### UF HOSTS PSU LOOKING TO ADVANCE TO NCAA QUARTERFINALS

The Florida lacrosse squad picked up the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, its second-highest in program history, and earned the right to host NCAA First & Second Rounds at The Diz. Penn State (12-6) defeated Winthrop (20-3) Friday evening, 16-6, to solidify a date with the Gators Sunday at 1 p.m.

A berth in the NCAA Quarterfinals -- Elite 8 -- is up for grabs as the Gators take on their eighth ranked opponent in No. 11 PSU. UF will look to advance to its fifth NCAA Quarterfinals in the program's seven seasons. UF competed in the Final Four in 2012 and advanced to the quarterfinals in 2011, 2013 & 2014. **Of note, the Gators defeated Penn State 15-2 in 2012 NCAA Quarterfinal action to advance to the Semifinals that year.**

Since falling to the No. 1 team in the land March 19, Florida's only blemish on the 2016 schedule, the Gators are riding a nine-game win streak into Sunday's clash with the Nittany Lions. Florida went a perfect 7-0 in BIG EAST play, then swept through the conference tournament to win both the regular season and tourney titles, their sixth and fourth, respectively.

- The Gators boast the BIG EAST Most Outstanding Player (Nicole Graziano), Midfielder of Year (Graziano), Co-Attacker of Year (Sammi Burgess), Defensive Player of Year (Caroline Fitzgerald), Freshman of Year (Lindsey Ronbeck) and Co-Coaching Staff of the Year. Florida had seven players named all-conference and has two Tewaaraton Award Top-25 Nominees in Graziano and Fitzgerald
- Just Friday, six Gators were named IWLCA All-South Region, including four First Team selections in Graziano, Burgess, Taylor Bresnahan and Fitzgerald. Ronbeck and sophomore Shayna Pirreca were Second Team selections
- Five players were named to the BIG EAST All-Tournament Team last week in Washington, DC, including MOP Graziano, Burgess, Lauren Lea and a pair of freshmen in Sydney Pirreca and Haley Hicklen

**Florida owns the best 19-game record in Gators history, is one win away from a program-record 19 wins (went 19-3 in 2012) and is 6-5 all-time in NCAA Tournament play under head coach Amanda O'Leary.**

**2016 NOTABLES**

- **Gator head coach Amanda O'Leary entered the 2016 season as the fifth winningest active Division I coach with her .737 winning percentage in 20 years as a head coach. O'Leary is now (.276-.93, .748) overall in her career and is the 17th winningest coach all-time in the history of NCAA women's lacrosse. She boasts a record of 114-28 (.803) all-time at the University of Florida**
- **Heading into NCAA play, Florida is one win shy of a program-record 19 wins, and also boasts the best win percentage in school history at .947. UF's 18-1 start is its best 19-game record since the program started in 2010**
- UF has now won six conference titles in the program's seven seasons: 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014 American Lacrosse Conference Champions and 2015 and 2016 BIG EAST Champions

- The Gators played in the 2012 Final Four in the program's third season ever and have advanced to the NCAA Tournament every year since 2011
- A new season has brought two new faces on the Florida coaching staff in **Crysti Foote** and **Becca Block** -- both elite college players, national team members (Foote: Canada, Block: USA) and renowned coaches heading into their first seasons in Gainesville
- The Gators boast a senior class of 10 athletes, led by captains **Sydney DuPre**, **Nicole Graziano**, **Lauren Lea** & **Devon Schneider**. The senior class is now 69-13 (.841) during their tenure at Florida
- UF also boasts the No. 1 and No. 2 recruits in the 2016 freshman class in **Sydney Pirreca** and **Lindsey Ronbeck**, the latter of which was named the BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and to the IWLCA All-South Second Team. Pirreca was named to the BIG EAST All-Tournament Team after a hat trick in two straight games in DC

**GRANNY GRAZ**

Redshirt senior **Nicole Graziano**, the 2016 BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year, IWLCA All-South First Team honoree, BIG EAST Tournament MOP and five-time BIG EAST Midfielder of the Week -- referred to as grandma by her teammates -- is the lone player on this year's squad who has the taste of a Final Four. Graziano was one of two players in the country added to the Tewaaraton Watch List March 17. Graziano was a freshman on the 2012 squad that played in the National Semifinals that year, and has hit her stride down the stretch. **Since March 6, the fifth-year senior has led the Gators in goals (34), points (44), draw controls (33) and caused turnovers (19). Graz is also 10-14 on free-position goals. Graziano tied a University of Florida single-game record with five caused turnovers against No. 17 Towson.**

**Graziano has risen to the occasion in Florida's biggest games this season. Through clashes with seven ranked foes so far, Graziano has racked up team highs in goals (14), points (20), ground balls (12), draw controls (18) and caused turnovers (12).**

**PIRRECAS IN THEIR PRIME**

The Mount Sinai, N.Y., Pirreca sisters have been a 1-2 punch for the Gators offensively. After carrying Florida to victory against Michigan early in the season with a career-best four-goal splurge for BIG EAST Attacker of the Week honors for **Shayna Sydney** turned it on with a career-best five-goal outing that was key in UF's victory at North Carolina. Sydney picked up BIG EAST Freshman of the Week honors, *Inside Lacrosse* National Rookie of the Week and *Lacrosse Magazine* Player of the Week accolades for her work against the Tar Heels. Shayna's career-best sophomore season resulted in All-BIG EAST Second Team and IWLCA All-South Second Team honors. Sydney was named to the BIG EAST All-Tournament Team after notching a hat trick in each game against Georgetown and Temple. The duo has combined for 52 goals and 73 points this season. Shayna ranks first for the Gators with 17 assists and ties for fourth with 44 points.

**DEFENSE DOING WORK**

Florida ranks 10th in the nation in scoring defense (.71) to hold it down in the defensive end, and the Gator defense also puts the ball in the back of the net. UF has scored a defensive goal in eight of 19 games this season, with junior Tewaaraton Award Top-15 Nominee and BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year **Caroline Fitzgerald** netting her third, fourth and fifth career goals against Dartmouth, Niagara and most recently Villanova. First Team IWLCA All-South and All-Conference pick **Taylor Bresnahan** had one goal each against Loyola, Michigan, **Sydney Brook** and most recently Vanderbilt, while senior **Sydney DuPre** scored just her second career goal as a Gator at UNC that counted as the game-winner against the Heels.

**BALANCED ATTACK**

While UF relied heavily on All-American Shannon Gilroy last season, UF has featured a balanced attack in 2016 with a different break out player in each game. In all, 21 different players have scored, 18 of those players with multiple goals so far in 2016.

The Gators are 17-0 this season when five or more Florida players score with UF's unselfish ball distribution.

The Orange and Blue took a season-high 42 shots on the road at Villanova and the Gators rank No. 10 in the nation in scoring offense with 13.37 goals per game.

**STREAKING**

Florida junior **Mollie Stevens** has scored a goal in 33 of 35 games she has played in since May 2, 2014. Stevens had a school-record 31-game streak scoring halted against Boston College when she was issued a red card. Stevens will be UF's next 100-goal scorer in program history. She enters the Penn State game with 98 career goals and will be the third to eclipse the century mark this season (Nicole Graziano, Sammi Burgess). Also of note, senior goalkeeper **Mary-Sean Wilcox** is 17-1 on the season and has eight or more saves in UF's three top-10 road wins. Junior **Sammi Burgess** has a goal in 17 of 19 games this season and a point in 23 consecutive games. **Nicole Graziano** has scored in 18 straight games, including four goals against Temple for BIG EAST Tournament MOP honors.

**HOME COOKING**

Florida owns a 69-9 record at home in the friendly confines of Donald R. Dizney Stadium. After falling to Maryland March 19, UF has strung together home wins vs. Vandy, Temple, Marquette and UConn. The Gators will look to even out the number at 70 home wins all-time against the Nittany Lions Sunday.

**HOW HICKLEN HAS HELPED**

Freshman GK Haley Hicklen, the April 12 BIG EAST Freshman of the Week, has been a steady second go-to in the cage. Hicklen has started the second half in nearly every Gator game this season and most recently picked up BIG EAST All-Tournament Team honors after a team-best nine saves against both Georgetown and Temple in the conference tournament in DC. Hicklen picked up her first win of the season against the Hoyas. She's had a career-high six saves three times in Florida's last eight games. Hicklen additionally had a career-best outing in 41:30 against No. 17 Towson with a then-career-high five saves. Hicklen limited the Towson Tigers to just two of their seven scores on the night. Hicklen opened BIG EAST play against Vandy with a career-high six saves in 30 minutes before denying six against both Georgetown & Marquette.

**FRESH FACES**

Florida boasts the nation's No. 4 recruiting class this season, which includes the No. 1 (**Sydney Pirreca**)

In addition to Hicklen's impact in the cage this season, Pirreca and Ronbeck accounted for seven of Florida's 16 goals against North Carolina and then scored the first three goals against No. 2 Syracuse for the early 3-0 Gators lead. While Pirreca had five goals at UNC, Ronbeck notched her first hat trick against the Orange, led Florida in scoring (2 goals) and points (3) against No. 1 Maryland. Ronbeck has four times been the BIG EAST Freshman of the Week and had a career game against Marquette with five goals and seven points -- the most of a Gator this season. Freshman **Caroline Benitez** earned her first start against Temple, and first-year Gator **Madi Hall** has had significant contributions in her 12 games so far in 2016.

**DEFENSIVE DANDIES**

Junior defenders and IWLCA All-South First Team honorees **Taylor Bresnahan** and **Caroline Fitzgerald**, both 2016 All-BIG EAST Conference First Team selections, anchor the Gator defense. Florida additionally relies heavily on senior captain **Sydney DuPre** on its defensive end. Sophomore **Aniya Flanagan** has been a key cog on UF's back line since starting for the first time Feb. 20 at UNC. Florida ranks 10th in the country in scoring defense, limiting teams to 7.11 goals per game.

**TOP-NOTCH COMPETITION**

Florida has gone 6-1 against IWLCA top-20 teams, knocking off Loyola at home and North Carolina, Syracuse and Stony Brook on the road. UF followed with wins over Boston College and Towson at home. While the Gators fell short to the Terps March 19, the clash with No. 1 Maryland marked UF's seventh ranked opponent this season, third top-three foe. Florida will clash with another ranked opponent in No. 11 Penn State Sunday for the right to advance to the NCAA Quarterfinals.

**USA, USA, USA**

First year assistant coach **Becca Block** was named to the US National Team for the foreign tour of England this summer, alongside Gator great and 2015 graduate **Shannon Gilroy**. The duo will compete at Surrey Sports Park in Guildford, England, June 28 to July 4.

**PROFESSIONAL RANKS**

The United Women's Lacrosse League (UWLX) is the first professional women's lacrosse league in the world, and several Gators were a part of the inaugural draft on April 13. Former Gators **Nora Barry** (Long Island Sound), **Sam Farrell** (Baltimore Ride) and **Shannon Gilroy** (Long Island Sound) were all drafted, as was Florida assistant **Becca Block** (Long Island Sound). On May 13 after the UWLX Draft Camp, Gator assistant coach **Crysti Foote** (Baltimore Ride) and former Gator All-American **Kitty Cullen** (Baltimore Ride) were added to UWLX rosters for the upcoming season.

# AMANDA O'LEARY

**HEAD COACH** ♦ 21st Season Overall ♦ 7th Season at Florida ♦ Temple '88

Amanda O'Leary, an experienced coach who played the sport at its highest level, finished her sixth season at the helm of the Florida Gators with the program's fifth NCAA Tournament bid. O'Leary has turned her team into a national powerhouse since its inception in 2010.

Hired to lead Florida's inaugural lacrosse team on June 22, 2007, O'Leary had the opportunity to recruit and organize the program before the Gators began competition in the 2010 season.

Her impressive career record of 258-92 (.737) entering 2016 ranks among the best of active head coaches in the nation. In just six seasons, she has taken Florida to a NCAA Final Four, four NCAA quarterfinal appearances, one BIG EAST regular season, one BIG EAST tournament title, four American Lacrosse Conference regular season titles and two ALC tournament championships. She's also coached nine Gators who have earned 40 All-America honors, three Tewaaraton Award finalists and two Honda Sports Award nominees.

After five years in the ALC, the Gators found themselves in a new conference in 2015: The BIG EAST. Just as they had done in their old conference, the Gators continued their winning ways. Florida earned a tie with Georgetown for the regular season title, but blew away the competition in the BIG EAST Tournament. In the tournament, Florida's 24-point scoring margin over the two day tournament was the best mark in BIG EAST Tournament history.

O'Leary and her Gators qualified for their fifth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and the sixth-year coach led her team to a 15-10 win over Stanford in the first round. In the second round, Florida's national championship aspirations were cut short by the second-seeded North Carolina Tar Heels.

Florida saw a conference-leading eight members be named to the All-BIG EAST teams and senior midfielder Shannon Gilroy was named BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year along with a Tewaaraton Finalist for a second-straight year.

The 2014 season proved that the Florida Gators didn't need to rebuild, they just reloaded. After graduating a 13-member founding class in 2013, everyone expected Florida to take a step back and rebuild. The Gators returned three starters and had a roster featuring 22 underclassmen. After an eye-opening loss at No. 1 North Carolina to start the season, Florida banded together and embarked on an 18-3 season that featured a sweep of the ALC regular season and tournament titles as well as a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals.

The Gators finished the season ranked second nationally in scoring offense (15.00 goals per game), fourth in scoring margin (6.57) and fifth in points (412) and draw controls (15.14 per game). Individually, Tewaaraton finalist Shannon Gilroy led the nation with 86 goals and became the first Florida player in program history to score 100+ points in a season.

O'Leary was named the ILWomen Coach of the Year for the first time in her 20-year coaching career, and the ALC Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season and third overall. Shannon Gilroy was named the ALC Midfield Player of the Year and Sammi Burgess picked up ALC Rookie of the Year honors. Gilroy was also named the ALC Tournament MVP and the Gators placed four on the All-Tournament Team.

In just its second year of competition, the Florida lacrosse team reached as high as a No. 2 national ranking, won 14 consecutive games, accomplished an undefeated 11-0 home season, won the regular-season conference title outright, had six All-ALC honors, eight ALC weekly honors, six National Player of the Week recognitions, six All-America honors and, under O'Leary's watchful eye, had Kitty Cullen honored as the ALC Player of the Year and nominated for the Tewaaraton Award as only a sophomore. Following the 2011 season, O'Leary was named ALC Coach of the Year and IWLCA South Region Coach of the Year.

The Gators defeated seven ranked opponents in 2011, including eventual 2011 NCAA Champion, Northwestern, and 2010 national semifinalist, Syracuse. On April 14, Florida defeated then-No. 2 Northwestern, the six-time National Champions, handing the Wildcats their first ALC regular season loss in seven years.

O'Leary came to UF from Yale, where she led the Bulldogs for 14 seasons. Yale set the school record for season wins with 14 in O'Leary's second year (1995) and twice equaled that mark (1999 and 2003). She took Yale to two of its three NCAA Championship appearances, as the Bulldogs reached the 2003 quarterfinal round and the 2007 opening round.

During her playing career, O'Leary was a four-year starter for Temple's lacrosse and field hockey teams. A two-time All-American in both sports, O'Leary led the Owl's lacrosse team to a 19-0 record and the national championship in 1988. O'Leary was the Midfielder of the Year selection for the NCAA All-Tournament teams in 1987 and 1988 as well as the NCAA Most Valuable Player in 1988. Lacrosse Magazine also selected her as its 1988 Player of the Year.

While suiting up with Temple's field hockey team, O'Leary garnered 1986 and 1987 All-America honors and helped the Owls reach the NCAA semifinals in 1984.

In 2005, O'Leary was inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. She also became a member of the Temple Owls' Hall of Fame in the fall of 2004. O'Leary was named to the NCAA Women's Lacrosse 25th Anniversary Team in the fall of 2006.

She was the youngest player and starter on the 1989 U.S. World Cup team that claimed the International Federation of Women's Lacrosse Association (IFWLA) gold medal in Perth, Australia. O'Leary was the second-leading scorer on the 1993 U.S. World Cup team which repeated as the IFWLA World Cup champions in Edinburgh, Scotland. In the 1993 World Cup, O'Leary scored 17 points, including the game-winner versus Australia in the semifinal game.

O'Leary has also served as the chair of the U.S. Team selection and on the former U.S. Women's Lacrosse Association (USWLA) Board of Directors. She was an assistant coach with the U.S. Women's Developmental Team from 2002-05 and has been a member of the Connecticut Lacrosse Foundation Executive Committee since 1993.

She has a daughter, Madison, who is a sophomore on the Stanford lacrosse team, and a son, Ryan. She graduated cum laude from Temple in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in exercise physiology and kinesiology.

## CRYSTI FOOTE

**ASSISTANT COACH** ♦ 1st Season

Crysti Foote enters her first season as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the defending BIG EAST Champion Gators after serving four seasons as an assistant coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Louisville.

A 2006 graduate of Notre Dame, Foote was a two-time All-American and capped off her senior season with IWLCA First Team All-America honors and IWLCA Attack Player of the Year accolades. Foote was a finalist for lacrosse's highest honor, the Tewaaron Trophy, in 2006 and was the BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year. She guided Team Canada to a bronze medal in the 2009 World Cup and a silver medal in the 2013 World Cup.

Foote, who has a reputation for quality player development, has coached at all levels including high school and club, while she additionally has DIII and Ivy League experience at Drew and Columbia, respectively. Foote returned to her alma mater Notre Dame for the 2010-11 season before her last stand at Louisville the past four years.

In just Louisville's sixth season in the BIG EAST in 2014, Foote's offense helped guide the Cardinals to an undefeated 7-0 record in conference play to win both the regular season and conference tournament championships. Louisville became the first team in league history to sweep all four major awards. Foote then helped the Cardinals transition to the ACC in 2015.

While at Louisville, Foote tutored multiple-time All-American Nikki Boltja, while the Cardinals scoring offense ranked No. 8 in the country in 2013. Prior to Louisville during her stint at Notre Dame, Foote assisted in guiding

the Fighting Irish to the BIG EAST Championship Game, while ND's attackers ranked in the top 25 in the nation in both points and scoring margin in 2011.

Foote comes from a family with deep lacrosse roots, as her father William is a member of the Ontario Lacrosse Hall of Fame and is a former indoor professional player

Foote married Kyle Stratton in August, 2014.



## BECCA BLOCK

**ASSISTANT COACH** ♦ 1st Season

Becca Block, the 2013 IWLCA Defender of the Year and a U.S. Lacrosse National Team member, enters her first season as an assistant coach at the University of Florida. A 2013 graduate of Syracuse University, Block had coaching stops at Vermont (2014) and Michigan (2015) en route to Gainesville.

In addition to two years as an assistant coach under her belt, Block is in her fourth year as a member of the U.S. Lacrosse National Team after first making the team in 2012 following her junior season at Syracuse. Block has been a mainstay on the squad for the past four years.

Block arrives in Gainesville after spending the 2015 campaign an assistant coach at Michigan, where she helped guide the Wolverines to a conference tourney berth with the No. 6 overall seed in the inaugural Big Ten tournament.

Prior to her stint with the Wolverines, Block got her coaching career started as an assistant coach/defensive coordinator at the University of Vermont. She was the 2013 IWLCA Defender of the Year at Syracuse University.

In her first season as a collegiate lacrosse coach in 2014, Block helped guide Vermont to a 12-6 overall record and an appearance in the America East Tournament championship game. Under Block's guidance, the Catamounts' defense allowed just 9.50 goals per game, while their offense averaged 14.33 per outing.

The Stratham, N.H., native and 2013 team captain capped a four-year career at Syracuse in 2013 with Defender of the Year an All-America honors by both the IWLCA and Synapse Sports. The BIG EAST Conference also selected Block as its Defender of the Year and a member of the All-BIG EAST first team. Throughout her career, Block helped the Orange qualify for the NCAA Tournament on three occasions (2010, '12, '13). Under her watch, Syracuse advanced to the Final Four in 2010 and the national championship game in 2012. In 2012, Syracuse also captured the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Block, a two-time BIG EAST All-Academic honoree, graduated from Syracuse University with a bachelor's degree in health and exercise science in May 2013.

In addition to Block's collegiate playing and coaching experience, she was also a coach and counselor for the Syracuse University Elite Lacrosse Camps and helped organize and run the Laxfest Lacrosse Tournament in Syracuse, N.Y., from 2010-15.
