THE STORYLINE

- Florida has won seven consecutive games for the first time since 2015, when it won the Birmingham Bowl on Jan. 3 and started the 2015 season 6-0. UF last won eight in a row in 2012 (won Gator Bowl, started 2012 season 7-0).
- Florida has been a top-10 team in five of the last six AP Polls, which is its most consistent stretch since a span of 12 consecutive top-10 rankings from Week 5 of 2012 (Sept. 30) through the 2013 preseason rankings. From Week 1 of 2013 (Sept. 3) through the final ranking of the 2017 season, Florida appeared in the top 10 just four times.
- The Gators have scored 24-plus points in seven straight games for the first time since a 24-game stretch which began with a 28-24 loss to LSU on Oct. 6, 2007, and was snapped with a 23-13 win over Tennessee on Sept. 19, 2009.
- The Gators are seeking a second consecutive 10-win campaign for the first time since posting 13 wins in both 2008 -- head coach **Dan Mullen's** final year as offensive coordinator -- and 2009.

TRASK LEADS COMEBACK VICTORY AFTER FRANKS' INJURY

- Redshirt junior **Kyle Trask** took over Florida's offense to start the fourth quarter and led a comeback victory at Kentucky after **Felipe Franks** left the game with an injury. Franks started Florida's last 18 games.
- Trask completed his first four passes for 54 yards and made a miraculous pitch to **Lamical Perine**, as he led Florida on a 6-play, 62-yard touchdown drive on his first series.
- On what would be Florida's game-winning touchdown drive, Trask completed a 30-yard pass to tight end **Kyle Pitts** and had a 4-yard rushing touchdown that put the Gators ahead, 22-21.
- Trask finished the game 9 of 13 for 126 yards (tying the career high he set in a relief appearance against Missouri last season) and led the Gators to 222 yards of total offense and 19 points in the fourth quarter.
- Florida finished with exactly 300 passing yards, marking its second consecutive 300-yard game. The Gators last threw for 300 yards in consecutive games for the first time since Nov. 10-17, 2007 (Florida Atlantic / South Carolina).
- The Gators have multiple 300-yard passing games in a season for the first time since 2014. They combined for two 300-yard outings from 2015-17, and they have not had three in a single season since 2009.
- Florida's last 300-yard passing game against an SEC team came on Sept. 10, 2016 against Kentucky (320 yards).
- Florida has six games of 250-plus yards passing in Mullen's 16 games as head coach. Florida totaled five games of 250-plus yards passing in the 24 games that comprised the 2016 and 2017 seasons.

RECEIVING CORPS MAKING EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

- Florida's veteran receiving corps is responsible for all four of the Gators' plays of 60-plus yards this year.
- Josh Hammond** has two of them -- a 76-yard touchdown run to seal a win at Kentucky, and a 65-yard reception which set up the game-winning touchdown against Miami. Hammond, Alabama's Henry Ruggs III, and Colorado State's Marvin Kinsey Jr. are the only FBS players with a 65-yard run and reception this year.
- Florida (three), Colorado State (three), and Oklahoma State (four) are the only FBS teams with at least three passing plays of 60-plus yards this season.
- Van Jefferson** has a pair of 90-yard receiving games this year (94 against UT-Martin; 93 at Kentucky), making him the first Gator with two such outings in a season and in a row since fellow senior **Tyrie Cleveland** did it against Tennessee (93) and Kentucky (110) in September 2017.
- Hammond also has a 90-yard receiving game this year (career-high 93 yards against Miami).
- The three 90-yard receiving games by Gators this season has already matched last year's season total.
- Tight end **Kyle Pitts** has also emerged as a receiving threat, posting career highs for receptions (four) and receiving yards (63) at Kentucky. Pitts entered the season with three catches for 73 yards and one touchdown in his career; he has nine receptions for 99 yards this year.

INJURY HALTS FRANKS' STRONG STRETCH

- Franks had four of the five highest passing yardage totals of his career in the five games prior to UF's trip to Kentucky: 274 vs. Idaho (No. 2 in career); 254 at Florida State / vs. Miami (t-No. 4); 270 vs. UT-Martin (No. 3).

- This season, Franks ranks eighth nationally in completion percentage (54 of 71 / 76.1 percent), as well as fifth nationally among quarterbacks with at least 70 attempts. He is also 20th in passing efficiency rating (173.43).
- Against UT-Martin, Franks completed his first 15 passes (the third-longest streak of completions in school history) and finished the game 25 of 27 (92.6 percent) with 270 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions. Franks became the first FBS player since UCF's McKenzie Milton (Oct. 28, 2017 - Austin Peay) to complete 90-plus percent of his passes with a minimum of 25 attempts, 250 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions.
- Franks' completion percentage against UT-Martin (92.6%) was the fourth-best percentage in SEC history (minimum 20 completions), and broke Tim Tebow's school record from the 2010 Sugar Bowl (88.6% / 31 of 35).
- In the season-opening win over Miami, Franks accounted for all three Gators touchdowns (two passing, one rushing), the sixth time in his career he finished with three total touchdowns -- all six came under Mullen.
- While many remember his late-game interceptions, Franks followed the first by accounting for every yard of Florida's game-winning, 4-play, 80-yard touchdown drive -- which he ended with a 3-yard touchdown run.
- Franks' 2018 season as a whole was, statistically, the best by a Gators quarterback in nearly a decade. His 31 touchdowns accounted for (24 passing, 7 rushing) ranked tied for 19th nationally.
- Franks also finished tied for 17th nationally in touchdown-interception ratio (4.00 / 24 TDs to 6 INTs), just one year removed from tying for 107th among qualifying FBS players in 2017.
- Franks was one of 12 FBS quarterbacks to throw more than 20 touchdowns and fewer than seven interceptions last year, a group that included stars like Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa and Clemson's Trevor Lawrence.
- Franks' 24 touchdown passes last season -- the most since Tim Tebow's 30 in 2008 -- ranked tied for 32nd nationally, while his 2,457 passing yards were UF's highest total since Tebow's 2,895 yards in 2009.
- Franks' four games of three-plus touchdown passes were the most such games since Tebow had four in 2008, and just one shy of UF quarterbacks' combined total from the 50 games spanning 2014-17. His six 200-yard passing games were the most since Tebow's seven in 2009.

Gators Turned Tide Versus Ranked Foes

- UF went 3-1 against ranked opponents last year, including a 2-1 mark against top-10 teams. From 2010-17, Florida went 5-11 against top-10 teams, and it was 9-26 against all ranked opponents.
- UF last beat three ranked opponents (as well as multiple top-10 opponents) in 2012.
- Prior to beating No. 5 LSU, Florida had lost nine of its last 11 games against top-five teams, a stretch that dated back to the start of the 2010 season. Six of the nine losses were by 21-plus points.
- Prior to a win at then-No. 23 Mississippi State, UF was 3-13 on the road versus ranked foes since 2010.
- Florida beat consecutive ranked teams (No. 23 Mississippi State, No. 5 LSU) for the first time since 2012. That year it beat No. 23 Tennessee (Sept. 15), No. 4 LSU (Oct. 6), and No. 9 South Carolina (Oct. 20).
- Florida defeated ranked opponents in back-to-back games for the first time since 2008, when it won at No. 23 Florida State (Nov. 29), beat No. 1 Alabama in the SEC Championship Game (Dec. 6), and topped No. 2 Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game (Jan. 8, 2009).

SPECIAL TEAMS MAKING SPECIAL IMPACT

- Sophomore **Evan McPherson**, one of the 20 Lou Groza Award semifinalists last year, has made three of his four field goals this season. McPherson ranked 6th nationally last year with an 89.5 percentage (17 of 19).
- Senior **Van Jefferson** is one of Florida's "gunners" on its punt team. In the Miami game, he downed a punt at Miami's 5-yard line and recovered a muffed punt that set up a go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter.
- **"It's something we stress so much within our team. You're looking at a senior starting wide receiver that's covering a punt, making plays. That really shows a lot about the team. Special teams is something we take a lot of pride in, we practice an awful lot."** --Dan Mullen after Miami win.
- Senior **Tommy Townsend** has downed all five of his punts inside the 20-yard line this year. Townsend downed 17 of 39 punts inside the 20 last year.
- Special teams coordinator **Greg Knox** has made an immediate impact with the Gators. Knox's Mississippi State teams blocked 15 kicks or punts from 2014-17, which tied for the SEC lead and ranked 3rd nationally.

GATORS DIAL UP DEFENSIVE PRESSURE

- Florida's 16 sacks lead all FBS teams by two, and its 29 tackles for loss rank sixth nationally.
- UF needed six games to reach 16 sacks last year, and it took four full games to rack up 29 TFLs last year.
- **Jabari Zuniga** is Florida's top disrupter, as he's tied for the SEC lead in sacks (3.0) and tied for second in the SEC in tackles for loss (4.5).
- Florida, Michigan State, and South Florida are the only FBS teams featuring three players with at least 3.5 tackles for loss (Zuniga, **Jeremiah Moon**, **Jonathan Greenard**).
- UF and Arkansas the only SEC teams featuring three players with 2.0 sacks -- Greenard, Zuniga, **Ventrell Miller**. The Gators and Ole Miss are the only SEC teams boasting four players with at least 3.0 tackles for loss -- Greenard, Zuniga, **Kyree Campbell**, **Jeremiah Moon**.
- The Gators defense has also been plenty fresh in the second half this season, contributing to Florida outscoring its opponents 67-14 after halftime.
- Florida's 10 sacks in its Week 0 win over Miami set a school record and were the highest total by an SEC team since Nov. 28, 2008, when Ole Miss had 10 against Mississippi State. It was the eighth game of 10-plus sacks by an FBS team since the start of the 2015. Last year, Army (10 against Houston - Dec. 22) was the only FBS team with 10 in a game.
- No FBS team has recorded more than eight sacks in a game this season.
- In 16 games under defensive coordinator **Todd Grantham**, Florida has five-plus sacks in seven of them, as well as eight-plus tackles for loss in eight of them.
- Florida had five-plus sacks in five games last year, eclipsing the 1996 and 1997 Gators and becoming the only UF team since 1990 with that many games in a season. UF had a season-high six sacks at Mississippi State.

SECONDARY CREATING SURGE OF TAKEAWAYS

- Florida is tied for eighth nationally with four interceptions -- all of which have come in the last two games.
- **Kaiir Elam** has an interception in each of the last two games, and he is the only FBS true freshman with multiple interceptions this season.
- Defensive backs **Trey Dean III** and **Brad Stewart Jr.** have also recorded a forced fumble and fumble recovery, respectively.
- Five takeaways by UF's secondary have helped the Gators into a tie for 20th nationally with six takeaways.



THE MULLEN EFFECT

MORE MULLEN TRANSITION NOTES / UPTICKS

- UF has 500-plus yards of total offense in four of its last seven games (Miami [304], Michigan [427], and Kentucky [438] are the outliers). UF had three games of 500-plus yards from 2015-17, and only five from 2011-14.
- Mullen became the third head coach in history to win 10 games in a debut season with a current Power Five program after inheriting a team that won less than five games the year prior. The others were Stanford's Chuck Shaughnessy (1-7-1 in 1939; 10-0 in 1940) and Auburn's Gus Malzahn (3-9 in 2012; 12-2 in 2013).
- Mullen was just the ninth first-year FBS head coach since 2008 to post a top-10 finish in the AP Poll.
- The Gators posted their most games of 500-plus total yards (four), 400-plus total yards (six) and 350-plus total yards (10) since 2009, when they did it five, six, and 10 times, respectively.
- One of Mullen's points of emphasis has been rotation at various positions throughout the game--especially at running back--with the result being a fresher team in the fourth quarter. Florida averaged 6.23 yards per carry (884 on 141 carries) in fourth quarter last year, which ranked 8th in the FBS and led the SEC.
- Florida logged four 250-yard rushing games and three 275-yard rushing games for the first time since 2009 (four of each), and its nine 200-yard rushing performances tied the 1984 Gators and 2008 Gators for the most 200-yard games in a season since at least 1981. From 2015-17, UF combined for eight 200-yard games.
- Florida's tempo increased in Mullen's offense as well, and the evidence was in their touchdown drives. Florida had 32 touchdown drives under three minutes last season, its highest total since posting 40 in 2009. UF combined for 27 sub-three-minute touchdown drives in 2016 and 2017, and it only had 22 in 2015.
- Florida also surpassed its combined totals from 2016 and 2017 totals for touchdowns of 30-plus yards.

STRONG FINISH TO REMARKABLE 2018 TURNAROUND

- Florida won each of its last three games in 2018 by 26-plus points. The last time it won three consecutive games by at least 25 points was an eight-game stretch from Oct. 4-Nov. 29, 2008.
- The Gators also scored 40-plus points in each of those final three games, marking the first time they scored 40-plus points in three consecutive games since a seven-game stretch from Oct. 11-Nov. 29, 2008.
- UF had 400-plus total yards in its last four games, its first such streak time since Nov. 8-29, 2008.
- Florida rose 86 spots in the FBS rankings for scoring offense from 2017 to 2018, the second-largest jump of any team. The Gators were tied for 108th (22.1 points per game) in 2017, but finished 22nd (35.0) last year.
- The Gators finished last season ranked No. 6 in the Coaches Poll and No. 7 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It was Florida's highest finish in either major poll since ending the 2009 season ranked No. 3 in both.
- Prior to last year, Florida had not finished in the top 10 of either poll since 2012 (No. 9 AP / No. 10 Coaches).

PLENTY OF OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION BACK IN 2019

- Florida returns 1,979 of its 2,771 rushing yards (71.4 percent), as well as 18 of its 23 rushing touchdowns (78.3 percent). **Lamical Perine**, last year's leading rusher, heads the group with 826 yards and seven TDs from 2018.
- In the receiving corps, Florida's top seven pass catchers (by receptions) are back. The Gators return 187 of their 217 receptions (86.1 percent), as well as 2,436 of their 2,776 receiving yards (87.8 percent), and 24 of their 28 receiving touchdowns (85.7 percent) from last season's team.
- **Van Jefferson** led Florida in all receiving categories with 35 receptions for 503 yards and six touchdowns. His six touchdown receptions tied Solomon Patton (2013) for the third-highest season total by a Gator since 2009. Riley Cooper (9 in 2009) and Demarcus Robinson (7 in 2014) are the only others in that span with six.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVE / HISTORICAL STREAKS

- UF has scored in 388 consecutive games -- which is an NCAA record. The Gators broke Michigan's record of 365 consecutive games (1984-2014) against LSU on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Since 2008, Florida and Alabama are the only FBS teams that have not lost to a team which finished the season with a losing record. UF is one of four teams since 2013 to stave off such a loss (Alabama, LSU, Michigan).

CROSSING PATHS

- Dan Mullen** faced Tennessee head coach **Jeremy Pruitt** his last two seasons at Mississippi State, when Pruitt was Alabama's defensive coordinator. In 2017, Mullen's Mississippi State offense generated 330 yards (the fourth-most Alabama allowed) and 172 rushing yards (the most any team had against Alabama that year) in a 31-24 loss.
- Christian Robinson** also worked with Pruitt at Georgia during the 2014 season. Robinson was a graduate assistant under Pruitt, who was UGA's defensive coordinator.
- Robinson also worked with special teams coordinator / inside linebackers coach **Kevin Sherrer**, offensive line coach **Will Friend**, and defensive line coach **Tracy Rocker** on Mark Richt's 2014 Georgia coaching staff. Sherrer coached outside linebackers, Friend worked with offensive linemen and was running game coordinator, and Rocker coached the defensive line. Robinson and Friend were also on staff with Richt in 2013.
- Todd Grantham** and Friend worked together at Georgia from 2011-13. Friend was offensive line coach all three seasons, while Grantham was defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach in 2011 before a promotion to associate head coach for 2012 and 2013.
- Larry Scott** had a two-year coaching stint at Tennessee, serving as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach in 2016, then offensive coordinator and tight ends coach in 2017.
- Scott and Tennessee tight ends coach **Brad Niedermeyer** briefly overlapped at Miami in 2013, when Scott was tight ends coach and Niedermeyer was a volunteer analyst.
- David Turner** and Tennessee assistant head coach **Tee Martin** spent two seasons together at Kentucky (2010-11). Turner was defensive line coach, while Martin coached receivers in 2010 and added passing game coordinator responsibilities in 2011.
- Tennessee co-defensive coordinator **Chris Rumph** recently worked at Florida as a defensive line coach (2015-17) and co-defensive coordinator (2017).
- Van Jefferson** (Brentwood) is UF's only player from Tennessee. The Vols have 12 Floridians.

FLORIDA vs. TENNESSEE SERIES HISTORY



A Rivalry Born in the 1990s

- The Gators and Vols met as ranked teams 18 consecutive times from 1990-2007.
- Of the 16 meetings from 1990-2005, both Florida and Tennessee were top-10 teams in 11 matchups, with the Gators winning eight of those 11 games.
- On a conference level, from 1989-2000, Florida and Tennessee combined to win 10 SEC titles in that 12-year stretch.
- Once Florida-Tennessee became an annual series in 1990, the game's winner captured eight of 11 SEC titles through the 2000 season.
- The only exceptions were 1992 (UF lost to Tennessee, but won the SEC East Division), 1997 (UT lost at UF, but won SEC East and SEC Championship Game), and 1999 (UF beat UT, but lost SEC Championship Game).
- Since the creation of divisions and the SEC Championship game in 1992, the winner of the Florida-Tennessee game has gone on to win the SEC East 13 of a possible 27 times. The two have combined for 17 SEC East titles as well, with Florida owning 12.

Florida's Decade of Superiority

- The Gators' 11-game winning streak from 2005-15 is the longest by either team in the Florida-Tennessee series history.
- Florida won seven of those games by double-figures.
- The Gators' average margin of victory during the streak was 13 points.

Notable Games

- **Oct. 13, 1990** - The first top-10 meeting in the series was a homecoming of sorts for first-year head coach Steve Spurrier, who was a star quarterback at Science Hill High School in Johnson City, Tennessee. The Vols spoiled his return home with a 45-3 rout.
- **Sept. 16, 1995** - Sports Illustrated's Tim Layden spent the week leading up to the game following Peyton Manning for a cover story. He went to his classes, his apartment, his film sessions, even the locker room before the game. Layden's piece on Manning was set to be Sports Illustrated's cover story the following week.

All was well early, as Tennessee led 30-14 toward the tail end of the second quarter. Then Danny Wuerffel and the Gators rattled off 48 consecutive points to win a 62-37 rout.

Wuerffel threw for six touchdowns (four in the second half) and ran in another in the fourth quarter. Manning finished with 326 yards and two touchdowns.

"I felt like we could score every time we got it," said Spurrier, "and we came awfully close."

Adding insult to injury: Wuerffel stole the Sports Illustrated cover (pictured on Page 7) days later.

Notable Games

- **Sept. 21, 1996** - In the first-ever matchup featuring top-five Florida and Tennessee teams, the No. 2-ranked Vols welcomed the No. 4-ranked Gators to Knoxville. Wuerffel threw four touchdowns in the first 18 minutes and 57 seconds. Just 57 seconds after the fourth, Anthone Lott returned a fumble 27 yards and made it 35-0.

Manning eventually threw for 492 yards and four touchdowns--along with four interceptions--as Tennessee mounted a comeback that came up short, with the Gators prevailing 35-29.

Florida jumped to No. 1 and earned the centerfold treatment from Sports Illustrated (pictured on Page 6) the following week.

- **Sept. 20, 1997** - At an offseason speaking event, Spurrier joked, "You can't spell citrus without UT," followed by, "I know why Peyton came back for his senior year. He wanted to be a three-time star of the Citrus Bowl."

Wuerffel was gone. Manning was leading the Heisman discussion. Sports Illustrated centered around Manning, asking on their cover (picture on right), "Gator Bait Again?" It all seemed as though Manning would finally exorcise his Gators demons.

But Manning wound up as Gator Bait. Again.

Third-ranked Florida raced to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, as Doug Johnson threw a touchdown and Tony George returned an interception (one of Manning's two on the day) 89 yards for the Gators' second score.

After a Manning touchdown pass, Florida scored 19 of the game's next 26 points to seal a 33-20 victory over No. 4-ranked Tennessee.

"I'm sure Coach Spurrier will go make a few more jokes," Manning said afterwards.

- **Sept. 18, 1999** - The third top-five matchup in four meetings saw No. 2-ranked Tennessee come to Gainesville to face the No. 4-ranked Gators.

The game was far from pretty for Florida's offense, but Alex Brown dominated on defense, sacking Tee Martin five times, hauling in an interception, breaking up two passes, and forcing a fumble. Brown and the Gators held Tennessee to 287 total yards and a paltry 95 rushing yards.

The offense did just enough, with Doug Johnson tossing a pair of touchdowns and Jeff Chandler nailing three field goals to give Florida a 23-7 lead in the third quarter. Again, a late Tennessee surge was not enough, as Florida held on to win, 23-21.

- **Sept. 16, 2000** - Florida trailed, 23-20, with 2:14 left to play. Jesse Palmer led the Gators to UT's three-yard line and, with 20 seconds to go, hit Jabar Gaffney in the end zone for a touchdown. Gaffney had the ball batted away almost instantly, but officials determined he possessed it long enough for the game-winning score. The 27-23 victory is now referred to as, "The Catch?"

- **Dec. 1, 2001** - The fourth top-five matchup in a span of six meetings, No. 2 Florida and No. 5 Tennessee met in a rescheduled game with an SEC Championship Game berth at stake.

Florida was a 17.5-point favorite, and the 2001 Gators are still regarded as one of the best teams in UF history, beating four teams that finished in the AP Top 15 by 24-plus points, including a 44-15 win at No. 7 LSU.

This thrilling clash came down to a two-point conversion, as Rex Grossman, who threw for 362 yards and two touchdowns, led the Gators into the end zone to make it 34-32 with 1:10 remaining. Grossman's pass was wide of Gaffney on the two-point try that could have tied the game.

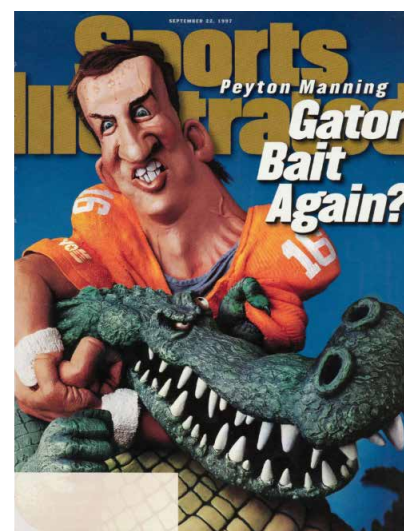
- **Sept. 16, 2006** - Seventh-ranked Florida's defense picked off Erik Ainge twice and held No. 13-ranked Tennessee to negative 11 rushing yards, while senior Chris Leak tossed all three Gators touchdowns, including the game-winner with 6:30 left in the 21-20 victory.

- **Sept. 15, 2007** - Fifth-ranked Florida notched its largest win of the series, thumping No. 22-ranked Tennessee, 59-20. Tim Tebow accounted for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing), and Percy Harvin racked up 195 all-purpose yards and a touchdown. Florida finished with 554 total yards.

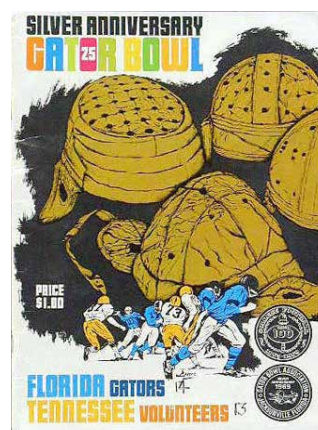
- **Sept. 26, 2015** - The final win of Florida's 11-game winning streak saw it erase a 27-14 four-quarter deficit with touchdown passes to Brandon Powell and Antonio Callaway, the latter coming with 1:26 remaining to secure a 28-27 win.

Chris Harry's Quick Slant

WHAT HAPPENED: UF forced six turnovers, and quarterback Feleipe Franks and friends took advantage of those home-team miscues to the tune of 24 points on the way to a lopsided Southeastern Conference win Saturday night in front of more than 100,000 at Neyland Stadium. Franks completed nine of 18 throws for 172 yards, including a 65-yard scoring strike to wideout Freddie "Big Gain" Swain, as the Gators handed the Vols their worst loss in the series since a 59-20 wipeout in 2007. Florida turned a pair of interceptions into scoring drives of 22 and seven yards in the first quarter, went on to lead 26-3 at halftime, then recovered a fumble to start the second half and scored on the first play of the third quarter on a 19-yard run by tailback Jordan Scarlett to officially make it a runaway. The Gators only outgained the Vols in total yards, 387-364, but it hardly mattered, given the inability by Tennessee to finish drives due to turnovers and UF's offense benefiting from short fields. Of Florida's six touchdown drives, five went four plays or less and three were one-play drives, the last coming on 47-yard, fourth-quarter scoring run by true freshman tailback Dameon Pierce, who had a 68-yard score in last week's win over Colorado State. The 47 points were the most ever scored by UF in Knoxville.

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida continued its mastery of the series by winning for the 13th time in the last 14 meetings, dating to 2005. Just where the Gators will eventually sit in the SEC East Division remains to be seen. They won't be in last place any time soon, though, because they now have a game-plus advantage on Tennessee, which has lost its 10th straight league game, dating to the last game of the 2016 season. Florida won for the second consecutive week, looked pretty good doing so, and will leave Knoxville with a jolt of confidence, thanks to such a lopsided outcome.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Junior linebacker David Reese, UF's leading tackler a season ago, made his season debut after missing the first three games with an ankle injury. Reese wasted no time announcing his return. He was in the backfield on a blitz when Jachai Polite sacked UT quarterback Jarrett Guarantano, with the ball popping in the air for a fumble recovery, which the Gators converted into the first touchdown of the game. Florida led 14-0 early in the second quarter when Tennessee faced a third-and-1 at the UF 14. A touchdown would have cut the Gators' margin in half. Reese, though, joined forces with defensive tackle Adam Shuler to bulldoze the UT front and blow up tailback Ty Chandler for a one-yard loss that forced the Vols to settle for a field goal. Reese finished with a team-high 11 tackles, with 0.5 for loss and the fumble recovery.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Obviously, the half-dozen turnovers, but the four in the first half were huge for the Gators (and brutal for the Vols), as they set the game's tone, especially when the visitors capitalized on them for 17 points through the first 30 minutes. Florida turned the first two takeaways into touchdowns to jump ahead 14-0 with nearly five minutes remaining in the first period. The third and fourth took the air out of the stadium (and the UT sidelines) by thwarted promising Tennessee drives, especially when cornerback C.J. Henderson chased down tight end A.J. Pope and forced a fumble at the goal line that rolled out of the end zone for a touchback at the end of a 51-yard completion. Surely, the UT coaches told their team at halftime the Vols would be in the game were it not for the turnovers, right? Mullen Revives Florida's Offense in 2018 Debut

- The Gators finished in the top 100 in scoring offense for the first time since 2014. They had not finished higher than 96th in total offense since 2010 (when they were 83rd), and their only passing offense to rank higher than 85th following the 2009 season checked in at 79th (2016).
- Florida's averages in each of the following categories were also its highest since 2009: scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense (and average), touchdown-interception ratio, passing touchdowns, and scrimmage touchdowns.
- Here is a look those massive improvements:

- Florida also had its most games of 500-plus total yards (four), 400-plus total yards (six), and 350-plus total yards (10) since 2009, when it had five, six, and 10, respectively.
- Much of the success in 2018 could be attributed to Feleipe Franks turnaround, which Mullen engineered. Franks finished the year tied for 17th nationally in touchdown-interception ratio, and his 24 touchdown passes (to six interceptions) were the highest season total since Tim Tebow threw 30 en route to the 2008 national title.
- The Gators had 11 different pass catchers with a touchdown reception for the first time since 2009. In 2017, UF totaled 10 receiving touchdowns.
- Mullen joined Stanford's Chuck Shaughnessy (1-7-1 in 1939; 10-0 in 1940) and Auburn's Gus Malzahn (3-9 in 2012; 12-2 in 2013) as the only other head coaches in history to win 10 games in a debut season at a current Power Five program after inheriting a team that won less than five games the year prior.
- Oversaw the second-highest wins turnaround in school history (4-7 to 10-3 / +6), with it only being behind the 1980 Gators, who went 8-4 following a 0-10-1 campaign in 1979.
- Became the first head coach in Gators history to win seven-plus games in a debut season after inheriting a sub-.500 team.

In Perspective: Mullen's Mississippi State Turnaround

- Mullen took over in Starkville with the Bulldogs coming off a 4-8 season and a nine-season stretch from 2000-08 in which they went 37-69 and made just two bowl appearances.
- The Bulldogs went 69-46 overall, 33-39 in SEC play, and made eight bowl games in Mullen's nine seasons as head coach. Of his losses, 34 (or 74 percent of them) were to ranked opponents.
- Seven of MSU's top nine (and all of its top four) highest total offense per game season averages were produced with Mullen as head coach
- Mississippi State broke more than 112 game, season, and career school records under Mullen.

- Mullen made Mississippi State one of 11 FBS programs to produce six different 1,000-yard rushers from 2009-17. The others were: Auburn (9), Nevada (7), Alabama (6), Army (6), Baylor (6), Boise State (6), Georgia Tech (6), Navy (6), Ohio State (6), and Wisconsin (6).
- Mississippi State produced 26 NFL Draft picks in Mullen's nine seasons, including a pair of First-Rounders. From 1996 through 2008, MSU had 27 NFL Draft picks.

- The Bulldogs' held the No. 1 ranking until after a 25-20 loss at No. 4 Alabama on Nov. 15.
- Since 2001, only 16 FBS programs--predominantly "blueblood" schools--have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25.
- Since 2001, only 11 FBS programs have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25 at least five weeks:** Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Miami, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Oregon, and Southern California.
- Since 2013, only five FBS programs have been the No. 1 team in the AP Top 25.**

In Perspective: Mullen as Florida's O.C.

- During Mullen's four seasons as the Gators offensive coordinator from 2005-08, Florida ranked 3rd in passer rating (155.9), 8th in scoring offense (36.3), 15th in total offense (418.9), 21st in rushing offense (185.6), 39th in passing offense (233.2).
- Coordinated an offense that ranked 4th nationally in points per game (43.6--also fourth in school history) and 15th in yards per game (445.1), eventually helping the Gators win the 2009 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated a Gators offense that scored 41 points to rout Ohio State--which had the nation's top scoring defense--in the 2007 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated the 2007 offense to 457.2 total yards per game, which ranks eighth in UF history.
- Helped Chad Jackson garner Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after he set UF's single-season record with 88 receptions in 2005. Jackson led the SEC and ranked 6th nationally in receptions.
- Also in 2005, center Mike Degory was named a Rimington Trophy finalist.

In Perspective: Mullen's Quarterbacks Track Record

- In 2002 at Bowling Green, Mullen helped Josh Harris account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (41) among FBS players and 3,213 total yards.
- In 2004 at Utah, Mullen helped Alex Smith account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (42) among FBS players, and amass 3,604 total yards.
- Smith finished fourth in the 2004 Heisman Trophy voting and was the No. 1 pick in 2005 NFL Draft.
- In 2007, Mullen helped Tim Tebow account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (55--an SEC record) among FBS players, and amass 4,181 total yards.
- Tebow also became the first quarterback in FBS history to pass for 20+ touchdowns and rush for 20+ touchdowns in a season.
- Tebow won the Heisman Trophy in 2007, becoming the first underclassman to win the award.

- Tebow's numbers dipped slightly in 2008, but he still ranked 7th nationally in total touchdowns (42) and accounted for 3,419 total yards.
- In 2014, Mullen helped Dak Prescott finish tied for fifth nationally in total touchdowns (42) in 2014, in addition to totaling 4,470 yards (3,449 pass / 986 rush / 35 receiving).
- Prescott finished 8th in the 2014 Heisman voting and was a finalist for the Maxwell Award.
- Prescott's rushing production dipped in 2015, but he increased his passing production and finished the season ranked 15th nationally in passing yards (3,793). He also ranked 11th nationally with 39 total touchdowns.
- In 2016, Mullen helped first-year starter Nick Fitzgerald, a redshirt sophomore, tie for 14th nationally with 37 total touchdowns. Fitzgerald also ran for 1,375 yards--ranking 3rd among FBS quarterbacks.
- In 2017, Fitzgerald accounted for 2,766 yards (1,782 passing, 984 rushing) and 29 touchdowns (15 passing, 14 rushing) despite missing nearly all of the Egg Bowl and Mississippi State's bowl game due to a gruesome ankle injury.

- **The Mullen Connection:** safeties coach under Mullen at Mississippi State for the 2017 season.
- Notable Coaching Stints: Michigan (2003-05 - secondary), Michigan (2006-07 - defensive coordinator), Eastern Michigan (2009-13 - head coach), Mississippi State (2017 - safeties)
- Coached Chauncey Gardner-Johnson to a team-leading four interceptions (and two return touchdowns) in 2018.
- DC for Mississippi State's 2017 TaxSlayer Bowl win--which saw it force 2016 Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson into a career-high four interceptions and a season-high six sacks.
- D-coordinator for a Michigan unit that led the FBS in rushing defense (43.4 yards), rushing touchdowns allowed (5) in 2006.
- In 2005, Michigan was 8th nationally in pass defense (178.8).

- Coordinated Florida's offense to its best numbers since 2009 in numerous categories, including rushing offense (213.2 yards per game - 27th in FBS) and rushing average (5.3 yards per carry - tied 18th in FBS).
- Oversaw running game and offensive line his entire MSU tenure, adding co-offensive coordinator duties from 2014-17.

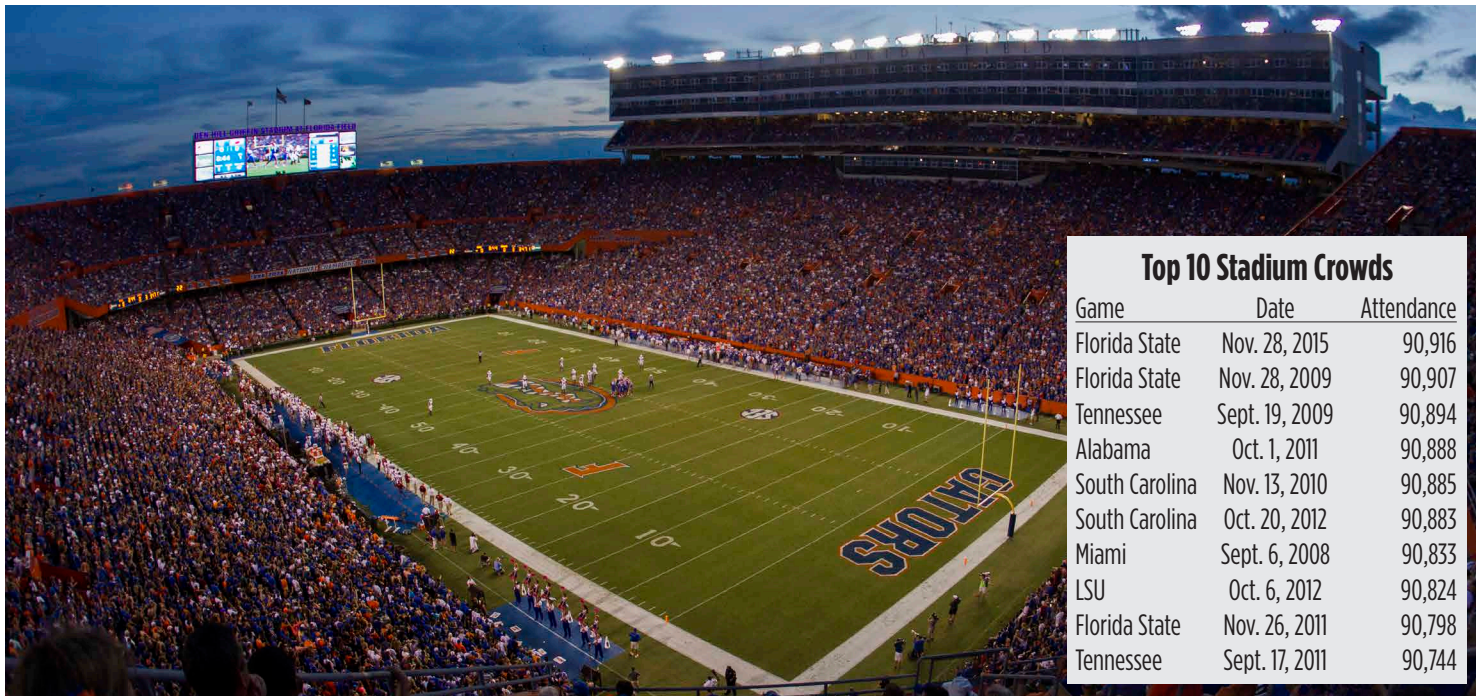

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."

WHAT HAPPENED: Fourth-year junior quarterback Feleipe Franks ran three yards for the go-ahead touchdown with just over eight minutes left and a Florida defense that sacked Miami redshirt freshman Jarren Williams 10 times withstood a flurry of penalties on the Hurricanes' final two drives and held on for a big (albeit ugly, at times) season-opening victory before a sold-out house at Camping World Stadium in Orlando. The game, serving as the ceremonial kickoff to college football's 150th season, was a rare matchup between two cross-state rivals and featured five lead changes, including two in the fourth quarter, but also five turnovers and 23 combined penalties for 218 yards. Miami tailback DeeJay Dallas, from the wildcat spot, dashed 50 yards for a touchdown to give Miami a 20-17 lead 45 seconds into the final period. Two UF drives later, Franks dropped and heaved a 65-yard completion to senior wideout Josh Hammond, with Franks scoring on a QB keeper three plays later at the 8:18 mark. After that, both teams made enough mistakes for two games, as Miami had no answer for Florida's defensive pressure and Florida's secondary was unable to cleanly cover Miami's receivers downfield. After a huge UF stop with 4:30 to play, Franks was intercepted on first down and gave the Hurricanes the ball at the Florida 36. From there, the Gators had to escape two defensive pass interference penalties -- one of them on fourth-and-34. The game ended with Miami at the Florida 26, facing fourth-and-12, but with a chance to chuck the ball into the end zone for the win. Instead, UF defensive end Jeremiah Moon was fast off the edge and forced Williams into a no-chance throw into the dirt to end the game and give the Gators just their second victory over the Hurricanes in the last 33 years. Franks finished 17 of 27 for 254 yards and two touchdowns, including a 66-yard screen pass to Kadarius Toney in the first quarter, plus two interceptions, both in the final period. Williams, making his first career start, hit 19 of 29 attempts for 214 yards and a score, while Dallas had 12 carries for 95 yards.

WHAT IT MEANS: A lot. Florida began the day having lost seven of eight to Miami, dating to the 1986 season, the year before the Gators begged out of an annual rivalry that dated to 1938. The run of frustration included an ugly 2013 defeat that marked the last time the two programs played. With the victory, UF now trails the series, 27-29. More importantly, of course, was getting the 2019 season off to a victorious start, even though things did get a little dicey at the end. Better than the alternative. Ask the Canes.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Got to go with Franks ... for the good and bad. His big-arm throw to Hammond helped turn the game, but his interception after that huge defensive stop gave the Hurricanes a chance. Remember, things weren't always smooth sailing with him last season either, but alongside Coach Dan Mullen the two worked together and figured some stuff out.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Those 10 sacks by the Gators were the most by a Florida defense since at least 1996 (the only stats available via our data base), topping the previous best when Jevon Kearse and the Gators beheaded Auburn's Dameyune Craig nine times in a 24-10 win at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

WHAT HAPPENED: Quarterback Feleipe Franks completed his first 15 passes on the way to throwing for 270 yards and two touchdowns without a turnover Saturday night, and the Gators did what the 11th-ranked team in the country is supposed to do an FCS opponent from the Ohio Valley Conference in their 2019 home opener at Spurrier/Florida Field. The UF offense started slowly, managing just a 3-0 lead through the first 22 minutes before Franks, the fourth-year junior, fired scoring strikes of 69 yards to Van Jefferson and 35 to Tyrie Cleveland to open a 17-0 lead in the second quarter. The Gators added third-quarter rushing TDs from tailbacks Malik Davis and Lamical Perine, then stretched the lead in the fourth quarter when both UF backup quarterbacks, Kyle Trask and Emory Jones, accounted for a TD (Trask passing, Jones rushing). Franks, who had three turnovers in UF's season-opening win two weeks ago against Miami, played just three quarters and finished his night 25 of 27 (that's 92.6 percent). UF tallied 543 yards of total offense (312 passing, 231 rushing), while the defense limited the Skyhawks to 194 yards and posted the program's first shutout since a 32-0 defeat of North Texas three games into the 2016 season. The win, however, looked to have come with a price (read on).

WHAT IT MEANS: Not much, other than the fact UF was bigger, faster and more physical than UTM, which everybody knew well before the kickoff. The game allowed the Gators to build some confidence, pile up some statistics and celebrate some big offensive plays the likes of which were much harder to come by two weeks earlier against a stout Hurricanes defense in Orlando.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Got to go with wingback Kadarius Toney and cornerback CJ Henderson -- unfortunately -- as both players left the game with injuries and did not return. Toney was hit hard on a running play in the first quarter and went to the sideline in obvious pain with what appeared to be an arm or shoulder injury. Trainers tended to Toney in the sideline tent before taking him to the locker room. In the second quarter, Henderson got tangled up covering a deep pass down the middle of the field. Henderson, after remaining on the field a bit, was helped off by two trainers and taken to the locker room. No in-game injury updates were provided by UF.

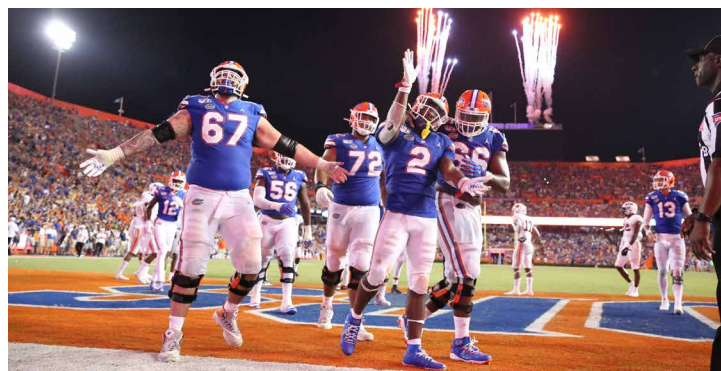
STAGGERING STATISTIC: Those first 15 completions by Franks were the second-most to start a game by a Florida quarterback in program history. Worth noting: The incompletion on his 16th attempt came on a "Hail Mary" at the end of the half. The record for most completions to start a game remained at 17, set by Chris Leak in a 32-14 season-opening defeat of Wyoming on Sept. 3, 2005, a game that marked the debut of Coach Urban Meyer.

WHAT HAPPENED: Backup quarterback Kyle Trask, summoned to duty for injured starter Feleipe Franks, led two fourth-quarter touchdown drives and capped the second with a 4-yard run and go-ahead score with 4:11 remaining as the ninth-ranked Gators overcame a double-digit deficit and escaped with a stirring comeback win in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams at sold-out Kroger Field. The outcome could easily have gone the other way, as the Wildcats, after Trask's go-ahead score, marched 58 yards in nine plays, but Chance Moore was wide right on a 34-yard field goal attempt with 54 seconds to play. UK tried to get the ball back by calling a couple timeouts, but wide receiver Josh Hammond's electrifying 76-yard touchdown run iced it and gave the Gators their 32nd over the Wildcats in the last 33 meetings. There was no in-game update on Franks, who was trying to run for a first down on fourth-and-1 when he was hit hard and his torso awkwardly bent backward, with his legs appearing to be planted in the pile. The entire UF sideline emptied onto the field when Franks, who hit 12 of 17 throws for 174 yards, one touchdown and an interception in his 18th consecutive start, was carted away. Kentucky led 21-10 at the time. Enter Trask, who hit his first four passes on his way to going 9-for-13 for 126 yards and stealing the spotlight from UK first-time starter Sawyer Smith, who hit 23 of 34 passes for 267 yards, two touchdowns and another rushing. Smith, though, turned the ball over four times, including a pair of second-half interceptions by junior safety Shawn Davis that led to 10 points. The second of those Davis picks came with Kentucky leading 21-16 and 6:05 to play in the game. Florida needed just four plays to go 66 yards, but 30 of those came on Kentucky penalties, with Trask finishing things off with the go-ahead scramble up the middle.

WHAT IT MEANS: A road win to open the SEC slate, which is always big. Remember, the Gators started 0-1 in the league last season, courtesy of that home loss to the Cats that snapped the historic 31-game winning streak. As for the injury to Franks, the team's personality obviously will undergo a significant change. Read on.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: No one outside of the Florida football walls (maybe even Coach Dan Mullen's office) knew for certain if the Florida backup quarterback was Trask or redshirt freshman Emory Jones. Now, not only do we know a little more, but we're going to find out a lot more about Trask, the person/player, in the coming days/weeks. Now that there's high-leverage tape for opposing defensive coaches to break down, the 6-foot-5, 239-pound fourth-year junior from Texas no longer will have the element of surprise working in his favor, as he surely must have against the Kentucky defense.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The Gators had 216 yards of offense through three quarters, but cranked out 222 in the fourth quarter alone, including TD drives of 66 and 80 yards with Trask in control.
