STORYLINES

• **TO THE SWAMP:** Tennessee hits the road for the first time this season to open SEC play against No. 11 Florida at 7 p.m. ET in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium live on ESPN. The Vols went 3-7 in SEC play a year ago, and this season they were picked to finish fifth in SEC East at SEC Media Days. Florida was picked to finish second. Saturday's game is the first of back-to-back SEC road games for UT, who travels to Missouri next week. Head coach **Josh Heupel** was 11-4 in road games in three seasons at UCF.

• **HEUPEL ERA:** **Josh Heupel** is in his debut season at Tennessee and reached the 30-win plateau last Saturday. The 27th head coach in Vol history, Heupel's 30 victories rank ninth among FBS head coaches dating back to the start of the 2018 season, trailing only Nick Saban (41), Dabo Swinney (41), Brian Kelly (36), Lincoln Riley (36), Luke Fickell (34), Kirby Smart (34), Ed Orgeron (32) and Dan Mullen (31). Heupel owns the eighth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches at .769 (min. two seasons). Heupel became the fourth-quickest active FBS head coach (39 games) to reach 30 career victories, behind only Oklahoma's Lincoln Riley (34), Stanford's David Shaw (35), UCLA's Chip Kelly (35) and Georgia's Kirby Smart (38).

• **SHUTOUT SATURDAY:** Tennessee recorded its first shutout since Sept. 2019 with a 56-0 blanking of Tennessee Tech last Saturday in Neyland Stadium. Eight different Vols scored - four rushing, three passing and one interception return (31 yards by **Solon Page III**) - as UT outgained the Golden Eagles, 417-179. Quarterback **Hendon Hooker**, making his first UT start in place of an injured **Joe Milton III**, accounted for 263 yards of total offense and four touchdowns. Hooker became the first Vol QB to throw for at least three TDs and rush for at least one TD in the same game since Joshua Dobbs threw for three and rushed for two on Nov. 19, 2016, against Missouri. **Aubrey Solomon** and **Byron Young** led the Vols in tackles with six apiece.

• **CREATING NEGATIVE PLAYS:** Tennessee has racked up 29 tackles for loss through three games under new defensive coordinator **Tim Banks**. That tally ranks seventh in the nation and third in the SEC behind LSU (40) and Auburn (33). The 29 TFLs are the most through the first three games of a season since at least 2008. A total of 17 different players have 0.5 TFL so far, including six with multiple TFLs. The Vols are averaging 9.67 tackles for loss per game, which ranks sixth in the FBS. **Theo Jackson** leads the way with 6.0, which is tops among all FBS defensive backs and is tied for the SEC lead overall.

• **FACING FLORIDA:** Tennessee and Florida are meeting for the 51st time with the Gators leading the series, 30-20. Florida has won four in a row over the Vols. Tennessee's last win against the Gators came on Sept. 24, 2016, in Knoxville by a score of 38-28. UT is seeking its first win in Gainesville since Sept. 20, 2003 (24-10). **Josh Heupel** is seeking to become the first Vol head coach to defeat Tennessee in his first try since Phillip Fulmer did so on Sept. 19, 1992, in Knoxville (31-14). Fulmer was serving as interim head coach in that contest. The last UT coach to win in Gainesville in his first game against Florida was Bill Battle on Oct. 24, 1970.

• **TEMPO:** A trademark of **Josh Heupel's** offenses is tempo. The Vols are averaging 3.08 offensive plays per minute, which is tops in the nation. Utah State is next closest at 2.95. UT is tallying 77.67 plays per game, which is 13th in the FBS. From 2018-20, Heupel's UCF teams averaged a nation-high 3.04 plays per minute. The next closest was 2.78 by Wake Forest during that span. Heupel's UCF squads averaged 79.97 plays per game from 2018-20.

- **MEDIA WILL CALL:** For those media members picking up their credentials, pickup is located at the Tennessee Media Relations Office on the ground floor of the Anderson Training Center. Credential pickup begins four hours prior to kickoff.
- **MEDIA ENTRANCE:** Media will enter the press box through Gate 15A on the west side of Neyland Stadium.
- **PRESS BOX:** The press box will open 3.5 hours prior to kickoff. A pregame meal will be served beginning two hours prior to kickoff. After entering Gate 15A, take the elevator to Level 5.
- **STOKELY FAMILY MEDIA CENTER:** Stokely Family Media Center on the field level of Neyland Stadium opens 3.5 hours prior to kickoff and is available for credentialed photographers/videographers. A pregame meal for photographers/videographers will be served beginning two hours prior to kickoff. To access Stokely Family Media Center, take the elevator to Level 1, enter the stadium concourse, and walk north (left). Just inside Gate 21, take the stairs down to the Gate 21A ramp. Enter the field area and walk along the back of the north end zone to the media center, which is located in the

northeast corner of Neyland Stadium.

- **PRINTABLES:** With the exception of flip cards and final game books, media materials will be available digitally in accordance with FWAA recommendations. This includes in-game stats and game notes. Digital links will be distributed prior to game day for game notes.
- **SEC MEDIA PORTAL:** Similar to the 2020 season, the SEC and XOS Digital will provide a platform for distribution of game photos and press conference content. Still photography will be available in the portal for the media following each SEC football game. To request access to the SEC Media Portal and create an account, contact: licensing@xosdigital.com.
- **POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCES:** Tennessee's home postgame press conference will be held with media in person in the Stokely Family Media Center. A Zoom option will be available to watch, listen and record only. Questions will come from those media in person. The visiting team postgame press conference will be via Zoom format only with no media in person. Links to both Zoom press conferences will be distributed the day prior to the game. The on-demand video of both press conferences will be available in the SEC Media Portal.

NOTING THE TENNESSEE-FLORIDA SERIES

- Tennessee and Florida are meeting for the 51st time with the Gators owning a 30-20 advantage in the series.
- This will be the 21st meeting in Gainesville. Tennessee is 5-15 vs. Florida in Gainesville, and the Gators have won eight in a row vs. the Vols in the Swamp.
- It is the first time that two teams will face off at night since 2018 in Knoxville. The last time the two teams played each other at night in Gainesville? Sept. 17, 2005
- Tennessee and Florida have played each other every season for 31 straight years dating back to the 1990 season.
- The two teams will play each other for September for the 26th time in the last 28 meetings. Last season was a rare December meeting (COVID-19).
- Florida has been the first SEC opponent Tennessee has faced 17 times since 2000. The Vols had faced the Gators in the conference opener five straight times before the conference-only 2020 COVID-19 season saw UT play South Carolina in the opener.
- Since 2000, Tennessee is 3-4 against Florida when the Gators are ranked outside the top 10.
- Four of the last seven meetings have been decided by 10 points or less.
- Josh Heupel** is 6-0 against teams from Florida. It is his first meeting with the Gators (3-0 vs. South Florida, 2-0 vs. FAU, 1-0 vs. Florida A&M).
- A total of 542 miles separate the two schools down I-75.
- Florida co-offensive coordinator/WR coach Billy Gonzales and Tennessee defensive coordinator **Tim Banks** and offensive coordinator/TE coach **Alex Golesh** all coached on the same staff at Illinois in 2012. Golesh was the tight ends and recruiting coordinator on that staff, while Gonzales was the wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator.

Vols Fall to No. 6 Florida, 31-19

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Despite giving up just 19 rushing yards and making multiple timely stops, Florida's passing attack was too much for Tennessee to overcome in a 31-19 defeat on Saturday inside Neyland Stadium.

The meeting was the first between the two teams in Knoxville in December since 1928.

Tennessee true-freshman quarterback Harrison Bailey completed 14 of his 21 pass attempts for 111 yards and his first career touchdown toss in his first career start for UT (2-6).

Bailey became the fourth ever Tennessee true-freshman signal caller to make his first career start against a top-10 opponent, joining Erik Ainge, Josh Dobbs and Brian Maurer. Florida quarterback Kyle Trask led the way for UF (8-1) with 433 yards through the air and four touchdowns.

The Gators opened the scoring on a 30-yard field goal from Evan McPherson with 9:19 remaining in the opening quarter.

After the teams traded punts to end the first quarter, the Vols marched 96 yards down the field in 11 plays, capped by Bailey's first career touchdown pass -- a 15-yard connection to Eric Gray out of the backfield -- to give UT a 7-3 advantage with 9:59 left in the first half.

The drive was the longest scoring drive of the season for the Vols in terms of yardage and the touchdown was Gray's 10th in his last 10 games.

Florida immediately responded with a six-play, 75-yard drive in just over two minutes to regain a three-point advantage.

On the ensuing drive, the Vols failed to convert on a fake punt from their own 30, but the defense was undaunted with its back against the wall, forcing a three-and-out before McPherson missed a 53-yard field goal attempt.

Following a Tennessee punt, the Gators added their second touchdown of the half to take a 17-7 lead into the locker room.

Getting the first possession of the second half, Florida maintained its momentum with a five-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to increase its lead to 24-7.

The Gators pushed the advantage to 31-7 with another touchdown early in the fourth quarter.

The Vols responded by embarking on an 11-play, 94-yard drive led by reserve quarterback J.T. Shrout. Ty Chandler capped the drive with his third score of the season to cut the Florida lead to 31-13.

NOTEBOOK

EXPERIENCED QUARTERBACK ROSTER

- Tennessee boasts 26 career collegiate starts among the quarterbacks on its roster. In terms of starts at Tennessee, **Joe Milton III** owns a 1-1 record, **Hendon Hooker** is 1-0 and **Harrison Bailey** is 1-2.
- **Joe Milton III** joined the roster in June 2021 after playing two seasons at Michigan. Milton III played in all six of the Wolverines games a season ago, making five starts. He accounted for 1,350 yards of total offense and eight touchdowns -- five passing and three rushing -- in his two seasons in Ann Arbor.
- **Milton** earned the start for the Vols in the first two games, accounting for 287 yards and three touchdowns. Milton rushed for 45 yards and two scores in the season-opener. He was the first Tennessee QB to rush for multiple touchdowns in his first start with the Vols since Alan Cockrell on Sept. 19, 1981, against Colorado State. Milton's first touchdown pass as a Vol was a 40-yard strike in the back of the end zone to **Cedric Tillman**, accounting for Tennessee's final score against Bowling Green.
- **Milton** left the Pitt game in the second quarter due to injury and did not return. Prior to injury, he recorded a career-long 54-yard rush in the second quarter. His previous career-long rush was 23 yards (twice). Milton's 54-yard rush was the longest by a Tennessee quarterback since Joshua Dobbs had a 70-yard touchdown run against Missouri on Nov. 19, 2016 in a 63-37 UT win. Milton did not play against Tennessee Tech in Week 3, recovering from injury.
- UT brought in graduate transfer **Hendon Hooker** from Virginia Tech in January 2021. Hooker produced an 8-7 record as a starter for the Hokies, throwing for 2,894 yards and 22 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,033 yards on 247 carries with 15 touchdowns on the ground. Hooker enrolled at Tennessee in January.
- **Hooker** spelled Milton against Pitt in Week 2 in the second quarter after Milton exited to injury. He threw his first touchdown pass as a Vol on a 44-yard screen to **Jimmy Calloway** with 2:16 remaining in the second quarter. Hooker threw for 188 yards and two touchdowns and added 49 yards on the ground.
- **Hooker** started in Week 3 against Tennessee Tech, his first start as a Vol. He accounted for 263 yards of total offense and four touchdowns. Hooker completed 17-of-25 passes for 199 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. He became the first Vol QB to throw for at least three TDs and rush for at least one TD in the same game since Joshua Dobbs threw for three and rushed for two on Nov. 19, 2016 against Missouri. Hooker finished with 64 yards rushing on nine carries, and he connected on touchdown passes of 29-yards, 45-yards and 1-yard.
- The Vols return sophomore **Harrison Bailey**, who started the final three games of the 2020 season. Bailey saw his first action of the season in the third quarter against Tennessee Tech in Week 3. He completed 3-of-7 passes for 16 yards.

30-POINT PLATEAU

- Tennessee has eclipsed the 30-point mark in each of its first three games as the Vols are averaging 42.7 points per contest, which ranks third in the SEC and tied for 15th in the FBS. It's the first time that UT has produced 30 or more points in its first three games of a season since 2004 - UNLV (42), Florida (30) and Louisiana Tech (42). This season, the Vols have scored 38 against Bowling Green, 34 vs. Pitt and 56 vs. Tennessee Tech.
- In 39 games as a head coach, **Josh Heupel** teams have hit the 30-point mark 36 times and his teams are 30-6 when doing so. The only times his teams did not hit 30 points was at Cincinnati (2019), Tulsa (2020) and BYU (2020). Heupel is the second UT head coach all-time to put up 30 points or more through his first three games as head coach joining Phillip Fulmer (1992). Fulmer did it in his first nine games (first three games of 1992, 1993 Hall of Fame Bowl and first five games of 1993).
- Tennessee erupted for 56 points in its shutout of Tennessee Tech in Week 2 on Sept. 18. That point tally was the Vols' most since putting up 59 points against ETSU on Sept. 8, 2018.

FAST STARTS

- Tennessee has outscored opponents 38-0 in the first quarter this season. The Vols are one of two SEC teams yet to surrender a point in the first quarter (Arkansas). They are one of eight Power Five teams who have yet to issue a score entering Week 4, including Boston College, Clemson, Colorado, Michigan State, Rutgers and Wisconsin.
- Tennessee's scoring differential in the first quarter (offense minus defense) is +12.67, which is tied for second in the nation with Houston. Alabama leads the nation at +14.00.
- Opponents are managing only 39.7 yards of total offense in the first quarter against the Vols this season.
- The Vols have scored touchdowns on their first drive in two of their first three games, including on their first play from scrimmage against Pitt in Week 2 that was setup by a **Christian Charles** blocked punt. UT did not convert on its first drive against Tennessee Tech in Week 3 (punt).

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Tennessee's new-look defense under the direction of defensive coordinator **Tim Banks** has been a bright spot through the first three games.
- The Vols have held three straight opponents under 100 yards rushing in the same season for the first time since 2005 when it held five consecutive foes under 100 yards rushing to open the season - UAB (53), Florida (68), LSU (98), Ole Miss (50). This season, UT held Bowling Green (32), Pittsburgh (96) and Tennessee Tech (35) under 100 yards rushing.
- This season, UT is allowing only 54.33 yards rushing per game, which ranks second in the SEC and fifth in the FBS. The Vols allowed 141.60 yards rushing per game a season ago, which was fifth in the SEC.
- Tennessee has issued only 3 rushes of 10+ yards this season, a figure that ranks third in the nation. The longest rush by an opponent was 24 yards by Bowling Green in the season-opener.
- The Vols are allowing only 265.0 yards per game of total offense, which ranks 17th in the nation and fourth

NOTEBOOK

- in the SEC. That is a +142.4 improvement from a year ago when UT allowed 407.4 yards per game.
- The Vols came into Week 3 against Tennessee Tech without having forced a takeaway this season. That changed quickly as UT intercepted four passes on Sept. 18. **Jaylen McCollough** (16 yards), **Tamarion McDonald** (4 yards), **Solon Page III** (31 yards for a touchdown) and **Alontae Taylor** (29 yards) each notched picks. The four interceptions were the most in a game for UT since collecting four on Sept. 14, 2019 vs. Chattanooga. That shifted the Vols' turnover margin for the season to -2.
- Tennessee's defense has responded admirably to sudden change when the offense commits a turnover. In two of three games thus far, UT has not allowed a point on the ensuing opponent possession following a Vol turnover (Bowling Green, Tennessee Tech). Against Pitt, the Vols allowed only three points following a sudden change (turnover). Five of Tennessee's six turnovers this season have occurred in its own territory and out of those five, the Vol defense has allowed only three points (*credit Brent Hubbs for the note*).
- Third-down defense has been a strength of Banks' squad. Opponents have converted only 14 of 51 opportunities (27.45 percent), which ranks second in the SEC and 12th in the nation.

SUNSHINE STATE VOLS

- Five Vols call the state of Florida home, including wide receiver **Andison Coby** (Fort Lauderdale), linebacker **Morven Joseph** (Lakeland), offensive lineman **Kingston Harris** (Orlando), quarterback **Joe Milton III** (Pahokee) and defensive back **De'Shawn Rucker** (Tallahassee). Milton moved to Orlando from Pahokee for his freshman year of high school.

THEO'S TIME

- Senior **Theo Jackson** has been arguably the SEC's best defensive back through three weeks and Tennessee's top player. Jackson leads the Vols in tackles (25), tackles for loss (6.0), sacks (1.5) and pass breakups (5).
- Jackson is tied for the SEC lead in tackles for loss, and he is tied for fifth in the FBS. He leads all FBS defensive backs in tackles for loss.
- Jackson ranks fifth in the SEC in total tackles, and he is tied for 51st in the FBS.
- Jackson is tied for the SEC lead in pass breakups, and he is tied for sixth in the FBS.
- Jackson has tied his career high with 11 tackles in each of his first two games of 2021. It was the first time in his career that he registered double-digit tackles in back-to-back games.
- Jackson's 25 tackles are the most by a Vol through the first three games of a season since Daniel Bituli had 33 through the first three of 2018 (23 vs. Georgia Tech, 5 vs. Indiana State, 5 at Florida).

RB DUO OF SMALL, EVANS

- Tennessee's top two running backs departed last season in Eric Gray (Oklahoma) and Ty Chandler (North Carolina), and the Vols haven't missed a beat with the emergence of junior **Tiyon Evans** and sophomore **Jabari Small**. Both went over 100 yards rushing in the season-opener.
- It represented the 21st time in program history that UT had two 100-yard rushers in the same game and the first since QB Joshua Dobbs (190) and RB John Kelly (101) vs. Missouri on Nov. 19, 2016.
- It was the first time the Vols produced multiple 100-yard running backs in the same game since the 2015 season-opener against Bowling Green (Sept. 5) when Jalen Hurd (123) and Alvin Kamara (144) achieved the feat.
- Making his UT debut, **Evans** had 16 carries for 120 yards and one touchdown. He averaged 7.5 yards per carry and collected 63 yards after contact. Evans scored on a 19-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Evans was the first Vol to rush for over 100 yards in his UT debut since Alvin Kamara rushed for 144 yards on Sept. 5, 2015, vs. Bowling Green in Nashville. According to PFF, Evans was the second-highest graded Power Five running back in Week 1 at 87.8. Evans was unavailable during Week 2 against Pitt but returned Week 3 against Tennessee Tech.
- Small, making his first career start, finished with 117 yards on 22 carries and his first career rushing touchdown in the season-opener. Small was injured in the second quarter against Pitt in Week 2 and did not play in Week 3 against Tennessee Tech.

"CHILI HOT" SPECIAL TEAMS SUCCESS

- Tennessee's special teams has shined through the first three games under the direction of **Mike Ekeler**. The Vols blocked a punt on the first series that led to their first touchdown against Pitt in Week 2. True freshman **Christian Charles** recorded the block. It was the first blocked punt by UT since Oct. 26, 2019 vs. South Carolina.
- Senior punter **Paxton Brooks** came into 2021 as a preseason second-team All-SEC selection. Brooks ranks third in the SEC in average yards per punt so far with seven punts averaging 47.14 yards. Three of his seven punts have gone 50 yards or more, including a career-long 64-yarder in the second quarter of the season-opener against Bowling Green. Three punts have been pinned inside the 20.
- Senior kicker **Chase McGrath**, a Southern Cal transfer, is off to a good start at Tennessee. McGrath has connected on his first three field goal attempts, making a 43-yarder against Bowling Green in Week 1 and drilling a 37-yarder and 48-yarder against Pitt in Week 2. He's 16-of-16 on PATs as a Vol.
- Tennessee's kickoff return coverage ranks fourth in the SEC and 24th in the FBS as the Vols have allowed only 16.2 yards per return thus far.

851 WINS AND COUNTING

VELUS JONES JR. ELITE SPECIAL TEAMS RETURNER

- In the spring of 2020, grad transfer wide receiver/return specialist **Velus Jones Jr.** enrolled at Tennessee after four seasons at Southern Cal. He elected to return for his second senior season at UT in 2021.
- Jones Jr. finished his USC career second all-time in school history in kickoff return yards with 1,947, just 194 shy of the USC record.
- Jones Jr., a Paul Hornung Award watch list candidate and preseason All-SEC selection, enters the Florida game with 2,542 career kickoff return yards, which leads all active FBS players. He has averaged 24.0 yards per kickoff return for his entire career, which is 25th among active FBS players.
- Jones Jr. led the SEC in kickoff return yards in 2020, racking up 398 on 18 returns. He ranked second in the league in kickoff return average at 22.11. Through three games this season, Jones Jr. ranks second in the SEC and 12th in the FBS, averaging 28.14 yards per kickoff return.
- Jones Jr. has scored a touchdown three different ways during his college career - receiving (4), rushing (1) and kick return (1).

MAYS, GARLAND BROTHERS

- Knoxville natives **Cade Mays** and **Cooper Mays** are starters on the offensive line this season, continuing a family legacy of Vols. Cade and Cooper's father, Kevin, was an All-American SEC guard and offensive captain on the

Vols' 1994 squad. Both Cade and Cooper prepped at Knoxville Catholic where they played together in high school before reuniting last season at Tennessee.

- The Mays brothers have both started in the same game twice at the collegiate level, doing so against No. 6 Florida on Dec. 5, 2020, with Cooper at center and Cade at right guard. They did it again in the 2021 season-opener against Bowling Green with Cooper at center and Cade at right tackle. It marked the first time that the Vols had brothers start in the same game since Ethan Wolf and Eli Wolf both started at tight end in Tennessee's 2017 season opener vs. Georgia Tech.
- **Cade Mays** entered the 2021 season as a preseason first-team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches and media. Cade played two seasons at Georgia where he started 18 games before joining the Vols in the spring of 2020. Cade has played in and started 10 games for the Vols. Six of his starts have come at right guard and four at right tackle. Including his time at Georgia and Tennessee (28 starts), Cade has started 18 games at right guard, six at right tackle, two at left guard and two at left tackle.
- **Kurott Garland** and **Kwauze Garland** are also brothers on the same Vol team for the third straight season. The Conyers, Georgia, natives both lettered in 2020. Kurott has played in 30 career games with six starts, while Kwauze has played in eight contests. The two have seen action together in the same game in each of Tennessee's last five contests. SECONDARY LOADED WITH EXPERIENCE

- Tennessee's secondary is one of the most experienced units on the squad in 2021. The Vols return both of their safeties in senior **Trevon Flowers** and junior **Jaylen McCollough**. Senior **Theo Jackson** serves as the starter at the STAR (nickel) position for the second straight season. The trio has combined to play in 99 games with 48 starts, including 16 starts by Flowers, 15 by Jackson and 17 by McCollough. Flowers was the Vols' leading tackler in the secondary a season ago with 62.
- Senior cornerback **Alontae Taylor**, a preseason All-SEC third-team selection by the media and coaches, is in his fourth straight season as a starter. Off the field, Taylor has played a valuable role in the SEC's return to play after COVID-19. Taylor serves as the Vice Chair of the SEC Football Leadership Council, and he spent a week in Belize in July 2021 as part of the VOLEaders Academy.
- The secondary is coached by a familiar face who returns to Rocky Top in 2021. **Willie Martinez** is in his second stint at Tennessee after coaching the Vols' secondary from 2013-16. Martinez served on **Josh Heupel's** UCF staff from 2018-20. Martinez recruited both Taylor and Jackson.

AL WILSON COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- On Dec. 7, 2021, Tennessee legendary linebacker Al Wilson will be formally inducted into the National Football Foundation (NFF) College Football Hall of Fame.
- Wilson becomes the 25th Vol to be enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame and first since Peyton Manning in 2017. Of the 25 inductees, 21 were enshrined as players and four as coaches. The 25 inductees are the most in the SEC and sixth-most nationally.
- All season long, Tennessee will pay tribute to Wilson with decals on the brick walls of Neyland Stadium even with the 27-yard line, the number Wilson wore. The decals are located at all four quadrants of the field.

Former Oklahoma national champion quarterback and UCF head coach Josh Heupel takes the reins of Tennessee football in 2021. Heupel was officially announced as the Volunteers' 27th head football coach on Jan. 27, 2021, by Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White, who he worked alongside at UCF.

A 2018 National Coach of the Year finalist and dynamic offensive playcaller, Heupel's 28 victories with the Knights ranked among the top 10 in the FBS over a three-year span from 2018-20. The 43-year-old has enjoyed success at every stop of his career dating back to his high school playing days in South Dakota.

Heupel's arrival in Knoxville comes after a triumphant three-year head coaching stretch at UCF, an era that saw the Knights reaffirm themselves as one of college football's most exciting teams. UCF owned a 28-8 overall record and a stellar 20-5 mark in conference play under his watch, while shattering a program record for NFL Draft picks with five Knights earning the call in the spring of 2021.

Under Heupel's watch, UCF was the only team in the FBS to rank among the top five in total offense in each of those three seasons (2018-20), and the Knights were the only program in the nation to average at least 522.7 yards of total offense in each of those years as well. UCF joined Alabama as the only teams to rank among the top eight in the country in passing in each of his last two seasons (2019-20).

Heupel was tabbed as head coach at UCF in December 2017 by White and promptly became one of only three coaches in college football history to lead a team to an undefeated regular season in his first year with them (Chris Petersen at Boise State in 2003 and Larry Coker at Miami in 2001 also accomplished that feat).

In 2018, his squad posted a 12-1 overall record and an 11-0 regular season mark en route to capturing the American Athletic Conference championship and a berth in the Fiesta Bowl. He led UCF to as high as seventh in both the Associated Press Top 25 and Amway Coaches poll, marking the highest regular-season rankings in program history. The Knights finished the year ranked 11th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches' poll.

For his efforts, Heupel was named the 2018 First Year Coach of the Year by the Football Writers Association of America, and he was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year Award, the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

7. Carry the fight to our opponent and keep it there for 60 minutes.

Vols Run Past Falcons, 38-6, To Open Heupel Era

Running backs **Tiyon Evans** and **Jabari Small** each turned in 100-yard nights, as Tennessee scored four touchdowns on the ground and rushed past Bowling Green, 38-6, to open the **Josh Heupel** era in victorious fashion. With a crowd of 84,314 enjoying the opening contest of the 100th year of Neyland Stadium, Shields-Watkins Field, and the 125th season of Vol football, the Big Orange dominated the ground game, 331-32 and averaged 5.2 yards per carry. Evans, a junior, led the way with 120 yards and a score on 16 carries, while Small, a sophomore, recorded 117 yards and a TD on 22 attempts. The efforts by the UT running back duo marked the 21st time in program history the Vols had two 100-yard rushers in a single game. Evans also became the first Tennessee back to eclipse the century mark in his debut since Alvin Kamara carried for 144 yards in Nashville on Sept. 5, 2015, also vs. Bowling Green. In his debut under center for the Big Orange, redshirt junior quarterback **Joe Milton III** ran for two scores and threw for another on a night in which he went 11 of 23 for 139 yards. Milton III guided the Vols to touchdowns on the first two drives, including a 12-play, 66-yard drive to start that culminated with his own 4-yard score. **Theo Jackson** had a career night defensively, registering 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and three pass breakups. UT racked up 11 tackles for loss, while **Da'Jon Terry** and **Tyler Baron** each had a sack. The win was the 850th for Vol football, becoming the 10th program in FBS history to achieve the feat.

Vols Fall in Fierce Fight With Panthers, 41-34

A resilient Tennessee team carried the fight to Pitt for 60 minutes on Saturday afternoon, coming up just short in a 41-34 setback in the Johnny Majors Classic at Neyland Stadium. UT drove deep into Pitt territory with an opportunity to tie the game at 41, but it was stymied on a 4th & 1 rush attempt from the 3-yard line with 6:59 left in the contest. After forcing a three-and-out and a short punt by the Panthers, the Vols were back in business at the Pitt 34. An interception two plays later, however, ended the threat, with the visitors able to move the chains and run out the clock. Redshirt senior quarterback **Hendon Hooker** came off the bench to complete 15 of 21 passes for 188 yards and two scores, and rush nine times for 49 yards for the Big Orange. He led the Vols to their final 21 points after starter **Joe Milton III** left the game to injury in the second quarter and didn't return. Tennessee burst out to a 10-0 lead after the first 15 minutes and was able to weather a second quarter that saw the Panthers outscore the Vols, 27-10. Tennessee struck first, forcing Pitt into a three-and-out and getting a blocked punt by freshman **Christian Charles** to set itself up at the Panther 2-yard line. **Jabari Small**, carding his second touchdown in as many games, carried it over the left side into the end zone on the first play from scrimmage. For the second-straight game, **Theo Jackson** led the Vol defense, tying a career high with 11 tackles and recording one sack and two tackles for loss. **Tyler Baron** added 2.5 tackles for loss, and **Jeremy Banks** had a sack.

Vols Soar Past Golden Eagles, 56-0

Tennessee forced four turnovers and got touchdowns from eight different players, including one on defense, in a 56-0 blowout of Tennessee Tech on Saturday afternoon at Neyland Stadium. Redshirt senior quarterback **Hendon Hooker** got his first start as a Vol and threw for a career-high-tying three touchdowns and carried for another. He ended the day 17 of 25 for 199 yards and was his team's leading rusher with 64 yards on nine carries. Hooker connected for scoring strikes with senior wide receiver **JaVonta Payton** (29 yards), redshirt senior receiver **Velus Jones Jr.** (45 yards) and redshirt junior tight end **Jacob Warren** (1 yard), all in the first half. Tennessee's defense, meanwhile, spent all day frustrating the Golden Eagles, generating four sacks, tallying eight tackles for losses, breaking up seven passes and getting interceptions from four different players with 80 yards of combined return yardage. Senior corner **Alontae Taylor**, junior safety **Jaylen McCollough**, sophomore safety **Tamarion McDonald** and redshirt senior linebacker **Solon Page III** came away with errant Tennessee Tech passes, with Page III returning his 31 yards for a touchdown in the third stanza. Seeing his first action as a Vol, sophomore defensive end **Byron Young** tied for the team lead in tackles (6) with senior defensive lineman **Aubrey Solomon**. UT limited the Golden Eagles to 179 total yards, including only 35 on the ground. Tennessee got out to a 14-0 lead in the opening stanza, getting a short field on both scoring drives, thanks to a nifty, 25-yard punt return from Jones Jr. and later a 16-yard return by McCollough on his first career interception. Hooker and company needed only 25 seconds to generate points after starting at the TTU 33 on their second possession of the afternoon. On the second play of the drive, he found Payton in the corner of the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown pass.
