## 6-1 / 32.6 / 6.7

Florida went 6-1 in games started by true freshman **QB DJ Lagway** last season, with the lone loss being to No. 2 Georgia, a game which the Gators led prior to Lagway departing due to injury. That means Florida was 6-0 in games Lagway started and finished. The Gators outscored opponents, 32.6 PPG to 16.1 PPG (228-113), and averaged 6.7 yards per play to opponents' 4.4 yards per play, in the seven games Lagway started. In that span, Florida surrendered 11 sacks while racking up 26 on defense.

## 28.8 / 30

The Gators closed out the 2024 regular season by rattling off four-straight victories against No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, Florida State and Tulane. In that span, Florida averaged 28.8 PPG to opponents' 13.0 PPG, including 30 points off turnovers to opponents' seven.

### THE STORYLINE

- Ranked inside the Preseason AP Top 25 for the first time since 2021, Florida plays LIU for the first time in history.
- Florida's only prior game vs. a current NEC team was a 27-14 win over Duquesne in Gainesville on Sept. 30, 1950.
- The 2025 Gators return 13 starters from last year, which is tied for the 10th-most in the FBS and second in the SEC.
- Florida enters 2025 with a preseason top-25 position group at every unit per Phil Steele, led by the No. 5 offensive line in the country (No. 2 in SEC).
- The 2025 Gators also boast the nation's No. 10 defensive line, No. 10 defensive backs, No. 13 special teams, No. 14 running backs, No. 18 receivers and No. 25 linebackers, with the first three units ranked inside the top five in the SEC.
- Florida finished 8-5 last season after staring down a 4-5 record following a 49-17 loss at No. 5 Texas on Nov. 9.
- Florida capped its 2024 late-season surge with a fourth-straight victory by defeating Tulane in the 16th Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl for UF's first bowl win since 2019, eclipsing eight wins on the season (most since 2020).
- Entering 2025, Florida's active four-game winning streak is the longest in the SEC and tied for third nationally.
- With the No. 1 SOS in the country, Florida is the only team in the nation with four opponents ranked in the Preseason AP Top 10, and is one of four teams (all in SEC) with seven opponents ranked in the Preseason AP Top 25.
- After having its NCAA-best, 33-game winning streak in home openers snapped last season vs. Miami (L, 41-17), the Gators are aiming to avoid losing their third-straight season opener for the first time since 1946-48.
- Florida has lost just three season openers since 1990, going 30-3 (2017 vs. Michigan, 2023 at Utah, 2024 vs. Miami).
- Florida is 88-30 all-time in season openers featuring a 71-8 mark in Gainesville.
- The 2025 season marks the first time in four years that Florida is not opening the campaign vs. a ranked opponent.
- In each of its last four FCS games since 2021, Florida has eclipsed 560 total yards while rushing for over 150 yards.
- Florida is 24-1 vs. FCS teams dating back to 1981, with the lone loss coming against Georgia Southern in 2013.
- The Gators have outscored their opponents in those 25 games by an average margin of 38.7 points.
- Florida has totaled 400-plus yards and 200-plus passing yards in nine-straight games vs. FCS teams since 2014.
- The Gators finished last season with a takeaway in 10-straight games, forcing a turnover in 12 of 13 contests overall.
- QB DJ Lagway** improved to 6-1 as a starter and 6-0 in games he plays in entirety with the bowl win over Tulane, also tying QB Chris Leak for the most wins as a true freshman quarterback in Florida program history.
- With **RB Jadan Baugh** starting alongside Lagway three times in 2024, Florida started a true freshman backfield (QB & RB) for the first-three times in program history and was 3-0 with the only FBS wins in 2024 while doing so.
- Florida allowed just 20 sacks in 2024, grading as the No. 10 pass blocking team in the FBS with an 80.4 PFF grade.
- The Gators nearly doubled that total with 38 sacks on the defensive side of the ball (3.00 sacks/game, 11th in FBS).
- Since 2018, **HC Billy Napier** ranks 12th in the FBS with 59 total victories (10th among active head coaches).
- Saturday's season opener vs. LIU represents Florida's 13th-straight sellout and 17th overall under Napier.
- Florida's all-time, NCAA-record scoring streak currently sits at 461-consecutive games dating back to 1988.

- As a result, the Gators have won four-straight games for the first time since Oct. 31-Dec. 5, 2020 (six).
- The 2024 season was the first time Florida closed out the season with four-straight wins (def. No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, FSU & Tulane) since the 2019 campaign (Vanderbilt, Missouri, FSU, Virginia – Orange Bowl).
- UF posted back-to-back wins vs. the AP Top 25 for the first time since Sept. 29-Oct. 6, 2018 (No. 23 MSU, No. 5 LSU).
- In 2024, Florida posted back-to-back upset wins over AP Top 25 opponents (No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss) as an unranked team for the first time since Oct. 11-18, 2003 (No. 6 LSU, No. 11 Arkansas). This was the first time the aforementioned feat was accomplished in consecutive home games.
- The win vs. No. 9 Ole Miss marked UF's first home victory as a double-digit underdog and UF's second-largest upset win overall in the last 45 seasons (behind topping No. 16 LSU as a 14-point road dog in 2016).
- Florida's victory over No. 9 Ole Miss marked the Gators' highest-ranked SEC win as an unranked team since defeating No. 9 Georgia, 38-20, on Nov. 1, 2014.

## - DJ TURN IT UP: THE LAGWAY FILE -

- QB DJ Lagway** led all FBS true freshman quarterbacks with at least 125 pass attempts with a 154.9 rating last season - 10.9 points higher than the next-closest true freshman passer (Marcel Reed, Texas A&M).
- Lagway finished with the 12th-best passer rating in UF program history last season at 154.9, which is the best ever for a UF true freshman.
- Lagway posted a rating above 134.0 in six-straight games to close out the season.
- Lagway delivered a 150.0-plus rating in six different contests (264.8 vs. Samford, 191.2 vs. MSU, 205.0 vs. UCF, 191.1 vs. UK, 154.1 vs. UGA, 174.8 vs. Ole Miss).
- When Lagway starts, Florida is 6-1 with twice as many points (32.6 PPG) than its opponents (16.1 PPG).
- In games started by Lagway, Florida is averaging 9.8 yards per pass to opponents' 5.8 YPP, and 54 points off turnovers compared to opponents' 21 points.
- Lagway ranked third among FBS passers with a 95.8 passing grade on deep throws last season (20-plus yards) per PFF, behind only Syracuse's Kyle McCord and Ohio State's Will Howard.
- The rookie totaled 16 big-time throws to just one turnover-worthy play on deep balls, per PFF.
- Lagway completed 12 passes of 40-plus yards across his 192 attempts (115 completions) in 2024.
- Lagway had five completions of 40-plus yards in both of his first two career starts (vs. Samford, vs. UK).
- No other Florida quarterback has completed five passes of 40-plus yards in a game in the last 20 years.
- Making his seventh-career start (6-1) in the Gasparilla Bowl, Lagway improved to 6-0 in games he starts and finishes en route to throwing a career-high 35 times (22-of-35) for 305 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions for a 134.1 rating - all while taking home Gasparilla Bowl MVP honors.
- Lagway's six victories tied Chris Leak (6-3, 2003) for the most as a UF true freshman QB in team history.
- Lagway is the fourth UF freshman quarterback to start a bowl game and the third to win.
- Although Lagway was Florida's fifth true freshman quarterback to start against Florida State, he became the first of that contingent to defeat the Seminoles in 2024.
- Lagway holds status as the third Gators true freshman QB to start at home vs. a Top 25 opponent and the first QB to win, doing so in consecutive weeks with signature victories over No. 21 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss.
- In his first SEC road game at MSU, Lagway led two scoring drives starting inside UF's 10-yard line, making him the first freshman QB to lead a pair of 90-plus-yard drives in a road SEC tilt since Jalen Hurts in 2016.
- Making his first-career start in the Week 2 win over Samford, Lagway passed for the most yards ever (456) by a Florida true freshman quarterback, breaking Chris Leak's mark of 269 vs. Kentucky in 2003.

### - THIS O-LINE MIGHT BE HIGHLY OFFENSIVE -

- Entering the 2025 season, Florida's offensive line boasts 223 combined games played, which ranks 11th in the FBS and fourth in the SEC behind Auburn (236), Texas A&M (235) and Mississippi State (227).
- The Florida O-line also features a combined 109 career starts, which ranks 14th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.
- Returning starters include All-American **C Jake Slaughter** (13 starts), Preseason First Team All-SEC **OL Austin Barber** (13), **OL Damieon George Jr.** (10) and **OL Knijeah Harris** (13), who combined for 49 starts last season.
- They are joined by incumbent **RT Bryce Lovett**, who played all 13 games and earned three starts at right guard.
- In 2024, the Gators allowed just 20 sacks all season, which ranked third in the SEC and 40th nationally.
- UF graded as the No. 11 pass blocking team in the FBS (79.8) and was second in the SEC behind Texas.
- Florida did not allow a sack in four separate games last season including the Week 12 upset win vs. LSU.
- Across Florida's active four-game winning streak, the Gators have allowed just 15 tackles for loss and seven sacks while tallying 38 TFLs and 19 sacks on defense.
- Florida has allowed 76 sacks in 38 games under **HC Billy Napier**, ranking sixth-lowest in the SEC.
- Across the last four seasons (2021-24), Florida's 90 sacks allowed are the 34th-fewest in the FBS and fifth-least in the SEC. During that span, the Gators have out-sacked opponents by a plus-31 margin (121-90).

### - SLAUGHTERING THE COMPETITION -

- **C Jake Slaughter** was named a 2024 First Team All-American by the AP, ESPN and PFF after finishing with the sixth-best PFF grade in the FBS at the position (82.0).
- As Florida's first-ever First Team All-American center, Slaughter joined Gators Bill Carr (1966) and Maurkice Pouncey (2009) as UF All-Americans at the position.
- Slaughter allowed one sack, zero QB hits, eight hurries and nine pressures in 402 pass block snaps in 2024.
- Slaughter ranked top-20 nationally in both run blocking (eighth, 80.1) and pass blocking (17th, 84.2).
- He also played the most snaps (800) on a Florida O-line that ranked No. 7 in run blocking and No. 11 in pass blocking in the FBS, per PFF.
- Slaughter enters 2025 with Preseason First Team All-American and First Team All-SEC status, having allowed just 13 hurries, three sacks and two QB hits across 1,397 career snaps from 2021-24.
- His PFF grade has increased in every season: 2021 (59.0), 2022 (69.4), 2023 (78.4) and 2024 (82.0).

### - BAUGHLIN' BELLCOWS -

- Florida welcomes back five of its top six rushers from last season in terms of net yardage, led by the return of sophomore **RB Jadan Baugh**, who started four of the final seven games of the season.
- Baugh led Florida with 133 carries and 673 rushing yards while tying for the team high with seven rushing touchdowns alongside **RB Ja'Kobi Jackson**.
- The Gators have 70.9% of its net rushing yardage back from last season, headlined by Baugh (32.1%) and Jackson (24.3%), who make up 56.4% of returning output.
- Baugh averaged 5.1 yards per carry and 51.8 rushing yards per game while playing all 13 contests.
- Baugh is the only active SEC running back who had at least 130 rush attempts, seven rushing touchdowns and at least one receiving score while averaging at least 5.0 yards per carry last season.
- Baugh scored eight total touchdowns in the last seven games, highlighted by a record-setting, five-touchdown performance in Week 8 vs. Kentucky.
- Baugh's five-touchdown game came in his first-career start and tied the school record for the most in a game (Trey Burton vs. UK in 2010, Tim Tebow vs. South Carolina in 2007)
- Baugh is the only Florida Gator to score five touchdowns in his first-career start.
- Baugh ran 102 times for 520 yards in the final seven games (74.3 YPG) of 2024, racking up 317 yards after contact (61.0%).
- Last season, 427 of Baugh's team-leading 673 rushing yards came after contact (63.4%).
- Baugh will team up with Jackson to lead the 2025 UF backfield, the latter of which rushed 95 times for 509 yards last season, equating to 5.4 yards per carry and 39.2 yards per game.
- Five of Jackson's seven rushing scores came in SEC play - the other two were vs. in-state foes UCF and FSU.
- With 459 combined rush yards in its final two games of 2024 alone, Florida averaged 173.9 rushing yards per game over the last 10 tilts of the campaign.
- Redshirt freshman **RB KD Daniels** (four games in 2024) and true freshmen **RB Duke Clark** and **RB Byron Louis** will also be featured in the rotation as the Gators await the return of **RB Treyaun Webb**.





## - A REVAMPED RECEIVERS ROOM -

- With one of the nation's top receiving duos having departed for the NFL in **WR Elijah Badger** and **WR Chimere Dike**, Florida must replace each of its top pass catchers from last season.
- Florida lost 63.1% of its receiving offense from 2024, 54.2% of which came from Badger and Dike.
- Last year, Badger (806 yards, 20.7 YPC) and Dike (783 yards, 18.6 YPC) represented the only FBS receiving duo to have both players post over 700 receiving yards and over 18.0 yards per catch.
- Badger led Florida with 806 receiving yards (13th in SEC) and four receiving TDs on top of 39 receptions.
- Badger's 806 receiving yards ranked third behind Kadarius Toney (984) and Ricky Pearsall (964) across Florida's last 10 seasons.
- Badger finished fifth in the FBS (second in SEC) with 20.7 YPC and ninth in the SEC with 67.2 YPG.
- Meanwhile, Dike ranked sixth in the SEC and 18th in the FBS in YPC (18.6), and 13th in the SEC in YPG (60.2).
- Dike also totaled 783 receiving yards, good for 15th in the SEC, while leading Florida with 42 receptions.
- With Badger and Dike now gone, Florida looks to returners **WR Eugene Wilson III**, **WR Aidan Mizell**, **WR Tank Hawkins**, **WR TJ Abrams** and **WR Kahleil Jackson**, among others.
- Despite lost production, Florida's 2025 receiving room ranks No. 18 in the FBS and No. 8 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- Wilson III is the most-experienced returning UF receiver on the roster, playing in 13 career games including 11 starts with 80 receptions, 804 yards, seven touchdowns, 57.4 YPG and 10.1 YPC.
- Although he was limited to four games in 2024 due to injury, Wilson III managed to rack up 19 catches, 266 yards and one touchdown after dazzling across 10 games as a Freshman All-American in 2023: 61 receptions, 538 yards, six touchdowns.
- True freshman five-star recruits **WR Dallas Wilson** and **WR Vernell Brown III** will also be heavily involved in the receiving corps, as well as rookie four stars **WR Muizz Tounkara** and **WR Naeshaun Montgomery**.
- If any of UF's true freshman receiving contingent were to earn a Week 1 start vs. LIU, they would become the first Florida true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since 2015 and the third all-time to start in Week 1 (Antonio Callaway in 2015, Percy Harvin in 2006).
- Redshirt senior transfer **WR J. Michael Sturdivant** arrives from UCLA, having played in 40 career games including 30 starts over four seasons at Cal (2021-22) and UCLA (2023-24).
- Sturdivant was a First Team Freshman All-American at Cal in 2022 prior to his two seasons at UCLA, where he played in 24 games and caught 58 passes for 912 yards and six touchdowns.
- Sturdivant has totaled 123 receptions, 1,667 receiving yards, 13 receiving touchdowns and five 100-yard games in his four-year career while averaging 41.7 YPG and 13.6 YPC.

## - HANSEN AND THE TIGHT ENDS -

- Seven tight ends can be found on the 2025 roster highlighted by redshirt junior **TE Hayden Hansen**, who has started 22-consecutive games for the Gators at the position dating back to 2023.
- Hansen's 22-game start streak is the longest of any Florida offensive player and is the second-longest such streak on the entire roster behind **DB Jordan Castell**'s 24-consecutive starts.
- Last season, Hansen had 15 catches for 207 yards and one touchdown, with 12 of his 15 receptions going for either a first down or touchdown.
- Across the last two campaigns (2023-24), Hansen has caught 27 passes for 357 yards and three touchdowns.
- Adding depth to the position and potentially joining Hansen in two-TE sets is junior **TE Tony Livingston**, who made one start in Week 4 of last season at Mississippi State.
- Livingston played in 10 contests with 11 receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns.
- **TE Amir Jackson** is also in line for work at the position after appearing in four games last year.

## - OFFENSIVE GRAB BAG -

- Florida became the only team to eclipse 300 total yards vs. Texas during the 2024 regular season (329).
- The Gators also totaled 197 yards rushing against Texas – the most vs. UT during the regular season.
- In the Gasparilla Bowl, the Gators eclipsed 400 yards for the 16th time since the start of 2022 (third of 2024).
- With 224 rushing yards vs. Tulane, Florida has rushed for 200 yards 14 times since 2022.
- Florida has scored 40 points seven times in the Napier era, including 30 points in 18 contests.

Despite each of its **top two receivers departing** for the NFL in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, Florida returns **six** of its top nine receivers from 2024 including **three** of its top five.

## - 2025 DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK -

- Florida returns 62% of defensive production and five starters from last year's squad, which finished on a tear across the Gators' season-ending, four-game winning streak.
- Florida returns 76.9% of its sack production (30 of 39 sacks) and each of its top five leaders in sacks, in addition to seven of its top 10 in sacks from last year.
- Florida also brings back 72.1% of its TFL production (62 of 86 TFLs) and each of its top four leaders in TFLs, as well as six of its top 10 in TFLs from the 2024 season.
- In the last four games, Florida combined for 38 tackles for loss, 19 sacks, 18 pass breakups, 17 quarterback hurries, eight forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five interceptions while allowing 13.0 points per game.
- Florida's 18 sacks and 34 tackles for loss were the most in the FBS over the last three weeks of the regular season.
- In the last four games, UF opponents reached the redzone nine times and only scored 22 total points.
- UF forced -161 rushing yards in the final four games played as opponents only averaged 2.9 yards per carry.
- When opponents rushed the ball in the last four weeks of 2025, there was a 25% chance it would go for negative yards and a 31% mark for zero or negative yards.
- In eight of the last nine games, the Gators did not allow an opponent to rush over 150 yards, including under 100 yards vs. FSU (99) and Tulane (69). The Seminoles averaged just 2.25 YPC.
- Florida was one of eight teams to only allow one rushing TD in the last three weeks (3 GP) of the regular season.
- As a result of the four-game finish, the Gators ended the season ranking ninth nationally in red zone defense (0.725), 11th in sacks (3.00 per game), 27th in passes intercepted (14), 33rd in tackles for loss (6.6 per game), 35th in turnover margin (0.46), 43rd in scoring defense (23.1) and 49th in team passing efficiency defense (124.2).
- Returning starters include **DE Caleb Banks**, **DL Tyreek Sapp**, **LB Grayson Howard**, **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 57 games played and 48 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five), **STAR Aaron Gates** (five), **LB Jaden Robinson** (four), **DE Kamran James** (four) and **JACK George Gumbs Jr.** (three) all made multiple starts on Florida's defense last year for an additional, combined 32 starts.

## - BANKS OF AMERICA -

- Preseason Second Team All-SEC **DL Caleb Banks** will headline the 2025 Florida defense after electing to return for his senior season and forgoing the 2025 NFL Draft. He projects as a first-to-second rounder in the 2026 NFL Draft.
- Banks made the Preseason Watch Lists for both the Bronko Nagurski Award and Chuck Bednarik Award.
- In his second year at Florida in 2024, Banks played in 12 games (10 starts) and racked up 21 tackles (10 solo) including 7.0 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. he also added two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.
- Banks went off in the upset wins over No. 21 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss in Weeks 12-13 last year, totaling seven tackles, 4.5 tackles-for-loss (-26 yards), 3.5 sacks (-22 yards), four quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup.
- Prior to those two games, he had career stats of 5.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and five QB hurries.
- Despite the slow start, Banks still finished as the No. 58 pass rusher among FBS interior defenders.
- Banks joined the Gators in 2023 after only playing 47 career snaps in two seasons at Louisville, and has now played in 24 games including 21 starts over the past two campaigns in Orange & Blue (2023-24).
- Against No. 9 Ole Miss, Banks finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.
- According to PFF, he led all FBS defensive tackles in quarterback pressures from Weeks 12-13 of 2024 with eight vs. LSU and seven against Ole Miss for a total of 15.

## - TAP INTO THE SAPP -

- Teaming up with Sapp to form Phil Steele's No. 10 defensive line in the FBS (No. 4 in SEC) is **EDGE Tyreek Sapp**, who enters the 2025 season as a projected first-round pick and on the Bronko Nagurski Award Watch List.
- Leading Florida with 13.0 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks, Sapp played in all 13 games (nine starts) in 2024.
- As a redshirt junior last season, Sapp graded as PFF's No. 9 edge rusher in the FBS (90.4) while posting the No. 4 rush defense grade (88.7) among FBS edge rushers.
- Sapp's 90.4 grade was the highest by a Florida defender since Jonathan Greenard in 2019 and ranked third highest among SEC edge defenders in 2024.
- Florida's 2024 season-high in sacks (eight) and tackles-for-loss (14) came in the Week 14 victory at FSU, which represented the Gators' most in the last five seasons.
  - » Sapp led the effort with his third-consecutive game of 2.0 tackles-for-loss and 1.0 sack. He closed out the last four games with 19 tackles, 8.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, 12 stops, two QB hurries and one forced fumble.

**- ONCE YOUTHFUL DEFENSE READY TO FLY -**

- Of the 143 starting opportunities on defense in 2024, a combined 55 came from underclassmen (38.4%) highlighted by five starts each in the last four games of the year, consecutively.
- Across the last two seasons (2023-24), 128 out of 275 defensive starts have been by underclassmen (47%).
- Additionally, 50% of Florida's defensive snaps in 2024 came from underclassmen, compared to the 2023 campaign, when 58% of snaps were logged by underclassmen, including 25% by freshmen alone.
- A combined 53% of defensive snaps were recorded by underclassmen from 2023-24.
- Last season, 16 players made their first UF starts while nine made their first-collegiate starts.
- Of those who played the 10-most snaps for the Gators in 2024, five were underclassmen: **FS Jordan Castell** (first), **DB Dijon Johnson** (fourth), **STAR Sharif Denson** (fifth), **SS Bryce Thornton** (sixth) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (eighth).
- Five of the Gators top-eight tacklers last season were second-year players: Castell (fourth), Robinson (fifth), Thornton (seventh), Denson (t-eighth) and **ILB Grayson Howard** (t-eighth).
- Florida's 25 takeaways last season were its most since 2018, with 13 coming from underclassmen highlighted by three apiece from Thornton and **STAR Aaron Gates**.

**- IMPACT PLAYS DOWN THE STRETCH -**

- Florida forced and recovered five fumbles vs. FSU, the team's most since at least 2000 and one back of the program record of six – last accomplished vs. Vanderbilt in 1993.
  - » The five total takeaways were a season high and sixth-most since 1996 in single game for UF.
  - » The five turnovers gained were just one behind the most in the FBS last season (six), accomplished by six different schools.
- A total of three takeaways were obtained by Florida vs. No. 9 Ole Miss: two interceptions and one fumble recovery.
  - » **DB Bryce Thornton** picked off Jaxson Dart in the endzone with 1:32 remaining and then sealed the win with a second interception with 0:17 left. His 14 tackles (five solo) were a career high and the most in a game by a Gator last season. Thornton's two interceptions made him one of six SEC players to have two in conference play last season.
- Florida had a six-sack performance against an LSU offensive line that entered the week ranking fourth in the FBS (first in the SEC) in sacks allowed per game, and entered the game having allowed six sacks all season.
- LSU was held to an average of 2.9 yards per carry and 128 total rushing yards.
  - » Florida forced -62 rushing yards, a season-high and tied for the eighth-most by an SEC team.

**- JUST TAKING THE EDGE OFF -**

- In addition to stars **DL Caleb Banks** and **EDGE Tyreek Sapp**, Florida's No. 10 defensive line features returning edge rushers in **JACK George Gumbs Jr.**, **DE Kamran James**, **EDGE LJ McCray**.
- With both Sapp and Gumbs Jr. back in the fold, Florida returns each of its top-two leaders in sacks from 2024, as well as the entirety of the top four in Sapp (7.0), Gumbs Jr. (5.0), Banks (4.5) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (3.5).
- Gumbs Jr. finished second on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and sacks (5.0) last year in just his second full season on defense after three seasons at Northern Illinois: one at WR, one at TE and one at DE.
- As a sophomore in 2024, James tied for the team lead with six QB hurries while tying for fifth on the Gators with 4.0 sacks. James totaled 28 tackles (20 solo), 2.0 sacks and one forced fumble.
- Playing just 181 defensive snaps as a true freshman, McCray tied for second on the Gators with five QB hurries in addition to 13.0 tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss and 0.5 sacks.
- Notable newcomers to Florida's edge rushing unit include UMass transfer **EDGE Kofi Asare** and true freshman **EDGE Jayden Woods** out of Mill Valley HS in Shawnee, Kan.
- Playing in 12 games with four starts at UMass in 2024, Asare ranked second on the Minutemen in tackles for loss (5.5) and sacks (3.0) while logging 30 tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
- As the second-highest graded pass rush defender (73.7) on UMass last season, Asare played in 20 total games for the Minutemen from 2023-24.





## - THE NATION'S MOST UNDERRATED LB ROOM -

- Although Florida's linebacker room is its lowest-ranked preseason unit per Phil Steele at No. 25, the position group welcomes back **LB Grayson Howard**, **LB Jaden Robinson**, **LB Myles Graham** and **LB Aaron Chiles**.
- Howard started the first nine games of 2024 before going down with injury, totaling 37 tackles (17 solo), 1.0 sack, 2.0 TFLs, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble, two QB hurries and one pass breakup.
- Howard posted the fourth-best tackling grade (90.3) among FBS linebackers and a 78.6 run defense grade.
- Fellow rising junior Robinson played in all 13 games last season while starting each of the final four contests.
- Robinson recorded 52 tackles (28 solo) and 3.5 sacks in 2024, which ranked fourth on the Gators.
- As a true freshman and Gator legacy player, Graham emerged in the last six games of the 2024 season.
- In those six games, Graham had 23 tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.5 TFLs, one interception, one forced fumble and one QB hurry. Prior to that, Graham owned seven tackles (one solo) and zero TFLs across the first seven games of 2024.
  - » He made his first-career sack vs. No. 2 Georgia, which was a 10-yard loss on third and two in the fourth quarter. Graham then forced his first-career fumble at No. 5 Texas that led to a Gators touchdown drive.
  - » Against No. 21 LSU, he played a season-high 31 snaps and had a season-best seven tackles with two stops while grading as the Gators best defensive player and tackler, according to PFF.
  - » He had two tackles, 0.5 tackle for loss and one interception in the Gasparilla Bowl victory.
- Graham played the second-most snaps (183) among SEC freshman LBs in 2024 while Chiles ranked third (130).
- Graham also led all SEC freshman linebackers with 10 stops last season.
- Tue freshmen **LB Ty Jackson** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla. / Seminole Ridge) and **LB Myles Johnson** (Brewton, Ala. / T.R. Miller) add depth as four-star recruits on the Gators roster.

## - SO, WHAT ABOUT THE DEFENSIVE BACKS? -

- Florida's 2025 defensive backs unit ranks No. 10 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- The Gators' secondary brings back a pair of starting safeties in **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 23 games played and 20 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- In all, Florida had 14 interceptions and 49 pass breakups in 2024. Ten of those interceptions came from players returning for the 2025 season (71.4%) while 28 pass breakups were recorded by returners (57.1%).
- Castell has played every game across the last two seasons (2023-24) while making 24-straight starts in Orange & Blue, which is the longest-such streak of any current Gator on the roster.
- For the second straight season in 2024, Castell led the team in snaps played (831) after competing in a team-best 751 snaps in 2023.
- Castell played every snap during Weeks 12-13 in the upset wins over No. 21 LSU (93) & No. 9 Ole Miss (79).
- Also in 2024, Castell paced Florida with nine pass breakups - three more than the next-closest Gator.
- Castell ranked fourth on the roster with 55 tackles (29 solo) in 2024 while adding 1.0 sack and 2.0 TFLs.
- Castell boasts 115 tackles across the last two seasons, having led UF with 60 (30 solo) in 2023.
- Meanwhile, Thornton has played in 22 games including 11 starts across the last two seasons (2023-24), starting seven last season highlighted by five straight to conclude the campaign.
- Thornton led Florida with three interceptions in 2024 on top of 41 tackles (22 solo), 1.5 TFLs, one forced fumble and three pass breakups - and played all but one snap of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss).
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five), **STAR Aaron Gates** (five) all started five or more games for the 2024 Gators defense, bringing more experience back to the secondary.
- Although he missed six games due to injury, Moore totaled 17 tackles, two pass breakups and one interception, playing his best football in his last two games of 2024 against Kentucky (81.6 PFF grade) and Georgia (76.1).
- Fellow corner Johnson played all but four snaps of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss), tallying nine tackles (eight solo), 1.0 TFL, one QB hurry and one PBU.
- Denson added another TFL while posting his second-best PFF grade (73.0) in the bowl win over Tulane.
- Like Moore and Johnson, Denson also finished the 2024 campaign strong with his best weekly PFF grade coming in the Gasparilla Bowl victory over Tulane.
- In 2024, Denson's 87.4 pass rush grade ranked 13th among FBS safeties, as he racked up 37 tackles (22 solo), 5.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks in addition to two pass breakups, one interception and one forced fumble.
- Gates played in nine games with five starts one year ago, ranking fifth on the team with 4.0 TFLs in addition to 27 tackles, one interception, three PBUs, two fumble recoveries and one QB hurry.
- Much of Gates' production came across four games from Weeks 9-12, when he racked up 20 tackles, 2.0 TFLs, one interception and one fumble recovery as UF went 2-2 with SEC wins over Kentucky and LSU.

## JOE HOUSTON'S SPECIAL TEAMS IMPACT

- Florida's 2025 special teams unit ranks No. 13 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- Last offseason, the Gators added senior special teams analyst **Joe Houston** to the fold. He came from the New England Patriots after spending four seasons (2020-23) as a special teams assistant.
- He enters the 2025 season in the role of special teams coordinator.
- In 2024, the Gators climbed to No. 1 in the FBS in special teams for three-consecutive weeks (Weeks 2-4) by ESPN's SP+ metric and finished third in the final regular-season ranking.
- Florida ranked 11th in the FBS in net punting (42.37) and 18th in punt return average (13.36) while holding status inside the top-13 all season in ESPN's SP+ metric.
- The Gators were also one of 44 teams to not have a blocked kick and one of 80 programs to not have a blocked punt.
- K Trey Smack's** 73 extra points made without a miss (73-for-73) is a UF program record.

## - 2024 DEFENSIVE NOTABLES -

- With 25 takeaways last season, Florida more than tripled its takeaways (seven) from the 2023 campaign.
  - » It marked Florida's most turnovers gained (26) since 2018.
- The Gators produced at least one turnover in 10-straight games to end the season (29 of 38 games in Napier era).
- Florida has forced at least 15 fumbles in four-straight seasons powered behind a season-high of five at FSU in 2024.
- Florida posted four first-half shutouts (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, Tulane) and held its opponent without a first-half touchdown five times (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, UCF, Tulane).
- Florida's 14 interceptions quadrupled its total (three) from the 2023 season, and was UF's most since 2019 (16).
- The Gators held their opponents to zero points on the opening drive in the last-eight games consecutively.
  - » Florida had four takeaways on opening drives in that span: vs. LSU, Samford, Tennessee & Tulane.
  - » Outside of the season-opener with Miami scoring a touchdown, opponents only scored twice on their opening drives, with both being field goals: Texas A&M & UCF.
- Across the final four games the UF defense did not allow over 17 points in any contest.
- Against Kentucky, the Florida defense posted three interceptions, its most in a game since Nov. 28, 2020 vs. UK.
  - » It also tied for the total amount of interceptions (three) the Gators had during the entire 2023 season.
- Florida had three interceptions in back-to-back games in 2024 vs. Kentucky and Georgia for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 vs. Kentucky (three) and Sept. 21, 2019 vs. Tennessee (three).
- Since 1996, the Gators rank sixth nationally in interceptions with an SEC-leading 426.

## - THE GAMECHANGERS -

- Although 2024 Honorable Mention All-America **P Jeremy Crawshaw** departed for the NFL, Florida returns starting specialists **K Trey Smack** and **LS Rocco Underwood**.
- Crawshaw finished as the program's all-time leader in career punting average at 46.4, passing Johnny Townsend (46.2).
- He set the single-season program record with 48.9 yards per punt last year and was AP All-SEC Second Team.
- He punted 190 times in his career for an average of 46.4 per attempt, 17 of 60-plus yards, 74 of 50-plus yards, 76 inside the 20-yard line and 69 fair catches.
- Although replacing Crawshaw's production will be difficult, Florida brought in 2024 Third Team All-Big Ten **P Tommy Doman**, who won the 2023 National Title at Michigan.
- Serving as Michigan's primary punter, holder, and placekicker in consecutive seasons from 2023-24, Doman punted 103 times in his career for an average of 43.4 yards, highlighted by 22 of 50-plus yards and 34 inside the 20.
- Underwood became the first-ever Gator to win the Mannelly Award in 2024, given to the nation's top long snapper.
- Underwood will attempt to win the honor in back-to-back seasons, having been named to the 2025 Mannelly Award Preseason Watch List.
- Underwood was named All-SEC Second Team, AFCA Second Team All-America and Phil Steel First-Team All-America.
- In 2024, Underwood totaled three solo tackles and one fumble recovery, making him one of 11 FBS long snappers to have three tackles and one of two in the SEC.
- Named to the 2025 Lou Groza Award Watch List, Smack is a three-time SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Smack took over UF's primary kicking duties two seasons ago in Florida's 29-16 win vs. No. 11 Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2023 and went on to be a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist, making 17-of-21 FGs (81.0%) with a pair of 54-yarders.
- Smack was a perfect 44-for-44 on PATs and 18-for-21 on field goals in 2024 with a long of 55, and was 8-for-10 from 40-plus yards.
- After back-to-back games with a miss against UCF and Tennessee, he ended the 2024 season going 13-for-14.
- Smack drilled 50-plus yarders in three of the last five regular-season games with a 55-yarder vs. LSU, tied for third longest in program history.
- He made all five FG attempts vs. Charlotte in 2023 (23, 23, 27, 36, 54) and drilled seven touchbacks on all seven attempts, becoming the first Gator to make five field goals in a single game since Eddy Pineiro in 2017.
- RB Jadan Baugh** shined as the Gators' primary kick returner in 2024, averaging 21.55 yards in 11 attempts.
- Baugh was one of eight SEC players with two 30-plus yard kick returns and one of 11 freshmen in the FBS.
- He had a 35-yard kickoff return vs. Miami in his collegiate debut, marking Florida's longest return since 2022.
- Baugh had another 30-plus yard kick return with a 31-yarder in Week 2 vs. Samford and then added two 27-yard returns vs. Texas A&M despite receiving both in the endzone.

- The 18 sacks and 34 TFLs were both the most in the FBS across the last three weeks of the regular season.
- Florida led the FBS in both sacks (21) and forced fumbles (10) during the month of November (5 GP).
- The 11 turnovers forced over the last three games of the seasons propelled Florida from t-54th in the FBS in takeaways to t-13th to finish the season.
- Florida's scoring defense jumped 20 spots from t-62nd to t-42nd in the FBS and rose 16 spots in total defense following a dominant performance vs Tulane in the Gasparilla Bowl.
- Florida rose 15 spots in total offense in the FBS after posting 529 yards of offense against Tulane.
- Seven of the 14 interceptions came against ranked opponents, which is tied for third in the FBS against ranked foes.
- Florida showed remarkable improvement in turnover margin over the last four games, going from -0.22 (t-81st in the FBS) to 0.46 (t-35 in the FBS) to end the season.

### CROSSING PATHS

- Head coaches **Billy Napier** and Ron Cooper (LIU) are both products of the legendary Nick Saban's coaching tree, having served as assistants under him at Alabama. While they did not coach directly alongside one another, each worked separate stints for the Crimson Tide as a full-time assistant as well as an analyst. Napier was an analyst for Saban in Tuscaloosa in 2011 and later served as the Tide's wide receivers coach from 2013-16. Meanwhile, Cooper coached at Alabama from 2018-19 as a defensive backs coach, and again in 2021 as an analyst.
- In 2011, Napier and Cooper were both working as assistants in the SEC, and faced off against each other in a battle of No. 1 LSU vs. No. 2 Alabama on Nov. 5. In a game comprised of no scoring outside of five combined field goals, the epic showdown was tied at 6-6 at the end of regulation. Led by Les Miles, Cooper's LSU team defeated Napier's Alabama squad in overtime, 9-6, as a third Tigers field goal sealed it from 25 yards out. Cooper was in his final season of a three-year tenure with the Tigers as defensive backs coach at the time (2009-11).
- Transfer redshirt sophomore **DL Brendan Bett** made his collegiate debut vs. LIU at Baylor in 2023.

# BILLY NAPIER

## HEAD COACH

*Fourth Season*

Billy Napier enters his fourth season with the Gators after being named the 29th head coach in program history on Nov. 28, 2021.

In 2024, Napier led the Gators to a late-season charge, winning the last four games of the season to finish with an 8-5 record overall, with victories over No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, Florida State and Tulane in the 16th Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl. The Gators were one of just unranked six teams in the nation to post multiple top-25 wins on the year.

Florida finished in the top-25 in 10 NCAA statistical categories, including ninth in red zone defense (.725), ninth in passing yards per completion (14.11), 11th in team sacks (3.00) and 13th in turnovers gained.

Individually, center Jake Slaughter was named a First-Team All-American by the AP, while quarterback DJ Lagway earned Freshman All-America honors from ESPN and PFF. Rocco Underwood won the Mannely Award for best long snapper in the nation, while also earning AFCA Second-Team All-America honors and Second-Team All-SEC accolades from the league's coaches. Slaughter was also named First-Team All-SEC by the Associated Press. Running back Jadan Baugh, long snapper Gannon Burt, linebacker Myles Graham and offensive lineman Bryce Lovett were all named to the SEC All-Freshman Team, marking the second time under Napier that the Gators had four honorees.

After taking over full-time when quarterback Graham Mertz was injured in the Tennessee game, Lagway became a sensation for the Gators, finishing 6-1 as a starter and 6-0 in games when he finished. The true freshman ended the season ranked second in the nation in yards per pass attempt (9.97), third in passing yards per completion (16.65) and ninth in passing efficiency (154.9).

In his second season at the helm, Napier helped transform transfer quarterback Graham Mertz's career and led a youthful Gators roster highlighted by Jordan Castell and Eugene Wilson III while becoming the 12th FBS head coach to win 51 games since 2018.



During his first season with the Gators, Mertz went on to set career-highs in completions (261), passing yards (2,903), touchdown passes (20), completion percentage (72.9), passing yards per game (263.9) and efficiency (157.8) while only throwing three interceptions, marking a career-low and tied his career-best with four rushing scores. He set program records for consecutive passes without an interception (239), consecutive passes completed (19) and a season-best completion percentage of 72.9% (261 of 358). Mertz tied for second all-time in UF history with completion percentage in a game (83.3%) on two occasions and notched six multi-touchdown performances.

Mertz led the SEC and ranked third nationally in completion percentage while placing nationally among FBS quarterbacks sixth in TD-INT ratio (6.7) 14th in completions per game (23.7) and 17th in passing efficiency and 25th in passing yards per game. According to ESPN, he was one of four SEC quarterbacks to complete 70% of their throws, have 20 passing touchdowns and no more than six turnovers in a season over the past 20 years, joining LSU's Jayden Daniels and Alabama's Mac Jones and Tua Tagovailoa.

Florida's youth immediately contributed and carved out roles throughout the season while earning postseason honors. Four Gators in Jordan Castell, Kelby Collins, T.J. Searcy and Eugene Wilson III were named to the SEC All-Freshman team selected among conference coaches. The four selections were the most by a school and most by Florida since 2012. Among the group, Castell (CFN & ESPN), Collins (The Athletic) and Wilson (CFN, On3 and 247Sports) all collected freshman all-american honors.

Wilson made a name for himself nationally after each week as he led FBS true freshmen in receptions per game (6.1) while ranking second in receptions (61), tied for second in receiving TDs (six), fourth in receiving yards per game (53.8) and seventh in receiving yards (538).

Castell played all 12 games and started the last 11 consecutively while finishing as the team-leader in tackles (60) and most defensive snaps played with 660, one of two UF players (Jason Marshall Jr. / 651) to play over 600-plus snaps. There were only 51 defensive snaps Castell didn't play in. He accumulated 751 snaps (adding special teams), marking the only defensive player and sixth Gator to play in 700-plus snaps joining the likes of Graham Mertz and Ricky Pearsall.

During his first year at Florida, Napier established a new culture that emphasizes teamwork, toughness and discipline, setting a sturdy foundation for the future of Florida Football.

It didn't take long for Florida's culture shift to become evident. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season ranked fourth in the SEC in total penalty yards (584) and penalty yards per game (48.7), and eighth in total penalties (78). Napier's emphasis in playing disciplined football translated into a distinctive improvement from the 2021 season when the Gators ranked 13th in the conference with 104 penalties.

The turnover battle was another area where the Gators saw improvement in 2022. Florida finished ranked tied for eighth in the nation in turnover margin (8), giving up the football only 14 times while producing 22 takeaways during the regular season. The Gators outscored their opponents 70-42 points off turnovers during the 2022 campaign.

Florida's rushing attack took the nation by storm during Napier's first year at the helm. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season as the third-most productive rushing offense in the nation and best in the conference in yards per carry (5.84). Florida ran the ball for an average of 213.7 yards per game in 2022, which ranked 16th in the FBS and third in the SEC.





At the forefront of the Florida's mighty ground offense was the running back duo formed by freshman Trevor Etienne and Louisiana transfer Montrell Johnson Jr, who averaged 5.7 yards per carry and 120.0 rushing yards per game, while combining for a touchdown in all 12 regular season games and scoring 17 total touchdowns. They were one of only 15 running backs duos in the FBS to rush for over 700 yards apiece in 2022.

Johnson Jr. finished the 2022 campaign ranked tied-for-fourth in the SEC in rushing touchdowns (10) and became the first UF running back to rush for over 800 yards since La'Mical Perine in 2018. Meanwhile, Etienne ranked fourth in yards per carry (6.1), tied for 10th in touchdowns (six) and eighth in rushing yards (719) in the FBS among true freshmen.

The efficiency by Florida's running offense reflected an offensive line that allowed only 13 sacks in the regular season, ranking tied for second-fewest in the SEC and 16th in the FBS.

The offensive line was anchored by Louisiana transfer O'Cyrus Torrence, who finished as the top-rated guard in the nation at 88.0, according to Pro Football Focus.

Torrence became first Gators offensive guard to be named a Consensus All-American, and the fifth lineman in Florida history. He was named a First Team All-American by Sporting News, Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association and Walter Camp, and to the second team by the Football Writers Association of America. He was also named to the AP All-SEC First Team.

Torrence, who Napier recruited out of high school to play at UL, never allowed a QB hit or sack in 3,065 career snaps, including zero QB hurries or penalties in 698 snaps and 11 games started with the Gators in 2022.

Napier played a key role in the development of Anthony Richardson into the one of the hottest quarterbacks in college football. Richardson, who was ultimately drafted fourth overall in the 2023 NFL Draft, finished the 2022 season ranked fifth in the FBS among qualified quarterbacks in yards per carry (6.3) and was the only quarterback with two 400-yard games and two 100-yard rushing games in the season. Additionally, he was one of only five FBS players with over 2,500 passing yards and 650 rushing yards in 2022.

On the opposite side of the ball, the Gators continued their long-term defensive trends under Napier.

The Gators rank fifth nationally in interceptions with 409 and lead the SEC since 1996, while holding opponents to a 54.0 passing completion percentage, which is the seventh-lowest in the FBS and third in the SEC in that that span.

The Gators recorded an interception in six games during Napier's first season, the first of which secured a victory against No. 7 Utah—Napier's first game as Florida's head coach, to make him the only Florida head coach to defeat a ranked opponent in his first game.

Napier's emphasis on a new culture also became evident in the classroom. The Gators set a new Southeastern Conference record with 62 UF football players placing in the 2022 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll. The team also set a squad record with a 3.30 team GPA for the 2023 Spring semester.

In spite of a 6-7 record during Napier's first season at the helm, UF outscored its opponents 29.5-to-28.8 points per game and a total of 384 to 375. Florida lost their six regular-season games by a total of only 61 combined points. Five of those games were lost by 10 points or less and three by only one score.

During his first season as Florida's head coach, Napier delivered a total 10 Gators to the NFL via the NFL Draft and free agency. Drafted were QB Anthony Richardson (Rnd. 1, Pick 4, Indianapolis), DT Gervon Dexter (Rnd. 2, Pick 22, Chicago), OL O'Cyrus Torrence (Rnd. 2, Pick 28, Buffalo), LB Ventrell Miller (Rnd. 4, Pick 19, Jacksonville), WR Justin Shorter (Rnd. 5, Pick 15, Buffalo) and LB Amari Burney (Rnd. 6, Pick 26, Las Vegas). The six picks were tied for fourth highest by a school that year and tied third in the SEC. Additionally, four other Gators were tabbed as undrafted free agents.

## Louisiana (2018-21)

Napier spent four seasons at Louisiana and finished with a record of 40-12, a perfect 16-0 mark against members of the Sun Belt West Division, four consecutive West Division titles, four straight bowl appearances, a share of the Sun Belt title in 2020 and 2021 Sun Belt Conference Champions.

A two-time Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year (2019 & 2021), Napier took the Ragin' Cajuns to unprecedented heights when the team broke into the national rankings in 2020 for the first time in the modern era. The team finished the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top-25, No. 16 in the USA Today/Amway Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the College Football Playoff, Louisiana's highest rankings in all three polls.

In 2021, he led the program to their first conference championship title since 2005 and only the second time in program history. Napier concluded his final season with a 12-1 record, the most single-season wins in school history after setting it with 11 in his second year. The 12 straight wins also set the program record for consecutive victories, as the previous record was eight in 1976.

Napier led Louisiana to its fourth straight Sun Belt Conference Championship game with a 24-16 victory over Appalachian State to finish with a career record of 28-7 against conference opponents. Louisiana became the first team in conference history to make all four conferences championship games.

Napier's Louisiana team produced two 2022 NFL Draft picks in safety Percy Butler and tackle Max Mitchell, who were both drafted in the fourth round by the Washington Commanders and the New York Jets, respectively.

The 2020 Louisiana Sports Writer Association Coach of the Year, Napier navigated Louisiana through a season heavily impacted by COVID-19 and claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference Championship, its third-straight West Division title and its second-straight bowl victory, a 31-24 win over UTSA in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl. The Ragin' Cajuns also advanced to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship game, but was canceled due to COVID-19.

Napier's team broke into the national rankings for the first time in the modern era following its week one upset at No. 23 Iowa State, marking the first win over a ranked opponent on the road and only the second time in program history. He concluded non-conference matchups at Louisiana with a record of 13-5, as three of the losses came against ranked opponents - No.1 Alabama, No. 16 Mississippi State and No. 19 Texas.

Both the offense and defense continued to flourish in 2020 under Napier's watch. Offensively, the team ranked 29th nationally in scoring offense (33.6) and 43rd nationally in total offense (421.5), while the defense ranked 31st in scoring defense (22.0) and 33rd in total defense (355.4).

Napier coached Louisiana to 14 Sun Belt All-Conference selections, led by First Team selections Elijah Mitchell and Chris Smith. Mitchell wrapped up his stellar career ranking fifth in career scoring (276), fifth in career rushing touchdowns (41) and sixth in career rushing yards (3,267) before being drafted in the sixth round by the San Francisco 49ers.

Smith additionally earned First Team All-America honors from CBSSports/247Sports, Pro Football Focus and Second Team All-America honors from the FWAA, marking the second consecutive season that a Ragin' Cajun earned All-America honors under Napier.

In just the second season (2019) under Napier, the program set the all-time single season victories (11) at the time and second-straight trip to the Sun Belt Championship Game after clinching the league's West Division title with a 53-3 victory over Troy. The 11 victories also marked the first double-digit win season in program history and the first of three consecutive 10-plus win years by Napier.

He was voted the program's first Sun Belt Coach of the Year, becoming the third Louisiana coach to earn the distinction of top coach and the first since 1993 in their respective conference.

Napier coached three 2020 NFL Draft picks in Raymond Calais (RB), Kevin Dotson (G) and Robert Hunt (G), tying the program record for draft selections in a year. Hunt became the third-highest pick in team history as he was selected 39th overall by the Miami Dolphins. A First Team All-American selection by the Associated Press, USA Today, Sports Illustrated, Pro Football Focus and a Second Team All-American by Sporting News, Dotson was drafted in the fourth round by the Pittsburgh Steelers. Calais was tabbed by the reigning Super Bowl Champions, Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the seventh round.

In Napier's first season at the helm, the Ragin' Cajuns (7-7, 5-3) won the 2018 Sun Belt Conference West Division Championship, advancing to the inaugural conference championship game. Louisiana accepted an invitation to the AutoNation Cure Bowl, its first bowl trip since 2016.

## Arizona State (2017)

Prior to his stint at Louisiana, Napier was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona State in 2017.

Napier guided the Sun Devils' offense to the 14th highest-graded offense in the FBS according to Pro Football Focus - including the 10th highest-graded passing attack in the nation. ASU was ranked 54th in the nation in total offense last season and 86th in the passing game the season prior. The offensive turnaround (+40 positions) was the eighth-largest in the FBS and ASU was one of just three programs to move from outside the Top-50 to inside of it in just one season. The 76-spot swing in the passing game rankings was the third highest in all of the FBS..

ASU developed one of the elite red zone scoring teams in the nation under Napier, tied for first nationally in converting on 95.83 percent of its red zone appearances (46-of-48) with the only two "blemishes" against the Sun Devils coming when the team took a knee late in the fourth quarter. ASU was 11th nationally in red zone touchdown scoring rate with 36 touchdowns on those 48 attempts (75.00).

Ball security was another notable facet of Napier's offense. The Sun Devils turned the ball over just 11 times in 2017, which ranked 12th nationally after finishing 82nd in the country a year ago with 21 turnovers.

## Alabama (2011, 2013-16)

Napier's first experience in the SEC came at Alabama in 2011 and he later returned to Crimson Tide from 2013-17 as the wide receivers coach.

He was instrumental in helping Nick Saban and Alabama achieve a 63-7 record in five seasons (2011, 2013-2016), two National Championships (2011 & 2015) and was part of the great run of 26 consecutive wins from 2015-2016. In 70 games at Alabama, the Crimson Tide offense averaged 6.27 yards per play and 36.4 points per game. Napier coached three first round draft picks in Amari Cooper, Jerry Jeudy, Amari Cooper and Calvin Ridley while in Tuscaloosa.

In 2016, Napier's wide receiver corps were led by junior ArDarius Stewart, a third-round pick by the New York Jets in 2017 and Ridley. Stewart snagged in a team-leading eight touchdowns and 864 yards while Ridley totaled a team-high 72 receptions. Napier also helped develop wide outs Gehrig Dieter (Kansas City) and Cam Sims (Washington), both who were NFL free agent signees.

After recruiting Ridley to sign with the Crimson Tide, Napier coached him to a freshman-record and team-leading 89 catches for 1,045 yards and seven touchdowns in 2015 along with being named a USA Today Freshman All-American.

Napier played a vital role in Cooper's historical campaign in the 2014 season. He became Alabama's first Biletnikoff Award winner and caught a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns. Cooper led the country in receptions (124), was second nationally in receiving yards (1,727), receiving touchdowns (16) and catches per game (8.9) while ranking third in yards per game (123.4). A Heisman Trophy finalist and unanimous first team All-American, Cooper smashed all of the Tide's career receiving marks with 228 receptions, 3,463 yards and tied the SEC record with 31 receiving touchdowns.

In his first season as the Crimson Tide's receivers coach in 2013, Napier built a deep and talented group of wide outs. Alabama had four players with at least 32 receptions, led by Cooper's 45 catches for 736 yards.

The 2011 season marked the first year for Napier on the Alabama staff as he served as an offensive analyst, helping the Crimson Tide win the 2011 BCS national championship. The Tide ranked 16th in scoring offense, 30th in total offense and 17th in rushing offense in 2011.





## Colorado State (2012)

After a year at Alabama, Napier served as the assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach at Colorado State in 2012 for former Florida head coach Jim McElwain.

Injuries forced Napier to go deep down the bench looking for quarterbacks during his one season in Fort Collins. The Rams saw three quarterbacks play significant snaps as the starter with Garrett Grayson going down early in the season and M.J. McPeck followed two weeks later, forcing redshirt freshman Conner Smith into action. The trio combined to throw for 2,520 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2012 as Colorado State won three of its final five games.

## Clemson (2003-04, 2006-10)

Before his first stretch at Alabama, Napier spent seven years in two different stints at Clemson. During Napier's final two seasons at Clemson he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

At the age of 29, he became the youngest coordinator in the nation and in Clemson history. In his first season as Clemson's coordinator, the 2009 Tigers scored a school-record 436 points and collected 54 touchdowns (third-most in school history), averaged 5.73 yards per play (fourth best) and finished as the ACC Atlantic Division champions.

He also served as Clemson's recruiting coordinator from 2006-08. In those three seasons, he compiled two top-25 recruiting classes, according to Rivals.com, and in 2008, his class was tabbed as the second-best in the nation by ESPN.com.

Napier was the 2007-08 tight ends coach at Clemson, helping lead the Tigers to two bowl games and a prolific offense.

The 2007 season featured a 9-4 record and the ACC's highest-scoring offense. In his first year back with Clemson (2006), Napier worked primarily with the Tigers' tight ends but also was responsible for the punt team and assisted in several special-teams capacities. The 2006 Tigers led the ACC in total offense, rushing and scoring offense, advancing to the Music City Bowl.

Clemson averaged 410.9 yards per game and 32.7 points, more than doubling its opponent's totals. Michael Palmer, who Napier coached for three seasons, went on to the NFL. He also worked with the special teams units, helping develop the 2009 ACC Player of the Year and a unanimous All-American C.J. Spiller.



He began his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant at Clemson in 2003-04. The Tigers won nine games, including the Peach Bowl against Tennessee. The following season, Napier was a graduate assistant on defense, and gained his first experience with recruiting off the field.

## Background

As a player, Napier was a four-year letterwinner and two-time All-Southern Conference selection as the starting quarterback at Furman. The Paladins won two conference championships and in 2001, Napier's junior year, advanced to the Division I-AA national championship game, losing to Montana.

He completed 64.8-percent of his career passes, setting a school record. As the team captain during a record-setting senior season, Napier amassed 2,475 passing yards, also a Furman record, and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding FCS offensive player.

Napier grew up in Chatsworth, Georgia, and graduated from Murray County High School in 1998. He is married to the former Ali Gunn and the couple has a daughter, Annie, and sons, Sammy and Charlie. He earned his Bachelor's degree in health & exercise science from Furman in 2002.

## Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Miami quarterback Cameron Ward passed for 385 yards, three scores and keyed a unit that cranked out 529 yards of total offense Saturday, as the 19th-ranked Hurricanes silenced then emptied Spurrier/Florida Field with a lopsided 41-17 victory before 90,544 mostly stunned-and-bummed Gator fans. The loss was UF's first in a home opener since 1989, snapping a NCAA-best 34-game winning streak in kicking off the third season under Coach Billy Napier. It also was the Gators' sixth straight defeat, dating back to an Oct. 28, 2023 loss to No. 1 Georgia at Jacksonville. Ward, the heralded transfer from Washington State, was spectacular in his UM debut. He completed 26 of 35 passes, with touchdown throws of 9, 24 and 23 yards, while also rushing three times for 33 yards and instantly thrusting his name into early Heisman Trophy consideration. His UF counterpart, fifth-year senior Graham Mertz, could manage only 261 yards for his offense and faced a far more menacing and engaged defense in the Canes, with the lone positive play of note a 71-yard touchdown dash by Montrell Johnson Jr. that gave the Gators some second-quarter hope. It was short-lived. Mertz completed 11 of 20 passes for just 91 yards and was sacked three times before giving way to freshman DJ Lagway, the 2023 Gatorade National Player of the Year, who went three of six for 31 yards with an interception in three series of mop-up duty, but did lead a TD drive. On the game's second possession, Miami marched mostly effortlessly to an 11-play, 84-yard touchdown drive, aided by a roughing-the-passer penalty on Justus Boone on a third-and-10 incompleteness that would have brought on the field-goal unit. Three plays later, Ward shoveled an 8-yard scoring toss to tight end Cam McCormick for a 7-0 lead barely halfway through the opening period. Before the quarter ended, a Ward interception (his lone miscue of the day) set up a 41-yard Trey Smack field goal that made it 7-3. Those three points were canceled out on UM's next drive, a 9-play, 70-yarder, that ended at the UF 5 and finished with a 23-yard field goal by Andres Borregales. The Canes' padded the margin after a failed fourth-and-5 gamble by Napier at the UM 42. Another roughing-the-passer penalty, this one on DJ Douglas, and 30-yard Ward-to-Isiah Horton completion set up a Mark Fletcher Jr.'s 10-yard scoring run and 17-3 visitors' lead. After an exchange of punts, the Gators finally gave the Swamp something to cheer about, as Johnson dashed around left end for a 71-yard touchdown gallop to cut the lead in half at 17-10 with 3:32 left in the half. If only the home team could've taken it to the locker room then. Instead, Ward worked the clock for a couple first downs, then hit Elijah Arroyo for a 28-yard gain to the UF 24, then two plays later fired a dime between the UF safeties for a 24-yard touchdown strike to Xavier Restrepo with 45 seconds left. It was 24-10, with UM cranking out 283 yards of first-half offense (to UF's 145, half on one running play). Miami got the ball to start the second half, hit a 40-yard completion on the third snap, a 22-yarder on the fourth and was in the end zone again on the sixth, a 1-yard plunge by Fletcher for a 31-10 lead less than three minutes in.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** This one is going to have residual ramifications. The Gators will have to deal with a negative narrative ("Noise in the system," as Ron Zook used to call it) right out of the 2024 box. As far as righting the ship, the Southeastern Conference opener against Texas A&M in two weeks can't get here soon enough. The win was Miami's eighth over the previous 10 meetings, dating to 1986. The Canes now lead the all-time series 30-28.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** For Ward, the Jayden Daniels comparisons are coming. Probably a stretch, at least for now, but he certainly had a track record as an exciting, joy-stick QB in the defunct Pac-12 Conference and the Gators made him look like a Heisman candidate.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** The 24-point margin of defeat was the largest for Florida in a home game since Florida State won 27-2 at the "Swamp" on Nov. 28, 2015. Miami's 41 points were the most ever surrendered by UF in a home opener.

**UP NEXT:** The Gators (0-1) remain in non-league play, but step down in classification with a home date against FCS Samford the night of Sept. 7. The Bulldogs, out of the Southern Conference, opened their season Saturday at West Georgia.

#### Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Florida freshman quarterback DJ Lagway passed for 456 yards and three touchdowns in his collegiate starting debut Saturday night to lead the Gators to a 45-7 victory over FCS-classified Samford at Spurrier/Florida Field. Senior tailback Montrell Johnson Jr. rushed for a pair of first-half touchdowns, while wideouts Eugene Wilson III and Elijah Badger each had 100-yard receiving games, but it was Lagway's big arm — and the energy he ignited in "The Swamp" — that picked the Gators off the mat following last week's lopsided season-opening home loss to cross-state rival Miami. Lagway, the 2023 Gatorade National Player of the Year summoned to starting duty after sixth-year senior Graham Mertz suffered a concussion against the Hurricanes, hit 18 of 25 attempts, with touchdowns of 36, 41 and 85. When he was done, the 6-foot-3, 239-pounder from Willis, Texas, had shattered the record for single-game yards by a UF true freshman, leaving the 268 by Chris Leak (Sept. 27, 2003 at Kentucky) in the dust. The 456 yards was the ninth-highest single-game total in Florida football history. After UF's first possession ended with Samford stuffing tailback Treyaun Webb on a fourth-and-1 at the 17, the Gators (and Lagway) made up for it on their second turn. On second down from his own 20, Lagway dropped and launched a bomb for Badger up the right sideline that went for 77 yards to the Bulldogs' 4, where Johnson finished things off with a couple runs for a 7-0 lead with three minutes to go in the opening period. On the third drive, Lagway started with a 40-yard completion to tight end Hayden Hansen deep into Samford territory. A 22-yard pass-and-run to Badger set up Johnson's second TD run, a 7-yarder, for a 14-0 lead. At that point in the game, Lagway was 6-for-6 for 193 yards. After a rocky end to the first half, Lagway was back at it to the start the second half, this time hooking up for the first scoring strike of his career, a 36-yarder to Tank Hawkins for a 21-0 lead. The Bulldogs cut the margin with a 12-play, 75-yard drive (with only one third down along the way) capped by a 1-yard plunge by Damonta Witherspoon midway through the period. Not a problem. Lagway's 44-yard rocket to Aidan Mizell made it 28-7 just four snaps later, with the play giving Lagway the freshman record. A 25-yard field goal by Trey Smack early in the fourth quarter pushed the Gators in front 31-7. Five minutes later, after the UF defense forced a punt and the Gators' offense took possession at its 15, Wilson came in motion, took a forward two-handed toss from Lagway (a pass, technically), turned up the center of the field and out-raced the Samford defense 85 yards for the score. By night's end, the Gators had 632 yards of total offense to just 205 for Bulldogs. Wilson caught six passes for 141 yards, with Badger pulling in three for 123. Yale transfer Aidan Warner replaced Lagway late in the fourth quarter and had a 9-yard touchdown run to cap the scoring. The win was Florida's first since last Oct. 14 at South Carolina, snapping a six-game skid.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** A win, obviously, but also the first step toward putting away that ugly season-opening loss to Miami. Maybe even the start of a new era under center (read on).

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:**Duh. If Mertz is cleared from concussion protocol next week, Florida coach Billy Napier has an interesting decision to make heading into the Southeastern Conference season.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:**During the 2023 season, the Gators totaled 39 pass completions of at least 20 yards (so-called "explosive plays") over 12 games. Lagway had four in the first half of his debut and nine for the game (with completions of 77, 44, 40, 22, 22, 36, 41, 24 and 85 yards).

**UP NEXT:** The Gators (1-1, 0-0) will open their SEC slate with a third straight home game, this one against Texas A&M (1-1, 0-0), which bounced back from a tough Week 1 home loss against No. 7 Notre Dame by waxing McNeese State 52-10 Saturday. The Aggies, under new Coach Mike Elko (by way of Duke), will make just their second trip to Gainesville since joining the conference in 2012 (compared to UF's three trips to College Station during A&M's first 11 seasons in the league).

## Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Redshirt freshman quarterback Marcel Reed, making the first start of his career, accounted for 261 yards of total offense and three touchdowns in engineering a Texas A&M offense that met little resistance on the way to handing Florida a 33-20 defeat in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday at Spurrier/Florida Field. Reed, who replaced injured sophomore starter Connor Weigman, completed 11 of 17 passes for 178 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while also rushing 13 times for 83 yards and a score, and easily stole the game's QB storyline from UF counterparts Graham Mertz and DJ Lagway. When the final numbers were in, A&M had snapped a 10-game road losing streak by scoring on its first five possessions, cranked out 488 yards of total offense, did not turn the ball over and dominated time of possession by more than 15 minutes. The game, which was delayed for 47 minutes in the first half due to lightning in the area, was lopsided from the start, with the Aggies scoring on all four of their first-half possessions (and first of the second, as it turned out). Reed's 29-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter was sandwiched between a pair of Randy Bond field goals. Those three scores came while the UF offense took just 12 snaps on its first four series and totaled minus-17 yards. The killer sequence, though, came after Florida punter Jeremy Crawshaw pinned A&M at its 1 with 8:07 to play in the first half. The Aggies proceeded to drive 99 yards in 15 plays — without a pass — and scored on Reed's 1-yard sneak with 44 seconds to go before intermission to take a 20-0 lead into the locker room. At that point, the yards stood at 302-73 in favor of the visitors, with the Gators at minus-4 yards rushing, and offensive snaps favored the Aggies 53-18. Mertz started the second half and threw a 14-yard TD pass to Elijah Badger to make it 20-7 barely three minutes into the third quarter. The Aggies needed just two plays and 49 seconds to answer, as Reed rolled to his left, threw back against his body and hit Cyrus Allen running all alone behind the UF secondary for a 73-yard touchdown bomb and 26-7 lead. The two-point conversion attempt was no good. After an exchange of punts, A&M safety Bryce Anderson picked off a deflected Mertz pass in stride and raced 45 yards untouched for a touchdown and 33-7 lead. UF managed two fourth-quarter touchdown drives, one with each quarterback, both on marches of 70-plus yards, to make the scoreboard and stat sheet appear closer. Lagway threw a 17-yard touchdown to Chimere Dike, while Mertz drove the unit to a 2-yard plunge from Ja'Kobi Jackson with 5:13 to go. Mertz finished 12 of 15 for 195 yards, one touchdown and one interception, while Lagway struggled to find the rhythm that allowed him to torch FCS-class Samford for 458 yards last weekend. He completed just six of 13 throws for 54 yards, one score, two interceptions and was sacked twice. The Aggies rushed for 310 yards, led by Le'Veon Moss's 110 on 18 carries.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Make that three of the last four years that the Gators have dropped their SEC opener and now have lost six home games under Coach Billy Napier. That so-called "noise in the system" is about to return, following a week off optimism and and praise for the young quarterback. Lagway, though, got a dose of SEC reality Saturday.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Mertz definitely outperformed Lagway, for whatever that means for the rest of the season. Reed, though, way outperformed both of them.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Coming into the game, A&M's last true road victory was a 35-14 win at Missouri on Oct. 16, 2021. Of the 10 in a row the Aggies had lost since, half were against ranked teams.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (1-2, 0-1) goes on the road for the first time this season with a date at Mississippi State (1-1, 0-0). For the Bulldogs, who lost at home 41-14 to Toledo Saturday night, the game will represent their SEC opener after starting the season with a 56-7 home win over Eastern Kentucky, followed by a 30-23 loss at Arizona State. The Gators own a 34-19-2 all-time advantage in the series, including a 13-6 win at Starkville in 2018. Next week's game will be just the second in the series over the previous 14 seasons.

**WHAT HAPPENED:**Florida quarterback Graham Mertz passed for three touchdowns, rushed for another and led the Gators to a 45-28 road victory and first Southeastern Conference win of the 2024 season. Mertz, the sixth-year veteran in his second UF season after transferring from Wisconsin, completed 19 of 21 passes (90.5 percent) for 201 yards, with all three of his TDs coming in the first half to set the tone for a team — as well as Coach Billy Napier — in desperate need of something positive following two lopsided home losses against both its high-major conference opponents earlier this month. UF finished with 503 yards of total offense (a balanced 226 rushing, 277 through the air), besting the host Bulldogs' 480 (to go with 31 first downs), with a whopping 240 coming on the ground. Mertz, who was 15-for-16 for 147 yards in the first half, fired touchdowns of three yards to tight end Arlis Boardingham, 20 to wide receiver Marcus Burke and 35 to tight end Hayden Hansen to stake the Gators to a 21-7 lead early in the second quarter. He shared quarterback duties with true freshman DJ Lagway, who completed all seven of his passes for 76 yards and and also had a fumble into the end zone that was recovered by offensive lineman Austin Barber. Lagway's second series was a 10-play, 91-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard touchdown run by Ja'Kobi Jackson and pushed the visitors in front 28-7 late in the first half. The Bulldogs cut the margin to 14 when quarterback Blake Shapen (13 of 21 for 140 yards, 1 TD) finished off a quick six-play, 75-yard, 54-second drive with a 3-yard run with 23 seconds to play in the period to make it 28-14 at the half. The game got even closer after Shapen engineered another long scoring drive, capped by a 13-yard pass to Jordan Mosley on MSU's first possession of the second half. Mertz countered with an 8-play, 75-yard drive (aided by a couple defensive penalties) and finished the march with a 1-yard sneak for a 35-21 lead with just under four minutes remaining in the third quarter. A goal-line stand by the Florida defense turned the ball back to the Gators less than a minute into the fourth period. Lagway then led his second drive of more than 90 yards (this one 10 plays, 93 yards) and almost finished it himself with a 6-yard scoring run, with Barber falling on the fumble for a 42-21 lead. The Bulldogs got a 10-yard scoring run from Johnnie Daniels with 4:26 to go, while the Gators added a 47-yard Trey Smack field goal with 2:34 remaining. UF got a game-high 68 yards rushing from senior tailback Montrell Johnson Jr. and had 10 different receivers haul in passes, led by Aidan Mizell's five for 36 yards. The win was just the third for Florida in its last 15 road games and snapped a seven-game streak against power conference opponents, dating to Oct. 28, 2023 against Georgia.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** The Gators, with everything going on, badly needed a victory to stop the bleeding. Mississippi State, obviously, is not a good team, but UF went on the road and amid all the adversity and distractions put one in the SEC win column.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** While Lagway may be the favored Florida quarterback (and the Gators' future at the position), Mertz is the better one right now and gives them the best chance to win.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:**Mertz and Lagway combined to go 26-for-28. That's 92.9 percent, which is believed to be a single-game team record.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (2-2, 1-1) has the first of two open dates next weekend. The Gators will return to action Oct. 5 at home against cross-state foe UCF (3-0, 1-0), which was idle Saturday. While the Gators will be sitting out the week, the Knights will play host to Deion Sanders and Colorado in a Big 12 Conference game. Mississippi State (1-3, 0-1) plays at No. 1 Texas next week. Then at No. 2 Georgia. Good luck, Bulldogs.

## Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** The Florida defense, maligned since the start of the season, picked a good night to play its best game to date, as the Gators' unit collectively bowed up and proved the catalyst of a 24-13 victory Saturday night over cross-state foe UCF at sold-out Spurrier/Florida Field. Quarterback Graham Mertz passed for 179 yards and a touchdown, tailbacks Ja'Kobi Jackson and Montrell Johnson Jr. each had short running scores, and kicker Trey Smack added a field goal. All those scores came in the first half, as UF, with its defense shutting down the Knights and their powerful running game, built a 24-3 advantage at the break and held on for a second consecutive victory. UCF came into the game with the nation's No. 4 overall offense, averaging a whopping 543.3 yards per game, including 326.0 on the ground, which ranked second nationally. Facing a UF defense that checked in 113th overall (425.5 per game), as well as 110th against the run (188.75), the Knights managed a season-low 273 yards, with just 108 on the ground on 40 carries. Five sacks of UCF's KJ Jefferson, the Arkansas transfer (and engineer of the Razorbacks' upset win here last season), greatly aided the cause, as he finished just 12 of 22 for 165 yards and an interception. UCF was just four of 12 on third was turned away on both of its fourth-down attempts. Mertz, the sixth-year senior, was an efficient 19-for-23, while freshman DJ Lagway went 4-for-4 for 50 yards in alternating every third series. Neither UF quarterback took a sack on the way to helping the Gators generate 359 total yards and out-rush the Knights with 130 on the ground. UF made a statement early by taking the opening kickoff and marching 75 yards in 15 plays, eating up half the first quarter, with Mertz lobbing a 13-yard TD to wide receiver Elijah Badger for a lead the home team never gave back. The Knights threatened on their first drive, but the UF defense stiffened and forced them to settle for a 27-yard Grant Reddick field goal. That was it for UCF the rest of the half, while UF scored 17 second-quarter points. Lagway, on his first series, fired a 37-yard bullet to Chimere Dike that set up a 1-yard scoring run by Jackson barely two minutes into the period. A 3-yard, extra-effort plunge from Johnson with 1:50 to go was followed by a fourth-down stop by the Florida defense that set up Lagway for a quick drive that led to a 29-yard Smack field goal for a 24-3 advantage with four seconds to play in the half. UCF took the second-half kickoff and went on a 14-play drive that ate up eight-plus minutes, but a false-start penalty, then sack of Jefferson forced the Knights to kick a second Reddick field goal to make the score 24-6. After a short UF possession and punt, the Knights started deep in their territory with a Jefferson 35-yard completion to tailback RJ Harvey, who finished the drive six plays later with a 13-yard scoring run to make it 24-13 with 7:50 to play. The scoreboard, however, held from there.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** A couple weeks ago, after a lopsided 33-20 home loss to Texas A&M, the Florida fan base was wondering where its next victory (much less two) could come from. The Gators, after winning at Mississippi State two weeks ago, have prevailed in two straight and at least won't have to deal with any trash talk from their younger brothers down the turnpike until they meet again in Orlando in 2030.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** The total yardage allowed by the Florida defense was half what UCF usually gained per game, with the Knights' rushing output nearly one-third less than its average. Seven different UF defenders had at least a half-sack, with edge George Gumbs Jr. tallying 1.5. Safety Bryce Thornton had a late interception to ice the game. The Knights' 273 yards marked the third-fewest gained by a Gus Malzahn offense in his 13 seasons as a head coach.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Vanderbilt (two weeks after losing at home to Georgia State) beat No. 1 Alabama earlier in the day. The Commodores entered 0-60 all-time against AP top-five teams. Sorry, couldn't resist.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (3-2, 1-1) gets back into SEC play ... and in a big, difficult way. The Gators hit the road to face No. 4 Tennessee (4-1, 1-1) and more than 102,000 very ornery folks at Neyland Stadium, all of whom will be steamed still after being upset 19-14 late Saturday night at Arkansas. The Volunteers, who have lost 17 of the previous 19 in the Florida series dating to 2005, will be looking to exact nearly two decades of lopsided revenge (including last season's 29-16 upset loss at Gainesville), with arguably their biggest man-to-man advantage and talent discrepancy over that span.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Tailback Dylan Sampson slammed into the end zone from a yard out on Tennessee's first possession of overtime to give the eighth-ranked Volunteers a 23-17 victory over rival Florida in their Southeastern Conference game Saturday night at sold-out Neyland Stadium. Sampson's score was his third of the game for the league's rushing leader and came after his 23-yard touchdown run in the fourth period put the Vols ahead for the first time with just under 10 minutes to play. The Gators, 15 1/2-point underdogs, rallied to tie the score behind freshman quarterback DJ Lagway after starting sixth-year Graham Mertz left the game in the third quarter after suffering what appeared to be a knee injury. Lagway fired a 27-yard touchdown pass to Chimere Dike on a third-and-19 play with just 29 seconds remaining in regulation to make the score 17-16 and stun the crowd of more than 102,000. UF coach Billy Napier, at first, kept his offense on the field and threatened a two-point conversion attempt — and a go at the win — but after Tennessee called a desperation timeout and reset, Napier opted to send Trey Smack out to kick the point-after and play for overtime. UT won the coin toss and chose to play defense first. The Gators ran three plays, lost four yards and turned to Smack, who earlier kicked a 42-yard field goal. His OT attempt from 47, however, was pushed right, leaving Tennessee to play for the win. The Vols needed five plays to go the 25 yards, with Sampson crashing across on second-and-goal from the 1 and giving the Volunteers just their third win in the last 20 games of this series. Sampson, who came into the game with 589 rushing yards and 12 TDs, finished with 112 on 27 attempts and the three scores. Defensively, UF did a mostly outstanding job of containing a UT offense that began the day ranked No. 5 in the nation at 519.0 yards per game, as the Vols finishing with a season-low 312 yards and nearly dropped a second game in as many weeks as a top 10-ranked team. UT sophomore quarterback Nico Iamaleava completed 16 of 26 passes for 169 yards, no scores, an interception and was sacked three times. Lagway finished nine of 17 for 98 yards, the one score, one interception and three sacks, as the Gators actually out-gained the Vols with 361 yards of total offense. Mertz was 11-for-15 for 125 yards and a touchdown, with his 13-yard scoring toss to tight end Arlis Boardingham giving the Gators a 10-0 lead in the third quarter, but also ending with UF's starting quarterback suffering a non-contact injury at the end of the play. Mertz joined starting tailback Montrell Johnson Jr. (12 carries, 85 yards before going down with a lower body injury early in the third quarter) on the sidelines, as the two had to watch the Vols rally from their 10-0 deficit. The UF lead could have been much more, but the Gators self-destructed on a trio of drives that penetrated the UT 20 in the first half and netted no points. First, wideout Eugene Wilson III was tackled for a yard loss on a fourth-and-1 jet sweep. Next, Mertz fumbled on a first-down sneak attempt at the Vols' 1. And, lastly, after a Florida interception, Smack had a converted 43-yard field goal taken off the board on the final play of the first half when the Gators were flagged for 12 men on the field. Because they had no timeouts and could not accept a 10-second clock run-off, the half ended with the penalty and without a re-kick. UF finally found the end zone on its second possession of the second half, when Mertz moved the Gators 92 yards in nine plays, then lobbed his score to Boardingham. UT needed less than five minutes to find the end zone for the first time, with Iamaleava driving the Vols 75 yards in 11 plays and Sampson crashing in on a fourth-and-1 with a six-yard scoring run. On the very next play from scrimmage, Lagway threw an interception in minus-territory that led to a 35-yard Max Gilbert field goal that tied the game at 10 with 1:37 left in the third quarter. Sampson's second TD about five minutes later made it 17-10 and set up the frantic finish.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Just the third loss to Tennessee since 2005, but it very well could have gone differently — and maybe given Napier the biggest win of his three UF seasons, as well as some promising possibilities for the program — had the Gators not blown those three outstanding first-half scoring chances.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** The Florida defense has made some impressive strides since those two debacle performances in home losses to Miami and Texas A&M early in the season. The guys on that side of the ball put the Gators in position to steal what would have been a victory virtually no one was counting on.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Florida was 3-for-6 in the red zone, with those three come-up-empty killers all in the second quarter. Tennessee was 3-for-3 in the red zone. There's the game.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (3-3, 1-2) will be back at "The Swamp" for a homecoming date against Kentucky (3-3, 1-3), which has beaten the Gators three straight and four of the previous five after losing 31 straight in the series from 1987-2017. The Wildcats had a two-game winning streak snapped late Saturday night by losing at home against college football's 2024 giant-killer, Vanderbilt, which followed last week's stunning upset of No. 1 Alabama by going to Lexington and handing the favored Wildcats a 20-13 defeat.

## Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Florida freshman tailback Jadan Baugh tied a program record with five rushing touchdowns and the Florida offense, led by freshman DJ Lagway, rolled up 476 yards against the nation's No. 4-ranked defense, as the Gators routed Kentucky 48-20 in their Southeastern Conference homecoming game Saturday night at Spurrier/Florida Field.

Not bad for the first freshman QB-RB duo in school history to start in the same backfield.

Baugh, the 6-foot-1, 227-pounder from Atlanta, made his first career start in place of injured senior Montrell Johnson Jr. He carried 22 times for 106 yards and scored on runs of 7, 10, 1, 1 and 1 yard, with his five TDs equaling the program record he now holds jointly with Tim Tebow (2007 vs. South Carolina) and Trey Burton (2010 vs Kentucky). Lagway, making his first SEC start following the season-ending knee injury to sixth-year Graham Mertz, completed just seven of 14 attempts, but for 259 yards and one interception. Wide receiver Elijah Badger caught three passes for 148 yards.

By the time the Gators were done, their yardage (including 197 on the ground) was the most cranked out against the Wildcats this season, easily eclipsing the 353 gained by Ole Miss earlier this month. They were also a perfect 7-for-7 in red-zone scoring opportunities. The Florida defense, meanwhile, had a third straight outstanding effort in holding Kentucky to just 309 yards, just 1-for-5 on fourth down (including a second-quarter goal-line stand) and intercepting three passes, the last a 29-yard pick-six by sophomore Cormani McClain, the transfer from Colorado and former five-star recruit, with 3:23 to play that wrapped the night's scoring.

UF had two excellent scoring opportunities on their first drives of the game, but both times settled for short Trey Smack field goals. UK used some flea-flicker trickery to take advantage of the Gators' failure to capitalize when quarterback Brock Vandergriff (12 of 26 for 165 yards, 1 TD, 2 INT) took a pitchback from his tailback and threw a 45-yard touchdown pass to Barion Brown. The point-after was wide left, leaving the game tied at 6-all.

From there, the Gators scored the next three TDs on Baugh runs to go up 27-6 and seize the momentum; or so it seemed. That 21-point cushion was short-lived, as Brown's 99-yard kickoff return after Baugh's third score made it 27-13 with 1:30 to go in the half and backup quarterback Gavin Wimsatt's 1-yard touchdown run to cap the first possession after halftime made it a 27-20 game with 8:34 to play in the third.

Lagway, though, hit Chimere Dike for 44 yards to set up Baugh's fourth score with 3:27 left in the third for a two-touchdown cushion. The Florida defense stopped Kentucky on downs the next two possessions, adding Baugh's final score (after a 40-yard Lagway-to-Badger completion) with 3:31 remaining. McClain's interception return came on the first snap of UK's ensuing possession.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** With four victories, the Gators are one win from equaling their total of last season, but also are heading into the meat of the nation's toughest schedule (read on). UF ended UK's three-game winning streak in the series, avoiding what would have been the first four-game skid against the Cats since dropping four from 1948-51 — when Kentucky was coached by Paul "Bear" Bryant.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Who else had Baugh with his name in the UF record book by mid-October on their 2024 bingo card?

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Lagway completed just 50 percent of his passes, but his yards-per-attempt were a whopping 18.5 and his yards-per-completion number — get this — was 37.0 for the game.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (4-3, 2-2) has its second open date of the season next weekend, then will return to action Nov. 2 against fifth-ranked Georgia (6-1, 4-1), which has won three consecutive games in the series and six of the last seven. The Bulldogs, who are also idle next week, will head to Jacksonville coming off a 30-15 road thrashing of No. 1 and previous unbeaten Texas Saturday night.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** For Florida, there was so much to be encouraged about ... until DJ Lagway went down.

First, the Gators lost their freshman quarterback. Next, they lost their lead. In time, they lost their poise and ultimately the game Saturday, falling 34-20 to second-ranked Georgia in their annual Southeastern Conference showdown at EverBank Stadium, giving the Bulldogs a fourth consecutive win (and seventh in the previous eight meetings) in the storied rivalry.

UGA quarterback Carson Beck shook off a trio of interceptions in passing for 309 yards and two second-half scores in guiding his team to a huge come-from-behind victory. It all turned for the Bulldogs after Lagway, the centerpiece of the Gators' offense just a year removed from being named Gatorade Player of the Year, was carted from the field in the second-quarter with a severe hamstring injury. Lagway's injury came two games after the team lost sixth-year starting QB Graham Mertz for to a season-ending knee injury, and left UF quarterback duties to third-teamer Aidan Warner, a walk-on from Yale.

Warner went seven of 22 for 66 yards and an interception, along the way -- needless to say -- getting a crash course in the difference between the Ivy League and SEC. When the final numbers were in, Georgia had totaled 455 yards of offense to UF's 228. Beck completed 25 of his 40 attempts, while tailback Nate Frazier rushed 19 times for 82 yards and a touchdown. Lagway hit just two of his six attempts, but fired a 43-yard touchdown strike to Aidan Mizell early in the second quarter to stake the Gators to a 7-3 lead after Beck's first pick. A 53-yard field goal by Trey Smack had UF ahead 10-3, which was where things stood when Lagway suffered his injury on a designed first-down run with five minutes left in the half.

Over the next eight series with Warner under center, the Gators ran 25 plays for just 53 yards, yet still led 13-6 after two three-and-out possessions to start the third quarter.

Georgia then mounted consecutive touchdown drives. The first was an eight-play, 83-yard march with Dillon Bell's 33-yard dash off an end-around the big hitter. It set up Frazier's 2-yard scoring run to tie the game at 13 with seven minutes to go in the third period. On Florida's, ensuing series, the Gators actually moved the ball, driving to the UGA 33 and in position for a 50-yard field goal try by Smack for the lead.

But the snap from Rocco Underwood was low, hot and through the hands of holder Jeremy Crawshaw. The ball skipped past midfield and was recovered by Georgia at the UF 36 for a crushing loss of 33 yards. Three plays later, Beck hit Cash Jones on a crossing rout. Jones broke through the arms of Shemar James then ran over two Gator defenders at the goal line for a 20-13 lead with 1:30 to go in the third.

A Warner to Elijah Badger completion of 26 yards, plus a personal foul on the UGA defense helped move the Gators into scoring position. Tailback Ja'Kobi Jackson's 15-yard touchdown run tied the game at 20 and lit up the UF sideline midway through the fourth period. Back came Beck, however. Completions of 34 yards to Arian Smith and 21 to Lawson Luckie got the Bulldogs inside the UF 20, where Beck finished with 10-yard scoring toss to Dominic Lovett on a wideout screen. That gave Georgia a 27-20 advantage with four minutes to go.

On UF's next snap, Warner rolled to his right and tried to force a pass downfield that landed in the chest of Georgia linebacker CJ Allen, who returned the interception to the Florida 14-yard line. Two plays later, Dwight Phillips Jr. iced the game with a 4-yard scoring run with 3:03 remaining.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** For the Gators, their four-game losing streak in the series is the longest since dropping six straight from 1978-83. Go ahead and cue the noise in the system (again), but the fact the Gators have lost their second starting quarterback inside a month is a handicap that cannot be dismissed. Neither can the inspired way the team persevered, especially on the defensive side of the football. No quit in this team.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Who had the phrase, "Florida starting quarterback Aidan Warner" on their bingo card?

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** The Gators came to Jacksonville knowing they'd be without cornerback Jason Marshall Jr., tailback Montrell Johnson Jr. and wideout Eugene Wilson III, three of the best players on the team. By halftime, they'd lost Lagway and standout corner Devin Moore (after he intercepted a pass). Then safety Jordan Castell and cornerback Dijon Johnson went down in the third quarter. Throw all those names into an injury pile that already included defensive tackle Jamari Lyons, wideouts Kahleil Jackson and Andy Jean, plus tailback Treyaun Webb and, of course, Mertz. That's a bunch of manpower on the shelf.

**UP NEXT:** The Gators (4-4, 2-3) have next to no time to lick their wounds (much less feel sorry for themselves) before kicking off preparation for a road trip to No. 5 Texas (7-1, 3-1) in what will be the first meeting between the two programs since 1940. The Longhorns, who were idle Saturday, were beaten soundly at home by the Bulldogs, 30-15, last month, but bounced back last weekend with a 27-24 victory at No. 24 Vanderbilt.

## Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** The Florida football team could have waited another 84 years for its first game against Texas.

UT quarterback Quinn Ewers threw for 333 yards and five touchdowns over a little more than two quarters, as the fifth-ranked Longhorns overwhelmed the injury-ravaged Gators 49-17 in their Southeastern Conference game Saturday at Memorial Stadium. Ewers completed 19 of his 29 attempts, with scoring strikes of 29, 22, 50, 32 and 34 before checking out of the game after UT's first possession of the second half and Texas leading 42-0.

The Gators, with third-string walk-on quarterback Aidan Warner on for injured freshman DJ Lagway, didn't get on the board until midway through the third quarter. First, Coach Billy Napier sent Trey Smack in to kick a 23-yard field goal on fourth-and-goal from the UT 5 with 7:03 to play to make it 42-3, thus extending the NCAA record of 457 games (dating to 1988) without a shutout. After the UF defense greeted heralded backup quarterback Arch Manning with a three-and-out, Warner drove the offense 56 yards in nine plays, with freshman tailback Jadan Baugh putting Florida in the end for the first time with a 2-yard run to make it 42-10.

Warner, the redshirt freshman transfer from Yale who took over for Lagway in the second quarter of last week's loss against No. 2 Georgia, finished 12 of 25 for 132 and two interceptions. The Gators, who were without a slew of offensive skill position players due to injury, managed 329 yards of total offense and turned the ball over three times. They played their best after Texas emptied its bench, with Baugh and junior Ja'Kobi Jackson capping drives with TDs after the game was out of hand.

The Longhorns averaged 8.8 yards per play and cranked out 562 yards of total offense, the first 450 with Ewers under center. Tailback Jaydon Blue rushed 16 times for 106 yards, including a 60-yard touchdown dash. Ewers' five TDs went to four different players, with wideout Matthew Golden finishing with three catches for 64 yards and two scores.

Texas got the ball first and opened the game by driving to the Florida 32, but missed a 51-yard field goal attempt. Florida's first two possessions ended with a punt and fumble, respectively, with the Longhorns mounting marches of 85 yards and 22 yards to go up 14-0 and never looking back.

The Gators had a chance to get on the scoreboard after going down those two scores, but Smack missed a 30-yard field goal. After back-to-back punts, Texas scored touchdowns on four consecutive possessions (and five of the next six), taking a 35-0 lead at halftime and coasting home.

The game marked just the fourth meeting between Florida and Texas, and the first since 1940, a 26-0 victory in Gainesville. The Longhorns, who joined the SEC this season, now lead the all-time series 0-3-1.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Even UF fans wearing orange-and-blue goggles knew an 0-2 start to UF's November paddle-wheel of ranked opponents was a very real possibility, especially with a walk-on, third-team quarterback on the road. Those same fans will keep their fingers crossed the Gators will be healthier for their upcoming back-to-back home games.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** It'll be beaming brightly on Lagway, specifically his availability, all next week.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** The 32-point margin of defeat was the largest for a Florida team since a 55-20 loss to Oklahoma in the 2020 Cotton Bowl, as well as the worst in SEC play since a 31-3 loss at Alabama in 2005. The 35-point margin at half-time was the largest since the Gators trailed 35-10 against Nebraska at intermission of the 1996 Fiesta Bowl national-championship game. That one, of course, ended with a 62-24 Cornhuskers victory.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (4-5, 2-4) will be back home Nov. 16 for a 3:30 p.m. date against 14th-ranked LSU (6-2, 3-1). The Tigers have a monster Saturday night showdown against No. 11 Alabama, a game that likely will eliminate the losing team from the College Football Playoff picture. LSU has defeated the Gators five straight and six of the previous seven, dating to the 2017 season.

**WHAT HAPPENED:**The return of Florida freshman quarterback DJ Lagway ignited both the underdog Gators and energized the homefield Saturday in a 27-16 upset of 21st-ranked LSU in their Southeastern Conference showdown at Spurrier/Florida Field. Lagway, out with a hamstring injury since the first half of the Georgia game two weeks ago, passed for 226 yards and a score and rookie classmate Jadan Baugh had a 55-yard game-sealing touchdown run with just under four minutes remaining. The Florida defense, meanwhile, was no bystander. Though Tigers quarterback Garrett Nussmeier was on the field for twice as long as Lagway and the UF offense, the Gators did a bend-don't-break number on the visitors in holding the nation's seventh-best passing offense (322.3 yards per game) mostly in check and sacking Nussmeier, one of the best-protected QBs in the country, seven times times for 49 yards. Nussmeier finished 27 of 47 for 260 yards, with a touchdown and a fumble. Lagway, who had a first-quarter touchdown strike of 23 yards to wideout Elijah Badger (6 catches, 131 yards), completed 13 of his 26 attempts without a turnover or a sack. LSU out-gained UF in total offense 382 yards to 339 and had the ball for 41:13 to Florida's 18:17, but the Gators made more out of their five single-digit scoring drives than the Tigers (13 of 24 on third down, 2-for-4 on fourth) did with their four scoring drives of double digits.

LSU ran 93 plays to just 42 for Florida.

The win snapped a five-game losing streak for the Gators in their series with the Tigers that dates to 1937. Florida's last win against LSU was a 27-19 victory here in 2018. UF took the first lead of the game when Lagway lobbed a beautiful back-shoulder touchdown pass to Badger to go up 7-0. LSU matched the score with a 14-play, 84-yard scoring drive, converting four third downs along the way, including three of them of at least nine yards, with the last a 28-yard strike from Nussmeier to Aaron Anderson midway through the period.Both teams added field goals in the second quarter, with Trey Smack's 49-yarder giving the Gators a 10-7 edge with 3:27 to play in the half and Damian Ramos tying the game with a 50-yard with 10 seconds to play before intermission.The Tigers took their first lead, 13-10, on Ramos's 45-yard field at 5:54 of the third. Nussmeier, after surviving a sack/fumble inside his 10, drove his offense 62 yards, converting two more third-and-longs and appeared to have converted a third, but his 13-yard TD pass to Anderson on third-and-9 was called back for offensive pass interference. LSU could not convert on third-and-23 and Ramos put his team momentarily in front.The Gators threatened on their next possession, moving to LSU 34 on a couple nice Lagway-to-Badger completions. But a holding penalty, followed by a delay penalty, put the offense behind schedule. Smack bailed the unit out with a 55-yard field goal that tied for the third-longest in program history, and tied the score at 13 with 3:07 left in the period. UF had a chance to take the lead by recovering a fumble at the LSU 34, but after a delay penalty on first down the Gators lost three yards over the next three snaps and had to punt the ball away. Field position, though, would be key. The UF defense, again, thwarted Nussmeier on a third-and-long, with George Gumbs Jr. coming up with a sack at the LSU 5, forcing the Tigers to punt from their end zone on the first play of the fourth quarter. On the third play of the quarter, Lagway hit Badger with a 36-yard rope to the LSU 1 and Ja'Kobi Jackson scored the go-ahead TD on the next play for a 20-13 lead with 13:58 remaining.Nussmeier again put together a long drive (15 plays, 54 yards), but the Tigers had to settle for a third Ramos field goal, this one from 34 yards, that made the score 20-16 with 5:18 remaining. On UF's ensuing possession Lagway threw a second-down completion of 19 yards to tight end Hayden Hansen. On the next play, Baugh (6 carries, 65 yards) took a handoff off Lagway's misdirection, hit the left side of the line, got the edge and out-raced the LSU defense up the sideline for his career-long run and decisive touchdown with 3:48 to go.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** The Gators, with their third win against a ranked opponent in Coach Billy Napier's three seasons, are one win from bowl eligibility. The victory also evened the all-time series between the two teams at 34-34-3.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Think the freshman quarterback makes a difference?

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Coming into the game, LSU ranked fourth in the nation (and first in the SEC) in sacks allowed, having surrendered just six. Florida matched that.

**UP NEXT:** The Gators (5-5, 3-4) will wrap up their home schedule and SEC slate with a Saturday noon date against No. 10 Ole Miss (8-2, 4-2), which remains in the thick of the College Football Playoff mix. The Rebels, who upset No. 2 Georgia last week, will be coming off a bye week when they come to town. LSU (6-4, 3-3), which dropped its third straight, plays Vanderbilt at home.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Senior tailback Montrell Johnson Jr. scored on a 5-yard run out of the wildcat formation with 7:41 remaining and sophomore safety Bryce Thornton intercepted Heisman Trophy hopeful Jaxson Dart twice in the final minute and half, as the Florida Gators shocked No. 9 Ole Miss by bottling up the Rebels' high-scoring offense in a 24-17 upset before a Saturday sold-out, sonic-booming Spurrier/Florida Field. For the Gators, the win was their second in as many weeks against a ranked opponent, following last week's defeat of No. 21 LSU. It also clinched bowl eligibility, as well as positioning the team for a winning record for a 2024 season that began two months ago with ugly home losses to Miami and Texas A&M. Once again, it was freshman quarterback DJ Lagway injecting life into his team. Lagway completed 10 of 17 passes for 180 yards and two first-half touchdowns and one interception, but this day belonged to the Florida defense, a unit that started the day ranked No. 98 overall and tied for 80th in the country in scoring. On the other side was a Mississippi offense ranked No. 2 nationally at 539.5 yards per game and fourth in scoring at 40.7 points per. The Rebels approached the first number (464 yards), but never came close to the latter — the one that matters — thanks to the bend-don't-break UF execution that limited Ole Miss to just three second-half points and held the Rebs scoreless in all three of its red-zone opportunities. Johnson, on his senior day, carried 18 times for 107 yards, none bigger than the five when he switched places with Lagway, took a direct snap on second-and-goal and sliced in off the right side of the line to break a 17-all tie inside eight minutes left in the game. Dart, who completed 24 of 41 attempts for 323 yards, two TDs and two picks, drove the Rebels to the UF 40, but the drive stalled with a Tyreek Sapp/Caleb Banks sack on third-and-10 that forced a punt with 6:26 to go.

The Rebels got the ball back with 3:58 to go at their own 22. Dart dashed for a big first down on third-and-6, but from the Florida 39 tried to force a deep ball down the middle for Antwane Wells Jr., who was blanketed by the UF secondary. The pass sailed into triple coverage and was intercepted by a leaping Thornton in the end zone for a touchback with 1:32 to go. Ole Miss had all three timeouts remaining and called one after three consecutive UF running plays, forcing a Jeremy Crawshaw punt of only 39 yards that started the Rebels at their 34 with 1:03 left. Sapp sacked Dart on first down, but a 19-yard completion on the next play moved Ole Miss to the UF 48 with 34 seconds remaining. On the next play, Dart was pressured to his right and, appearing to try to throw the ball out of bounds, instead hit a sliding Thornton in the chest for the game-sealing turnover with 24 seconds to go. The loss was a devastating one for the Rebels, who came into the game in the middle of the College Football Playoff picture, but almost certainly were eliminated. The Gators finished with 344 yards of offense, including 180 on the ground and had just the one turnover to three for the Rebels. Both teams had a pair of long first-half scoring drives finished off by touchdown passes. The Gators got on the board first by going 89 yards in 11 plays and, on the first snap of the second quarter, Lagway fired an 8-yard score to Elijah Badger on third-and-goal. Dart needed just seven snaps to even the count with a 43-yard bomb to Tre Harris, who beat Thornton and Dijon Johnson on a deep post to tie the game at 7-all. The Rebels capitalized on a high, tipped Lagway pass that was intercepted by safety John Saunders Jr. at the Ole Miss 45. After a 25-yard completion to Jordan Watkins on fourth and 2, Dart finished the drive with a 22-yard touchdown strike to Cayden Lee for a 14-7 lead. Lagway needed only four plays to pull his team even on the next drive. He checked down a third-and-2 pass that Badger took 27 yards into Rebels' territory and, after a face mask penalty, hit tailback Jadan Baugh on a screen and (thanks to a great kick-out block from guard Damieon George Jr.) zipped in for a 25-yard score to knot the game at 14. The third quarter was an exchange of field goals, a 53-yarder by UF's Trey Smack and 42-yarder from Mississippi's Caden Davis, that sent the teams into the fourth quarter even at 17, setting the stage for the wild fourth quarter.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** A lot, obviously. Coach Billy Napier, fresh off his vote of confidence, and his Gators have a chance to end the season on a three-game winning streak (read on) — if not more, counting a bowl game — and are armed with the most dynamic young quarterback in college football to dangle as bait when they hit the transfer portal next month. That's a lot of late-season momentum.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** A couple weeks ago, the notion that Johnson, who came to UF with Napier from Louisiana, had played his final game as a Gator was something that was being discussed. Instead, he returned from injury for a few carries last week and saved one of his finest hours for an emotional, richly satisfying senior day. What a way to go out.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Before Saturday, the last time Florida defeated ranked opponents in back-to-back games was in 2008 — the program's last national championship season — when the Gators beat No. 23 Florida State 45-15 on the road, then a week later upset No. 1 Alabama in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta. The last time an unranked UF team (like this one) won consecutive games against ranked foes? That was way back in 2003, under Ron Zook, when the Gators beat No. 6 and eventual national champ LSU 19-7, followed by a 33-28 upset of No. 11 Arkansas. Both of those wins were on the road.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (6-5, 4-4) will wrap the regular season with its annual end-of-year

showdown against rival Florida State at Tallahassee. The Seminoles (2-9, 1-7), who routed FCS-classified Charleston Southern 41-7 Saturday, are in the midst of one of the worst seasons in program history, but can ruin all these good Gator vibes with a home win next weekend.

#### Scott Carter's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** DJ Lagway passed for two scores, Montrell Johnson Jr. ran for one, and Florida's defense recovered five Florida State fumbles on Saturday night to beat the Seminoles, 31-11, at Doak Campbell Stadium. Florida (7-5) clinched a winning season by beating FSU (2-10) for the first time since 2021, and sent the Seminoles to their first 10-loss season in 50 years. The Gators put the game out of reach early in the fourth quarter when Johnson, the senior tailback who followed head coach Billy Napier from Louisiana to Florida, raced 65 yards for a touchdown and 24-3 lead. Johnson finished with 99 yards on 10 carries and eclipsed 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, Lagway finished 14 of 22 for 133 yards, two TDs and one interception to become the first true freshman Gators quarterback to ever win in Tallahassee. Lagway threw a 4-yard TD pass to Marcus Burke in the second quarter to put the Gators up, 14-0. His final scoring pass was an 8-yard toss to Tony Livingston late in the fourth quarter.

The Gators struck first when edge rusher Jack Pyburn sacked FSU freshman quarterback Luke Kromenhoeck, forcing a fumble that was recovered by teammate D'Antre Robinson at the Seminoles' 14. Running back Ja'Kobi Jackson took over from there, running for 13 yards to FSU's 1, and then strolling into the end zone for a 1-yard TD and 7-0 Florida lead with 2:28 left in the first quarter. Pyburn's sack and Robinson's fumble recovery not only led to Florida's first score, it set the stage for what was about to happen over and over. Florida recovered five FSU fumbles and registered eight sacks on a night the Seminoles managed only 239 yards of total offense. Florida gained 368 yards and outscored FSU 14-0 in points off turnovers. Florida's best offensive drive came in the second quarter when the Gators stretched their lead to 14-0 with 25 seconds left in the first half on Lagway's 4-yard pass to Burke. The Gators drove 80 yards on nine plays, consuming 2:31 off the clock. Lagway was 4-for-4 for 60 yards on the drive, including a pair of throws to receiver Chimere Dike that combined for 46 yards.

FSU scored its first points on a 39-yard field goal by Ryan Fitzgerald to cap a nine-play, 42-yard drive on the Seminoles' first possession of the second half. The Seminoles' only other score came on a 2-yard run by Lawrance Toafili with less than four minutes remaining. After Fitzgerald's field goal made it 14-3, Rocco Underwood recovered a muffed punt by Seminoles punt returner Lawayne McCoy at FSU's 12. Trey Smack added a 30-yard FG to put Florida up 17-3 with 6:27 remaining in the third quarter. The Gators' lead was never seriously threatened in the second half as the defense put constant pressure on Kromenhoeck, recording a season-high sack total.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Florida clinches a winning season for the first time in Napier's three seasons and snaps a streak of three consecutive losing seasons dating back to 2021. Meanwhile, the Gators snapped a two-game skid against FSU and won for the first time in Tallahassee since 2018. More than anything, the Gators held onto the momentum they gained from victories over LSU and Ole Miss at home.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** In the first matchup between true freshman quarterbacks in the rivalry's history, Lagway outperformed Kromenhoeck. Lagway wasn't as sharp as he has been, but he finished the regular season with a 5-1 record as Florida's starter. Meanwhile, Kromenhoeck went 15 of 28 for 140 yards in his second career start.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** The Gators finished the regular season on the road, but they brought their pass rush with them. Florida, after totaling 10 sacks in the back-to-back wins over LSU and Ole Miss, sacked the Seminoles eight times on Saturday. For those counting at home, that is 18 sacks in the last three games. Florida totaled 20 sacks through its first nine games. You want more? The Gators accumulated 36 tackles-for-loss in the last three games.

**UP NEXT:** Could the Gators crack the AP Top 25 for the first time this season after a third consecutive victory? Meanwhile, the Gasparilla Bowl, Gator Bowl and Music City Bowl have been mentioned as postseason possibilities, but the bowl picture remains fluid in the first year of the 12-team College Football Playoff. The bowl schedule will be finalized by Sunday, Dec. 8.

### Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Freshman quarterback DJ Lagway threw for 305 yards and a second-half touchdown, junior kicker Trey Smack booted four field goals and the Florida Gators capped the 2024 season with a fourth consecutive victory Friday, defeating Tulane 33-8 in the Gasparilla Bowl at Raymond James Stadium. With their eighth win, the Gators clinched their most in four years and sent third-year Coach Billy Napier into the offseason with the program's longest win streak since 2020, along with a lot to be encouraged about with regard to the future of Florida football, given the turnaround from that ugly and lopsided 1-2 start to the season.

Smack, out of Severna Park, Md., kicked field goals of 34, 44, 24 and 30 yards, two in each half, with his first three staking his team to a 9-0 third-quarter lead. Lagway, named the Gasparilla Bowl MVP, completed 22 of 35 passes, with his 305 yards setting a bowl record for yardage. He had 7-yard scoring toss to tight end Tony Livingston in the third period that basically broke the game open, but also threw a pair of first-half interceptions, including one in the end zone, that kept the game close through the first two-plus periods until a run of 27 points bridging the third and fourth quarters turned a close game into a rout. Though all eyes were on Lagway, the Florida defense, with Ron Roberts in total charge after co-coordinator Austin Armstrong's exit last week for Houston, was probably the biggest factor of the game. UF virtually negated a Tulane offense that was one of the best in the nation during the regular season — 37.2 points (9th in the nation) and 421.1 yards per game (41st) — but was knee-capped by the defection of star quarterback Darian Mensah, (2,723 yards, 22 TD), who entered the transfer portal and signed last week with Duke. In his place, junior Ty Thompson, a former five-star prospect and transfer from Oregon, was under duress and inaccurate all game. Thompson finished just 11 of 29 for 125 yards and three interceptions, while scrambling nine times for 17 yards. Thompson's 16-yard touchdown to Mario Williams with 29 seconds to play averted a shutout.

Smack kicked a field goal in each of the first two quarters, but the Gators' inability to finish drives kept things close in the first half and well into the third quarter. Midway through the period, with UF up just 9-0, defensive back Dijon Johnson tipped a Thompson pass that was intercepted by walk-on teammate Alfonzo Allen Jr. at the UF 40. Seven plays later, Lagway play-faked, rolled right and tossed his short scoring pass to Livingston for a 16-0 lead with just over four minutes to go in the quarter. Two minutes into the fourth, Smack nailed his fourth field goal to put his team ahead 19-0.

Florida added a pair of touchdowns inside the final seven minutes. The first came after the Gators sacked Thompson on fourth-and-3 to force a turnover on downs. UF moved to the Tulane 25 and faced a fourth-and-1, with Lagway attempting to sneak for the first down. The ball, though, popped loose and bounced backward, where true freshman tailback KD Daniels scooped it up and raced through the Green Wave defense 27 yards for a score with 6:29 to go. It was 26-0. Walk-on tailback Anthony Rubio, the son of U.S. senator and likely the next Secretary of State, Marco Rubio, capped the Florida scoring with a 9-yard touchdown run with 1:11 remaining on a drive that included two plays — first a 1-yard run, then a lead block — by 449-pound defensive tackle Desmond Watson in his final collegiate game just down the road from his hometown of Plant City. The Gators finished with 529 yards of total offense, their second-most of the season (behind the 632 against FCS-classed Sanford), including 224 on the ground. The Green Wave, who lost to Army in the American Athletic Conference championship game two weeks ago, were held to a season-low 194 yards, with nearly half (89) coming in the fourth quarter after the game had been decided.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** The last time the Gators exited a season with this much momentum was in 2019 when they beat Virginia in the Orange Bowl for a fourth straight victory and second consecutive 11-win season. That UF team, coached by Dan Mullen, had nothing close to the off-field momentum (read: recruiting) like the roll Napier and his army are on right now, with what is expected to be (when the final signatures come in) a top-10 class.

UF improved to 25-24 all-time in bowl games, winning its first since that UVA showdown in Miami. Napier evened his Florida record to 19-19 over three seasons.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** The Gators are 6-0 when Lagway starts and finishes a game. He joined Chris Leak as the only true freshman quarterback in program history to win at least six games as a starter (Leak was 6-3 in 2003). He wasn't perfect, far from it, but now the 2023 Gatorade Player of the Year gets an offseason with all the first-team reps. Lagway's final freshman numbers: 115 of 192 (59.9 percent) for 1,915 yards, 12 touchdowns and nine interceptions.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** Over the last four games (all wins), the Florida defense combined for 38 tackles-for-loss, 19 sacks, 13 turnovers and allowed an average of just 13.0 points per game.

**UP NEXT:** Keep an eye on the transfer portal, which will remain open until Dec. 28, followed by an enthusiastic start to offseason conditioning in January and what figures to be the most-anticipated spring season in years come March. In the interim, Merry Christmas, Gator Nation.

ORANGE & BLUE  
MACGUFFIN

- The MacGuffin Trophy, college football's title belt, currently belongs to the Florida Gators for the first time since the 2010 season. The honor dates back to the first college football game in 1869, when Princeton defeated Rutgers, 6-4. The MacGuffin changes hands when a team defeats the title's current holder, and it passes from victor to victor, from 1869 to the present day.
- Florida laid claim after its win over No. 9 Ole Miss on Nov. 23, 2024. In 2024 alone, it switched hands four times, from Michigan to Texas (Sept. 7), to Georgia (Oct. 19), to Ole Miss (Nov. 9), to Florida (Nov. 23).
- This is Florida's sixth stint with the MacGuffin, having previously held it from Oct. 1 to Oct. 29, 1983; Sept. 19 to Oct. 10, 1989; Sept. 9 to Sept. 29, 2006; Jan. 1 to Dec. 6, 2009 (taken from Oklahoma after the National Title game); and Oct. 30 to November 13, 2010.
- The previous five times that the MacGuffin was played for in a non-national title bowl game, the holder of the MacGuffin has won and held it four times. UF's win over Tulane marked the fifth.
- Florida has never lost the MacGuffin to a non-SEC opponent, a streak which continued with the team's Gasparilla Bowl victory over Tulane and remains intact heading into Week 1 vs. LIU.
- Last season, Florida became the first unranked team to hold the MacGuffin since BYU held it for one week in 2022 (9/10 taken from Baylor, 9/17 lost to Oregon).
- The College Football MacGuffin was conceived of and coined by social media creator Tyler Budge in 2022, named after the Alfred Hitchcock-popularized term for a plot device which has no intrinsic value to anyone except a story's characters, and therefore drives the plot forward (ex: the Holy Grail in Arthurian legend, the ring in Lord of the Rings, etc.).

## WEEK 1: HONORARY MR. TWO BITS

### THE LEGEND OF MR. TWO BITS

It all started in 1949 at Florida Field, when George Edmondson looked at the crowd around him as the Gators were playing The Citadel. Fans were booing the team and George would not stand for it. He jumped up and got the fans cheering, and so began the legend of Mr. Two Bits.

For 60 years, Gators fans from all across the world became eternally grateful for the man who started every Gators home football game with the phrase “Two-Bits, Four-Bits, Six-Bits, a Dollar. All for the Gators, Stand Up and holler!” George Edmondson led the cheer in his trademark yellow shirt with an orange and blue tie from 1949 until retiring from the role at the end of the 2008 season. Coincidentally, Florida’s home finale that season came against The Citadel, providing a unique symmetry to Edmondson’s decades of leading Florida fans in the Mr. Two Bits cheer.

Upon his retirement, Florida mascots Albert and Alberta continued the pregame Two Bits tradition until 2013 when UF began inviting celebrities to perform the role. Errict Rhett was the first honorary Mr. Two Bits, and multiple Gator Greats have gone on to fill that role since.



### THIS WEEK'S HONORARY MR. TWO BITS IS...

...Florida Football National Champion and All-American, **Ahmad Black**. Florida’s Chris Harry details his selection as Week 1’s honorary Mr. Two Bits below.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – As it turned out, the “Two Bits” invite that Ahmad Black got was the second-most eventful thing that happened to the former Florida football standout last week.

“We had a baby Tuesday,” Black said.

Ace Black (7 pounds, 7 ounces) will keep his mother at home this weekend, but Dad will be at Spurrier/Florida Field when the 15th-ranked Gators open the 2025 season Saturday night against Long Island. Black’s other two kids (parents and in-laws, as well) will be at “The Swamp” to see one of the best and most decorated UF defensive backs of his generation kick off the 13th year of the celebrity “Mr. Two Bits” tradition, as well as the highly anticipated fourth season of the Billy Napier era.



Black will join seven former teammates – Percy Harvin, Brandon Spikes and Major Wright, among them – to get the honorary “Two Bits” call. And, yes, for former players it’s become a pretty big deal.

“It’s cool, man,” said Black, now 36. “Any time you get to go to ‘The Swamp’ again it’s an amazing opportunity. Things people deal with on a daily basis get forgotten when you get to go cheer for your team. It’s just great to be around the fans that have grown to love and support you at Florida.”

Black was easy to pull for. A hotshot prospect out of Lakeland High, he played sparingly as a freshman in 2007, then started all 14 games at strong safety during the Gators’ 2008 national-championship season, finishing with 59 tackles, a team-high seven interceptions and two touchdowns. One of those picks was in Florida’s 24-14 defeat of No. 1 Oklahoma in the BCS title game at Miami.

In 2010, Black was honored as first-team All-SEC and first-team All-America, capping his career with a MVP performance in the Outback Bowl with two interceptions, including an 80-yard touchdown return to seal a 37-24 victory over Penn State at Tampa, less than an hour from his hometown; on the final play of his collegiate career, no less.

Black was a fifth-round draft pick of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2011 and played three seasons with the club. He finished work on his UF Family Youth and Community Science degree in 2017 and now serves as community health coordinator at Lakeland Regional Hospital.

Just as he’ll relish a chance to come back, he cherishes his time with the Gators. Not necessarily because of the championships or honors.

“Everybody wants to be recognized for their accomplishments,” Black said. “But I didn’t play for accolades. If I’m blessed enough to get into the UF Hall of Fame one day, that’ll be great. But I didn’t play for that. I played the game because I enjoyed it and made memories for people and with people who I forged lifelong relationships and became my brothers. I got rings for championships, which are amazing, but the lifelong bonds I have with people, that’s what really matters.”

Like, for example, the man who approached Black once and recalled being at Raymond James Stadium with his Gator-loving parents to see that touchdown return in the bowl game. The man’s parents had passed away, but the memory Black gave him would remain for a lifetime.

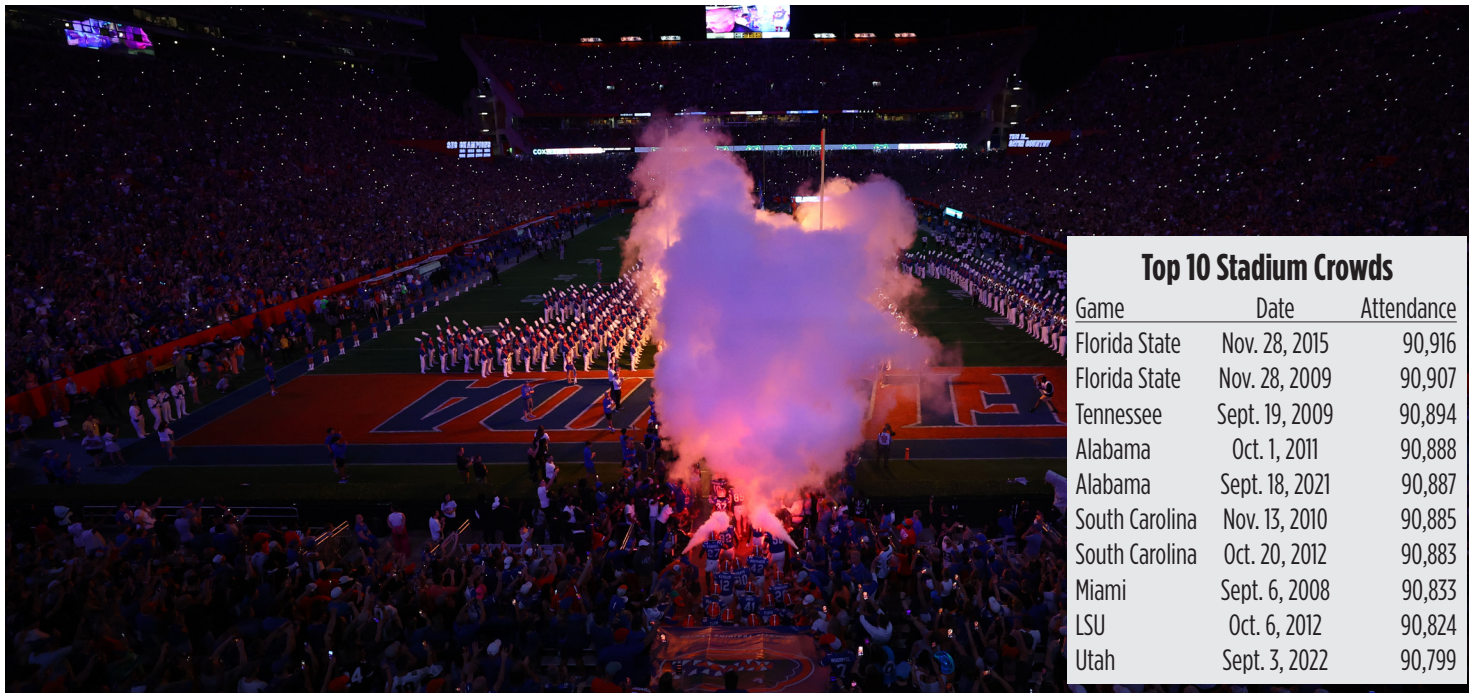
He thanked Black for that. “Very special,” he said. Now Black gets to make a memory of his own.

Bring on the 2025 season, one of Gator Nation’s most hyped in years.

“It has been one of the most talked-about preseasons we’ve had in a while ... and I don’t know if that’s awesome or not,” Black said. “But we’ve got a lot of eyes on us again, so let’s go.”

## at BEN HILL GRIFFIN STADIUM

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."
