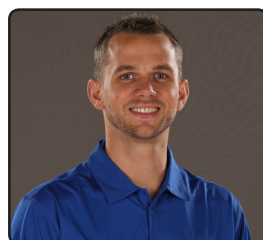

The architect of one of the most storied programs in NCAA Division I volleyball history begins her 26th season at the helm of the Florida program. The accomplishments of Mary Wise since being named head coach of the Gators in 1991 have been nothing short of unprecedented. Take 21 SEC titles, including 18 straight from 1991-2008 -- the record for most consecutive conference titles by a program in the nation, then add 25 straight NCAA Tournament bids, seven Final Four appearances, 14 SEC Coach of the Year honors and a trip to the National Championship in 2003.

Wise has coached all 35 Florida All-Americans in Gator Volleyball history. Those 35 athletes have racked up 90 All-America honors. Twelve players have been named SEC Athlete of the Year 18 times since 1992.

The list of achievements is long and cements the fact that if there has been one constant to Wise's 25-year tenure at Florida -- its unparalleled success. There hasn't been a single coach in the history of Division I men's and women's basketball, football or baseball with at least 16 seasons of coaching who can claim a better winning percentage than Wise has at Florida (.890).

Consider this: Wise became the first coach in NCAA history to win 100 consecutive games, the first to win 130 consecutive regular-season conference matches and the only coach ever to win 90 percent of her matches in her first 20 seasons at one school. She is the nation's winningest coach since the 1991 season with 767 victories (entering 2016) to her credit since her hire at Florida.

Those accomplishments led USA Volleyball to bestow on Wise the title of "All-Time Great Coach" in 2006.

Summer 2016 was a banner international year for the Gators. Two of the most prominent Florida volleyball players in program history, Kelly Murphy ('11) and Aury Cruz ('03), became the first indoor Olympians in program history. Murphy, a four-time All-American, represented Team USA in the Rio Olympics, while Cruz, a three-time All-American at UF, guided Puerto Rico to its first-ever Olympic berth before hanging up her jersey and retiring after 18 years with the Puerto Rico National Team.

In 2015, the Gators racked up a 25-7 record and finished the SEC schedule at 13-5, marking the program's 25th straight 25-win season, all under Wise. Florida advanced to the Elite Eight for the 15th time in school history and led the country in hitting efficiency with a .313 clip. Add five All-America honors, including first teamer Rhamat Alhassan, who ranked second in the nation in blocks (1.62/s) and ninth in hitting efficiency (.422).

In 2014, en route to leading the Gators to their 13th undefeated SEC season and 21st SEC Championship (28-4, 18-0 SEC), Wise hit another career milestone with her 800th career victory in dominating fashion with a 3-0 blanking of the then-No. 6 USC Trojans in L.A. to become the only active female Division I head coach to reach the milestone.

The Gators boasted the nation's hitting efficiency leader in then-freshman Alhassan (.458) for the third straight year, as Alhassan and sophomore Alex Holston were the SEC Freshman and Player of the Year, respectively. Wise picked up her 14th SEC Coach of the Year honor as the Gators notched their 24th consecutive 25-win season and trip to the NCAA Tournament, where they advanced to the Elite Eight. Four All-Americans in Alhassan (second team), Holston (first team), Mackenzie Dagostino (third team) and Simone Antwi (honorable mention) highlighted the milestone campaign for wise.

The 2013 Gators made their 23rd consecutive NCAA Tournament run after picking up the No. 5 seed, their highest since being No. 1 overall in 2010. Florida cruised to a 28-4 overall record, 16-2 in the SEC to finish second in the league race. Wise eclipsed career win No. 700 at the helm of the program, and the Orange and Blue bid farewell to a duo of seniors -- one

of the most decorate players in NCAA history, Chloe Mann, and senior setter Taylor Brauneis. Mann, a candidate for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award, left the UF program as the NCAA's record holder for career hitting efficiency (.476) and paced the entire country in 2013 with her .506 clip. UF placed four on the All-SEC Team, had a program-best six named to the AVCA All-Southeast Region Team and garnered five AVCA All-Americans, the most in school history following AVCA regional realignment.

Florida ranked second in the country in hitting percentage (.331) and fifth in the nation in kills per set (14.88). In the classroom, Florida had nine named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll, one shy of the program-best 10. The Gators represented internationally, as seven played for either Team USA or their respective national teams -- Slovenia for Živa Recek, and Puerto Rico for Naomi Santos-Lamb.

In 2012, the Gators captured the program's 20th Southeastern Conference title and advanced to its 22nd consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and Florida's 21st Sweet 16. The Gators finished the year with a 27-5 overall record to extend the nation's longest streak of consecutive 25-win seasons to 22. Florida ranked fourth in the nation in hitting percentage (.298) behind First Team All-American and SEC Player of the Year in Mann. The Gator junior led the NCAA in hitting percentage (.443) and appeared in 104 sets for the Orange and Blue, starting all 32 matches.

Another success story for Florida in 2012 was the freshman phenom in Recek, who was named AVCA National Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA South Region Freshman of the Year and SEC Freshman of the Year. A First Team All-SEC selection, Recek led the Gators in kills (440) and points (490), averaging 4.00/set. Recek shattered the Florida freshman records for kills, points and attacks in a season.

For her efforts, Wise was named the 2012 Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, the 13th time the SEC honored Wise for Florida's achievements.

In 2011, Wise led the Gators to the Elite Eight for the first time since 2005. Behind two of the greatest Gators in history, All-Americans Kelly Murphy and Kristy Jaekel, Florida led the nation in hitting percentage (.309) and finished with an overall record of 27-6. The Gators extended the nation's longest streak of consecutive 25-win seasons to 21, advancing to the NCAA Regional Semifinals.

Under her tutelage, sophomore middle blocker Chloe Mann went from relative unknown to one of the most formidable attackers in the nation, setting a new Florida program record for hitting percentage in a season (.500).

Since arriving at UF in 1991, Wise has propelled a once lackluster program into the epitome of excellence. That was never more evident than in 2010, when Wise's squad -- not voted to win the Southeastern Conference for the first time since 1991 -- engineered one of the finest campaigns in program history.

The Gators spent eight weeks at the No. 1 spot in the AVCA poll, battling through a grueling schedule to post 10 wins against top-25 opponents during the season. The early part of the schedule proved to be a gauntlet, as Florida faced nine ranked teams in its first 12 matches -- winning eight of those contests. Wise's 2010 Gators became the first team in SEC history to post a perfect 20-0 league record, as the conference instituted a 20-match double round-robin format prior to the start of the 2006 campaign. Wise's prize pupil -- junior right-side/setter Kelly Murphy -- earned AVCA First-Team All-America honors and was named the 2010 SEC Player of the Year. The Gators placed four players on the AVCA All-South Region team and Wise was named both the SEC Coach of the Year and the AVCA South Region Coach of the Year.

# HEAD COACH **MARY WISE** | 26TH SEASON

Wise joined the exclusive 700-win career club during the 2010 season, becoming just the 16th head coach in NCAA Division I history to eclipse that milestone.

The Gators hold the nation's longest streak of consecutive 25-win seasons at 25 and also have been ranked among the nation's top-15 in the final AVCA poll 24 of those 25 years. Florida owns the fourth-longest streak in the nation in consecutive NCAA appearances and is seventh in the country overall in tournament appearances.

It was in 2008 that Wise's proficiency as a true teacher of the game shined. Her squad captured an unlikely 18th consecutive league championship, which broke an NCAA Division I record for the most consecutive conference titles in the sport of volleyball. Wise guided a young squad that featured five freshmen regularly playing in the rotation to the outright league championship and an NCAA Regional Semifinal appearance.

Under her direction, Murphy, a freshman, became the first player in school history to be named the AVCA National Freshman of the Year and senior Kelsey Bowers was named the SEC Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Florida has so dominated the SEC in her tenure that Wise is one of only two coaches in conference history in any sport, men's or women's, to win as many as 18 consecutive conference titles.

Florida's success in the Wise Era, however, hasn't been limited to the conference level. The Gators went more than 10 seasons from 1994-04 without losing a regular-season SEC match -- a feat unmatched by any school in NCAA women's volleyball history. In 2003, the Gators won 105 straight games during the course of the season, smashing the previous NCAA record by 36 games.

A pioneer with tremendous vision, passion and enthusiasm for the sport of volleyball, Wise is the only female coach to appear in more than one national semifinal, and she reached the 500-win plateau faster than any other Division I female coach. A 14-time winner of the SEC Coach of the Year award (1991, 1992, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2014), Wise also has been named the national coach of the year twice (1992, 1996).

Her penchant for prosperity on the court has transcended into the regional community. Florida has ranked among the top-15 schools in the nation in attendance 24 times in the last 26 years, as countless Gator fans moved through the turnstiles at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center to provide Florida with one of the most electric, intimidating and inspiring volleyball venues in the country.

The NCAA recognized the enthusiasm of Gator fans by awarding Florida NCAA Regional hosting duties in 2006 and 2007, as UF became the first school to host back-to-back regionals and the first to host three total regionals since the pre-determined format was adopted in 2003. Florida again hosted regionals in 2009 and 2011.

As strong as the reputation that has built for her program is in the state of Florida, it extends far beyond the borders of the Sunshine State. On the forefront of increasing awareness and exposure for volleyball, Wise has ushered in a philosophy of innovation when it comes to rules changes and youth volleyball opportunities, and she is routinely regarded as one of the finest resources for coaching in collegiate volleyball.

In April of 2008, Wise helped blaze another trail for the women's volleyball community, as she played an integral role in the organization of inaugural SEC Coaches Beach Volleyball Championships, which marked the first beach volleyball tournament held by an NCAA Division I conference. Later that month, the Birmingham News named her one of the 10 most influential women's sports coaches or administrators in conference history.

Due to the advocacy of Wise and others in the coaching community, the sport of "sand volleyball" was added to the NCAA's list of emerging sports for women in the spring of 2009.

Wise served as the president of the American Volleyball Coaches Association during the 2008 year and held the position of past president

until Dec. 31, 2009.

Wise's expertise and intuition have led to numerous appointments on international coaching staffs. Most recently, Wise was named the head coach of Team USA's Collegiate National Team that competed at the World University Games in Gwangju, South Korea, in summer 2015 with Holston by her side. Wise served as the team leader of the U.S. National Team in the Pan American Cup during the summer of 2010. In May of 2006, she guided the USA Volleyball A2 Team at the U.S. Open Championships, as the volleyball community became one of the first groups to compete in a large-scale event in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina. She also directed the U.S. National "B" Team at the 1995 World University Games.

Along the way, multiple players under Wise's tutelage have gone on to earn invitations to national teams and compile individual honors. In the summer of 2005, four Gators trained with the USA Women's Volleyball National Team -- more than any other school in the country that year. Currently, Florida's only four-time AVCA All-American Kelly Murphy is a starter with the U.S. Women's National Team and made her first Olympics roster five years after graduating as a Gator.

A Florida player has earned the title of SEC Player of the Year 18 times, including Angie McGinnis in 2006 and 2007, when she became the first setter in league history to claim the honor and one of just five players in the league to win the award on multiple occasions. Since Wise's arrival at UF, 35 players have earned a sum of 90 All-America honors, including a record six combined honors by a trio of players in 2007.

In the classroom, a total of seven UF players have combined to receive 10 Academic All-America honors in Wise's career at Florida.

The Gators have also shown a commitment to playing an active role in community leadership and involvement. Each year members of the Gator volleyball team visit children at nearby Shands Hospital during the Thanksgiving holiday, while players also participate in the Goodwill Gators program. In 2003, Wise helped raise \$7,500 for the Children's Miracle Network after more than 4,000 Gator fans packed the

O'Connell Center for a match against South Carolina. She also organizes and operates the annual Mary Wise Scramble, a golf tournament that benefits PACE Alachua, which provides guidance to young girls who are experiencing conflict in school or at home.

Since winning the SEC Championship in her first season in Gainesville, Wise's affect on volleyball in the state has been nothing short of amazing. UF's annual summer camps typically draw nearly 1,700 eager athletes from all levels who travel to the UF campus in order to learn from one of the finest coaches in the country.

Fittingly, several of Wise's former players and assistants have successfully ventured into coaching, including Taylor Unroe (George Mason), Michelle Chatman (San Diego State), Jeni Jones (Central Arkansas), Prentice Lewis (Dallas), Sally Polhamus (Georgia State), Betsy Smith (Georgia State) and Ryan Theis (Marquette), to name a few. Her influence stretched even farther after Wise was the lead editor for the book "Volleyball Drills for Champions." She also produced a series of videos titled "Foundations for Successful Volleyball."

Prior to guiding the Gators, Wise honed her talents at Kentucky as an assistant for five years from 1986-90. During her progression from a graduate assistant to associate head coach, the Wildcats won a pair of SEC titles and advanced to the NCAA Championship three times. Before moving on to Lexington, Ky., Wise had previously served as the head coach at Iowa State from 1981-84. At the time of her hire, she became, at 21 years of age, the youngest Division I head coach in history before eventually guiding the Cyclones to an 81-63 record, which also included a second-place finish in the Big Eight Conference in 1984.

Wise graduated from Purdue in 1981 with a bachelor's degree in physical education after a standout career as a setter for the Boilermakers. A dean's list student, Wise was a member of Purdue's 1979 and 1980 Big Ten championship teams. A native of Evanston, Ill., Wise resides in Gainesville with her husband, Mark, and their son Mitchell (22). Son Matt (27) and wife, Katie, reside in Laramie, Wyo., as Matt enters his fourth season at the University of Wyoming as the Assistant Director of Player Development for the Cowboys' men's basketball program.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH **DAVE BOOS** | 7TH SEASON

Dave Boos, a renowned volleyball coach with over 20 years of experience at the highest level, enters his seventh season at Florida in 2016, his sixth as associate head coach for the Gator volleyball program.

Boos, a defensive mastermind who is involved in all aspects of the Florida program, has been instrumental in the Gators' success since his arrival on campus.

In 2015, the Gators advanced to the program's 15th Elite Eight behind a nation-best hitting efficiency (.313), while Florida also checked in 20th in the country in total blocks (322.5) and 23rd in blocks per set (2.76). Then-sophomore Rhamat Alhassan, an AVCA First Team All-American, posted the ninth-best clip in the NCAA (.422) and ranked second in the nation in blocks per set (1.62). Alhassan had a school record 14 roofs in Florida's season opener, the most of any player in the SEC in 2015. Her 189 total blocks were a single-season UF record. Defensively, Florida held its opponents to a .164 efficiency through the season, 22nd best in the NCAA in 2015 and tops in the Southeastern Conference.

Boos' schematics were key in guiding the Gators to their 13th undefeated SEC season and the program's 21st SEC title in 2014. Florida held its opponents to just a .172 hitting efficiency, tops in the SEC, while the Gators additionally ranked second in the league in blocks (2.37/s) and first in aces per set (1.53). The middle blocker duo of Simone Antwi and Alhassan tag-teamed for two All-America honors, while Alhassan additionally paced the NCAA with her .458 hitting efficiency en route to SEC and AVCA Regional Freshman of the Year honors.

The Gators had arguably its best passing trio in the back row in 2015 with three seniors in Maddy Monserez, Holly Pole and Taylor Unroe, who stabilized UF on serve-receive and set up the potent offense for the Orange and Blue.

Boos crafted a stellar 2013 campaign for the Gators, highlighted by SEC Libero of the Year honors for Unroe, marking just Florida's second defensive player of the year honor. Florida paced the SEC by holding its opponents to just a .173 hitting efficiency, while registering 170 service aces (1.57/s), first in the conference. Unroe was tops in the SEC with her 0.38 service aces per set, 41 overall, while ranking in the top 10 in the league with 3.84 digs per set. First Team All-American senior middle blocker Chloe Mann, a candidate for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award, registered 0.85 blocks per set -- top 20 in the conference -- to balance out her potent .506 hitting percentage, but it was sophomore AVCA All-Southeast Region Honorable Mention honoree Simone Antwi who led the Orange and Blue with 0.89 blocks per set. Antwi, who played on the USA Volleyball Collegiate National Team on the European tour over the summer, paced UF with 96.0 total blocks.

In his third season, Boos continued to impact the Gators' defensive scheme and service efforts in 2012, as UF tallied 269 blocks as a team with First Team All-American Mann averaging 1.15/set. Florida led the SEC in opponent hitting percentage (.164) and was top five in blocks (2.45/set) and service aces (1.43/set). Unroe was top five in the SEC in digs her junior campaign (4.40/set) and service aces (.32/set) while also registering the best serve receive percentage in the nation (.963).

The Gators' defense was phenomenal in 2011, as Florida registered 2.38 blocks/set (third in the SEC) with both starting middle blockers averaging nearly a block/set. The Gators' service game was equally stellar, leading the SEC in aces/set (1.56). Senior outside hitter Kristy Jaeckel averaged .42 aces/set to lead the SEC and rank 27th in the nation, and senior setter/right-side hitter Kelly Murphy was fifth in the conference with .32 aces/set.

Boos made a dynamic impact during the 2010 campaign, primarily with the team's defensive scheme and service efforts. Those two areas flourished in Boos' first season with the Gators as Florida led the Southeastern Conference in both blocks per set (2.84) and service aces per set (1.64). The Gators ranked 10th nationally in rejections per frame and 21st in the country in aces per set. Junior middle blocker Cassandra Anderson led the conference and ranked 28th in the nation

in blocks per set at 1.27, while junior right-side/setter Kelly Murphy was the conference leader and 32nd in the country in service aces per set at 0.40.

Boos joined the Gators after spending three seasons as the head coach at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind. He re-built a storied Cardinals program, tripling the team's win total from his first season in his final year of 2009. Exemplifying his prowess as a recruiter, four players from Boos' 2010 recruiting class were named to PrepVolleyball.com's list of Senior Aces.

Boos re-united with Wise after serving as her assistant coach on the USA A2 Women's National Team in May 2006. On that squad, he acted as defensive coordinator, while assisting in practice planning and opponent scouting. Additionally, his international experience includes serving as a coaching intern on the USA National Training Team in February 2003.

Boos joined Ball State after five seasons as the associate head coach at Minnesota from 2002-06 under former head coach Mike Hebert. He helped the Gophers to a 142-38 overall record, including an 80-20 Big Ten mark.

Minnesota reached the NCAA Tournament in each of Boos' five years on the staff, earning trips to the national semifinals in 2003 and 2004, including the school's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I National Championship match in 2004. He also assisted a team that captured the program's first ever Big Ten Championship in 2002.

Prior to joining the Minnesota coaching staff, Boos spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana (1999-2001), where he helped guide the Hoosiers to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1999. Boos began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Wisconsin-Oshkosh from 1995-98.

During his time in the Big Ten, Boos helped guide his student-athletes to 33 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 14 All-Big Ten honors, 12 AVCA All-Region awards, 10 AVCA All-America accolades, four Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honors, four NCAA Division III All-America selections, one Big Ten Player of the Year and one NCAA Division III Player of the Year.

Boos was a player for the Wisconsin-Oshkosh men's club team from 1994-1999 and served as the club's head coach from 1996-1999. He led the team to the National Intramural-Recreational Sports Association Division II National Championship as the setter and head coach in 1996. A four-time First Team All-Wisconsin Volleyball Conference selection, Boos guided the program to conference championships in 1997, 1998 and 1999. The 1998 squad finished the season ranked in the NIRSA Division I Top 5. Boos compiled a 144-36-4 overall record as the club's coach.

Boos graduated cum laude from Wisconsin-Oshkosh with a bachelor's of science degree in 1998. He is married to the former Amy Ward and the couple welcomed their first child, Kaelyn, in 2012 and son, Ethan, in 2015.

Shannon Wells enters her third season with the Gators as an assistant coach and UF's recruiting coordinator. In her first two seasons, working primarily with Florida's setters, Wells tutored Mackenzie Dagostino to two All-SEC and two AVCA All-America nods in 2014 and 2015.

In 2015, Dagostino ranked 18th in the nation in assists per set (11.38) and 31st in the country in total assists (1,286). Under Wells' tutelage, Dagostino ended her career ranked No. 4 all-time at UF in career assists (2,727) as the Gators posted the best hitting efficiency in the nation (.313).

In Wells' first season in 2014, the Gators went undefeated in the SEC for the 13th time in school history to win the program's 21st SEC Championship. Dagostino finished the 2014 season 13th in the NCAA with 11.50 assists/s and 23rd in the nation 0.41 aces/s. Dagostino was additionally the starter for the USA Collegiate National Team on the China Tour.

Wells arrived in Gainesville in the spring of 2014 after serving as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for Ole Miss 2013, and prior to her promotion to associate head coach as a three-year assistant coach at Ole Miss.

Before her time on the Rebels' coaching staff, Wells spent three seasons as an assistant coach with the Winthrop Eagles of the Big South Conference under former Florida assistant and Georgia State head coach Sally Polhamus. Before heading to Winthrop in 2007, Wells began her coaching career at her alma mater, the University of Southern Indiana, as an assistant coach before operating as a graduate assistant for two years at Morehead State in 2005 and 2006.

An alumna of USI, Wells played four seasons and helped lead her team to 87 wins over that time span - including a school record 27 wins in the 2000 campaign. She ranks first all-time at USI in service aces and kills for her career. A two-time selection as the Great Lakes Valley Conference Scholar Athlete of the Year, Wells was also named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team in 2002 and was a three time GLVC All-Academic team selection.

For her accomplishments in college, Wells was just the second volleyball player to be inducted into the USI Hall of Fame in February 2013.

She was most recently inducted into the 2015 Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) Hall of Fame.

### AT OLE MISS

During her time at Ole Miss, Wells played a significant role in the development of a number of different Rebel volleyball student-athletes who have successfully re-written the Ole Miss record books. Wells mentored 2013 senior outside hitter Kara Morgan - who finished in the top six in school history in career kills, aces, and digs - during her four-year college career.

As the Ole Miss offensive coordinator in 2012, Wells tutored setter Amanda Philpot to a single-season school record assists, and as the defensive coordinator for the Rebels in 2010 & 2011, Wells helped guide libero Morgan Springer to the first and third-place spots in the record book for single-season digs en route to being Ole Miss' all-time dig leader. Springer additionally holds the top spot for career service aces in school history.

As the Ole Miss recruiting coordinator, Wells reeled in five Rebel student-athletes in Morgan, Aubrey Edie, Ty Laporte, Nakeyta Clair and

Kristen Brashear who have worked their way on to Ole Miss' top-10 lists in kills, digs, assists & blocks under Wells' tutelage, four of those athletes still underclassmen.

Wells helped lead the Rebels to the 2010 NCAA Tournament, coached two SEC All-Freshman Team members, a USA A2 squad member and two-time All-American Regina Thomas during her time in Oxford.

### AT WINTHROP

In her three seasons at Winthrop, Wells helped lead the Eagles to a conference championship and a 20-win season. She helped guide Winthrop to the Big South Championship in 2007 when the Eagles captured a share of the regular season title with an 11-1 mark in conference play. She also worked with Big South Player of the Year Shannon Sitzmann as the Eagles finished 20-11 on the season.

In 2009, the Eagles finished 19-11 overall and 11-5 in Big South play while producing yet another Big South Player of the Year selection in Kelley Taylor.

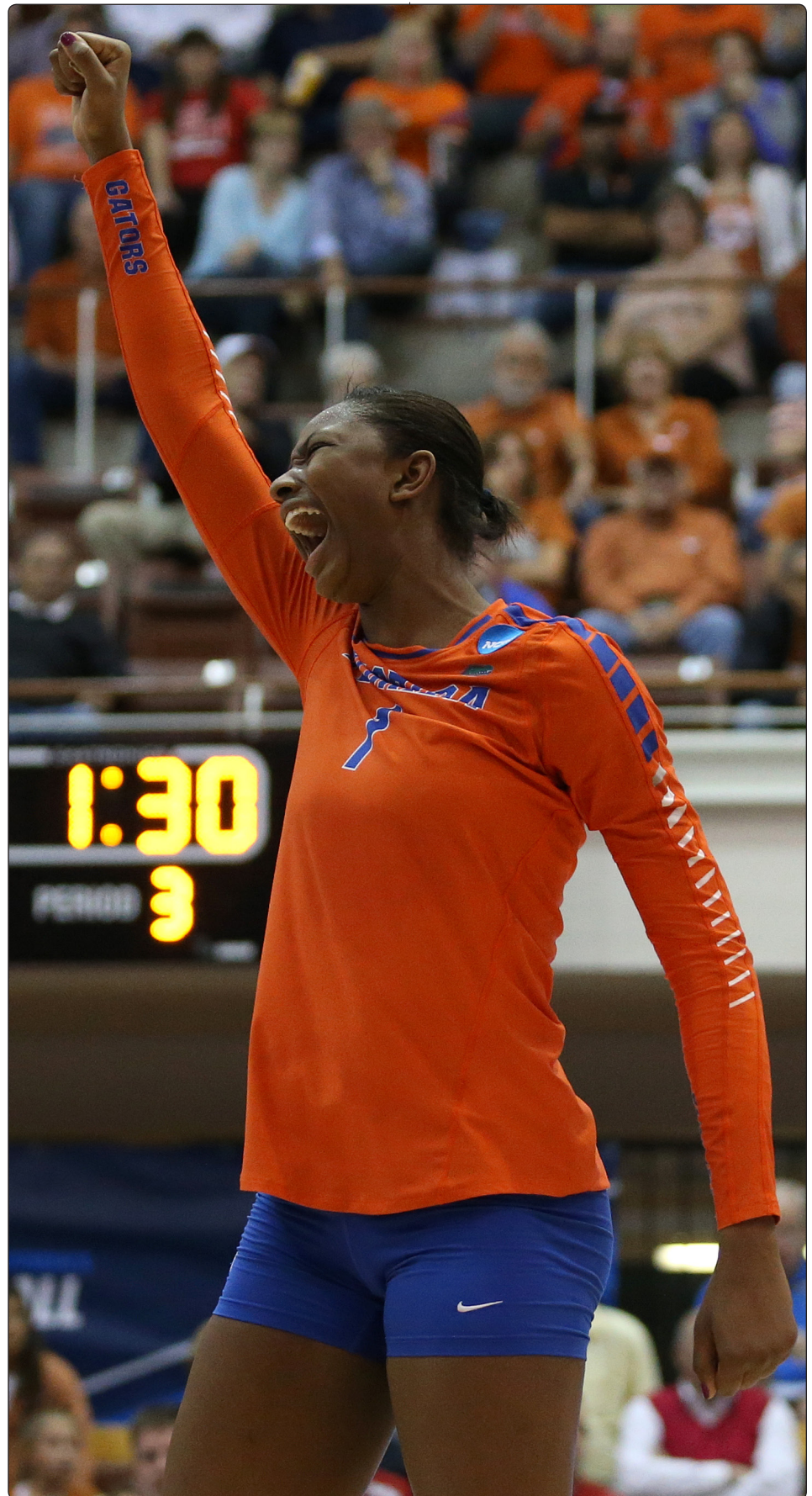

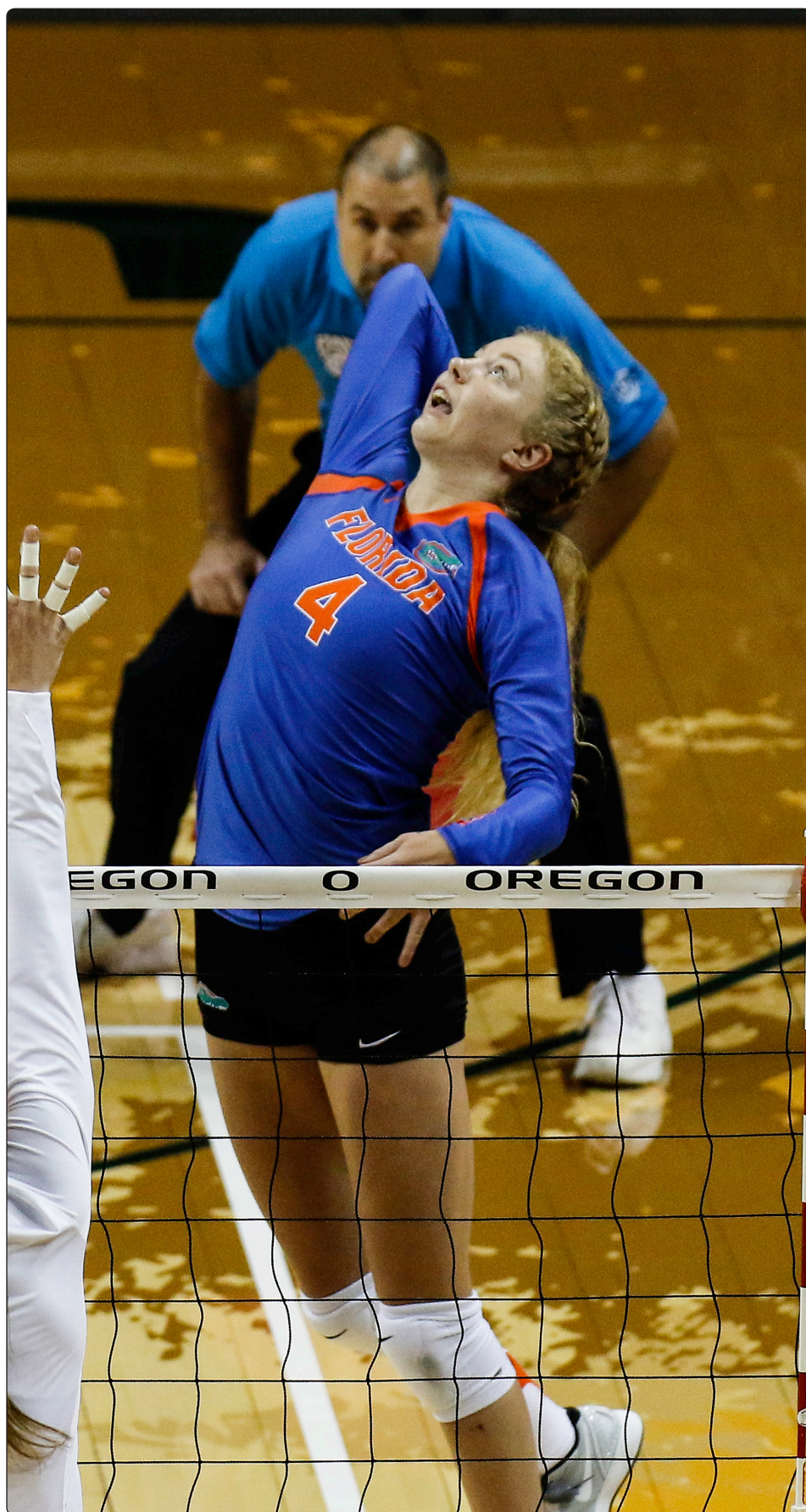

# FLORIDA VOLLEYBALL TIMELINE

## JANUARY 3, 1984

Marilyn McReavy is hired as the Gator volleyball coach. Volleyball was reinstated to varsity status in 1984 after the program was cut in 1978 due to a struggling financial situation.

## DECEMBER 4, 1987

The Gator volleyball team earns its first ever berth in the NCAA Tournament. Florida defeats Louisiana State, 3-2, in the first round of the tournament to reach the round of 16.

## SEPTEMBER 1, 1989

Head coach Marilyn McReavy earns her 500th career coaching victory with a 15-0, 15-5, 15-4 victory against South Alabama in Memphis, Tenn. McReavy becomes only the fifth coach in women's Division I volleyball at the time to reach the 500-win plateau.

## MARCH 25, 1991

Mary Wise is named head coach of the Gator volleyball team. She joins Florida after serving five years with the University of Kentucky Wildcat volleyball program, first as a graduate assistant, then assistant coach, then elevating to the position as associate coach.

## SEPTEMBER 17, 1991

The Gator volleyball team, under the leadership of first year head coach Mary Wise, enters the AVCA Top 20 poll at No. 17, marking the first time Florida has appeared on the AVCA poll since its inception in 1981. The 1987 UF squad was ranked 20th in the final NCAA poll of that season.

## OCTOBER 28, 1991

Florida is ranked No. 5 in AVCA volleyball poll - the highest ranking to date in the program's history.

## NOVEMBER 22, 1991

The Gators defeat Ole Miss to earn share of school's first ever SEC Volleyball Championship. Four days later, Wise is named AVCA/Tachikara South Region Co-Coach of the Year.

## DECEMBER 13, 1991

Florida defeats Texas 3-1 to advance to school's first ever appearance in NCAA Volleyball Tournament Final Eight.

## DECEMBER 18, 1991

Gudula Staub becomes the first player in Gator volleyball history to earn All America honors when she is named to the first team of the AVCA/Tachikara All America team.

## NOVEMBER 22, 1992

The Gators defeat South Carolina for their first outright SEC volleyball championship. Two days later, Wise is selected AVCA/Tachikara National Coach of the Year. It is the first time a Gator volleyball coach has earned a national award.

## NOVEMBER 28, 1992

Florida defeats LSU to win its first SEC Volleyball Tournament. Gudula Staub becomes the first Gator to ever earn tournament MVP honors.

## DECEMBER 12, 1992

Down 2-0 to Texas in the NCAA South Regional volleyball final, Florida rallies to win the next three

games and to advance to the school's first ever appearance in the NCAA Women's Volleyball Final Four.

## AUGUST 11, 1993

The volleyball team is ranked No. 10 nationally in the American Volleyball Coaches of America (AVCA) preseason poll.

## NOVEMBER 9, 1993

A then-school record 6,132 volleyball fans turn out to see the Gators defeat Florida State. The 6,132 attendance figure was the second-highest number in the nation for volleyball at the time.

## NOVEMBER 25, 1993

Mary Wise is named SEC Coach of the Year in volleyball for the third consecutive season - a conference record and Florida ties the SEC record with five All-SEC volleyball selections.

## DECEMBER 11, 1993

The Gators advance to their second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Women's Volleyball Final Four after defeating No. 2 Texas 3-2 in the South Region Championship in Austin, Texas. The Longhorns are the highest-ranked team Florida had ever defeated.

## SEPTEMBER 1, 1994

Florida rewrites the NCAA record book by defeating Stetson for its 56th consecutive home win.

## OCTOBER 14, 1994

A school-record 8,163 fans fill the O'Connell Center to see the Gators defeat Georgia.

## NOVEMBER 1, 1996

Florida earns the AVCA No. 1 ranking for the first time in school history.

## DECEMBER 1, 1996

Florida earns the No. 2 overall seed in the NCAA Championship - UF's highest seed ever awarded.

## DECEMBER 13, 1996

The Gators defeat No. 7 Michigan State in four games at the O'Connell Center to advance to the program's third Final Four.

## AUGUST 15, 1997

Florida is ranked No. 4 in the AVCA Preseason Poll - the first time in school history UF earned a preseason top-five ranking.

## DECEMBER 14, 1997

No. 8 Florida upsets fourth-ranked Wisconsin on its home court after coming back from an 0-2 deficit to make UF's fourth NCAA Final Four.

## DECEMBER 10-11, 1998

The Gators knock off historical powers Southern California and Hawai'i on back-to-back nights in the O'Connell Center to advance to their fifth Final Four in eight years.

## MAY 18, 1999

Florida senior Jeni Jones is honored with the Honda Inspiration Award. Jones overcame a rare neurological disease to help lead her squad to the 1998 NCAA National Championship Semifinals.

## AUGUST 26, 1999

Eighth-ranked Florida wins a five-game thriller against No. 1 Penn State at the NACWAA Classic in Lincoln, Neb. - the win was the first in school history against a No. 1 ranked team.

## NOVEMBER 12, 2000

The Gators clinch their 10th consecutive regular season SEC title with a win on the road against South Carolina.

## NOVEMBER 17-19, 2000

UF again hosts the SEC Tournament and wins all nine games it plays in to earn the Gators' ninth SEC Tournament title in 10 years.

## NOVEMBER 11, 2001

Florida caps off its seventh consecutive undefeated SEC season en route to its 11th consecutive league title. It marks the ninth undefeated conference season in program history.

## SEPTEMBER 29, 2002

Florida sets an NCAA record for most consecutive regular-season conference wins with 100. The Gators do so with a 3-0 sweep of Mississippi State in Starkville. Florida eclipses the record of 99 consecutive conference wins set by Western Michigan from 1982-89. The last conference match that Florida had lost during the regular season was a 3-1 decision to South Carolina in the final regular-season match in 1994.

## DECEMBER 17, 2003

Senior Aury Cruz becomes the first player in school history to be named a first-team All-America selection three times in her career. Earlier that month, she had become the first-ever three-time SEC Player of the Year.

## DECEMBER 18, 2003

The Gators advance to their first NCAA volleyball championship match in school history with a 3-1 win against Hawai'i in the national semifinal in Dallas. Florida was appearing in the national semifinals for the seventh time in program history.

## SEPTEMBER 15, 2006

Head Coach Mary Wise wins her 500th match in just her 552nd contest at UF, which was believed to have made her the fastest coach in NCAA Division I history to win 500 matches at one school. She does so with a 3-0 win at Georgia in Athens. She becomes just the second coach in the 100-plus year history of Florida athletics to amass as many as 500 wins as a Gator coach - former baseball coach Dave Fuller was the other.

## JANUARY 18, 2008

The Gators set a single-season school record with six total All-America honors during the 2008 campaign.

## APRIL 12, 2008

Florida plays host to the first-ever SEC Coaches Beach Volleyball Championships at the Southwest Rec Center. Just more than a year later, "sand" volleyball is added to the NCAA's list of emerging sports.

## NOVEMBER 26, 2008

Florida sets an NCAA Division I record by winning its 18th consecutive SEC regular-season title. The

Sophomore Chloe Mann turns in the weekend of a lifetime hitting a blistering .589 (37-4-56) with 37 kills and 10 blocks. The Gators triumphed over Arkansas, 3-2, marking the first time since September 6, 2008 that Florida rallied from an 0-2 deficit to defeat an opponent and the first time since September 21, 2001 that the feat was accomplished on the road.

## DECEMBER 9, 2011

The Gators sweep Michigan to reach the Elite Eight for the first time since 2005. Seniors Kristy Jaeckel and Kelly Murphy are both named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional Team.

## SEPTEMBER 16, 2012

The Gators sweep Kentucky in the 1,000th match played in Florida history. The Gators were 842-180 all-time heading into the 2013 season.

## DECEMBER 2, 2013

Junior libero Taylor Unroe named the SEC Libero of the Year, just the second-ever defensive player of the year award. Shortly after, the Gators earned their 23rd consecutive NCAA Tournament berth.

Wise, the nation's winningest coach since taking over at the helm of the University of Florida volleyball program in 1991, is the third-winningest active Division I coach in the country (.843 win percentage) in her 28th season as a head coach.

## DECEMBER 17, 2014

Four Gators were named All-Americans, most notably freshman Rhamat Alhassan. Alhassan, an AVCA Second Team All-American, was the SEC Freshman of the Year and the AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year. Alhassan led the nation in hitting efficiency (.458) to give the Gators the nation's leading hitting efficiency leader for three consecutive seasons.

## AUGUST 29, 2015

Rhamat Alhassan opens the 2015 campaign with 14 block assists at James Madison, a single-match school record and career high for the then-sophomore. Alhassan would go on to rank second in the nation in blocks in 2015 with 1.62 per set and set a single-season school record with 189 total blocks.

## DECEMBER 12, 2015

Florida competes in the program's 15th Elite Eight appearance against Texas. While the Gators fell short in five, UF notched its 25th consecutive 25-win season under Mary Wise. Florida boasts the fourth-longest streak in the nation in consecutive NCAA appearances (Penn State, Stanford, Nebraska) and is seventh in the country overall in tournament appearances (26).

## AUGUST 20, 2016

Florida boasts the program's first indoor volleyball Olympians in program history for Rio 2016. Kelly Murphy (USA) and Aury Cruz (Puerto Rico) represent the Gators in Rio. Murphy earns a bronze medal with Team USA as the Americans defeated the Netherlands in the Bronze-Medal Match to win the Gators' first-ever Olympic Medal. Cruz and Puerto Rico reached the country's first-ever Olympic Games under the veteran Cruz's leadership. Cruz retires from the Puerto Rican National Team following the Olympics.

## SEPTEMBER 16, 2016

Florida opens a new season in a new venue: The Lemerand Athletic Center, while the Stephen C. O'Connell Center undergoes a \$64.5 million renovation, set to be complete in December 2016.

## A WHOLE NEW LOOK

THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE APPEARED IN THE 1984 FLORIDA VOLLEYBALL MEDIA GUIDE:

For one thing, Florida's volleyball program could qualify as one of relative obscurity, considering that UF has not fielded a team since 1978. The athletic department was forced to cut the school's volleyball and wrestling programs in '78 to combat a struggling financial situation.

However, Florida managed to put a pretty respectable team on the courts from 1975 until 1978. Coach Kay Johnson guided UF's first-ever squad to a 12-9 record, playing a schedule that was composed entirely of Florida teams.

The 1976 season brought a new coach and several out-of-state opponents into Florida Gym. Coach Jill Stumpe's squad took on Southeastern Conference opponents for the first time and found the competition to be a bit tough. The team registered 16 wins against 18 losses.

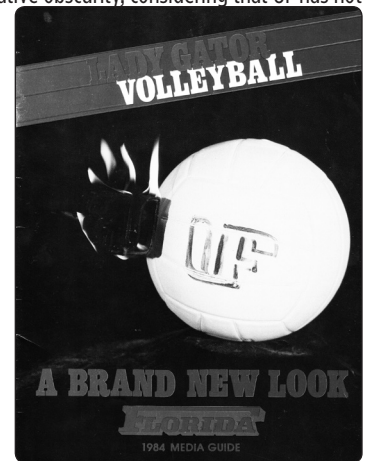
The 1977 season was a tough one for the Gators, as Florida finished third in the state tournament and managed only one win in the AIAW Region III Tournament.

Florida saved its best for last, as the Gators posted a 25-21 record and a runner-up finish in the 1978 state tournament. Janet Appleby was named to the Caribbean Invitational All-Star team and was awarded honorable mention honors at the AIAW Tournament. Appleby shared team MVP honors with Shirley Kendrick and Shirlee Mussleman as given the freshman award.

Volleyball is back. With the appointment of Marilyn McReavy to serve as head volleyball coach, the University Athletic Association strengthened its continuing commitment to support a women's athletics program of excellence both in the SEC and on the national level.

Florida narrowly missed capturing the first-ever All-Sports Trophy for women in the SEC this past year. However, it is hoped that with the reinstating of the volleyball program, the Lady Gators can make a strong surge for the prestigious trophy for many years to come.

What lies ahead for the Lady Gator volleyball teams of the future? Well, if history tends to repeat itself, Gator fans will be able to see the nation's best women's collegiate volleyball right here in Gainesville. It appears that Florida fans will definitely see a brand new look in Lady Gator volleyball, both in '84 and in the future.



The 1987 volleyball team became the first squad in school history to advance to the NCAA Tournament. The Gators defeated Southeastern Conference rival LSU in the first round before falling to Texas in Austin the next week. That postseason appearance would be the first of 26 such NCAA bids in program history. Florida has advanced to the NCAA Tournament for 25 straight seasons under current head coach Mary Wise.

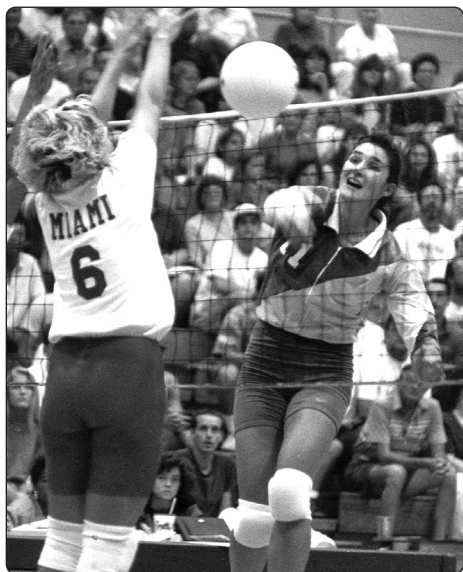

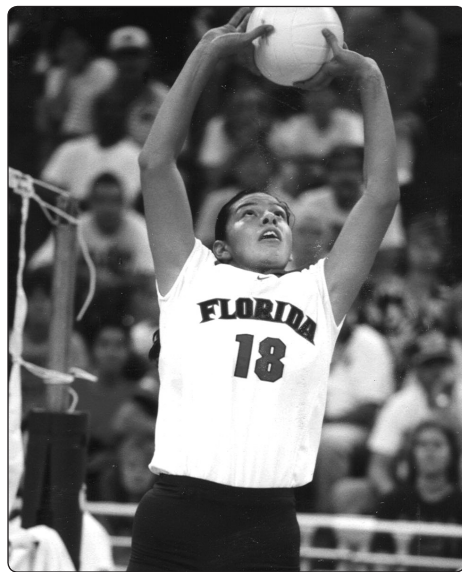

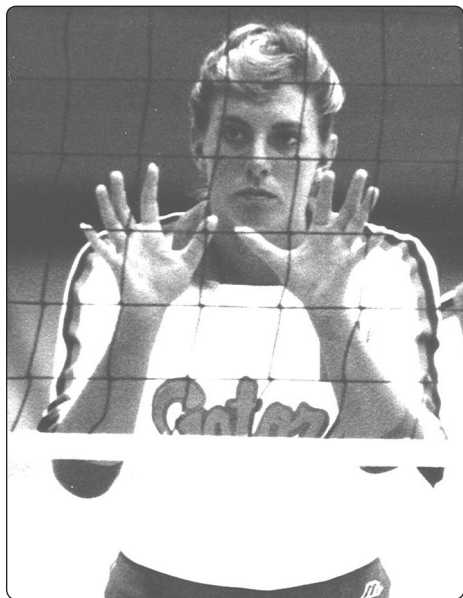

# STEPHEN C. O'CONNELL CENTER

Florida's Stephen C. O'Connell Center has a reputation around the Southeastern Conference and throughout the nation - enthusiastic and friendly if you're a Gator ... noisy, deafening and menacing if you're the opposition. When you watch the Gators play in the O'Connell Center, you hopefully not only go home with a win, but also with a smile on your face.

UF welcomes its competition, affectionately known as "Gator Bait," with a pre-match show like none other. Spotlights, four video boards, a light show and thunderous music highlight the team introductions before the crowd erupts in darkness. As the lights burst on, the whistle for the first serve blows. Additionally, Florida's mascots - Albert and Alberta, the band, cheerleaders, the Dazzlers dance team, state-of-the-art shutter lighting system, four video boards, in-game statistics boards, and, of course, the best fans in the country provide an atmosphere that is unmatched in Division I volleyball.

The Gators play on their own volleyball-specific floor, which has been home to many Gator volleyball achievements. The O'Connell Center played host to Florida's 58-match home win streak (Oct. 14, 1990-Sept. 4, 1994), which at the time was the nation's longest winning streak. The O'Connell Center is such an intimidating venue that the Gators have posted nine undefeated seasons at home and have won nearly 90 percent of their matches at home since 1991 - one of the top percentages in the nation.

It has been the home venue for First and Second Round competition in 24 of the last 25 years. Eleven NCAA Regionals have been contested in the O'Connell Center, four of which sent the Gators to the NCAA Final Four.

"Our success is due in part to the support we receive both by the UF administration and the community," UF head coach Mary Wise said. "We have in the O'Connell Center a venue that is one of the best places to watch and play volleyball. Our fan base has created an atmosphere where a home match is an event."

Florida has ranked among the top-15 schools in the nation in attendance 24 times in the last 25 years, as countless Gator fans moved through the turnstiles at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center to provide Florida with one of the most electric, intimidating and inspiring volleyball venues in the country.

The Gator Attack Club, Florida's volleyball booster organization, is one of the largest groups in the nation. The members sponsor the season-ending banquet, as well as other approved activities, and supports visiting teams during tournaments as well.

The Rowdy Reptiles are the official student group of Florida

athletics. The Rowdy Reptiles united together create a home field advantage for Gator teams and generate an electric atmosphere at all venues. The Rowdy Reptiles support all Gator teams and are rewarded for their dedication to the Gator Nation by receiving points and various levels of prizes when they attend home athletic events.

At Florida, Gator volleyball players interact with their fans in all kinds of ways, including signing autographs after matches. Post-match spikeline and several clinics throughout the year also are offered. The 21-time SEC Champion Gators make the atmosphere at home matches enjoyable for fans of all ages.

## COMING SOON: EXACTECH ARENA AT THE STEPHEN C. O'CONNELL CENTER

The multipurpose Stephen C. O'Connell Center, named for a former University of Florida president, features a main arena covering more than 3.6 acres and containing 292,000 square feet. In addition to the main Exactech Arena, there is a practice court, two weight rooms, a natatorium, an indoor track, a private gymnastics arena, dance studio, martial arts studio and several classrooms.

The facility is currently undergoing a \$64.5 million renovation, set to be complete December of 2016.

Gator fans won't have to go far to take in a UF volleyball match this season, as the Lemerand Athletic Center, right on the UF campus, will be the home of Florida Volleyball for the 2016 season while the Stephen C. O'Connell Center continues a \$64.5 million renovation. With a capacity of approximately 700 in the Lemerand Athletic Center Gym, 2016 Florida Volleyball tickets will be the hottest ticket in town, and the intimate atmosphere will be second-to-none.

The Lemerand was the site for Florida's 3-2 opening round win over Texas Tech in the 1995 NCAA Championship action, marking the last match played in the Lemerand during fall-season action.
