Historically Consistent Gators

- Florida's men have **won or taken runner-up honors at 23 of 34 NCAA Championships (67.6 percent) with Mike Holloway as head coach.**
- That includes victories at the 2018 and 2019 NCAA Indoor Championships, and a runner-up finish at the 2018 NCAA Outdoor Championships.
- Florida's men are **one of three programs in Division I history** to post seven straight top-3 finishes at both NCAA Indoors and Outdoors (Florida, 2009-15; Arkansas, 1992-2000; UTEP, 1975-82).
- Florida's men finished second in 2019, claiming their 10th top-2 outdoors finish since 2009.
- Florida's 10 top-2 finishes since 2009 is tied the most in that span.
- Florida's men have won a **nation-leading 9 NCAA titles since 2010** - 5 indoors and 4 outdoors
- In 2018, Florida's men and women **swept the SEC Outdoor Championships for the first time in program history.**
- Although it was the 11th sweep in meet history, the Gators' sweep was just the **fourth at SEC Outdoors since 1991.**
- The titles were the sixth SEC Outdoor crowns in program history for both the men and women.

NCAA Indoor Championships

- Florida's men finished fourth in March at the 2021 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
- The Gators have finished in the top 4 13 times since 2003, when Head Coach Mike Holloway took over the men's program.
- Florida's 13 top-4 finishes since 2003 is the most in Division. The next three programs following the Gators are LSU (11), Arkansas (9) and Oregon (7).
- In 2019, Florida's men claimed their **Division I-leading ninth national title since 2010**, finishing 11 points clear of runner-up Houston at the NCAA Indoor Championships in Birmingham, Ala.
- The indoor national title was Florida's fifth in program history - which ties with Oregon for the third-most indoor crowns in Division I history. Only Arkansas (20) and UTEP (7) have more.
- Florida's five indoor titles in the 2010s put them in elite company among all Division I sports. Here are the only Division I teams (FBS for football) to win five national titles from the start of the 2009-10 athletics season to the end of 2019:

NEWS & NOTES

Gators Women Finish Strong SEC Indoors

- Florida's women's finished second at this year's SEC Indoor Track and Field Championships in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
- The runner-up finish marked the first top-2 finish for the women since 2015, and the fifth since 2010
- The runner-up finish was also the fifth top-2 finish since 2010 for the women, which includes conference titles in 2010, 2012 and 2014.
- The Gators' five runner-up finishes since 2010 is the third most in the SEC in that span. Only Arkansas (10) and LSU (6) have more.
- Combined (outdoor and indoors) the Gators have 10 top-2 finishes since 2010, which also ranks third behind Arkansas (15) and LSU (12).

Gators on Top

- The Gators enter the 2021 NCAA Outdoor Championships with 18 combine berths. The men's team has 10, while the women boast eight.
- Florida currently holds **five top-5 spots** on this year's Division I Outdoor Qualifying list, including **one NCAA-leading mark**.
- Senior thrower **Thomas Mardal leads the nation in the hammer throw** with a school-record mark of 76.18 meters (249 feet, 11 inches), which he posted during this year's Tom Jones Invitational. Mardal was crowed SEC Outdoors champion.
- Redshirt freshman **Joseph Fahnbulleh** ran the **third-fastest time in Division I and the sixth-fastest time in the world** (20.05 [+1.7]) in the 200 meters at this year's SEC Outdoor Championships to collect a silver medal.
- Redshirt freshman **Grace Stark ranks fourth in the nation in the 100-meter hurdles** with a time of 12.74 [+3.6], which she ran at this year's SEC Outdoors Championship to collect a silver medal.
- Redshirt senior **Natricia Hooper fifth in the nation** in the triple jump with a mark of 13.92 meters (45 feet, 8 inches) [+1.7]. Hooper earned a bronze medal at SECs.
- Florida's women 4x400m Relay, formed by **Taylor Manson, Sterling Lester, Doneisha Anderson** and **Talitha Diggs, ranks fourth in the nation and seventh in the world** with a time of 3:27.50. The group earned a silver medal at SECs.

Mardal Headlines Historic Season

- Senior thrower **Thomas Mardal**, who **leads the nation in the Hammer throw** with a mark of 76.18 meters (249 feet, 11 inches), has broken five combined school records in the weight and hammer throws this year.
- Mardal was **crowned SEC champion** last month in the hammer and will look to earn his first NCAA Outdoor title in Eugene.
- Mardal was also named the SEC Outdoor Track and Field Scholar-Athlete of the Year.
- Crowned the 2021 SEC and NCAA champion in the weight throw, **Mardal broke the school record and an SEC Indoor Championships 11-year-old record**, before setting a new program record at nationals. He also became the **fifth-best performer in collegiate history**.
- Mardal logged a weight throw mark of 24.46 meters (80 feet, 3.75 inches) at nationals to become the **first person in NCAA Indoor Championships history, and the second in collegiate history, to have at least two throws of 80 feet or further in the same meet**.

Fahnbulleh's Breakout Season

- Redshirt freshman **Joseph Fahnbulleh, who finished second at SEC Outdoors**, ranks third in Division I and the sixth in the world (20.05 [+1.7]) in the 200 meters
- Indoors, Fahnbulleh finished second at SECs and third at nationals in the 200 meters, ranking **third in the nation and in the world**.
- In addition to ranking third in the nation and in the world in the 200 meters, **Fahnbulleh also ranks 11th in the 100 meters**. He ran a time of 10.08 [+3.6] during Florida' outdoors opening meet at FSU.
- After a quiet freshman year in 2020, Fahnbulleh has raised among the top runners of the nation and the world.

Wilkinson on Pace to the Top

- Redshirt sophomore **Gabrielle Wilkinson** has surfaced among Florida's top distance runners.
- Wilkinson was crowned SEC Champion in the 1,500 meters last month in College Station.

The Gators Great Mentality

- **Became the second member** of Florida's track and field program to win **The Bowerman**, collegiate track and field's highest individual honor and the sport's version of the Heisman Trophy.
- **First man in history** to win three consecutive national titles in both indoor and outdoor high hurdles.
- **Third man in history** to sweep the 60 meters / 60 hurdles titles at NCAA Indoors, and second man to do it at SEC Indoors
- **Fourth 110 hurdler in history** to break 13 seconds prior to turning 22 years old (Xiang Liu; Omar McLeod, Dayron Robles)
- **Second 60 hurdler in history** to break 7.40 seconds prior to turning 22 (Robles)
- Finished career with **five of the 11 fastest** 110 hurdles times in collegiate history (12.98 - CR / 13.07 / 13.10 / 13.12 / 13.16)
- Finished career with **four of the six fastest** 60 hurdles times in collegiate history (7.35 - CR / 7.43 / 7.44 / 7.44)
- **Only man in outdoor track and field history** to break 13.10 seconds and long jump 8.00-plus meters (both wind-legally) in a career
- **Second man** in indoor track and field history to break 7.45 seconds and long jump at least 8.00 meters
- **Third man** in indoor track and field history to run 6.51 or faster in the 60 and long jump 8.00-plus meters (accomplished in 21 hours at 2019 Razorback Invitational)
- **First man in Division I history** to log top-2 finishes in both 110 hurdles and long jump at NCAA Outdoor Championships (2017)
- **First man in Division I history** to log top-2 finishes in both 60 hurdles and long jump at NCAA Indoor Championships (2018)
- Former American Junior record holder, No. 2 high schooler, No. 5 on World Junior All-Time list (60mH)
- **Eight-time NCAA Champion (School record)**
- **2019 IAAF World Championships gold medalist (110-meter hurdles)**

In 2015, **Marquis Dendy** became the first Florida Gator to win The Bowerman, track and field's highest individual honor and the sport's equivalent to college football's Heisman Trophy. Four years later in 2019, **Grant Holloway** became the second member of Florida's track and field program to collect the award.

Florida's other The Bowerman finalists since the award's inception in 2009 include **Christian Taylor** (2011), **Tony McQuay** (2012), and **Yanis David** (2019).

The Bowerman is presented annually by the USTFCCA to the most outstanding male and female collegiate track and field athletes in the nation. The award is named after Bill Bowerman, legendary former track and field and cross country coach for the University of Oregon and co-founder of NIKE.

Florida is the only men's Division I program since 2010 with at least four outdoor triple jumpers who eclipsed 16.60 meters (wind legal) in their collegiate careers--Petersen coached three of UF's five.

Florida's men won six consecutive NCAA Outdoor triple jump national titles from 2010-15, **tying the longest streak in Division I history in any event**, either indoors or outdoors and irregardless of gender.

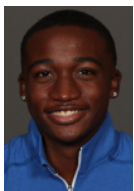
