When **QB DJ Lagway** starts, Florida is **7-1** with more than three times as many points (35.4 PPG) as its opponents (11.0 PPG). Florida has racked up 27 sacks while allowing just 12 sacks in those eight games.

The Gators are **7-0** in games Lagway plays in entirety, with the lone loss coming vs. No. 2 Georgia in 2024, a game which the Gators led prior to Lagway departing due to injury.

Florida is **4-0** with Lagway and **RB Jadan Baugh** starting together in the backfield.

### THE STORYLINE

- Florida hosts South Florida for the third time in school history in the fourth-ever meeting between the schools.
- The Gators are riding an SEC-high, five-game winning streak that is tied for the longest in the FBS with Ohio State, Illinois, Memphis, Air Force and TCU. At No. 13, Florida is ranked its highest in the AP Poll since Sept. 5, 2022 (No. 12).
- Across the five-game win streak, Florida has outscored teams by 23.6 points per game (170-52, +118).
- Florida has allowed 17 points or fewer in five-straight contests for an average of 10.4 points allowed per game.
- The Gators are coming off their first shutout in 46 games (Oct. 9, 2021 vs. Vanderbilt) and most points scored (55) in 42 contests, signifying the fewest points allowed and most points scored of the **Billy Napier** era.
- In Week 1, Florida set a team record with two first downs allowed and had zero penalties for the second time ever.
- Week 1 marked the first game in UF history with zero points allowed and zero penalties (also zero turnovers).
- Entering Week 2 of the season, the Gators are the only FBS team yet to commit a penalty.
- Florida grades as the No. 9 team in the FBS, backed by the No. 3 team defense and No. 4 run defense, per PFF.
- Thirteen Florida true freshmen debuted in the Week 1 victory (eight on defense, five on offense).
- The Gators are 3-0 in the all-time series against USF including 2-0 at home, most recently posting a 31-28 win on Sept. 17, 2022 in what was Napier's second victory as UF head coach.
- Going back two meetings to Sept. 11, 2021, Florida dominated, 42-20, while totaling 666 yards of offense (sixth-most all-time) on 363 yards rushing and 303 yards passing.
  - » It marked one of four times since 1996 that Florida eclipsed 300 yards passing and rushing simultaneously.
- In 2010, Florida defeated USF in The Swamp in the first-ever meeting, 38-14, thanks to 139 yards and one touchdown from RB Jeff Demps and a 172-yard, two touchdown game (18-for-31) by QB John Brantley.
- Florida has outscored USF, 111-62 (+49 pts / 16.3 PPG), and out-gained USF, 1,418 to 1,029 (+389 yds / 129.7 YPG).
- The 2025 Gators return 13 starters from 2025, which is tied for the 10th-most in the FBS and second in the SEC.
- Florida finished 8-5 last season after staring down a 4-5 record following a 49-17 loss at No. 5 Texas on Nov. 9.
- With the No. 1 SOS in the country, Florida is the only team in the nation with four opponents ranked in the Preseason AP Top 10, and is one of four teams (all in SEC) with seven opponents ranked in the Preseason AP Top 25.
- Napier is currently over .500 at Florida (20-19) for the first time since Nov. 3, 2023 (11-10).
- The Gators have forced a takeaway in 11-straight games and in 13 of 14 contests since the start of 2024.
- Since 2018, Napier ranks 10th among active FBS head coaches in the FBS with 60 total victories.
- Florida's all-time, NCAA-record scoring streak currently sits at 462-consecutive games dating back to 1988.
- Week 2 vs. USF marks the 14th-straight sellout in The Swamp dating back to Week 3 of the 2023 season.
- Florida has won five-straight games in The Swamp by an average of 22.4 points (178-66).

## - FLORIDA'S FIVE GAME WIN STREAK -

- Florida's five-game winning streak is the longest in the SEC and tied for the longest in the FBS.
- In the five games dating back to 2024, Florida outscored teams by 118 total points, or 23.6 per game (170-52).

- As a result, the Gators have won five-straight games for the first time since Oct. 31-Dec. 5, 2020 (six).
- The 2024 season was the first time Florida closed out the season with four-straight wins (def. No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, FSU & Tulane) since the 2019 campaign (Vanderbilt, Missouri, FSU, Virginia – Orange Bowl).
- In 2024, Florida posted back-to-back upset wins over AP Top 25 opponents (No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss) as an unranked team for the first time since Oct. 11-18, 2003 (No. 6 LSU, No. 11 Arkansas). This was the first time the aforementioned feat was accomplished in consecutive home games.
- The win vs. No. 9 Ole Miss marked UF's first home victory as a double-digit underdog and UF's second-largest upset win overall in the last 45 seasons (behind topping No. 16 LSU as a 14-point road dog in 2016).

## - DJ TURN IT UP: THE LAGWAY FILE -

- **QB DJ Lagway** improved to 7-1 as a starter in Week 1, throwing a touchdown in his sixth-straight game played while tying his career high with three touchdown passes (second time in career, 2024 vs. Samford).
- Lagway completed 15-of-18 passes for 120 yards and now owns 15 career touchdown passes.
- With a 194.3 rating vs. in Week 1 vs. LIU, Lagway posted the second-highest rating of his career and the fourth-best rating of any UF quarterback in the Napier era (2022-25).
- Lagway's 194.3 rating ranks 17th in the FBS and third in the SEC behind Taylen Green and Diego Pavia.
- Lagway's 83.3% completion pct. is tied for fifth in the FBS and leads the SEC.
- Meanwhile, his 16.7% touchdown pct. ranks fifth in the FBS and second in the SEC behind Taylen Green.
- Lagway has posted a quarterback rating above 134.0 in seven-straight games.
- In Week 1, Lagway delivered a 150.0-plus rating for the seventh time in his career.
- Lagway surpassed the 2,000 career passing yards mark in Week 1 (2,035 yards, 130-of-210, 61.9%).
- In games started by Lagway, Florida is averaging 9.3 yards per pass to opponents' 5.7 YPP, and 68 points off turnovers compared to opponents' 21 points.
- Lagway owns 17 big-time throws to just one turnover-worthy play on deep balls in his career, per PFF.
- Lagway has completed 13 passes of 40-plus yards across his 210 career attempts.
- Lagway led all FBS true freshman quarterbacks with at least 125 pass attempts with a 154.9 rating last season - 10.9 points higher than the next-closest true freshman passer (Marcel Reed, Texas A&M).
- Lagway finished with the 12th-best passer rating in UF program history last season at 154.9, which is the best ever for a UF true freshman.
- Lagway ranked third among FBS passers with a 95.8 passing grade on deep throws in 2024 (20-plus yards) per PFF, behind only Syracuse's Kyle McCord and Ohio State's Will Howard.
- Making his seventh-career start in the Gasparilla Bowl, Lagway improved to 6-0 in games he starts and finishes en route to throwing a career-high 35 times (22-of-35) for 305 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions for a 134.1 rating - all while taking home Gasparilla Bowl MVP honors.
- Lagway's six wins in 2024 tied Chris Leak (6-3, 2003) for the most ever by a UF true freshman quarterback.
- Although Lagway was Florida's fifth true freshman quarterback to start against Florida State, he became the first of that contingent to defeat the Seminoles in 2024.
- Lagway holds status as the third Gators true freshman QB to start at home vs. a Top 25 opponent and the first QB to win, doing so in consecutive weeks with signature victories over No. 21 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss.
- Making his first-career start in the Week 2 win over Samford, Lagway passed for the most yards ever (456) by a Florida true freshman quarterback, breaking Chris Leak's mark of 269 vs. Kentucky in 2003.

- THIS O-LINE MIGHT BE HIGHLY OFFENSIVE -

- Entering the 2025 season, Florida's offensive line boasted 223 combined games played, which ranked 11th in the FBS and fourth in the SEC behind Auburn (236), Texas A&M (235) and Mississippi State (227).
- The Florida O-line also entered with 109 career starts, which ranked 14th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.
- Across Florida's active five-game winning streak, the Gators have allowed just 26 tackles for loss and eight sacks while tallying 45 TFLs and 20 sacks on defense.
- Returning starters include All-American **C Jake Slaughter** (13 starts), Preseason First Team All-SEC **OL Austin Barber** (13), **OL Damieon George Jr.** (10) and **OL Knijeah Harris** (13), who combined for 49 starts last season.
- UF offensive linemen did not allow a QB hit in Week 1 while ranking No. 12 in the FBS in run blocking (76.3).
- Slaughter (91.5) and Barber (91.3) were Florida's highest-graded offensive players in Week 1 vs. LIU.
- Barber's 91.3 overall grade and 90.3 run blocking grade both rank second among FBS offensive tackles.
- Barber did not allow a QB pressure across 44 Week 1 snaps for a 100% block rate.
- **RT Bryce Lovett** started Week 1 vs. LIU after playing all 13 games (three starts) at right guard in 2024.
- **OL Caden Jones** (75.6) and **OL Roderick Kearney** (74.6) finished among Florida's top-10-graded offensive players in Week 1, ranking seventh and eighth, respectively.
- In 2024, the Gators allowed just 20 sacks all season, which ranked third in the SEC and 40th nationally.
- UF graded as the No. 11 pass blocking team in the FBS (79.8) and was second in the SEC behind Texas.
- Florida has allowed 77 sacks in 39 games under **HC Billy Napier**, ranking sixth-lowest in the SEC.

- SLAUGHTERING THE COMPETITION -

- All-American **C Jake Slaughter** grades as the top FBS center (91.5) and owns the best run blocking grade (90.2) among FBS centers through Week 1, per PFF.
- His PFF grade has increased every season: 2021 (59.0), 2022 (69.4), 2023 (78.4), 2024 (82.0) and 2025 (91.5).
- Across 37 Week 1 snaps, Slaughter did not allow a QB pressure for a 100% block rate, per PFF.
- Slaughter was named a 2024 First Team All-American by the AP, ESPN and PFF after finishing with the sixth-best PFF grade in the FBS at the position (82.0).
- As Florida's first-ever First Team All-American center, Slaughter joined Gators Bill Carr (1966) and Maurkice Pouncey (2009) as UF All-Americans at the position.
- Slaughter has allowed just 13 hurries, three sacks and two QB hits across 1,434 career snaps from 2021-25.
- Slaughter allowed one sack, zero QB hits, eight hurries and nine pressures in 402 pass block snaps in 2024.
- Slaughter ranked top-20 nationally in both run blocking (eighth, 80.1) and pass blocking (17th, 84.2) in 2024.

- BAUGHLIN' BELLCOWS -

- Florida has five of its top six rushers from last season back in terms of net yardage, led by sophomore **RB Jadan Baugh**, who has started five of the last eight games after earning the Week 1 start vs. LIU.
- Leading Florida with 133 carries and 673 rushing yards in 2024, Baugh opened his sophomore 2025 season by rushing for 104 yards on nine carries (11.6 YPC) to notch his second-career, 100-yard game in Week 1.
- If Baugh eclipses 100 yards in Week 2, it would be the sixth time (fifth UF player) a Gator opened the season with consecutive 100-yard games (Emmitt Smith 1988 & 1989, Errict Rhett 1993, Fred Taylor 1997, Terry Jackson 1998).
- Baugh also posted an 82.8 PFF grade (second in SEC, 13th in FBS), ranking fourth among UF offensive players.
- Backed by 60 yards after contact, Baugh's 83.1 rushing grade sits 10th in the FBS and third in the SEC.
- Baugh had a 78.8% breakaway rate and was fourth in the FBS with nine missed tackles forced in Week 1.
- In the last eight games dating back to last season, Baugh has scored nine total touchdowns while rushing 111 times for 624 yards (5.6 YPC, 78.0 YPG), featuring 377 yards after contact (60.4%).
- In his career, 487 of Baugh's 777 rushing yards have come after contact (61.6%).
- Florida has rushed for over 200 yards in three-straight games while averaging 219.7 rushing yards per game.
- Florida has rushed for over 100 yards in 11-straight tilts while averaging 176.3 rushing yards per game.
- Baugh tied for the team high with seven rushing touchdowns in 2024 alongside **RB Ja'Kobi Jackson**.
- Jackson saw the second-most carries (seven) among the five UF running backs to garner a touch in Week 1.
- Meanwhile, redshirt freshman **RB KD Daniels** recorded his first-career reception in the third quarter and true freshman **RB Duke Clark** logged his first-career carry as well as his first-career catch.
- Florida has 70.9% of net rushing yardage back from 2024, headlined by Baugh (32.1%) and Jackson (24.3%).
- Baugh is the only active SEC running back who had at least 130 rush attempts, seven rushing touchdowns and at least one receiving score while averaging at least 5.0 yards per carry last season.
- Baugh delivered a five-touchdown game in his first-career start vs. Kentucky in 2024 and tied the school record for the most in a game (Trey Burton vs. UK in 2010, Tim Tebow vs. South Carolina in 2007).



## - A REVAMPED RECEIVERS ROOM -

- With one of the nation's top receiving duos having departed for the NFL in **WR Elijah Badger** and **WR Chimere Dike**, Florida is replacing each of its top pass catchers from last season.
- Florida lost 63.1% of its receiving offense from 2024, 54.2% of which came from Badger and Dike.
- Last year, Badger (806 yards, 20.7 YPC) and Dike (783 yards, 18.6 YPC) represented the only FBS receiving duo to have both players post over 700 receiving yards and over 18.0 yards per catch.
- With Badger and Dike now gone, Florida looks to returners **WR Eugene Wilson III**, **WR Aidan Mizell**, **WR Tank Hawkins**, **WR TJ Abrams** and **WR Kahleil Jackson**, among others.
- Despite lost production, Florida's 2025 receiving room ranks No. 18 in the FBS and No. 8 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- Fifteen different Gators recorded a reception in Week 1 as the revamped corps started with a bang, highlighted by true freshman **WR Vernell Brown III** pacing Florida with 79 yards on three catches in his debut.
- Brown III's 79 yards marked the most ever by a UF true freshman receiver in his first-career start.
- Brown III became the third true freshman wide receiver to start on opening day for the Gators, joining Antonio Callaway (2015) and Percy Harvin (2006).
- Brown III's father's first-career start came in 2002 as a redshirt freshman on the road at Vanderbilt while his grandfather's first-career start was in 1982 as true freshman vs. West Texas State (West Texas A&M).
- Brown III is the 17th true freshman at any position to start a season opener for the Gators dating back to 1972 (Mike Williams, OT). The last UF true freshman to start opening day on offense was RT Jawaan Taylor in 2016.
- Among FBS true freshmen, Brown II ranks third in yards per catch (26.3) and fourth in yards (79).
- Despite leading all 15 UF receivers with five catches in Week 1, Wilson III finished last in yards (-4).
- Wilson III has recorded a catch in 15-straight games he has played in dating back to his collegiate debut.
- Wilson III is the most-experienced returning receiver on the roster, entering 2025 with 13 career games including 11 starts with 80 receptions, 804 yards, seven touchdowns, 57.4 YPG and 10.1 YPC.
- Although he was limited to four games in 2024, Wilson III racked up 19 catches, 266 yards and one touchdown after dazzling across 10 games as a 2023 Freshman All-American: 61 receptions, 538 yards, six touchdowns.
- Abrams set career highs with two receptions and 53 yards in Week 1.
- True freshman five-star recruits **WR Dallas Wilson** and Brown III will be heavily involved in the receiving corps, as well as rookie four stars **WR Muizz Toukara** and **WR Naeshaun Montgomery**.
- Toukara and Montgomery also made their career debuts alongside Brown III in Week 1.
- Toukara recorded his first-career reception and Montgomery logged his first carry and reception.
- Redshirt senior transfer **WR J. Michael Sturdivant** arrives from UCLA, having played in 40 career games including 30 starts over four seasons at Cal (2021-22) and UCLA (2023-24).
- Sturdivant recorded his first touchdown reception as a Gator in Week 1 vs. LIU in the second quarter.

## - HANSEN AND THE TIGHT ENDS -

- Seven tight ends can be found on the 2025 roster highlighted by redshirt junior **TE Hayden Hansen**, who has now started 23-consecutive games for the Gators at the position dating back to 2023.
- Hansen's 23-game start streak is the longest of any Florida offensive player and is the second-longest such streak on the entire roster behind **DB Jordan Castell**'s 25-consecutive starts.
- Hansen had three catches for 27 yards and caught his fourth-career touchdown in Week 1.
- From 2023-24, Hansen caught 27 passes for 357 yards and three touchdowns.
- Adding depth to the position and potentially joining Hansen in two-TE sets is junior **TE Tony Livingston**, who made one start in Week 4 of the 2024 season at Mississippi State.
- Livingston played in 10 contests with 11 receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns in 2024.
- After playing in four games last year, **TE Amir Jackson** logged his first-career reception (10 yards) in Week 1.

## - OFFENSIVE GRAB BAG -

- The Gators have eclipsed 400 yards 17 times since the start of 2022.
- With 200 rushing yards vs. LIU, Florida has rushed for 200 yards 15 times since 2022.
- Florida has scored 40 points eight times in the Napier era, including 30 points in 20 contests.
- Florida was the only team to eclipse 300 total yards vs. Texas during the 2024 regular season (329).
- The Gators also totaled 197 yards rushing against Texas – the most vs. UT during the regular season.

Florida **lost 63.1%** of receiving offense

The Gators welcome back **over 70%** of both their passing (**73.1%**) and rushing offense (**70.9%**) from last season, with **five** of Florida's six leading rushers back in Orange & Blue.

Despite each of its **top two receivers departing** for the NFL in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, Florida returns **six** of its top nine receivers from 2024 including **three** of its top five.

- 2025 DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK -

- Florida returns 62% of defensive production and five starters from last year's squad, which finished on a tear across the Gators' season-ending win streak.
- Florida returns 76.9% of its sack production (30 of 39 sacks) and each of its top five leaders in sacks, in addition to seven of its top 10 in sacks from last year.
- Florida also brings back 72.1% of its TFL production (62 of 86 TFLs) and each of its top four leaders in TFLs, as well as six of its top 10 in TFLs from the 2024 season.
- In the last four games of 2024, UF totaled 38 tackles for loss, 19 sacks, 18 pass breakups, 17 quarterback hurries, eight forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five interceptions while allowing 13.0 points per game.
- Florida's 18 sacks and 34 tackles for loss were the most in the FBS over the last three weeks of the regular season.
- In those four games, UF opponents reached the redzone nine times and only scored 22 total points.
- UF forced -161 rushing yards in the final four games played as opponents only averaged 2.9 yards per carry.
- When opponents rushed the ball in the last four weeks of 2025, there was a 25% chance it would go for negative yards and a 31% mark for zero or negative yards.
- In eight of the last nine games of 2024, the Gators did not allow an opponent to rush over 150 yards, including under 100 yards vs. FSU (99) and Tulane (69). The Seminoles averaged just 2.25 YPC.
- Florida was one of eight teams to only allow one rushing TD in the last three weeks (3 GP) of the regular season.
- As a result of the four-game finish, the Gators ended the season ranking ninth nationally in red zone defense (0.725), 11th in sacks (3.00 per game), 27th in passes intercepted (14), 33rd in tackles for loss (6.6 per game), 35th in turnover margin (0.46), 43rd in scoring defense (23.1) and 49th in team passing efficiency defense (124.2).
- Returning starters include **DE Caleb Banks**, **DL Tyreek Sapp**, **LB Grayson Howard**, **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 57 games played and 48 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five), **STAR Aaron Gates** (five), **LB Jaden Robinson** (four), **DE Kamran James** (four) and **JACK George Gumbs Jr.** (three) all made multiple starts on Florida's defense last year for an additional, combined 32 starts.

- BANKS OF AMERICA -

- Preseason Second Team All-SEC **DL Caleb Banks** headlines the 2025 Florida defense after electing to return for his senior season and forgoing the 2025 NFL Draft. He projects as a first-to-second rounder in the 2026 NFL Draft.
- Banks made the Preseason Watch Lists for both the Bronko Nagurski Award and Chuck Bednarik Award.
- In his second year at Florida in 2024, Banks played in 12 games (10 starts) and racked up 21 tackles (10 solo) including 7.0 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. He also added two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.
- Banks went off in the upset wins over No. 21 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss in Weeks 12-13 last year, totaling seven tackles, 4.5 tackles-for-loss (-26 yards), 3.5 sacks (-22 yards), four quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup.
- Prior to those two games, he had career stats of 5.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and five QB hurries.
- Despite the slow start, Banks still finished as the No. 58 pass rusher among FBS interior defenders.
- Banks joined the Gators in 2023 after only playing 47 career snaps in two seasons at Louisville, and has now played in 24 games including 21 starts over the past two campaigns in Orange & Blue (2023-24).
- Against No. 9 Ole Miss, Banks finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.
- According to PFF, he led all FBS defensive tackles in quarterback pressures from Weeks 12-13 of 2024 with eight vs. LSU and seven against Ole Miss for a total of 15.

- TAP INTO THE SAPP -

- Teaming up with Sapp to form Phil Steele's No. 10 defensive line in the FBS (No. 4 in SEC) is **EDGE Tyreek Sapp**, who entered the 2025 season as a projected first-round pick and on the Bronko Nagurski Award Watch List.
- Leading Florida with 13.0 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks, Sapp played in all 13 games (nine starts) in 2024.
- As a redshirt junior last season, Sapp graded as PFF's No. 9 edge rusher in the FBS (90.4) while posting the No. 4 rush defense grade (88.7) among FBS edge rushers.
- Sapp's 90.4 grade was the highest by a Florida defender since Jonathan Greenard in 2019 and ranked third highest among SEC edge defenders in 2024.
- Florida's 2024 season-high in sacks (eight) and tackles-for-loss (14) came in the Week 14 victory at FSU, which represented the Gators' most in the last five seasons.
  - » Sapp led the effort with his third-consecutive game of 2.0 tackles-for-loss and 1.0 sack. He closed out the last four games with 19 tackles, 8.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, 12 stops, two QB hurries and one forced fumble.



## - DEFENSE MAINTAINS LATE SEASON MOMENTUM -

- The Florida defense picked up where it left off last season with a 55-0 shutout of LIU in the 2025 season opener. It was the 25th all-time shutout in a season opener and Florida's first since 2014 vs. Eastern Michigan (65-0).
- It was Florida's first shutout in 46 games, since defeating Vanderbilt, 42-0, in 2021.
- Florida was one of 10 teams to shut out their opponent in week one and the only SEC team to do so.
- The Gators set a program record for fewest first downs allowed in a game (two) as LIU earned one on its opening drive and then not again until 9:22 left in the game.
- LIU also never advanced to the redzone and didn't cross midfield until 9:22 left in the game.
- Florida only allowed 86 total yards in Week 1 – the team's fewest since giving up 53 yards to North Texas in 2016 and its fifth-lowest total since 1996.
- **DB Bryce Thornton** recovered a fumble for a touchdown (37 yards) on the opening drive of Week 1. He later added a second fumble recovery in the second quarter to become the first Gator with two since Gervon Dexter Sr. vs. FAU in the 2021 season opener.
- UF was one of three teams to score a defensive touchdown for its first points of 2025 (Maryland, W. Michigan).
- The fumble was forced by **LB Jaden Robinson**, who made his fifth straight start and led the team with 2.0 tackles-for-loss in Week 1. Over the last five games, he has 20 tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.

- During Florida's five-game winning streak, the Gators defense has suffocated opposing offenses.
- No opponent has scored more than 17 points, including only a total of 19 combined points in the last three outings alone.
- Across the 182 rush attempts in the last five games, 46 carries have gone for negative yards, 55 attempts have been for negative or zero yards and only 14 attempts have eclipsed 10 yards.
- When opponents rush the ball, there is a 25% chance it will be for negative yards, 30% for negative or zero yards and 53% for two yards or less.
- UF has limited opponents to 34% (26/76) on third down conversions.
- **EDGE Tyreek Sapp** has totaled 20 tackles, 8.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, TWO QB hurries and one forced fumble in the last five games.
- **DB Bryce Thornton** has tallied 27 tackles, four takeaways (2 INT, 2 FR), two pass breakups, one forced fumble and 0.5 TFL.

**- ONCE YOUTHFUL DEFENSE READY TO FLY -**

- Of the 143 starting opportunities on defense in 2024, a combined 55 came from underclassmen (38.4%) highlighted by five starts each in the last four games of the year, consecutively.
- Across the two previous seasons (2023-24), 128 out of 275 defensive starts were by underclassmen (47%).
- Additionally, 50% of Florida's defensive snaps in 2024 came from underclassmen, compared to the 2023 campaign, when 58% of snaps were logged by underclassmen, including 25% by freshmen alone.
- A combined 53% of defensive snaps were recorded by underclassmen from 2023-24.
- Last season, 16 players made their first UF starts while nine made their first-collegiate starts.
- Of those who played the 10-most snaps for the Gators in 2024, five were underclassmen: **FS Jordan Castell** (first), **DB Dijon Johnson** (fourth), **STAR Sharif Denson** (fifth), **SS Bryce Thornton** (sixth) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (eighth).
- Five of the Gators top-eight tacklers last season were second-year players: Castell (fourth), Robinson (fifth), Thornton (seventh), Denson (t-eighth) and **ILB Grayson Howard** (t-eighth).
- Florida's 25 takeaways in 2024 were its most since 2018, with 13 coming from underclassmen highlighted by three apiece from Thornton and **STAR Aaron Gates**.

**- IMPACT PLAYS DOWN THE STRETCH IN 2024 -**

- Florida forced and recovered five fumbles vs. FSU, the team's most since at least 2000 and one back of the program record of six – last accomplished vs. Vanderbilt in 1993.
  - » The five total takeaways were a season high and the sixth-most since 1996 in a single game for UF.
  - » The five turnovers gained were one behind the most in the FBS last season (six) by six different schools.
- Florida nabbed three takeaways vs. No. 9 Ole Miss: two interceptions and one fumble recovery.
  - » **DB Bryce Thornton** picked off Jaxson Dart in the endzone with 1:32 remaining and then sealed the win with a second interception with 0:17 left. His 14 tackles (five solo) were a career high and the most in a game by a Gator last season. Thornton's two interceptions made him one of six SEC players to have two in conference play last season.
- Florida had a six-sack performance against an LSU offensive line that entered the week ranking fourth in the FBS (first in the SEC) in sacks allowed per game, and entered the game having allowed six sacks all season.
- LSU was held to an average of 2.9 yards per carry and 128 total rushing yards.
  - » Florida forced -62 rushing yards, a season-high and tied for the eighth-most by an SEC team.

**- JUST TAKING THE EDGE OFF -**

- In addition to stars **DL Caleb Banks** and **EDGE Tyreek Sapp**, Florida's No. 10 defensive line features returning edge rushers in **JACK George Gumbs Jr.**, **DE Kamran James** and **EDGE LJ McCray**.
- With both Sapp and Gumbs Jr. back in the fold, Florida returns each of its top-two leaders in sacks from 2024, as well as the entirety of the top four in Sapp (7.0), Gumbs Jr. (5.0), Banks (4.5) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (3.5).
- Gumbs Jr. finished second on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and sacks (5.0) in 2024 in just his second full season on defense after three seasons at Northern Illinois: one at WR, one at TE and one at DE.
  - » In Week 1 vs. LIU, Gumbs Jr. collected 1.5 tackles-for-loss and 0.5 sack and was UF's highest-graded player per PFF with a 91.9 grade, ranking 11th in the FBS and third in the SEC among EDGE defenders.
- As a sophomore in 2024, James tied for the team lead with six QB hurries while tying for fifth on the Gators with 4.0 sacks. James totaled 28 tackles (20 solo), 2.0 sacks and one forced fumble.
  - » In the 2025 season opener, James and Gumbs Jr. teamed up for the first sack of the season while James tied for the team high in tackles (five), with three of them holding LIU to a rush of less than two yards.
- Playing just 181 defensive snaps as a true freshman, McCray tied for second on the Gators with five QB hurries in addition to 13.0 tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss and 0.5 sacks.
- Notable newcomers to Florida's edge rushing unit include UMass transfer **EDGE Kofi Asare** and true freshman **EDGE Jayden Woods** out of Mill Valley HS in Shawnee, Kan.
- Playing in 12 games with four starts at UMass in 2024, Asare ranked second on the Minutemen in tackles for loss (5.5) and sacks (3.0) while logging 30 tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
- Asare made his UF debut in the 2025 season opener and had a tackle-for-loss for his first Gator tackle.
- In his collegiate debut, Woods posted the best pass rush grade (90.2) on the UF defense, ranking second in the FBS among true freshmen EDGE defenders. He finished with one solo tackle and an 83.8 overall PFF grade.





## - THE NATION'S MOST UNDERRATED LB ROOM -

- Although Florida's linebacker room was its lowest-ranked preseason unit per Phil Steele at No. 25, the position group welcomes back **LB Grayson Howard**, **LB Jaden Robinson**, **LB Myles Graham** and **LB Aaron Chiles**.
- In the season opener, the LB unit combined for 13 tackles, 11 stops, 3.0 tackles-for-loss and one forced fumble.
- Robinson played in all 13 games last season while starting each of the final four contests and started the 2025 season opener for his fifth-straight game and made four solo tackles, 2.0 TFLs and forced one fumble.
- Robinson's four tackles last week featured one forced fumble, two solo TFLs and one stop (0-yard rush).
- Over last five games, Robinson has 20 tackles, 4.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks. Robinson recorded 52 tackles (28 solo) and 3.5 sacks in 2024, which ranked fourth on the Gators.
- As a true freshman and Gators legacy player, Graham earned his first-career start in the 2025 opener and led the team in tackles (five) with a tackle-for-loss, as all five of his tackles were stops.
- Graham emerged in the last six games of the 2024 season, posting 23 tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.5 TFLs, one interception, one forced fumble and one QB hurry. Prior to that, Graham owned seven tackles (one solo) and zero TFLs across the first seven games of 2024.
  - » He made his first-career sack vs. No. 2 Georgia, which was a 10-yard loss on third and two in the fourth quarter. Graham then forced his first-career fumble at No. 5 Texas that led to a Gators touchdown drive.
  - » Against No. 21 LSU, he played a season-high 31 snaps and had a season-best seven tackles with two stops while grading as the Gators best defensive player and tackler, according to PFF.
  - » He had two tackles, 0.5 tackle for loss and one interception in the Gasparilla Bowl victory.
- Graham played the second-most snaps (183) among SEC freshman LBs in 2024 while Chiles ranked third (130).
- Graham also led all SEC freshman linebackers with 10 stops last season.
- True freshmen **LB Ty Jackson** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla. / Seminole Ridge) and **LB Myles Johnson** (Brewton, Ala. / T.R. Miller) made their collegiate debuts in Week 1. Johnson had four tackles with three stops in 13 snaps played.

## - SO, WHAT ABOUT THE DEFENSIVE BACKS? -

- Florida's 2025 defensive backs unit ranks No. 10 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- The Gators' secondary brings back a pair of starting safeties in **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 23 games played and 20 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- In all, Florida had 14 interceptions and 49 pass breakups in 2024. Ten of those interceptions came from players returning for the 2025 season (71.4%) while 28 pass breakups were recorded by returners (57.1%).
- Castell has played every game across the last three seasons (2023-25) while making 25-straight starts in Orange & Blue, which is the longest-such streak of any current Gator on the roster.
- For the second straight season in 2024, Castell led the team in snaps played (831) after playing a team-best 751 snaps in 2023. He continued the trend into the 2025 opener and has now played over 1,500 career snaps.
- Castell played every snap during Weeks 12-13 in the upset wins over No. 21 LSU (93) & No. 9 Ole Miss (79).
- Also in 2024, Castell paced Florida with nine pass breakups - three more than the next-closest Gator.
- Castell compiled 115 tackles across the 2023-24 seasons, having led UF with 60 (30 solo) in 2023.
- Meanwhile, Thornton has played in 23 games including 12 starts across the last three seasons (2023-25), starting each of the last-six games consecutively dating back to last year.
- Thornton had Florida's first score of the 2025 season with a 37-yard fumble recovery on the first drive of Week 1 and later added a second fumble recovery, setting up a Gators touchdown in the second quarter.
- In his last four games, Thornton has four takeaways - two interceptions and two fumble recoveries.
- Thornton led Florida with three interceptions in 2024 on top of 41 tackles (22 solo), 1.5 TFLs, one forced fumble and three pass breakups - and played all but one snap of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss).
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five), **STAR Aaron Gates** (five) all started five or more games for the 2024 Gators defense, bringing more experience back to the secondary.
- Although he missed six games due to injury, Moore totaled 17 tackles, two pass breakups and one interception, playing his best football in his last two games of 2024 against Kentucky (81.6 PFF grade) and Georgia (76.1).
- Fellow corner Johnson played all but four snaps of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss), tallying nine tackles (eight solo), 1.0 TFL, one QB hurry and one PBU.
- Like Moore and Johnson, Denson also finished the 2024 campaign strong with his best weekly PFF grade coming in the Gasparilla Bowl victory over Tulane.
- In 2024, Denson's 87.4 pass rush grade ranked 13th among FBS safeties, as he racked up 37 tackles (22 solo), 5.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks in addition to two pass breakups, one interception and one forced fumble.
- Gates played in nine games with five starts one year ago, ranking fifth on the team with 4.0 TFLs in addition to 27 tackles, one interception, three PBUs, two fumble recoveries and one QB hurry.
- Much of Gates' production came across four games from Weeks 9-12, when he racked up 20 tackles, 2.0 TFLs, one interception and one fumble recovery as UF went 2-2 with SEC wins over Kentucky and LSU.

**JOE HOUSTON'S IMPACT**

- Florida's 2025 special teams unit ranks No. 13 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- Last offseason, the Gators added senior special teams analyst **Joe Houston** to the fold. He came from the New England Patriots after spending four seasons (2020-23) as a special teams assistant.
- He enters the 2025 season in the role of special teams coordinator.
- In 2024, the Gators climbed to No. 1 in the FBS in special teams for three-consecutive weeks (Weeks 2-4) by ESPN's SP+ metric and finished third in the final regular-season ranking.
- Florida ranked 11th in the FBS in net punting (42.37) and 18th in punt return average (13.36) while holding status inside the top-13 all season in ESPN's SP+ metric.
- The Gators were also one of 44 teams to not have a blocked kick and one of 80 programs to not have a blocked punt.
- **K Trey Smack's** 80 extra points made without a miss (80-for-80) is a UF program record.

**- 2024 DEFENSIVE NOTABLES -**

- With 25 takeaways last season, Florida more than tripled its takeaways (seven) from the 2023 campaign.
  - » It marked Florida's most turnovers gained (26) since 2018.
- The Gators produced at least one turnover in 10-straight games to end the season.
- Florida has forced at least 15 fumbles in four-straight seasons powered behind a season-high of five at FSU in 2024.
- Florida posted four first-half shutouts (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, Tulane) and held its opponent without a first-half touchdown five times (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, UCF, Tulane).
- Florida's 14 interceptions quadrupled its total (three) from the 2023 season, and was UF's most since 2019 (16).
- The Gators held their opponents to zero points on the opening drive in the last-eight games consecutively.
  - » Florida had four takeaways on opening drives in that span: vs. LSU, Samford, Tennessee & Tulane.
  - » Outside of the season-opener with Miami scoring a touchdown, opponents only scored twice on their opening drives, with both being field goals: Texas A&M & UCF.
- Against Kentucky, the Florida defense posted three interceptions, its most in a game since Nov. 28, 2020 vs. UK.
  - » It also tied for the total amount of interceptions (three) the Gators had during the entire 2023 season.
- Florida had three interceptions in back-to-back games in 2024 vs. Kentucky and Georgia for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 vs. Kentucky (three) and Sept. 21, 2019 vs. Tennessee (three).
- Since 1996, the Gators rank sixth nationally in interceptions with an SEC-leading 426.

**- THE GAMECHANGERS -**

- Although 2024 Honorable Mention All-America **P Jeremy Crawshaw** departed for the NFL, Florida returns starting specialists **K Trey Smack** and **LS Rocco Underwood**.
- Crawshaw finished as the program's all-time leader in career punting average at 46.4, passing Johnny Townsend (46.2).
- He set the single-season program record with 48.9 yards per punt last year and was AP All-SEC Second Team.
- Although replacing Crawshaw's production will be difficult, Florida brought in 2024 Third Team All-Big Ten **P Tommy Doman**, who won the 2023 National Title at Michigan.
- Serving as Michigan's primary punter, holder, and placekicker in consecutive seasons from 2023-24, Doman punted 103 times in his career for an average of 43.4 yards, highlighted by 22 of 50-plus yards and 34 inside the 20.
- Doman made his UF debut in Week 1, punting one time for 47 yards and landing it on the opponent's 11-yard line.
- Underwood became the first-ever Gator to win the Mannelly Award in 2024, given to the nation's top long snapper.
- Underwood will attempt to win the honor in back-to-back seasons, having been named to the 2025 Mannelly Award Preseason Watch List.
- Underwood was named All-SEC Second Team, AFCA Second Team All-America and Phil Steel First-Team All-America.
- In 2024, Underwood totaled three solo tackles and one fumble recovery, making him one of 11 FBS long snappers to have three tackles and one of two in the SEC.
- Named to the 2025 Lou Groza Award Watch List, Smack is a three-time SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Smack took over UF's primary kicking duties two seasons ago in Florida's 29-16 win vs. No. 11 Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2023 and went on to be a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist, making 17-of-21 FGs (81.0%) with a pair of 54-yarders.
- He moved himself up in the record book with a 56-yarder in Week 1 vs. LIU, tying for second-longest in program history and marking his fourth field goal of 50-plus. He was also 7-of-7 on PATs to remain a perfect 80-of-80.
- Smack was a perfect 44-for-44 on PATs and 18-for-21 on field goals in 2024 with a long of 55, and was 8-for-10 from 40-plus yards.
- After back-to-back games with a miss against UCF and Tennessee, he ended the 2024 season going 13-for-14.
- Smack drilled 50-plus yarders in three of the last five regular-season games with a 55-yarder vs. LSU, which was tied for third longest in program history.
- He made all five FG attempts vs. Charlotte in 2023 (23, 23, 27, 36, 54) and drilled seven touchbacks on all seven attempts, becoming the first Gator to make five field goals in a single game since Eddy Pineiro in 2017.
- **WR Vernell Brown III** was Florida's primary kick and punt returner in the 2025 season opener and had three punt returns for 45 yards and a kickoff return for 25 yards.
- **RB Jadan Baugh** shined as the Gators' primary kick returner in 2024, averaging 21.55 yards in 11 attempts.
- Baugh was one of eight SEC players with two 30-plus yard kick returns and one of 11 freshmen in the FBS.
- He had a 35-yard kickoff return vs. Miami in his collegiate debut, marking Florida's longest return since 2022.
- Baugh had another 30-plus yard kick return with a 31-yarder in Week 2 vs. Samford and then added two 27-yard returns vs. Texas A&M despite receiving both in the endzone.

- Florida's 55-0 win is the largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2014 (65-0 vs. E. Michigan) and helps the scoring offense debut at 10th in the FBS.
- The defense's performance against LIU, only giving up 86 yards and shutting the Sharks out, puts the Gators at second in the FBS for total defense and t-first in scoring defense.
- The Gators made eight plays in the opponent's backfield, recording one sack and seven tackles for loss - good for being ranked t-ninth and t-second in FBS respectively.
- CB J'vari Flowers'** pass breakup in the fourth quarter helped the Gators to a 0% Opponent Red Zone %, which is tied-for-first in the SEC and in the FBS after Week 1.
- P Tommy Doman** booted his lone punt for 47 yards, ranking second in the SEC in net punt average.
- WR Vernell Brown III** returned the opening kick of the second half for 25 yards, good for 25th in the FBS and fifth in SEC for average kickoff return.

## CROSSING PATHS

- This marks the first time that **HC Billy Napier** and South Florida HC Alex Golesh have faced off as head coaches, but they do have prior history in SEC play. Golesh served as Tennessee's OC from 2021-22 and faced off against Billy Napier, when the Gators lost a nail biter in Neyland Stadium, 38-33.
- UF Wide Receiver Coach **Billy Gonzales** worked with Golesh at Illinois in 2012. Gonzales served as Co-OC and WR Coach while Golesh served as a TE Coach and Recruiting Coordinator during their time together with the Fighting Illini.
- There are seven Tampa natives on Florida's Roster: **Tony Livingston, Titus Bullard, Dijon Johnson, Jamroc Grimsley, Duke Clark, Dallas Wilson, and Eugene Wilson III.**
- The Bulls' Alvon Isaac, a Gainesville's native, returns home for the first time in his collegiate career. Currently USF's leading rusher, Isaac went to Hawthorne High School, which is 20 minutes from the University of Florida campus.

# BILLY NAPIER

HEAD COACH

Fourth Season

Billy Napier enters his fourth season with the Gators after being named the 29th head coach in program history on Nov. 28, 2021.

In 2024, Napier led the Gators to a late-season charge, winning the last four games of the season to finish with an 8-5 record overall, with victories over No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, Florida State and Tulane in the 16th Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl. The Gators were one of just unranked six teams in the nation to post multiple top-25 wins on the year.

Florida finished in the top-25 in 10 NCAA statistical categories, including ninth in red zone defense (.725), ninth in passing yards per completion (14.11), 11th in team sacks (3.00) and 13th in turnovers gained.

Individually, center Jake Slaughter was named a First-Team All-American by the AP, while quarterback DJ Lagway earned Freshman All-America honors from ESPN and PFF. Rocco Underwood won the Mannely Award for best long snapper in the nation, while also earning AFCA Second-Team All-America honors and Second-Team All-SEC accolades from the league's coaches. Slaughter was also named First-Team All-SEC by the Associated Press. Running back Jadan Baugh, long snapper Gannon Burt, linebacker Myles Graham and offensive lineman Bryce Lovett were all named to the SEC All-Freshman Team, marking the second time under Napier that the Gators had four honorees.

After taking over full-time when quarterback Graham Mertz was injured in the Tennessee game, Lagway became a sensation for the Gators, finishing 6-1 as a starter and 6-0 in games when he finished. The true freshman ended the season ranked second in the nation in yards per pass attempt (9.97), third in passing yards per completion (16.65) and ninth in passing efficiency (154.9).

In his second season at the helm, Napier helped transform transfer quarterback Graham Mertz's career and led a youthful Gators roster highlighted by Jordan Castell and Eugene Wilson III while becoming the 12th FBS head coach to win 51 games since 2018.



During his first season with the Gators, Mertz went on to set career-highs in completions (261), passing yards (2,903), touchdown passes (20), completion percentage (72.9), passing yards per game (263.9) and efficiency (157.8) while only throwing three interceptions, marking a career-low and tied his career-best with four rushing scores. He set program records for consecutive passes without an interception (239), consecutive passes completed (19) and a season-best completion percentage of 72.9% (261 of 358). Mertz tied for second all-time in UF history with completion percentage in a game (83.3%) on two occasions and notched six multi-touchdown performances.

Mertz led the SEC and ranked third nationally in completion percentage while placing nationally among FBS quarterbacks sixth in TD-INT ratio (6.7) 14th in completions per game (23.7) and 17th in passing efficiency and 25th in passing yards per game. According to ESPN, he was one of four SEC quarterbacks to complete 70% of their throws, have 20 passing touchdowns and no more than six turnovers in a season over the past 20 years, joining LSU's Jayden Daniels and Alabama's Mac Jones and Tua Tagovailoa.

Florida's youth immediately contributed and carved out roles throughout the season while earning postseason honors. Four Gators in Jordan Castell, Kelby Collins, T.J. Searcy and Eugene Wilson III were named the the SEC All-Freshman team selected among conference coaches. The four selections were the most by a school and most by Florida since 2012. Among the group, Castell (CFN & ESPN), Collins (The Athletic) and Wilson (CFN, On3 and 247Sports) all collected freshman all-american honors.

Wilson made a name for himself nationally after each week as he led FBS true freshmen in receptions per game (6.1) while ranking second in receptions (61), tied for second in receiving TDs (six), fourth in receiving yards per game (53.8) and seventh in receiving yards (538).

Castell played all 12 games and started the last 11 consecutively while finishing as the team-leader in tackles (60) and most defensive snaps played with 660, one of two UF players (Jason Marshall Jr. / 651) to play over 600-plus snaps. There were only 51 defensive snaps Castell didn't play in. He accumulated 751 snaps (adding special teams), marking the only defensive player and sixth Gator to play in 700-plus snaps joining the likes of Graham Mertz and Ricky Pearsall.

During his first year at Florida, Napier established a new culture that emphasizes teamwork, toughness and discipline, setting a sturdy foundation for the future of Florida Football.

It didn't take long for Florida's culture shift to become evident. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season ranked fourth in the SEC in total penalty yards (584) and penalty yards per game (48.7), and eighth in total penalties (78). Napier's emphasis in playing disciplined football translated into a distinctive improvement from the 2021 season when the Gators ranked 13th in the conference with 104 penalties.

The turnover battle was another area where the Gators saw improvement in 2022. Florida finished ranked tied for eighth in the nation in turnover margin (8), giving up the football only 14 times while producing 22 takeaways during the regular season. The Gators outscored their opponents 70-42 points off turnovers during the 2022 campaign.

Florida's rushing attack took the nation by storm during Napier's first year at the helm. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season as the third-most productive rushing offense in the nation and best in the conference in yards per carry (5.84). Florida ran the ball for an average of 213.7 yards per game in 2022, which ranked 16th in the FBS and third in the SEC.



At the forefront of Florida's mighty ground offense was the running back duo formed by freshman Trevor Etienne and Louisiana transfer Montrell Johnson Jr, who averaged 5.7 yards per carry and 120.0 rushing yards per game, while combining for a touchdown in all 12 regular season games and scoring 17 total touchdowns. They were one of only 15 running backs duos in the FBS to rush for over 700 yards apiece in 2022.

Johnson Jr. finished the 2022 campaign ranked tied-for-fourth in the SEC in rushing touchdowns (10) and became the first UF running back to rush for over 800 yards since La'Mical Perine in 2018. Meanwhile, Etienne ranked fourth in yards per carry (6.1), tied for 10th in touchdowns (six) and eighth in rushing yards (719) in the FBS among true freshmen.

The efficiency by Florida's running offense reflected an offensive line that allowed only 13 sacks in the regular season, ranking tied for second-fewest in the SEC and 16th in the FBS.

The offensive line was anchored by Louisiana transfer O'Cyrus Torrence, who finished as the top-rated guard in the nation at 88.0, according to Pro Football Focus.

Torrence became first Gators offensive guard to be named a Consensus All-American, and the fifth lineman in Florida history. He was named a First Team All-American by Sporting News, Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association and Walter Camp, and to the second team by the Football Writers Association of America. He was also named to the AP All-SEC First Team.

Torrence, who Napier recruited out of high school to play at UL, never allowed a QB hit or sack in 3,065 career snaps, including zero QB hurries or penalties in 698 snaps and 11 games started with the Gators in 2022.

Napier played a key role in the development of Anthony Richardson into the one of the hottest quarterbacks in college football. Richardson, who was ultimately drafted fourth overall in the 2023 NFL Draft, finished the 2022 season ranked fifth in the FBS among qualified quarterbacks in yards per carry (6.3) and was the only quarterback with two 400-yard games and two 100-yard rushing games in the season. Additionally, he was one of only five FBS players with over 2,500 passing yards and 650 rushing yards in 2022.

On the opposite side of the ball, the Gators continued their long-term defensive trends under Napier.

The Gators rank fifth nationally in interceptions with 409 and lead the SEC since 1996, while holding opponents to a 54.0 passing completion percentage, which is the seventh-lowest in the FBS and third in the SEC in that that span.

The Gators recorded an interception in six games during Napier's first season, the first of which secured a victory against No. 7 Utah—Napier's first game as Florida's head coach, to make him the only Florida head coach to defeat a ranked opponent in his first game.

Napier's emphasis on a new culture also became evident in the classroom. The Gators set a new Southeastern Conference record with 62 UF football players placing in the 2022 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll. The team also set a squad record with a 3.30 team GPA for the 2023 Spring semester.

In spite of a 6-7 record during Napier's first season at the helm, UF outscored its opponents 29.5-to-28.8 points per game and a total of 384 to 375. Florida lost their six regular-season games by a total of only 61 combined points. Five of those games were lost by 10 points or less and three by only one score.

During his first season as Florida's head coach, Napier delivered a total 10 Gators to the NFL via the NFL Draft and free agency. Drafted were QB Anthony Richardson (Rnd. 1, Pick 4, Indianapolis), DT Gervon Dexter (Rnd. 2, Pick 22, Chicago), OL O'Cyrus Torrence (Rnd. 2, Pick 28, Buffalo), LB Ventrell Miller (Rnd. 4, Pick 19, Jacksonville), WR Justin Shorter (Rnd. 5, Pick 15, Buffalo) and LB Amari Burney (Rnd. 6, Pick 26, Las Vegas). The six picks were tied for fourth highest by a school that year and tied third in the SEC. Additionally, four other Gators were tabbed as undrafted free agents.

**Louisiana (2018-21)**

Napier spent four seasons at Louisiana and finished with a record of 40-12, a perfect 16-0 mark against members of the Sun Belt West Division, four consecutive West Division titles, four straight bowl appearances, a share of the Sun Belt title in 2020 and 2021 Sun Belt Conference Champions.

A two-time Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year (2019 & 2021), Napier took the Ragin' Cajuns to unprecedented heights when the team broke into the national rankings in 2020 for the first time in the modern era. The team finished the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top-25, No. 16 in the USA Today/Amway Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the College Football Playoff, Louisiana's highest rankings in all three polls.

In 2021, he led the program to their first conference championship title since 2005 and only the second time in program history. Napier concluded his final season with a 12-1 record, the most single-season wins in school history after setting it with 11 in his second year. The 12 straight wins also set the program record for consecutive victories, as the previous record was eight in 1976.

Napier led Louisiana to its fourth straight Sun Belt Conference Championship game with a 24-16 victory over Appalachian State to finish with a career record of 28-7 against conference opponents. Louisiana became the first team in conference history to make all four conferences championship games.

Napier's Louisiana team produced two 2022 NFL Draft picks in safety Percy Butler and tackle Max Mitchell, who were both drafted in the fourth round by the Washington Commanders and the New York Jets, respectively.

The 2020 Louisiana Sports Writer Association Coach of the Year, Napier navigated Louisiana through a season heavily impacted by COVID-19 and claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference Championship, its third-straight West Division title and its second-straight bowl victory, a 31-24 win over UTSA in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl. The Ragin' Cajuns also advanced to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship game, but was canceled due to COVID-19.

Napier's team broke into the national rankings for the first time in the modern era following its week one upset at No. 23 Iowa State, marking the first win over a ranked opponent on the road and only the second time in program history. He concluded non-conference matchups at Louisiana with a record of 13-5, as three of the losses came against ranked opponents - No.1 Alabama, No. 16 Mississippi State and No. 19 Texas.

Both the offense and defense continued to flourish in 2020 under Napier's watch. Offensively, the team ranked 29th nationally in scoring offense (33.6) and 43rd nationally in total offense (421.5), while the defense ranked 31st in scoring defense (22.0) and 33rd in total defense (355.4).

Napier coached Louisiana to 14 Sun Belt All-Conference selections, led by First Team selections Elijah Mitchell and Chris Smith. Mitchell wrapped up his stellar career ranking fifth in career scoring (276), fifth in career rushing touchdowns (41) and sixth in career rushing yards (3,267) before being drafted in the sixth round by the San Francisco 49ers.

Smith additionally earned First Team All-America honors from CBSSports/247Sports, Pro Football Focus and Second Team All-America honors from the FWAA, marking the second consecutive season that a Ragin' Cajun earned All-America honors under Napier.

In just the second season (2019) under Napier, the program set the all-time single season victories (11) at the time and second-straight trip to the Sun Belt Championship Game after clinching the league's West Division title with a 53-3 victory over Troy. The 11 victories also marked the first double-digit win season in program history and the first of three consecutive 10-plus win years by Napier.



He was voted the program's first Sun Belt Coach of the Year, becoming the third Louisiana coach to earn the distinction of top coach and the first since 1993 in their respective conference.

Napier coached three 2020 NFL Draft picks in Raymond Calais (RB), Kevin Dotson (G) and Robert Hunt (G), tying the program record for draft selections in a year. Hunt became the third-highest pick in team history as he was selected 39th overall by the Miami Dolphins. A First Team All-American selection by the Associated Press, USA Today, Sports Illustrated, Pro Football Focus and a Second Team All-American by Sporting News, Dotson was drafted in the fourth round by the Pittsburgh Steelers. Calais was tabbed by the reigning Super Bowl Champions, Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the seventh round.

In Napier's first season at the helm, the Ragin' Cajuns (7-7, 5-3) won the 2018 Sun Belt Conference West Division Championship, advancing to the inaugural conference championship game. Louisiana accepted an invitation to the AutoNation Cure Bowl, its first bowl trip since 2016.

**Arizona State (2017)**

Prior to his stint at Louisiana, Napier was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona State in 2017.

Napier guided the Sun Devils' offense to the 14th highest-graded offense in the FBS according to Pro Football Focus - including the 10th highest-graded passing attack in the nation. ASU was ranked 54th in the nation in total offense last season and 86th in the passing game the season prior. The offensive turnaround (+40 positions) was the eighth-largest in the FBS and ASU was one of just three programs to move from outside the Top-50 to inside of it in just one season. The 76-spot swing in the passing game rankings was the third highest in all of the FBS..

ASU developed one of the elite red zone scoring teams in the nation under Napier, tied for first nationally in converting on 95.83 percent of its red zone appearances (46-of-48) with the only two "blemishes" against the Sun Devils coming when the team took a knee late in the fourth quarter. ASU was 11th nationally in red zone touchdown scoring rate with 36 touchdowns on those 48 attempts (75.00).

Ball security was another notable facet of Napier's offense. The Sun Devils turned the ball over just 11 times in 2017, which ranked 12th nationally after finishing 82nd in the country a year ago with 21 turnovers.

**Alabama (2011, 2013-16)**

Napier's first experience in the SEC came at Alabama in 2011 and he later returned to Crimson Tide from 2013-17 as the wide receivers coach.

He was instrumental in helping Nick Saban and Alabama achieve a 63-7 record in five seasons (2011, 2013-2016), two National Championships (2011 & 2015) and was part of the great run of 26 consecutive wins from 2015-2016. In 70 games at Alabama, the Crimson Tide offense averaged 6.27 yards per play and 36.4 points per game. Napier coached three first round draft picks in Amari Cooper, Jerry Jeudy, Amari Cooper and Calvin Ridley while in Tuscaloosa.

In 2016, Napier's wide receiver corps were led by junior ArDarius Stewart, a third-round pick by the New York Jets in 2017 and Ridley. Stewart snagged in a team-leading eight touchdowns and 864 yards while Ridley totaled a team-high 72 receptions. Napier also helped develop wide outs Gehrig Dieter (Kansas City) and Cam Sims (Washington), both who were NFL free agent signees.

After recruiting Ridley to sign with the Crimson Tide, Napier coached him to a freshman-record and team-leading 89 catches for 1,045 yards and seven touchdowns in 2015 along with being named a USA Today Freshman All-American.

Napier played a vital role in Cooper's historical campaign in the 2014 season. He became Alabama's first Biletnikoff Award winner and caught a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns. Cooper led the country in receptions (124), was second nationally in receiving yards (1,727), receiving touchdowns (16) and catches per game (8.9) while ranking third in yards per game (123.4). A Heisman Trophy finalist and unanimous first team All-American, Cooper smashed all of the Tide's career receiving marks with 228 receptions, 3,463 yards and tied the SEC record with 31 receiving touchdowns.

In his first season as the Crimson Tide's receivers coach in 2013, Napier built a deep and talented group of wide outs. Alabama had four players with at least 32 receptions, led by Cooper's 45 catches for 736 yards.

The 2011 season marked the first year for Napier on the Alabama staff as he served as an offensive analyst, helping the Crimson Tide win the 2011 BCS national championship. The Tide ranked 16th in scoring offense, 30th in total offense and 17th in rushing offense in 2011.



## Colorado State (2012)

After a year at Alabama, Napier served as the assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach at Colorado State in 2012 for former Florida head coach Jim McElwain.

Injuries forced Napier to go deep down the bench looking for quarterbacks during his one season in Fort Collins. The Rams saw three quarterbacks play significant snaps as the starter with Garrett Grayson going down early in the season and M.J. McPeck followed two weeks later, forcing redshirt freshman Conner Smith into action. The trio combined to throw for 2,520 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2012 as Colorado State won three of its final five games.

## Clemson (2003-04, 2006-10)

Before his first stretch at Alabama, Napier spent seven years in two different stints at Clemson. During Napier's final two seasons at Clemson he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

At the age of 29, he became the youngest coordinator in the nation and in Clemson history. In his first season as Clemson's coordinator, the 2009 Tigers scored a school-record 436 points and collected 54 touchdowns (third-most in school history), averaged 5.73 yards per play (fourth best) and finished as the ACC Atlantic Division champions.

He also served as Clemson's recruiting coordinator from 2006-08. In those three seasons, he compiled two top-25 recruiting classes, according to Rivals.com, and in 2008, his class was tabbed as the second-best in the nation by ESPN.com.

Napier was the 2007-08 tight ends coach at Clemson, helping lead the Tigers to two bowl games and a prolific offense.

The 2007 season featured a 9-4 record and the ACC's highest-scoring offense. In his first year back with Clemson (2006), Napier worked primarily with the Tigers' tight ends but also was responsible for the punt team and assisted in several special-teams capacities. The 2006 Tigers led the ACC in total offense, rushing and scoring offense, advancing to the Music City Bowl.

Clemson averaged 410.9 yards per game and 32.7 points, more than doubling its opponent's totals. Michael Palmer, who Napier coached for three seasons, went on to the NFL. He also worked with the special teams units, helping develop the 2009 ACC Player of the Year and a unanimous All-American C.J. Spiller.



He began his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant at Clemson in 2003-04. The Tigers won nine games, including the Peach Bowl against Tennessee. The following season, Napier was a graduate assistant on defense, and gained his first experience with recruiting off the field.

## Background

As a player, Napier was a four-year letterwinner and two-time All-Southern Conference selection as the starting quarterback at Furman. The Paladins won two conference championships and in 2001, Napier's junior year, advanced to the Division I-AA national championship game, losing to Montana.

He completed 64.8-percent of his career passes, setting a school record. As the team captain during a record-setting senior season, Napier amassed 2,475 passing yards, also a Furman record, and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding FCS offensive player.

Napier grew up in Chatsworth, Georgia, and graduated from Murray County High School in 1998. He is married to the former Ali Gunn and the couple has a daughter, Annie, and sons, Sammy and Charlie. He earned his Bachelor's degree in health & exercise science from Furman in 2002.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Florida quarterback DJ Lagway passed for three first-half touchdowns, tailback Jadan Baugh rushed for 104 yards and a score and the nation's 15th-ranked team did what a power-conference program with high expectations is supposed to do to an FCS opponent in running roughshod over Long Island in a 55-0 rout Saturday night in the season opener for both teams at sold-out Spurrier/Field Field. Lagway, the 6-foot-3, 247-pound sophomore from Willis, Texas, had to shake off some rust after being limited for the first month of fall practice with a sore calf. Nonetheless, the UF franchise QB completed 15 of his 18 throws (83.3%) for 120 yards, with short scoring tosses of four yards to wide receiver Eugene Wilson III and tight end Hayden Hansen, plus an 8-yarder to wideout J. Michael Sturdivant, the transfer from UCLA. All three came in the second quarter, as the Gators built a 38-0 halftime lead, then shut Lagway down for the night. UF churned out 236 yards, including 120 rushing, and 16 first downs with Lagway under center. When the night was over, the Gators had out-gained the out-manned Sharks, by way of the Northeast Conference, 451 yards to 86, with a whopping 27-2 edge in first downs, an all-time low for a UF opponent. The Sharks' first 12 possessions went just three plays or less. Florida's 55 points marked a single-game high under Coach Billy Napier, now in his fourth season. The Gators went an entire game without a penalty for the first time since 2021 and did not turn the ball over. LIU, in its seventh season of existence, was facing just its fourth power-conference program. The previous three were losses of 66-0 at West Virginia in 2021, 30-7 at Baylor in '22 and 45-0 at Texas Christian in '24. UF did not waste any time jumping in front, but did so on defense. The Gators won the coin toss, deferred to the second-half, but took the lead on safety Bryce Thornton's 37-yard fumble return — the first fumble for a score by the Gators' defense since 2020 — on the game's third play from scrimmage. On Florida's first offensive series, Baugh had runs of 17, 16 and seven yards before scoring on a 4-yard blast for a 14-0 lead. He got the second 100-yard game of his career on just nine carries. While LIU was cranking one three-and-out after another, Florida had three consecutive series ended in Trey Smack field-goal attempts. He missed from 40 and 39, but drilled a 56-yarder in between that tied the second-longest in school history and gave the home team a 17-0 lead. The Gators' next three series ended in the Lagway TD passes and fat halftime advantage. True freshman Trammell Jones Jr., out of Jacksonville, replaced Lagway in the second half and led a scoring drive to Smack's second field goal, a 41-yarder, and then a 64-yard march capped by a 4-yard touchdown pass to tight end Tony Livingston for a 48-0 lead. He threw an 11-yard scoring strike to former walk-on Taylor Spierto with 25 seconds remaining in the game. Jones finished 12 of 18 for 131 yards and the two TDs without a turnover.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Not much. LIU may have been one of the most over-matched opponents ever to play at Florida Field. For the Gators, the best thing about beating up on the Sharks was getting Lagway some much-needed reps (and getting out of the game healthy) before things start to get real.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Legacy wideout Vernell Brown III made quite the splash in his collegiate debut. Brown, whose father played at UF from 2002-05 and whose grandfather played here from 1982-85, became the first true freshman to start for the Gators on offense since tackle Jawaan Taylor in 2016 and just the third receiver in program history to do so, joining Percy Harvin (2006) and Antonio Callaway (2015). Brown caught three passes for 79 yards, breaking the true freshman debut mark of 72 set by Josh Hammond against North Texas in 2016. Brown hauled a spectacular one-handed, 41-yard gem from Lagway in the second quarter to set up a score. He also returned three punts for 45 yards, with a long of 25.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** LIU's total offense of 86 yards marked the 10th-lowest total by an opponent in UF history. The Sharks did not run a play in Florida territory until quarterback Luca Stanzani, from the his 42, converted a third-and-7 with a 28-yard completion to Deion Richardson to the UF 28 with just over nine minutes to go in the game. The drive fizzled from there. As for their two first downs, the previous all-time low against the Gators was four against Western Carolina in 2006 and Miami in 1974.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (1-0) is back in "The Swamp" on Sept. 6 for a date against cross-state foe South Florida (1-0), which turned plenty of college football heads Thursday night in trouncing 25th-ranked Boise State, a College Football Playoff participant last season, 34-7 at Tampa. The Bulls are in their third season under Alex Golesh, who's put together back-to-back 7-6 seasons capped by bowl wins. The upset of the Broncos, though, was one of the program's biggest victories in years and should get the attention of the UF staff. Especially if USF, though unlikely, jumps into the Associated Press Top 25 this week.

ORANGE & BLUE  
MACGUFFIN

- The MacGuffin Trophy, college football's title belt, currently belongs to the Florida Gators for the first time since the 2010 season. The honor dates back to the first college football game in 1869, when Princeton defeated Rutgers, 6-4. The MacGuffin changes hands when a team defeats the title's current holder, and it passes from victor to victor, from 1869 to the present day.
- Florida laid claim after its win over No. 9 Ole Miss on Nov. 23, 2024. In 2024 alone, it switched hands four times, from Michigan to Texas (Sept. 7), to Georgia (Oct. 19), to Ole Miss (Nov. 9), to Florida (Nov. 23).
- This is Florida's sixth stint with the MacGuffin, having previously held it from Oct. 1 to Oct. 29, 1983; Sept. 19 to Oct. 10, 1989; Sept. 9 to Sept. 29, 2006; Jan. 1 to Dec. 6, 2009 (taken from Oklahoma after the National Title game); and Oct. 30 to November 13, 2010.
- The previous five times that the MacGuffin was played for in a non-national title bowl game, the holder of the MacGuffin has won and held it four times. UF's win over Tulane marked the fifth.
- Florida has never lost the MacGuffin to a non-SEC opponent, a streak which continued with the team's Gasparilla Bowl victory over Tulane and Week 1 win vs. LIU in 2025.
- Last season, Florida became the first unranked team to hold the MacGuffin since BYU held it for one week in 2022 (9/10 taken from Baylor, 9/17 lost to Oregon).
- The College Football MacGuffin was conceived of and coined by social media creator Tyler Budge in 2022, named after the Alfred Hitchcock-popularized term for a plot device which has no intrinsic value to anyone except a story's characters, and therefore drives the plot forward (ex: the Holy Grail in Arthurian legend, the ring in Lord of the Rings, etc.).



## WEEK 2: HONORARY MR. TWO BITS

### THE LEGEND OF MR. TWO BITS

It all started in 1949 at Florida Field, when George Edmondson looked at the crowd around him as the Gators were playing The Citadel. Fans were booing the team and George would not stand for it. He jumped up and got the fans cheering, and so began the legend of Mr. Two Bits.

For 60 years, Gators fans from all across the world became eternally grateful for the man who started every Gators home football game with the phrase “Two-Bits, Four-Bits, Six-Bits, a Dollar. All for the Gators, Stand Up and holler!” George Edmondson led the cheer in his trademark yellow shirt with an orange and blue tie from 1949 until retiring from the role at the end of the 2008 season. Coincidentally, Florida’s home finale that season came against The Citadel, providing a unique symmetry to Edmondson’s decades of leading Florida fans in the Mr. Two Bits cheer.

Upon his retirement, Florida mascots Albert and Alberta continued the pregame Two Bits tradition until 2013 when UF began inviting celebrities to perform the role. Errict Rhett was the first honorary Mr. Two Bits, and multiple Gator Greats have gone on to fill that role since.



### THIS WEEK’S HONORARY MR. TWO BITS IS...

...Alachua County Secondary Teacher of the Year, **Monica Benson**. Benson, who put her two UF degrees to work alongside students at Sydney Lanier School, was named 2025 Alachua County Teacher last January. Florida’s Chris Harry details her selection as Week 2’s honorary Mr. Two Bits below.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – In 2022, the University Athletic Association first invited the Alachua County Teacher of the Year to join the celebrity “Two Bits” pregame football tradition. Call it an honor that honors the honorable, if you will.

In 2016, Benson was closing in on completing her Florida master’s degree in special education. Already with a UF undergrad degree in elementary ed, she’d done a handful of internships at schools across the county, but for her last one specifically asked to be placed at Sydney Lanier School, which serves students with significant disabilities.

“They asked me, ‘Are you sure?’ “ Benson recalled, with both she and her colleagues well aware of the challenges. “I never thought twice about it. Sydney Lanier was my place.”

And still is. Now in her 10th year at the school at Main Street and 16th Avenue in Gainesville, Benson has given a decade to students ages kindergarten to 22 years old who need specialized attention and care. If you’re there for Benson’s pregame “Two Bits” turn Saturday when No. 15 Florida (1-0) squares off against South Florida at Spurrier/Florida Field, let her know you care, as well.

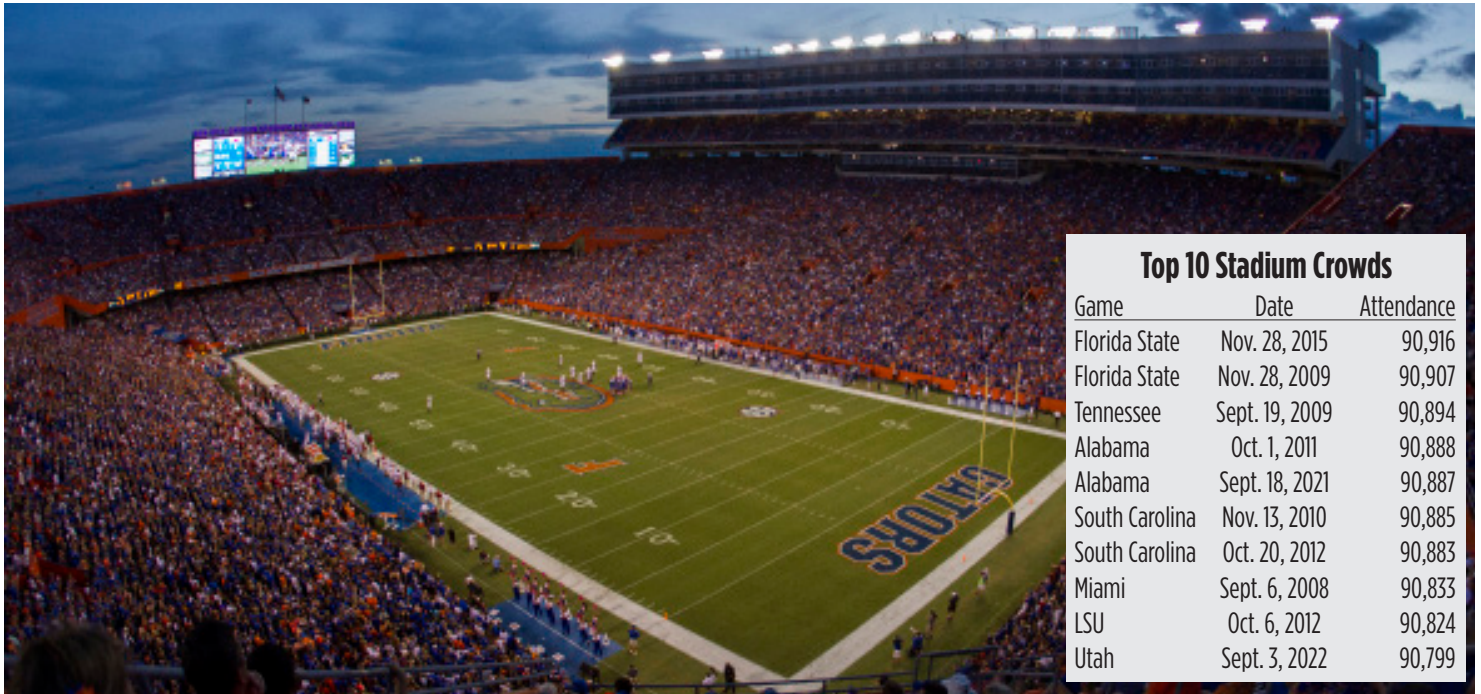
Benson was chosen as the county’s secondary ToY honoree when the awards were announced last January. Also recognized were elementary-school finalist Vanessa Lind, a second-grade teacher at Glen Springs, and middle-school finalist Natalie Watkins, a seventh-grade teacher at Fort Clarke.

“It’s all about love. It’s all about being there with the children,” Benson said. “I’ve watched them grow so much and be able to achieve so many different goals that no one had imagined they could achieve; loving life, being happy. And it’s all individualized, where everybody has their own goals they achieve and we move on. We’re very lucky to have our students to the age of 22 and help them transition to adulthood.”

Some of those young adults, as well as their younger co-students, might very well be on hand when Benson, a lifelong Gator fan from Middleburg, Florida, gets to live out a kid-like fantasy in front of close to 90,000 in what will mark the 14th consecutive sellout in “The Swamp.”

“I remember the original,” Benson said of icon George Edmondson, famous father of the chant. “I was raised in a household where the Florida Gators were the star on Saturday. They were everything. We didn’t care about any other football, so this will be very nostalgic and exciting for me. Very near and dear to my heart.”

## at BEN HILL GRIFFIN STADIUM

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."
