## Did You Know?

**Eight Gators scored 13 goals** during the course of the 2024 season.

Already through three matches of 2025, **seven Gators scored nine goals**. That goals total is tied for 10th among NCAA teams playing three matches so far this season. It is the highest number of goals scored for the Gators since nine were also scored in the opening three matches of the 2017 season.

Of the seven 2025 Gator goal scorers, six hit their first collegiate goals.

## What's Happening?

Florida closes a three-match homestand and opens 2025 road action versus two Power 4 programs. Action begins Thursday when unbeaten Central Florida comes to Dizney Stadium and then Florida heads north for a Labor Day weekend meeting at Maryland on Sunday.

Florida pushed its all-time home opener record to 25-3-3 with Thursday's 4-2 win versus Towson. Three first-time collegiate scorers provided all of Florida's scoring. Freshman **Katie Johnston** became the 22<sup>nd</sup> in program history to open her collegiate scoring with two or more goals. She was a part of all the goals, providing the assist on senior **Njeri Butts'** first half goal and serving up the corner kick for sophomore **Skye Barnes'** score.

The Gators registered their first shutout Sunday in a 5-0 win versus North Florida. Five different Gators scored, with three – **Kai Tsakiris**, **Sophia Sindelar** and **Tatum O'Coyn** – registering their first collegiate goals. Junior **Lena Bailey** closed the opening half with the seventh goal of her career and first of the season. Butts made it a two-goal weekend, scoring her second collegiate goal to open the second half scoring.

Florida's 28-team roster includes 11 newcomers – six freshmen and five transfers. Of those 11 newcomers, two freshmen and all the transfers enrolled at UF in January 2025 and took part in team's spring training program.

Florida was 4-8-6 in 2024 and were No. 15 in Southeastern Conference action with a 1-7-2 record. Florida returns a duo with a pair of goals in 2024 – juniors **Delaney Tellex** and **Lena Bailey**. Back this season is the 2023 SEC freshman goals leader **Megan Hinnenkamp** (8) who was sidelined with injury in 2024. Senior **Njeri Butts** led Florida last season with three assists. Two with 12 or more midfield starts in 2024 – **Norah Abbott** and **Madison Jones** – are back this season, although Abbott is sidelined due to an injury suffered in preseason training. Florida graduated its starting backline and goalkeeper. Senior **Lauren McCloskey** has 27 starts on the backline. Florida returns two – **Jayden Emmanuel** and **Paloma Peña** – who combined for 10 appearances in goal last season.

Central Florida (4-0, 0-0 Big 12) is one of 34 undefeated teams remaining after the season's opening two weeks. The Knights started the season with four consecutive wins – at Alabama-Birmingham (2-1), Florida Atlantic (3-1), South Florida (4-1) and Louisiana State (2-1). Senior Liz Worden is in her first season at UCF and is the team's points leader off two goals and three assists. Redshirt sophomore Genesis Perez Watson has played every minute in goal this season for UCF and owns a goals-against-average of 1.0. She started each of Costa Rica's three matches in 2024 FIFA U20 Women's World Cup.

The Terrapins started the 2025 season with three consecutive wins – versus Lehigh (3-0), Saint Francis (5-0), Maryland-Baltimore County (1-0) and opened road action Sunday with a 2-0 loss at Old Dominion. Three Terrapins are among the 2025 Big Ten Players to Watch – seniors Kelsey Smith (forward), Tahirah Turnage-Morales (defender) and sophomore Emily Lenhard (midfield). Smith is UM's points leader off three goals and one assist. Redshirt sophomore Faith Luckey is making her first appearance in collegiate action this season and has played every minute in goal. She owns a goals-against-average of 0.51.

The Gators' 2025 fall schedule includes nine teams that advanced to 2024 NCAA Tournament action – Arkansas (third round), Florida State (second), Georgia (first), Kentucky (second), LSU (first), Mississippi State (third), South Carolina (second), Tennessee (first) and Texas (second).

Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, Twelve-year old Brooke, a Gator fan since birth, made her Florida allegiance official with her adoption through the [Friends of Jaclyn](#) organization. She was diagnosed in April of 2018 with neuroblastoma, a cancer of the central nervous system and nerve tissue. The first step of the treatment, chemotherapy, started soon after the diagnosis. The treatment disrupted Brooke's plans to attend the Gators' Orange & Blue game (a big disappointment for Brooke!).

Friends of Jaclyn's mission is "to improve the quality of life for children and families living with pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancer. Friends of Jaclyn matches children with high school and college athletic teams to provide support for the child and spread awareness of brain tumors throughout the community. Brooke is the 261<sup>st</sup> child to join a team through the Friends of Jaclyn program.

Two days after her adoption by the Gator program, **Brooke got some good news. She rang the bell at Shands Pediatrics to signal NEC (no evidence of disease).**

Florida is 21-7-3 in season openers. Thursday's meeting the eighth time UF opened a season versus a top-20 team (2-4-2 all-time vs top-20 teams in opener)

**Thursday's Scoring:**  
Florida State started the scoring in the 34<sup>th</sup> minute. Lara Dantas crossed the ball across the face of the goal to find Heather Gilchrist, who headed in the Seminoles' first goal of the season.

Shortly after play resumed, the Seminoles were awarded a free kick at corner of box. The ball sent in by Enasia Colon was touched in by Gilchrist from eight yards at 39:16.

The Seminoles scored again within two minutes off another free kick from Colon. This time, Wrianna Hudson headed it in from six yards.

Second half scoring started in the 64<sup>th</sup> minute. Riley Giana touched the ball forward to Taylor Suarez, who was wide and just inside the box. Her centering ball was one-touched in by Yuna McCormack from seven yards.

In the 77<sup>th</sup> minute, Peyton Nourse followed the deflection on her own shot to score from eight yards to close the evening's scoring.

I think three or four of their goals were set pieces, which we actually identified in pre game that we cannot give them set pieces when you have a six foot two center forward for them.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Three Gators turned in their first collegiate goals Thursday to open Florida Athletics 2025-26 home action with a win. Florida scored twice in the second half to take a 4-2 win over Towson at the Donald R. Dizney Stadium.

Florida is now 25-3-3 all-time in home openers, with wins in the last four seasons.

**Weather Delay – Again!**  
Both matches of this season were delayed by lightning. A week ago in Tallahassee, that match was twice delayed for a total of 2 hours and 15 minutes. Tonight, the players were pulled from the pitch after just over 12 minutes of action and returned to play 2 hours and eight minutes later.

**Tonight's Scoring:**  
The Tigers were the first to score after the delay, with Sydney Feiler one-touching in the ball from Kale'a Perry from eight yards in the 20<sup>th</sup> minute.

Freshman **Katie Johnston** hit her first collegiate goal off her first collegiate shot in the 31<sup>st</sup> minute to tie the match. The play started when **Madison Jones** won the ball and found Johnston about 30 yards from goal. Johnston drove forward about 10 yards before striking a left-footed shot to the left of keeper.

Another collegiate first goal – this time by senior **Njeri Butts** – came less than three minutes later. Johnston played the ball down the middle, enabling Butts to show her speed as she ran the ball down for a left-footed tap-in at the near post.

The Tigers tied the match in the 42<sup>nd</sup> minute when Perry scored off the pass from Emely Rubio.

Towson went a player down in the 49<sup>th</sup> minute when Gracen Houck was given her second yellow card after fouling Johnston on a goal scoring chance.

Johnston earned the brace in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute. Sophomore **Ryleigh Acosta** started the play, getting the ball to freshman **Addy Hess**. Johnston ran down the ball Hess played through the middle to score her second goal of the match.

Another Gator – sophomore **Skye Barnes** – became the third of the evening to score her first collegiate goal. She headed in the corner kick sent it by Johnston from four yards at the far post in the 68<sup>th</sup> minute.

- **Katie Johnston** is the 22nd in Florida's 31 seasons to score multiple goals in the same match as her first collegiate goal. The last was **Lauren Donovan** who provided both the goals in 2-1 win versus then No. 22 Texas on Oct. 4, 2024. This is the third consecutive season with a double goal effort in the same match as their first Gator goal. **Molly Grant** and **Megan Hinnenkamp** both turned in a pair of goals versus Stetson (Aug. 27, 2023). Hinnenkamp turned in three double goal matches in 2023.
  - Johnston joins **Jill Stevens** as the only players in Florida history with six points earned in the match with their first collegiate goal. As a freshman, Stevens hit a hat-trick on Oct. 9, 1998 in Florida's 8-0 win versus Mississippi State for her six points. In addition to her two goals Thursday, Johnston provided the assist on Njeri Butts' and Skye Barnes' goals.
  - Two who have seen most of their collegiate minutes as a defender scored tonight. **Skye Barnes** plays outside back for the Gators. **Njeri Butts** moved from the backline to a more attacking role for the Gators during the 2024 season. She played as an outside back for Jamaica in a pair of friendly matches versus Chile in February.

**Coach Bohon Said:**  
*On this evening's win:*  
"A lot of credit to Katherine (Vettori, Towson head coach) and her group. She was like that as a player - really gritty and worked really hard, never gave up - and you could see her team took on that personality so we knew they weren't going to go away easily. That's why we were a little bit frustrated at halftime that we didn't put away more chances because we felt like we could have had a little bit more of a cushion.

"But again, shows real sign of growth from last year to this year to put four goals away against a pretty gritty team and have three first time goal scorers is really exciting. So it was a good night. Anytime you get a result against a good, competitive team like Towson, you're happy." – Florida Head Coach **Samantha Bohon**
