### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This will be the 27th meeting all-time between the Rebels and Gators, the first in Oxford since 2020.
- Florida leads the series 13-12-2, including a 6-2 mark in Oxford.
- The Rebels are on their second-longest AP poll streak ever at 45 straight since 2023, trailing only 73 from 1957-63.
- The Rebels currently rank No. 6 in ESPN's Strength of Record metric and No. 12 in its Football Power Index.
- Ole Miss is 9-1 for the first time since 1962 and only the eighth time in its history ... A win Saturday would make head coach **Lane Kiffin** the first in program history with three consecutive 10-win seasons.
- Ole Miss is 7-0 at home for the third time in its history, all under Kiffin (2021, '23) ... A win would mark the first-ever eight-win home season at Ole Miss.
- Ole Miss is 34-3 in its last 37 home games and 20-1 at home since the start of the 2023 season ... In that span, Ole Miss is averaging 41.0 points and 520.7 yards per game at home.
- Ole Miss is 48-14 under **Lane Kiffin** since 2021 and ranks third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- Since the start of 2020, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams lead all FBS schools at 502.1 yards per game.
- RB **Kewan Lacy** leads the nation with 16 rushing TD, which is also tied for the Ole Miss single-season record ... Lacy also ranks second nationally in missed tackles forced (69) and fourth in carries (200).
- QB **Trinidad Chambliss** owns four games with 300 passing yards and 50 rushing yards, second-most by any SEC QB in the last 30 years behind LSU's Jayden Daniels during his 2023 Heisman season (6).
- Ole Miss leads the FBS in 30-yard plays (36) and owns the SEC's third-fastest offense (23.2 seconds/play).
- Across its last three games, Ole Miss has 27 tackles for loss and 11 sacks while yielding 231.7 yards per game.

**PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS:** Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (12:10 p.m. CT). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

**SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE:** Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at 12:50 p.m. CT, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season.

**WORKING CREDENTIALS:** To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: [www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss](http://www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss). Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials.

**PARKING:** Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes are digital and must be requested during credential application process.

**MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL:** Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS:** All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

**SIDELINE ACCESS:** Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

**VIDEO CONTENT:** Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of Ole Miss Athletics. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: [www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos](http://www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos). Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

**RECRUITS:** Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

**RADIO RIGHTS:** The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on OleMissSports.com and airs on ESPN.

**COREY ADAMS: 2006-2025**



This season, the Rebels will wear helmet decals in memory of freshman defensive end **Corey Adams**, who was tragically killed on July 19. Adams, a member of the 2024-25 Ole Miss signing class, enrolled at Ole Miss early and participated in spring drills while earning Dean's Honor Roll accolades in the classroom. Adams, a native of New Orleans, was a unanimous three-star prospect coming out of Edna Karr High School and was rated as high as the No. 16 overall recruit in Louisiana.

### LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST FLORIDA

#### Nov. 23, 2024 • Oxford, Miss. • Florida 24, #9 Ole Miss 17

No. 9 Ole Miss outgained Florida by 100 yards at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, but the Rebels were unable to turn production into points, going 0-for-3 in the red zone and turning the ball over three times in a 24-17 defeat. Jaxson Dart was 24-for-41 for 323 yards with two touchdowns but three interceptions on each of the last two Rebel drives as Ole Miss couldn't complete a comeback.

#### Sept. 26, 2020 • Oxford, Miss. • #5 Florida 51, Ole Miss 35

Despite 613 yards of total offense, the Ole Miss Rebels had few answers for Florida as they fell 51-35 to the No. 5 ranked Florida Gators to open the 2020 season. Matt Corral completed 22 of 31 passes for 395 yards and three touchdown passes. Elijah Moore also had 10 catches for 227 yards, the second most in a single game in Ole Miss history and most against an SEC opponent in school history.

#### Sept. 30, 2015 • Gainesville, Fla. • #23 Florida 38, #3 Ole Miss 10

In front of a packed crowd of 90,585 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, No. 3 Ole Miss could not overcome a big deficit early in the game. No. 23 Florida scored the first 25 points of the game to hand the Rebels their first loss of the season, 38-10. Chad Kelly completed 26-of-40 passes for 259 yards.

#### Sept. 27, 2008 • Gainesville, Fla. • Ole Miss 31, #4 Florida 30

Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, ran for another score and led the Rebels to a stunning 31-30 victory at No. 4 Florida. Snead was 9-of-20 passing for 185 yards. His biggest was an 86-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge that put the Rebels ahead 31-24 with 5:26 to play. Tim Tebow was 24-of-38 passing for 319 yards and a touchdown.

#### Sept. 22, 2007 • Oxford, Miss. • Florida 30, Oxford 24

Tim Tebow set a school record for quarterbacks with 166 yards rushing, as his two passing touchdowns and two running scores propelled the Gators to victory, 30-24. Ole Miss cut Florida's lead to 27-24 late in the third quarter on Seth Adams' 71-yard touchdown strike to Mike Wallace.

**OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN**

**Lane Kiffin**, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program. Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths, including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances. Kiffin has tallied three 10-win seasons in Oxford, including Ole Miss' first-ever 11-win season. In 13 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 114-53, including a 53-19 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin came to Ole Miss from Florida Atlantic, where he turned around an FAU program that won nine games over the previous three seasons with two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

**FLORIDA INTERIM HEAD COACH BILLY GONZALES**

**Billy Gonzales**, who coaches wide receivers and took over as interim head coach mid October, is in his 12th overall season with the Gators after returning to Florida in 2023 for a third stint. In 2024, Gonzales helped guide Florida to a late-season charge, winning the last four games of the season to finish with an 8-5 record overall, with victories over No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, Florida State and Tulane in the 16th Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl. The Gators were one of just six unranked teams in the nation to post multiple top-25 wins on the year. He spent the 2022 season at Florida Atlantic as their wide receivers coach after spending four seasons in the same role for the Gators from 2018-21. Gonzales spent five years at Mississippi State prior to returning to Florida, where he served as co-offensive coordinator from 2014-17. The Colorado native has 32 years of college coaching experience, including stops at Illinois, LSU and Utah.

**GATOR SCOUTING REPORT**

Florida heads into Oxford with a 3-6 overall record and is 2-4 in SEC play, having dropped three of their last four games. Saturday's matchup against Ole Miss will mark the Gator's sixth top-10 matchup in the last eight weeks. Offensively, the Gators average 341 yards per game, with 217 of those coming through the air. DJ Lagway spearheads the Florida offense, completing 65 percent of his passes for 1,762 yards and 11 touchdowns on the season. Wideout Vernell Brown III leads the Florida receiving corps with 33 receptions for 473 yards. Jadan Baugh, a sophomore running back from Atlanta, ranks fifth in the SEC in rushing, averaging 83.0 yards per game. The Florida defense is allowing 347.2 yards and ranks top 25 nationally in red zone defense. Myles Graham leads Florida with 51 total tackles on the season, including 3.5 TFL. Defensive back Bryce Thornton is second on the team with 42 tackles and ranks No. 4 in the FBS with two fumble recoveries this season. Gator kicker Trey Smack is 14-for-17 on the season, including 4-for-5 beyond 50 yards.

**OLE MISS-FLORIDA SERIES HISTORY**

- This game will be the 27th all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Florida.
- Florida leads the series 13-12-2 dating back to its origin in 1926.
- Florida leads 6-2 in Oxford, while Ole Miss leads 6-5-1 in Gainesville.
- Ole Miss' last win vs. Florida was in 2008 in Gainesville (31-30), and its last in Oxford was in 2002 (17-14).

**FLASHBACK: LAST WIN vs. FLORIDA (at No. 4 Florida, Sept. 27, 2008)**

On Sept. 27, 2008, the unranked Rebels went into The Swamp and took down the 4th-ranked Gators, 31-30, a win that proved equally as important for Ole Miss in victory as it did Florida in defeat. For Ole Miss, the win was the 600th in program history, its first over a top-five opponent since 1977, its first top-five win on the road since 1962, and it helped set the stage for a 9-4 season that ended with a Cotton Bowl victory for Houston Nutt's first-year Rebel squad. For Florida, it spurred an iconic postgame speech from reigning Heisman Trophy winner, Tim Tebow, that inspired a dominant run to the BCS National Title, winning their remaining 10 games by an average of 33.8 points. Ole Miss QB Jevan Snead was 9-of-20 for 185 yards, two TDs, one interception and his first career rushing TD, but no play was bigger than his 86-yard pass to WR Shay Hodge that put the Rebels ahead 31-24 with 5:26 to play. DE Kentrell Lockett blocked Florida's PAT with 3:28 left in the game to keep Ole Miss in front, stymieing what would have been a game-tying drive by Tebow on a day that saw him go 24-of-38 for 319 yards and one TD. Hodge ended the day with three catches for 133 yards and that one crucial touchdown, while RB Dexter McCluster had 60 yards and one score on the ground.

### OLE MISS IN THE PLAYOFF ERA

Ole Miss came in at No. 6 in the first College Football Playoff committee rankings for the 2025, its second-highest CFP ranking ever behind a No. 4 slot in the very first CFP release in 2014. In the playoff era since 2014, Ole Miss has appeared in the first CFP rankings seven times with an average opening slot of 11.6. The Rebels have finished within the CFP top-25 five times, including four times within the top-12 during the four-team playoff era from 2014-23.

Ole Miss is right in the thick of the playoff conversation, with the 6th-ranked Rebels currently slated to host a first round game per the first College Football Playoff rankings released on Nov. 4. The Rebels have consistently been a top-10 team over the last several weeks, and own two AP ranked wins over No. 4 LSU on Sept. 27 (24-19) and at No. 13 Oklahoma on Oct. 25 (34-26). Against the current CFP top-25, Ole Miss is 1-1 with its win over the now 12th-ranked Sooners on Oct. 25 and a hard-fought 43-35 loss at current No. 5 Georgia on Oct. 18.

**CUSP OF HISTORY**

At 9-1, a win for Ole Miss head coach **Lane Kiffin** this Saturday vs. Florida would make him the first coach in program history with three consecutive 10-win seasons. Under Kiffin, the Rebels have broken the 10-win plateau three times already in 2021 (10-3), 2023 (11-2) and 2024 (10-3), with 2021 and 2023 also registering as the first 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss football history. In 2023, Kiffin's Rebels went one step further in notching the first 11-win campaign in program history, and if the Rebels win out it would mark the first 11-win regular season ever at Ole Miss. Another 10-win season would also tie Kiffin for the overall program record with John Vaught, who reached 10 wins four times in 1955, '59, '60 and '62.

Ole Miss has dismantled its attendance records the last several seasons, with the 2024 Rebels setting seven of the top-10 crowds all-time alone last season. This year, the 2025 Ole Miss squad owns four of the 10-best crowds ever at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, including the current fourth-best all-time of 67,737 against then No. 4 LSU. This season, the Rebels are averaging a capacity crowd of 66,577.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Vaught-Hemingway Stadium has been a safe haven for the Rebels historically, owning a 312-116-8 (.725) record all-time in Oxford before vacated wins (290-113-8), and that's been no different in the **Lane Kiffin** era. Ole Miss is 34-3 in its last 37 home games, and since the beginning of Kiffin's tenure in 2020, the Rebels have gone 34-6 overall at Vaught-Hemingway -- which includes a current 10-game home winning streak since Oct. 26, 2024 and a 14-game home winning streak that spanned Nov. 14, 2020 to Oct. 15, 2022. That streak was among the longest home winning streaks nationally when it was snapped by No. 9 Alabama in 2022. Under Kiffin, the Rebels have recorded the first two seven-win home seasons in program history in 2021, 2023 and now again in 2025, with this Saturday marking a chance for the first eight-win home season in Ole Miss football history.

### HOT AT HOME

Ole Miss has only lost at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium three times since the beginning of the 2021 season and only six times total in the **Lane Kiffin** era. That includes only one loss since the start of the 2023 season and a current 10-game home winning streak back to a 26-14 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 26, 2024. In that span, the Rebels have consistently put on a show for the Ole Miss faithful, welcoming in a grand total of 1,383,681 fans through its turnstiles since the beginning of 2023 -- good for a capacity crowd per game average of 65,889.

**RACKING UP THE YARDS**

Lane Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording four of the top-five and six of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history. Kiffin owns 29 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 19 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as eight of the top-10 performances all-time.

**GO FOR IT**

Ole Miss is 12-of-18 this year on fourth down. Under head coach **Lane Kiffin** since 2020, the Rebels have converted 62 percent of its fourth down tries (124 of 200), with at least 17 successes and at least 29 attempts each year.

**GROUND GAME**

Sophomore **Kewan Lacy** has been brilliant as Ole Miss' top rusher, currently leading the FBS in rushing touchdowns with 16 and tied for the national lead in all-purpose scores with those 16 rushing TDs. Lacy stands just one more rushing score away from breaking Quinshon Judkins' 2022 record, as well as tying the Ole Miss single-season all-purpose TD record set by Judkins and several others. Lacy's season ranks highly in other categories as well, as he also leads the SEC in rushing attempts (200; FBS No. 4) and is tied with teammate Lucas Carneiro for the conference lead in points scored (96), while also ranking second in the SEC and 10th nationally in rushing yards (912). At his current pace of 20.0 attempts, 91.2 yards and 1.6 scores per game, Lacy is on pace for 240 rushes for 1,094 yards and 19 touchdowns by the end of the regular season. Entering the season, Lacy had just 104 yards on 23 carries in six games played at Missouri in 2024.

QB **Trinidad Chambliss** came to Ole Miss this offseason from Division II Ferris State, where he led the Bulldogs to a 14-1 campaign and a national title in 2024. Chambliss has helped push Ole Miss to its current 9-1 record and its No. 6 national ranking, which is thanks in large part to the Rebels owning the SEC's No. 2 total offense (489.4 ypg; FBS No. 4), No. 2 passing offense (305.5 ypg; FBS No. 7) and No. 4 scoring offense (37.5 ppg; FBS No. 13).

- One of four Ole Miss QBs all-time with 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game (Tulane; 307 pass, 112 rush) joining Archie Manning in 1969, Chad Kelly in 2015 and Jordan Ta'amu in 2018.
- One of three Ole Miss QBs all-time with 350 passing yards and two rushing TD in same game (Arkansas: 353 pass yards, two rush TD), joining Archie Manning, Chad Kelly and Jordan Ta'amu.

### UNDER PRESSURE? NO PRESSURE

QB **Trinidad Chambliss** has been superb this season in large part due to the stellar play of the Ole Miss offensive line. The Rebels rank second in the SEC at 11 sacks allowed this year, including only two in conference play (one each to Arkansas and Oklahoma). The main starting unit of LT **Diego Pounds**, LG **Delano Townsend**, C **Brycen Sanders**, RG **Patrick Kutas** and RT **Jayden Williams** have helped give Chambliss a clean pocket on 223 of his 264 pass attempts this season.

### THE PRICE IS WRIGHT

In less than two seasons with the Rebels, TE **Dae'Quan Wright** is marching up several all-time Ole Miss lists among tight ends. With the Rebels, Wright owns a career line of 52 catches for 843 yards and eight touchdowns, and in his overall career when including his first two seasons at Virginia Tech he has 99 receptions for 1,417 yards and those eight scores with Ole Miss. This season, Wright leads all tight ends nationally in yards per catch (18.0), while ranking fifth nationally among tight ends at his 449 receiving yards.

### PERKINS ON PACE

Junior LB **Suntarine Perkins** has tallied 2.0 sacks across his last two games, which currently puts his 16.0 career sacks in a tie for ninth all-time at Ole Miss. Perkins put together a superb sophomore campaign in 2024 with 14.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks -- with the latter ranked tied for the second-most in Ole Miss single-season history. Perkins is also about to break onto the all-time list for tackles for loss, entering this weekend with 26.0 in his Rebel career -- just 1.0 shy of 15th all-time.

**DEFENSIVE NOTES**

The Rebel defensive unit has been crucial to Ole Miss' success with timely big plays and big stops.

- Ole Miss ranks top-30 nationally in passing defense (18th, 179.5 ypg), scoring defense (25th, 19.8 ppg) and total defense (30th, 323.1 ypg).
- Across its last two games, the Rebel defense has allowed 168.0 total yards per game (66.5 rushing, 101.5 passing).
- Ole Miss shutout The Citadel, marking the first back-to-back seasons with at least one shutout since 2007-08.
- The Rebels stuffed The Citadel to 106 total yards, the fewest by any Rebel opponent since Memphis in 2014 (104).
- Ole Miss has 27 tackles for loss across its last three games, contrasted to 28 total in seven games prior.
- Likewise, the Rebels have 11 sacks across their last three games out of 21 total on the season.
- Ole Miss held The Citadel to 23 passing yards, the fewest by a Rebel team since allowing 21 against The Citadel on Oct. 8, 2005.
- LB **Princewill Umanmielen** leads Ole Miss with 8.0 TFL and 4.5 sacks.
- LB **TJ Dottery** leads all Rebels with 63 tackles ... Dottery is Ole Miss' top returning tackler from 2024 (76).
- DE **Kam Franklin** leads the team with an impressive 14 QB hurries on the season ... Franklin also ranks third on the team in tackles (48), TFL (6.5) and sacks (3.5).

**STINGY DEFENSE**

Ole Miss is coming off a dominant defensive effort against South Carolina, where the Rebels held them to just 230 yards of total offense -- the second-fewest by an SEC opponent under defensive coordinator Pete Golding.

**KING OF SWAT**

Senior DT **Zxavian Harris** has been a wrecking ball on special teams his entire career, and after another blocked kick against Georgia State in the opener, he stands on the edge of history as one of the best kick blockers in SEC history. Harris, who had a superb game with 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sack, two QB hurries and his first career interception, got a finger on the Panthers' field goal try during the first quarter -- his sixth career blocked kick across PATs and field goals. One more ties him with Kentucky's Lonnell Dewalt (2004) and Matt Roark (2008-11), who each set the SEC record at seven blocks.

**CARNEIRO FROM DOWNTOWN**

Kicker **Lucas Carneiro** currently ranks as the most prolific kicker in the SEC this season, leading the conference and ranking tied for second nationally at his 19 made field goals. Carneiro also leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally at his 96 points, which recently moved him up to ninth all-time at Ole Miss on the single-season scoring list. Across his career, Carneiro owns a career line of 46-of-52 (88.5 percent) and a perfect 127-of-127 mark on PATs -- which makes him one of only 10 active FBS kickers to have never missed with at least 100 attempts. But it's from distance where Carneiro really shines, holding a career 11-of-13 mark from 40-49 yards and a 7-of-8 line from 50 yards out -- including a 54-yarder vs. Tulane that tied his career long and for sixth-longest in Ole Miss history.

### HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program in 2025.

Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths (including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances), three 10-win seasons (including the first ever 11-win season and the first two 10-win regular seasons in program history), and several of the most statistically significant campaigns in the storied past of Ole Miss football.

Kiffin's Rebel teams have broken into the national top-10 in at least one poll in each of the last four seasons since 2021, the first streak at Ole Miss since John Vaught's hallowed teams from 1961-64. In that same stretch since 2021, Kiffin has won 48 games, which ranks third among all SEC schools behind Georgia and Alabama, and includes a superb 34-3 home record. Since 2023 alone, Kiffin's teams are 20-1 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Kiffin's well-renown prowess on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal has helped transform Ole Miss into perennial contenders and a hot commodity on the transfer market. The "Portal King" has welcomed in four straight top-six transfer classes according to 247Sports -- including the No. 1 ranked class in 2024 -- as well as five-straight top-25 high school classes per On3.

In 14 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 114-53 -- including a 53-19 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin's 53 wins has him third in Ole Miss history, and he became the fastest in program history to 50 wins -- doing so in 68 games, four fewer than Vaught. Kiffin (.736) and Vaught (.745) rank as the lone Rebel coaches all-time to have a win percentage of at least .700 (in at least 30 games coached).

Kiffin led the Rebels to a 10-3 mark and a dominant 52-20 Gator Bowl victory over Duke in 2024, marking the first consecutive 10-win campaigns at Ole Miss since 1959-60. The Rebels shattered program records in total yards (6,845), yards per play (7.3), passing yards (4,561), passing yards per game (350.8), sacks (52) and tackles for loss (120), as Ole Miss possessed one of the most dynamic passing attacks in the nation in addition to one of the most powerful rush defenses and pass rush capabilities in the FBS.

The 2024 campaign was simultaneously highlighted by the end of the incredible career of eventual first-round NFL Draft pick quarterback Jaxson Dart, who led the nation in total offense while dismantling several all-time Rebel records, and the stifling Ole Miss defense, which led the nation in both sacks and TFL alongside the best Rebel rush defense since 1966. Defensive tackle Walter Nolen led that defense, ending up as the 14th consensus All-American in program history and the first Rebel selected in the 2025 NFL Draft -- one of a seven-round era record eight Ole Miss draftees taken.

Kiffin's marquee win of the 2024 season was a 28-10 victory over No. 2 Georgia, the highest ranked win for the Rebels since 2015 and the first top-five win and highest ranked win in Oxford since 2014. The 2024 Rebels were the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and it stands as the largest top-five win by an Ole Miss team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 victory over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11). The Rebels finished the year ranked No. 9 in both the AP and Coaches polls, only the second final top-10 ranking by an Ole Miss team since 1969.

The Rebels once again ranked among the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16).

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history that included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Wide receiver Elijah Moore and quarterback Matt Corral were two of the main cogs in the Rebels' high-powered offense.

Moore earned first-team consensus All-America accolades after a historic and shortened 2020 junior season. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native hauled in a school record 86 receptions for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns during his last season in a Rebel uniform. Moore, a Biletnikoff finalist, led the country in receiving yards per game (149.1) and receptions per game (10.8).

Corral became just the fourth SEC player ever to finish as the NCAA leader in total offense per game (384.9), joining Pat Sullivan (1970), Rex Grossman (2001) and Johnny Manziel (2012). The signal-caller also finished No. 5 in passing yards per game (333.7), No. 7 in passing TDs (29), No. 9 in passing efficiency (177.6) and No. 11 in passing yards per completion (14.5).

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set last season during the Tigers' run to a national title.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first seasons at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing quarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

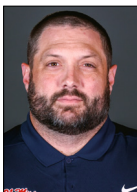

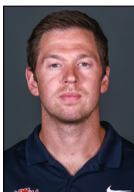

### GAME ONE #15 OLE MISS 63, GEORGIA STATE 7

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 15 Ole Miss football overcame a couple of early miscues to turn in a dominant 63-7 victory over Georgia State to open its 2025 season on Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Georgia State pass rush caused a pair of early interceptions to keep the game close in the opening half, but Ole Miss kept its foot on the gas to come away with a decisive win to start 1-0 for the fifth straight season. The Rebels became the first team in SEC history to score 60-plus points in three consecutive season-openers.

Lane Kiffin's squad outgained Georgia State 695-260, including a 400-69 advantage through the air. Ole Miss totaled 33 first downs in the victory, including an 8-for-13 mark on third downs, while the Rebel defense held Georgia State to 2-for-15 on third downs.

Austin Simmons finished 20-for-31 for 341 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions in his first career start. Harrison Wallace III led the receiving corps with 130 yards and a touchdown on five catches, while tight ends Dae'Quan Wright and Caleb Odom each scored, combining for eight catches and 135 yards. Kewan Lacy broke the century mark on the ground and found the end zone three times in his Rebel debut, going 108 yards on 16 carries.

TJ Dottery led the Rebel defense with nine tackles, including a shared tackle for loss, and broke up one pass. Zxavian Harris had a monster day, totaling five tackles, including a sack, with an interception and two pass breakups. Jaden Yates finished second behind Dottery with eight tackles in his Rebel debut.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — No. 14 Ole Miss football had a slow start in its SEC opener at Kentucky, but Lane Kiffin and the Rebels found their way and left Kroger Field with a 30-23 road win to open conference play.

It was the fourth win for the Rebels in the last five meetings vs. Kentucky.

A couple of early interceptions helped Kentucky jump out to a 10-0 lead, but Ole Miss responded with two of its three rushing touchdowns on the afternoon to go on top. The Rebels never trailed from there, fending off the Wildcats thanks to a late rushing score by Austin Simmons and three Lucas Carneiro field goals.

Ole Miss outgained Kentucky 455-354, including a 220-yard day on the ground for the visitors. The Rebels were a perfect 5-for-5 in red zone scoring and logged three sacks, while the Wildcats had zero.

Austin Simmons finished 13-for-24 through the air, with 279 total yards, one rushing touchdown and two interceptions. Kewan Lacy had a monster day, rushing for 138 yards and a score on 28 carries. Both Lacy and Harrison Wallace III had consecutive 100-yard performances to start their Rebel careers. Wallace hauled in four passes for a team-high 117 yards.

TJ Dottery, Jaden Yates and Zxavian Harris tied atop the Rebel tackle sheet with six apiece, with Harris notching a sack for the second straight game. Princewill Umanmielen had a team-high two tackles for loss, including a sack. Will Echoles logged a sack as part of his three total tackles. Ole Miss broke up six passes on the afternoon, including two by Wydett Williams Jr.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — A game that began with a wild flurry of offense ended with a crucial defensive play as No. 13 Ole Miss football held off an Arkansas comeback attempt to win 41-35 and improve to 2-0 in SEC play just three weeks into the 2025 college football season.

The two SEC rivals combined for nine straight scoring drives in the first half, 997 yards of total offense and 53 first downs. But the shootout came down to a defensive stop in the end as TJ Dottery forced a fumble in the final minutes to halt the Razorback comeback.

Special teams proved to be crucial as well, as Ole Miss kicker Lucas Carneiro finished 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, while Arkansas was 0-for-2, ultimately spelling the difference in a six-point game.

Trinidad Chambliss was outstanding in his first Ole Miss start, going 21-for-29 passing with 415 total yards and three touchdowns. Harrison Wallace III once again led the receiving corps with six catches for 92 yards and a touchdown, just eight yards shy of his third straight 100-yard game to start the season. Kewan Lacy had a strong day out of the backfield with 84 all-purpose yards and a rushing touchdown.

Suntarine Perkins led the Ole Miss defense with nine tackles on the night, including one for a loss, as well as one QB hurry. TJ Dottery tallied eight tackles, broke up one pass and forced a fumble. Wydet Williams Jr. recovered that fumble and broke up a pass in addition to six tackles. Zxavian Harris notched five total tackles, including one for a loss and added a pass breakup. Will Echoles had a team-high two QB hurries to go with four tackles.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — A high-powered offensive attack paired with a stagnate defense guided No. 11 Ole Miss to a dominant 45-10 win on Saturday afternoon to improve to 4-0 for the second year in a row.

The Rebels dropped 548 offensive yards on the Green Wave, who only mustered 282 against a defense on fire. Tulane became the second team this season to not surpass the 300-yard plateau against Ole Miss, joining Georgia State. Two Tulane quarterbacks combined for only 104 yards on 10-for-29 passing as they struggled to find a rhythm with their receivers. Tulane went 0-for-3 on fourth down attempts, all halting momentum for the Green Wave and setting up Ole Miss for good field position.

Trinidad Chambliss once again shined behind center, going 17-for-27 with a pair of touchdowns. He eclipsed 400 yards of total offense for the second week in a row with 307 yards in the air and 112 on the ground. Chambliss became just the fourth Ole Miss QB ever to have 300 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in a single game. Deuce Alexander paced the Rebel receivers with four receptions for 94 yards, an overall career-high for the sophomore. His fourth quarter touchdown was his first in an Ole Miss uniform and effectively put the game away for the Rebels.

Kewan Lacy reached the endzone twice for the Rebels, his second multi-touchdown career game of the season as he increased his season total to seven through four games.

Linebacker Jaden Yates became the first Rebel defender this season to reach double-digit tackles in a game this season. His 11 tackles led Ole Miss' dominant defense, which had five tackles for loss in the game. Will Echoles had a career-high eight tackles and had an impressive pass breakup in the first quarter for the first of his career.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — In front of a packed Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, No. 11 Ole Miss football bested No. 4 LSU with a 24-19 victory, becoming 5-0 for the first time since 2022 in the process.

Ole Miss' stout defense headlined the days efforts by stifling and frustrating LSU on nearly every possession. The Rebels shutdown the Tiger offense for 254 yards, nearly 100 less yards than LSU's yearly average thus far, while holding the Tigers to 2-for-11 on third downs. Entering the game, Offensively, the Rebels dropped 480 total yards on the Tigers, the most they've allowed this season.

Ole Miss' win served as the 16th all-time top-5 win in program history and the sixth at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

For the third game in a row, Trinidad Chambliss passed for over 300 yards, reaching 314 and tallying a touchdown in the air. He became the first Ole Miss quarterback to surpass 300 yards of total offense in each of his first three Ole Miss starts since Jordan Ta'amu in 2017. With his performance, he surpassed 4,000 passing yards for his overall collegiate career.

Chambliss also added 71 rushing yards for the Rebels, with Kewan Lacy reaching 87 on the ground. His primary target today, Cayden Lee, had a team-leading four catches for 70 yards and reached the endzone for the first time this season.

Linebacker Sutarine Perkins paced Ole Miss with seven total tackles, three of which being solo. It's the second time in three games that Perkins led Ole Miss defensively. Kam Franklin and Will Echoles headlined Ole Miss' defensive front, each accounting for at least one tackle for loss and five tackles each, with Echoles recording a sack.

Wydett Williams Jr. secured his first interception as a Rebel during the second quarter, perfectly reading the ball to put Ole Miss' offense in scoring position.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — No. 4 Ole Miss football celebrated its 98th Homecoming game in Oxford with a gritty 24-21 win over non-conference foe Washington State on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels are now 74-17-2 all-time in Homecoming games since 1924, and by besting the Cougars, Ole Miss is now undefeated through six games for the first time since 2022.

The difference in the matchup came on third downs, where Washington State struggled to convert all game. The Cougars went 2-for-10 on third downs for a 20 percent clip. Ole Miss has allowed a 34.8 percent conversion rate on third downs this season.

With the win, head coach Lane Kiffin became the fastest coach in Ole Miss history to 50 wins, needing just 68 games. Kiffin (50-18) broke 50 wins six games faster than John Vaught (50-19-5) and 26 games faster than Billy Brewer (50-51-3), the lone other Rebel coaches to cross the 50-win barrier. Under Kiffin, the Rebels are now 22-2 in non-conference action, and an undefeated 19-0 in regular season action.

Trinidad Chambliss went 20-for-29 through the air and accounted for three total touchdowns on the day. Dae'Quan Wright continued to etch his name further into Ole Miss' record book by catching his seventh touchdown as a Rebel. Wright, who finished the day with four catches for 80 yards on top of his score, is now tied with Don Williams for the sixth most touchdown receptions among Rebel tight ends in program history. On the ground, Kewan Lacy averaged 5.9 yards per carry for a total of 142 rushing yards for the day.

TJ Dottery, Wydett Williams Jr., Kam Franklin and Tahj Chambers paced the Rebel defense with six tackles apiece. Six total Rebels recorded at least five tackles, including Franklin, who recorded 1.5 sacks. Franklin paced the team in that category, with Princewill Umanmielen and Will Echoles recording one each as well. Ole Miss finished with four sacks on the day, which is a season-high for the team.

**ATHENS, Ga.** — The game saw seven lead changes and 78 combined points, but the No. 5 Ole Miss Rebels couldn't hold off a late charge from the No. 7 Georgia Bulldogs, falling 43-35 between the hedges on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels and Bulldogs were in bitter competition for much of the game, as every drive until the late fourth resulted in either a Georgia or Ole Miss score. But the Bulldog defense figured it out late, finally frustrating the Rebel offense to two straight three-and-outs and a turnover on downs to close the game.

Trinidad Chambliss was effective at keeping the Georgia defense on its toes, going 19-of-36 passing for 263 yards and one touchdown while also leading Ole Miss in rushing at 42 yards and two touchdowns on nine attempts.

Kewan Lacy also had two scores alongside 31 yards on 12 attempts, making him only the 18th rusher in Ole Miss history with 10 rushing touchdowns in a single season. De'Zhaun Stribling had his best day as a Rebel with 96 yards on three catches — including a massive 75-yard score at the start of the third quarter.

Suntarine Perkins led the way with a season-high 10 tackles, one forced fumble and a half tackle for loss. Inside linebacker TJ Dottery tied his season-high with nine stops, while safety Wydett Williams Jr. had an Ole Miss career-high eight tackles.

**NORMAN, Okla.** — The Sooners ripped off an early second half run to make it tight, but timely defensive stops and some key movements downfield by the Rebel offense helped keep No. 8 Ole Miss on top of No. 11 Oklahoma, 34-26, on Saturday.

The Rebels led 22-10 at the break, but Oklahoma scored 13 unanswered across the final five minutes of the third quarter to take a 26-25 lead. But a crucial success by the Rebel offense — led by another strong day by quarterback Trinidad Chambliss — and a forced fumble on a punt by Trace Bruckler, who caught the previous touchdown, helped give Ole Miss the narrow edge for victory.

Ole Miss notched 436 yards of total offense and yielded 359, but the Rebels had five more third-down successes and dominated time of possession at 35:36 — crucially 8:17 in the fourth quarter to keep the Sooner offense off the field.

Chambliss surpassed 300 yards passing for fourth time in six starts, ending with 315 yards and one touchdown on a 24-of-44 passing line. Chambliss is the first Ole Miss QB with at least 250 passing yards through their first six starts since Eli Manning in 2001, who did so six times.

Edge rusher Princemill Umanmielen had a breakout performance, notching six tackles with 2.0 TFL and 1.5 sacks to lead an effective Ole Miss pass rush. TJ Dottery and Kapena Gushiken were also tied for the team lead with six tackles apiece.

### GAME NINE #7 OLE MISS 30, SOUTH CAROLINA 14

**OXFORD, Miss.** — A dominant defensive effort as well as Kewan Lacy's career day pushed No. 7 Ole Miss football past South Carolina on Saturday evening, 30-14, at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Rebels stifled the Gamecocks' offense, causing havoc in the backfield all day after allowing a Gamecock touchdown on their first drive. Once the Rebels took the lead in the second quarter, they never looked back. A strong defensive fourth quarter that saw Ole Miss allow only 65 yards would be the deciding factor in shutting down South Carolina down the line.

Ole Miss had a season-high six sacks on the day, which marks the second consecutive season the Rebels had at least that many sacks in a single game. For Ole Miss, it's the most sacks by the Rebels in a single game since having eight against Arkansas last season. Offensively, the Rebels accounted for 417 total yards for the day, with Lacy accounting for 174 of the yards on his own. As a team, Ole Miss rushed for 258 yards. The Rebels have yet to drop below 400 total yards in a game this season.

The Rebels are 8-1 for the third time under head coach Lane Kiffin.

Lacy headlined Ole Miss' offensive efforts against South Carolina, accumulating 167 yards for the day on a 7.0-yard average per carry. For Lacy, it's his third game with triple-digit rushing in a Rebel uniform. His 29-yard and 54-yard runs in the game was his seventh and eighth run of at least 20 yards this season.

The Rebel defense highlighted the days efforts in total. Suntarine Perkins and Kam Franklin had six tackles apiece to lead the Rebel defense, with each picking up at least one sack. Perkins led the team with 1.5 on the day. Five other Rebels each had at least half sacks for the day. The Rebels had eight tackles for loss on the day.

### GAME TEN #6 OLE MISS 49, THE CITADEL 0

**OXFORD, Miss.** — An unstoppable aerial assault and the definition of stout defense guided No. 6 Ole Miss to a dominant 49-0 victory over The Citadel Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels have now recorded a shutout in two consecutive seasons and third time in four seasons. It marks the first time since the 2007 and 2008 seasons that Ole Miss has recorded at least one shutout in back-to-back seasons. Ole Miss' defense continued to shut down its opponents, holding The Citadel to only 106 yards of total offense. It's the first time since 2014 against Memphis that the Rebels held their opponents to 150 yards or less of total offense.

The Rebels recorded 603 yards of total offense, marking the second time this season they've surpassed the 600-yard mark.

Trinidad Chambliss and Ole Miss' receivers lit up The Citadel's defense throughout the game. Chambliss went 29-for-33 through the air, an 88 percent completion percentage, with a trio of touchdowns that the Rebels held their opponents to 150 yards or less of total offense.

The leading receiver for the Rebels was Harrison Wallace, who hauled in eight passes for 87 yards. Caleb Odom had a career day himself, recording career highs in catches (six) and receiving yards (64), while bringing in the second touchdown of his career. Winston Watkins and Cayden Lee were the other receivers to score touchdowns on the game.

TJ Dottery and Andrew Maddox led Ole Miss' defensive charge, bringing in seven tackles apiece. The Rebels recorded a season-high 13 tackles from behind the line of scrimmage, with Dottery, Suntarine Perkins and Talib Graham each recording two.

Chucky Mullins Award Winner Tyler Banks had a career-high six tackles, which included two solos. He recorded 1.5 tackles for loss which is also a career best. Andrew Jones also continued his upward trajectory, hauling in four tackles with two solo, and half of one for a loss.
