“The Florida Times Union,”
“The Atlanta Georgian”

I also used the “Sanborn Fire Maps”

Except for the “Atlanta Georgian” all of these newspapers are available on microfilm at the University of Florida’s Smathers Library. In addition, the “Gainesville Daily Sun” (1906-1909), “The Weekly True Democrat” (1909) and “The University News” (1906-1907) are all available online thru the Smathers Library. “The Atlanta Georgian” (1906-1907, 1910) is only available online at the University of Georgia Library thru Galileo and Atlanta Newspapers. The “Sanborn Fire Maps” are available online at the Smathers Library.

After you have looked over my suggested corrections, I would appreciate knowing if any are not accepted. I would like to have the ability to prove my assertions. There is more evidence out there. I know that you and your staff are very busy at this time, so let me know of any problems as soon as you are able.

This game was actually played by the Jacksonville All-stars and the Savannah AC. Captain Corbett's comment about "We crowed again" actually refers to the fact that the Jacksonville all-Stars were unable to score on Savannah. A careful reading of the complete article make that clear. UF was very proud of the fact that they claimed to score two points on Savannah.

#Note: If the UF had played the All-Stars that day, Captain Corbett would certainly have mentioned that UF had beaten their own coach, who was playing for the All-Stars at that time. (Florida Times Union:11/30, 1906 "Savannah takes an Easy Victory" p.2)

The two victories over Jacksonville AC (actually Riverside AC) in 1907 and the two victories over Jacksonville AC (actually Riverside AC) in 1908 should be added to the game and win record for Riverside AC. The second claimed victory of 1906 over Riverside AC should be subtracted from the record because UF did not participate in this game, Savannah AC did.

*Note: The University News Article of Jan. 5, 1907 only mentions the second Riverside game when commenting that they were shutout by Savannah AC and that the UF team had scored a safety.

Error Line: 1906-1911 When the Gator football program started in 1906 under Head Coach James Forsythe, prior to the existence of the Swamp, Florida played home football games in Gainesville at the "ball park field", which is now located on the old Arlington Street bordering the Utility Center. The Gators compiled an 18-1-1 record from 1906-1911.

Correct Information: 1906-1910 When the Gator football program started in 1906 under Head Coach James Forsythe, prior to the existence of the Swamp, Florida played home football games in downtown Gainesville at the “Ballpark”, which was located south of Market St.(SW 5th Ave.) and bordered to the east by Garden St.(SW 1st St.), to the west by Arredonda St.(SW 3rd St.) and to the south by Depot Ave. The Gators compiled an 14-0-1 record from 1906-1910.

Numerous issues of the Gainesville Sun during this period mention the site of all Gator home games during this period as the “Ballpark” or the local gridiron(same location).

*Gainesville Daily Sun Article: “New Baseball Diamond”, The old baseball diamond is no more. The wall fence.....has been torn down and removed. The fence was purchased by the Athletic Association of UFconstructing a diamond near the University. (This purchase also included the old grandstand).

*Gainesville Daily Sun Article: “The Spring Normal Work at University”,hereafter all games will be played on the University field. The Athletic Association is enclosing the groundsbuilding a grandstand.

*Gainesville Daily Sun Article: “University Lost By The Score of 12 to 4”, The grounds were in fine shape, a new grandstand being built and the grounds enclosed. The carpenter work was done by the students....

*Sanborn Fire Map: Gainesville, Alachua County, Florida 1909, this map does show that the ballpark was not located just south of W. Arlington St. The ballpark was located just south of W. Market St. It was a common practice for the Sanborn maps to not show open fields without structures, so the ballpark is not labeled or shown on the map.

#Note: Two games in 1906 season that were not played by UF (Athens AC & 2nd Riverside AC), the 1907 Mercer game, which was actually an away game and the 1909 Tallahassee game that was actually played in Tallahassee have been subtracted from the timeline totals. Two 1911 home games, that were victories, also have been subtracted and added to the Fleming Field timeline totals.

Error Line: 1912-1929 From 1912-1929, Florida football was played at Fleming Field on the UF campus. Situated just north of the current Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, the Gators went 46-6-1 on Fleming Field prior to playing on Florida Field.

Correct Information: 1911-1929 From 1911-1929, Florida football was played in an area located just north of the current Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. In its earlier days, this area was known as the University Park and the University Athletic Field. In the Fall of

1915 the area was renamed Fleming Field. The Gators went 48-6-1 on Fleming Field prior to playing on Florida Field.

*Gainesville Daily Sun Article: "FOOTBALL" game ad....University Park.

#Note: Two Victories(1911) were taken from the Ballpark era and added to the 1911-1929 (Fleming Field) era.

The University News Article: "University on the Gridiron", Captain Corbett's season review , in reference to the Georgia University town was snowed under 10-0, Guess the F team didn't do so worse. He is making reference to the fact that at least UF scored on the Savannah AC team and was not shut out like UGA. He was not claiming a victory over an Athens AC team that wasn't even involved in the game between UGA and Savannah

AC. The UGA vs. Savannah game was played on Monday, Dec. 1. UF Media Guide claims their game with Athens AC was played in Athens on Nov. 18, which just happens to be the day after Coach Forsythe announced in Jacksonville that the UF team was disbanded and would play no more games.

#Note: If needed additional evidence can be provided that shows that UGA played Savannah AC on Dec. 1 and that Savannah won the game. The Gainesville Daily Sun, the University News nor the Florida Times Union have any coverage of a Athens AC game with UF during the 1906 season.

The University News Article: "University on the Gridiron", Captain Corbett's season review, in reference to...and when Jacksonville was laid away 39-0 we crowed again. He is making reference to the fact UF at least scored on Savannah AC. He was not making a claim of victory over Jacksonville AC which was actually an All-Star team. Later in the article, he states that the team finished the season with the 11/9 Rollins away game and that the team finished the season with a 3-3 record. Captain Corbett made no claim of victory over Athens AC or Jacksonville AC nor did he describe the games in this season review article.

#Note: There was plenty of coverage in the Florida Times Union concerning this game between the Jacksonville All-Stars and Savannah AC, a game played in Savannah on Nov. 29 and won by Savannah by the score of 39-0. The Jacksonville Team, with a roster of the best players in Jacksonville and our own player/coach Forsythe, returned to Jacksonville by train on Dec. 1. The Florida Times Union has no coverage of a claimed UF victory over a Jacksonville AC team on Dec. 30. All of the best Riverside players were on the Jacksonville All-Star team, which was still out of town.
