In the last three games (12 quarters) of play aganst Ole Miss, Florida quarterbacks have combined for a 191.2 quarterback rating, tossing 12 touchdowns against two interceptions while completing 70.7% of passes. In last season's win over No. 9 Ole Miss, QB DJ Lagway completed 10-of-17 passes for 180 yards, two touchdowns and one interception.

THE STORYLINE

- In Week 12 at No. 7/6 Ole Miss, Florida faces its sixth top-10 opponent of the season, tying the program record for most top-10 games in a year (1987: six). The Gators set the team record for most top-five opponents in a season in Week 10 vs. No. 5 Georgia (four). Florida is on pace to tie its record for most top-25 opponents in Week 13 (2003: seven).
- From Weeks 3-7, Florida played its first four-game stretch against four top-10 opponents in team history, as the Gators became the first team in college football to do so since Northwestern and Illinois in 1968.
- Week 12 marks the 27th meeting between Florida and Ole Miss including the ninth matchup in Oxford.
- The Gators took the all-time series lead at 13-12-1 after a 24-17 upset win of No. 9 Ole Miss in The Swamp last season.
- Florida now has three-straight wins vs. Ole Miss (2024: W, 24-17 | 2020: W, 51-35 | 2015: W, 38-10) with an average margin of victory of 17.0 points (113-62) despite the Rebels outgaining the Gators, 1,405-1,341 yards, in those games.
- The Gators defeated the Rebels, 51-35, in their last trip to Oxford on Sept. 26, 2020.
- As a result, Florida has won two games in a row vs. Ole Miss in Oxford, and six of the last seven since 1965.
- Although UF won just one of the first nine meetings (1-7-1) from 1926-1958, Florida is 12-5 vs. Ole Miss since then.
- The two teams first met in Gainesville in 1926 (Ole Miss 12, Florida 7). They did not meet in Oxford until 1935 (L, 27-6).
- Florida's first win over Ole Miss came in Jacksonville in 1945, 26-13.
- A victory would mark Florida's highest-AP-ranked win since Nov. 7, 2020 vs. No. 5 Georgia in Jacksonville (W, 44-28).
- On the road, Florida is looking for its highest-ranked victory since Oct. 10, 2009 at No. 4 LSU (W, 13-3).
- Playing on the road while unranked, this would be UF's highest-ranked win since Oct. 11, 2003 at No. 6 LSU (W, 19-7).
- In the last four seasons, Florida has five wins vs. AP Top 25 teams while unranked, including three vs. the AP Top 10: 2022 vs. No. 7 Utah, 2023 vs. No. 11 Tennessee, 2024 vs. No. 21 LSU, 2024 vs. No. 9 Ole Miss, 2025 vs. No. 9 Texas.
- This is just the second time in UF-OM series history that Ole Miss has been ranked and Florida has not (2024, 2025).
- Week 12 is the third game at the helm of the Gators for Florida Interim HC Billy Gonzales.
- Gonzales is the seventh interim head coach in UF football history, following Greg Knox (2021: 1-1), Randy Shannon (2017: 1-3), DJ Durkin (2014: 1-0), Charlie Strong (2004: 0-1), Gary Darnell (1989: 3-4) and Galen Hall (1984: 8-0).
- Florida interim head coaches have gone a combined 14-11 following Gonzales' Week 11 road debut in Lexington.
- Gonzales takes on Rebels HC Lane Kiffin, who is 0-3 in his career vs. Florida at Tennessee (0-1) and Ole Miss (0-2).
- Florida is 23rd in the FBS in first down defense (155) and 24th in red zone defense (0.778). The Gators also rank 27th in fumbles recovered (six), 46th in interceptions (eight), 47th in rushing defense (132.8), 49th in total defense (347.2) 53rd in in scoring defense (22.4 PPG), 61st in passing defense (214.4) and 69th passing efficiency defense (131.93).
- As a result, Florida enters Week 12 boasting the No. 32 overall defense in the FBS per PFF with a 90.4 grade, featuring the eighth-best tackling grade (90.1) and 26th-highest run defense grade (90.8) in the nation (per PFF).

- THE STORYLINE (CONT.) -

- The Gators are one of five teams in the FBS with a top-10 tackling and top-30 run defense grade, including one of two in the SEC (Georgia, Texas Tech, Pittsburgh, TCU).
- On offense, UF touts the nation's No. 12 red zone offense (92.6%), having scored on 25 of 27 red zone trips.
- Florida's all-time, NCAA-record scoring streak currently sits at 470-consecutive games dating back to 1988.

- LAST THREE AGAINST OLE MISS -

- Florida has won three-straight games vs. Ole Miss: 2024 in Gainesville (Florida 24, No. 9 Ole Miss 17), 2020 in Oxford (No. 5 Florida 51, Ole Miss 35) and 2015 in Gainesville (No. 25 Florida 38, No. 3 Ole Miss 10).
- This is the fourth-straight matchup in which one of the two teams has been ranked inside the Top 10.

- TACKLING KEY FOR 2025 GATORS -

- Florida averaged 10.1 missed tackles per game in 2022, 9.6 in 2023 and 11.0 in 2024.
- This season, the Gators have missed 7.2 tackles per game for the eighth-best tackling grade in the FBS.
- UF has finished with a tackling grade outside of the top-40 in each of the last three seasons prior to 2025.

- THE LAGWAY FILE -

• **QB DJ Lagway** enters Week 12 having completed 171-of-265 passes (64.5%) for 1,762 yards, 11 touchdowns and 12 interceptions for a 125.02 rating through nine games this season. He is 9-7 as the starting quarterback of the Gators, having posted his third top-25 upset as a starter in Week 6.

- In Week 10 vs. Georgia, Lagway completed over 62.0% of his passes (62.5%) for the fifth time this season.
- With a 40-yard touchdown pass in Week 10, Lagway has 17 completions of 40-plus yards in his career.
- Lagway has posted a QB rating above 130.0 in 11 of his last 15 games.
- Lagway ranks ninth in the SEC in completion percentage (64.5%), rising to sixth among SEC quarterbacks with at least 265 passing attempts.
- Eclipsing 3,000 career pass yards in Week 7, Lagway has thrown for 200 yards in five of the last eight games.
- In the Week 6 win, Lagway went 21-for-28 to finish with a completion percentage of at least 75% percent for the second time this season. He also posted the third-best QB rating (180.8) of his career.
- Lagway's 75% completion percentage in Week 6 is tied for the ninth-highest in SEC play this season while his 180.8 rating stands as the eighth-best of any SEC quarterback in conference play this year.
- Lagway is one of five SEC QBs to complete 75% of passes and throw for 250 yards and multiple TDs in an SEC game in 2025 (Joey Aguilar v. UK, Gunner Stockton v. Ole Miss, Arch Manning v. Vandy, Diego Pavia v. Auburn).
- Against the Longhorns in Week 6, Lagway delivered a 150.0-plus rating for the eighth time in his career.
- In Week 3, Lagway had the most completions (33) and attempts (49) by a UF quarterback since Kyle Trask (33-for-49) vs. Tennessee in 2020. Those totals are tied for third and fourth by a UF quarterback since 1996.
- With a 194.3 rating in Week 1 vs. LIU, Lagway posted the second-highest rating of his career and the fourth-best rating of any UF quarterback from 2022-25.
- Lagway led all FBS true freshman quarterbacks with at least 125 pass attempts with a 154.9 rating last season - 10.9 points higher than the next-closest true freshman passer (Marcel Reed, Texas A&M).
- Lagway finished with the 12th-best passer rating in team history last season at 154.9 (true FR record).
- Lagway ranked third among FBS passers with a 95.8 passing grade on deep throws in 2024 per PFF (20plus yards), behind only Syracuse's Kyle McCord and Ohio State's Will Howard.
- Lagway's six wins in 2024 tied Chris Leak (6-3, 2003) for the most ever by a UF true freshman quarterback.
- Making his first-career start in the Week 2 win over Samford in 2024, Lagway passed for the most yards ever (456) by a Florida true freshman quarterback, breaking Chris Leak's mark of 269 vs. Kentucky in 2003.

- THE BAUGHLIN' BELLCOW -

- After leading UF in carries and rush yards as a true freshman in 2024, **RB Jadan Baugh** has started all nine games this season with 149 carries for 747 yards, five rushing touchdowns and 27 receptions for 239 yards.
- He is on pace for 996 rush yards, putting him four yards shy of becoming UF's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kelvin Taylor in 2015. To this point, nine Gators have combined for 11 100-yard rushing seasons in UF history.
- In Week 11 at Kentucky, Baugh became the first Florida player with at least 60 yards rushing and five receptions in a game in two years since Montrell Johnson Jr. on Nov 11, 2023 at LSU (fourth Gators to do so in last 14 seasons). He is the third SEC player to do so this year, and just the second in conference play.
- Baugh caught multiple passes (five) for the seventh-straight game in Week 11 at Kentucky, marking the first-seven games of his career with multiple receptions. He also had his first receiving touchdown of the season.
- Baugh boasts five more receptions (27) than any other SEC running back, ranking t-15th in the FBS.
- Baugh's 45 missed tackles forced rank ninth in the FBS and third in the SEC behind Kewan Lacy (69) and Ahmad Hardy (65). He is tied for 14th in the FBS and second in the SEC (behind Hardy, 28) with 23 explosive rushes.
- Baugh is averaging 5.0 YPC and 83.0 rush YPG after posting marks of 5.1 YPC and 51.8 YPG in 2024.
- He is one of six FBS players (only in SEC) with 25+ catches, 700 rush yards, 5.0+ YPC and at least five rushing TDs.
- Baugh ranks fifth in the SEC in rush yards per game and 18th in yards per carry (15th among running backs).
- Baugh has 509 yards after contact this season (68.1% of his net rushing) and 936 in his career (66.1%).
- Baugh has eclipsed 100 rush yards in three games already this season for four career 100-yard performances.
- Baugh rushed for a career-high 150 yards and one touchdown on 23 carries (6.5 YPC) in Week 8 vs. Miss. St.
- Baugh's 150 rush yards were the most by a Gator since Sept. 16, 2023 vs. Tennessee (Trevor Etienne, 172).
- Baugh's seven receptions at LSU in Week 3 were the most by a UF running back in 25 years (2001).
- Baugh is the only active SEC running back who had at least 130 rush attempts, seven rushing touchdowns and at least one receiving score while averaging at least 5.0 yards per carry last season.
- Baugh delivered a five-touchdown game in his first-career start vs. Kentucky in 2024 and tied the school record for the most in a game (Trey Burton vs. UK in 2010, Tim Tebow vs. South Carolina in 2007).

- GRADING THE OFFENSIVE LINE -

- Entering the 2025 season, Florida's offensive line boasted 223 combined games played, which ranked 11th in the FBS and fourth in the SEC behind Auburn (236), Texas A&M (235) and Mississippi State (227).
- The Florida O-line also entered with 109 career starts, which ranked 14th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.
- Returning starters include All-American C Jake Slaughter (13 starts), Preseason First Team All-SEC OL Austin Barber (13), OL Damieon George Jr. (10) and OL Knijeah Harris (13), who combined for 49 starts last season.
- Florida enters Week 12 ranking first in the SEC and 25th in the FBS in run blocking, per PFF.
- The Gators sit sixth in the SEC and t-55th in the FBS with just 15 sacks allowed in nine games this season.
- Florida has allowed one or zero sacks in five of nine games this season (one sack in last two weeks combined).
- Across the last 13 games, the Gators have allowed 66 tackles for loss and 22 sacks.
- Florida allowed zero sacks and three TFLs in Week 6 vs. Texas, who had a season-low six QB pressures.
- Barber has the 26th-best run blocking grade (76.5) among all FBS tackles.
- George Jr. allowed his first sack in Week 11, with just seven QB hurries in 471 snaps for a 98.2% block rate.
- OL Kamryn Waites, OL Bryce Lovett and OL Roderick Kearney have yet to allow a sack.
- Despite playing just two games, OL Mark Faircloth has the best overall grade (82.0) on the UF offensive line, ranking first on the Gators in run blocking (79.8) and second in run blocking (82.5).
- UF offensive linemen did not allow a QB hit in Week 1 while ranking No. 12 in the FBS in run blocking (76.3).
- Florida has allowed 91 sacks in 47 games since 2022, which ranks seventh in the SEC.

- SLAUGHTERING THE TRENCHES -

- All-American C Jake Slaughter has allowed three QB pressures and one sack this season for a 99.4% block
 rate in 569 snaps, grading as Pro Football Focus' No. 3 center in the FBS through Week 11 with an 80.3 grade.
- Slaughter has posted a 100% block rate and zero QB pressures in six of nine games.
- Slaughter ranks second among FBS centers in pass blocking (88.8) and fourth in run blocking (78.2).
- His PFF grade has increased every season: 2021 (59.0), 2022 (69.4), 2023 (78.4), 2024 (82.0).
- Slaughter has allowed just 14 hurries, four sacks and three QB hits across 1,966 career snaps from 2021-25 for a 98.8% success rate.
- Slaughter was named a 2024 First Team All-American by the AP, ESPN and PFF after finishing with the sixth-best PFF grade in the FBS at the position (82.0). As Florida's first-ever First Team All-American center, Slaughter joined Gators Bill Carr (1966) and Maurkice Pouncey (2009) as UF All-Americans at the position.
- Slaughter ranked top-20 nationally in both run blocking (eighth, 80.1) and pass blocking (17th, 84.2) in 2024.



- TRUE ROOKIE RECEIVERS AND THE CORPS -

- Florida had to replace each of its top-two pass catchers from 2024 in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, who represented the only FBS receiving duo to both post over 700 receiving yards and 18.0 YPC.
- Florida's returning wide receiver contingent consists of WR Eugene Wilson III, WR Aidan Mizell, WR Tank Hawkins and WR TJ Abrams, among others.
- Eighteen Gators have a reception through Week 11 highlighted by 15 different players in Week 1 alone.
- Despite the returning experience, true freshman WR Vernell Brown III leads Florida in receptions (33) and receiving yards (473) with 200 more yards than the next Gator. He is looking for his first-career touchdown.
- Among FBS true freshmen, Brown III ranks second in receptions (33), second in receiving yards (473), second in receiving yards per game (59.1) and seventh in yards per catch (14.3).
- Brown III is the *only* FBS true freshman player with at least 30 receptions, 14.0+ YPC and 50.0+ YPG.
- Brown III is top-25 among all SEC players in receiving YPG (17th), receiving yards (19th) and catches (t-22nd).
- Another true freshman, WR Dallas Wilson, is tied for the team lead with three receiving touchdowns in just four games played. That makes Florida the only FBS team to be led by true freshmen in all three categories.
- Abrams made his first-career start in Week 11 at UK and made an immediate impact, catching two passes tying his career high – on Florida's opening drive. He finished with a career-high four receptions for 28 yards.
- E. Wilson III also has three touchdowns after setting season highs in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (121) en route to his second-career, 100-yard receiving performance in Week 10 vs. Georgia.
- Wilson III more than doubled his total receiving yards on the season, as he entered Week 10 with 118 vards.
- In the process, Wilson surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards and caught his 10th-career touchdown pass.
- In two-career, Florida-Georgia games (2023 & 2025), Wilson III has totaled 20 catches, 196 yards and two touchdown receptions. He accounted for 72.9% of Florida's receiving yards in Week 10 vs. Georgia.
- Florida, Washington, USF and Boston College are the only FBS teams with two true freshmen with over 150
 receiving yards.
- Redshirt senior transfer **WR J. Michael Sturdivant** (UCLA) is second on the roster in receiving yards (264) and fifth in receptions (20). He recorded his first and only touchdown catch as a Gator in Week 1 vs. LIU.
- In Week 7 at Texas A&M, D. Wilson and Brown III became the first two true freshman wide receivers to start in the same game in program history.
- D. Wilson is the only UF true freshman receiver in team history to catch three touchdowns in his first two games, and the first Florida receiver (any year) to do so in his first two games since Carlos Alvarez in 1969.
- Making his collegiate debut in Week 6, D. Wilson set records for a Gators true freshman wide receiver making his first-career start with six receptions, 111 yards receiving and two touchdowns (all records). His 111 yards broke Brown Ill's record set five weeks prior in the season opener (79).
- D. Wilson became the second Gator all-time with 100 receiving yards in his collegiate debut (Carlos Alvarez, 1969 vs. No. 7 Houston) and the first UF freshman receiver 100 yards since Tyrie Cleveland vs. LSU in 2016.
- D. Wilson became the 18th true freshman wide receiver to start in UF program history, marking the fourth season all-time in which two different UF true freshman receivers have started (2025, 2016, 2012, 2000).
- Brown's 60-yard catch in the third quarter of the Week 6 win over Texas marked Florida's longest pass play of the season and longest since E. Wilson III's 85-yard touchdown reception against Samford on Sept. 7, 2024.
- Brown III became the third true freshman wide receiver to start on opening day for the Gators in Week 1 of the season, joining Antonio Callaway (2015) and Percy Harvin (2006).
- Brown III was the 17th true freshman to start a season opener for UF dating back to 1972 and the first Gator to start opening day on offense since Jawaan Taylor in 2016.

- HANSEN AND THE TIGHT ENDS -

- TE Hayden Hansen has started 31-consecutive games for the Gators at the position dating back to 2023, which is the longest-active streak of any Florida player.
- Hansen ranks fourth on Florida in catches (24) and receiving yards (208).
- Hansen is tied for seventh among SEC tight ends (t-38th in FBS) in receptions and is 12th in receiving yards.
- Hansen set career highs with seven receptions and 50 yards receiving in Week 3 at LSU.
- From 2023-24, Hansen caught 27 passes for 357 yards and three touchdowns.
- Joining Hansen in two tight end sets is junior TE Tony Livingston, who made one start in 2024.
- Livingston has played in seven games (two starts) this season, tallying seven catches for 50 yards and one TD.
- Livingston played in 10 contests with 11 receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns in 2024.
- Having played in four games in 2024, TE Amir Jackson caught his first-career TD on his second-career reception in Week 7 at A&M. He has appeared in all nine games of 2025 with three catches for 29 yards.

- 2025 DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK -

- Florida returned 62% of defensive production and five starters from last year's squad, which finished on a tear across the Gators' season-ending, four-game win streak.
- Florida returned 76.9% of its sack production (30 of 39 sacks) and each of its top five leaders in sacks, in addition to seven of its top 10 in sacks from last year.
- Florida also brought back 72.1% of its TFL production (62 of 86 TFLs) and each of its top four leaders in TFLs, as well as six of its top 10 in TFLs from the 2024 season.
- In the last four games of 2024, UF totaled 19 sacks while allowing 13.0 points per game.
- Florida's 18 sacks and 34 tackles for loss were the most in the FBS over the last three weeks of the regular season.
- In those four games, UF opponents reached the redzone nine times and only scored 22 total points.
- UF forced -161 rushing yards in the final four games played as opponents only averaged 2.9 yards per carry.
- When opponents rushed the ball in the last four weeks of 2024, there was a 25% chance it would go for negative yards and a 31% mark for zero or negative yards.
- In eight of the last nine games of 2024, the Gators did not allow an opponent to rush over 150 yards, including under 100 yards vs. FSU (99) and Tulane (69). The Seminoles averaged just 2.25 YPC.
- As a result of the four-game finish, the Gators ended the season ranking ninth nationally in red zone defense (0.725), 11th in sacks (3.00 per game), 27th in passes intercepted (14), 33rd in tackles for loss (6.6 per game), 35th in turnover margin (0.46), 43rd in scoring defense (23.1) and 49th in team passing efficiency defense (124.2).
- Returning starters include DE Caleb Banks, DL Tyreak Sapp, LB Grayson Howard, SS Bryce Thornton and FS
 Jordan Castell, who combined for 57 games played and 48 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- Additionally, CB Devin Moore (six), CB Dijon Johnson (five), STAR Sharif Denson (five), STAR Aaron Gates
 (five), LB Jaden Robinson (four), DE Kamran James (four) and JACK George Gumbs Jr. (three) all made
 multiple starts on Florida's defense last year for an additional, combined 32 starts.

- ONCE YOUTHFUL DEFENSE READY TO FLY -

- Of the 143 starting opportunities on defense in 2024, a combined 55 came from underclassmen (38.4%) highlighted by five starts each in the last four games of the year, consecutively.
- Across the two previous seasons (2023-24), 128 out of 275 defensive starts were by underclassmen (47%).
- Additionally, 50% of Florida's defensive snaps in 2024 came from underclassmen, compared to the 2023 campaign, when 58% of snaps were logged by underclassmen, including 25% by freshmen alone.
- A combined 53% of defensive snaps were recorded by underclassmen from 2023-24.
- Last season, 16 players made their first UF starts while nine made their first-collegiate starts.
- Out of the 10-most snaps for the Gators in 2024, five were underclassmen: FS Jordan Castell (first), DB Dijon
 Johnson (fourth), STAR Sharif Denson (fifth), SS Bryce Thornton (sixth) and LB Jaden Robinson (eighth).
- Five of the Gators top-eight tacklers last season were second-year players: Castell (fourth), Robinson (fifth), Thornton (seventh). Denson (t-eighth) and ILB Grayson Howard (t-eighth).
- Florida's 25 takeaways in 2024 were its most since 2018, with 13 coming from underclassmen highlighted by three apiece from Thornton and STAR Aaron Gates.

- SECONDARY NEWCOMERS STEP UP vs. MSU -

- In the victory vs. Mississippi State, Florida's secondary featured an unexperienced group composed of redshirt-freshman Jamroc Grimsley, true freshmen Ja'Vari Flowers, Ben Hanks III and Lagonza Hayward, walk-on Alfonzo Allen Jr. and first-year transfer Michael Caraway Jr.
- The six combined for 315 defensive snaps played after only totaling 78 in the season's first six games: Caraway Jr. (32), Hayward (26), Flowers (18), Grimsley (2), Allen Jr. (0) and Hanks III (0). Allen Jr. made his season debut and first-career start, Grimsley his first-career start and Hanks III his collegiate debut.
- The group ended MSU's Blake Shapen's FBS-best, 21-game passing touchdown streak.
- The Gators were missing starters Jordan Castell and Cormani McClain as both Sharif Denson (five snaps) and Devin Moore (eight snaps) exited the game due to injury in the first quarter. Additionally, UF was already without starters Aaron Gates and Dijon Johnson.
- The lone secondary veteran starter was junior safety Bryce Thornton, who has played every defensive snap across the last-eight games. He made seven tackles to eclipse 100-career tackles and added his fourth PDU.
- Allen Jr. made his first-career start and his season debut and led the Gators with a career-high 15 tackles and tied for team-best five stops. He finished with the most tackles by a Gator since 2021.
 - » He matched his career-high (three) on the first drive alone and he played all 82 snaps at safety.
- Hayward tied for a team-high 2.5 TFLs and had six tackles, as his final was a third-down stop in the fourth.
- Flowers had a team-high two pass breakups with three tackles and 0.5 tackles-for-loss, and was highestgraded true freshman CB in Week 8, per Pro Football Focus.



- CHARTING THE GATORS DEFENSE -

- The Gators rank ninth in overall tackling grade (90.1) by PFF and are one of two SEC schools (Georgia) to be in the
 top 10. UF and Clemson are the only schools ranked in the top 10 despite having a losing record.
 - » Florida has only missed 65 total tackles this season compared to 144 last year. It is on the pace to be the fewest since 2017 (102).
- UF has allowed nine passing scores this season, tied for 18th-fewest in the FBS and fourth in the SEC.
- The Gators have forced a takeaway in 20 of 22 contests since the start of the 2024 season for a total of 39, which is
 the most in a two-year span since 2019-20. UF is one takeaway from reaching 40, which last occurred in 2018-19.
 - » DB Devin Moore has contributed to UF's takeaways in back-to-back weeks. He picked off UGA QB Gunner Stockton for just the second interception by the Bulldogs QB this season at Kentucky, he forced a fumble and tackle-for-loss in Florida territory.
 - » Moore has accounted for three turnovers this season and five total in last two seasons.
- Florida has now picked off quarterbacks in the seven-straight games for eight total interceptions while allowing
 eight passing touchdowns in that stretch. The record is 12-straight games with an INT in 2008 (National Champs).
 - » The streak of seven-consecutive games with an interception is just the eighth season since 1996 with seven-straight games with a pick, and the first since 2017 (8 games).
- Sophomore LB Myles Graham leads the Gators defense in tackles (51), stops (26) and quarterback hurries (5) while ranked second in pass breakups (4) and third in tackles-for-loss (3.5).
- In his third season on the defense, **EDGE George Gumbs Jr.** leads the Gators in TFLs (5.5) for 20.5 in his career.
- The Gators doubled their season high with four takeaways in Week 11 highlighted by three in the first half alone.
- After UGA's opening drive TD (just the 4th allowed by UF in last 16 games), Florida held Georgia scoreless over the next five drives (65 total yards / 2.3 yards per play).
- The Florida defense featured an average distance of nine yards-to-go on third downs against Georgia.
- Following MSU's TD on their opening drive, UF held them scoreless on the following-eight drives for a total of 196 yards including three drives of negative total yards. That also included a fourth-down stop and fumble recovery.
- Florida had a season-high 11 TFLs vs. MSU, led by EDGE Kamran James and DB Lagonza Hayward, with 2.5 each.
- Allowing 196 total yards in the first quarter at Texas A&M, Florida allowed 221 yards in next three quarters.
- In the Aggies' first-three series of the second half, Florida forced two three-and-outs and allowed one first
 down, with one of the series ending in a field goal after starting the drive on the UF 29-yard line.
- The Gators limited Texas to 52 rush yards, marking UF's third game allowing under 100 this season.
- Across Texas' 26 carries, only three went for seven-plus yards as 14 rushes went for zero or negative yards.
 » Texas was held to 87 total yards (63 passing, 24 rushing) and four first downs in the first half.
- Florida racked up an astounding 35 QB pressures on Texas and QB Arch Manning, the most pressures against the Longhorns in the Sarkisian era, topping the previous record by Georgia in Austin last season (28).
- Florida delivered a season-high six sacks vs. a Texas O-Line that had only allowed three all season to that point.
- Miami's 80-yard TD drive to seal the game in Week 4 was the second-longest TD drive Florida has allowed this season, as the Canes only had to go 22 yards for their final TD after a failed Florida fourth-down conversion.
- After that opening drive and score at Miami, Florida held the Canes to 165 yards (20.6 avg), six points (2 FGs) and forced an interception over the next-eight possessions.
- The Gator defense is the only team this year to not allow Miami to throw a passing touchdown while it marked
 just the fifth time in QB Carson Beck's career as a starter that he did not throw a passing touchdown.
- » The Canes were also held to current season lows in passing yards (160) and completions (17).
- At LSU, Florida forced three-straight three-and-outs to start the game and allowed only 16 yards of offense.
- Florida picked up where it left off last season with a 55-0 shutout of LIU in the 2025 season opener. It was the 25th all-time shutout in a season opener and first shutout since defeating Vanderbilt, 42-0, in 2021.

- DEFENSE REWIND vs. OLE MISS -

- Florida's upset victory over No. 9 Ole Miss last year was part of a four-week dominance by the Gators defense.
 - » The defense combined for 38 tackles-for-loss, 19 sacks, 18 pass breakups, 17 quarterback hurries, eight forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five interceptions while only allowing 13.0 points per game.
 - » UF forced -161 rushing yards in the final four games played as opponents only averaged 2.9 yards per carry.
- UF held Ole Miss, who finished third in the FBS and first in SEC in scoring offense, to a season-low 17 points.
- Ole Miss was 0-for-3 on red zone trips as Florida stopped them twice on fourth down and forced a missed field goal.
- The Rebels were held to a mark of 3-of-14 on third downs and 2-of-4 on fourth Downs.
- Florida recorded 9.0 TFLs, six PBUs, four QB hurries, two interceptions and one fumble recovery vs. Ole Miss.
- DB Bryce Thornton picked off Jaxson Dart in the endzone with 1:32 remaining and then sealed the win with a
 second interception with 0:17 left. His 14 tackles (five solo) were a career-high and most in a game by a Gator
 last year. The two INTs in the game made him one of six SEC players to have two in conference play last season.

- THE NATION'S MOST UNDERRATED LB ROOM -

- Although Florida's linebacker room was its lowest-ranked preseason unit per Phil Steele at No. 25, the position group welcomes back Aaron Chiles. Myles Graham, Grayson Howard and Jaden Robinson.
- Graham (51) and Robinson (35) have started every game of 2025 and rank first and fifth in total tackles. They have also combined for 46 stops - Graham (26) & Robinson (21), sitting first and second on the team.
- As a true freshman and Gators legacy player, Graham earned his first-career start in the 2025 opener and led the team in tackles (five) with 1.0 tackle-for-loss, as all five of his tackles were stops.
- Graham already broke his career-high of 30 tackles set last season and is on pace to lead UF in tackles (51). marking first time since 2021 a linebacker finished as the team's top tackler.
- His four pass breakups are the second most in the nation by a linebacker (Owen Chambliss/SDSU five).
- Graham emerged in the last six games of 2024, posting 23 tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.5 TFLs, one interception, one forced fumble and one QB hurry. Prior to that, he owned seven tackles (one solo) and zero TFLs in seven games.
- Graham played the second-most snaps (183) among SEC freshman LBs in 2024 while Chiles ranked third (130).
- Graham also led all SEC freshman linebackers with 10 stops last season.
- Robinson played in all 13 games last season while starting each of the final four contests and started the 2025 season opener, making three solo tackles, 2.0 TFLs and one forced one fumble.
- Robinson filled the stat sheet vs. Texas in Week 6 with three tackles, 0.5 sacks, one pass breakup and one QB hurry. His PBU came on second down and the QB hurry on third to force UT to punt on their opening drive.

- SO. WHAT ABOUT THE DEFENSIVE BACKS? -

- Week 10's game vs. UGA featured a fully-healthy secondary that combined for 25 tackles, 11 stops, 2.0 TFLs, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
- The secondary performance vs. MSU was highlighted by walk-on safety **Alfonzo Allen Jr.'s** career-high 15 tackles in his season debut and first-career start, true freshmen Lagonza Hayward's team-high 2.5 tacklesfor-loss and Ja'Vari Flowers' two pass breakups and 0.5 tackles-for-loss.
- The Gators' secondary brought back a pair of starting safeties in SS Bryce Thornton and FS Jordan Castell, who combined for 23 games played and 20 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- This season, Thornton (579) and Castell (487) rank first and second in defensive snaps played while Thornton has played every defensive snap in the last-eight games and has only not played in 15 defensive snaps total. In the last 13 games, Thornton has only missed 63 total defensive snaps.
- In all, Florida had 14 interceptions and 49 pass breakups in 2024. Ten of those interceptions came from players returning for the 2025 season (71.4%) while 28 pass breakups were recorded by returners (57.1%).
- Castell had played every game across the last three seasons (2023-25) before missing the first game of his career in Week 8 vs. MSU, ending a streak of 30-straight starts in Orange & Blue, which was the longest-such streak of any Gator on the roster.
- Returning from his first-game ever missed (college or prep), Castell tied his career-high with 11 tackles vs. UGA.
- For the second-straight season in 2024, Castell led the team in snaps played (831) after playing a team-best 751 snaps in 2023. He continued the trend into the 2025 opener and has now played over 1,500 career snaps.
- Castell nabbed his second interception in as many games in Week 7, picking off QB Marcell Reed in the endzone on the first play of the fourth quarter. He has a career-high two picks this season (three in career).
- Thornton ranks first on the team in pass breakups (five) and fumble recoveries (two), second in tackles (42) and third quarterback hurries (three) this season.
- He nabbed an interception in the second quarter for his third takeaway and first pick of the season at Kentucky.
- Meanwhile, Thornton has played in 30 games including 19 starts across the last three seasons (2023-25), starting each of the last-13 games consecutively dating back to last year.
- In Week 10. Thornton's had six tackles as four were stops with one TFL (-11 vards) and one PBU (on third down) while grading as the best in coverage (88.8) and third-highest FBS safety overall (86.5) in Week 10 per PFF.
- Thornton had Florida's first score of the 2025 season with a 37-yard fumble recovery on the first drive of Week 1 and later added a second fumble recovery, setting up a Gators touchdown in the second quarter.
- Thornton led Florida with three interceptions in 2024 on top of 41 tackles (22 solo), 1.5 TFLs, one forced fumble and three pass breakups - and played all but one snap of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss).
- Additionally, CB Devin Moore (six), CB Dijon Johnson (five), STAR Sharif Denson (five) and STAR Aaron Gates (five) all started five or more games for the 2024 UF defense, bringing more experience back to the secondary. The group also features **CB Cormani McClain** (five career starts).
- Moore has already surpassed his career-high in snaps (278) and games played (seven) with 429 and nine.
- Moore is graded the second-best corner in coverage (83.3) in the SEC and 12th overall, per Pro Football Focus.
- He has not committed a penalty in the last two seasons and has only has two pass interferences in 58 career targets.
- Against Texas. Moore had his first-career sack and fourth-career interception on the same drive.
- In Denson's career, the junior has 7.5 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks while only missing four tackles in 2025.
- Denson made a career-high 11 tackles (9 solo) at Kentucky last week, besting his previous high of seven.



- DEPTH ON THE D-LINE -

- In addition to stars DL Caleb Banks and EDGE Tyreak Sapp, Florida's No. 10 defensive line (per Phil Steele) features returning edge rushers in EDGE George Gumbs Jr., EDGE Kamran James and EDGE LJ McCray.
- To aid with the interior side, the group consists of veteran **DL Jamari Lyons** and promising second-year players in **DL Michai Boireau** and **DL Brien Taylor Jr.**, along with Baylor transfer **DL Brendan Bett**.
- In only his third season on defense, Gumbs Jr. leads the Gators in TFLs (5.5) and has reached 20.5 in his career.
- Against UGA, Gumbs Jr. had a career-high nine tackles with team-high five stops and a sack on third down in the fourth quarter. He did not miss a tackle and had a tackling grade of 80.4 - a team-high.
- Boireau sealed the victory vs. Mississippi State with his first-career interception with 0:21 remaining, becoming UF's first defensive lineman with an interception since Gervon Dexter Sr. in 2021 (Chicago Bears starting DT).
- James had a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks while tying his career high in tackles (six) vs. MSU.
- Taylor Jr. had four tackles with 1.5 tackles-for-loss, 0.5 sacks and one forced fumble vs. Mississippi State.
- Against Texas, Taylor Jr. (Houston native) had three tackles and a team-high 1.5 sacks and two QB hurries.
- With both Sapp and Gumbs Jr. back in the fold, Florida returned each of its top-two leaders in sacks from 2024, as well as the entirety of the top four in Sapp (7.0), Gumbs Jr. (5.0), Banks (4.5) and LB Jaden Robinson (3.5).
- Gumbs Jr. finished second on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and sacks (5.0) in 2024 in just his second full
 season on defense after three seasons at Northern Illinois: one at WR, one at TE and one at DE.
- As a sophomore in 2024, James tied for the team lead with six QB hurries while tying for fifth on the Gators with 4.0 sacks. James totaled 28 tackles (20 solo), 2.0 sacks and one forced fumble.
- Notable newcomers to UF's edge rushing unit include UMass transfer EDGE Kofi Asare and true freshman EDGE Jayden Woods out of Mill Valley HS in Shawnee, Kansas.
- Woods teamed up with James for a sack on Texas' first play of an attempted comeback with 53 seconds left
 in Week 6. The duo each had a quarterback hurry as Woods collected a pass breakup as well, while James'
 other tackle was a third-down stop (Arch Manning three-yard rush) to force a Texas punt.
- Woods made his first-career start vs. Miami, marking the first Florida true freshman to start on the DL since Jabari Zuniga in 2016. He had his first-career sack and three tackles across 59 defensive snaps.
- Asare played a season-high 36 snaps at Miami en route to five tackles (three solo), two stops and 0.5 TFL.

- THE GAMECHANGERS -

- Although 2024 Honorable Mention All-America P Jeremy Crawshaw departed for the NFL, Florida returns a
 pair of starting specialists in K Trey Smack and LS Rocco Underwood.
- Crawshaw finished as Florida's all-time leader in career punting average at 46.4, passing Johnny Townsend (46.2)
- Although replacing Crawshaw's production is difficult, Florida brought in 2024 Third Team All-Big Ten P Tommy Doman, who won the 2023 National Title at Michigan.
- Doman's 4.47 hang time is second among FBS punters and he is the second-highest graded punter (91.5) in the FBS while sitting at No. 1 in the SEC, per Pro Football Focus.
- In Doman's 40 punt attempts this season, 15 have landed inside the opposing 20-yard line and nine have gone for 50-plus yards, including eight inside the 13-yard line in addition to a season-long of 65 yards.
- Smack's 56-yard field goal vs. LIU is the longest in the SEC this season while Doman's 65-yard punt ranks fifth.
- Named to the 2025 Lou Groza Award Watch List, Smack took over UF's primary kicking duties two seasons ago in Florida's 29-16 upset vs. No. 11 Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2023 and went on to be a Lou Groza Semifinalist.
- Since missing three field goals in the season opener, Smack has made his last-12 attempts in a row.
- Smack's 54-yarder vs. UGA was his ninth career 50-yarder, which is the most in Florida history.
- He is one of two kickers in the country with four or more 50-yard fields goals this season.
- Smack was 3-for-3 on field goals (54, 53, 24) vs. Mississippi State in Week 8.
- It marked consecutive seasons making three 50-yarders, joining Caleb Sturgis (2011-12) as the only Gator to do so.
- In addition, Smack is 22-for-30 in his career from 40-plus yards and 9-for-12 from 50-plus yards.
- He moved himself up in the record books with a 56-yarder in Week 1 vs. LIU (t-second-longest in UF history).
- Smack was 44-for-44 on PATs and 18-for-21 on FGs in 2024 with a long of 55, and 8-for-10 from 40-plus.
- Underwood became the first-ever Gator to win the Mannelly Award in 2024, given to the nation's top LS.
- Underwood recovered his third-career fumble at Kentucky to setup Florida's lone touchdown drive.
- In 2024, Underwood totaled three solo tackles and one fumble recovery, making him one of 11 FBS long snappers to have three tackles and one of two in the SEC.
- WR Vernell Brown III is the only freshman (of ten FBS players) with five 20-yard punt returns this season.
- In his lone punt return in Week 2, Brown III returned it for 40 yards to set up Florida's touchdown in the fourth quarter. The return is the fifth longest by an FBS true freshman this season and the longest by a Gator since 2022.
- WR Taylor Spierto blocked a punt for a safety vs. Texas for Florida's first blocked punt since Derek Wingo vs. Charlotte on Sept. 23, 2023 and first safety since Nov. 25, 2023 vs. FSU.
- It marked the first time Florida blocked a punt for a safety since Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Miami (Jeff Demps).
- The play also represented Florida's first blocked punt in SEC play since Jordan Pouncey at LSU on Oct. 16, 2021.

JOE HOUSTON'S IMPACT

- Last offseason, the Gators added senior special teams analyst Joe Houston to the fold. He came from the New England Patriots after spending four seasons (2020-23) as a special teams assistant.
- He enters the 2025 season in the role of special teams coordinator.
- In 2024, the Gators climbed to No. 1 in the FBS in special teams for three-consecutive weeks (Weeks 2-4) by ESPN's SP+ metric and finished third in the final regular-season ranking.
- Florida ranked 11th in the FBS in net punting (42.37) and 18th in punt return average (13.36) while holding status inside the top-13 all season in ESPN's SP+ metric.
- The Gators were also one of 44 teams to not have a blocked kick and one of 80 programs to not have a blocked punt.

- UF **DL Brendan Bett** was teammates with Ole Miss DT Caleb James at Baylor in 2024.
- Gators OL Dameion George Jr. was teammates with Ole Miss LS Carter Short at Alabama in 2021.
- There are four Mississippi natives on UF's roster: DB Michael Caraway, RB KD Daniels, K Evan Noel, and TE Micah Jones.

WHAT HAPPENED: Florida quarterback DJ Lagway passed for three first-half touchdowns, tailback Jadan Baugh rushed for 104 yards and a score and the nation's 15th-ranked team did what a power-conference program with high expectations is supposed to do to an FCS opponent in running roughshod over Long Island in a 55-0 rout Saturday night in the season opener for both teams at sold-out Spurrier/Field Field. Lagway, the 6-foot-3, 247-pound sophomore from Willis, Texas, had to shake off some rust after being limited for the first month of fall practice with a sore calf. Nonetheless, the UF franchise QB completed 15 of his 18 throws (83.3%) for 120 yards, with short scoring tosses of four yards to wide receiver Eugene Wilson III and tight end Hayden Hansen, plus an 8-yarder to wideout J. Michael Sturdivant, the transfer from UCLA. All three came in the second quarter, as the Gators built a 38-0 halftime lead, then shut Lagway down for the night. UF churned out 236 yards, including 120 rushing, and 16 first downs with Lagway under center. When the night was over, the Gators had out-gained the out-manned Sharks, by way of the Northeast Conference, 451 yards to 86, with a whopping 27-2 edge in first downs, an all-time low for a UF opponent. The Sharks' first 12 possessions went just three plays or less.

Florida's 55 points marked a single-game high under Coach Billy Napier, now in his fourth season. The Gators went an entire game without a penalty for the first time since 2021 and did not turn the ball over. LIU, in its seventh season of existence, was facing just its fourth power-conference program. The previous three were losses of 66-0 at West Virginia in 2021, 30-7 at Baylor in '22 and 45-0 at Texas Christian in '24. UF did not waste any time jumping in front, but did so on defense. The Gators won the coin toss, deferred to the second-half, but took the lead on safety Bryce Thornton's 37-yard fumble return — the first fumble for a score by the Gators' defense since 2020 — on the game's third play from scrimmage. On Florida's first offensive series, Baugh had runs of 17, 16 and seven yards before scoring on a 4-yard blast for a 14-0 lead. He got the second 100-yard game of his career on just nine carries. While LIU was cranking one three-and-out after another, Florida had three consecutive series ended in Trey Smack field-goal attempts. He missed from 40 and 39, but drilled a 56-yarder in between that tied the second-longest in school history and gave the home team a 17-0 lead. The Gators' next three series ended in the Lagway TD passes and fat halftime advantage. True freshman Tramell Jones Jr., out of Jacksonville, replaced Lagway in the second half and led a scoring drive to Smack's second field goal, a 41-yarder, and then a 64-yard march capped by a 4-yard touchdown pass to tight end Tony Livingston for a 48-0 lead. He threw an 11vard scoring strike to former walk-on Taylor Spierto with 25 seconds remaining in the game. Jones finished 12 of 18 for 131 yards and the two TDs without a turnover.

WHAT IT MEANS: Not much. LIU may have been one of the most over-matched opponents ever to play at Florida Field. For the Gators, the best thing about beating up on the Sharks was getting Lagway some much-needed reps (and getting out of the game healthy) before things start to get real.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Legacy wideout Vernell Brown III made quite the splash in his collegiate debut. Brown, whose father played at UF from 2002-05 and whose grandfather played here from 1982-85, became the first true freshman to start for the Gators on offense since tackle Jawaan Taylor in 2016 and just the third receiver in program history to do so, joining Percy Harvin (2006) and Antonio Callaway (2015). Brown caught three passes for 79 yards, breaking the true freshman debut mark of 72 set by Josh Hammond against North Texas in 2016. Brown hauled a spectacular one-handed, 41-yard gem from Lagway in the second quarter to set up a score. He also returned three punts for 45 yards, with a long of 25.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: LIU's total offense of 86 yards marked the 10th-lowest total by an opponent in UF history. The Sharks did not run a play in Florida territory until quarterback Luca Stanzani, from the his 42, converted a third-and-7 with a 28-vard completion to Deion Richardson to the UF 28 with just over nine minutes to go in the game. The drive fizzled from there. As for their two first downs, the previous all-time low against the Gators was four against Western Carolina in

UP NEXT: Florida (1-0) is back in "The Swamp" on Sept. 6 for a date against cross-state foe South Florida (1-0), which turned plenty of college football heads Thursday night in trouncing 25th-ranked Boise State, a College Football Playoff participant last season, 34-7 at Tampa. The Bulls are in their third season under Alex Golesh, who's put together back-to-back 7-6 seasons capped by bowl wins. The upset of the Broncos, though, was one of the program's biggest victories in years and should get the attention of the UF staff. Especially if USF, though unlikely, jumps into the Associated Press Top 25 this week.

WHAT HAPPENED: South Florida's Nico Gramatica kicked a 20-vard field goal as time expired and the down-south, cross-state foe Bulls shocked 13th-ranked Florida 18-16 before a sold-out, bummed-out crowd Saturday night at Spurrier/Florida Field. Gramatica's game-winner came after the Bulls — nine days removed from upsetting 25th-ranked and 2024 College Football Playoff participant Boise State at Tampa — capped an eight-play, 87-yard drive over the final 2:26, with the Gators defense doing its part in handing USF one of its biggest victories in school history by committing a disastrous unsportsmanlike-conduct penalty and a handful of missed tackles on a long catch-and-run. The victory gave the Bulls, in just their 25th year in Division I and FBS classification, wins over Florida, Florida State, Miami in their short history. Senior quarterback Byrum Brown completed 23 of 36 passes for 263 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing 17 times for 66 yards. Brown's 66-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter gave the Bulls their first lead of the game. The Gators, thanks to a 40-yard punt return by dynamic freshman Vernell Brown III, managed to retake the lead on a DJ Lagway short scoring toss to Eugene Wilson III, but the home team, despite getting the ball back twice more, left the door open for Brown and friends. The Bulls kicked it in. USF began the close-out drive at its 11. On second-and-10, defensive back Dijon Johnson was called for pass interference. On the very next snap, tailback Alvon Isaac was stopped for no gain at the 24, but in the middle of a mini-shoving match defensive lineman Brendan Bett was flagged for spitting on a player, resulting in a 15-yard penalty and automatic ejection. The ball was moved to the South Florida 39, where on first down Brown threw a short pass in the flat to Isaac, who turned the corner, broke two tackles and made another defensive back miss as he dashed 29 yards up the USF sidelines to the Florida 32. In field-goal range. From there, it was a slow green-and-gold bleed out, with either Brown or Isaac moving the ball to the UF 2 and calling a timeout with three seconds left. Gramatica, the son of former Tampa Bay Buccaneers kicker and Super Bowl champion Martin Gramatica, split the uprights from inside point-after range. It was his third field goal of the night. USF out-gained UF in total yards, 391 to 355, and on defense made Lagway look uncomfortable most of the night. The sophomore finished 23 of 33 for 222 yards, one touchdown and a first-half interception. The Gators out-rushed the Bulls, though barely, 133 to 128, led by sophomore Jadan Baugh's 93 yards on 18 carries. Through the first 48 minutes, the game featured nothing but field goals; three by Florida's Trey Smack (from 28, 36 and 25) and two by Gramatica (38 and 25), with neither team able to finish drives. The Gators led 9-6 until what looked like a promising UF march. with a first down at midfield, stalled and ended in a punt. The Bulls took over at their 14, got out of a hole with a 15-yard completion from Brown to Mudia Reuben, then turned the game on its head. On third-and-5 from his 34, Brown got his fast-breaking, high-tempo offense to the line and got the ball snapped as the Florida defense was caught — and confused — in mid-substitution. Singleton sprinted upfield and Brown lofted a strike that split defensive backs Johnson and Sharif Denson, both of whom looked like they could make a play on the ball. Instead, the two dove past each other, the ball hit Singleton in stride and he went untouched into the end zone for the Bulls' first lead of the game at 13-9. The Gators' ensuing possession answer was a three-and-out followed by a high snap from punt formation by Rocco Underwood, a 2024 first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection, that sailed over the head of Tommy Doman and rolled out of the end zone for a safety that pushed USF's margin to 15-9 with 13 seconds to go in the third quarter. Then came Brown's big return, Lagway's scoring toss, the lead, the momentum and the crowd doing its part. It wasn't enough.

WHAT IT MEANS: Get ready for more of what Ron Zook used to call "noise in the system," as UF failed to go 2-0 under Coach Billy Napier for the fourth time in as many seasons. USF, meanwhile, now has to be considered one of the Group of Five front-runners for a possible CFP berth.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Brown, the senior from Raleigh, North Carolina, was the best player on the field against Boise last weekend and the best on the field Saturday.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The Gators were flagged 11 times for 103 yards, several of them stalling drives or extending ones on defense. Quite a drastic turn after the season-opening 55-0 win against FCS-classed Long Island when the Gators had zero penalties. They were a huge reason UF punted on six of its seven possessions in the second half.

UP NEXT: Florida (1-1) dives into the meat cleaver portion (the first one) of a 2025 schedule that is ranked as the most difficult in the country this season. The Gators open their SEC slate Sept. 13 with a night game at No. 3 LSU (1-0), which faces Louisiana Tech later tonight. Come what may, then it's a trip down the Florida Turnpike to face fifth-ranked Miami, which blew out the home team at "The Swamp" by a 41-17 count a year ago.

WHAT HAPPENED: LSU safety Dashawn Spears returned one of DJ Lagway's career-high five interceptions 58 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to break open a close game, as the third-ranked Tigers went on to a 20-10 defeat of the visiting Florida Gators in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday night at sold-out Tiger Stadium. Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier passed for 220 yards and a touchdown, but it was the LSU defense that dictated and determined the outcome. The Tigers thoroughly frustrated and confused Lagway, the sophomore who repeatedly made ill-advised throws either under duress or into double- or triple-coverage. The Gators also undermined themselves with another night of costly penalties, committing seven for 57 yards (all through the first three quarters), including three holding penalties, one of which cost UF an 87-yard touchdown pass. The UF defense played admirably, holding the Tigers to just 316 yards, 10 first downs and came up with an interception early in the fourth quarter when the Gators, trailing by 10, sorely needed to make a play. Lagway, though, after working the offense into LSU territory, forced a deep pass into triple coverage down the middle on the third-and-9 from the 36. The ball was intercepted in the end zone by defensive back Tamarcus Cooley with 11 minutes remaining. The Gators' defense, though, forced a punt and Lagway, after starting at his 15, moved UF to the LSU 39, and in field-goal range, to possibly make it a one-score game late. But under pressure, Lagway danced in the backfield and tried to make a desperation, cross-field throw into heavy coverage. That one was picked off at the LSU sideline by defensive back DJ Pickett with 2:07 to go. Three plays later, on third-and-1 from the LSU 46, tailback Caden Durham ripped off a 51-yard run to the Florida 3, where the Tigers ran out the clock. Lagway, who missed virtually the entire offseason and most of preseason practice dealing with shoulder and calf injuries, finished 33 of 49 for 287 yards, one touchdown, the five picks and was sacked three times. The Gators out-gained the Tigers on the night, finishing with 366 yards (only 79 rushing), but the turnovers and penalties killed them. Both teams mostly struggled during a first half that ended with LSU's Damian Ramos drilling a 45-yard field goal as time expired to lead 13-10. The Gators took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a 45-yard Trey Smack field goal and -- for a moment -- thought they had jumped ahead 10-0 on an 87-yard touchdown strike from Lagway to tailback Jadan Baugh. Instead, the play was called back for holding and UF had to punt from its end zone. LSU tied the game on a Ramos' 47-yarder on the ensuing possession. The Tigers took the lead when Nussmeier hit wideout Zavion Thomas for a 23-yard scoring strike to cap a 10-play, 76-yard drive with 7:33 to go in the half. The Gators, though, matched it with a near-identical 10-play, 75-yard drive, with Lagway lofting a perfect pass to Aidan Mizell for a 10-yard score on third-and-9 that tied the game at 10 with 3:25 to go before intermission. That's where it should have stood at halftime, but Lagway tried to force a pass to freshman wideout Vernell Brown III for his second interception, with the Tigers taking over at the UF 40. Aided by a pass-interference call (and despite a false-start penalty), Ramos was able to give LSU a 13-10 lead on the final play of the half. The only score after the break was the game-sealing pick-6. For the second consecutive week, the Florida defense gave up just one touchdown in a loss. Sophomore running back Jadan Baugh (13) on the move Saturday against the Tigers.

What it Means: More noise. More adversity. More pressure. And more great opponents on the immediate horizon (read on)

In the Spotlight: The LSU secondary had a bead on Lagway all night. With good pressure up front, the Tigers' DBs sat back and locked in on the Gators' QB as he stared down his receivers.

Staggering Statistic: Lagway became the first Florida quarterback to throw at least five interceptions in a game since Shane Matthews threw five in a 30-6 loss at Mississippi State in 1992. The last UF quarterback to throw at least four in a game was Rex Grossman in a 17-14 loss at Ole Miss in 2002. The last time LSU intercepted at least four passes in a game occurred in 2021, when the Tigers picked off four passes (two each from UF's Emory Jones and Anthony Richardson) in defeating the Gators 49-42 at Baton Rouge.

Up Next: Florida (1-2) continues its harrowing run of ranked opponents with a road date at No. 5 Miami (3-0), which destroyed 18th-ranked South Florida 49-12 Saturday at Miami Gardens, a week after the Bulls came to "The Swamp" and did their well-chronicled damage in handing the Gators a stinging 18-16 loss. The prime-time UF-UM showdown will mark the Gators' first road date against the Hurricanes since 2013 (a 21-16 loss) and likely the last regular-season meeting between the two programs for a long time, given the SEC's expansion to a nine-game league schedule starting next season.

WHAT HAPPENED: Running backs CharMar Brown and Mark Fletcher Jr. each rushed for short touchdowns in the final four minutes and No. 4 Miami staved off a Florida second-half push for a 26-7 victory in their cross-state rivalry showdown Saturday night at Hard Rock Stadium. Brown's 1-yard run with 4:08 remaining capped a 13-play, 80-yard drive after the Gators, completely stifled (and shut out) in the first half, awakened in the third quarter with an impressive scoring march that turned what was looking like a rout into a one-possession game at 13-7. Brown's score made it 19-7, as UM missed the two-point try. The TD came after UF had a chance to take the lead -- or at least cut Miami's six-point edge in half -- after forcing a Carson Beck interception on the first play after scoring its touchdown. The Gators, though, could not capitalize, while the Hurricanes bowed up and put things away in the fourth quarter. After Brown's score, Florida went four plays and out, turning the ball over on downs deep in its own territory. Miami answered with a four-play, 22-yard drive that ended with Fletcher bowling over from the 1 to cap the scoring. Beck, the Georgia transfer, completed 17 of 30 passes for 160 yards and a pick, but it was the UM rushing game, which cranked out 184 yards on 46 attempts, that proved the difference. Fletcher Jr. rushed 24 times for 116 yards, while Brown toted 18 times for 80. The Hurricanes finished with 344 total yards versus just 141 by the Gators, the team's fewest since gaining just 139 in a 30-3 loss to Oregon State in the 2022 Las Vegas Bowl. The Gators managed just seven first downs and 0-for-13 on third-down conversion opportunities. Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway, a week after throwing five interceptions in a loss at LSU, had another frustrating night, completing just 12 of 23 passes for 61 yards, a career-low in games he has started. Lagway's longest completion went for 12 yards and he was sacked four times. UF got the ball to open the game and the Gators' first three plays, all runs, looked like this; minus-3, minus-1, minus-1, It was a preview of things to come. UM took the ensuing punt and drove 56 yards in seven plays, with Brown powering in from the 2 for a 7-0 lead and the first opening-drive touchdown against the Florida defense in 12 games. The Hurricanes made it look easy. Florida's second series went like the first; another three-and-out. Miami converted three consecutive third downs before a sack of Beck by freshman Jayden Woods forced the Canes to settle for the first of two field goals in the period. Carter Davis hit a 53-varder less than a minute into the period and laater a 28-varder with just over a minute to play in the half to take a 13-0 lead to the locker room. The Gators went to intermission with just 32 yards of offense, including only four on the ground, on 22 plays (1.45 per snap) and one first down. It looked like it would be all Miami. Until it didn't. The Hurricanes got the ball to start the second half and eventually punted. The Gators took over at their 20 and instantly looked like a different team. The offensive line began moving the UM defensive front, starting with a 27-yard by Ja'Kobi Jackson that almost equaled the team's entire offensive output of the first half. A 10-yard completion to Vernell Brown III and 11-yard run by Jadan Baugh set up a 4th-and-2 at the UM 12 that Lagway converted on a keeper around the right side. Two plays later, Baugh went to that same side for a 7-yard touchdown that suddenly made a completely lopsided game into a 13-7 contest. On the very next snap from scrimmage, Beck threw late down the middle on first down and was intercepted by UF's Cormani McClain near midfield. The Gators had a fourth and 3 at the UM 45, but Lagway threw short of the line to gain, with TJ Abrams tackled after a 2-yard gain on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Florida defense, though, forced a three-and-out, with UF still down by just six points. On third-and-1 at the Gators' 27, an inside handoff to Baugh was blown up in the backfield, forcing the Gators to punt the ball away with 11:20 to go. Miami started at its 20 and went to work on the first of its two late fourth-quarter TD marches. That one basically sealed the victory.

What it Means: More of the same, relative to adversity, only with no game to potentially quiet the noise this week. Read on

In the Spotlight: The defense, like the previous two weeks, kept the Gators in the game. Through nearly 56 minutes, the unit had allowed just one touchdown (like it did in the loss at LSU and the home loss the week before against South Florida), but only had so much resistance left in the fourth quarter after the Florida offense could not stay on the field.

Staggering Statistic: The Gators have lost three of their first four games for the first time in 39 years. In 1986, UF opened with a 38-14 win over Division I-AA Georgia Southern, then lost at home to No. 2 Miami 23-15 and No. 4 Alabama 21-7 in consecutive weeks, followed by a 16-10 road defeat at Mississippi State. The Gators, who were in the final year under crippling NCAA sanctions, lost a fourth in a row, 28-17 at home against LSU, then reeled off five wins in their final six games to finish 6-6.

Up Next: Florida (1-3, 0-1) has a much-needed open date to process their latest loss, but will return to action Oct. 4 with a home Southeastern Conference game against Texas (3-1, 0-0), currently ranked No. 10 in the nation after tumbling from No. 1 following an ugly season-opening 14-7 loss at third-ranked Ohio State. The Longhorns defeated Sam Houston State 55-0 Saturday night.

WHAT HAPPENED: Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway passed for 298 yards and a pair of touchdowns, with true freshman wide receiver Dallas Wilson accounting for the better part of those numbers in a spectacular collegiate debut Saturday, as Florida upset No. 9 Texas 29-21 before a sold-out and rollicking crowd at Spurrier/Florida Field that badly needed a game (and result) like this one. The finish was on the wild side, with the Longhorns scoring on a 1-yard Quintrevion Wisner run with 3:20 to go, then forcing a three-and-out and Gators punt, with UT taking over at its 31 with 54 seconds to go. On first down, UT quarterback Arch Manning was sacked by Kamran James and freshman Jayden Woods for a 12-yard loss, with Manning's helmet coming off and, by rule, forcing him to the sidelines for one play. Enter backup Matthew Caldwell, who fired a 26-yard completion, with UF also being flagged for a personal foul on the play. The 41-yard gain put UT at the UF 40 and Manning re-entering the game with 18 seconds remaining. The next (and final) three plays looked this this: incompletion; sack by UF edge George Gumbs Jr.; and a desperation spike by Manning to try (in vain) and stop the clock with one second remaining. Instead, the game ended and so did Florida's three-game losing streak. Lagway, in bouncing back from a three-week run of poor play, completed 21 of 28 passes (75%) and keyed an offense that cranked out 457 total yards against a Longhorns' defense that began the day ranked fourth overall nationally (211.0 yards per game) -- as well as second in scoring (7.8 points per) -- and 16th against the pass (151.3 yards per). UF sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh carried a career-high 27 times for 107 yards and a touchdown, as the Gators grounded out 159 yards against the nation's No. 3 rush defense (just 59.8 per game) and did not allow Lagway to be sacked. But it was Wilson, the 6-foot-3, 213-pound five-star prospect out of Tampa Bay Tech, who lit up the stadium and introduced himself to Gator Nation in stunning fashion. After missing the season's first four games with a foot injury, Wilson hauled in six receptions for 111 yards and both of Lagway's TDs; a 13-yarder in the first half and electrifying 55-yard catch-and-run in the second half that gave UF a 15-point lead with 38 seconds remaining in the third quarter and set up the final and frantic (for the home team and crowd) fourth period. Texas, which came in averaging 438 yards and 31.8 points a game, was limited to 341 yards, including just 52 on the ground. Manning, the sophomore with Hall-of-Fame family pedigree, completed 16 of 29 passes for 263 yards and a pair of scores, but also threw a pair of interceptions (one in the fourth quarter) and was sacked six times. The Gators used a near-flawless first half to take a 19-7 lead into the locker room. The lone flaw miscue was a fumble by tight end Havden Hansen after a completion into Texas territory that led to UT's only score of the half when UF was threatening to blow the game open. UF took the opening kickoff and marched 84 yards in a methodical 13 plays, with Baugh scoring on a 5-yard run on third-and-1. The Florida defense forced a Texas punt on the Longhorns' first possession and answered with another long drive (10 plays, 64 yards) that Trey Smack capped with a 34-yard field goal for a 10-0 lead. The Gators were threatening yet again when Hansen caught a 13-yard pass and coughed up the ball at the Texas 40 on a hit by Ty'Anthony Smith. Linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. scooped and returned the play to UF 45. Manning's 33-yard pass to Parker Livingstone got the Longhorns to the 10 and Wisner scored the first of his two TDs on a 5-yard swing pass to make it 10-7. Lagway, who was playing through some pain, went back to work, with completions of 11 yards to Vernell Brown III, 19 to J. Michael Sturdivant and 18 to Wilson, all mixed with some nice running from backup freshman tailback Duke Clark (9 carries, 38 yards), who was on for injured backup Ja'Kobi Jackson. Lagway finished the drive by firing a 13-yard scoring dart to Wilson to make the score 17-7. Texas' next possession was a three-and-out, with UF fifth-year senior and former walk-on Taylor Spierto crashing the protection and blocking Jack Bouwmeester's punt out of the back of the end zone for a safety and 19-7 advantage. When the teams went to the locker room, Florida was up in total yards 263 to 87 (with a 113-24 differential on the ground), first downs 17 to five and had a nearly 10-minute advantage in time of possession. After the first three possessions of the third quarter ended in punts, the Gators struck midway through the period when Lagway bombed a 60-yard completion to Brown, who made a ridiculous catch in tight coverage at the UT 25. Florida, though, had to settle for Smack's 38-yard field goal, which kept the lead at two possessions, 22-7. But not for long. Manning struck for a 38yard TD pass to Ryan Wingo with 2:43 left in the third, drawing to within 22-14. Lagway and Wilson answered. The former hit the latter on a deep sidelined rout, with Wilson running through defenders and tight-roping the UT sidelines for an incredible 55-yard scoring that made it a 15-point margin again at 29-14. It held up, but not without a little late-game angst.

What it Means: To say Coach Billy Napier and his team needed a win like this would be a Century Tower-sized understatement. It doesn't mean the pressure is off, not even close -- and not with the schedule the Gators are staring down (read on) -- but the team and fan base has a week to feel better about itself. Last year demonstrated that Napier's players have his back. They do not quit. The Gators showed more of the same against the Longhorns, in improving to 3-9 under Napier against teams ranked in the top 10.

In the Spotlight: Take a wild guess. Wilson's catches, yards and touchdowns were all single-game records for a UF freshman receiver playing in his first collegiate game. Think about that relative to the superstar wideouts who have come through this program over the years.

Staggering Statistic: For Longhorns coach Steve Sarkisian, the loss was his first in 18 games at UT when his team was ranked in the top 10 and facing an unranked opponent. Worth noting, Florida lost 49-17 at Texas last season, a game they trailed at one point 42-0.

Up Next: Florida (2-3, 1-1) gets to enjoy this one for ... oh ... about 20 minutes, then must begin preparations for next week's road date at No. 6 Texas A&M (4-0, 1-0), making for a fourth top-10 opponent in the Gators' first six games of the season (with more on the way). The Aggies, who were home against Mississippi State late Saturday night, whipped the Gators 33-20 in Gainesville last season

WHAT HAPPENED: What began as an offensive shootout between Florida and Texas A&M at Kyle Field turned into an all-too-familiar result for the Gators: another road loss. The Gators remained winless away from The Swamp, losing 34-17 to the host Aggies on Saturday night. Florida (2-4, 1-2 SEC) dropped to 0-3 away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in losing for the second consecutive season to Texas A&M. The fifth-ranked Aggies (6-0, 3-0) iced their sixth consecutive victory with a 12-play, 53-yard drive in the fourth quarter to extend their lead to 31-17 with 4:39 remaining. Texas A&M running back Rueben Owens II capped the 8-plus-minute drive with a 2-yard touchdown run. The Aggies gained possession after stopping the Gators on downs. With UF trailing 24-17 and facing a fourth-and-6 from the Aggies' 49, Florida head coach Billy Napier opted to go for it. Quarterback DJ Lagway's pass to Vernell Brown III dropped incomplete, and Texas A&M took over and proceeded to march down the field. Lagway finished 21 of 37 for 245 yards and two touchdowns. "We were right there. We had our opportunities," Napier said. "We just have to make plays. We've got to stay the course, and we're going to have opportunities to play better moving forward. Offensively, we started fast and then settled in on defense. In general, we didn't sack their guy, and we struggled to protect DJ at times. Once we settled in on defense, I thought the effort was there. Our kids battled their ass off." Meanwhile, the teams traded punches early as Florida (157) and Texas A&M (196) combined for 353 yards in a back-and-forth first quarter, which ended in a 14-14 tie. Florida averaged 9.1 yards per play in the opening quarter, Texas A&M 13.1. The offensive fireworks flamed out over the next two quarters as the defenses caught up and surrendered only 244 yards (Florida 101, Texas A&M 143) over the second and third quarters. Still, the game was within reach for the Gators when safety Jordan Castell picked off Aggies quarterback Marcel Reed in the end zone on the first play of the fourth quarter. Lagway hit J. Michael Sturdivant for 27 yards on the next play to move Florida near midfield. But four plays later, the drive stalled and the Gators turned it over on downs, sparking a roar from the announced crowd of 105,086. The teams traded field goals in the third quarter. Texas A&M stretched the lead to 24-14 with 10:42 left in the third quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Randy Bond. The Aggies gained possession at UF's 29-yard line when linebacker Daymion Sanford forced Brown III to fumble, which was recovered by Aggies linebacker Taurean York, Five plays later, Bond split the uprights for Texas A&M's largest lead of the game at that point. The Gators answered with a nine-play, 47-yard drive that ended with a 45-yard field goal by Trey Smack to make it 24-17. The field goal was the 44th of Smack's career, moving him into fourth place in school history. The Gators struck first when Lagway led them on an eight-play, 75-yard drive on the opening possession. Lagway finished the drive with a 1-yard scoring throw to tight end Amir Jackson. It was Jackson's first career touchdown. The Aggies responded with scoring drives of 75, 81 and 75 yards on their first three possessions. Reed scored on an 8-yard run to make it 7-7, and after the Aggies forced a punt, Reed connected with Jamarion Morrow for a 22-yard touchdown. The Gators answered with Lagway's 6-yard touchdown pass to freshman receiver Dallas Wilson, but Florida's defense had no answer for the Aggies early. Texas A&M drove 75 yards on 11 plays, taking a 21-14 lead on a 22-yard touchdown run by Ja'Veon Moss, who left the game with an injury later in the first half. Reed finished 16 of 26 for 234 yards and added 37 yards rushing. "We're close, but close is not good enough," linebacker Myles Graham said. "We're right there, but we have to be better."

What it Means: For now, another week on the seesaw for the Gators, who, after upsetting No. 9 Texas at home last week to snap a three-game losing streak, could not sustain the momentum of a feel-good victory. The Gators sit with four losses in six games at midseason after starting the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top 25.

In the Spotlight: The return home for Lagway, who grew up about 65 miles away from Kyle Field in Willis, Texas, started fast and furious as he threw two touchdowns on Florida's first three drives, However, the offense stalled as the Aggies turned up the pressure on Lagway, who was sacked

Staggering Statistic: The Gators played hard and responded to some early shots from the Aggies, but they could not overcome their inability to beat a ranked team on the road on Napier's watch. Florida dropped to 0-14 in games away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium against ranked opponents, including losses at LSU, Miami and Texas A&M this season. They dropped to 0-10 in true road games vs. ranked teams under Napier.

Up Next: The Gators return home to face Mississippi State (4-2, 0-2) on Homecoming at The Swamp. The Bulldogs were off Saturday after losing a week ago to Texas A&M, 31-9, at Kyle Field. The good news for the Gators is that, unlike their last four opponents, the Bulldogs are not ranked in the top 10.

WHAT HAPPENED: Sophomore defensive tackle Michai Boireau came up with an improbable. game-saving interception with 21 seconds left allowing Florida to escape Saturday night with a 23-21 homecoming victory over Southeastern Conference foe Mississippi State before a sold-out crowd at Spurrier/Florida Field. The Bulldogs were thisclose to their first SEC win in two years. Quarterback Blake Shapen, after a UF punt with 1:38 remaining, drove the MSU offense to Florida 29 — well within Kyle Ferrie's field-goal range — and faced a second-and-10 out of timeout with 29seconds to go. Shapen, who'd riddled the Florida defense for 324 yards through the air, dropped and looked for wideout Anthony Evans III, already with 11 catches for 105 yards, on a crossing route slanting from the right. What Shapen did not see was Boireau, the 6-foot-5, 349-pound sophomore defensive lineman, dropping into shallow coverage. Shapen fired a pass and Boireau, maybe 10 yards away, stuck his gloved hands in the air and snagged a remarkable pick thrown from pointblank range, saving the day and icing the win as the "Swamp" went berserk. UF sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh carried 23 times for a career-high 150 yards and a touchdown, while senior Trey Smack kicked three field goals, including a 53-yarder with 6:49 to play that proved the difference, as MSU staged its late comeback attempt. Gators sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway completed 20 of 34 passes for 280 yards, did not throw a touchdown and was intercepted twice. Shapen completed 24 of 36 passes with the lone interception, while MSU tailback Davin Booth rushed 22 times for 105 yards and two scores. Mississippi State finished with 468 yards of total offense to Florida's 452. The Bulldogs took an early lead, thanks to a 48-yard Shapen-to-Evans completion on the second play from scrimmage that set the visitors up at the UF 21. Five plays later, running back Kamario Taylor replaced Shapen and scored on a 2-yard run from the wildcat formation for a 7-0 lead less than three minutes in. The Gators cut into the margin, courtesy of a 29-yard Smack field goal at the 8:55 mark of the first, then took a 10-7 lead on the second snap of the second quarter when Baugh busted off a 19-yard scoring dash to finish a six-play, 69-yard drive. UF extended the lead to 13-7 when Smack bombed a 54-vard field goal on a drive that included a 60-vard touchdown run by Baugh called back — the fourth TD erased by penalty for the Gators this season — for holding downfield on Eugene Wilson III. After a scoreless third period, UF finished an 11-play, 93-yard drive with tailback KD Daniels scoring from a vard out on a direct-snap run that pushed the Gators ahead 20-7 with 13:41 remaining. UF lined up to go for a two-point conversion, but got called for having 12 men on the field and was forced to settle for the kick and 13-point margin. The Bulldogs needed just five plays to offset that TD, with Booth finishing a 65-yard drive with a 2-yard run with 11:57 to go that closed the home team's margin to 20-14. With the game in the balance, Florida's best offense turned out to be Mississippi State's defense, as the Bulldogs were flagged for two personal fouls over the next six snaps, including a roughing-the-passer call on a failed third-down conversion, that helped UF move to the MSU 31. The Gators did themselves no favors with a offensive pass interference penalty, but Smack was good from 53 yards (the eighth field goal of at least 50 yards of his career) and the Florida lead was 23-14 inside seven minutes remaining. That's when Shapen zapped the Gators for a five-play, 65-yard drive, aided by an end-zone pass interference call against linebacker Jadan Robinson on an incompletion on third-and-goal from the 8. Booth scored from the 2 two plays later to make the score 23-21 with two minutes to go. Lagway and his offense took over with a chance to close out the game with a first down, but on third-and-1 from UF 34 the call from the sidelines was for a pass play and Lagway was sacked for a seven-yard loss that forced a punt. Mississippi State took over at its 28 with 1:32 remaining. Seventy-three seconds later, Michai Boireau was a household name in Gator Nation.

What it Means: The Gators won a fifth straight SEC home game and gave their head coach (and enthusiastic crowd) a sorely needed victory. Read on.

In the Spotlight: In a vacuum, the answer would be Boireau or Baugh or maybe even Smack. But all eyes, heading into the upcoming bye week, will be locked in on the status of Coach Billy Napier, who improved to 22-23 in his four UF seasons.

Staggering Statistic: Mississippi State is now 0-11 in SEC play under second-year coach Jeff Lebby. The Bulldogs have lost 15 consecutive league games, dating to the 2023 season.

Up Next: Florida (3-4, 2-2) will have its second open date of the season on Oct. 25, then resume play Nov. 1 with their annual showdown against Georgia at Jacksonville. The Bulldogs (6-1, 4-1), who started the day ranked ninth in the nation, claimed a come-from-behind 43-35 home defeat Saturday over fifth-ranked and previously unbeaten Ole Miss.

WHAT HAPPENED: The Gators responded with a gutsy performance in their first game under interim head coach Billy Gonzales, but not a winning one in their annual Southeastern Conference clash against Georgia here at EverBank Stadium. The final result was a 24-20 loss to the fifthranked Bulldogs (7-1, 5-1) in a game the Gators (3-5, 2-3) had an opportunity to win in the fourth quarter. Florida took a 20-17 lead on a 54-yard field goal by Trey Smack with 14:52 left in the game. The kick was Smack's school-record ninth of his career of 50 yards or more. However, the Bulldogs had enough time to stifle Florida's upset bid for their fifth consecutive win in the rivalry, Georgia's longest run of success over the Gators since a six-game win streak from 1978 to 1983. In their first game with Gonzales in charge, the Gators failed on a pair of fourth-down conversions in the final quarter that proved costly. Gonzales said he had "no regrets" about the decisions and stated that the Gators showed what they are made of after a tumultuous two weeks following the firing of head coach Billy Napier. "I'm super proud of the way they bonded together. The guys played extremely hard," Gonzales said. "They don't have any quit in their DNA. We came here to win, but we came up short. The Gators expect to win. There are no moral victories. You either win or you lose." A pivotal moment for the Gators came after Smack's field goal. Leading 20-17 and at Georgia's 18-yard line, Gonzales opted to go for it on fourth-and-1 instead of running Smack out for another field goal. Running back Jordan Baugh was stopped for no gain, and Georgia took over with 7:54 remaining. The Bulldogs drove down the field and took the lead on a 36-yard run by Chauncey Bowens that capped a seven-play, 82-yard drive with 4:36 left. The Gators never recovered from the massive momentum swing.

On the ensuing drive after Georgia regained the lead, the Gators were forced to go for it on fourthand-4 from their 30 with 3:13 remaining. Lagway's pass was broken up, and the Bulldogs took possession and ran out the clock.

The loss was difficult for the Gators to swallow.

"It stinks. It stinks" said fifth-year senior defensive lineman Tyreak Sapp, who will finish his career without a win in the rivalry. "It hurts real bad, knowing this is my last time playing in this game."

The teams traded scores in the third quarter. First, Georgia's Gunner Stockton tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to Noah Thomas to put the Bulldogs up, 17-10, with 10:46 left in the quarter. Florida responded with a 12-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 2-yard scoring run by Baugh. The drive consumed more than seven minutes and tied the score, 17-17, with 3:37 left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs helped Florida's cause with a pair of pass interference calls. After Gators running back KD Daniels picked up a first down with a three-yard gain on third-and-2 from Georgia's 31, Bulldogs linebacker Raylen Wilson was flagged for interference against Baugh. The penalty moved the Gators to Georgia's 13, and on third-and-4 from the 7, Lagway's pass intended for TJ Abrams in the end zone dropped incomplete. But a pass interference call against Georgia's Zion Branch gave the Gators a first down at the 2, and Baugh plunged in for the score on the next play. Georgia scored on its opening drive when Stockton connected with Dillon Bell for an 8-yard touchdown pass. Lagway hit Eugene Wilson III for a 40-yard touchdown later in the first quarter to tie the game, and Smack's 22-yard field goal with 3:02 left in the opening quarter gave Florida a 10-7 lead, marking the first time since 2016 that the Gators led the Bulldogs after the first quarter.

What it Means: The Gators failed to move to .500 for the third consecutive time, despite having an opportunity. The Gators were 1-2 when they lost at Miami. They were 2-3 when they lost at Texas A&M. And on Saturday, with an opportunity to move to 4-4, they dropped to 3-5 with four regular-season games left. To avoid a losing record, the Gators must win at least three of those remaining games: at Kentucky, at Ole Miss, and at home against Tennessee and Florida State.

In the Spotlight: The Gators were without their leading receiver, Vernell Brown III, and fellow receiver Aidan Mizell due to injuries. That provided junior Eugene Wilson III an opportunity to shine, and he did. Wilson led the Gators with nine catches for 121 yards. Wilson surpassed his season yardage total (118) entering the game. Wilson continued to be Lagway's favorite target in the second half after freshman Dallas Wilson left the game due to a foot injury.

Staggering Statistic: The Gators ran only 22 plays in the first half compared to 42 for Georgia. Still, the game was tied 10-10 at halftime. Meanwhile, Florida's lack of success on third down continued in its first game under Gonzales. The Gators finished 2 of 11 on third-down conversions and 0-for-2 on fourth down.

Up Next: Florida (3-5, 2-3) remains away from home with a road game at Kentucky. The Wildcats (2-5, 0-5) played Saturday night at Auburn in search of their first conference victory. The Gators have not had success in their last two trips to Lexington, losing in 2021 and 2023. The back-to-back losses came after Florida won 16 in a row at Kentucky from 1988 to 2019.

WHAT HAPPENED: Once upon a time, not so long ago, playing a road game at Southeastern Conference foe Kentucky was nothing more than a weekend pleasure trip for the Gators. There was nothing fun about what happened at Kroger Field on Saturday night if you were on the Florida sideline. Kentucky blitzed the Gators for 21 points in the second quarter and never looked back in a 38-7 runaway victory. The Wildcats (4-5, 2-5) snapped a 10-game home losing streak to SEC opponents, defeating a conference opponent at home for the first time since their 33-14 win over the Gators two years ago. Add the 2021 loss at Kroger Field to the list, and Florida (3-6, 2-4) has dropped three consecutive road games against Kentucky and five of eight overall since a 31-game win streak in the series was snapped in 2018. Wildcats quarterback Cutter Boley was 14 of 19 for 150 yards, completed 11 consecutive passes during one stretch, threw two touchdowns and had an interception in the first half to put Kentucky up 24-7 at the break. Meanwhile, UF quarterback DJ Lagway was 11 of 19, one touchdown and three interceptions in the opening half. That prompted Gators interim head coach Billy Gonzales to replace Lagway with freshman Tramell Jones Jr. at the start of the second half. Jones finished 9 of 17 for 60 yards. "Obviously, it wasn't anywhere close to what we wanted," Gonzales said. "Not acceptable in any terms to take a loss like we did." Trouble started for Florida when it drove to the Kentucky 44 on its opening drive, the big play a 22-yard pass from Lagway to receiver Vernell Brown III. However, three plays later, Lagway was picked off by Wildcats defensive back Ty Bryant, who returned the interception 17 yards to midfield. The Wildcats took advantage of the turnover with a 10-play, 30-yard drive that ended with a 39-yard field goal by Jacob Kauwe for a 3-0 lead. Kentucky delivered the Gators a return gift later in the first quarter. Florida took a 7-3 lead after Rocco Underwood covered a muffed punt by Kentucky's Ja'Mori Maclin at the Wildcats' 13. Three plays later, Lagway connected with running back Jadan Baugh for a 10yard scoring pass. However, the Wildcats regained momentum on their next possession, driving 75 yards on nine plays. Boley hit J.J. Hester for a 29-yard touchdown for the go-ahead score. Kentucky then tightened its grip when a KD Daniels fumble was recovered by Cam Dooley with 9:43 left in the first half. Five plays later, Boley connected with Jason Patterson for a 15-yard scoring pass and a 17-7 lead. Before the first half was over, the Wildcats added to their lead on a 2-vard touchdown run by Seth McGowan. McGowan scored on a 5-yard run in the second half, and Dante Dowdell capped the rout with a 65-yard touchdown scamper in the fourth quarter. The 31-point loss was Florida's worst to Kentucky since a 40-6 defeat in Lexington in 1950, and the Gators' most-lopsided loss to an unranked opponent since a 46-15 loss at Alabama in 1970, "It's really shocking, honestly," linebacker Myles Graham said. "It's really embarrassing, and I did not know we were going to come out and play like that. I'm really blindsided, just like everybody else is. We gotta look in the mirror, and we got to do better. "That's completely unacceptable." Meanwhile, while the Gators need to win their final three regular-season games to avoid a losing record, who will play quarterback is unclear. Lagway walked dejectedly to the sideline after his third interception Saturday and took a seat alone on the bench. He has now thrown more interceptions (12) than touchdowns (11) this season. "We had a rough first half, and I thought it might be good for him just to gather and look at it from a coach's point from the sideline," Gonzales said. "But we need to play better all around, not just him. I think if you take a look at what we do and where we need to be, it's unacceptable, and I'm going to put me up in front and say, 'that's on me.' I'll take the blame for this loss, 100%. So, we gotta be better and I've got to be better to make sure these players can continue forward."

What it Means: Florida's season faces a different challenge with three games remaining — including home contests against traditional rivals Tennessee and Florida State. When it was revealed on the SEC Network's telecast that UF sophomore receiver Tank Hawkins had opted not to play Saturday to maintain redshirt status this season, it raised eyebrows considering the Gators were already without injured receivers Eugene Wilson III, Dallas Wilson and Taylor Spierto. Keeping the team together has been a talking point since the midseason coaching change, and as the losses pile up, that can become more difficult.

In the Spotlight: Making his 16th career start on Saturday night, Florida quarterback DJ Lagway was benched for the first time in his college career at the start of the second half. Lagway threw three interceptions in the first half and struggled to make on-target throws. The benching is the latest development in what has been a disappointing season for the sophomore from Willis, Texas. He missed the bulk of spring camp and preseason camp due to a variety of injuries and has been unable to duplicate his success from a season ago when he led the Gators to six wins in his seven starts.

Staggering Statistic: Florida entered the game ranked 129th among 134 FBS teams in third-down conversion rate, converting at a measly 30.4% (31 of 102) clip after going 2-for-11 in the loss to Georgia. What did the Gators do on Saturday night at Kentucky? They converted 5 of 7 third downs in the first half — and trailed 24-7. Go figure.

Up Next: Florida (3-6, 2-4) is back on the road again, this time for what figures to be a fascinating date at Ole Miss, chock full of pregame storylines and speculation (see Kiffin, Lane). The Rebels (9-1, 5-1) crushed The Citadel 49-0 on Saturday and remain in contention for a College Football Playoff berth. Meanwhile, the Gators must win to avoid a winless season away from The Swamp.



STEVE SPURRIER - FLORIDA FIELD

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live." Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored opponents, 8,344 to 3,683 in 225 games inside The Swamp, putting the average outcome at 37.1 to 16.4 (20.7 points).
- The Gators had two significant win streaks in The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23game run from 1990-93, and a school-record 30-game streak from 1994-99.
- In 225 home games from 1990 through today, the Gators have...

Scored 50+ points.....54 times Scored 40+ points.....91 times Scored 30+ points.....145 times Shut Out Opponents......18 times Allowed 3 points or less......33 times Allowed 14 points or less......116 times

- Florida's school-record crowd of 90,916 on Nov. 28, 2015 marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 16 Super Bowls, four BCS National Championship Games and the 2017 and 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The largest crowd for a home opener was 90,799 (Sept. 3, 2022 Utah). The 2005 opener vs. Wyoming remains the second-largest.
