MEDIA COVERAGE

From the tip of the Panhandle and down through Miami, the University of Florida athletic program attracts statewide interest from newspapers, magazines, television, websites and radio stations. UF holds its fair share of the national spotlight too, as media outlets such as ESPN, USA Today and Sports Illustrated track the progress of not only the nationally ranked football team, but also the careers of the many Gator world-class athletes. Locally, more than dozen media outlets regularly cover the Gators. In addition to daily coverage from the local media, many of the state's larger papers such as the Orlando Sentinel, Palm Beach Post, Miami Herald, Ft. Lauderdale Sun Sentinel, Florida Times Union and the Tampa Bay Times cover the Gator teams. The UF Communications Department also helps student-athletes' hometown media follow the careers of Gators from their area.

ESPN EXPANDING GYMNASTICS COVERAGE

Interest in collegiate gymnastics is growing and ESPN is adding more live events to expand coverage.

Two of Florida's six regular-season televised appearances air live on ESPN2.

ESPN AND THE SEC: BRING CONFERENCE ACTION TO THE NATION

The SEC Network brings 24/7 coverage of Southeastern Conference sports on the cable channel which started in August of 2014. The SEC-ESPN contract runs for 20 seasons, giving the conference unprecedented national exposure.

Jenny Rowland, who swept all possible coaching honors in 2020, begins season 10 as University of Florida's head gymnastics coach. Rowland is the seventh head coach for the Gator program, which is in its 53rd season in 2025.

Rowland brought experiences from the sport's highest level to Florida. She is a former U.S. National Team member and a collegiate All-American. Rowland claimed the 2020 Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) National Coach of the Year award.

Rowland's Coaching Career:

At Florida:

The Gators ranked among the nation's top four teams throughout Rowland's first nine seasons at Florida. The Gators claimed second in the 2022 and 2023 NCAA team finals. The Gators were the only Southeastern Conference team among the 2021 NCAA Championships' Team final, taking fourth overall. The 2020 Gators were 10-0 and ranked No. 2 before the Covid-19 pandemic ended NCAA action for all sports. In NCAA Super Six team final action, the 2016 Gators were fourth and took third in 2017 and 2018. Seven NCAA team final appearances since 2016 equals the national high.

The Gators are seven-time Southeastern Conference champions under Rowland – winning the 2016, 2022 & 2023 SEC Championship meets and 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024 SEC regular-season crowns. Florida set the SEC unbeaten record at 26-0-1 (started March 2019 – Feb 10, 2023).

Rowland shared the 2016 SEC Coach of the Year honor. In 2020, Rowland swept all coaching honors – SEC, Region 5 and WCGA National Coach of the Year. She again was the SEC Coach of the Year in 2021 and three such honors is the most for any league coach in their opening six seasons.

Since 2016, 22 Gators collected 176 All-America honors (at NCAA Championships and WCGA regular-season). Five Gators claimed 11 NCAA event titles - Bridget Sloan (2016 NCAA all-around, uneven bars, balance beam), Alex McMurtry (2017 all-around, uneven bars; 2018 vault), Alicia Boren (2019 floor exercise), Trinity Thomas (2022 all-around, uneven bars, floor exercise) and Leanne Wong (2024 bars). Sloan (2016), McMurtry (2017) and Thomas (2022 & 2023) claimed the Honda Award, given annually to the top collegiate female athlete in each of 12 sports.

The Gators also excelled in the classroom, with the team's cumulative 3.72 grade point average for the spring 2020 semester ranking among the best ever among all Florida teams. The 2017 NCAA Elite 90 Award went to McMurtry, an honor given to the student-athlete with the highest grade point average at each of the 90 NCAA Championship sites. McMurtry (2018) and Thomas (2024) earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and Grace McLaughlin received a \$10,000 postgraduate scholarship as the 2018 Brad Davis SEC Community Service Award winner.

She earned her 200th win in the March 15, 2024 quad. Her overall record now stands at 213-43-1 and Rowland is the only current SEC coach with 200 wins.

Rowland served on the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Committee (2019-23).

At Auburn:

Rowland came to Florida after spending five seasons at Auburn. She joined the Auburn coaching staff as an assistant coach in October of 2010 and was elevated to associate head coach in March of 2013. Rowland worked with all aspects of the Auburn gymnastics program, coordinating all of the program's community outreach efforts and interactions on campus as well as playing an integral role in recruiting and in-gym activities.

She was named co-National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2015 after helping Auburn reach the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years.

She served as the lead balance beam coach, as the Tigers put up the top beam totals of 2015 Southeastern Conference and NCAA Semifinal II competition. Three Tigers earned beam All-America honors in 2015. She also worked with the Tigers' floor exercise and routine construction. Rowland, who is a Category 3 International Brevet judge, offered her judging expertise through video breakdown of Auburn's routines.

Coaching Career Start in Sooner State:

Rowland coached Elite gymnasts at Bart Conner Gymnastics Academy in Norman, Oklahoma, for five years and then joined the Oklahoma coaching staff in June of 2001. At OU, she helped coach the Sooners to the 2004 Big XIII title, three-time team NCAA qualifiers (2004-06) and three Big XIII Gymnasts of the Year.

As a Gymnast:

During her gymnastics career, Rowland was a USA National Team member from 1985-1990 and was part of the U.S.'s 1989 World Championships team. During her collegiate career, she earned All-America honors for the uneven bars in 1993 for Arizona State.

After retiring from competition, she returned to her home state, enrolling at the University of Oklahoma to finish her degree.

More Rowland Info:

She graduated from Oklahoma with a bachelor's degree in health and sports sciences in 1997. Rowland married Garon Rowland, an All-American gymnast for the Sooners, and the couple has two daughters – Ella and Emmy.

Rowland is a Category 3 International Brevet level judge. She served on the judging panel for the 2008, 2012 and 2016 U.S. Olympic Trials.

ADRIAN BURDE

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



Adrian Burde (pronounced bur-DAY) enters his 19th season with the Florida gymnastics program in the fall of 2024. He coaches vault and tumbling, as well as aids in recruiting and team conditioning. He was elevated to Associate Head Coach in summer of 2022.

Burde's Coaching Career:

At Florida:

Burde has coached vault and tumbling for the Gators since 2011. A Gator has claimed three NCAA vault titles since 2011 (Marissa King/2011, Kytra Hunter/2012, Alex McMurtry/2018). Florida has also taken Southeastern Conference event titles in 11 of the last 13 SEC Championships (Kennedy Baker 2016 vault & 2017 floor; Sloane Blakely 2023 vault; Ashanée Dickerson, 2011 floor exercise; Hunter, 2012 & 2015 vault; 2013, 2014 & 2015 floor; McMurtry 2015 & 2018 vault & 2017 floor; Bridget Sloan, 2013 floor; Trinity Thomas 2019 vault, 2022 vault, floor; 2023 floor.

Florida's 10 advancing to the final five NCAA floor exercise finals (individual event championship format ceased after 2015) is the nation's top total in that time span and UF's nine in the NCAA vault finals is the second highest. Three Gators won NCAA floor since 2015 – Hunter (2015), Alicia Boren (2019) and Thomas (2022). Three of the top four floor totals in NCAA Championship history belong to the Gators – 49.75 (2022 semi), 49.725 (2013 Super Six) and 49.7125 (2022 team final) and Florida's 49.875 in the 2014 home opener is the second-highest floor total in NCAA history.

Nine Gators matched Florida's vault and floor exercise records in the last 11 seasons. Hunter led the nation in 2014 with six 10.0 marks (two vault; four floor) and Sloan also turned in a 10.0 floor score. Sloan opened the 2015 season with a perfect vault

mark and McMurtry also posted a vault 10.0. Baker collected 10.0 floor marks in 2016 and 2017. McMurtry added another vault 10.0 and earned her first floor 10.0 in 2017. She also scored a vault 10.0 in 2018. Thomas earned 12 floor 10.0s and her final of five vault 10.0s in the 2023 NCAA Team Final pushed her total to a NCAA record of 28 career 10.0s. Leanne Wong's floor 10.0 in 2024 completed her Gym Slam. Another current Gator - Sloane Blakely (floor) - also owns a 10.0.

Burde coached the Gator uneven bar performers when he joined the program and his impact was evident early. The 2007 Gators opened the season with the team's then third-highest uneven bars team total ever of 49.575 at the Super Six Challenge. The UF bar record was reset to 49.70 versus Kentucky on Feb. 16. The Gators held the No. 1 position in the national bar rankings for the final nine weeks of the regular season. Florida was again among the national uneven bars leaders in Burde's second season. Florida's total of 49.625 set in the Gators' Link to Pink meet was the nation's highest uneven bars total of the 2008 season and ranks third all-time for the Gators. Two Gators advanced to the 2009 NCAA bar final, with then sophomore Alicia Goodwin sharing third overall – matching the then-second-highest UF bar finish in the program's history. All-America honors were earned by three Gator bar performers in 2010, with two advancing to the event final.

At Nebraska:

Burde was part of the University of Nebraska staff for the 2002 through 2006 seasons. At Nebraska, he served as the vault and floor coach and conditioning coordinator.

Burde helped lead the Cornhuskers to four NCAA Super Six team finals (2002, '03, '05, '06). He saw NU athletes earn 19 All-America honors in the floor and vault events. It was at Nebraska that Burde coached Canadian Richelle Simpson, the 2003 NCAA all-around and floor exercise champion. He served as her coach at the 2003 World Championships in Anaheim, California, and the 2003 Pan American Games.

Burde began his coaching career in his native Romania in 1994. He was a Junior National team coach until 1999, coaching the Romanian Junior National Team.

He coached Romanian Alexandra Eremia from 1997-99, who later was a member of the 2004 Olympic gold medal team and was awarded the bronze medal on the balance beam. Burde also coached Florica Leonida during the same time, who along with Eremia, earned a team silver medal at the 2003 World Championships.

Burde was a member of the Romanian Junior National Team from 1988 to 1992. He joined the French club team Aix les Bains in 1992 and captured the all-around title at the 1994 French national meet. While competing, Burde also helped coach younger gymnasts at the club.

Owen Field is in his 10th season with the Gators in 2024-25. He coaches uneven bars, as well as aids in Florida recruiting, team conditioning, social media/creative content, meet day operations and equipment needs/maintenance. Field also picks up frequent flier miles when traveling to coach Gators participating in national team camps or

national/international competitions. He was elevated to Associate Head Coach in summer of 2024.

Field's Coaching Career:

At Florida:

A national high four NCAA uneven bars titles since 2016 were claimed by Gators - Bridget Sloan (2016), Alex McMurtry (2017), Trinity Thomas (2022) and Leanne Wong (2024). The Gators' lineup is a regular among the nation's top four uneven bars rankings, including making appearances at No. 1 in four of the last six seasons.

McMurtry was the nation's only gymnast to turn in multiple 10.0 bars marks in 2016 and she added two more in 2017 - including in the NCAA Super Six team final. She was nearly perfect again in 2018 NCAA Super Six action with her fifth 9.975 bars mark of the season. Trinity Thomas earned her first collegiate 10.0 on the uneven bars in 2020 and twice found perfection on the event in 2021. Her postseason 10.0s in 2022 (NCAA Regionals) and 2023 (SEC Championships) completed 'Season Slams' (10.0 in each apparatus). Florida was the nation's only program with multiple gymnasts earning uneven bars 10.0s in 2023, with Kayla DiCello (2), Thomas (1) and Leanne Wong (2) earning five total. Wong added another bars 10.0 in 2024.

Nine Gators collected 16 uneven bars All-America honors in NCAA Championships competition since 2016.

Field shared the 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020 WCGA Region 5 Assistant Coach of the Year honor with Adrian Burde.

At Nebraska:

Before joining Florida, Field was with the University of Nebraska women's gymnastics program, serving roles as manager or volunteer coach during his six years with the Huskers. When he was a volunteer coach, Field worked alongside head coach Dan Kendig to coach the Huskers' on uneven bars. He also assisted with the Huskers' strength and conditioning program.

While Field was with Nebraska, the Huskers advanced to the NCAA Championships four times (2015, 2014, 2012, 2010), reaching the Super Six in 2014. Nebraska gymnastics picked up a total of 12 All-America honors in either uneven bars or all-around while Field was with the Huskers. A Husker won conference bars titles in 2012, 2013 and 2015.

Field also served as Southern Utah's volunteer coach for the 2011 season.

Field was the club coach at UNL, the Nebraska School of Gymnastics, and was a coach at the Southern Utah Gymnastics Academy. Field has coached at several gymnastics camps, including Lake Owen Gymnastics Camp, Flipfest and Woodward Gymnastics Camp.

Field received his bachelor's degree in psychology from Nebraska in 2015.

He was born in Sheboygan, Wis., on July 11, 1990. Field and Makayla Thompson married in May of 2022.

JEREMY MIRANDA

ASSISTANT COACH



Jeremy Miranda was elevated to Assistant Coach in summer of 2023 after 16 seasons as Florida's Volunteer Coach. He continues to oversee all creative aspects musically and choreographically for Florida floor routines as well as aid in the team's coaching and recruiting.

His 17 years at Florida have included 15 NCAA Championship appearances, three NCAA team titles,

47 All-America honors earned in NCAA Championships' floor competition (including the 2015, 2019 and 2022 NCAA champion), 11 Southeastern Conference floor champions, 20 NCAA Regional floor champions, and 210 regular season floor titles - including all 10 possible titles in 2020. Also, three of the top four floor totals in NCAA Championship history belong to the Gators - 49.75 (2022 semi), 49.725 (2013 Super Six) and 49.7125 (2022 team final).

Prior to joining the Gator program in the summer of 2007, Miranda worked with the University of Nebraska women's gymnastics team for the 2006 and 2007 seasons. His choreography and assistance to the coaching staff helped the Huskers to the Super Six Championship both seasons. In addition, Miranda also served as club coach for the Nebraska School of Gymnastics from 2005-07, coaching classes ranging from preschool to elite.

Miranda spent several summers as master staff instructor at the world-renowned Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pennsylvania, and additionally has served on the coaching staff at multiple summer camps and clinics across the country.

A notable gymnast in his own right, Miranda was a level 10 gymnast who culminated his gymnastics career with a co-national championship finish on the floor exercise at the 2005 Junior Olympic National Championship, as well as an eighth-place finish on the vault.

A native of Chamberlain, S.D., Miranda graduated summa cum laude from the University of Florida, receiving a bachelor of fine arts degree in dance performance during the summer of 2010. Miranda has experience as a professional dancer and choreographer in New York City and appeared in many live stage productions such as Hello Dolly!, Cats, A Chorus Line, West Side Story and Mary Poppins as well as TV appearances on Orange is the New Black, The Following, Law and Order SVU, The Blacklist and SMASH. He has worked with the shows for Norwegian Cruise Lines, Disney Cruise Lines and Holland America Cruise Lines, worked in the revamp of Donn Arden's Jubilee! at Bally's in Las Vegas and worked with the shows at Walt Disney World.

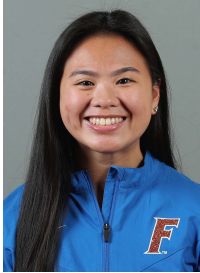

GYMNASTICS SCORING

In collegiate team competition, six gymnasts perform on each of the four apparatus. The five best scores per event are added together to make up the cumulative team total.

At least two judges are required to evaluate an athlete's performance. Choices of elements "up to the competition level" are defined by basic requirements for each event. Scores are averaged for final mark.

Other deductions are taken, usually up to and no more than 0.3, for such things as bent arms and legs, or separation of legs.

VAULT



Vaulting requires speed, quickness and explosive power. Vaults are divided into three categories: handspring, Tsukahara and round-off entry.

Deductions are taken for technical errors in the areas of preflight (approach to the horse) and after flight (distance and height) from the horse to the point of landing.

Since 2020 Season:

Start values for uneven bars, balance beam and floor exercise starts at 9.4. The gymnasts are required to gain six-tenths in bonus on those events to get to 10.0. In previous years, the start value for these events was 9.5, requiring gymnasts to earn five-tenths bonus.

UNEVEN BARS



Good composition includes elements showing great amplitude, bar changes, grip changes and direction changes. Pauses for concentration, intermediate swings and uncharacteristic elements are to be avoided. After a fall, the gymnast must resume the exercise within 30 seconds

Requirements for the bars (failure to complete requirements results in .2 start value deduction) include:

- 1) Minimum of 2 bar changes
- 2) 2 flight elements, minimum of 2 different C's or D and B (not to include dismount)
- 3) One element with long axis turn, minimum of "C" (not to include dismount)
- 4) "C" dismount with the following modification: "C" dismount immediately preceded by same two A or B elements = .10 deduction (not .20)

BALANCE BEAM



The beam routine should be composed of elements from the following groups: acrobatic elements with and without flight, turns and leaps. The balance beam is 16 feet long, four feet high and only four inches wide. The entire routine must last between 30 seconds and one and a half minutes. A bell is rung at the 1:20 mark of the routine. If the gymnast does not complete the routine at the end of one and a half minutes, an overtime penalty of .10 is deducted from the score. There is no under time deduction.

Requirements for the beam (failure to complete requirements results in .2 start value deduction) include:

- Acro series: Minimum of two (2) flight elements, one element must be a minimum of C with or without hand support (both elements must start and finish on the beam).
- Dance or dance acro series with a minimum of two (2) elements, dance element C or higher.
- A leap or jump requiring 180 degree split (this may be part of the acro/dance series).
- Minimum of 360 degree turn. No hand support permitted.
- Minimum of C dismount or B dismount preceded by and directly connected to any D acro element.

FLOOR EXERCISE



The composition of the exercise must show harmony between gymnastics and acrobatic elements, create dynamic changes in rhythm and levels and show versatile use of the entire floor area. The exercise must contain two different acrobatic series and one series must contain at least two saltos. The musical accompaniment is to be instrumental only. The exercise must last between 1:10 and 1:30 minutes. The "competition level" for floor exercise are defined by the basic standards (failure to meet competition level is a .10 deduction).

Requirements for floor (failure to complete requirements results in .2 start value deduction) include:

- 5) One acro series with two (2) saltos (same or different), OR two directly connected saltos.
- 6) Three different saltos within the exercise.
- 7) Dance passage with a minimum of two (2) elements (*leaps* - one must be off of one foot that includes a 180 degree split; *jumps*)
- 8) Salto performed as the last isolated salto or within the last salto connection must be minimum "C".

2024 SEASON RECAP

Jan. 12 Home Quad

Preseason No. 2 Gators gymnastics opened 2024 in front of a sellout crowd with a home quad win versus Fisk, George Washington and Talladega College for Equality Night sponsored by Publix.

Florida posted a 197.10 followed by George Washington (194.55), Fisk (189.95) and Talladega (187.75).

The Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center crowd of 8,775 is the third-highest season opener in the program's 52-season history. It is Florida's 10th consecutive sellout.

Florida gymnasts swept the meet event titles, including freshman **Anya Pilgrim** winning at least a share of four events – including taking the all-around title. A near-perfect 9.975 on balance beam by senior **Ellie Lazzari** was the evening's high mark across all teams Friday.

Pilgrim's all-around winning total of 39.525 is the highest ever for a Gator freshman in the first meet of her career. This is the third consecutive season a Gator began with an all-around win with a then-freshman high in a season opener. **Sloane Blakely** won the 2022 opener with UF's then collegiate opening leading total of 39.45. **Kayla DiCello** took the 2023 season-opening quad win at 39.475.

The two Gators who competed at the 2023 World Championships – Pilgrim (Barbados) and **Leanne Wong** (U.S.) – opened the season by sharing the vault win at 9.875. Pilgrim used another 9.875 to take the uneven bars win.

The night's leading score across all events – a near-perfect 9.975 – matched senior **Ellie Lazzari's** collegiate best. Nguyen and Pilgrim turned in consecutive 9.925s to share the floor exercise win.

Jan. 19 at No. 12 Auburn

No. 7 Florida gymnastics opened 2024 Southeastern Conference action with a 197.325-197.025 win at No. 12 Auburn in front of a sellout Neville Arena crowd of 9,121.

Florida junior All-American **Leanne Wong** won three events Friday. Wong won her all-around debut (39.625) and also used 9.95s to win uneven bars and floor exercise.

Florida was led on vault by its opening (**Bri Edwards**) and anchor (**Pilgrim**) performers. Both turned in then collegiate bests of 9.875 to share second overall. Sophia Groth opened Auburn's lineup with a 9.90 for her Yurchenko full to win the vault title.

The Gators led by 0.350 at the meet's midway point.

Sloane Blakely and Wong tied for third at 9.875 on balance beam to close the meet. Auburn's Gabby McLaughlin won the beam title at 9.95 and Cassie Stevens took second at 9.90.

In her first appearance in all events of 2024, Wong claimed her 10th career all-around win at 39.625.

Jan. 26 vs No. 6 Alabama

No. 8 Florida gymnastics was edged on the final rotation by No. 6 Alabama 197.575-197.425 in front of a sellout Exactech Arena crowd for the Gators Alumni Night presented by GFL.

Florida trailed Alabama by 0.15 at the meet's midway point. After a season-best performance on balance beam, Florida erased that margin to even the team standings heading into the final rotation. UF's floor exercise scores couldn't keep pace with Alabama, who closed the meet by also tallying a season-best on balance beam to claim the win by 0.15.

Florida was led by **Victoria Nguyen's** near-perfect 9.975 on vault on its opening event. Alabama's Lilly Hudson used the nation's third vault 10.0 to win the event title.

In her first uneven bars performance since the 2021 NCAA team final, senior **Ellie Lazzari** led the Gators on the event with a collegiate-best 9.925. Wong anchored the lineup with a 9.90. Lazzari shared her first collegiate uneven bars win with Alabama's final two performers – Makarri Doggette and Luisa Blanco.

A season-best 49.525 on balance team moved Florida into a tie with Alabama after the third rotation. Florida used four marks of 9.9 or better toward its beam total, led by back-to-back 9.925s by **Sloane Blakely** and Pilgrim.

Blakely set her season to share the floor title with Alabama's Lilly Hudson at 9.925.

Alabama's Blanco used a season-high 39.70 to win Friday's all-around. Wong was second (39.575) while Pilgrim placed third (39.525).

Feb. 2 at No. 21 Georgia

With just a tenth advantage heading into the final rotation, used a solid balance beam performance to take a 197.475 – 197.30 Groundhog's Day win over Georgia in the Stegeman Coliseum.

For the second consecutive week, senior **Ellie Lazzari** led the Gators on uneven bars, this time with a 9.90. That mark tied for second with Georgia's JaFree Scott and Holly Snyder. Georgia's Lily Smith anchored the lineup with a 9.95 to win the event.

It was a season-high 49.45 for Florida on vault. The Gators who competed at the 2023 World Championships – Pilgrim and Wong – shared the win at 9.925. Freshman **Skylar Draser** led off the lineup with a collegiate-best 9.90 for third to complete the UF vault sweep.

Florida was led on floor exercise by 9.90s from both **Victoria Nguyen** and **Morgan Hurd**. That mark set Hurd's collegiate best. Those two shared second behind Georgia's Lily Smith, who won the evening floor title at 9.925.

UF's lead was just a tenth heading into the final rotation.

Florida opened its beam set with a 9.85 by Draser. The next three marks all were 9.9 or better – **Sloane Blakely** (9.925), Pilgrim (9.90) and Lazzari (9.925). Blakely and Lazzari shared the balance beam win and Pilgrim tied for third with UGA's Scott. The GymDogs' floor scores couldn't keep pace on the final rotation as UF nudged out the winning margin to 0.175.

Smith claimed the all-around win at 39.60 and UF's Pilgrim was second with a collegiate-best 39.55.

Feb. 9 versus No. 13 Arkansas

Powered by a vivid sellout crowd, No. 6 Florida gymnastics used a season-high to take a 197.85-196.05 win over No. 13 Arkansas in front of an Exactech Arena crowd of 8,823 in the 18th Annual Gators Link to **Pink** presented by UF Health.

Gator **Leanne Wong** wowed the crowd with her 10.0 to anchor the uneven bars lineup. It was her first 10.0 of her junior season and the seventh as a Gator. Wong also used a season-best 39.725 to lead a Gator all-around sweep. **Anya Pilgrim** was second at 39.60, matching the nation's 2024 freshman high.

Freshman **Danie Ferris'** collegiate best of 9.95 took the vault win. Senior **Victoria Nguyen** and Wong shared the balance beam win at 9.925 with Arkansas' Kalyxta Gamiao. The Razorbacks' Frankie Price won the floor exercise at 9.95. Sophomore Lori Brubach equaled her collegiate floor best of 9.90 for the second time of 2024 to lead UF on floor.

Feb. 16 at Missouri at the Lou Quad

A then season-best 197.925 elevated No. 6 Florida to win the Missouri at the Lou quad meet held in front of 5,995 who braved the snow to be at the Family Arena Friday evening.

No. 14 Missouri was second at 197.475, followed by No. 27 Illinois (196.55) and Lindenwood (194.825).

Uneven bars opened competition for Florida. For the second consecutive week, freshman **Gabby Disidore**

raised her collegiate best – this time to 9.925 to lead the Gators. Freshman **Skylar Draser** led off the Gators' balance beam lineup with a collegiate-best 9.90. Two other Gators – Pilgrim and **Ellie Lazzari** - earned 9.9 beam marks. Wong anchored with a near-perfect 9.975 to up Florida's beam total to a season-high 49.55.

All marks used toward Florida's season-best 49.60 floor exercise total were 9.90 or better. **Victoria Nguyen** led off the lineup with a 9.90 and Pilgrim also earned the same score. It was season-bests for the bottom half of UF's lineup as **Sloane Blakely** and **Payton Richards** turned in marks of 9.925. Wong anchored with a 9.95.

Blakely led the Gators on their final event, winning vault with a season-best 9.925. **Danie Ferris** and Wong closed the lineup with a pair of 9.90s.

Florida swept the all-around, with Wong winning her third title of 2024 after matching her season-high of 39.725 for the second consecutive week. Blakely posted a season-high 39.55 for second and Pilgrim closed the sweep at 39.525.

Feb. 23 versus No. 2 LSU

A big win for Florida gymnastics enlarged to a league title about an hour and half after the final roar of the sellout Exactech Arena crowd of 8,884.

With No. 5 Florida's 198.15-197.95 upset win over No. 2 LSU combined with No. 16 Arkansas' win over No. 6 Kentucky, the Gators earned at least a share of the 2024 Southeastern Conference regular-season title. It is Florida's sixth consecutive SEC regular-season title.

The win was hard-earned, as Florida headed into the final rotation trailing by 0.15.

Florida's finish on floor exercise included collegiate or season bests from its first four competitors. Then UF's fifth performer, Super Senior **Payton Richards**, opened her floor routine with a hit double layout but stopped the routine due to injury. Florida needed a solid routine from its final performer to earn the win.

Junior All-American **Leanne Wong's** walk-off floor 10.0 not only elevated her team to the win, it finished off Wong's 'Gym Slam' [a 10.0 in each apparatus].

Floor was one of four event titles Wong won at least a share, including setting the nation's then 2024 high of 39.875 to win her fourth all-around title of the season.

Five consecutive 9.9 or better marks tallied to Florida's season-best vault total (49.60). The two Gators who competed at the 2023 World Championships – **Anya Pilgrim** and Wong – led UF with season-bests of 9.95. LSU's Amari Drayton won the event at 9.975.

Some execution deductions dinged the Gators uneven bars scores as Florida tallied its second-lowest total (49.225) of the season. Wong anchored the bars lineup with the evening's winning mark of 9.95.

Two near-perfect 9.975s from Pilgrim and Wong won balance beam as UF posted its season-high of 49.625. Junior **Victoria Nguyen** set her collegiate beam best of 9.95.

Nguyen and Pilgrim opened Florida's floor lineup by matching their collegiate bests of 9.925. Freshman **Kaylee Bluffstone**, making her first lineup appearance

in front of the home crowd, equaled her best of 9.875 for the second consecutive week. Junior **Sloane Blakely** posted a season high of a near-perfect 9.975 before Richards' shortened routine due to injury. A hit routine was needed from UF's anchor and Wong delivered with her first collegiate floor 10.0. The 49.70 for floor was Florida third season-best team total of the evening. LSU's Aleah Finnegan also posted a floor 10.0 to share the event title with Wong.

In addition to Wong's all-around win, Pilgrim was third with the nation's top 2024 freshman total of 39.65. Florida's other two all-arounders – Blakely (39.60 – season best) and Victoria Nguyen (39.55 – collegiate best) also turned in impressive all-around performances among an evening with some of the nation's best all-around totals. LSU's Haleigh Bryant was second at 39.75 and Kiya Johnson turned in a 39.55.



Florida clinched its sixth consecutive Southeastern Conference regular-season title with win at Kentucky.

March 3 at No. 6 Kentucky

UF's 198.225-198.10 win over No. 6 Kentucky in front of 10,069 at the Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center gave Florida sole possession of its sixth consecutive Southeastern Conference regular-season title.

SEC TITLE CLINCHED:

- Florida claims its 16th SEC gymnastics title and fifth consecutive (1982, '83, '84, '85, '89, '07, '10, '12, '13, 16, '19, '20, '21, '22, '23, '24). This is the eighth year for the awarding of a regular-season SEC gymnastics title. From 1981-2016, the winner at the SEC Championship meet was considered the league champion.

For the third consecutive year, the Florida-Kentucky dual meet included a SEC regular-season title storyline. And in the 2024 version, there were three teams involved in that narrative.

Florida clinched at least a share of its sixth consecutive title with its win last week versus No. 2 LSU. Two other teams had the opportunity to share the 2024 title with wins in their SEC regular-season finale. LSU claimed a home win over Alabama on Friday. Kentucky needed a win over Florida to have three teams tied at the top with 5-2 records.

To claim sole possession of the 2024 title, Florida needed to come back after trailing the Wildcats by 0.25 at the meet's midpoint.

Florida's season-best floor exercise total of 49.725 – which included a 10.0 by freshman **Anya Pilgrim** – put the Gators up 0.30 heading into the final rotation. What the team needed to seal the win was a solid balance

beam performance as the Wildcats rotated to floor exercise, their strongest scoring event.

The Gators got just that, posting their second-highest beam total (49.575) of the season to hold off Kentucky's season-high performance on floor exercise.

Leanne Wong anchored the beam lineup with a near-perfect 9.975. She used the same mark to win uneven bars. Wong won all-around at 39.775 – her fifth of the season and fourth consecutive.

Pilgrim made it a one-two Florida all-around finish, as she upped her collegiate high and the nation's top freshman total to 39.675 to take second. Pilgrim led Florida's season-best floor total (49.725) with her first 10.0. She shared the floor win with UK's Raena Worley.

UK's Makenzie Wilson won vault with the day's first 10.0. Collegiate bests of 9.95 by two freshmen – **Skylar Draser** and **Danie Ferris** – led the Gators on vault.

March 9 at Ameritas Master's Classic

No. 4 Florida gymnastics won the Ameritas Master's Classic quad meet held in front of 3,842 at the Bob Devaney Center.

The Gators took the win at 197.70, followed by No. 27 Nebraska at 197.15, Lindenwood (196.325) and Eastern Michigan (193.600).

A Gator took three of the five meet event titles:

The all-around total was a career high for Nguyen and her first win since the opening meet of her freshman season at Georgia in 2021.

March 15 Senior Night Home Quad

No. 4 Florida gymnastics closed regular-season action with a win in Gators Senior Night presented by Auto ER in front of 8,133 at the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Gators took the win at 197.90 – the team's fourth-highest mark of 2024. No. 18 North Carolina State was second at 196.825, followed by Iowa State (195.825) and Long Island University (192.025).

Freshmen led off and anchored Florida's vault lineup with the team's leading marks. **Skylar Draser** started off the competition with a 9.95 on vault – equaling her collegiate best to claim her first collegiate event win. **Danie Ferris'** anchoring 9.925 was just off her collegiate best. Another freshman, **Anya Pilgrim**, also scored a vault 9.90.

Junior **Leanne Wong** was *oh-so-close* to perfection in her only event of the evening. She led Florida on uneven bars with the winning mark of 9.975.

A pair of 9.925s by Blakely and freshman **Alyssa Arana** shared the balance beam win Friday. Blakely's mark equals her season best for the third time. Arana's mark in the anchor position equals the second-highest by a Gator in their beam lineup debut.

Marks of 9.9 or better were used toward UF's 49.60, the team's third-highest floor exercise total of the season. A quad of 9.925s by Blakely, **Morgan Hurd**, **Ellie Lazzari** and Nguyen led the Gators to share second in the individual floor standings.

Blakely's season-best 39.625 won her second all-around title of her career. Nguyen was second at 39.475.

March 23 at SEC Championships

Florida finished fourth at the 2024 Southeastern Conference meet Saturday in front of a Smoothie King Center crowd of 9,878.

LSU won the meet at 198.075 – the Tigers fifth SEC meet title and first since the event was last contested in the Big Easy in 2019. Alabama was second at 197.75, followed by Kentucky (197.60), **Florida** (197.30), Missouri (197.275), Arkansas (197.05), Auburn (196.775) and Georgia (196.075).

The competition was sure to be tight, with each of the SEC Championship meet's second session teams bringing a top-7 national ranking. Entering the final rotation, Kentucky held a slight 0.025 lead but LSU's meet-high 49.675 on floor exercise propelled the Tigers to the title.

Just 0.075 separated the top four seeded teams after the opening rotation of the meet's second session. Two Gator juniors turned in balance beam marks of 9.9 or better – **Sloane Blakely** (9.925) and **Leanne Wong** (9.90). Blakely's mark equals her season best for the fourth time and also for the second consecutive meet. Florida posted a 49.40 to stand fourth after the first event.

Florida didn't make up any ground on floor exercise, posting a season low 49.175. Wong anchored Florida's floor set with a team-high 9.90. Florida trailed the mid-point leaders LSU and Kentucky by 0.35.

On vault, steps on landing dinged several Gator marks as the team tallied a 49.275. **Victoria Nguyen** and **Anya Pilgrim** led with a 9.90, which tied for fourth overall.

Florida's 49.45 on uneven bars shared the high bars team total for the day. Two Gators turned in 9.925s – Wong and Nguyen – to finish among a seven-way tie for third on the event. Pilgrim also posted a 9.90. It was a season-best mark for Nguyen, who set her collegiate bars high of 9.95 at the 2023 SEC Championship meet.

LSU's Haleigh Bryant won all-around at 39.80. Wong tied for fourth at 39.60 and Nguyen shared sixth at 39.525.

April 4 in NCAA Regional Round 2

No. 4 seed Florida gymnastics win in NCAA Regional Second Round action propelled the team to the final back in the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center

The Gators tallied the top total across both of the Gainesville Regional second-round sessions. Florida's 197.925 equaled the team's third-highest total of the season.

A blind draw determined the competition order for regional competition. The Gators opened with five consecutive vault marks of 9.9 or better. Senior **Victoria Nguyen** shared the event win at 9.95 while freshman **Skylar Draser** started the lineup off with a 9.925. The

Gators got 9.9s from **Anya Pilgrim** and **Danie Ferris** plus junior **Leanne Wong**.

When Pilgrim stuck the landing on her half in half out dismount, the Exactech Arena knew a good score was coming. Her collegiate best 9.975 led UF on uneven bars to share the win with another freshman, Georgia's Lily Smith. Wong anchored with a 9.9 to finish a 49.30 set that was tested by an early lineup miss. In just her third appearance in the Gators bars lineup, Draser turned in a collegiate-best 9.85.

Florida led Georgia by 0.125 at the midpoint.

A six-for-six balance beam set sent Florida into the final rotation with a 0.30 lead over Missouri. Senior **Ellie Lazzari** anchored with a 9.95 – second only this season to the 9.975 she opened the campaign with in January. Three other marks of 9.9 or better helped Florida equal its second-highest total (49.575) of the season – 9.925 by Pilgrim and Wong plus Draser's collegiate-best 9.90 to start the lineup off.

Four marks of 9.9 or better helped the Gators tally the day's top floor total (49.475). Nguyen and Wong led the team with 9.925 with **Sloane Blakely** and Lazzari each earning 9.9s.

A season-high five Gators competed as all-arounders Friday. Wong was third overall at 39.65 and Nguyen was fourth (39.55). Draser was sixth with a collegiate-best 39.50.

April 7 Regional Final

A season-best of 198.325 posted in the NCAA Regional winning effort propelled No. 4 Florida gymnastics to the NCAA Championships.

Florida and Utah advanced to the NCAA Championships with top two team finishes. The Gators won the Gainesville Regional at 198.325, advancing to the program's 40th NCAA Championship in the 42 year history of the event. Utah kept its record of appearing in every NCAA event by claiming the second advancing spot with a 197.575 team score. Missouri was third (197.325) and Michigan State took fourth (196.625).

All of the top seeds at each of the nation's four region sites opened final competition on balance beam.

Florida opened the meet with its second-highest beam total of 2024. Five marks of 9.9 or better went toward the 49.60 total. Senior **Ellie Lazzari** anchored the set with a team high 9.95. **Sloane Blakely** and **Victoria Nguyen** earned 9.925s while freshmen **Skylar Draser** and **Anya Pilgrim** added 9.9s.

For the first time this season, all six in Florida's floor exercise lineup earned a 9.9 or better as UF turned in its third-highest total (49.65) of 2024. Pilgrim and **Leanne Wong** – led with winning marks of 9.95. Collegiate bests of 9.925 were earned by Nguyen and freshman **Danie Ferris** with 9.9s by Blakely and Lazzari.

The Gators tallied a 49.575 on vault for both days of NCAA Regional action – the second-highest UF total for the season. A trio of 9.925s by Draser, Wong and Lazzari led with 9.9s by Ferris and Nguyen rounding out Florida's scoring routines. Lazzari's 9.925 set her collegiate best.

That's just what UF got, posting its second-highest uneven bars total (49.50) of 2024. Wong and Pilgrim

each turned in a team-high 9.925 with Draser adding a collegiate-best 9.9.

The top four all-around scores of the day came from the Gator quad. Lazzari eclipsed her collegiate best to share the win with Pilgrim at 39.65. Right behind that duo was Nguyen and Wong, who shared third at 39.60.

April 18 at NCAA Semifinal

No. 4 Florida gymnastics claimed a berth in the NCAA Championships team final after taking second in the second semifinal at Dickie's Arena.

The top two teams at the NCAA Gainesville Regional both move ahead to the NCAA Championships team final – Utah (197.9375) and Florida (197.875). Top-seed Oklahoma was forced to count multiple misses tonight and did not advance to defend its title after finishing third at 196.6625. Alabama rounded out the second semifinal at 195.4125.

Florida was assigned floor exercise to open the second semifinal. Junior **Leanne Wong** anchored with a team-high 9.9125 while freshman **Danie Ferris** posted a 9.90. **Sloane Blakely** earned 9.8875 while marks of 9.875 from **Victoria Nguyen** and **Anya Pilgrim** added to Florida's team total of 49.45.

It was hit after hit as the Gators went 1-2-3 in the second semifinal vault standings. Wong hit her Podkopayeva to lead all in the evening semifinal with a 9.9375. For the second consecutive meet, senior **Ellie Lazzari** hit a collegiate-best 9.925 to take second. Pilgrim posted a 9.9125 to share third overall in the semi and fellow freshman **Skylar Draser** started the lineup off with a 9.875. Nguyen and Ferris also earned 9.85s as UF posted the day's leading vault total of 49.50.

The Gators put aside a mid-lineup miss to hit its closing three uneven bars routines. Wong anchored to share the winning bars mark with Oklahoma's Audrey Davis at 9.965. The Gators broke their team corral celebrating Nguyen's 9.9125 routine. Pilgrim hit for a 9.90 while marks of 9.85 by Blakely and 9.825 from Draser added in to Florida's bars total of 49.45.

Blakely matched her season balance beam best of 9.925 to lead UF on its closing event. Draser got the Gators beam lineup started by equaling her collegiate best of 9.90. Nguyen posted a 9.9125 while Wong's 9.8875 and Pilgrim's 9.85 were also computed into UF's 49.475.

Wong and Oregon State's Jade Carey led the second semifinal all-around at 39.70, which ended up second overall to LSU's Haleigh Bryant's 39.7125. Two other Gators earned All-America all-around honors in the second semifinal – Nguyen (5th – 39.55) and Pilgrim (T6 – 39.5375).



Leanne Wong shared the 2024 NCAA uneven bars title and was second in the all-around and vault.

April 20 NCAA Final Four

Florida gymnastics finished fourth in the NCAA Team Final at Dickie's Arena to close the 2024 season.

Louisiana State celebrated its first NCAA gymnastics title with a 198.225, becoming just the eighth team in the 42-year history of the event to claim a team win.

California was second at 197.85, followed by Utah (197.80) and Florida (197.4375).

Florida was assigned Olympic rotation for Saturday's final. The vault landings didn't come as easily as in the semifinal with only **Danie Ferris** breaking 9.9, leading the team at 9.9125. Fellow freshman **Skylar Draser** led off with a 9.875 and senior **Victoria Nguyen** posted a 9.85. Florida tallied a 49.25 on vault.

Florida found those sticks on the next rotation with each of the six hitting her dismount. Draser equaled her collegiate best of 9.9 and **Leanne Wong** anchored with the day's winning mark of 9.95. **Anya Pilgrim** posted 9.8875, with Nguyen (9.875) and **Sloane Blakely** (9.8625) also adding into UF's bars total of 49.475.

Balance beam opened with two Gators equaling their collegiate best - first Draser (9.90) and then Blakely (9.95). Pilgrim earned a 9.875 and **Ellie Lazzari** anchored with a 9.85. Some balance checks and a miss dinged the scoring potential, as the Gators tallied a 49.2375.

The floor exercise lead-off and anchor led the Gators, with Nguyen starting off at 9.9125 and Wong finishing with the day's high floor mark of 9.95. Lazzari earned a 9.8875 with Blakely and Pilgrim contributing 9.8625s toward UF's total of 49.475.

GATOR GYMNASTICS FAN SUPPORT

A growing fan base is filling the Exactech Arena to cheer Gator gymnastics. The crowds are getting bigger each year at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The Gators raised their average attendance for the fifth consecutive full-capacity season in 2023 to 9,351. It was the sixth time in the last eight full capacity seasons the Gators set their attendance average (2023: 9,351; 2022: 9,108; 2020: 8,622; 2019: 8,333; 2018: 8,304; 2016: 7,433).

Even with the reduced-capacity limits in 2021, the only UF team to sell-out each event of the season was Gator gymnastics.

Eight of the program's top 10 crowds have come in the last decade. Florida's record crowd of 10,855 was set when No. 1 Florida met No. 2 Georgia. Florida's strong fan base played a big role in the Gators being awarded the 2010 NCAA Gymnastics Championships. Florida led the nation's six NCAA Regional sites in 2017 with a crowd of 5,214. Florida almost doubled the total attendance of any other 2024 NCAA Regional site with 15,693 across the three days of competition.

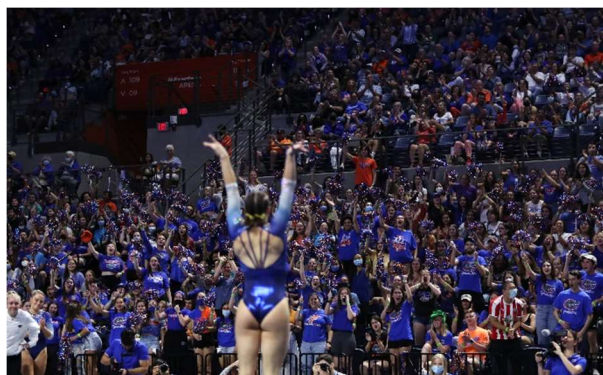

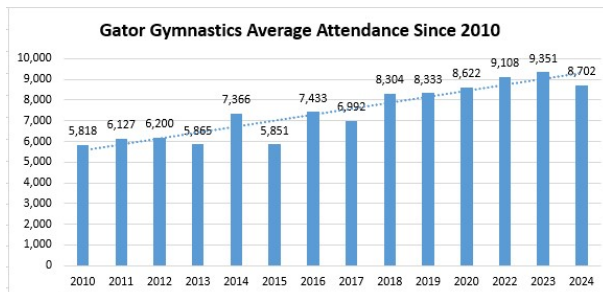
