90) as the only programs to win three straight national titles.
