HEAD COACH GREGG TROY



The summer of 2012 brought major accomplishments to an already stellar resume for Head Coach Gregg Troy. Troy served as the 2012 USA Men's Olympic Swim Team head coach in London, England, as the U.S. men won 16 medals during the Games. In coordination with his success with the University of Florida and his international coaching resume, Troy was inducted into the American Swimming Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2012.

Troy has brought the University of Florida swimming and diving program back to the national spotlight after winning the women's program's second NCAA Title in 2010, the first since the Gators won the inaugural NCAA Championship in 1982. As a result of his success during the 2010 season, Troy was named the 2010 USA Swimming Coach of the Year, 2010 and 2011 ASCA Coach of the Year, 2010 NCAA Women's Swimming Coach of the Year and 2010 SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year. A top-10 NCAA contender in his 19 years at the helm of the University of Florida women's swimming team and 18 as the leader of the men's program, Troy has created an atmosphere of consistency and excellence around both the men's and women's Gator swimming and diving programs. The result has been the elevation of one of the most storied collegiate programs to even higher levels of success.

SEC team titles, All-Americans, and Coach of the Year honors are just some of the accomplishments Troy has accumulated during his tenure at Florida. Entering his 20th season with the women's squad and 19th with the men's team, Troy has guided the Gators to 37 national titles, 168 SEC event titles, more than 400 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections and close to 1,000 All-America honors.

And that's just at Florida. With his first National Championship as the Gator head coach, Troy elevated to an elite status, having won a team national championship at the high school, club and collegiate levels.

In his career, he's tutored over 91 Olympians, over 250 All-America swimmers and has coached athletes to more than 155 U.S. and international records.

Florida kept in going in the 2016-17 season, with the men clinching their fifth-straight SEC Championship title. The squad followed that up with a third place finish at NCAA Championships, the 18th-straight year the Gator men finished in the top-10. The women grabbed seventh place at the SEC Championships. Coach Troy added four more National Championships under his belt, with Caeleb Dressel earning three (50 free, 100 free, 100 fly) and Mark Szarnek earning one in the 200 IM. Dressel's 40.00 in the 100 free set a new UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open record and earned him his second consecutive Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award. Dreseel and Jan Switkowski both picked up seven All-America honors, while Szarnek followed up with five. Florida garnered three SEC major awards, with Coach Troy earning Coach of the Year, Dressel earning Male Swimmer of the Year and freshman Maxime Rooney earning SEC Male Freshman of the Year award. On the women's side, Autumn Finke earned the highest finish at SECs, placing second in the 1,650 free race.

The Florida men claimed their fourth straight SEC Championship in the 2015-16 season and finished third at NAAs. This was the 17-straight year the men have finished in the top-10 at NCAA Championships. The women picked up a sixth place finish at the SEC Tournament and placed 19th at NCAA Championships. Caeleb Dressel added seven more All-America honors to his name, as well as two National Championships in the 50 and 100 freestyle. His 18.20 in the 50 free set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. He earned Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year, Coach Troy's first honoree in that award since Conor Dwyer in 2010. Jan Switkowski also earned seven All-America honors at NAAs and earned two bronze medals at the meet in the 200 and 800 free relays. On the women's side, Natalie Hinds led the way with four All-America honors and Kahlia Warner earned two in Diving. At the SEC Championships, she became the first diver to sweep both the 1-meter and 3-meter boards since Megan Neyer who swept in 1986. Warner was also named SEC Diver of the Year and Diver of the Meet.

The Gators took another step forward during the 2014-15 season, as the men's team won its third-straight Southeastern Conference Championship and finished fifth at the NCAA Championships. The women's team finished ninth overall,

extending Florida's top-10 streaks to 16 for the men and 15 for the women, respectively. Caeleb Dressel earned seven All-American honors and became the first UF freshman to earn seven tributes since Shaune Fraser in 2007. In addition, he won Florida's first-ever 50-yard freestyle (18.67) NCAA Championship and became the first Gator freshman to win an NCAA title since Darian Townsend achieved the accolade as a member of the UF's first place 800-yard freestyle relay team (Ryan Lochte, Brian Hartley, Adam Sioui) in 2005. Dressel is also the first freshman to win an individual crown since Adam Sioui did so in the 200-yard freestyle in 2002. The NCAA title provided Troy with his 32nd national crown.

In 2013-14, the men's team repeated as Southeastern Conference Champions and finished third at the NCAA Championships with 387 points, representing the highest finish for the Orange and Blue since 1991 and the school's highest point total ever recorded at the national meet. The women's team finished sixth overall. Marcin Cieslak captured a pair of national titles in the 200 IM and 100 fly.

The 2012-13 season brought even more highlights to Troy's already illustrious resume. UF's sixth-place finish on the men's side capped off a strong season for the Gators. The group tallied 41 All-America honors at the national meet, the most since the 2007 season. For the second time in three years, Florida's men claimed victory in the 800 free relay. The group of Pawel Werner, Sebastien Rousseau, Marcin Cieslak and Dan Wallace blistered the field with a school-record time of 6:13.27, winning by two seconds over eventual NCAA Champion Michigan. Cieslak led the team with seven All-America honors after finishing second in all three individual events (200 IM, 100 fly and 200 fly) and swam on four relays.

The biggest highlight of the season came at the 2013 SEC Championships, where Troy guided the Gator men to the conference title for the first time since 1993. The Gators broke Auburn's streak of 16-consecutive conference championships, and gave the program its 34th SEC title. Cieslak won two individual event titles, while Matt Elliott and Pawel Werner each won their first SEC titles. Troy was named the SEC Male Swimming Coach of the Year.

UF's women also finished sixth at the 2013 NCAA Championships, collecting 35 All-America honors, and placed third at the SEC Championships. Elizabeth Beisel won the NCAA title in the 400 IM, giving

her two NCAA championships in her career. Out of the pool, Beisel became just the 11th student-athlete in Florida history to be named Capital One Academic All-America of the Year, earning the distinction for the women's At-Large team.

In the 2011-12 season, the Gators continued their streak of consecutive top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. With their 12th consecutive top-10 finish, the Gator women took 10th at the 2012 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. They also brought home 27 All-America honors. Senior Teresa Crippen led the team with six All-America honors and finished eighth among the high point swimmers. Beisel won her first individual national championship when she finished first in the 200 backstroke with a time of 1:50.58.

The UF men also extended their streak of top-10 finishes to 13, as they placed eighth at the NCAA Championships. The Orange and Blue collected 27 more All-America titles, with Marcin Cieslak earning six to lead the men's team. Cieslak finished second in the 200 IM and third in the 100 and 200 butterfly. The Gators were one of only two SEC teams in the top-10.

At the 2011-12 SEC Championships the Gators collected eight SEC Championships, including a sweep of the 200 and 400 IM events. Beisel and Cieslak each won three individual events and Brad deBorde and Eduardo Solache-Gomez won one title apiece. Beisel and Cieslak were named SEC Female and Male Swimmers of the Year. It was the first year since 2010 that a Gator has received the Female Swimmer of the Year and the third year in a row that a UF swimmer has won the Male Swimmer of the Year.

The 2010-11 season was another successful year for Troy, as the men's team finished fifth and the women's team placed seventh at the 2011 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. The UF men's top-five finish was the highest of any Southeastern Conference school at the meet, Florida's fifth top-five finish in the last six years and UF's eighth under Troy. For the 12th consecutive season, the Orange and Blue finished in the top-10 nationally. Individually, 15 UF swimmers combined to bring back 19 All-America honors and two national championships (200-yard freestyle, 800-yard freestyle relay) to Gainesville.

For the 11th consecutive season, the Gator women placed in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships with 11

swimmers and one diver combining to earn 38 All-America honors, led by junior Shara Stafford's seven All-America honors. This year's SEC Female Freshman of the Year, Elizabeth Beisel, brought home five All-America honors, including top-three finishes in the 400-yard IM and 400-yard backstroke.

At the 2011 SEC Swimming and Diving Championships, Troy coached 19 Gators to 56 All-SEC honors, including 13 SEC Championships, more than any other school in the conference. As a result of Troy's guidance, UF took home the Male Swimmer of the Year Award and both Male and Freshman Swimmer of the Year Awards.

2010 was one for the record books, as the Florida women brought home the school's first National Championship in 28 years, led by five school records and national championship performances in the 200-yard free relay and 100-yard back by senior Gemma Spofforth. Like the Gators did on March 18-20, 1982, the 2010 squad pulled out a close victory over second-place finisher Stanford. Florida scored 382 points, edging out the Cardinal (379.5) in the second-closest NCAA competition ever. A total of 12 All-Americans tallied 36 All-America performances on the Purdue campus at the Boilermaker Aquatic center.

While the women's team swam and dove its most complete Championship meet in recent history, the 2010 men's swimming team rallied for its seventh top-five NCAA finish in Troy's tenure at Florida, scoring the most points in Florida history at the time to finish fifth at the NCAA meet on the Ohio State campus after tallying 364 points with leverage from three national titles and five top-eight relay finishes. Junior Conor Dwyer was named the men's Division I National Men's Swimmer of the Year after winning the 200 and 500 freestyle events, the first NCAA swimmer to do so since 2001. Additionally, senior Shaune Fraser recorded one first and two second-place finishes, earning seven All-America honors to rack up an all-time Florida mark of 27 All-America honors, the most for a single men's swimmer or diver in school history. Ten other Gators collaborated with Fraser to collectively put on 38 All-America performances to highlight the 2010 campaign.

Both the 2010 Gator squads finished second at the 2010 SEC Championship meet, Florida's 10th straight top-three finish on both the men's and women's side. The Gators

tallied numerous accolades at the league championships in Athens, Ga., under Troy, including SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year, SEC Women's Swimmer of the Year in Spofforth, SEC Men's Swimmer of the Year in Dwyer, high point awards for Spofforth, Dwyer and S. Fraser, while the Gator divers cleaned up with SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year for Donnie Craine and SEC Women's Diver of the Year for senior Kara Salamone.

In summer 2009, Spofforth captured the spotlight of the world when she shattered the World Record in the women's 100-meter backstroke (58.12), winning her first World Championship for Great Britain at the 2009 FINA World Championships in Rome, Italy. But Spofforth's World Title is just the tip of the iceberg. Under Troy, Spofforth defended her 100 & 200-yard backstroke races in 2009, becoming just the fourth NCAA swimmer to win the 200 back three consecutive years. Under Troy's watch, Spofforth, the 2009 SEC Swimmer of the Year, eclipsed the NCAA record in the 200 back at the 2009 SEC meet, becoming only the second swimmer to ever break the 1:50.00 mark in the event when she swam to a 1:48.34. Spofforth also carried British Commonwealth Records in the 50, 100 and 200-meter backstroke races, as well as the 100-meter back European Record. The Gators stamped their 17th SEC Championship team title in 2009 in Auburn, Ala., with the help of Spofforth, a tribute to Troy's talent and expectations of excellence at the head of the Gator program.

Additionally, Troy tutored 2009 NCAA Champions Bradley Ally and Shaune Fraser, who collectively won three individual national titles, the most since 2006, when Gator great Ryan Lochte picked up three, bringing Florida's all-time national championship count to 35 titles. Collectively, the men's and women's squads brought back 71 All-America honors home to Gainesville after the 2009 season.

Troy's success is thriving at Florida, but it's no different than the mark he made his first season. Troy came to Florida in 1998 as the women's head coach and promptly led the Gators to an eighth-place finish at the NCAA Championships – an improvement of seven spots from the previous season. A year later, he became the third coach in UF history to take the reins of both teams when he was named the head coach of the men's squad.

HEAD COACH GREGG TROY

In his inaugural season as men's head coach, the Sarasota, Fla., native guided the Gators to a ninth-place showing at NCAAs and a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships. For his efforts, Troy was named the 2000 SEC Men's Coach of the Year.

Both teams made remarkable strides the following season, as the women jumped 11 places from 19th at NCAAs in 2000 to an eighth-place spot in 2001. The men also showed improvement, from ninth place the year before to eighth that season, at NCAAs. Gators since a third-place showing in 1991. In addition to taking home the high finishes, Troy captured the 2002 NCAA Men's Coach of the Year and SEC Men's Coach of the Year awards. He also received the Knoxville Sentinel's 2002 SEC Men's and Women's Coach of the Year awards.

In 2002-03, both squads continued to make progress under the tutelage of Troy and his staff. The women improved yet again at the national level by placing fifth at NCAAs after a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships. The men took home second at the SEC meet for the third-consecutive season and followed that up with a sixth-place showing at NCAAs.

In 2003-04, Troy led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at NCAAs. The women's team finished third at SECs, marking the fifth-consecutive year UF had placed in the top three at the league championships, and the Florida women did not drop out of the top five of the College Swimming Coaches Association (CSCAA) national poll for the second-consecutive year. On the men's side, the Gators finished second at the SEC Championships, the fifth-straight top-three finish at SECs, and placed sixth at the NCAA Championships. One of the highlights of the season was Lochte winning the 26th NCAA title in UF history when he broke the U.S. Open, American and NCAA record in the 400-meter IM. At the end of the season, Troy was rewarded for the Gators' success with his second NCAA Men's Coach of the Year Award.

In 2004-05, Troy led both teams to top-five finishes at the NCAAs, as the women placed fourth and the men secured the fifth spot. For the women, it was the 22nd time in Florida history that they finished in the top-five. Both teams also had success outside of the pool, claiming a combined 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections during the season.

Troy piloted the Gator men to a fifth-place finish for a second-consecutive season in 2005-06, while Lochte, one of Troy's finest protégés, became the all-time Florida leader in individual NCAA Championships with seven titles. The women finished in the top-10 for a sixth-consecutive season under Troy's direction.

The 2006-07 season was another banner campaign for both Troy and the Gators, as both squads finished in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships. The UF men earned 45 All-America honors en route to a fourth-place finish – their highest in five years – at the NCAA meet. Three Gator men's swimmers also combined to win six individual SEC titles and Florida won the 800 FR at the conference meet for the sixth year in a row, garnering Troy SEC Men's Coach of the Year honors.

Florida's women were not left out of the title chase in 2006-07, as Troy guided freshman Gemma Spofforth to NCAA crown in the 200 back and Caroline Burckle to the conference championship in the 100 breast. Spofforth's performance marked the first individual national championship for a member of the UF women's team since 1995, and the squad's first backstroke victory in 17 years.

Spofforth returned a year later and under Troy's direction, became the first Gator woman since the 1993-94 season to win both the 100 and 200 backstroke events at the SEC and NCAA Championships in the same year. Burckle added to the trophy haul at the NCAA Championships, winning both the 200 and 500 freestyle events. Burckle also set a new NCAA record in the 500 free, eclipsing Janet Evans' 20-year record.

Named the 2008 SEC Women's Swimming Coach of the Year, Troy oversaw the development of Burckle, who came away from her four-year career with five school records. For her accomplishments in the water, she was named the 2008 NCAA Swimmer of the year and collected the Honda Sports Award for Swimming and Diving. Burckle additionally rallied at the 2008 Olympic Trials in Omaha, swimming a lifetime-best 200-meter free time to make her first-ever Olympic Games. In Beijing and under Troy's watch, she swam one of the four 200-meter free legs in the women's 800-meter free relay that claimed a bronze medal.

The Gator men countered in 2008 with five SEC titles of their own. Clark Burckle collected two of the five, winning the 400 IM and 200 breast while

also setting the school record in the 100 breast. Shaune Fraser picked up his second straight SEC Championship in the 200 free, defending his title in pool-record time. Bradley Ally picked up the win in the 200 IM in pool-record time while Omar Pinzon led a Gator sweep in the 200 back with the fifth-fastest time in school history. The men would go on to finish eighth at the NCAA Championships, picking up a total of 38 All-American honors.

Troy has also found success in international competition as the head coach of several teams, including his honor as an assistant coach of the men's United States Olympic Team in Beijing. Troy additionally served as head coach of the Thailand Olympic Team in the 1992 games in Barcelona, as well as themen's United States 2010 Pan Pacific Swim Team. Active Gator Olympians that are presently under Troy's tutelage include Sarah Bateman, Elizabeth Beisel, Melani Costa-Schmid, Evan Lehtonen, Jemma Lowe, Anna-Liisa Pold, Rodion Davelaar, Brett Fraser, Shaune Fraser, Balazs Gercsak, Sebastien Rousseau and Gemma Spofforth.

Under Troy's watchful eye, Lochte has developed into one of the top swimmers in the world. At the 2010 Pan Pacific Championships, Troy coached Lochte to a meet-high six gold medals, giving Lochte Male Swimmer of the Meet honors at the year's biggest international meet. At the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, Lochte won two gold medals and two bronze medals. He broke fellow American Aaron Peirsol's two-year winning streak in the 200-meter back with a world-record performance at the 2007 World Championships in Melbourne, Australia, winning his first individual world title in a long-course meters setting. He won five medals (three gold, one silver and one bronze) and set four world records at the 2006 FINA Short Course Championships in Beijing, China, just 10 days after competing at the NCAA Championships. In 2004, Lochte captured a gold medal at the Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, in the 800 FR with an American-record time of 7:07.33, and won a silver medal in the 200-meter IM in a University of Florida-record time of 1:58.78, which ranks third-fastest all-time in the history of the event.

Troy was on deck in Melbourne as an assistant coach with the U.S. Men's World Championships Team when Lochte claimed his world record. He has also served as the head coach for the U.S. Team at the World Championships in 2001; head coach of the U.S. Team for the Pan American Games in 1999; assistant coach for the 2004 U.S. Women's FINA World Short Course Championships; assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Team at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and the head coach for the U.S. Pan American Team in 1995. His accomplishments on the international level led him to being named the 1997 U.S. Olympic & United States Swimming Development Coach of the Year. The award is one of several that Troy has received from the U.S. Swimming Coaches' Achievement program.

Before Troy racked up success at the collegiate and international levels, he enjoyed a scintillating career at the prep level for The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla. For 20 years, he led the school's program and its affiliated club program.

Troy earned his bachelor's degree in history/government from Texas Christian University in 1972. In 1987, he earned his master's in history education from Jacksonville University. Troy and his wife, Kathleen, have three sons: Patrick (27), a former UF Cross Country and Track & Field athlete who earned his undergraduate degree in English from Florida in 2009; Geoffrey (26), a four-year football player at the Merchant Marine Academy and now a United States Marine Lt. Helicopter Pilot; and Ryan (24), a decathlete on the 2009-11 Gator Track & Field team and a graduate of Idaho State University in Outdoor Education.

COACHING STAFF

ANTHONY NESTY

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



One of the most decorated swimmers in Florida history, Anthony Nesty enters his 12th season as an associate head coach and 20th as a member of the Gators' coaching staff.

Nesty has played a key role in guiding UF men to five-consecutive Southeastern Conference Championships and a third-place finish at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Prior to 2013, the Gators had not won a conference title in 20 years. In addition, UF's SEC title in 2017 represented the program's 38th overall. This past season's third-place finish extended UF's streak of top-10 national finishes to 18 seasons. Florida had eight student-athletes total 31 All-America honors over the three-day meet. Nesty also coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In the 2016-17 season, Nesty coached Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaraneck won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became

Nesty's 10th SEC Male Freshman of the Year after his performance in the pool. A total of eight athletes took home 31 All-America honors.

In the 2015-16 season, Nesty once again coached Dressel to a National Championship, or in this case two. Dressel won the 50 free and 100 free to take home the second and third National Championship of his career. Dressel earned Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year, Nesty's first swimmer to garner that honor since 2010 when Conor Dwyer achieved the feat. Overall at the NCAA Championships, the Florida Gator Men tallied 37 All-America honors between nine of them.

In the 2014-15 Nesty coached Caeleb Dressel to UF's first-ever 50-yard freestyle (18.67) NCAA Championship, which he achieved on day one of the NCAA meet. Dressel became the ninth Gator swimmer under Nesty and Head Coach Gregg Troy's tutelage to win SEC Male Freshman of the Year. At the conference meet, Dressel won the 100-yard butterfly title in an outstanding time of 45.28 seconds. That mark not only ranked him second all-time in school history but it was the second-quickest in the U.S. 17-18 year old age group.

During the 2014-15 season, the Florida men set seven of a possible 18 school records.

In 2014, the Gators finished third at the NCAA meet which was the highest finish in program history since 1991. The Florida men set 12 school records, including Brad deBorde in the 50 and 100-yard free, Dan Wallace in the 500 free, Arthur Frayler in the mile, Eduardo Solache-Gomez in the 100 and 200 breaststroke and Marcin Cieslak in the 100 and 200 butterfly races. In addition, four of five relay teams set UF records as well. Cieslak won a pair of NCAA titles, becoming the first Gator since Nesty to bring home three consecutive national titles in the 100 butterfly (1990-92). Cieslak also captured UF's eighth 200 IM national championship. Sebastien Rousseau was named the SEC

Swimmer of the Year and earned the SEC Commissioner's Trophy after he won a trio of SEC titles.

"Anthony is one of the most revered coaches in college swimming, and one of the few who is considered both a great athlete and a great coach," Troy said. "He's got a great work ethic and a tremendous ability to get results. His experience at the Olympics as an athlete is instrumental in his ability to relate to our current athletes. His reputation for getting the most out of them speaks for itself."

During his collegiate career at UF, Nesty won his aforementioned three consecutive NCAA crowns in the 100 fly from 1990-92. In addition at the NCAA Championships, Nesty won the 200 fly in 1990 and he was a member of Florida's 1991 NCAA champion 400 medley relay team. He held the school records for NCAA titles until 2006, when former Gator Ryan Lochte finished his illustrious career with seven such honors.

For his accomplishments as a Gator, Nesty was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in April 2002.

In addition to his success at the collegiate level, Nesty brings experience at the highest levels of international swimming to the Florida staff. At the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games, he won the first-ever Olympic medal for his native country of Suriname when he edged seven-time medalist Matt Biondi of the United States by .01 to bring home the gold in the 100-meter fly. Nesty also won the gold medal in the 100 fly at the 1990 Goodwill Games and captured a world championship in the same event in 1991.

Nesty concluded his swimming career at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, where he earned the bronze in the 100 fly.

Nesty made his return to Gainesville on June 1, 1998, to assume duties on the pool deck. Prior to that, he served as a club level coach for three years with Swim Florida in Sarasota.

Making the coaching stop at Florida has not only allowed Nesty to reach a career goal, but his post on the Gators' deck has allowed him to be reunited with a close friend in Gator swimming head coach Gregg Troy, for whom Nesty swam for high school at The Bolles School in Jacksonville. Following Nesty's illustrious collegiate career, he served as one of Troy's assistants at Bolles, while also holding the head coaching position at Jacksonville's Nease High School.

Nesty began his international coaching career as an assistant coach for Suriname at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece. He then continued his Olympic tradition as the head coach for Suriname at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing and the 2012 Olympics in London. On the 20th anniversary of Nesty's Olympic gold medal in the 100-meter fly, not only was Nesty honored as head coach of his country's team, but he was recognized as the Suriname flag bearer at the opening ceremonies of the 2008 Summer Games.

Outside of the Olympics, Nesty coached internationally during the summer of 2009, when he traveled to Rome as the coach for the 2009 Cayman National Team at the 2009 FINA World Championships. At the Championships, Nesty tutored then-current Gators Brett and Shaune Fraser. In the summer of 2010, Nesty coached the Cayman National Team at the 2010 Mutual of Omaha Pan Pacific Championships, the largest international meet of the year. In 2011, Nesty served on deck as an assistant coach for the U.S. men's team at the World University Games, which was his first time coaching for the United States. In 2014, Nesty coached the Venezuelan team at the Pan Pacific games, where he tutored Olympian Andreina Pinto, who trains with the Gator swim club in Gainesville.

Over the last 18 seasons at UF, Nesty has shown the ability to transfer his penchant for fast times in the water to the Gator swimmers he has coached. In 2006-07, he helped Shaune Fraser, a 2004, 2008 and 2012 Olympian from the Cayman Islands, develop into a top-five finisher in the 200 fly at the NCAA Championships in his first collegiate season. His work with the Gators' middle-distance and distance freestylers during that campaign also came to fruition at the 2007 NCAA Championships, as he tutored Grant Johnson and Tobias Work to earn a combined five All-America honors and record four career-best times.

Fraser returned to the NCAA Championships in 2008 to collect seven All-American honors and finally reached the highest collegiate achievement under Nesty in 2009, when he brought home his first two individual national championships in the 200 free and 200 fly (NCAA record). Fraser became the first Gator to win the 200-yard fly since Nesty did so in 1990. Fraser wrapped up his career in 2010 with seven All-America honors, giving him 27 accolades for his career, the most for a single men's swimmer or diver in school history.

At the 2000 NCAA Championships, Nesty saw his pupil, Duncan Sherrard, break his 10-year old school record, which he set at the 1990 SEC Championships, in the 200 fly. In 2006, he was on the pool deck when Ryan Lochte set the school records in the 100 and 200 fly at the SEC Championships.

In addition to all the All-America honors, national championships and record breaking times that Nesty has led current and former Gators to; the Paramaribo, Suriname native has led multiple swimmers to SEC Male Swimmer of the Year and SEC Male Freshman Swimmer of the Year honors.

Jeff Poppell was hired on as the Associate Head Coach of the University of Florida swimming and diving team before the 2016-17 season. Poppell, beginning his 24th season of coaching this fall, most recently served four years as the head coach for Gulliver Preparatory School and the Gulliver Swim Club, six years as the women's head coach at the University of Arkansas and 13 years serving in head coach and assistant coach capacities with The Bolles School and Bolles School Sharks.

In the 2016-17 season, Poppell helped coach Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaranek won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his

career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became Poppell's first SEC Male Freshman of the Year after his performance in the pool. A total of eight athletes took home 31 All-America honors. Poppell coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Through four seasons at Gulliver Preparatory School and Gulliver Swim Club, Poppell's challenge was to build winning programs from the ground level up. He quickly helped launch the program to an elite status after several swimmers established themselves as top national talents, including Jana Mangimelli, who placed 5th in the 200-Meter IM at the 2013 United States World Championship Trials and US National Championships, clocking a time that ranked her among the top 25 in the world.

In 2014 and 2015, he led Gulliver Preparatory to consecutive 2A FHSAA High School State Swimming Championship titles in girls swimming after winning the school's first-ever state championship in swimming in 2014. Most recently, in 2015-2016, Poppell guided Gulliver Swim Club to its first-ever Silver Medal Award, which recognizes the top 100 swimming clubs in the United States. In addition, he tutored four U.S. Olympic Team Trials qualifiers,

three finalists at the U.S. Summer Junior National Championships, and 10 swimmers who were ranked among the top 25 nationally in their respective age groups.

During his six years as the Head Swimming Coach of the University of Arkansas, he guided the program to its best performances in school history, which included a top-five finish at the SEC Championships and a No. 17 national ranking in the College Swimming Coaches Association of America national polls. Beginning his second season at Arkansas, the Razorback swimming and diving program ranked in the Top 25 national poll for five consecutive years.

Poppell coached 16 athletes who individually qualified for the NCAA Championships and helped ten of these women earn NCAA All-American honors. One of his swimmers, Yi-Ting Siow, a three-time Olympian, became the first Razorback swimmer to win back-to-back SEC titles, claiming the SEC championship title in the 200 breaststroke in 2009 and 2010. Siow's fourth place finish in the 200 breaststroke at the 2009 and 2010 NCAA Championships represented the highest NCAA Championship finish for a swimmer in Razorback history. Her time of 2:07.73 was just seven-hundredths of a second behind the SEC record held by 1999 NCAA champion and 2000 Olympic silver medalist Kristy Kowal of Georgia.

During the 2010-2011 season, Chelsea Franklin finished seventh in the 1650 freestyle at the women's NCAA Championships, earning All-American honors for the first time with a time of 15:59.05, which still stands as the Arkansas school record in the event. The 2009 NCAA Championships were highlighted by five different Razorback swimmers qualifying individually for the meet with four of the swimmers earning NCAA All-American status by finishing in the top 16: Yi-Ting Siow and Leah Pierce in the 200 Breaststroke, Katie Kastes in the 400 Individual Medley and 200 Butterfly and Stephanie Carr in the 1650 Freestyle. The 2008 NCAA Championships featured freshman Katie Kastes' 9th place finish in the 200 Butterfly with the 6th fastest time recorded in the meet.

Coach Poppell had 10 swimmers qualify for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials in Omaha, Nebraska. In 2009, Poppell served as the Head Women's Coach for Team USA at the World Maccabiah Games in Israel. He was also a USA Swimming National Team coach from 2005-08, during which, he coached three swimmers who competed at the 2009 FINA World Swimming Championships in Rome, and two who competed in the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. He guided two of his swimmers to three gold medals, one silver, two bronze, and three meet records at the Southeast Asian Games.

Prior to the University of Arkansas, Poppell spent 13 years with the Bolles School and Bolles Sharks in Jacksonville, Florida, one of the country's most prominent high school and club swimming programs. At the 2006 Spring U.S. National Championships, he led the Bolles Sharks to a Top 5 Team finish where the Bolles men's 4x200 freestyle relay team won the U.S. National title and Omar Pinzon became the U.S. National Champion in the men's 200 backstroke.

During the 2005-06 High School season, Poppell guided the Bolles High School boys' team to its 18th consecutive Florida high school state championship and the girls earned its 15th consecutive high school state title. The boy's swimming team went on to be crowned National Prep School Champions and captured a National Runner-Up finish for Swimming World's National High School Championship. For his efforts, Poppell was honored with NFHS Florida High School Boy's Coach of the Year.

During the 2003-2004 season, The Bolles School Girls Swimming team was crowned Swimming World's National High School Champions and the 2003 & 2004 NISCA National Dual Meet Team Champions for both Girls and Boys Independent School. In addition, Anja Carman was named the NISCA National High School Female Swimmer of the Year and Coach Poppell was named the NHSCA National High School Coach of the Year and Florida Dairy Farmers High School Coach of the Year for his work with the girl's high school team at Bolles. Also during that year, Anja Carman won two Silver medals at the European Long Course Championships in both the 200 Backstroke and 800 Freestyle and teammate Stephanie Carr was crowned the 18&U U.S. National Champion in the 1500 Freestyle with the 6th fastest time in the World. Carr was also a finalist in the 800-meter free at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials.

As the Bolles School Head Coach from 2002-2006, he coached four swimmers ranked in the top 25 in the World and an additional seven swimmers ranked among the top 100 in the World, seventeen current or former Bolles Sharks swimmers that competed at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, five U.S. National Championship/U.S. Olympic Trials finalists, two U.S. National Champions, and two 18&U U.S. National Champions. Furthermore, Poppell's swimmers garnered medals at major international events such as the European Championships, Commonwealth Games, South American Championships, Southeast Asian Games, and the Central American and Caribbean Swimming Championships.

Under current UF head coach Gregg Troy, Poppell joined the staff of Bolles in August of 1993 as an age group coach. Working his way up to associate head coach in 2001, Poppell became the head coach and aquatics director in March of 2002.

As a student-athlete at University of Georgia, Poppell was a four-year letter winner and team captain for the Georgia Bulldogs' swimming team. He qualified for the NCAA Championships twice and was an Honorable Mention All-SEC and academic All-SEC honoree. He earned one gold, one silver, and two bronze medals while competing for the United States at the 1993 Maccabiah Games in Israel. To this day, the Bulldog program remembers his contributions to the team with the annual presentation of the Jeff Poppell Award for Leadership.

A 1993 graduate of the University of Georgia, Coach Poppell and his wife, Joanna, have two children, Jack and Jenna.

DIVING COACH



Bryan Gillooly began his tenure as the Florida diving coach in the 2016-17 season. He remains in the Sunshine State with his new position with the Gators. Gillooly previously coached the divers at FAU and was the age group coach of the Fort Lauderdale Diving Team from 2014 to 2016. This past season, he won the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association's Co-Dive Coach of the Year award while at FAU and coached three 2016 Olympic trials qualifiers who trained at Fort Lauderdale.

In Gillooly's first year as Diving Coach, he tutored eight athletes into SEC Championship competition. Two of those athletes, Samuel Smith and Teya Syskakis, to top-eight finishes. Smith garnered two top-eight finishes, placing fourth in the Men's 3m (440.20) and sixth in Men's Platform (390.90). Syskakis finished in sixth place in the Women's Platform with a score of 264.55. Smith, Syskakis, Brooke Madden, Robert Goss and Dylan Power each found their way into a final at the NCAA Diving Zone meets.

Before joining the FAU Owls, Gillooly pursued age group coaching at YCF Diving in Orlando from 2012 to 2014, guiding five divers to spots on the U.S. Junior National Squad and two to the 2012 Olympic trials.

Gillooly helped build the swimming & diving program at FIU from scratch, coaching there from its inception in 2004 to 2009. He earned Sun Belt Conference Diving Coach of the Year honors in 2004-05 and 2005-06 and developed five Sun Belt Conference Champions. Gillooly also served at the University of Miami, his alma mater, for the same period of time as the volunteer assistant coach.

Internationally, Gillooly coached the U.S. Junior National Squad at the Pan American Junior Diving Championships in Cuba last year. He also led South Africa to qualify for the 2008 Summer Olympics after its performance at the 2008 FINA Diving World Cup in Beijing. Overall, he has been a team coach for the United States, Canada, Portugal and South Africa in major international competitions.

In 1999, Gillooly graduated from the University of Miami, where he was a two-time NCAA national champion diver, 10-time All-American and 1996 NCAA Diver of the Year. He was inducted into the Hurricanes' Sports Hall of Fame in 2013. As a member of the U.S. National Team from 1990-2000, Gillooly was a three-time national champion, 1991 Junior World Champion and a finalist in the U.S. Olympic Team Trials in 1992, 1996 and 2000.

STEVE JUNGBLUTH ASSISTANT COACH



Steve Jungbluth enters his eighth season as an assistant coach for the Gators in 2017-18. Jungbluth works with the sprinters.

In the 2016-17 season, Jungbluth coached Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaranek won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became the 10th SEC Male Freshman of the Year under Jungbluth and Head Coach Greg Troy's tutelage to win the honor after his performance in the pool.

In the 2015-16 season, Jungbluth once again coached Dressel to a National Championship, or in this case two. Dressel won the 50 Free and 100 free to take home the second and third National Championship of his career. Dressel earned Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year. Overall at the NCAA Championships, the Florida Gator Men tallied 37 All-America honors between nine of them. He also coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In the 2014-15 season, Jungbluth coached Caeleb Dressel to UF's first-ever 50-yard freestyle (18.67) NCAA Championship, which he achieved on day one of the NCAA meet.

Dressel became the ninth Gator swimmer under Jungbluth and Head Coach Gregg Troy's tutelage to win SEC Male Freshman of the Year. At the conference meet, Dressel won the 100-yard butterfly title in an outstanding time of 45.28 seconds. That mark not only ranked him second all-time in school history but it was the second-quickest in the U.S. 17-18 year old age group. The Florida men set seven of a possible 18 school records.

In 2013-14, Jungbluth helped the Gators break eight UF sprint records in four individual events and four relays. Individually, Natalie Hinds' set the new standard in the 50-yard (21.66) and 100-yard freestyle (47.40) races. Meanwhile Brad deBorde broke the same two records on the men's side with times of 18.86 and 42.18 seconds, respectively. At the 2014 NCAA Championships, Jungbluth tutored deBorde to a third-place finish in the 50-yard free at NCAA's following his victory in the same event at the SEC Championships a weeks earlier. His sprinters helped lead the men's team to its second consecutive SEC Championship and 35th overall, as well as a third-place team finish at the national meet. The women placed third at SEC's and six at NCAA's.

In 2012-13, Jungbluth guided Hinds to seven All-America honors and three SEC titles. For her efforts, Hinds was named the SEC Female Freshman of the Year. In addition to the women's squad, Jungbluth coached Ellese Zalewski to swim UF's second fastest time in the 50-yard free (22.04) at the 2013 NCAA Championships. On the men's side, deBorde finished runner-up in the 50-yard free (19.12) at the 2013 SEC Championships and fifth in the same event at NCAA's. Also, Pawel Werner won the 200-yard free (1:33.23) at SEC's and earned four All-America honors at the national meet.

Combining the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons, Jungbluth tutored one national champion, three All-Americans and one SEC champion.

Before his time in Gainesville, Jungbluth spent seven seasons (2003-10) as the head coach at Colgate, where he led the Raiders to the top of the Patriot League. His women's squads won the league title in two of his last three seasons in Hamilton, N.Y, while every swimmer he recruited into the program achieved at least one personal-best time during the course of their career.

In the 2008-09 season, his women's team cruised to its second consecutive conference crown and the second-highest point total ever generated in the three-day event. At that meet, Colgate won titles of 14 of 18 swimming events; set 18 team records and 14 meet records. In the 2007-08 campaign, the Raiders' women's team won its first Patriot League championship in program history. Colgate had 11 individuals earn All-Conference honors and six take home take individual championships.

During the 2005-06 campaign, Jungbluth led Colgate's women's team to a perfect record through its dual-meet schedule, which included wins over the Naval Academy and four-time defending league champion Bucknell. Colgate defeated Navy for the first time in school history while it beat the Bison for the first time in 21 years. In his first season at Colgate (2003-04), Jungbluth earned Patriot League Coach of the Year honors after leading the women's team to a second-place finish at the conference championships. At the time, it was the highest finish at a conference meet in the history of the women's program. In addition, the men's squad finished with a 9-5 record in 2004, which was Colgate's highest number of victories in 20 seasons.

Prior to taking over at Colgate, Jungbluth served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Navy. During his time there, he produced nine Patriot League champions, six Patriot League record-setting performances, two Patriot League Championship Swimmers of the Meet and one team championship.

Jungbluth began his coaching career as an assistant coach and later interim head coach at NCAA Division III Amherst College (Mass.). As an assistant at Amherst, he helped coach seven New England champions, 10 All-Americans and 13 honorable-mention All-Americans. In addition, the Jeffs broke 41 varsity and pool records during his tenure. The men's team posted a perfect 10-0 dual meet record during the 1995-96 season.

Jungbluth earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, in 1994 and a master's degree in exercise science from UMass, in 1997. He was a four-year letterwinner for the Minutemen, serving as a co-captain during his senior season.

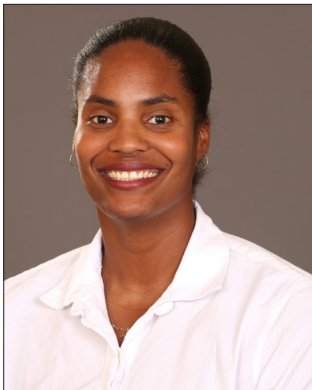

Leah Stancil, a former Gator swimmer and UF grad ('02), enters her tenth season as an assistant coach for Florida in 2016-17. Stancil has assisted with both the men's and women's swimming and diving programs since she returned to her alma mater prior to the 2008 season.

"Leah has a tremendous background in international competition, and sports psychology and she's also a Gator," head coach Gregg Troy said of Stancil.

Stancil's highlights of her young coaching career began with the 2008-09 Florida women's swimming and diving team, as she helped guide it to its 17th SEC Championship. Individually that season, Stancil tutored three individual NCAA Champions, including Bradley Ally, Gemma Spofforth and Shaune Fraser. The following season in 2010, Stancil helped elevate the women's program to new heights, as that squad won the programs first NCAA Championship since 1982.

In the 2016-17, she coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-

SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team. She also helped coach Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaraneck won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became SEC Male Freshman of the Year after his performance in the pool.

In the 2015-16 season, Stancil once again helped the men's team to a SEC Championship and helped the women's team place sixth. coach Dressel to a National Championship, or in this case two. Dressel won the 50 free and 100 free to take home the second and third National Championship of his career. Dressel earned Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year. Overall at the NCAA Championships, the Florida Gator Men tallied 37 All-America honors between nine of them. On the women's side, Natalie Hinds led the way with four All-America honors and Kahlia Warner earned two in Diving. At the SEC Championships, she became the first diver to sweep both the 1-meter and 3-meter boards since Megan Neyer who swept in 1986. Warner was also named SEC Diver of the Year and Diver of the Meet.

In 2014-15 season, the Florida men's team won its third-consecutive SEC title and finished fifth at the NCAA Championships. The Gators women's squad placed third at SEC's and ninth at NCAA's for the third-straight year. Individually, the two teams had 21 student-athletes combine for 55 All-America honors.

From 2011-15, Stancil helped extend Florida's streak of consecutive NCAA top-10 finishes, which is now 18 for the men and 16 for the women following this past season.

In addition to her coaching duties, Stancil serves as the Gator Swim Camp Director, while also coordinating all the team's travel.

Prior to her return to Gainesville, Stancil spent two seasons at SEC foe South Carolina (2006-08), one year as an assistant coach at the Savannah College of Art and Design (2005-06) and one as a graduate assistant at UF (2004-05) which began her coaching career. While she was a grad assistant, Stancil served as an instructor at Swim America in Gainesville.

In the pool during her career, Stancil was a 12-time NCAA All-American, two-time Olympian and a four-time national record holder for her native country, Barbados. She was a member of the 2002 Florida Gators SEC Championship team.

Internationally, Stancil is the Barbados national record holder in the 50 free, 100 free, 50 butterfly and 100 fly in both long and short course events. Stancil recorded her record-setting times in the 50 and 100 free events at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, while she clocked her marks in the butterfly races at the 2002 Commonwealth Games. In addition, Stancil was named Barbados' Female Sportsperson of the Year three times (1995-97).

Stancil graduated from Florida in 2002 with a B.S. in Psychology and she earned her M.S. in Sport & Exercise Psychology from UF in 2006. Stancil and her husband, Michael, reside in Gainesville and have three children, Noah, Emma and Grace.

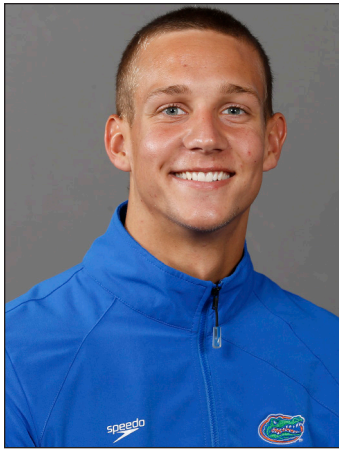

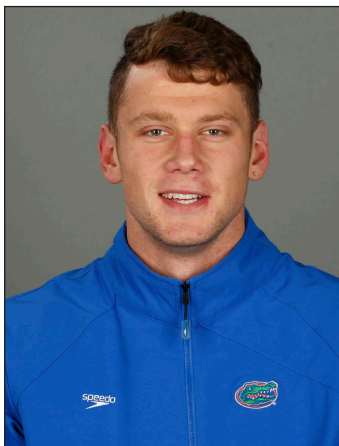

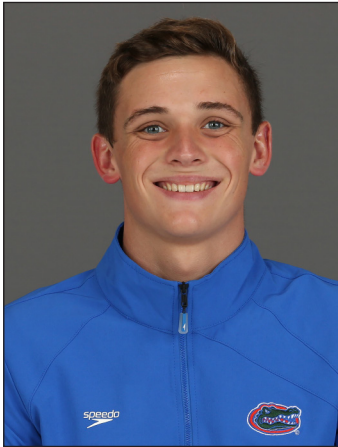

The Gators collected their fifth-straight Southeastern Conference team title in February.

Team Highlights

- At the 2017 NCAA Championships, Florida claimed four national individual titles and four other top-3 finishes to earn a third-place finish with 294.5 points. The Gators placed the highest of any Southeastern Conference squad.
- The Gators have placed inside the top 10 every year since 2000 (head coach **Gregg Troy** took on the men's team prior to the 1999-2000 season).
- Florida had eight swimmers combine for 31 All-America honors.
- **Caeleb Dressel** earned second consecutive College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) Swimmer of the Year honor. The award started in 2005 and it was the fifth such honor for the Florida program.
- UF's third-place NCAA finish matched the Gators' highest team mark under Troy. Florida also finished third at the 2014 and 2016 NAAs.
- UF brought home its fifth straight and 38th overall Southeastern Conference championship behind nine SEC event titles, including all five relays. It was Florida's first sweep of the five SEC relay titles in a single championship.
- Dressel claimed his second SEC Male Swimmer of the Year honor after swimming to three individual SEC titles and helping to win four relays.
- **Maxime Rooney** took home Florida's first Male Freshman Swimmer of the Year honor since Dressel won the award back in 2015. Rooney won the 200 free SEC title and swam in the first-place 400 and 800 free relays.
- Troy named the SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year for the fifth consecutive year and ninth time in his tenure at Florida.
- The Florida men set seven school records to end the 2016-17 season.
- The Gators had 13 student-athletes named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and six to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Florida Swimming & Diving in the Southeastern Conference

Both the Florida men and women's swimming and diving programs have dominated the Southeastern Conference since league competition began, dating back to 1937 for the men and 1981 for the women. The men's team has claimed 38 SEC Championships, doubling its closest competitor, Auburn (18). In 2015, the men won UF's fifth-straight SEC Championship. The women have claimed 17 out of 37 possible league crowns, including 11 consecutive from 1986 through 1997, and their most recent title in 2009. Both teams boast numerous SEC honors, as the men's history includes 24 SEC Male Swimmer of the Year awards and four SEC Male Diver of the Year selections. The SEC Female Swimmer of the Year has been a Gator 19 times, while the SEC Female Diver of the Year has been a Gator five times. Florida coaches have also earned 26 SEC Swimming Coach of the Year accolades and eight SEC Diving Coach of the Year awards.
