This represents Florida's highest rushing total (1,007 yards) through three games since at least 1965 and the program's most total yards (1,658) through three games in the last 20 seasons.

THE STORYLINE

- Florida hosts Tennessee for the 21st time in the 51st all-time meeting between the two programs.
- UF boasts a 30-20 record in the series and has won 15 of the last 16 meetings including an active four-game winning streak.
- The Gators have not lost a home game to the Volunteers since 2003, owning eight-straight home wins in the series.
- When the Vols last visited The Swamp in 2019, the Gators came away with a 34-3 victory in Kyle Trask's first-career start.
 » Florida topped Tennessee, 31-19, last season in Knoxville. In 2017, UF beat UT in Gainesville, 26-20, on a
 - 63-yard Hail Mary from Feleipe Franks to Tyrie Cleveland as time expired.
- This matchup pits the nation's No. 2 rushing offense (Florida, 335.7 rush YPG) against the country's No. 5 rushing defense (Tennessee, 54.3 rush yards allowed per game).
 - » This is also a showdown of UF's eighth-ranked offense (552.7 YPG) and UT's 17th-ranked defense (265.0 YAPG).
- UF head coach Dan Mullen is 4-0 (3-0 at UF) against Tennessee in his career. The only SEC school he has beaten
 more times without a loss is Vanderbilt (5-0).
- In three games vs. UT under Mullen, UF has outscored the Vols, 112-43 (+69, +23.0 PPG), while out-gaining them, 1,280 yards to 937 yards (+343, +114.3 YPG).
- Florida has totaled 300-plus yards of offense against Tennessee in six-straight games and in 11 of the last 12 meetings.
- This is the first meeting between Mullen and Josh Heupel as head coaches.
 - » Mullen and Heupel have previously faced off on opposing staffs -- **both were assistants in the 2009 BCS National Championship game**. Mullen was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for Florida and Heupel was the quarterbacks coach for Oklahoma.
- Florida's **13-straight games of 400-plus total yards is tied for the longest-active streak in the nation** -- the first time in the last 40 years the Gators have had as many 400-yard games consecutively. UF also has at least seven-straight 400-yard outings against SEC teams for the first time in school history -- **a streak now at 10 games.**
- Florida ranks second in the FBS in rushing (1,007 yards, 335.7 YPG) and eighth with 552.7 total yards/game.
 - » The Gators rank first in the SEC in total rush yards and rush YPG, as well as second in the SEC in total offense.
- Florida's 1,007 rushing yards through three games is its **highest total through three games of a season since at least 1965** -- the only three-game start in which the Gators have amassed 1,000 rush yards.
- Florida boasts a 346-111-13 (.750) all-time record at The Swamp, holding the **second-highest home winning percentage in the nation since 1990** with a 165-32 (.838) record.
 - » The Gators have outscored opponents, 7,429 to 3,117 in 197 games inside The Swamp since 1990, putting the average outcome at 37.7 to 15.8 (21.9 point spread).
- Week 3 vs. Alabama drew the fifth-largest crowd in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium history (90,887) and largest since FSU in 2015.
- Florida has scored in 413-consecutive games dating back to 1988 -- which is an NCAA record.
- Florida is 16-4 in true-home games under Mullen (2018: 5-2 | 2019: 6-0 | 2020: 4-1 | 2021: 1-1)

FLORIDA OFFENSE OFF TO HISTORIC THREE-GAME START

- After leading the nation with 378.8 passing YPG in 2020 (fourth-highest total in SEC history), the Gator
 offense has flipped the script and come out of the gate as the No. 2 rushing offense in the FBS as well as
 the top rushing attack in the SEC through Week 3 (1,007 yards, 335.7 YPG).
- With 244 rushing yards vs. Alabama, Florida's 1,007 rushing yards through three games is its highest total through three games of a season in the last 56 years (since at least 1965).
 - » Previous best: 868 rush yards through three games in 2009
- With 439 yards vs. Alabama, Florida's 1,658 total yards of offense is the team's most through the first-three
 games of a season since 2001.
 - » Florida opened up the 2001 season with 1,706 yards through three games.
 - » Florida totaled 553 yards vs. FAU in Week 1 and 666 yards at USF in Week 2 -- the latter being the fifth-highest total in program history.
- Florida begins the season with three-consecutive 200-plus yard rushing games for the first time since 2009.
 - » This is just the **third time in the last 45 seasons** in which Florida has posted **three-straight games of 200-plus rushing yards to open the season** (1995, 2009, 2021).
- The Gators open the season with three-consecutive 100-plus yard rushing games for the first time since 2018 (205 yards vs. Charleston Southern, 128 vs. Kentucky, 222 vs. Colorado State).

MULLEN'S OFFENSE CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

- Since head coach **Dan Mullen** took over at Florida, the Gators are **tied for sixth in the Power Five with 35.9 points per game** and **ninth** in the Power Five **with 461.5 scrimmage yards per game**.
 - » Those totals rank third and fourth in the SEC, respectively.
- Under Mullen, Florida has now posted 13-consecutive games of 400-plus total yards for the first time in the last 40 years -- a streak that is tied with Ole Miss for the longest in the FBS.
- Week 3 vs. Alabama represented the 28th time Florida amassed 400-plus total yards under Mullen three
 more than the program's total of 25 400-yard outings from the 88 games comprising the 2011-17 seasons.
- The Gators have eclipsed **400 total yards in 26 of their last 32 games**.
- Florida has rushed for 200-plus yards 16 times in 41 games under Mullen.
- The Gators have also rushed for 100-plus yards in 32 of Mullen's 41 games.
- Dating back to last season, Florida has totaled **500-plus yards in 10 of its last 16 games**.
- Florida has **16 games of 500-plus total yards** in Dan Mullen's 41 games as head coach two more games than the team's combined total of 14 games from the 115 games comprising the 2009-17 seasons.
- Week 2 vs. USF was the 20th time Florida has reached 300 passing yards under Mullen, equaling its total from the 168 games comprising its 2005-17 seasons.
- Florida has scored 40 points 16 times under Mullen including twice in the program's last five games, which is four more 40-point games than the Gators accumulated from the 2010-17 seasons combined (101 games played).
- The Gators have scored **30-plus points 28 times in 41 games** under Mullen, including scoring 30-plus in **15 of the team's last 17 games.**

RISING TO THE OCCASION AGAINST THE TIDE

- In front of the fifth-largest crowd in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium history, Florida hosted the AP No. 1 team for the first time since 2002 vs. Miami and welcomed Alabama to The Swamp for the first time since 2011.
- Florida out-gained Alabama in Week 3, 439-331 total yards. This was the first time Alabama had been outgained in terms of total yardage by an opponent since November 9, 2019 vs. LSU.
- Florida out-gained Alabama by a 108-yard margin, marking the most yards Alabama has been out-gained by in a single game since January 9, 2017 in the CFP National Championship game vs. Clemson (-135).
- Florida's 439 total yards were the most surrendered by Alabama since the Crimson Tide surrendered 462 yards of offense to Florida in the 2020 SEC Championship game on Dec. 19, 2020.
 - » The last time a team not named Florida totaled more yards against Alabama was on Oct. 10, 2020, when Ole Miss totaled 647 yards of offense against the Tide.
- After falling behind, 21-3, in the first quarter vs. Alabama, the Gators **outscored the Crimson Tide, 26-10, from the second quarter on**.
- Florida's **11-play, 99-yard touchdown drive** in the third quarter was the **longest** touchdown drive against Alabama **since** Texas A&M put together a 99-yard drive against the Crimson Tide on **Sept. 22, 2018**.
- Since Alabama's Citrus Bowl victory over Michigan on Jan. 1, 2020, Florida is the only team to play the Crimson Tide closer than 15 points.
 - » The Gators did so in the 2020 SEC Championship game (46-52) and in Week 3 of this season (29-31).
 - » During that span, Alabama has won its 15 other games by an average of 31.7 points while defeating the Gators by an average of four points.

JONES LEADS GROUP OF NOTABLE WEEK 3 PERFORMERS

- Quarterback **Emory Jones** made strides in Week 3 vs. Alabama, setting career highs with 195 yards passing, 18 completions and 28 pass attempts.
- Jones now **ranks second among all FBS guarterbacks with 77.0 rushing YPG** and 12th with 5.5 yards per rush.
- Jones eclipsed 1,000 career passing yards in Week 3 in his third-career start and 27th career appearance.
- Jones' completion percentage of 64.3% was the best among his three starts as the Gators guarterback.
- With 76 rushing vards vs Alabama. Jones has rushed for 74-plus vards in all three games this season.
 - » Jones now has 231 rush yards this season (77.0 YPG) to go with 459 yards passing (153.0 YPG).
- By tying his career high with two rushing TDs in Week 3, running back Dameon Pierce is now tied for ninth
 in the FBS (t-1 SEC) with five rushing touchdowns on just 18 carries -- the fewest of any player in the top 10.
- Running back Nay'Quan Wright rushed for a career-high 58 yards on seven attempts and also registered
 a career-long rush of 30 yards.
- Tight end **Kemore Gamble** set a new single-game career high with five receptions which paced all Gators in the game. Gamble finished with 32 yards and caught all five of his targets.
- Tight end **Keon Zipperer** set a new single-game career high with 51 receiving yards which paced all Gators in the game. Zipperer also tied his career high of four receptions.

RICHARDSON SHINES IN WEEKS ONE AND TWO

- With 115 yards rushing and 152 yards passing (3-for-3) vs. USF in Week 2, quarterback Anthony Richardson became the first FBS player in the last 25 seasons to rush for 100-plus yards, pass for 150-plus yards and complete every pass he threw in a single game.
- Richardson accounted for three touchdown scores of 70-plus yards in the first-two weeks of the season.
- Richardson's 80-yard touchdown rush in the fourth quarter vs. USF is tied for the ninth-longest touchdown rush in Florida football history. It is also the longest rush by a Florida quarterback in the last 25 years.
 - » Richardson also had a 73-vard TD run in Week 1 and a 75-vard TD pass in the first quarter in Week 2.
- Richardson's 80-yard TD rush is the longest rush and longest touchdown rush by an FBS quarterback this season and is also tied for the seventh-longest run overall in 2021.
- Richardson is the first Gators quarterback with a 70-plus yard touchdown run and 75-plus yard touchdown pass in the same season since Jeff Driskel in 2012.
- Richardson is one of two FBS quarterbacks to record a 70-plus yard touchdown rush and 70-plus yard touchdown pass in the same season over the last two years and the only quarterback to do it so far in 2021.
- Richardson is the first FBS quarterback to have a 70-plus yard touchdown rush and 70-plus yard touchdown pass in back-to-back weeks since Jabari Laws (Army) in 2019.



MORE ON MULLEN'S 100TH DUB, 40TH GAME AT UF

- In Week 2, Mullen celebrated his 100th career win by producing the most total yards (666) during his UF tenure.
 - » That total ranks fifth all-time in terms of total vards in a single game in Florida football history.
- Mullen became the 174th college head football coach to reach 100 career wins and the 18th to do so in the SEC.
- He owns a career record of 100-56 (.641). That includes a 31-10 record at UF (2018-21) and 69-46 mark at MSU (2009-17).
- Mullen went 31-9 in his first 40 games as UF head coach a mark that trailed only Steve Spurrier and Urban Meyer (both 32-8) among all UF head coaches.
- In Week 1, Mullen became the third-fastest (39 G) UF head coach to win 30 games behind Meyer (37) and Spurrier (38).

FLIPPING THE DEFENSIVE SCRIPT

- Florida's defense, which in 2020 ranked 74th in the FBS in points allowed per game (30.8), has proved to be on the right path during the first-three weeks of the season.
- Through three games, the Gators have held opponents to 21.7 points per game (33.3 in 2020), 62 first downs (86 in 2020), 17 third down conversions (27 in 2020), and 960 total yards (1,485 in 2020).
- One of Florida's most notable improvements is the defense's ability to stop the rush. Through the first-three games of the season, the Gators have allowed 278 rushing yards, ranking fifth in the SEC and improving from 492 rushing yards after three games in 2020.

- Florida's 129 sacks since Mullen's debut 2018 season rank first in the SEC and third nationally trailing only Clemson (153) and Pittsburgh (142).
- Florida's defense has produced 68 turnovers since Mullen's debut in 2018, which is tied for third in the conference and tied for 15th in the FBS.
- With just 324 yards of total offense allowed, Florida held Alabama to its lowest total yardage in a single game since November, 10, 2018 vs. Mississippi State (305 yards). This marks Alabama's fewest total yards in their last 34 games.
- Florida held the Crimson Tide to 91 rushing yards, the fewest since South Carolina held them to 76 in 2019.
- In the second quarter against the Tide, Florida forced three-consecutive punts on three-straight three-andouts. It was the first time Alabama was forced to punt on three-straight drives in their last 12 games. The last time Alabama punted on three-straight drives was on Oct. 17, 2020 vs. Georgia.
- Florida forced Alabama to punt four times in a single game for the first time since Nov. 28, 2020 vs. Auburn.
- In Week 1, the Gators' 14 points allowed against FAU is the team's second-fewest total in a game dating back to November of 2019. UF allowed fewer points just once last season, beating Kentucky at home by a score of 34-10.
- After ranking tied-for-eighth in the FBS and second in the SEC with 34 sacks last season, the Gators got to
 the quarterback six times against FAU tying the team high from the 2020 season.
- The Gators' **11 sacks this season rank tied for 14th in the nation** and fourth in the SEC.
- **Mohamoud Diabate**, who leads the Gators with 19 tackles this season (eight solo), surpassed 100 career tackles against Alabama, finishing with eight tackles including 0.5 tackles for loss. Diabate now has 106 career tackles.
- Coming off an injury in 2020, sixth-year senior **Jeremiah Moon** ranks tied for second on the team with 16 total tackles (six solo), in addition to 1.5 sacks for seven yards.
- Zachary Carter set a career high with three sacks in Week 1, becoming the first Gator with three sacks in a single game since Jonathan Greenard (vs. FSU) and Diabate (vs. Vanderbilt) accomplished the feat in 2019.
- Carter added 0.5 sack against USF in Week 2 and ranks fifth in the SEC with 3.5 sacks and fourth in sack yards
 with 23. He ranks ranks tied-for-first in the conference and tied-for-fourth in the nation with 6.0 tackles-for-loss.
- The Gators secondary also showed improvement in Week 3 vs. Alabama. Tre'Vez Johnson had a career-high
 two pass breakups while Kaiir Elam tied his career high with three pass breakups.
- Defensive backs **Trey Dean** and **Rashad Torrence** tied their career highs with eight tackles. Dean had 0.5 TFLs.


Despite being without each of the team's topthree receivers from 2020, Florida returns 13 of 16 players who caught at least one pass last year.

FLORIDA RANKED TOP-FIVE PUBLIC UNIVERSITY

On Sept. 13, UF was ranked the No. 5 public university in the nation in the U.S. News & World Report's annual rankings. Florida is one of three schools to rank as a top-five university AND finish inside the top five of the 2020-21 Directors' Cup, which measures the overall strength of athletic programs across the country.

GATORS' DEFENSIVE FRONT IS LOADED

- Zachary Carter set a career high with three sacks in Week 1, becoming the first Gator with three sacks in a single game since Jonathan Greenard (vs. FSU) and Mohamoud Diabate (vs. Vanderbilt) accomplished the feat in 2019.
- Carter added 0.5 sack agains USF in week two and ranks fifth in the SEC in sacks and fourth in sack yards with 23. Additionally, he ranks ranks tied-for-first in the conference and tied-for-fourth in the nation with 6.0 tackles-for-loss.
- UF sophomore Gervon Dexter added a stellar outing for the Gators' front during Week 1. Dexter recovered a pair of fumbles, marking the first two of his career, and added two tackles.



- For the second year in a row, Dexter opened his season with an unprecedented performance. During his collegiate debut in 2020, Dexter recorded an interception during Florida's season opener at Ole Miss.
- Dexter recorded the first solo sack of his career against Alabama and set a single-game career high with eight tackles.
- Florida's 11 sacks rank tied-for-14th in the nation and fourth in the SEC.
- Graduate-transfer additions Antonio Valentino (Penn State), Daquan Newkirk (Auburn) and Tyron Truesdell
 (Auburn) have contributed a combined total of 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles-for-loss, 0.5 sacks and three quarterback
 hurries.

PRESEASON PUB

- The Gators had four representatives on the Media's Preseason All-SEC Team: DL Zachary Carter (first team), DB
 Kaiir Elam (first), LB Ventrell Miller (second) and WR Jacob Copeland (third).
- Carter, Elam and Miller all garnered preseason recognition for the second-straight season after recieving second team honors at their respective positions in 2020.
- Elam was named to the Coaches All-SEC First Team and AP Second Team as a defensive back in 2020 after finishing with 39 tackles (28 solo), 11 pass breakups and two interceptions.
- Florida also saw five Gators combine to appear on seven different NCFAA Watch Lists heading into the season.
 - » Zachary Carter (Wuerfell Trophy), Jace Christmann (Lou Groza Award), Kaiir Elam (Chuck Bednarik Award, Jim Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Award), Emory Jones (Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award) and Ventrell Miller (Butkus Award).

ADDITIONAL ACTIVE / HISTORICAL STREAKS

- UF has scored in 413-consecutive games dating back to 1988 -- which is an NCAA record. The Gators broke Michigan's record of 365-consecutive games (1984-2014) against LSU on Oct. 7, 2017.
- UF has 13-consecutive games of 400-plus total yards for the first time since at least 1981 -- tied for the longest-active streak nationally. UF also has at least seven-straight 400-yard outings against SEC teams for the first time in school history -- a streak now at 10 games.
- UF has finished with fewer than 10 penalties in 35-consecutive games.
- Since 2008, Florida and Alabama are the only FBS teams that have not lost to a team which finished the season with a losing record. Florida's last such loss was against Mississippi State (3-9) in 2004.

- Dan Mullen's 31-9 record through 40 games represented the third-best start in school history behind only Steve Spurrier (32-8) and Urban Meyer (32-8).
- In 2020, UF beat four SEC opponents by at least 20 points for the first time since 2008 (seven times).

Offensive Upticks Continued in Mullen's Second Act

- Florida recorded seven games of 500-plus total yards in Mullen's first two seasons. In 75 games from 2012-17, UF had six 500-yard outings.
- Florida recorded 14 games of 400-plus total yards in Mullen's first 26 games as head coach. In the program's 50 games from 2014-17, UF had 400-plus yards just 14 times.
- The Gators had eight games of 400-plus total yards in 2019, their most such games in a season since 2008 -- Mullen's final year as O.C. -- when they did it 10 times.
- UF scored 40-plus points nine times in Mullen's first 26 games (three in 2019, six in 2018). In the 88 games spanning 2011-17, Florida scored 40 points on nine occasions.
- UF scored 105 offensive touchdowns in Mullen's first 26 games. In the three seasons prior to his arrival (2015-17), the Gators scored 93 offensive touchdowns in 38 games.

Mullen Revived Florida's Offense in Debut Season

- The Gators finished in the top 100 in scoring offense for the first time since 2014. They had not finished higher than 96th in total offense since 2010 (when they were 83rd), and their only passing offense to rank higher than 85th following the 2009 season checked in at 79th (2016).
- Florida's averages in each of the following categories were also its highest since 2009: scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense (and average), touchdown-interception ratio, passing touchdowns, and scrimmage touchdowns.
- Here is a look those massive improvements:

 Florida also had its most games of 500-plus total yards (four), 400-plus total yards (six), and 350plus total yards (10) since 2009, when it had five, six, and 10, respectively.

- Mullen joined Stanford's Chuck Shaughnessy (1-7-1 in 1939; 10-0 in 1940) and Auburn's Gus Malzahn (3-9 in 2012; 12-2 in 2013) as the only other head coaches in history to win 10 games in a debut season at a current Power Five program after inherting a team that won less than five games the year prior.
- Oversaw the second-highest wins turnaround in school history (4-7 to 10-3 / +6), with it only being behind the 1980 Gators, who went 8-4 following a 0-10-1 campaign in 1979.

In Perspective: Mullen's Mississippi State Turnaround

- Mullen took over in Starkville with the Bulldogs coming off a 4-8 season and a nine-season stretch from 2000-08 in which they went 37-69 and made just two bowl appearances.
- The Bulldogs went 69-46 overall, 33-39 in SEC play, and made eight bowl games in Mullen's nine sesaons as head coach. Of his losses, 34 (or 74 percent of them) were to ranked opponents.

Mullen made Mississippi State one of 11 FBS programs to produce six different 1,000-yard rushers from 2009-17. The others were: Auburn (9), Nevada (7), Alabama (6), Army (6), Baylor (6), Boise State (6), Georgia Tech (6), Navy (6), Ohio State (6), and Wisconsin (6).



DAN MULLEN - FLORIDA HEAD COACH

- Mississippi State produced 26 NFL Draft picks in Mullen's tenure, including a pair
 of first-rounders. From 1996 through 2008, MSU had 27 NFL Draft picks.
- Seven of MSU's top nine (and all of its top four) highest total offense per game season averages were produced with Mullen as head coach
- MSU broke over 112 game, season, and career school records under Mullen.

In Perspective: Mullen Takes Mississippi State to No. 1

- Mullen led Mississippi State to a 9-0 start in 2014, allowing the Bulldogs to secure the No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 for a five-week stretch from Oct. 12 through Nov. 9.
- MSU held the No. 1 ranking until after a 25-20 loss at No. 4 Alabama on Nov. 15.
- Since 2001, only 16 FBS programs -- predominantly "blueblood" schools -- have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25. And 11 of those 16 were ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25 at least five weeks: Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Miami, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Oregon, and Southern California.
- Since 2013, only six FBS programs have been the No. 1 team in the AP Top 25.

In Perspective: Mullen as Florida's O.C.

- During Mullen's four seasons as the Gators offensive coordinator (2005-08), UF ranked 3rd in passer rating (155.9), 8th in scoring offense (36.3), 15th in total offense (418.9), 21st in rushing offense (185.6), 39th in passing offense (233.2).
- Coordinated an offense that ranked 4th nationally in points per game (43.6-also fourth in school history) and 15th in yards per game (445.1), eventually helping the Gators win the 2009 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated a Gators offense that scored 41 points to rout Ohio State--which had the nation's top scoring defense--in the 2007 BCS National Champ. Game.
- Coordinated the 2007 offense to 457.2 total yards per game -- 8th in UF history.
- Helped Chad Jackson garner Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after he set UF's single-season record with 88 receptions in 2005. Jackson led the SEC and ranked 6th nationally in receptions.
- Also in 2005, center Mike Degory was named a Rimington Trophy finalist.

In Perspective: Mullen's Quarterbacks Track Record

- In 2002 at Bowling Green, Mullen helped Josh Harris account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (41) among FBS players and 3,213 total yards.
- In 2004 at Utah, Mullen helped Alex Smith account for the second-most total touchdowns (42) among FBS players, and amass 3,604 total yards.
- Smith finished fourth in the 2004 Heisman Trophy voting and was the No. 1 pick in 2005 NFL Draft.
- In 2007, Mullen helped Tim Tebow account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (55 -- an SEC record) among FBS players, and amass 4,181 total yards.
- Tebow was the first quarterback in FBS history to pass for 20+ touchdowns and rush for 20+ touchdowns in a season (2007), and his 2007 season remains the

- only one in history of more than 30 passing and 20 rushing touchdowns.
- Tebow won the Heisman Trophy in 2007 (first-ever underclassman winner).
- Tebow's numbers dipped slightly in 2008, but he still ranked 7th nationally in total touchdowns (42) and accounted for 3,419 total yards.
- In 2014, Mullen helped Dak Prescott finish tied for fifth nationally in total touchdowns (42) in 2014, in addition to totaling 4,470 yards (3,449 pass / 986 rush / 35 receiving).
- Prescott was eighth in the Heisman voting and a Maxwell Award finalist in 2014.
- Prescott's rushing production dipped in 2015, but he increased his passing production and finished the season ranked 15th nationally in passing yards (3,793).
 He also ranked 11th nationally with 39 total touchdowns.
- In 2016, Mullen helped first-year starter Nick Fitzgerald, a redshirt sophomore, tie for 14th nationally with 37 total touchdowns. Fitzgerald also ran for 1,375 yards--ranking 3rd among FBS quarterbacks.
- In 2017, Fitzgerald accounted for 2,766 yards (1,782 passing, 984 rushing) and 29 touchdowns (15 passing, 14 rushing) despite missing nearly all of the Egg Bowl and Mississippi State's bowl game due to a gruesome ankle injury.
- Much of Florida's offensive success in 2018 could be attributed to Feleipe Franks' turnaround, which Mullen engineered. Franks finished the year tied for 17th nationally in touchdown-interception ratio, and his 24 touchdown passes (to six interceptions) were the highest season total since Tim Tebow threw 30 en route to the 2008 national title. Franks threw nine touchdowns and eight interceptions, and ranked 99th nationally with a 113.31 passer rating in 2017.

THIS WEEK'S HONORARY MR. TWO BITS + GAME-SPECIFIC CELEBRATIONS

THE LEGEND OF MR. TWO BITS

It all started in 1949 at Florida Field, when George Edmondson looked at the crowd around him as the Gators were playing The Citadel. Fans were booing the team and George would not stand for it. He jumped up and got the fans cheering, and so began the legend of Mr. Two Bits.

For 60 years, Gators fans from all across the world became eternally grateful for the man who started every Gators home football game with the phrase "Two-Bits, Four-Bits, Six-Bits, a Dollar. All for the Gators, Stand Up and holler!" George Edmondson led the cheer in his trademark yellow shirt with an orange and blue tie from 1949 until retiring from the role at the end of the 2008 season. Coincidentally, Florida's home finale that season came against The Citadel, providing a unique symmetry to Edmondson's decades of leading Florida fans in the Mr. Two Bits cheer.

Upon his retirement, Florida mascots Albert and Alberta continued the pregame Two Bits tradition until 2013 when UF began inviting celebrities to perform the role. Errict Rhett was the first honorary Mr. Two Bits, and multiple Gator Greats have gone on to fill that role since.





THIS WEEK'S HONORARY MR. TWO BITS IS...

Sue Halfacre, Cherrietta Prince and Nancy Thayer -- three women from Florida's first-ever women's teams in 1972-73. **As a season-long celebration of 50 years of Florida women's athletics kicks off this weekend**, the aforementioned trio will lead the crowd in the pregame Mr. Two Bits cheer.

Halfacre, a 1991 UF Athletic Hall of Fame inductee, was a member of the first Florida women's swim team and a three-time All-American while doubling as the team's head coach from 1973-76. Halfacre became the first female Gator to claim an individual national title when she won the 400-meter freestyle at the 1973 AlAW championships.

Prince not only was on the first UF women's track team (as a long-jumper,

high-jumper and sprinter), but was also the first African-American female to compete in a Florida uniform.

Thayer came to UF in 1971 and was on the first gymnastics team. The program had its early struggles, but in its 10th season won the first women's team championship in Gators history by capturing the 1982 AIAW crown.

In March of 1972, a proposal written by Dr. Ruth Alexander (Chair of the Department of Physical Education for Women), Donna Deutsch (tennis coach), Linda Hall Thornton (tennis coach) and Mimi Ryan (golf coach) requesting a women's program of intercollegiate athletics was approved by the Faculty Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics. The effective date for the proposal was set for the 1972-73 school year -- the first official year for University of Florida women's athletics. This marked an important moment in history, as Title IX was not yet implemented, and would not follow until three months later, and no other school in the Southeastern Conference had yet to accomplish funding a women's program.

Prior to Saturday's Florida-Tennessee game, the anniversary letterwinners will partake in the **Gator Walk Parade of Champions at 4:45 p.m.**, before being honored at the **end of the first guarter** (1995 & 1996 football teams) **and halftime** (SEC Champions recognition).

Chris Harry's Quick Slant

WHAT HAPPENED: The first packed house at Spurrier/Florida Field in more than 21 months probably left the fans wanting more from the home team's new-look offense, but they settled for a 35-14 victory over Florida Atlantic and a long-awaited night of college-football atmosphere with a crowd of 86,840 celebrating the return of the "Swamp." Quarterback Emory Jones, in his first career start (and tasked with replacing 2020 Heisman Trophy finalist Kyle Trask), accounted for 187 yards of offense and passed for a touchdown. Senior tailback Malik Davis rushed for 102 yards and a score, while classmate Dameon Pierce ran for a couple TDs, as the 13thranked Gators took care of the Owls on a pretty September football night. Jones, the fourth-year junior from LaGrange, Ga., completed 17 of 27 passes for 113 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions (one coming in the end zone), while rushing 10 times for 74 yards. Redshirt freshman backup Anthony Richardson figures to be a topic of conversation this week, after relieving Jones and leading the Gators on two fourth-quarter touchdown drives, the second coming on his electrifying 73-yard run. Richardson, who ducked in for two series in the first half, completed all three of his seven passes for 40 yards and rushed seven times for 160 yards (all but 28 in the second half). He looked really good, but this was Jones' game all the way, though, and he'll come away from it knowing he and the Florida passing game have a lot of work to do after leading the nation in throwing the ball last season at 378.6 yards per game. Defensively, Florida gave up 351 yards and 23 first downs, but forced a pair of turnovers on the way to flirting with the unit's first shutout since 2019 -- and a year after finishing 89th nationally and allowing 30.8 points per game. UF scored on its first possession, with Jones leading an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Pierce scoring on a 2-yard run. A 9-yard Jones-to-Rick Wells scoring toss gave the Gators a two-touchdown cushion in the first period. Pierce added a 3-yard score in the fourth period and Davis dove over for a 1-yard TD midway through the fourth quarter. The Owls staved off a shutout with an eight-play, 67-yard drive ended with a 2-yard scoring run by Johnny Ford. Florida Atlantic quarterback N'Kosi Perry completed 19 of his 33 passes for 261 yards, with his lone TD passing coming with 1:37 left in the game.

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida had a school-record string of 27 consecutive season-opening victories snapped in 2017 when the Gators fell to Michigan 33-17 in Arlington, Texas. They've now won four straight openers, all under Coach Dan Mullen, with the victory over the Owls the first season-opening home win since 2018. UF kicked off the last two seasons away from home, beating Miami 24-20 at Orlando in 2019 and Ole Miss on the road in 2020. The Gators have won 32 straight home openers, dating to 1990.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: The easy and obvious pick would be Jones vs. Richardson, but Davis had a nice game running the football. Good for him. Davis took a lot of heat (too much, actually) last year for his late fumble at Texas A&M, so to start his fifth-year senior season and answer the call (with runs of 31, 17 and 21 yards in the first half). Davis, with the second 100-yard game of his career, became the first UF back to hit triple-digit rushing in a season opener since Matt Jones had 114 in 2014. On defense, linebacker Jeremiah Moon became the first player in school history to play in six different seasons (2017-22). Moon, who has struggled to stay healthy over his career, was a pass-rushing presence in finishing with six tackles (five in the first half) and a QB hurry.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The communications staff will be sifting through the records this week to find the last time a Florida offense had nearly three time as many rushing yards (400) as passing yards (153) in a game.

UP NEXT: The Gators (1-0) will play a rare nonconference road game (against an opponent other than Florida State) when they travel to Tampa to face South Florida (0-1) at Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls, out of the American Athletic Conference, opened the 2021 season Thursday by getting drilled 45-0 at North Carolina State. The game will mark UF's first regular-season game in Tampa since beating Mississippi State 21 there on Sept. 30, 1989, although the Gators have played in Tampa five times since in the Outback Bowl.

WHAT HAPPENED: Dueling quarterbacks Emory Jones and Anthony Richardson accounted for 500 yards and five touchdowns Saturday, as the 13th-ranked Gators used a first-half QB stampede to overwhelm the host Bulls Saturday at Raymond James Stadium. Jones, the fourth-year junior and starter through two games, completed 14 of 22 passes for 156 yards and one touchdown, but also had a pair of second-half interceptions and failed to score after a first-and-goal from the USF 7 early in the fourth quarter. Richardson, the fab redshirt freshman, had the better allaround afternoon, adding another 152 yards and two scores through the air (on just three attempts, all completions), including bombs of 75 and 41 in the first half to help the Gators cruise to a 35-3 lead at intermission, thanks to TDs on five consecutive possessions, and a total-yards advantage of 373-128 through the two periods. The only UF scoring drive of the second half was an 80-yard touchdown run by ... wait for it ... Richardson, who a week ago had a 73-yard touchdown run in the season opener against Florida Atlantic. When the final gun sounded, UF had out-gained USF 666 yards to 283 in what was the Gators' first in-state road game against an opponent other than Florida State or Miami since coming here to play the University of Tampa in 1945. Jones had a 35-yard TD throw to sophomore Xzavier Henderson as well as 11 rushes for 82 yards, including a 33-yard run on an option keeper in the first half. Unfortunately, he also threw those two third-quarter picks that set up the Bulls for 10 points in the period. Richardson fired a 75-yard touchdown to Jacob Copeland on his first snap of the game and later in the second quarter faked a run and dropped to hoist a 41-yard touchdown to Copeland, who caught just one pass for 15 yards last week. He found Copeland again for a 36-yard completion to the USF 7 early in the fourth period, but by-rule had to leave the game after the play because his helmet came off. With Jones back in, the Gators failed to score on the drive. The next Florida score came on Richardson's 80-yard keeper with 10:29 to go in the game. He with four carries for 115 yards and a score before leaving the game after his TD run with what appeared to be a hamstring strain or cramp. Defensively, the Gators gave up some plays here and there, but it was a better showing than a week ago (when FAU tallied 386 yards and a couple TDs). For what it's worth, South Florida outscored Florida 17-7 after intermission.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Gators have won their first two games for the third straight season, including one on the road, but now turn their focus to college football's ultimate litmus test next week. Florida Atlantic or USF aren't walking through that door, people. Read on (as if you need to).

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: You just know that every Gator fan leaving RJS was weighing in on the Jones vs. Richardson debate. The statistics and big plays speak for themselves, but it only matters what Coach Dan Mullen has to say.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Two weeks into the 2021 campaign, Florida is averaging 359.0 rushing yards per game. We'll see where that number stands after next week. Jammed in those numbers, Richardson has rushed 11 times for 275 yards, which converts to an average of 25.0 per carry.

WHAT HAPPENED: The Gators spotted the top-ranked Crimson Tide three first-quarter touchdowns and an early 18-point lead, then ran out of time during a furious comeback against the reigning national champions Saturday before nearly 91,000 at Spurrier-Florida Field. Bama sophomore quarterback Bryce Young passed for 233 yards and three touchdowns, while tailback Brian Robinson Jr. had a touchdown catch and run, the latter coming late in the third period and proving to be the difference on the scoreboard. For UF, the game fell to fourth-year junior quarterback Emory Jones and only Jones, as fab freshman backup Anthony Richardson, the Southeastern Conference's rushing leader coming in, was ruled out before the game due to a hamstring he pulled on his 80-yard touchdown run in last week's win at South Florida. Jones had an early interception to set up a Bama touchdown, but was up to the task on his way to completing 17 of 27 attempts for 181 yards, plus another 80 rushing yards and a score and leading three consecutive second-half touchdown drives. Young, in his first collegiate start in a true road environment, was unfazed by the deafening din of the "Swamp" and completed 22 of 35 passes, with all three of his TD throws coming in the first quarter on the way to a 21-3 lead. Young had TD tosses of 7, 26 and 7 yards, while UF managed just a 25-yard field goal on its first three series. A 26-yard touchdown run by UF tailback Malik Davis put the Gators in the end zone for the first time, although Chris Howard's point-after attempt was missed, leaving the score 21-9. It would matter. That's where it stood going into the third quarter when the two teams swapped scoring drives, with the Gators tallying a pair of touchdowns, the first on a 3-yard run by Dameon Pierce and the second on a 5-yarder from Jones that that capping a monumental 99-yard drive after a botched kickoff return. In between, Alabama had a 75-yard drive that ended with fourth-down run of three yards by Robinson. The Tide led 28-23 heading into fourth quarter, and upped the lead to eight points with a Will Reichard field goal of 24 yards after the UF defense bowed up on the goal line, keeping the margin at a one-possession game. Jones answer magnificently, moving his team 75 yards in 11 plays in 3:11, hitting a pair of third-down conversion passes, before Pierce sped off the left side for a 17yard touchdown that made the score 31-29 with 3:10 remaining. UF, smarting from the failed PAT in the second quarter, had to go for two and Davis was stuffed. Bama got one first down before punting the ball away with 10 seconds left. Not enough time (and too far to go) for the Gators.

(Photo: Chris Kim/UAA Communications) WHAT IT MEANS: With the loss the Gators already are down a game in the SEC East Division standings, but history has taught Florida fans that defeats against West Division opponents definitely can be overcome. UF's job now is to stay in the picture, take care of business, and be in the hunt for the East when the annual Georgia game rolls around.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Fans would say Richardson, who didn't even play, but what about that Florida ground game? UF, remember, came into the game leading the nation in rushing yards per game at 381.5, and outgained Alabama 258-91. Of the Gators' 439 yards of total offense (more than a hundred over the Tide's 324), 73.8 percent came on the ground. For Florida, especially when Richardson returns, that's likely the way the offense will go.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Florida went 59-for-59 on extra points last season, mostly courtesy of Evan McPherson, now with the Cincinnati Bengals. Howard made all seven of his attempts in 2020 and was 9-for-9 in '21.



June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live." Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tenative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored opponents 7,429 to 3,117 in 197 games inside The Swamp, putting the average outcome at 37.7 to 15.8 (21.9 points).
- The Gators had two significant win streaks in The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23game run from 1990-93, and a school-record 30-game streak from 1994-99.
- In 197 home games from 1990 through today, the Gators have...

Scored 50+ points.....51 times Scored 40+ points.....84 times Scored 30+ points......132 times Shut Out Opponents.....16 times Allowed 3 points or less......31 times Allowed 14 points or less......107 times

- Florida's school-record crowd of 90,916 on Nov. 28, 2015 marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 16 Super Bowls, four BCS National Championship Games and the 2017 and 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
