WOMEN'S HEAD COACH JEFF POPPELL

Jeff Poppell enters his third season as the women's head swimming and diving coach at the University of Florida in 2020-21, and his 27th season overall of coaching swimming and diving.

In his first two seasons as the women's head coach, Poppell has propelled the women's program to heights that haven't been reached in recent memory. Overall, he has led the Gators to an overall dual meet record of 14-2 and back-to-back second-place finishes at the Southeastern Conference Championships, a first since the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

At Poppell's second conference championship meet in 2019-20, the Gators would reel in seven medals (six individual and one relay) and set 28 new personal-best swims and six new top 10 program swims over the five-day competition, falling short of first-place by just 28.5 points. For their effort at the conference meet, nine Gators (seven Second Team and two All-Freshman) would earn post-season SEC honors.

Due to the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA women's swimming and diving championships, all 13 Florida invitees to the national meet earned College Swimming and Diving Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) All-American honors. Florida's honorees totaled 36 overall distinctions, led by Sherridon Dressel and Vanessa Pearl with three individual honors each. Taylor Ault, Leah Braswell, Kelly Fertel and Ashley McCool also earned multiple individual accolades. Bella Garofalo tied for a team-best four relay accolades with Dressel, appearing on UF's 200 free, 400 free, 200 medley and 400 medley relays that earned All-American recognition after meeting the time standard set by the NCAA this season.

Poppell's second regular season campaign was a special one, concluding 2019-20 with the program's best regular season dual finish (8-1) since the 2007-08 season when the Gators posted an identical record. The team got off to one of the greatest starts by a Gator squad, beginning the season by winning their first eight duals, which marked the first time this decade reaching this feat.

In total, Florida 22 swimmers and divers would go on to win 171 events throughout the season, led by Dressel's 27-win campaign. Freshman Talia Bates would make her presence felt immediately, producing the second-most event wins on the squad, producing nine individual wins as well as being a member of 10 winning relays.

Oct. 23, 2019 was a historic day for the Gators as they were voted the No. 1 team in the CSCAA Top 25 Poll after posting a 5-0 start, the first time the women's program has been the top-ranked team since the 2010 National Championship team.

Poppell has instilled in his team the importance of success in both the pool and in the classroom, which came into fruition during the 2019-20

academic year. The Gators would post a trio of new academic records, capped off by a Division I-leading 24 CSCAA Scholar All-America honors. The team would also set program records by placing 27 swimmers and divers on the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll, as well as combining for a team GPA of 3.80 during the 2020 Spring semester. Six Gators would land on the conference's First-Year Academic Honor Roll to cap off academic awards in Poppell's second season.

During his first year as the women's head coach in 2018-19, the Gators registered a 24th-place finish at the NCAA Championships to go along with the runner-up bid at SEC's. His team ended the 2018-19 campaign with 31 top times on the all-time program swim list. Women's swimmers and divers earned eight All-American honors, seven All-SEC accolades and two SEC All-Freshman nods. The Gators excelled outside of the water, tallying a team grade-point-average of 3.54 and landing 17 on the CSCAA Scholar All-America team, 23 on the SEC Academic Honor Roll and eight on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

The Gators finished the regular season ranked eighth-nationally with an overall record of 10-2, including a conference mark of 4-2. Poppell's team showed up and performed at the SEC Championships, registering 13 top-ten program fastest times, highlighted by Pearl posting the fastest 200 IM and 200 breast time in Gator history. In total, seven Gators earned All-SEC accolades for their performance at the conference tournament.

Poppell sent 13 swimmers and one diver to the 2019 NCAA Championships at the University of Texas. Here, the Gators finished in 24th-place with 44 total points and received six All-American honors. Poppell led the charge on the improvement from the previous year, where the Gators finished 35th overall at NCAA's. The orange and blue earned spots in the A Finals at the Championships for the first time since 2016.

Poppell was hired as the Head Coach of the University of Florida women's swimming and diving team before the 2017-18 season. He previously served four years as the head coach for Gulliver Preparatory School and the Gulliver Swim Club, six years as the women's head coach at the University of Arkansas and 13 years serving in head coach and assistant coach capacities with

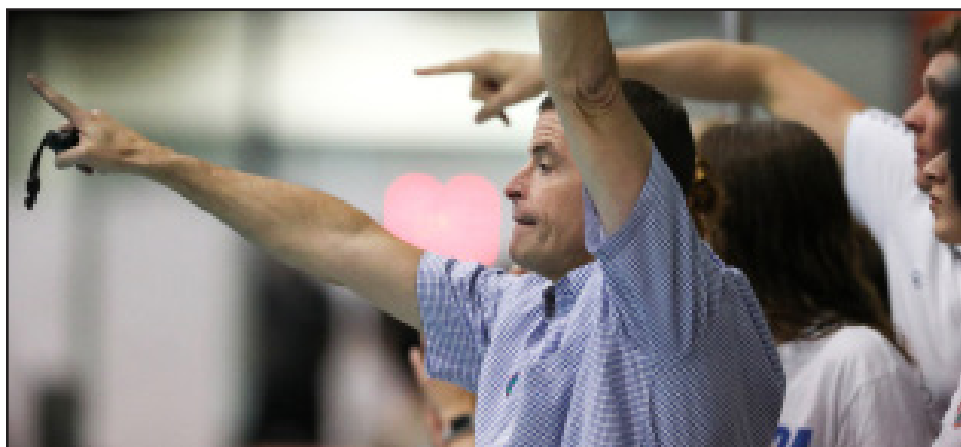
The Bolles School and Bolles School Sharks.

In the 2017-18 campaign, Poppell coached Caeleb Dressel to his seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free, 100 fly, and 200 free relay. Caeleb Dressel set a new American, NCAA, US Open and UF record in the 100 free with a mark of 39.90 which surpassed the mark of 40.00 he set in the previous year. Caeleb Dressel was named the SEC Swimmer of the Year and the CSCAA Swimmer of the Year, both for the third straight season. Under Poppell's guidance, the Gators totaled 33 All-American honors from 11 different athletes. Under the tutelage of Poppell, Florida collected 10 First-Team All-SEC accolades as well as two second-team nods. Poppell helped Sherridon Dressel and Brooke Madden to achieve All-American Honorable Mention accolades.

In the 2016-17 season, Poppell helped coach Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 Free, 100 Free and 100 Butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Caeleb Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Caeleb Dressel, Mark Szaranek won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became Poppell's first SEC Male Freshman of the Year after his performance in the pool. A total of eight athletes took home 31 All-American honors. Poppell coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Through four seasons at Gulliver Preparatory School and Gulliver Swim Club, Poppell's challenge was to build winning programs from the ground level up. He quickly helped launch the program to an elite status after several swimmers established themselves as top national talents, including Jana Mangimelli, who placed 5th in the 200-Meter IM at the 2013 United States World Championship Trials and US National Championships, clocking a time that ranked her among the Top-25 in the world.

In 2014 and 2015, he led Gulliver Preparatory to consecutive 2A FHSAA High School State Swimming Championship titles in girls swimming after winning the school's first-ever state championship



in swimming in 2014. Most recently, in 2015-2016, Poppell guided Gulliver Swim Club to its first-ever Silver Medal Award, which recognizes the Top-100 swimming clubs in the United States. In addition, he tutored four U.S. Olympic Team Trials qualifiers, three finalists at the U.S. Summer Junior National Championships, and 10 swimmers who were ranked among the top 25 nationally in their respective age groups.

During his six years as the Head Swimming Coach of the University of Arkansas, he guided the program to its best performances in school history, which included a top-five finish at the SEC Championships and a No. 17 national ranking in the College Swimming Coaches Association of America national polls. The Razorbacks swimming and diving program began Poppell's second season ranked in the Top-25 national poll and was ranked for five consecutive years.

Poppell coached 16 athletes who individually qualified for the NCAA Championships and helped ten of these women earn NCAA All-American honors. One of his swimmers, Yi-Ting Siow, a three-time Olympian, became the first Razorback swimmer to win back-to-back SEC titles, claiming the SEC championship title in the 200 breaststroke in 2009 and 2010. Siow's fourth place finish in the 200 breaststroke at the 2009 and 2010 NCAA Championships represented the highest NCAA Championship finish for a swimmer in Razorback history. Her time of 2:07.73 was just seven-hundredths of a second behind the SEC record held by 1999 NCAA champion and 2000 Olympic silver medalist Kristy Kowal of Georgia.

During the 2010-2011 season, Chelsea Franklin finished seventh in the 1650 freestyle at the women's NCAA Championships, earning All-American honors for the first time with a time of 15:59.05, which still stands as the Arkansas school record in the event. The 2009 NCAA Championships were highlighted by five different Razorback swimmers qualifying individually for the meet with four of the swimmers earning NCAA All-American status by finishing in the top 16: Yi-Ting Siow and Leah Pierce in the 200 Breaststroke, Katie Kastes in the 400 Individual Medley and 200 Butterfly and Stephanie Carr in the 1650 Freestyle. The 2008 NCAA Championships featured freshman Katie Kastes' 9th place finish in the 200 Butterfly with the 6th fastest time recorded in the meet.

Coach Poppell had 10 swimmers qualify for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials in Omaha, Nebraska. In 2009, Poppell served as the Head Women's Coach for Team USA at the World Maccabiah Games in Israel. He was also a USA Swimming National Team coach from 2005-08, during which, he coached three swimmers who competed at the 2009 FINA World Swimming Championships in Rome, and two who competed in the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. He guided two of his swimmers to three gold medals, one silver, two bronze, and three meet records at the Southeast Asian Games.

Prior to the University of Arkansas, Poppell spent 13 years with the Bolles School and Bolles Sharks in Jacksonville, Florida, one of the country's most prominent high school and club swimming programs. At the 2006 Spring U.S. National Championships, he led the Bolles Sharks to a Top-5 team finish where the Bolles men's 4x200 freestyle relay team won the U.S. National title and Omar Pinzon became the U.S. National Champion in the men's

200 backstroke.

During the 2005-06 High School season, Poppell guided the Bolles High School boys' team to its 18th consecutive Florida high school state championship and the girls earned its 15th consecutive high school state title. The boy's swimming team went on to be crowned National Prep School Champions and captured a National Runner-Up finish for Swimming World's National High School Championship. For his efforts, Poppell was honored with NFHS Florida High School Boy's Coach of the Year.

During the 2003-2004 season, The Bolles School Girls Swimming team was crowned Swimming World's National High School Champions and the 2003 & 2004 NISCA National Dual Meet Team Champions for both Girls and Boys Independent School. In addition, Anja Carman was named the NISCA National High School Female Swimmer of the Year and Coach Poppell was named the NHSCA National High School Coach of the Year and Florida Dairy Farmers High School Coach of the Year for his work with the girl's high school team at Bolles. Also during that year, Anja Carman won two Silver medals at the European Long Course Championships in both the 200 Backstroke and 800 Freestyle and teammate Stephanie Carr was crowned the 18&U U.S. National Champion in the 1500 Freestyle with the 6th fastest time in the World. Carr was also a finalist in the 800-meter free at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials.

As the Bolles School Head Coach from 2002-

2006, he coached four swimmers ranked in the top 25 in the World and an additional seven swimmers ranked among the top 100 in the World, seventeen current or former Bolles Sharks swimmers that competed at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, five U.S. National Championship/U.S. Olympic Trials finalists, two U.S. National Champions, and two 18&U U.S. National Champions. Furthermore, Poppell's swimmers garnered medals at major international events such as the European Championships, Commonwealth Games, South American Championships, Southeast Asian Games, and the Central American and Caribbean Swimming Championships.

Under current UF head coach Gregg Troy, Poppell joined the staff of Bolles in August of 1993 as an age group coach. Working his way up to associate head coach in 2001, Poppell became the head coach and aquatics director in March of 2002.

As a student-athlete at University of Georgia, Poppell was a four-year letter winner and team captain for the Georgia Bulldogs' swimming team. He qualified for the NCAA Championships twice and was an Honorable Mention All-SEC and academic All-SEC honoree. He earned one gold, one silver, and two bronze medals while competing for the United States at the 1993 Maccabiah Games in Israel. To this day, the Bulldog program remembers his contributions to the team with the annual presentation of the Jeff Poppell Award for Leadership.

A 1993 graduate of the University of Georgia, Coach Poppell and his wife, Joanna, have two children, Jack and Jenna.

MEN'S HEAD COACH ANTHONY NESTY

One of the most decorated swimmers in Florida history, Anthony Nesty enters his 3rd season as the men's head swimming and diving coach and 23rd as a member of the Gators' coaching staff in 2020-21.

Nesty has continued to lead the Gators' dynasty in his first two seasons as the leader of the men's program, pushing UF's conference championship streak to eight in a row with back-to-back Southeastern Conference titles in 2019 and 2020.

For his efforts, Nesty was named the SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year in both seasons to become the first men's swimming and diving coach in UF history to take home the honor in each of their first two seasons.

At the 2020 SEC Championships, the Gators strung together a championship-worthy performance, winning the five-day competition with 1,194 points for their eighth-straight (third-longest in conference history) and a SEC-best 41st overall conference crown. The Gators won the 2020 championship with 15 medals – five gold, four silver and six bronze– as well as five event titles– four individual and one relay.

Nesty's team would shatter multiple records at his second SEC meet, starting on the first night in the 800 free relay with a SEC and school record. Kieran Smith (500 free) and Robert Finke (1,650 free) would both become American record-holders in their respective events after shattering the previous top swims to lead Florida throughout the week. Smith would go on to add another SEC title in the 400 IM, with Khader Baqlah earning UF's final event title in the 200 free for the second time in his career.

For their performance, the Gators flooded the SEC postseason awards list. To go along Nesty's Coach of the Year honor, Smith was named SEC Male Swimmer of the Year after his dominating effort at his second career SEC's. This marks the sixth swimmer in Nesty's tenure to be earn the accolade, including taking home the honor eight of the last 10 years (Caeleb Dressel- 2016-18, Marcin Cieslak- 2011-12 & 2013-14 and Conor Dwyer- 2009-11).

Overall, a league-best 13 Florida swimmers, five on the First Team and eight on the Second Team, were named to the All-SEC team for their role in extending the championship streak and would go on to earn individual invites to the NCAA Championships, which was the third-most in the nation.

Fourteen swimmers, which tied for fifth-most in the nation, would go on to earn 38 College Swimming and Diving Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) All-America honors after the cancellation of the NCAA Championships.

Florida amassed an overall regular season record of 7-2 in Nesty's second season, including a conference mark of 2-2. The team would defeat three out of four possible ranked opponents, and posted a

perfect home record of 3-0. Throughout their nine meets, 22 different Gators would notch 124 event victories. Additionally, 52 Gator times or scores found its way on the top-20 SEC marks set throughout the regular season.

In the classroom, the Gators placed 17 individuals on the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll, as well as eight on the conference's First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

Florida earned national recognition for their academic achievements as well. The Gators were honored as a CSCAA Scholar All-America Team after posing a 3.33 team GPA during the Spring semester and had 11 individuals land on the CSCAA Scholar All-America First and Second Teams.

In his first year as the Head Coach in 2018-19, Nesty became just the second Gator to win a SEC title as both a coach and player. Additionally, Nesty won his first career SEC Swimming Coach of the Year award and coached 16 All-Americans, 11 All-SEC selections, five SEC All-Freshman and the Co-Freshman Swimmers of the Year.

The men's swimming and diving team finished ranked 6th nationally and posted a 9-1 regular season record, highlighted by a victory over at-the-time No. 1 ranked University of Texas during a tri-meet on Oct. 19-20. Overall, the team finished a tough schedule with beating seven of eight ranked opponents and registering an undefeated regular-season against SEC foes (5-0).

The team then went on to win its seventh-straight SEC championship with a final tally of 1,233 points after the five-day event concluded. Four Gators won their respective events, highlighted by wins in the 800 free relay and sweeping the 400 IM, the first time since 2013 a team swept an individual event in a conference finals.

The orange and blue finished in sixth-place with 164 total points at the 2019 NCAA Championships, the seventh-consecutive year the Gators finished highest of any SEC program at the national meet. His team collected 16 All-Americans, six first-team and 10 honorable mention awards. He coached the 800 free relay team to a program-fastest time and saw four of his student-athletes secure top-ten individual finishes.

His team performed in the classroom as well, collecting 39 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, 16 First-Year Academic Honor Roll accolades and eight CSCAA Scholar All-America selections. His team combined for a team grade-point-average of 3.00.

Prior to becoming head coach, Nesty has played a key role in guiding the UF men to the six previous Southeastern Conference Championships and a fifth-place finish at the 2018 NCAA Championships. Prior to 2013, the Gators had not won a conference title in 20 years. UF's SEC title in 2018 represented the program's 39th overall. This past season's fifth-place finish extended UF's streak of top-10 national finishes to 19 seasons. Florida had 11 student-athletes total 33 All-American honors over the three-day meet.

In the 2017-18 campaign, Nesty coached Caeleb Dressel to his seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth

National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free, 100 fly, and 200 free relay. Dressel set a new American, NCAA, US Open and UF record in the 100 free with a mark of 39.90 which surpassed the mark of 40.00 he set in the previous year. Dressel was named the SEC Swimmer of the Year and the CSCAA Swimmer of the Year, both for the third straight season. Under Nesty's guidance, the Gators totaled 33 All-American honors from 11 different athletes. Under the tutelage of Nesty, Florida collected 10 First-Team All-SEC accolades as well as two second-team nods.

In the 2016-17 season, Nesty coached Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaranek won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became Nesty's 10th SEC Male Freshman of the Year after his performance in the pool. A total of eight athletes took home 31 All-American honors. Nesty also coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In 2015-16, Nesty helped the Gators take another step forward as the Florida men matched their highest finish ever at the NCAA Championships. Behind two national titles from the NCAA Co-Swimmer of the Year, Caeleb Dressel, the Gators claimed a third-place finish for the second time in 20 seasons. In SEC competition, the Orange and Blue brought home their fourth straight Southeastern Conference Championship on the men's side while 11 Gators were crowned individual champions. Senior Kahlia Warner led the Florida women with a pair of titles in the diving well while Dressel shined once again, claiming six (3 individual, 3 relays).

In 2015, Nesty coached Caeleb Dressel to UF's first-ever 50-yard freestyle (18.67) NCAA Championship, which he achieved on day one of the NCAA meet. Dressel became the ninth Gator swimmer under Nesty and Head Coach Gregg Troy's tutelage to win SEC Male Freshman of the Year. At the conference meet, Dressel won the 100-yard butterfly title in an outstanding time of 45.28 seconds. That mark not only ranked him second all-time in school history but it was the second-quickest in the U.S. 17-18 year old age group.

During the 2014-15 season, the Florida men set seven of a possible 18 school records.

In 2014, the Gators finished third at the NCAA meet which was the highest finish in program history since 1991.

During that season, the Florida men set 12 school records in 2014, including Brad deBorde in the 50 and 100-yard free, Dan Wallace in the 500 free, Arthur Frayler in the mile, Eduardo Solaeche-Gomez in the 100 and 200 breaststroke and Marcin Cieslak in the 100 and 200 butterfly races. In addition, four of five relay teams set UF records as well. Cieslak won a pair of NCAA titles, becoming the first Gator since Nesty to bring home three consecutive national titles in the 100 butterfly (1990-92). Cieslak also captured UF's eighth 200 IM

national championship. Sebastien Rousseau was named the SEC Swimmer of the Year and earned the SEC Commissioner's Trophy after he won a trio of SEC titles.

"Anthony is one of the most revered coaches in college swimming, and one of the few who is considered both a great athlete and a great coach," Troy said. "He's got a great work ethic and a tremendous ability to get results. His experience at the Olympics as an athlete is instrumental in his ability to relate to our current athletes. His reputation for getting the most out of them speaks for itself."

During his collegiate career at UF, Nesty won his aforementioned three consecutive NCAA crowns in the 100 fly from 1990-92. In addition at the NCAA Championships, Nesty won the 200 fly in 1990 and he was a member of Florida's 1991 NCAA champion 400 medley relay team. He held the school records for NCAA titles until 2006, when former Gator Ryan Lochte finished his illustrious career with seven such honors. For his accomplishments as a Gator, Nesty was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in April 2002.

In addition to his success at the collegiate level, Nesty brings experience at the highest levels of international swimming to the Florida staff. At the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games, he won the first-ever Olympic medal for his native country of Suriname when he edged seven-time medalist Matt Biondi of the United States by .01 to bring home the gold in the 100-meter fly. Nesty also won the gold medal in the 100 fly at the 1990 Goodwill Games and captured a world championship in the same event in 1991.

Nesty concluded his swimming career at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, where he earned the bronze in the 100 fly.

Nesty made his return to Gainesville on June 1, 1998, to assume duties on the pool deck. Prior to that, he served as a club level coach for three years with Swim Florida in Sarasota.

Making the coaching stop at Florida has not only allowed Nesty to reach a career goal, but his post on the Gators' deck has allowed him to be reunited with a close friend in former Gator swimming head coach Gregg Troy, for whom Nesty swam for high school at The Bolles School in Jacksonville. Following Nesty's illustrious collegiate career, he served as one of Troy's assistants at Bolles, while also holding the head coaching position at Jacksonville's Nease High School.

Nesty began his international coaching career as an assistant coach for Suriname at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece. He then continued his Olympic tradition as the head coach for Suriname at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing and the 2012 Olympics in London. On the 20th anniversary of Nesty's Olympic gold medal in the 100-meter fly, not only was Nesty honored as head coach of his country's team, but he was recognized as the Suriname flag bearer at the opening ceremonies of the 2008 Summer Games.

Outside of the Olympics, Nesty coached internationally during the summer of 2009, when he traveled to Rome as the coach for the 2009 Cayman National Team at the 2009 FINA World Championships. At the Championships, Nesty tutored then-current Gators Brett and Shaune Fraser. In the summer of 2010, Nesty coached the Cayman National Team at the 2010 Mutual of Omaha Pan Pacific Championships, the largest international meet of the year. In 2011, Nesty served on deck as an assistant coach for the U.S. men's team at the World University Games, which was his first time coaching for the United States. In 2014, Nesty coached the Venezuelan

team at the Pan Pacific games, where he tutored Olympian Andreina Pinto, who trains with the Gator swim club in Gainesville.

Over the last 22 seasons at UF, Nesty has shown the ability to transfer his penchant for fast times in the water to the Gator swimmers he has coached. In 2006-07, he helped Shaune Fraser, a 2004, 2008 and 2012 Olympian from the Cayman Islands, develop into a top-five finisher in the 200 fly at the NCAA Championships in his first collegiate season. His work with the Gators' middle-distance and distance freestylers during that campaign also came to fruition at the 2007 NCAA Championships, as he tutored Grant Johnson and Tobias Work to earn a combined five All-America honors and record four career-best times.

Fraser returned to the NCAA Championships in 2008 to collect seven All-American honors and finally reached the highest collegiate achievement under Nesty in 2009, when he brought home his first two individual national championships in the 200 free and 200 fly (NCAA record). Fraser became the first Gator to win the 200-yard fly since Nesty did so in 1990. Fraser wrapped up his career in 2010 with seven All-America honors, giving him 27 accolades for his career, the most for a single men's swimmer or diver in school history.

In 2015, Dressel earned seven All-American honors and became the first UF freshman to earn seven tributes since Shaune Fraser in 2007. In 2014, Cieslak finished his career with 25 All-America honors and three NCAA Championships, the third-most All-America honors and the 10th most NCAA titles in school history.

At the 2000 NCAA Championships, Nesty saw his pupil, Duncan Sherrard, break his 10-year old school record, which he set at the 1990 SEC Championships, in the 200 fly. In 2006, he was on the pool deck when Ryan Lochte set the school records in the 100 and 200 fly at the SEC Championships. Another Nesty protégé, Ricardo Monasterio, collected four All-America honors during his career at UF and swam in the 1996, 2000, 2004 & 2008 Olympic Games for his home country of Venezuela.

In addition to all the All-America honors, national championships and record breaking times that Nesty has led current and former Gators to; the Paramaribo, Suriname native has led multiple swimmers to SEC Male Swimmer of the Year and SEC Male Freshman Swimmer of the Year honors. 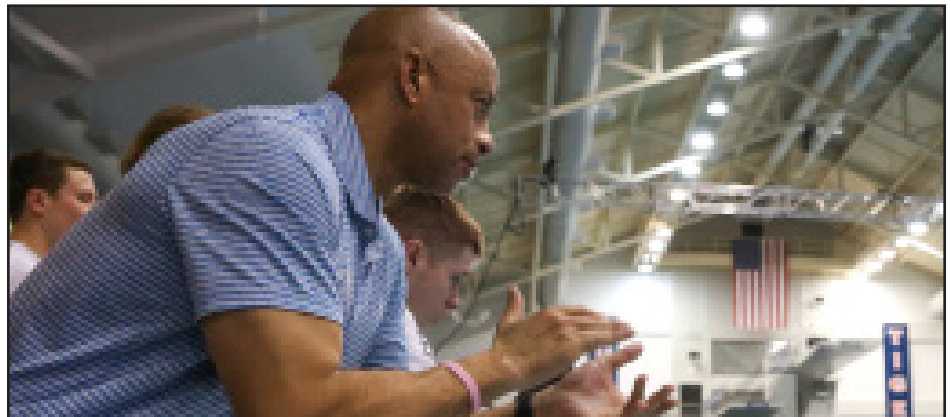

HEAD DIVING COACH BRYAN GILLOOLY



Bryan Gillooly enters his fifth season as the diving coach at the University of Florida in 2020-21.

Last season, Gillooly guided his divers to important contributors to both the men's and women's team, playing an integral role in the program's regular season and postseason success.

In her first season under the tutelage of Gillooly, Ashley McCool earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships and a pair of All-America honors for her performance at the NCAA Diving Zone meet.

Florida's women's diving accumulated the most points of any team at the 2020 SEC Championships. Four divers-Elizabeth Perez, Emma Whitner, McCool and Brooke Madden- registered 228 points, way ahead of their closest competitor, Auburn, with 142 points. Perez (3-meter) and Whitner (platform) both notched silver medals, and McCool posted a pair of fourth-place finishes in her first career SEC Championships.

On the men's side, Alex Farrow and Nick Lydon took to the board and scored in all three events for a total of 57 points to contribute for the SEC Champion Gators. Farrow would tally a personal-best platform score, as well as earning 10th and 11th-place finishes on 1-meter and 3-meter springboard.

Throughout the 2019-20 regular season, Gillooly's divers would post 23 event wins. The women were led by McCool's 11 wins, while the men were led by Farrow's four-win senior campaign. Additionally, the team earned conference recognition for their performances throughout the year as McCool earned back-to-back SEC Diver of the Week accolades after she swept the diving events in four straight meets to start out the year. Madden earned the honor after sweeping the springboards on Senior Day versus Auburn in her final home dual at the O'Connell Center Natatorium. For the men, Farrow garnered the accolade for the first time in his career on Oct. 15 after winning the 1-M springboard with the top score in the conference up to that point of the season.

In 2018-19, Gillooly helped Brooke Madden reach her third-consecutive NCAA Championship, earning her third All-American honor with a seventh-place in the 1-meter in his third season at the helm of the diving duties at UF. Madden also competed in the 3-meter with a 32nd-place finish with a score of 278.90. The Gators sent nine divers to the SEC Championship last year in Athens, Ga., the most in his tenure produced the most points out

of any team at the conference championships. Five divers made it to the final day of NCAA Zones.

During his second year in 2018-19, Gillooly guided Brooke Madden to the NCAA Championships for a second-consecutive season. Madden placed 13th on the 1-meter and 3-meter at the 2018 NCAA Championships. Madden also qualified on the platform, where she placed 43rd. At the SEC Championships, Gillooly helped Madden place tied for fifth on the platform and aided Dalton Goss to a 13th-place finish on the platform.

In Gillooly's first year as Diving Coach, he tutored eight athletes into SEC Championship competition. Two of those athletes, Samuel Smith and Teya Syskakis, tallied top-eight finishes. Smith garnered two top-eight finishes, placing fourth in the Men's 3-meter (440.20) and sixth in Men's Platform (390.90). Syskakis finished in sixth place in the Women's Platform with a score of 264.55. Smith, Syskakis, Madden, Goss and Dylan Power each found their way into a final at the NCAA Diving Zone meets.

Gillooly previously coached the divers at FAU and was the age group coach of the Fort Lauderdale Diving Team from 2014 to 2016. In 2015-16, he won the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association's Co-Dive Coach of the Year award while at FAU and coached three 2016 Olympic trials qualifiers who trained at Fort Lauderdale. Before joining the FAU Owls, Gillooly pursued age group coaching at YCF Diving in Orlando from 2012 to 2014, where he guided five divers to spots on the U.S. Junior National Team and two to the 2012 Olympic trials.

Gillooly helped build the swimming & diving program at FIU from scratch, coaching there from its inception in 2004 to 2009. He earned Sun Belt Conference Diving Coach of the Year honors in 2004-05 and 2005-06 and developed five Sun Belt Conference Champions. Gillooly also served at the University of Miami, his alma mater, for the same period of time as the volunteer assistant coach.

Internationally, Gillooly coached the U.S. Junior National Squad at the Pan American Junior Diving Championships in Cuba in 2015. He also led South Africa to qualify for the 2008 Summer Olympics after its performance at the 2008 FINA Diving World Cup in Beijing. Overall, he has been a team coach for the United States, Canada, Portugal and South Africa in major international competitions.

In 1999, Gillooly graduated from the University of Miami, where he was a two-time NCAA national champion diver, 10-time All-American and 1996 NCAA Diver of the Year. He was inducted into the Hurricanes' Sports Hall of Fame in 2013. As a member of the U.S. National Team from 1990-2000, Gillooly was a three-time national champion, 1991 Junior World Champion and a finalist in the U.S. Olympic Team Trials in 1992, 1996 and 2000.

WOMEN'S ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH WHITNEY HITE

Whitney Hite enters his third season as the associate head coach for the women's swimming and diving team in 2020-21. Hite has compiled 22 years of collegiate coaching experience with some of the nation's top swimming and diving programs.

Hite and UF's group strung together an outstanding season in his second year working with the group. Under his coaching and guidance, Sherridon Dressel, Emma Ball, Bella Garofalo, Talia Bates and Gabby Hillis would earn a combined 20 All-American honors, led by Dressel's career and team-high seven honors. Garofalo would earn five, which was tied for the second-most on the squad. Bates, Ball and Hillis would each notch their first All-American accolades of their careers.

That same group would place 10 top-10 individual swims throughout the season, placing them as one of the best women sprint groups in recent memory for the Gators.

Six of those 10 times posted by Hite's sprinters were at the 2020 Southeastern Conference Championships, where the Gators posted a runner-up bid for the second-straight season, the first time that has happened since 2011 and 2012. Three of Florida's relays also combined for a top-10 Gator time, featuring at least three of Hite's sprinters on each. Additionally, three Gators would each set three new career-best swims throughout the week in Auburn.

In her fourth and final conference meet in 2020, Dressel would post three new personal-best times, which all landed on the top-10 program list. She would go on to earn two medals- a silver in the 100 back and a bronze in the 100 fly- to help lead Florida throughout the week.

Individually, Hillis posted three new personal-bests at the SEC meet. With help of Hite, she cut drastic time off her top times at the conclusion of her sophomore season in 2018-19, improving by .46 seconds in the 50 free, 1.90 seconds in the 100 free and 1.40 seconds in the 200 free at the conclusion of this year's SEC meet.

Garofalo was the third and final Gator to post a trio of top swims in Auburn, claiming the seventh-fastest 50 free time in UF history (22.28), as well as the ninth-best 100 free swim of 48.65. She would touch in 1:47.53 in the 200 free to post her third career-best in her final meet of her collegiate career.

Relay-wise, UF's sprinters were an integral part of the success at SEC's. The 200 medley relay, which

included Ball, Dressel and Garofalo, earned an A-cut with their combined finish of 1:36.10. The group of sprinters also were members of the second-fastest 400 free relay, third-fastest 400 medley relay and the fourth-fastest 200 free relay in UF history.

Hite helped make Bates' transition from high school to the collegiate ranks smooth, which was apparent with the Gainesville native's 19-win freshman campaign, which ranked second on the team. For her success, she earned SEC Freshman of the Week accolades on Nov. 12 and Jan. 14. Heading into the postseason, Bates possessed the 12th-fastest 50 free swim, as well as the 19th-fastest 100 free effort in the conference.

The Gators ended 2019-20 with the program's best regular season dual finish (8-1) since the 2007-08 season when the Gators posted an identical record. The team got off to one of the greatest starts by a Gator squad, beginning the season by winning their first eight duals, which marked the first time this decade reaching this feat. In total, the 22 swimmers and divers would go on to win 171 events throughout the season, led by Dressel's 27-win campaign.

On Oct. 23, 2019, the Gators were voted the No. 1 team in the CSCAA Top 25 Poll after posting a 5-0 start, the first time the women's program has been the top-ranked team since the 2010 National Championship team.

In his first season, Hite worked closely with Dressel, Ball and Garofalo again. The trio gathered three All-American nods, 22 individual victories and 35 relay wins throughout the season. His coaching and leadership helped the group post nine new personal top-times while also being instrumental in Dressel earning her second and third All-American nods and Garofalo receiving her first All-American honor of her career.

Overall, the Gators put together the best season in recent years with a runner-up finish at the Southeastern Conference Championships and notching a 24th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. The Gators ended the 2018-19 campaign with 31 top times on the all-time program lists. Women's swimmers and divers earned six All-American honors, seven All-SEC accolades and two SEC All-Freshman nods.

Hite most recently spent seven years as the Head Men's and Women's Swimming Coach with the Wisconsin Badgers where he helped develop 25 Big 10 Champions and 103 All-Americans. Under his guidance, Drew TeDuits won an NCAA title in the 200 Back at the 2013 NCAA Championships while U.S. National Team Member Ivy Martin posted an NCAA Runner-up finish in the 50 Free at the 2015 NCAA Championships. In 2018, Beata Nelson finished 2nd in the 100 Back at the NCAA Championships recording the 3rd fastest time in history in the event. For his efforts at Wisconsin, Whitney was named the Head Men's Coach for

the U.S. at the 2017 World University Games, as well as an Assistant Men's Coach for the U.S. at the 2015 World Championships. Prior to Wisconsin, he served two years as an Assistant Coach with the University of Arizona where he helped the Wildcats to four Top 5 team finishes at the NCAA Championships and three years as the Assistant Women's Coach at the University of California-Berkeley assisting them to three Top 10 NCAA finishes.

Whitney began his coaching career in 1998 at the University of Georgia where he served as an Assistant Coach for five years and helped Georgia win three consecutive NCAA Women's National Championship titles and two NCAA Runner-up finishes.

Hite, originally from Denver, Colorado, swam collegiately at the University of Texas under head coach Eddie Reese and was a member of their 1996 Men's National Championship team. After completing his bachelor's degree in Sport Management in 1997, Hite went to the University of Georgia where he earned his master's degree in Education in 2001.

MEN'S ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH STEVE JUNGBLUTH

Steve Jungbluth enters his third season as the Associate men's head coach and 11th season as a member of the Gators coaching staff.

Jungbluth spent his first eight years at the sprint coach, guiding nine Gators to a top-10 program swim in the 50 free. In 2018 when the programs became split, his role expanded and now has a hand in multiple groups across the team under his current title of Men's Associate Head Coach.

Under his leadership and guidance in his second season in this role, the Gators would go on to win their eighth-consecutive and 41st overall Southeastern Conference Championship in 2019-20. At SEC's, the Gators would win the five-day competition with 1,194 points, reeling in 15 medals – five gold, four silver and six bronze- as well as five event titles- four individual and one relay.

The Gators would shatter multiple records at the 2020 SEC meet, breaking the conference record in the 800 free on the first night of competition, highlighted by Kieran Smith setting a new 200 free SEC and school record to lead-off UF's historic relay. Smith (500 free) and Robert Finke (1,650 free) would go on shatter new American records in their respective events to lead Florida. Smith would go on to add another SEC title in the 400 IM, with Khader Baqlah earning UF's final event title in the 200 free for the second time in his career.

Florida was well-represented in the SEC postseason awards as Smith was named the 2020 Male Swimmer of the Year, the eighth-time a Florida swimmer has won the award in Jungbluth's tenure. Overall, Jungbluth has coached four different swimmers that have earned the accolade. The Gators landed a league-best 13 swimmers on the All-SEC team. Five earned First Team distinctions for their role in the 2020 SEC event titles, while eight landed on the Second Team.

The 2019-20 squad had 14 swimmers invited to

compete at the 2020 NCAA Championship meet, the third-most in the country, prior to its cancellation. Those 14 Gators would go on to earn a total of 38 College Swimming and Diving Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) All-America honors (fifth-most in the nation).

Florida amassed an overall regular season record of 7-2 in Jungbluth's second season, including a conference mark of 2-2. The team would defeat three out of four possible ranked opponents, and posted a perfect home record of 3-0. Throughout their nine meets, 22 different Gators would notch 124 event victories. Additionally, 52 Gator times or scores found its way on the top-20 SEC marks set throughout the regular season.

In the classroom, the Gators placed 17 individuals on the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll, as well as eight on the conference's First-Year Academic Honor Roll. Florida earned national recognition for their academic achievements as well. The Gators were honored as a CSCAA Scholar All-America Team after posing a 3.33 team GPA during the Spring semester and had 11 individuals land on the CSCAA Scholar All-America First and Second Teams.

During his first season as associate head coach in 2018-19, he helped guide the Gators to their seventh-straight SEC Championships and a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Under the tutelage of Jungbluth, five sprinters finished with top-five fastest time in program history. He was instrumental in the development of freshman Kacper Stokowski, who earned All-American status by swimming the second-fastest 100 back time in program history, and Will Davis, who posted the third-fastest 50 free time at the SEC Championships. During the 2018-19 campaign, the Gators amassed a regular season record of 9-1, including a 7-1 record over ranked opponents and 5-0 against the SEC. Jungbluth coached 16 All-Americans, 11 All-SEC selections, five SEC All-Freshman and the Co-Freshman Swimmers of the Year in his first year as Associate men's head coach.

In the 2017-18 campaign, Jungbluth coached Caeleb Dressel to his seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free, 100 fly, and 200 free relay. Caeleb Dressel set a new American, NCAA, US Open and UF record in the 100 free with a mark of 39.90 which surpassed the mark of 40.00 he set in the

previous year. Caeleb Dressel was named the SEC Swimmer of the Year and the CSCAA Swimmer of the Year, both for the third straight season.

Under Jungbluth's guidance, the Gators totaled 33 All-American honors from 11 different athletes. Under the tutelage of Jungbluth, Florida collected 10 First-Team All-SEC accolades as well as two second-team nods. Jungbluth helped Sherridon Dressel and Brooke Madden to achieve All-American Honorable Mention accolades.

In the 2016-17 season, Jungbluth coached Caeleb Dressel to his fourth, fifth and sixth National Championships in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 butterfly. His mark of 40.00 set UF, NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Dressel took home his second-straight Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year award as well. Along with Dressel, Mark Szaraneck won the 200 IM National Championship, the first of his career. Newcomer Maxime Rooney became the 10th SEC Male Freshman of the Year under Jungbluth and Head Coach Greg Troy's tutelage to win the honor after his performance in the pool.

In the 2015-16 season, Jungbluth once again coached Dressel to a National Championship, or in this case two. Dressel won the 50 Free and 100 free to take home the second and third National Championship of his career. Dressel earned Co-CSCAA Male Swimmer of the Year. Overall at the NCAA Championships, the Florida Gator Men tallied 37 All-America honors between nine of them. He also coached 11 of the women's swimmers and two divers into qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Seven of those 13 were making their NCAA debut and 11 of the 13 will return for competition this coming season. Under his direction, Autumn Finke was named All-SEC Second Team and Emma Ball earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In the 2014-15 season, Jungbluth coached Caeleb Dressel to UF's first-ever 50-yard freestyle (18.67) NCAA Championship, which he achieved on day one of the NCAA meet. Dressel became the ninth Gator swimmer under Jungbluth and Head Coach Gregg Troy's tutelage to win SEC Male Freshman of the Year. At the conference meet, Dressel won the 100-yard butterfly title in an outstanding time of 45.28 seconds. That mark not only ranked him second all-time in school history but it was the second-quickest in the U.S. 17-18 year old age group. The Florida men set seven of a possible 18 school records.

In 2013-14, Jungbluth helped the Gators break eight UF sprint records in four individual events and four relays. Individually, Natalie Hinds' set the new standard in the 50-yard (21.66) and 100-yard freestyle (47.40) races. Meanwhile Brad deBorde broke the same two records on the men's side with times of 18.86 and 42.18 seconds, respectively. At the 2014 NCAA Championships, Jungbluth tutored deBorde to a third-place finish in the 50-yard free at NCAA's following his victory in the same event at the SEC Championships a weeks earlier. His sprinters helped lead the men's team to its second consecutive SEC Championship and 35th overall, as well as a third-place team finish at the national meet. The women placed third at SEC's and six at NCAA's.

In 2012-13, Jungbluth guided Hinds to seven All-America honors and three SEC titles. For her efforts, Hinds was named the SEC Female Freshman of the Year. In addition on the women's squad, Jungbluth coached Ellese Zalewski to swim UF's second fastest time in the 50-yard free (22.04) at the 2013 NCAA Championships. On the men's side, deBorde finished runner-up in the 50-yard free (19.12) at the 2013 SEC Championships and fifth in the same event at NCAA's. Also, Pawel Werner won the 200-yard free (1:33.23) at SEC's and earned four All-America honors at the national meet.

Combining the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons, Jungbluth tutored one national champion, three All-Americans and one SEC champion.

Before his time in Gainesville, Jungbluth spent seven seasons (2003-10) as the head coach at Colgate, where he led the Raiders to the top of the Patriot League. His women's squads won the league title in two of his last three seasons in Hamilton, N.Y.

In the 2008-09 season, his women's team cruised to its second consecutive conference crown and the second-highest point total ever generated in the three-day event. At that meet, Colgate won titles in 14 of 18 swimming events, set 18 team records, and 14 meet records. In the 2007-08 campaign, the Raiders' women's team won its first Patriot League championship in program history. Colgate had 11 individuals earn All-Conference honors and six take home individual championships.

During the 2005-06 campaign, Jungbluth led Colgate's women's team to a perfect record through its dual-meet schedule, which included wins over the Naval Academy and four-time defending league

champion Bucknell. Colgate defeated Navy for the first time in school history while it beat the Bison for the first time in 21 years. In his first season at Colgate (2003-04), Jungbluth earned Patriot League Coach of the Year honors after leading the women's team to a second-place finish at the conference championships. At the time, it was the highest finish at a conference meet in the history of the women's program. In addition, the men's squad finished with a 9-5 record in 2004, which was Colgate's highest number of victories in 20 seasons.

Prior to taking over at Colgate, Jungbluth served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Navy. During his time there, he produced nine Patriot League champions, six Patriot League record-setting performances, two Patriot League Championship Swimmers of the Meet and one team championship.

Jungbluth began his coaching career as an assistant coach and later interim head coach at NCAA Division III Amherst College (Mass.). As an assistant at Amherst, he helped coach seven New England champions, 10 All-Americans and 13 honorable-mention All-Americans. In addition, the Jeffs broke 41 varsity and pool records during his tenure. The men's team posted a perfect 10-0 dual meet record during the 1995-96 season.

Jungbluth earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, in 1994 and a master's degree in exercise science from UMass, in 1997. He was a four-year letterwinner for the Minutemen, serving as a co-captain during his senior season.

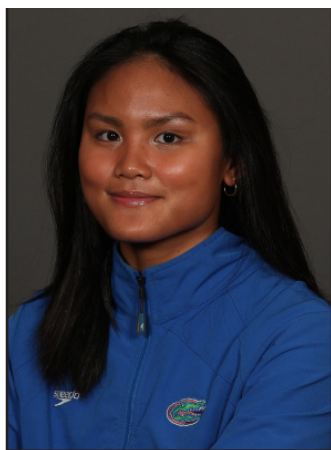

2019-20 Quick Hits

- After a vast improvement in head coach Jeff Poppell's first season at the helm of the program in 2018-19, the women's team finished runner-up at the 2020 SEC Championships for the second straight season for the first time since 2011 and 2012.
- Florida qualified 11 swimmers, one relay alternate and one diver for the 2020 NCAA Championships. UF's 11 individual swimmers tied for eighth-most qualifiers across the entire NCAA.
- Thirteen athletes collected 36 All-America honors, led by Sherridon Dressel's seven honors. Vanessa Pearl and Bella Garofalo each added five distinctions. Dressel and Garofalo each added a team-best four relay accolades.
- Picking up their first career All-American accolade was Emma Ball, Talia Bates, Leah Braswell, Savanna Faulconer, Kathleen Golding, Gabby Hillis and Nikki Miller.
- Florida would finish their dual meet portion of their regular season schedule with an 8-1 mark, the best finish since 2007-08.
- The Gators posted their second-straight runner-up bid at this year's SEC's, falling just 28.5 points from first. Overall, UF claimed seven medals (six individual and one relay).
- Sherridon Dressel set three new personal-bests, tallying three new top-five program swims, including the second-fastest 100 fly and 100 back times in school history. She would go on to notch two medals at her final conference championships.
- Vanessa Pearl (400 IM) and Leah Braswell (1,650 free) notched Florida final two individual swimming medals.
- Florida's diving showed up tremendously in Auburn, accumulating the most points of any team at the meet. The Gators registered 228 points, almost double their closest competitor.
- Seven Gators would earn spots on the All-SEC Second Team for their contributions at SEC's: Emma Ball, Leah Braswell, Sherridon Dressel, Bella Garofalo, Vanessa Pearl, Elizabeth Perez and Emma Whitner
- Kathleen Golding and Allie Piccirillo were named to the All-SEC Freshman Team.
- The 2019-20 team excelled in the classroom unlike any other team in year's past. Overall, the team would set three academic program records throughout the school year.
- UF would go on to place 24 individuals on the CSCAA Scholar All-American team, the most amongst Division I teams. Additionally, the Gators were honored with a program-record 27 members on the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll. The team would also set a record for highest team GPA ever recorded, combining for a 3.80 in the spring.

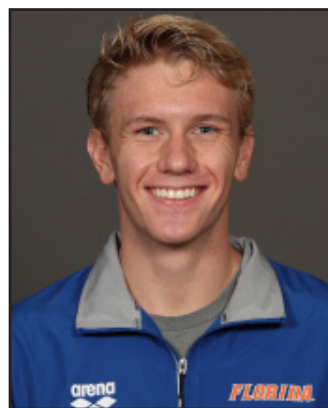

2019-20 Quick Hits

- In his second season as head coach, Anthony Nesty continued the historic success of the men's team, collecting the eighth-straight SEC Championship with 1,194 points over five days of competition. The streak now sits as the third-longest championship streak in conference history.
- Florida had 14 swimmers combine for 38 All-America honors, including a team-high seven honors by sophomore Kieran Smith.
- UF brought home its eighth-straight and 41st overall Southeastern Conference championship behind five SEC event titles – four individual and one relay, and the Swimmer of the Meet, Kieran Smith.
- Kieran Smith (500 free) and Robert Finke (1,650 free) strung together historic performances at the conference meet as the pair shattered American records.
- Anthony Nesty was named SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season. It sits as the eighth-straight season a member of the Gator coaching staff has won that award. Nesty also becomes the first coach in Gators history to take home the honor in each of their first two seasons as head coach.
- Kieran Smith was voted SEC Male Swimming of the Year, the seventh time in the last 10 years a Gator has won the award.
- Fourteen Gators, which tied for the fifth-most in the nation and the most in the SEC, would claim CSCAA All-American honors for qualifying for the NCAA Championships.
- Grant Sanders and Robert Finke would join Kieran Smith by earning three individual All-American honors for their trio of NCAA event qualification. Khader Baqlah would finish his Gator career with an All-American honor in three of his four seasons.
- Clark Beach, Will Davis and Marco Guarente received the honor for the second-straight season.
- First career All-Americans included Isaac Davis, Miguel Cancel, Eric Friese, Brennan Gravley, Dillon Hillis, Gerry Quinn and Kevin Vargas.
- The Gators finished the 2019-20 regular season campaign with an overall dual meet record of 7-2, including 2-2 mark in the conference.
- Florida boasted 13 All-SEC student-athletes, including five First Team selections. UF also notched three Freshman All-SEC honors as well.
- The Gators had 17 student-athletes named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- Throughout Florida's 11 regular season meets they competed in during the regular season, 22 different Gators would notch 124 event victories. UF's leader in combined victories was Kieran Smith with 24. The sophomore posted 16 individual event wins throughout the year, with eight relay victories as well. Marco Guarente finished with 16 total wins, with Clark Beach (13), Will Davis (12) and Eric Friese (12) rounding-out the top-five. Eight of Will Davis' victories came on relays, tying Kieran Smith's mark for the most on the squad.

FLORIDA SWIMMING & DIVING

TEAM NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

Both the Florida men's and women's programs boast a successful AIAW/NCAA Championships tradition, dating back to 1954 for the men and 1979 for the women. Prior to the NCAA's sponsoring of women's championship events, the UF women ranked among the nation's top competitors as a member of the AIAW (Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) since 1972.

The men's program has competed in 49 NCAA Championship meets, winning back-to-back team titles in 1983 and 1984, while finishing amongst the nation's top-10 a total of 36 times, including 17 years in a row from 1978-94. The women's team won the inaugural NCAA women's title in 1982 and has placed in the top-10 a total of 36 times, with 14 top-3 finishes. The men have combined for 46 national titles, 36 individual and 10 relay. The women added another NCAA championship in 2010. In AIAW competition, the women finished in the top-5 six out of eight years, while winning the 1979 title. The women won 15 AIAW individual titles, 80 individual NCAA titles and 24 relay titles.

In 1982, the women's team claimed the inaugural NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championship, which they played host to in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Natatorium. Winning 13 events, Florida outscored second-place Stanford, 505-383.

The team was led by two of the school's all-time greatest swimmers, legendary Tracy Caulkins and Kathy Treible. Caulkins picked up five individual titles, winning the 100 and 200 Fly, and the 100, 200, and 400 individual medley. She also swam on the winning 400 Medley Relay. Treible dominated in her specialty with victories in the 50, 100, and 200 Breast, as well as swimming on the winning 200 and 400 Medley Relays.

Caulkins went on to claim 12 individual NCAA and SEC titles and racked up 21 All-American honors in her three years of collegiate swimming. Treible won six NCAA individual titles and 12 SEC crowns, while earning 28 All-American honors during her four-year career.

Diver Megan Neyer was also on the team in 1982, where she completed the first of her four NCAA sweeps. Neyer took top honors in the 1- and 3-meter diving competitions. She repeated the feat in 1983, 1984 and 1986, becoming the only diver to sweep in all four years of eligibility.

Winning the inaugural event at home put the finishing touch on a flawless season. The Gators recorded a 10-0 dual-meet

record and won the SEC title by 325 points. Head Coach Randy Reese was named the NCAA Women's Coach of the Year as well.

It came down to the final race, the 400 Free Relay, and a group of underclassmen came through in true Gator style to capture the school's first men's NCAA Championship.

The Gators entered the meet as the crowd favorite, but powerhouses Texas, Southern Methodist and Stanford were thought to be the teams to beat. Although Florida won no individual in the meet, they placed swimmers in the championship finals 13 times to claim the team victory.

The Gators did capture two relay events, as the 800 Free Relay, consisting of Geoff Gaberino, Eric Boyer, Mike Heath, and Albert Mestre, set an American and NCAA record with a winning time of 6:25.29. Gaberino, Donald Gibb, Mestre, and Heath combined to take the 400 Free Relay title (2:54.06), just edging SMU and their standout anchor Steve Lundquist, whom Heath held off for the win.

The first day of action saw Florida in third place, trailing SMU and Texas, while the second day saw the Gators move into second place behind SMU.

Of the 15 Gator competitors at the meet, there were only two seniors and three juniors. Twelve of the athletes combined to earn 33 All-American honors. The win wrapped up an SEC Championship and a 5-2 dual-meet record season for the Gator squad under head coach Randy Reese, who was the 1983 NCAA Men's Coach of the Year.

For the first time since the Gators won the inaugural women's NCAA Championships in 1982, the University of Florida women's swimming and diving team brought home the NCAA National Championship, using two national titles in the 100 Back and 200 Free Relay and a wealth of depth to carry the Gators through to the very last relay Saturday at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center in West Lafayette, Ind. Head coach Gregg Troy was named the 2010 NCAA Women's Coach of the Year as the Gators racked up 382 points for the victory over second-place Stanford.

Florida's first-ever 200 Free Relay national title kicked off the first night of finals at the 2010 NCAA Championship meet for the Gators. Gemma Spofforth, Stephanie Napier, Shara Stafford, and Sarah Bateman, raced to a school-record of 1:27.79.

Spofforth won her sixth individual career title, seventh overall, with a three-peat in the 100 Back. Spofforth touched in at 50.92 to take her third consecutive title in the race, becoming the first Gator to win three in a row.

Twelve Gators earned a total of 36 All-American honors. The squad shattered five Florida records, and reeled in two national titles on the way to the team victory.

For the second-straight year, Florida captured the NCAA Championship, outscoring Texas and Stanford in a down-to-the-wire meet. The final event, the 400 Free Relay, again proved to be the deciding race, as the Gator team of Geoff Gaberino, Albert Mestre, Duffy Dillon, and Mike Heath finished second with a time of 2:54.22 to secure the team title.

Florida displayed superlative depth, winning just one individual title and one relay event, yet having 15 athletes score in 12 finals and seven consolation finals.

Heath captured the 200 Free with a pool-record time of 1:34.94, while the 800 Free Relay, consisting of Gaberino, Mestre, Dillon, and Heath, won the event with a time of 6:21.29 and surpassed the NCAA record set by UF in 1983.

Fourteen Gators earned 35 All-American honors, while head coach Randy Reese was honored as the NCAA Men's Coach of the Year for the second-consecutive season. The NCAA title followed the Gators' second-straight SEC title and a 9-1 dual-meet record for the 1983-84 season.

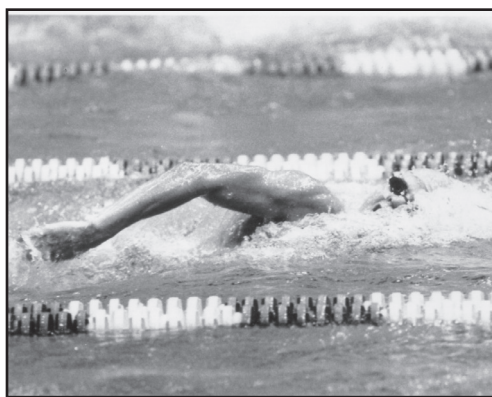

SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Florida Swimming & Diving in the Southeastern Conference

Both the Florida men and women's swimming and diving programs have dominated the Southeastern Conference since league competition began, dating back to 1937 for the men and 1981 for the women. The men's team has claimed 41 SEC Championships, doubling its closest competitor, Auburn (18). In 2020, the men won UF's eighth-straight SEC Championship, the third-longest title streak in conference history. The women have claimed 17 out of 38 possible league crowns, including 11 consecutive from 1986 through 1997, and their most recent title in 2009. Both teams boast numerous SEC honors, as the men's history includes 25 SEC Male Swimmer of the Year awards and four SEC Male Diver of the Year selections. The SEC Female Swimmer of the Year has been a Gator 19 times, while the SEC Female Diver of the Year has been a Gator five times. Florida coaches have also earned 28 SEC Swimming Coach of the Year accolades and eight SEC Diving Coach of the Year awards.

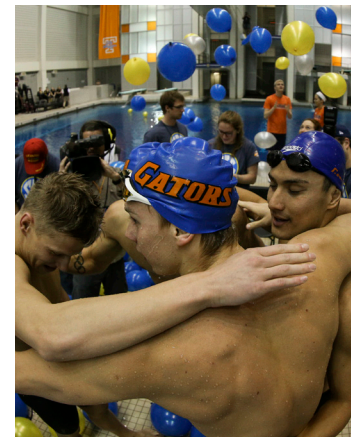
