Florida has produced a conference-leading **14** Freshman All-SEC honors since 2022 while also pacing the league with **12** Freshman All-SEC nods since 2023. As a result, the Gators boast a league-best **115** Freshman All-SEC accolades all-time. This past season, **WR Vernell Brown III** earned **three** sets of Freshman All-SEC honors at wide receiver, return specialist and all-purpose. He is the first player to collect **three** separate Freshman All-SEC honors since 2022 (Barrion Brown - Kentucky) and one of **five** players all-time to accomplish the feat (Jerrion Ealy - Ole Miss - 2019, JaShaun Corbin - Texas A&M - 2018, Christian Kirk - Texas A&M - 2015).

**198 / 1,380 / 30 / 1,100 / 2**

**RB Jadan Baugh** needed just **198** carries to eclipse 1,000 yards rushing for the 2025 season, making him one of six Gators to accomplish the feat under 200 rush attempts and signifying the seventh-fewest carries of any UF player to do so. Baugh finished with **1,380** scrimmage yards, which ranked third in the SEC and 12th in the FBS through conference championship weekend. The true sophomore was one of three FBS players (only in SEC) with at least **30** catches, **1,100** rush yards and **two** receiving touchdowns.

## Florida Gators (4-8, 2-6 SEC)



### 2025 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- The 2025 campaign saw Florida face a program-record seven top-20 opponents and four top-five foes in the regular season. The Gators also tied team records with seven top-25 opponents and six top-10 foes in a single season. Florida's 2025 opponents combined for a 104-55 record (.654) and 10 NCAA postseason berths.
- Nine of Florida's 11 FBS opponents competed in a bowl game or the College Football Playoff in 2025-26.
- One of UF's two opponents to fail to do so was Florida State, who Florida defeated for the fifth time in the last seven meetings to keep the Seminoles from obtaining bowl eligibility in the final week of the regular season.
- From Weeks 3-7, Florida played its first four-game stretch against four top-10 opponents in team history, as the Gators became the first team in college football to do so since Northwestern and Illinois in 1968.
- The Gators finished the 2025 regular season ranking 15th in the FBS in red zone defense (75.0%) and 17th in red zone offense, sitting third and second in the SEC in those two categories, respectively.
- Florida also finished among the top-50 teams nationally in fumbles lost (17th - four), fewest penalty yards (22nd - 524), fewest penalties (28th - 61), net punting (39th - 40.66), fumbles recovered (41st - seven), punt return average (42nd - 10.43), kickoff return defense (43rd - 18.89) and takeaways (47th - 17).
- **RB Jadan Baugh** became Florida's 10th 1,000-yard rusher in program history and UF's first since Kelvin Taylor in 2015 while running for a career-high 266 yards in Week 14 - the most all-time by a Gator against FSU and second-highest total in UF history behind Emmitt Smith's program-record 316 yards vs. New Mexico in 1989.
- Needing the seventh-fewest attempts (198) of any Gator to eclipse 1,000 rush yards, Baugh's 1,170 rush yards on the season rank seventh all-time in UF history and are the most since Ciatrick Fashon's 1,267 yards in 2004.
- **WR Vernell Brown III** finished the season leading UF in receptions (40) and receiving yards (512), becoming the first UF true freshman in program history to lead the Gators in both categories.
- All-American **C Jake Slaughter** had the fourth-highest grade among FBS centers (78.9), ranking fourth at the position in run blocking and eighth in pass blocking. He allowed zero quarterback pressures for a 100% block rate in eight of 12 games, and was the only FBS center to play at least 359 passing snaps and allow one or less sacks, and two or fewer quarterback hurries.
- Senior **K Trey Smack** capped off an all-time great career as a specialist, setting program records for 50-yard field goals made in a career (10) and in a single season (five). Smack's 82.8% field goal percentage ranks fifth in UF history (53 of 64). He made 100-straight PATs (third all-time) before missing the final attempt of his career.
- Florida had the 19th-best tackling grade (84.5) and 41st-ranked run defense grade (86.4) in the nation, per PFF.
- The UF offensive line allowed 20 sacks in 12 games during the regular season (fifth in SEC), highlighted by one sack or less in six contests.
- Florida's all-time, NCAA-record scoring streak currently sits at 473-consecutive games dating back to 1988.

## - THE BAUGHLIN' BELLCOW'S HISTORIC YEAR -



- Turning in one of the best seasons in team history, **RB Jadan Baugh** rushed 220 times for 1,170 yards, eight touchdowns and 5.3 YPC on top of pacing all SEC running backs with 33 catches and 210 receiving yards.
- Baugh finished with 10 total touchdowns (eight rushing, two receiving) and 1,380 scrimmage yards, the latter ranking third in the SEC and 12th in the FBS through conference championship weekend.
- As the 10th unique Gator to rush for 1,000 yards, Baugh produced the program's 12th 1,000-yard season.
- Baugh became the first UF underclassman to rush for 1,000 yards and the third Gator to reach the milestone against FSU.
- The true sophomore ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the FBS in net rush yards in 2025.
- Baugh was one of three FBS players (only in SEC) with at least 30 catches, 1,100 rush yards and two receiving touchdowns.
- Baugh finished with five more receptions (33) than any other SEC running back through conference championship weekend, ranking t-20th in the FBS at the position.
- Baugh's 91.4 PFF Grade for HandsFumble ranked second in the entire FBS and first in the SEC.
- Baugh's 65 missed tackles forced ranked seventh in the FBS and third in the SEC behind Kewan Lacy and Ahmad Hardy. His 35 explosive rushes sat eighth in the FBS and second in the SEC.
- Baugh averaged 5.3 YPC and 97.5 rush YPG after posting marks of 5.1 YPC and 51.8 YPG in 2024.
- Baugh ranked third in the SEC in rush YPG and 14th in yards per carry (11th among running backs).
- Baugh had 766 yards after contact this season (65.5% of his net rushing) and 1,193 in his career (64.8%).
- Baugh eclipsed 100 rush yards four times during the 2025 season for five career 100-yard performances.
- By rushing for a career-high 266 yards in Week 14, Baugh became the first Gator to rush for 200 yards in a game since Ciatrick Fashon in 2004 (210). His 266 yards sit second all-time in program history.
- It represented the eighth 200-yard rushing performance in team history (sixth-different Gator).
- Baugh caught multiple passes for the ninth-straight game in Week 13 vs. Tennessee, marking the first-nine games of his career with multiple receptions.
- In Week 11 at Kentucky, Baugh became the first Florida player with at least 60 yards rushing and five receptions in a game in two years – since Montrell Johnson Jr. on Nov 11, 2023 at LSU (fourth Gator to do so in last 14 seasons). He is one of five SEC players to do so this year, and just the fourth in conference play.
- Baugh rushed for 150 yards and one touchdown on 23 carries (6.5 YPC) in Week 8 vs. Miss. St.
- Baugh's seven receptions at LSU in Week 3 were the most by a UF running back in 25 years (2001).
- Baugh is the only active SEC running back who had at least 130 rush attempts, seven rushing touchdowns and at least one receiving score while averaging over 5.0 yards per carry last season.
- Baugh delivered a five-touchdown game in his first-career start vs. Kentucky in 2024 and tied the school record for the most in a game (Trey Burton vs. UK in 2010, Tim Tebow vs. South Carolina in 2007).

## - TACKLING KEY FOR 2025 GATORS -

- Florida averaged 10.1 missed tackles per game in 2022, 9.6 in 2023 and 11.0 in 2024.
- This season, the Gators have missed 8.6 tackles per game for the 19th-best tackling grade (84.5) in the FBS.
- It marked UF's first time finishing inside the top-40 FBS teams in tackling since 2016 (31st, 83.1).
- Florida's 84.5 tackling grade marked the program's best since 2014 (26th, 90.9).

- All-American **C Jake Slaughter** allowed four QB pressures and one sack this season for a 99.4% block rate in 748 snaps, grading as Pro Football Focus' No. 4 center in the FBS through Week 13 with a 78.9 grade.
- Slaughter ranks top-10 nationally at the position against the run and pass, sitting fifth among FBS centers in run blocking (78.3) and eighth in pass blocking (87.1).
- Slaughter graded the best SEC center in pass blocking while sitting second in the SEC in overall grade and run blocking.
- He allowed zero quarterback pressures for a 100% block rate in eight of 12 games.
- Slaughter posted a 100% block rate and zero pressures in eight of 12 games, including against Georgia, Florida State, Kentucky, Miami, Ole Miss and Texas.
- Slaughter was the only FBS center to play at least 359 passing snaps and allow one or less sacks, and two or fewer quarterback hurries.
- Named a 2025 Rimington Trophy Finalist, Slaughter was one of three FBS linemen (centers, guards and tackles) to play 400-plus passing snaps and only allow one or less sacks and two or less quarterback hurries.
- He was the only center in the SEC to play at least 75 passing snaps and only allow one or less sacks and two or less quarterback hurries.
- Slaughter anchored an offensive line that saw running back **RB Jadan Baugh** finish third in the SEC with 1,170 rushing yards.
- Slaughter started all 12 games this season, and has started the last 32-consecutive games.
- His PFF grade increased every season entering 2025: 2021 (59.0), 2022 (69.4), 2023 (78.4), 2024 (82.0).
- Slaughter has allowed just 15 hurries, four sacks and three QB hits across 2,145 career snaps from 2021-25 for a 98.8% success rate.
- Slaughter was named a 2024 First Team All-American by the AP, ESPN and PFF after finishing with the sixth-best PFF grade in the FBS at the position (82.0). As Florida's first-ever First Team All-American center, Slaughter joined Gators Bill Carr (1966) and Maurkice Pouncey (2009) as UF All-Americans at the position.
- Slaughter ranked top-20 nationally in both run blocking (eighth, 80.1) and pass blocking (17th, 84.2) in 2024.

- GRADING THE OFFENSIVE LINE -

- Entering the 2025 season, Florida's offensive line boasted 223 combined games played, which ranked 11th in the FBS and fourth in the SEC behind Auburn (236), Texas A&M (235) and Mississippi State (227).
- The Florida O-line also entered with 109 career starts, which ranked 14th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.
- Returning starters included All-American **C Jake Slaughter** (13 starts), Preseason First Team All-SEC **OL Austin Barber** (13), **OL Damieon George Jr.** (10) and **OL Knijeah Harris** (13), who combined for 49 starts last season.
- In 2025, Florida ranked second in the SEC and 15th in the FBS in run blocking, per PFF.
- The Gators finished the regular season ranking sixth in the SEC with 20 sacks allowed in 12 games.
- Florida allowed one or zero sacks in six of 12 games this season (six sacks in last five weeks combined).
- Across the last 16 games, the Gators have allowed 78 tackles for loss and 27 sacks.
- Florida gave up one sack at Ole Miss in Week 12, who entered the matchup with 21 sacks on the season.
- Florida allowed zero sacks and three TFLs in Week 6 vs. Texas, who had a season-low six QB pressures.
- Barber graded as the No. 22 FBS tackle in 2025 (78.0), highlighted by the 10th-best run block grade (82.2).
- George Jr. allowed just one sack and 11 QB hurries in 603 snaps for a 98.0% block rate.
- **OL Kamryn Waites**, **OL Bryce Lovett** and **OL Roderick Kearney** did not allow a sack this season.
- UF offensive linemen did not allow a QB hit in Week 1 while ranking No. 12 in the FBS in run blocking (76.3).
- Florida has allowed 96 sacks in 50 games since 2022, which ranks seventh in the SEC.



## - A TRUE FRESHMAN RECEIVER FOR THE AGES -

- **WR Vernell Brown III** finished the season leading UF in receptions (40) and receiving yards (512), becoming the first UF true freshman in program history to lead the Gators in both categories.
- Brown III totaled 106 more yards than the next-closest Gator (J. Michael Sturdivant - 406) and seven more receptions than any other UF player despite playing in just 10 games.
- Among FBS true freshmen, Brown III ranked fourth in receptions (40), fourth in receiving yards per game (51.2), fifth in receiving yards (512) and 11th in yards per catch (12.8).
- Brown III was one of two FBS true freshmen with 40+ catches, 12.0+ YPC and 50.0+ YPG (Andrew Marsh, Mich.).
- Brown III finished top-32 among SEC players in receiving YPG (23rd), catches (24th) and receiving yards (31st).
- In Week 7 at Texas A&M, Brown III and **WR Dallas Wilson** became the first two true freshman wide receivers to start in the same game in program history.
- Brown's 60-yard catch in the third quarter of the Week 6 win over Texas marked UF's longest pass play of the season and longest since **WR Eugene Wilson III's** 85-yard touchdown reception vs. Samford on Sept. 7, 2024.
- Brown III became the third true freshman wide receiver to start on opening day for the Gators in Week 1 of the season, joining Antonio Callaway (2015) and Percy Harvin (2006).
- Brown III was the 17th true freshman to start a season opener for UF dating back to 1972 and the first Gator to start opening day on offense since Jawaan Taylor in 2016.

## - RECEIVING ROOM REVIEW -

- Florida had to replace each of its top-two pass catchers from 2024 in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, who represented the only FBS receiving duo to both post over 700 receiving yards and 18.0 YPC.
- Returning receivers included **WR Eugene Wilson III**, **WR Aidan Mizell**, **WR Tank Hawkins** and **WR TJ Abrams**.
- Eighteen Gators had a reception in 2025 highlighted by 15 different players in Week 1 alone.
- RS senior transfer **WR J. Michael Sturdivant** (UCLA) finished second on UF in receiving yards (406) and t-fourth in receptions (27). He finished with a season-high 62 receiving yards in Week 12 at Ole Miss.
- In Week 14, Sturdivant's 150th-career catch came on his third TD reception of the season (16th of career).
- Mizell started the final three games of the season, finishing with 19 catches for 177 yards and one touchdown.
- Playing short-handed in Week 12, Abrams set career highs with 76 receiving yards and a long of 47 yards.
- Abrams made his first-career start in Week 11 at UK and made an immediate impact, catching two passes – tying his career high – on Florida's opening drive. He finished with a career-high four receptions for 28 yards.
- Despite missing the final four games to injury, **WR Dallas Wilson** tied for the team lead with three receiving TDs in just four games. That made Florida the only FBS team to be led by true freshmen in catches, yards and TDs.
- E. Wilson III set season highs in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (121) en route to his second-career, 100-yard receiving performance in Week 10 vs. Georgia. He more than doubled his receiving yards on the season.
- In the process, Wilson surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards and caught his 10th-career touchdown pass.
- D. Wilson is the only UF true freshman receiver in team history to catch three touchdowns in his first two games, and the first Florida receiver (any year) to do so in his first two games since Carlos Alvarez in 1969.
- Making his collegiate debut in Week 6, D. Wilson set records for a Gators true freshman wide receiver making his first-career start with six receptions, 111 yards receiving and two touchdowns (all records). His 111 yards broke Brown III's record set five weeks prior in the season opener (79).
- D. Wilson became the second Gator all-time with 100 receiving yards in his collegiate debut (Carlos Alvarez, 1969 vs. No. 7 Houston) and the first UF freshman receiver 100 yards since Tyrie Cleveland vs. LSU in 2016.
- D. Wilson became the 18th true freshman wide receiver to start in UF program history, marking the fourth season all-time in which two different UF true freshman receivers have started (2025, 2016, 2012, 2000).

## - HANSEN AND THE TIGHT ENDS -

- **TE Hayden Hansen** has started 34-consecutive games for the Gators at the position dating back to 2023, which is the longest-active streak of any Florida player.
- Hansen finished third on Florida in catches (30) and receiving yards (254) on top of two TDs this season.
- Hansen was tied for fifth among SEC tight ends (t-43rd in FBS) in receptions and 12th in receiving yards.
- Hansen set career highs with seven receptions and 50 yards receiving in Week 3 at LSU.
- Joining Hansen in two-TE sets was junior **TE Tony Livingston**, who started each of the final four games.
- Livingston played in 10 games (five starts) this season, tallying 11 catches for 119 yards and two TDs.
- In Week 12 at Ole Miss, Livingston recorded a career-long catch of 38 yards in the third quarter.
- Having played in four games in 2024, **TE Amir Jackson** caught his first-career TD on his second-career reception in Week 7 at A&M. He has appeared in all 11 games of 2025 with three catches for 29 yards.

The Gators welcome back **over 70%** of both their passing (**73.1%**) and rushing offense (**70.9%**) from last season, with **five** of Florida's six leading rushers back in Orange & Blue.

Despite each of its **top two receivers departing** for the NFL in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, Florida returns **six** of its top nine receivers from 2024 including **three** of its top five.

- BUILDING HIS OWN LEGACY -

- Sophomore and Gator legacy (son of Earnest Graham) **LB Myles Graham** started to carve out his role as the leader of the Gators defense for the future after a strong second year in Orange & Blue.
- Graham started all 12 games and led the Gators with career high in tackles (76), tackles-for-loss (7.0), stops (36) and quarterback hurries (seven) while ranking second in pass breakups (four) and fifth in sacks (2.0).
- Graham became the first UF linebacker to pace the team in tackles since 2021 (Mohamoud Diabate).
- Graham finished the regular-season 10th in the SEC in tackles, which was the highest by a UF linebacker since Ventrell Miller in 2020.
- He was one of four players in the SEC to post 75-plus tackles and 7.0-plus tackles-for-loss in the regular-season.
- Graham's four pass breakups were tied for second-most among FBS linebackers.
- His 36 stops were fifth-most in the SEC among linebackers this season in the regular season.
- The sophomore had a minimum of three tackles in every game with five games of eight more, including the last three games of 9-8-8 with 3.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, 10 stops, two pass breakups and two quarterback hurries.
- At No. 6 Ole Miss, Graham set a career high in tackles (nine) and TFLs (2.0) to go with one solo sack, six stops, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
- Graham notched a sack for his 100th-career tackle to force a punt on Florida State's opening drive in the season-finale victory.



- SECONDARY NEWCOMERS STEP UP TWICE -

- In the victory vs. Mississippi State, Florida's secondary featured an inexperienced group composed of redshirt-freshman **Jamroc Grimsley**, true freshmen **Ja'Vari Flowers**, **Ben Hanks III** and **Lagonza Hayward**, walk-on **Alfonzo Allen Jr.** and first-year transfer **Michael Caraway Jr.**
- The six combined for 315 defensive snaps played after only totaling 78 in the season's first six games: Caraway Jr. (32), Hayward (26), Flowers (18), Grimsley (2), Allen Jr. (0) and Hanks III (0). Allen Jr. made his season debut and first-career start, Grimsley his first-career start and Hanks III his collegiate debut.
- The group ended MSU's Blake Shapen's FBS-best, 21-game passing touchdown streak.
- The Gators were missing starters **Jordan Castell** and **Cormani McClain** as both **Sharif Denson** (five snaps) and **Devin Moore** (eight snaps) exited the game due to injury in the first quarter. Additionally, UF was already without starters **Aaron Gates** and **Dijon Johnson**.
- The lone secondary veteran starter was junior safety **Bryce Thornton**, who played every defensive snap in eight games from Weeks 2-11. He made seven tackles to eclipse 100-career tackles and added his fourth PBU.
- Allen Jr. made his first-career start as well as his season debut and led the Gators with a career-high 15 tackles and tied for a team-best five stops. He finished with the most tackles by a Gator in a single game since 2021 and matched his career high (three) on the first drive alone while playing all 82 snaps at safety.
- Hayward tied for a team-high 2.5 TFLs and had six tackles, as his final was a third-down stop in the fourth.
- Flowers had a team-high two pass breakups with three tackles and 0.5 tackles-for-loss, and was the country's highest-graded true freshman cornerback in Week 8, per Pro Football Focus.
- It was a similar situation in the season-finale victory against Florida State, which featured Allen Jr. (S) and Flowers (CB) starting along with Hanks III (CB), who made his first-career start in just his third game played.
- Hanks III and Flowers represented UF's first pair of true freshmen to start at cornerback in the same game since 2017 vs. FSU (Marco Wilson and CJ Henderson).
- Hanks III sealed the game with his first-career interception in the fourth quarter, returning it for 48 yards. He became the seventh unique Gator to notch a pick this season, tied for the fourth-most in the SEC.
- Hanks III was targeted four times in the game and allowed one catch for seven yards, finishing with two tackles, two pass breakups and one interception.
- Both Flowers and Hanks III played all 66 defensive snaps while Allen Jr. played the second-most with 58.



## - CHARTING THE 2025 GATORS DEFENSE -

- Florida finished the 2025 regular season ranked 15th in redzone defense (75.0%, second in SEC), 41st in fumbles recovered (seven) and 47th in takeaways (17).
- UF had the 13th-best tackling grade (86.2) and No. 43 run defense grade (86.4) in the FBS in the regular-season.
- The Gators missed 104 tackles, the team's lowest since 2017 (102), according to Pro Football Focus.
- UF allowed 13 passing touchdowns, tied for 22nd-fewest in the FBS and fifth in the SEC during the regular-season.
  - » The 13 total TD passes allowed were Florida's fewest since 2016 (eight).
- Florida forced a turnover in 10 of 12 games including a streak of eight-consecutive contests. The only games the defense did not get a takeaway was against USF and Tennessee. UF has a takeaway in 22 of the last 24 games.
- Florida has forced 40 takeaways in the last two years, which is UF's most in a two-year period since 2018-19 (49).
- Florida picked off quarterbacks in nine of the last 10 games for 10 total interceptions while allowing 12 passing touchdowns in that stretch.
  - » Prior to Tennessee, Florida had a streak of eight-straight games with an interception, which was tied for the second-longest active streak in FBS (ended vs. Tennessee).
  - » The team record is 12-straight games with an interception in 2008 (National Champs).
  - » Florida's streak marked just the seventh season since 1996 in which UF has gone eight-straight games with a pick, and the first since 2017 (eight games).
- Florida picked up where it left off in 2024 with a 55-0 shutout of LIU in the 2025 season opener. It was the 25th all-time shutout in a season opener and first shutout since defeating Vanderbilt, 42-0, in 2021.
  - » UF was one of 10 FBS teams and only SEC team to shut out their opponent in Week 1.
- At LSU, Florida forced three-straight three-and-outs to start the game and only allowed 16 yards of offense.
- The Canes were also held to season lows in passing yards (160) and completions (17).
- The Gator defense were one of two teams (Louisville) to not allow Miami to throw a passing touchdown while it marked just the sixth time in QB Carson Beck's career as a starter that he did not throw a passing touchdown.
- After allowing an opening drive score at Miami in Week 4, Florida held the Canes to 165 yards (20.6 avg), six points (two field goals) and forced an interception over the next-eight possessions.
- Florida delivered a season-high six sacks vs. a Texas O-Line that had only allowed three all season to that point.
- Florida racked up an astounding 35 QB pressures on Texas and QB Arch Manning, the most pressures against the Longhorns in the Sarkisian era, topping the previous record by Georgia in Austin in 2024 (28).
- Texas was held to 87 total yards (63 passing, 24 rushing) and four first downs in the first half.
- The Gators limited Texas to 52 rush yards, marking UF's third game allowing under 100 in 2025.
- In the Texas A&M's first-three series of the second half, Florida forced two three-and-outs and allowed one first down, with one of the series ending in a field goal after starting the drive on the UF 29-yard line.
- Allowing 196 total yards in the first quarter at Texas A&M, Florida allowed 221 yards in next three quarters.
- Following MSU's TD on their opening drive, UF held them scoreless on the following-eight drives for a total of 196 yards including three drives of negative total yards. That also included a fourth-down stop and fumble recovery.
- After UGA's opening drive TD, UF held UGA scoreless on the next five drives (65 total yards / 2.3 yards per play).
- The Gators doubled their season high with four takeaways at Kentucky highlighted by three in the first half.
- Ole Miss had seven redzone trips while UF stopped them twice on fourth down on the goal line and held them to two field goals. The Rebels ran a total of 24 plays in the red zone and accounted for 55 yards (2.29 yards per play).
- Florida racked up five sacks at Ole Miss, who had only allowed two sacks in SEC play entering the contest.
- The Gators closed the season with 7.0 tackles-for-loss and four sacks vs. FSU, which marked the fourth game the defense had seven-plus TFLs and four-plus sacks (Texas, Mississippi State and Ole Miss).

## - BANKS RETURNS FOR FINAL CALL -

- **DL Caleb Banks** was slated to headline the 2025 Florida defense after returning for his senior season and forgoing the 2025 NFL Draft. He projects as a first-to-second rounder in the 2026 NFL Draft. He also made Preseason Watch Lists for both the Bronco Nagurski and Chuck Bednarik Awards.
- After suffering an injury in spring camp and another setback in fall camp, Banks made his season debut at LSU before exiting after 29 snaps due to injury, which required surgery.
- Banks was scheduled to miss the rest of the season, but opted to return for Florida's final two games of 2025.
- He started against Tennessee and had three tackles, two of which were stops on third downs.
- In his final game at UF, Banks started and had three tackles, 1.0 tackle-for-loss and one fumble recovery.
- After joining the Gators in 2023 with only seven games played and two total tackles, Banks concluded his career at UF with 46 tackles, 9.5 TFLs, 5.5 sacks, 20 stops, nine QB hurries, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one pass breakup and one blocked kick.

- MOORE LEADS GATORS SECONDARY -

- Senior and team captain **Devin Moore** led the Gators secondary this season behind his career-best season in Orange & Blue.
- Starting a career-high 11 games, Moore also surpassed his previous career high in snaps (278) and games played (seven) with 556 snaps and 11 games.
- He set career highs in tackles (35), TFLs (2.0), pass breakups (four), interceptions (two), stops (13) sacks (one) and forced fumbles (one).
- He did not commit a penalty in the last two seasons and only has two pass interferences in 65 career targets.
- In the regular season, Moore graded as the second-best corner in coverage (81.5) in the SEC and 26th overall, per Pro Football Focus. He also graded out as Florida's best defender (83.0) overall in 2025.
- Against Texas, Moore had his first-career sack and fourth-career interception on the same drive.
- UF's second-highest graded defender, **Bryce Thornton**, started 11 games and led the Gators in pass breakups (six) and fumble recoveries (two).
- Thornton was second on the team in tackles (56), third in solo tackles (31) and third in interceptions (one).
- Thornton also scored the first touchdown of the season (37-yard fumble recovery vs. LIU) as UF was one of three teams to score a defensive touchdown for its first points of 2025 (Maryland, W. Michigan).
- He later added a second fumble recovery, setting up a Gators touchdown in the second quarter to become the first Gator with two in a game since Gervon Dexter Sr. vs. FAU in the 2021 season opener.
- In Week 10, Thornton had six tackles, four stops, one TFL (-11 yards) and one PBU (on third down) while grading as the best in coverage (88.8) and third-highest FBS safety overall (86.5), per PFF.
- Week 10's game vs. UGA featured a fully-healthy UF secondary that combined for 25 tackles, 11 stops, 2.0 TFLs, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
- Returning from his first game ever missed (college or prep), **Jordan Castell** tied his career high with 11 tackles vs. UGA. He had another double-digit tackle game (10) at Ole Miss for his third of the season and fifth in his career.
- Castell nabbed his second interception in as many games in Week 7, picking off QB Marcell Reed in the endzone on the first play of the fourth quarter. He had a career-high two picks in 2025 (three in career).
- In 128 defensive snaps, freshman **Lagonza Hayward** had 3.5 tackles-for-loss, five stops, 1.0 sack and two QB hurries.

- WOODS WASTING NO TIME ON THE D-LINE -

- True freshman **EDGE Jayden Woods** finished with the No. 1 freshman EDGE grade in the SEC en route to earning SEC All-Freshman Coaches' and PFF All-Freshman Team honors.
- Woods played in all 12 games with three starts and tied for a team-high 3.5 sacks.
- He is the first Gator true freshman since Johnnie Church in 1992 to lead or co-lead the team in sacks.
- In SEC play alone, Woods tallied 19 tackles, 11 stops, 2.0 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, two QB hurries, one interception, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble.
- Woods picked off Ole Miss QB Trinidad Chambliss in Week 12 for his first-career interception and second takeaway of the season, setting up a UF touchdown. He is the first UF true freshman with a pick since Myles Graham vs. Tulane in last season's Gasparilla Bowl, and the first in SEC play since Jordan Castell vs. Arkansas in 2023.
- He is the first UF true freshman with an interception and fumble recovery in the same season since 2011.
- Woods made his first-career start vs. Miami, marking the first Florida true freshman to start on the DL since Jabari Zuniga in 2016. He had his first-career sack and three tackles across 59 defensive snaps.
- In only his third season on defense, **EDGE George Gumbs Jr.** finished second on the team in TFLs (6.5) and reached 21.5 in his career.
- Gumbs Jr. finished second on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and sacks (5.0) in 2024 in just his second full season on defense after three seasons at Northern Illinois: one at WR, one at TE and one at DE.
- Against UGA, Gumbs Jr. had a career-high nine tackles, a team-high five stops and one sack on third down in the fourth quarter. He did not miss a tackle and had a tackling grade of 80.4 - a team-high.
- DT Michai Boireau** sealed the victory vs. Mississippi State with his first-career interception with 0:21 remaining, becoming UF's first DL with an interception since Gervon Dexter Sr. in 2021 (Chicago Bears starting DT).
- EDGE Kamran James** had a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks while tying his career high in tackles (six) vs. MSU. He finished tied for the team-best in sacks (3.5) with Woods.
- Against Texas, **DL Brien Taylor Jr.** (Houston native) had three tackles and a team-high 1.5 sacks and two QB hurries. He then had four tackles with 1.5 tackles-for-loss, 0.5 sacks and one forced fumble vs. Mississippi State.
- Baylor transfer **DL Brendan Bett** was third in sacks (3.0) and fifth in tackles-for-loss (4.0).

## - THE GAMECHANGERS -



- All three specialists will be playing in a postseason bowl with **P Tommy Doman** in the Senior Bowl, **K Trey Smack** at the East-West Shrine Bowl and **LS Rocco Underwood** an American Bowl participant.
- The Gators specialists owned the SEC's longest field goal (Smack -56 yards) *and* punt (Doman - 71 yards) during the regular season, marking the only FBS team to lead both categories inside their conference.
- **K Trey Smack** concluded his Gators career as one of the program's all-time best with his name scattered throughout the record book and earned All-SEC Coaches' Third Team honors.
- Named a 2025 Lou Groza Award Semifinalist for the second time in his career, Smack took over UF's primary kicking duties two seasons ago in Florida's 29-16 upset vs. No. 11 Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2023 and went on to be a Lou Groza Semifinalist.
- He was one of three kickers in the country with five or more 50-yard fields goals this season joining 2025 Lou Groza Award Winner Tate Sandell (Oklahoma) and Lucas Carneiro (Ole Miss).
- Smack's last-career field goal (54 yards) was his 10th-career field goal of 50-plus, extending his program record.
- Since 2023, Smack has made 10 field goals from 50-plus yards, which ranks second-most in the FBS.
- Additionally, Smack finished 24-for-32 in his career from 40-plus yards and 10-for-13 from 50-plus yards.
- Since 1996, Smack ranks sixth in the FBS in field goal percentage from 50-plus yards (76.9%).
- In Week 1 vs. LIU, Smack moved himself up in the record books with a 56-yarder (t-second-longest in UF history). The 56-yarder was the longest by an SEC kicker during the regular season.
- In Week 10 vs. UGA, Smack hit a 54-yarder for his school-record, marking consecutive seasons with three or more 50-yarders, joining Caleb Sturgis (2011-12) as the only Gator to do so.
- In Week 13, Smack missed his first field goal since the season opener as he had made 13-straight field goal attempts, tied for the fifth-longest streak in the FBS (second in SEC).
- Smack missed his first-career PAT in his last-career attempt in the season finale vs. FSU (had been 100-for-100).
- Replacing Florida's single-season and career punting average records, **Tommy Doman** finished solidly in his lone season in the Orange and Blue as he was named to the PFF 2025 All-SEC Team.
- Doman's 4.52 hang time led all FBS punters and was the second-highest graded punter (92.2) in the FBS while sitting at No. 1 in the SEC, per Pro Football Focus.
- In Doman's 50 punt attempts (44.0 avg) this season, 17 landed inside the opposing 20-yard line and 13 went for 50-plus yards, including nine inside the 13-yard line in addition to a season long of 65 yards.
- In his final collegiate game, both punt attempts (62.0 avg.) sailed over 50 yards, including his final attempt that went 71 yards, which tied his career best and ranked seventh-longest in program history.
- **LS Rocco Underwood** wrapped up career and fourth-straight season as the Gators' starting long snapper earning All-SEC Coaches' Third Team and PFF All-SEC Third Team nods while being a Mannelly Award Semifinalist.
- Underwood recovered his third-career fumble at Kentucky to set up Florida's lone touchdown drive.
- He became the first-ever Gator to win the Mannelly Award in 2024, given to the nation's top long snapper.
- Underwood finished his career with seven tackles (four solo) and three fumble recoveries.
- **WR Vernell Brown III** was one of two true freshmen (Malachi Toney) and one of 18 FBS players with five 20-yard punt returns this season.
- In his lone punt return in Week 2, Brown III returned it for 40 yards to set up UF's touchdown in the fourth quarter. The return was the longest in the SEC by a true freshman in 2025 and the longest by a Gator since 2022.
- **WR Taylor Spierto** blocked a punt for a safety vs. Texas for UF's first blocked punt since Derek Wingo vs. Charlotte on Sept. 23, 2023 and first safety since Nov. 25, 2023 vs. FSU. It was the first time UF blocked a punt for a safety since Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Miami (Jeff Demps) and UF's first in SEC play since Jordan Pouncey at LSU on Oct. 16, 2021.

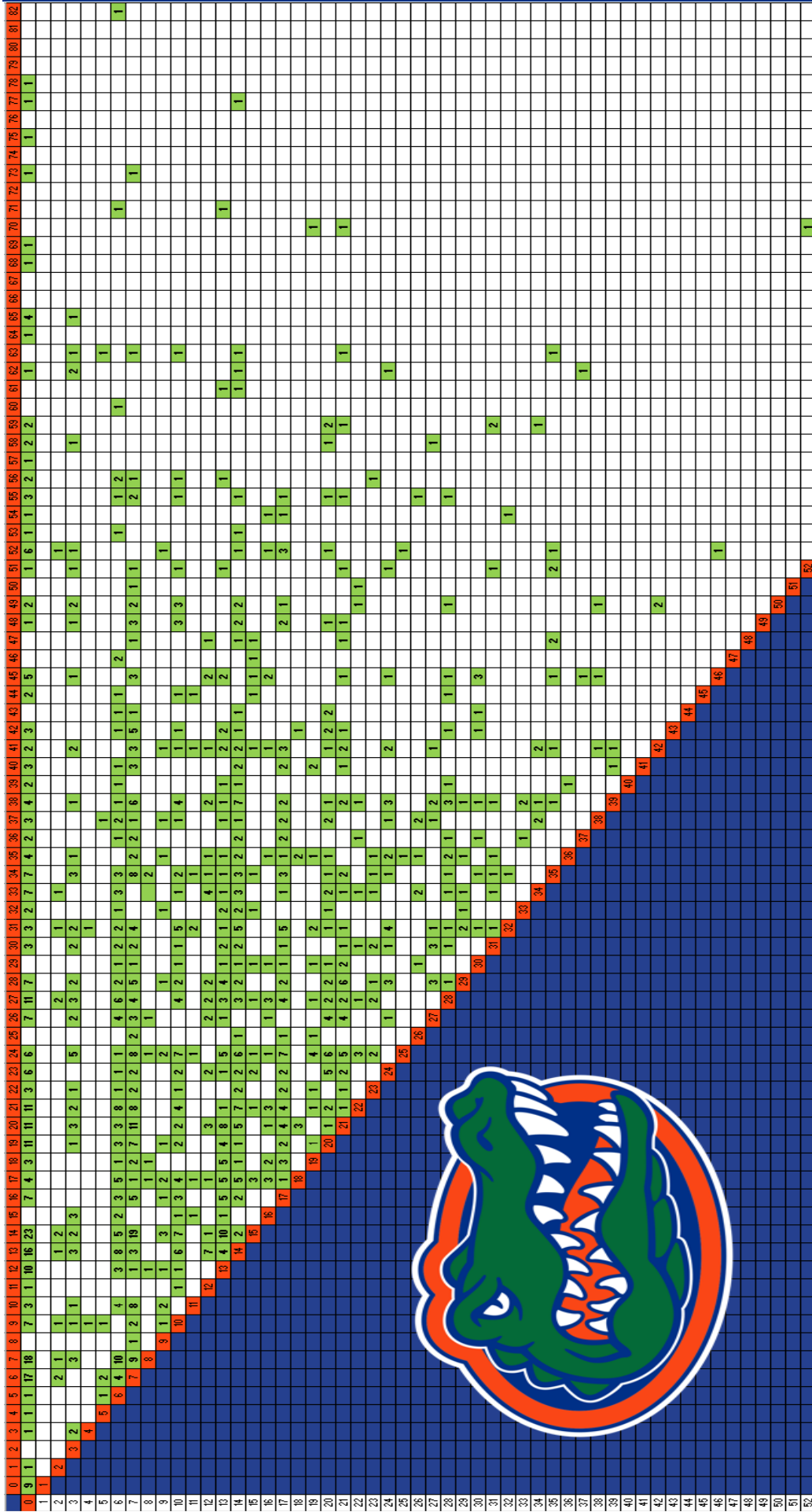

- The Gators rushed for 272 yards against the Seminoles in the final game of the regular season, highlighted by Jadan Baugh's 266 yards, which boosted their rushing offense from 105th in the nation to 91st.
- The Gators offensive line finished the season giving up 20 sacks, good for t-51st in the FBS and fourth in the SEC.
- The UF defense registered four sacks and seven tackles for loss against Florida State, jumping their rankings from 70th to 56th, and 104th to 90th, in the nation, respectively.
- The Gators' opponent red zone percentage finished at 75.0% on the season after being boosted by holding FSU to 3-of-5 (60%), good for t-16th in the FBS and third in the SEC.
- Both sides of UF's punt unit finished in the top-50 in the FBS. Florida finished 38th in the FBS and seventh in SEC for net punt average and 43rd in the FBS and eighth in the SEC for punt return average.
- By winning the turnover battle against FSU, 2-to-1 (one forced fumble and one interception for the Gators, one interception for the Seminoles), Florida boosted its final turnover margin per game ratio to -0.08 on the season, jumping their FBS ranking to 79th from 86th.

### Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Florida quarterback DJ Lagway passed for three first-half touchdowns, tailback Jadan Baugh rushed for 104 yards and a score and the nation's 15th-ranked team did what a power-conference program with high expectations is supposed to do to an FCS opponent in running roughshod over Long Island in a 55-0 rout Saturday night in the season opener for both teams at sold-out Spurrier/Field Field. Lagway, the 6-foot-3, 247-pound sophomore from Willis, Texas, had to shake off some rust after being limited for the first month of fall practice with a sore calf. Nonetheless, the UF franchise QB completed 15 of his 18 throws (83.3%) for 120 yards, with short scoring tosses of four yards to wide receiver Eugene Wilson III and tight end Hayden Hansen, plus an 8-yarder to wideout J. Michael Sturdivant, the transfer from UCLA. All three came in the second quarter, as the Gators built a 38-0 halftime lead, then shut Lagway down for the night. UF churned out 236 yards, including 120 rushing, and 16 first downs with Lagway under center. When the night was over, the Gators had out-gained the out-manned Sharks, by way of the Northeast Conference, 451 yards to 86, with a whopping 27-2 edge in first downs, an all-time low for a UF opponent. The Sharks' first 12 possessions went just three plays or less. Florida's 55 points marked a single-game high under Coach Billy Napier, now in his fourth season. The Gators went an entire game without a penalty for the first time since 2021 and did not turn the ball over. LIU, in its seventh season of existence, was facing just its fourth power-conference program. The previous three were losses of 66-0 at West Virginia in 2021, 30-7 at Baylor in '22 and 45-0 at Texas Christian in '24. UF did not waste any time jumping in front, but did so on defense. The Gators won the coin toss, deferred to the second-half, but took the lead on safety Bryce Thornton's 37-yard fumble return — the first fumble for a score by the Gators' defense since 2020 — on the game's third play from scrimmage. On Florida's first offensive series, Baugh had runs of 17, 16 and seven yards before scoring on a 4-yard blast for a 14-0 lead. He got the second 100-yard game of his career on just nine carries. While LIU was cranking one three-and-out after another, Florida had three consecutive series ended in Trey Smack field-goal attempts. He missed from 40 and 39, but drilled a 56-yarder in between that tied the second-longest in school history and gave the home team a 17-0 lead. The Gators' next three series ended in the Lagway TD passes and fat halftime advantage. True freshman Trammell Jones Jr., out of Jacksonville, replaced Lagway in the second half and led a scoring drive to Smack's second field goal, a 41-yarder, and then a 64-yard march capped by a 4-yard touchdown pass to tight end Tony Livingston for a 48-0 lead. He threw an 11-yard scoring strike to former walk-on Taylor Spierto with 25 seconds remaining in the game. Jones finished 12 of 18 for 131 yards and the two TDs without a turnover.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Not much. LIU may have been one of the most over-matched opponents ever to play at Florida Field. For the Gators, the best thing about beating up on the Sharks was getting Lagway some much-needed reps (and getting out of the game healthy) before things start to get real.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Legacy wideout Vernell Brown III made quite the splash in his collegiate debut. Brown, whose father played at UF from 2002-05 and whose grandfather played here from 1982-85, became the first true freshman to start for the Gators on offense since tackle Jawaan Taylor in 2016 and just the third receiver in program history to do so, joining Percy Harvin (2006) and Antonio Callaway (2015). Brown caught three passes for 79 yards, breaking the true freshman debut mark of 72 set by Josh Hammond against North Texas in 2016. Brown hauled a spectacular one-handed, 41-yard gem from Lagway in the second quarter to set up a score. He also returned three punts for 45 yards, with a long of 25.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** LIU's total offense of 86 yards marked the 10th-lowest total by an opponent in UF history. The Sharks did not run a play in Florida territory until quarterback Luca Stanzani, from the his 42, converted a third-and-7 with a 28-yard completion to Deion Richardson to the UF 28 with just over nine minutes to go in the game. The drive fizzled from there. As for their two first downs, the previous all-time low against the Gators was four against Western Carolina in 2006 and Miami in 1974.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (1-0) is back in "The Swamp" on Sept. 6 for a date against cross-state foe South Florida (1-0), which turned plenty of college football heads Thursday night in trouncing 25th-ranked Boise State, a College Football Playoff participant last season, 34-7 at Tampa. The Bulls are in their third season under Alex Golesh, who's put together back-to-back 7-6 seasons capped by bowl wins. The upset of the Broncos, though, was one of the program's biggest victories in years and should get the attention of the UF staff. Especially if USF, though unlikely, jumps into the Associated Press Top 25 this week.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** South Florida's Nico Gramatica kicked a 20-yard field goal as time expired and the down-south, cross-state foe Bulls shocked 13th-ranked Florida 18-16 before a sold-out, bummed-out crowd Saturday night at Spurrier/Florida Field. Gramatica's game-winner came after the Bulls — nine days removed from upsetting 25th-ranked and 2024 College Football Playoff participant Boise State at Tampa — capped an eight-play, 87-yard drive over the final 2:26, with the Gators defense doing its part in handing USF one of its biggest victories in school history by committing a disastrous unsportsmanlike-conduct penalty and a handful of missed tackles on a long catch-and-run. The victory gave the Bulls, in just their 25th year in Division I and FBS classification, wins over Florida, Florida State, Miami in their short history. Senior quarterback Byrum Brown completed 23 of 36 passes for 263 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing 17 times for 66 yards. Brown's 66-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter gave the Bulls their first lead of the game. The Gators, thanks to a 40-yard punt return by dynamic freshman Vernell Brown III, managed to retake the lead on a DJ Lagway short scoring toss to Eugene Wilson III, but the home team, despite getting the ball back twice more, left the door open for Brown and friends. The Bulls kicked it in. USF began the close-out drive at its 11. On second-and-10, defensive back Dijon Johnson was called for pass interference. On the very next snap, tailback Alvon Isaac was stopped for no gain at the 24, but in the middle of a mini-shoving match defensive lineman Brendan Bett was flagged for spitting on a player, resulting in a 15-yard penalty and automatic ejection. The ball was moved to the South Florida 39, where on first down Brown threw a short pass in the flat to Isaac, who turned the corner, broke two tackles and made another defensive back miss as he dashed 29 yards up the USF sidelines to the Florida 32. In field-goal range. From there, it was a slow green-and-gold bleed out, with either Brown or Isaac moving the ball to the UF 2 and calling a timeout with three seconds left. Gramatica, the son of former Tampa Bay Buccaneers kicker and Super Bowl champion Martin Gramatica, split the uprights from inside point-after range. It was his third field goal of the night. USF out-gained UF in total yards, 391 to 355, and on defense made Lagway look uncomfortable most of the night. The sophomore finished 23 of 33 for 222 yards, one touchdown and a first-half interception. The Gators out-rushed the Bulls, though barely, 133 to 128, led by sophomore Jadan Baugh's 93 yards on 18 carries. Through the first 48 minutes, the game featured nothing but field goals; three by Florida's Trey Smack (from 28, 36 and 25) and two by Gramatica (38 and 25), with neither team able to finish drives. The Gators led 9-6 until what looked like a promising UF march, with a first down at midfield, stalled and ended in a punt. The Bulls took over at their 14, got out of a hole with a 15-yard completion from Brown to Mudia Reuben, then turned the game on its head. On third-and-5 from his 34, Brown got his fast-breaking, high-tempo offense to the line and got the ball snapped as the Florida defense was caught — and confused — in mid-substitution. Singleton sprinted upfield and Brown lofted a strike that split defensive backs Johnson and Sharif Denson, both of whom looked like they could make a play on the ball. Instead, the two dove past each other, the ball hit Singleton in stride and he went untouched into the end zone for the Bulls' first lead of the game at 13-9. The Gators' ensuing possession answer was a three-and-out followed by a high snap from punt formation by Rocco Underwood, a 2024 first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection, that sailed over the head of Tommy Doman and rolled out of the end zone for a safety that pushed USF's margin to 15-9 with 13 seconds to go in the third quarter. Then came Brown's big return, Lagway's scoring toss, the lead, the momentum and the crowd doing its part. It wasn't enough.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** Get ready for more of what Ron Zook used to call "noise in the system," as UF failed to go 2-0 under Coach Billy Napier for the fourth time in as many seasons. USF, meanwhile, now has to be considered one of the Group of Five front-runners for a possible CFP berth.

**IN THE SPOTLIGHT:** Brown, the senior from Raleigh, North Carolina, was the best player on the field against Boise last weekend and the best on the field Saturday.

**STAGGERING STATISTIC:** The Gators were flagged 11 times for 103 yards, several of them stalling drives or extending ones on defense. Quite a drastic turn after the season-opening 55-0 win against FCS-classed Long Island when the Gators had zero penalties. They were a huge reason UF punted on six of its seven possessions in the second half.

**UP NEXT:** Florida (1-1) dives into the meat cleaver portion (the first one) of a 2025 schedule that is ranked as the most difficult in the country this season. The Gators open their SEC slate Sept. 13 with a night game at No. 3 LSU (1-0), which faces Louisiana Tech later tonight. Come what may, then it's a trip down the Florida Turnpike to face fifth-ranked Miami, which blew out the home team at "The Swamp" by a 41-17 count a year ago.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** LSU safety Dashawn Spears returned one of DJ Lagway's career-high five interceptions 58 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to break open a close game, as the third-ranked Tigers went on to a 20-10 defeat of the visiting Florida Gators in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday night at sold-out Tiger Stadium. Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier passed for 220 yards and a touchdown, but it was the LSU defense that dictated and determined the outcome. The Tigers thoroughly frustrated and confused Lagway, the sophomore who repeatedly made ill-advised throws either under duress or into double- or triple-coverage. The Gators also undermined themselves with another night of costly penalties, committing seven for 57 yards (all through the first three quarters), including three holding penalties, one of which cost UF an 87-yard touchdown pass. The UF defense played admirably, holding the Tigers to just 316 yards, 10 first downs and came up with an interception early in the fourth quarter when the Gators, trailing by 10, sorely needed to make a play. Lagway, though, after working the offense into LSU territory, forced a deep pass into triple coverage down the middle on the third-and-9 from the 36. The ball was intercepted in the end zone by defensive back Tamarcus Cooley with 11 minutes remaining. The Gators' defense, though, forced a punt and Lagway, after starting at his 15, moved UF to the LSU 39, and in field-goal range, to possibly make it a one-score game late. But under pressure, Lagway danced in the backfield and tried to make a desperation, cross-field throw into heavy coverage. That one was picked off at the LSU sideline by defensive back DJ Pickett with 2:07 to go. Three plays later, on third-and-1 from the LSU 46, tailback Caden Durham ripped off a 51-yard run to the Florida 3, where the Tigers ran out the clock. Lagway, who missed virtually the entire offseason and most of preseason practice dealing with shoulder and calf injuries, finished 33 of 49 for 287 yards, one touchdown, the five picks and was sacked three times. The Gators out-gained the Tigers on the night, finishing with 366 yards (only 79 rushing), but the turnovers and penalties killed them. Both teams mostly struggled during a first half that ended with LSU's Damian Ramos drilling a 45-yard field goal as time expired to lead 13-10. The Gators took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a 45-yard Trey Smack field goal and -- for a moment -- thought they had jumped ahead 10-0 on an 87-yard touchdown strike from Lagway to tailback Jadan Baugh. Instead, the play was called back for holding and UF had to punt from its end zone. LSU tied the game on a Ramos' 47-yarder on the ensuing possession. The Tigers took the lead when Nussmeier hit wideout Zavion Thomas for a 23-yard scoring strike to cap a 10-play, 76-yard drive with 7:33 to go in the half. The Gators, though, matched it with a near-identical 10-play, 75-yard drive, with Lagway lofting a perfect pass to Aidan Mizell for a 10-yard score on third-and-9 that tied the game at 10 with 3:25 to go before intermission. That's where it should have stood at halftime, but Lagway tried to force a pass to freshman wideout Vernell Brown III for his second interception, with the Tigers taking over at the UF 40. Aided by a pass-interference call (and despite a false-start penalty), Ramos was able to give LSU a 13-10 lead on the final play of the half. The only score after the break was the game-sealing pick-6. For the second consecutive week, the Florida defense gave up just one touchdown in a loss. Sophomore running back Jadan Baugh (13) on the move Saturday against the Tigers.

**What it Means:** More noise. More adversity. More pressure. And more great opponents on the immediate horizon (read on).

**In the Spotlight:** The LSU secondary had a bead on Lagway all night. With good pressure up front, the Tigers' DBs sat back and locked in on the Gators' QB as he stared down his receivers.

**Staggering Statistic:** Lagway became the first Florida quarterback to throw at least five interceptions in a game since Shane Matthews threw five in a 30-6 loss at Mississippi State in 1992. The last UF quarterback to throw at least four in a game was Rex Grossman in a 17-14 loss at Ole Miss in 2002. The last time LSU intercepted at least four passes in a game occurred in 2021, when the Tigers picked off four passes (two each from UF's Emory Jones and Anthony Richardson) in defeating the Gators 49-42 at Baton Rouge.

**Up Next:** Florida (1-2) continues its harrowing run of ranked opponents with a road date at No. 5 Miami (3-0), which destroyed 18th-ranked South Florida 49-12 Saturday at Miami Gardens, a week after the Bulls came to "The Swamp" and did their well-chronicled damage in handing the Gators a stinging 18-16 loss. The prime-time UF-UM showdown will mark the Gators' first road date against the Hurricanes since 2013 (a 21-16 loss) and likely the last regular-season meeting between the two programs for a long time, given the SEC's expansion to a nine-game league schedule starting next season.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Running backs CharMar Brown and Mark Fletcher Jr. each rushed for short touchdowns in the final four minutes and No. 4 Miami staved off a Florida second-half push for a 26-7 victory in their cross-state rivalry showdown Saturday night at Hard Rock Stadium. Brown's 1-yard run with 4:08 remaining capped a 13-play, 80-yard drive after the Gators, completely stifled (and shut out) in the first half, awakened in the third quarter with an impressive scoring march that turned what was looking like a rout into a one-possession game at 13-7. Brown's score made it 19-7, as UM missed the two-point try. The TD came after UF had a chance to take the lead -- or at least cut Miami's six-point edge in half -- after forcing a Carson Beck interception on the first play after scoring its touchdown. The Gators, though, could not capitalize, while the Hurricanes bowed up and put things away in the fourth quarter. After Brown's score, Florida went four plays and out, turning the ball over on downs deep in its own territory. Miami answered with a four-play, 22-yard drive that ended with Fletcher bowling over from the 1 to cap the scoring. Beck, the Georgia transfer, completed 17 of 30 passes for 160 yards and a pick, but it was the UM rushing game, which cranked out 184 yards on 46 attempts, that proved the difference. Fletcher Jr. rushed 24 times for 116 yards, while Brown toted 18 times for 80. The Hurricanes finished with 344 total yards versus just 141 by the Gators, the team's fewest since gaining just 139 in a 30-3 loss to Oregon State in the 2022 Las Vegas Bowl. The Gators managed just seven first downs and 0-for-13 on third-down conversion opportunities. Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway, a week after throwing five interceptions in a loss at LSU, had another frustrating night, completing just 12 of 23 passes for 61 yards, a career-low in games he has started. Lagway's longest completion went for 12 yards and he was sacked four times. UF got the ball to open the game and the Gators' first three plays, all runs, looked like this: minus-3, minus-1, minus-1. It was a preview of things to come. UM took the ensuing punt and drove 56 yards in seven plays, with Brown powering in from the 2 for a 7-0 lead and the first opening-drive touchdown against the Florida defense in 12 games. The Hurricanes made it look easy. Florida's second series went like the first; another three-and-out. Miami converted three consecutive third downs before a sack of Beck by freshman Jayden Woods forced the Canes to settle for the first of two field goals in the period. Carter Davis hit a 53-yarder less than a minute into the period and later a 28-yarder with just over a minute to play in the half to take a 13-0 lead to the locker room. The Gators went to intermission with just 32 yards of offense, including only four on the ground, on 22 plays (1.45 per snap) and one first down. It looked like it would be all Miami. Until it didn't. The Hurricanes got the ball to start the second half and eventually punted. The Gators took over at their 20 and instantly looked like a different team. The offensive line began moving the UM defensive front, starting with a 27-yard by Ja'Kobi Jackson that almost equaled the team's entire offensive output of the first half. A 10-yard completion to Vernell Brown III and 11-yard run by Jadan Baugh set up a 4th-and-2 at the UM 12 that Lagway converted on a keeper around the right side. Two plays later, Baugh went to that same side for a 7-yard touchdown that suddenly made a completely lopsided game into a 13-7 contest. On the very next snap from scrimmage, Beck threw late down the middle on first down and was intercepted by UF's Cormani McClain near midfield. The Gators had a fourth and 3 at the UM 45, but Lagway threw short of the line to gain, with TJ Abrams tackled after a 2-yard gain on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Florida defense, though, forced a three-and-out, with UF still down by just six points. On third-and-1 at the Gators' 27, an inside handoff to Baugh was blown up in the backfield, forcing the Gators to punt the ball away with 11:20 to go. Miami started at its 20 and went to work on the first of its two late fourth-quarter TD marches. That one basically sealed the victory.

**What it Means:** More of the same, relative to adversity, only with no game to potentially quiet the noise this week. Read on.

**In the Spotlight:** The defense, like the previous two weeks, kept the Gators in the game. Through nearly 56 minutes, the unit had allowed just one touchdown (like it did in the loss at LSU and the home loss the week before against South Florida), but only had so much resistance left in the fourth quarter after the Florida offense could not stay on the field.

**Staggering Statistic:** The Gators have lost three of their first four games for the first time in 39 years. In 1986, UF opened with a 38-14 win over Division I-AA Georgia Southern, then lost at home to No. 2 Miami 23-15 and No. 4 Alabama 21-7 in consecutive weeks, followed by a 16-10 road defeat at Mississippi State. The Gators, who were in the final year under crippling NCAA sanctions, lost a fourth in a row, 28-17 at home against LSU, then reeled off five wins in their final six games to finish 6-6.

### Chris Harry's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway passed for 298 yards and a pair of touchdowns, with true freshman wide receiver Dallas Wilson accounting for the better part of those numbers in a spectacular collegiate debut Saturday, as Florida upset No. 9 Texas 29-21 before a sold-out and rollicking crowd at Spurrier/Florida Field that badly needed a game (and result) like this one. The finish was on the wild side, with the Longhorns scoring on a 1-yard Quintrevion Wisner run with 3:20 to go, then forcing a three-and-out and Gators punt, with UT taking over at its 31 with 54 seconds to go. On first down, UT quarterback Arch Manning was sacked by Kamran James and freshman Jayden Woods for a 12-yard loss, with Manning's helmet coming off and, by rule, forcing him to the sidelines for one play. Enter backup Matthew Caldwell, who fired a 26-yard completion, with UF also being flagged for a personal foul on the play. The 41-yard gain put UT at the UF 40 and Manning re-entering the game with 18 seconds remaining. The next (and final) three plays looked like this: incompleting; sack by UF edge George Gumbs Jr.; and a desperation spike by Manning to try (in vain) and stop the clock with one second remaining. Instead, the game ended and so did Florida's three-game losing streak. Lagway, in bouncing back from a three-week run of poor play, completed 21 of 28 passes (75%) and keyed an offense that cranked out 457 total yards against a Longhorns' defense that began the day ranked fourth overall nationally (211.0 yards per game) -- as well as second in scoring (7.8 points per) -- and 16th against the pass (151.3 yards per). UF sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh carried a career-high 27 times for 107 yards and a touchdown, as the Gators grounded out 159 yards against the nation's No. 3 rush defense (just 59.8 per game) and did not allow Lagway to be sacked. But it was Wilson, the 6-foot-3, 213-pound five-star prospect out of Tampa Bay Tech, who lit up the stadium and introduced himself to Gator Nation in stunning fashion. After missing the season's first four games with a foot injury, Wilson hauled in six receptions for 111 yards and both of Lagway's TDs; a 13-yarder in the first half and electrifying 55-yard catch-and-run in the second half that gave UF a 15-point lead with 38 seconds remaining in the third quarter and set up the final and frantic (for the home team and crowd) fourth period. Texas, which came in averaging 438 yards and 31.8 points a game, was limited to 341 yards, including just 52 on the ground. Manning, the sophomore with Hall-of-Fame family pedigree, completed 16 of 29 passes for 263 yards and a pair of scores, but also threw a pair of interceptions (one in the fourth quarter) and was sacked six times. The Gators used a near-flawless first half to take a 19-7 lead into the locker room. The lone flaw miscue was a fumble by tight end Hayden Hansen after a completion into Texas territory that led to UT's only score of the half when UF was threatening to blow the game open. UF took the opening kickoff and marched 84 yards in a methodical 13 plays, with Baugh scoring on a 5-yard run on third-and-1. The Florida defense forced a Texas punt on the Longhorns' first possession and answered with another long drive (10 plays, 64 yards) that Trey Smack capped with a 34-yard field goal for a 10-0 lead. The Gators were threatening yet again when Hansen caught a 13-yard pass and coughed up the ball at the Texas 40 on a hit by Ty'Anthony Smith. Linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. scooped and returned the play to UF 45. Manning's 33-yard pass to Parker Livingstone got the Longhorns to the 10 and Wisner scored the first of his two TDs on a 5-yard swing pass to make it 10-7. Lagway, who was playing through some pain, went back to work, with completions of 11 yards to Vernell Brown III, 19 to J. Michael Sturdivant and 18 to Wilson, all mixed with some nice running from backup freshman tailback Duke Clark (9 carries, 38 yards), who was on for injured backup Ja'Kobi Jackson. Lagway finished the drive by firing a 13-yard scoring dart to Wilson to make the score 17-7. Texas' next possession was a three-and-out, with UF fifth-year senior and former walk-on Taylor Spierto crashing the protection and blocking Jack Bouwmeester's punt out of the back of the end zone for a safety and 19-7 advantage. When the teams went to the locker room, Florida was up in total yards 263 to 87 (with a 113-24 differential on the ground), first downs 17 to five and had a nearly 10-minute advantage in time of possession. After the first three possessions of the third quarter ended in punts, the Gators struck midway through the period when Lagway bombed a 60-yard completion to Brown, who made a ridiculous catch in tight coverage at the UT 25. Florida, though, had to settle for Smack's 38-yard field goal, which kept the lead at two possessions, 22-7. But not for long. Manning struck for a 38-yard TD pass to Ryan Wingo with 2:43 left in the third, drawing to within 22-14. Lagway and Wilson answered. The former hit the latter on a deep sidelined rout, with Wilson running through defenders and tight-roping the UT sidelines for an incredible 55-yard scoring that made it a 15-point margin again at 29-14. It held up, but not without a little late-game angst.

**What it Means:** To say Coach Billy Napier and his team needed a win like this would be a Century Tower-sized understatement. It doesn't mean the pressure is off, not even close -- and not with the schedule the Gators are staring down (read on) -- but the team and fan base has a week to feel better about itself. Last year demonstrated that Napier's players have his back. They do not quit. The Gators showed more of the same against the Longhorns, in improving to 3-9 under Napier against teams ranked in the top 10.

**In the Spotlight:** Take a wild guess. Wilson's catches, yards and touchdowns were all single-game records for a UF freshman receiver playing in his first collegiate game. Think about that relative to the superstar wideouts who have come through this program over the years.

**Staggering Statistic:** For Longhorns coach Steve Sarkisian, the loss was his first in 18 games at UT when his team was ranked in the top 10 and facing an unranked opponent. Worth noting, Florida lost 49-17 at Texas last season, a game they trailed at one point 42-0.

**Up Next:** Florida (2-3, 1-1) gets to enjoy this one for ... oh ... about 20 minutes, then must begin preparations for next week's road date at No. 6 Texas A&M (4-0, 1-0), making for a fourth top-10 opponent in the Gators' first six games of the season (with more on the way). The Aggies, who were home against Mississippi State late Saturday night, whipped the Gators 33-20 in Gainesville last season.

### Scott Carter's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** What began as an offensive shootout between Florida and Texas A&M at Kyle Field turned into an all-too-familiar result for the Gators: another road loss. The Gators remained winless away from The Swamp, losing 34-17 to the host Aggies on Saturday night. Florida (2-4, 1-2 SEC) dropped to 0-3 away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in losing for the second consecutive season to Texas A&M. The fifth-ranked Aggies (6-0, 3-0) iced their sixth consecutive victory with a 12-play, 53-yard drive in the fourth quarter to extend their lead to 31-17 with 4:39 remaining. Texas A&M running back Rueben Owens II capped the 8-plus-minute drive with a 2-yard touchdown run. The Aggies gained possession after stopping the Gators on downs. With UF trailing 24-17 and facing a fourth-and-6 from the Aggies' 49, Florida head coach Billy Napier opted to go for it. Quarterback DJ Lagway's pass to Vernell Brown III dropped incomplete, and Texas A&M took over and proceeded to march down the field. Lagway finished 21 of 37 for 245 yards and two touchdowns. "We were right there. We had our opportunities," Napier said. "We just have to make plays. We've got to stay the course, and we're going to have opportunities to play better moving forward. Offensively, we started fast and then settled in on defense. In general, we didn't sack their guy, and we struggled to protect DJ at times. Once we settled in on defense, I thought the effort was there. Our kids battled their ass off." Meanwhile, the teams traded punches early as Florida (157) and Texas A&M (196) combined for 353 yards in a back-and-forth first quarter, which ended in a 14-14 tie. Florida averaged 9.1 yards per play in the opening quarter, Texas A&M 13.1. The offensive fireworks flamed out over the next two quarters as the defenses caught up and surrendered only 244 yards (Florida 101, Texas A&M 143) over the second and third quarters. Still, the game was within reach for the Gators when safety Jordan Castell picked off Aggies quarterback Marcel Reed in the end zone on the first play of the fourth quarter. Lagway hit J. Michael Sturdivant for 27 yards on the next play to move Florida near midfield. But four plays later, the drive stalled and the Gators turned it over on downs, sparking a roar from the announced crowd of 105,086. The teams traded field goals in the third quarter. Texas A&M stretched the lead to 24-14 with 10:42 left in the third quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Randy Bond. The Aggies gained possession at UF's 29-yard line when linebacker Daymion Sanford forced Brown III to fumble, which was recovered by Aggies linebacker Taurean York. Five plays later, Bond split the uprights for Texas A&M's largest lead of the game at that point. The Gators answered with a nine-play, 47-yard drive that ended with a 45-yard field goal by Trey Smack to make it 24-17. The field goal was the 44th of Smack's career, moving him into fourth place in school history. The Gators struck first when Lagway led them on an eight-play, 75-yard drive on the opening possession. Lagway finished the drive with a 1-yard scoring throw to tight end Amir Jackson. It was Jackson's first career touchdown. The Aggies responded with scoring drives of 75, 81 and 75 yards on their first three possessions. Reed scored on an 8-yard run to make it 7-7, and after the Aggies forced a punt, Reed connected with Jamarion Morrow for a 22-yard touchdown. The Gators answered with Lagway's 6-yard touchdown pass to freshman receiver Dallas Wilson, but Florida's defense had no answer for the Aggies early. Texas A&M drove 75 yards on 11 plays, taking a 21-14 lead on a 22-yard touchdown run by Ja'Veon Moss, who left the game with an injury later in the first half. Reed finished 16 of 26 for 234 yards and added 37 yards rushing. "We're close, but close is not good enough," linebacker Myles Graham said. "We're right there, but we have to be better."

**What it Means:** For now, another week on the seesaw for the Gators, who, after upsetting No. 9 Texas at home last week to snap a three-game losing streak, could not sustain the momentum of a feel-good victory. The Gators sit with four losses in six games at midseason after starting the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top 25.

**In the Spotlight:** The return home for Lagway, who grew up about 65 miles away from Kyle Field in Willis, Texas, started fast and furious as he threw two touchdowns on Florida's first three drives. However, the offense stalled as the Aggies turned up the pressure on Lagway, who was sacked three times.

**Staggering Statistic:** The Gators played hard and responded to some early shots from the Aggies, but they could not overcome their inability to beat a ranked team on the road on Napier's watch. Florida dropped to 0-14 in games away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium against ranked opponents, including losses at LSU, Miami and Texas A&M this season. They dropped to 0-10 in true road games vs. ranked teams under Napier.

**Up Next:** The Gators return home to face Mississippi State (4-2, 0-2) on Homecoming at The Swamp. The Bulldogs were off Saturday after losing a week ago to Texas A&M, 31-9, at Kyle Field. The good news for the Gators is that, unlike their last four opponents, the Bulldogs are not ranked in the top 10.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Sophomore defensive tackle Michai Boireau came up with an improbable, game-saving interception with 21 seconds left allowing Florida to escape Saturday night with a 23-21 homecoming victory over Southeastern Conference foe Mississippi State before a sold-out crowd at Spurrier/Florida Field. The Bulldogs were thisclose to their first SEC win in two years. Quarterback Blake Shapen, after a UF punt with 1:38 remaining, drove the MSU offense to Florida 29 — well within Kyle Ferrie's field-goal range — and faced a second-and-10 out of timeout with 29 seconds to go. Shapen, who'd riddled the Florida defense for 324 yards through the air, dropped and looked for wideout Anthony Evans III, already with 11 catches for 105 yards, on a crossing route slanting from the right. What Shapen did not see was Boireau, the 6-foot-5, 349-pound sophomore defensive lineman, dropping into shallow coverage. Shapen fired a pass and Boireau, maybe 10 yards away, stuck his gloved hands in the air and snagged a remarkable pick thrown from point-blank range, saving the day and icing the win as the "Swamp" went berserk. UF sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh carried 23 times for a career-high 150 yards and a touchdown, while senior Trey Smack kicked three field goals, including a 53-yarder with 6:49 to play that proved the difference, as MSU staged its late comeback attempt. Gators sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway completed 20 of 34 passes for 280 yards, did not throw a touchdown and was intercepted twice. Shapen completed 24 of 36 passes with the lone interception, while MSU tailback Davin Booth rushed 22 times for 105 yards and two scores. Mississippi State finished with 468 yards of total offense to Florida's 452. The Bulldogs took an early lead, thanks to a 48-yard Shapen-to-Evans completion on the second play from scrimmage that set the visitors up at the UF 21. Five plays later, running back Kamario Taylor replaced Shapen and scored on a 2-yard run from the wildcat formation for a 7-0 lead less than three minutes in. The Gators cut into the margin, courtesy of a 29-yard Smack field goal at the 8:55 mark of the first, then took a 10-7 lead on the second snap of the second quarter when Baugh busted off a 19-yard scoring dash to finish a six-play, 69-yard drive. UF extended the lead to 13-7 when Smack bombed a 54-yard field goal on a drive that included a 60-yard touchdown run by Baugh called back — the fourth TD erased by penalty for the Gators this season — for holding downfield on Eugene Wilson III. After a scoreless third period, UF finished an 11-play, 93-yard drive with tailback KD Daniels scoring from a yard out on a direct-snap run that pushed the Gators ahead 20-7 with 13:41 remaining. UF lined up to go for a two-point conversion, but got called for having 12 men on the field and was forced to settle for the kick and 13-point margin. The Bulldogs needed just five plays to offset that TD, with Booth finishing a 65-yard drive with a 2-yard run with 11:57 to go that closed the home team's margin to 20-14. With the game in the balance, Florida's best offense turned out to be Mississippi State's defense, as the Bulldogs were flagged for two personal fouls over the next six snaps, including a roughing-the-passer call on a failed third-down conversion, that helped UF move to the MSU 31. The Gators did themselves no favors with an offensive pass interference penalty, but Smack was good from 53 yards (the eighth field goal of at least 50 yards of his career) and the Florida lead was 23-14 inside seven minutes remaining. That's when Shapen zapped the Gators for a five-play, 65-yard drive, aided by an end-zone pass interference call against linebacker Jadan Robinson on an incompletion on third-and-goal from the 8. Booth scored from the 2 two plays later to make the score 23-21 with two minutes to go. Lagway and his offense took over with a chance to close out the game with a first down, but on third-and-1 from UF 34 the call from the sidelines was for a pass play and Lagway was sacked for a seven-yard loss that forced a punt. Mississippi State took over at its 28 with 1:32 remaining. Seventy-three seconds later, Michai Boireau was a household name in Gator Nation.

**What it Means:** The Gators won a fifth straight SEC home game and gave their head coach (and enthusiastic crowd) a sorely needed victory. Read on.

**In the Spotlight:** In a vacuum, the answer would be Boireau or Baugh or maybe even Smack. But all eyes, heading into the upcoming bye week, will be locked in on the status of Coach Billy Napier, who improved to 22-23 in his four UF seasons.

**Staggering Statistic:** Mississippi State is now 0-11 in SEC play under second-year coach Jeff Leiby. The Bulldogs have lost 15 consecutive league games, dating to the 2023 season.

**Up Next:** Florida (3-4, 2-2) will have its second open date of the season on Oct. 25, then resume play Nov. 1 with their annual showdown against Georgia at Jacksonville. The Bulldogs (6-1, 4-1), who started the day ranked ninth in the nation, claimed a come-from-behind 43-35 home defeat Saturday over fifth-ranked and previously unbeaten Ole Miss.

### Scott Carter's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** The Gators responded with a gutsy performance in their first game under interim head coach Billy Gonzales, but not a winning one in their annual Southeastern Conference clash against Georgia here at EverBank Stadium. The final result was a 24-20 loss to the fifth-ranked Bulldogs (7-1, 5-1) in a game the Gators (3-5, 2-3) had an opportunity to win in the fourth quarter. Florida took a 20-17 lead on a 54-yard field goal by Trey Smack with 14:52 left in the game. The kick was Smack's school-record ninth of his career of 50 yards or more. However, the Bulldogs had enough time to stifle Florida's upset bid for their fifth consecutive win in the rivalry, Georgia's longest run of success over the Gators since a six-game win streak from 1978 to 1983. In their first game with Gonzales in charge, the Gators failed on a pair of fourth-down conversions in the final quarter that proved costly. Gonzales said he had "no regrets" about the decisions and stated that the Gators showed what they are made of after a tumultuous two weeks following the firing of head coach Billy Napier. "I'm super proud of the way they bonded together. The guys played extremely hard," Gonzales said. "They don't have any quit in their DNA. We came here to win, but we came up short. The Gators expect to win. There are no moral victories. You either win or you lose." A pivotal moment for the Gators came after Smack's field goal. Leading 20-17 and at Georgia's 18-yard line, Gonzales opted to go for it on fourth-and-1 instead of running Smack out for another field goal. Running back Jordan Baugh was stopped for no gain, and Georgia took over with 7:54 remaining. The Bulldogs drove down the field and took the lead on a 36-yard run by Chauncey Bowens that capped a seven-play, 82-yard drive with 4:36 left. The Gators never recovered from the massive momentum swing.

On the ensuing drive after Georgia regained the lead, the Gators were forced to go for it on fourth-and-4 from their 30 with 3:13 remaining. Lagway's pass was broken up, and the Bulldogs took possession and ran out the clock.

The loss was difficult for the Gators to swallow.

"It stinks. It stinks" said fifth-year senior defensive lineman Tyreak Sapp, who will finish his career without a win in the rivalry. "It hurts real bad, knowing this is my last time playing in this game."

The teams traded scores in the third quarter. First, Georgia's Gunner Stockton tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to Noah Thomas to put the Bulldogs up, 17-10, with 10:46 left in the quarter. Florida responded with a 12-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 2-yard scoring run by Baugh. The drive consumed more than seven minutes and tied the score, 17-17, with 3:37 left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs helped Florida's cause with a pair of pass interference calls. After Gators running back KD Daniels picked up a first down with a three-yard gain on third-and-2 from Georgia's 31, Bulldogs linebacker Raylen Wilson was flagged for interference against Baugh. The penalty moved the Gators to Georgia's 13, and on third-and-4 from the 7, Lagway's pass intended for TJ Abrams in the end zone dropped incomplete. But a pass interference call against Georgia's Zion Branch gave the Gators a first down at the 2, and Baugh plunged in for the score on the next play. Georgia scored on its opening drive when Stockton connected with Dillon Bell for an 8-yard touchdown pass. Lagway hit Eugene Wilson III for a 40-yard touchdown later in the first quarter to tie the game, and Smack's 22-yard field goal with 3:02 left in the opening quarter gave Florida a 10-7 lead, marking the first time since 2016 that the Gators led the Bulldogs after the first quarter.

**What it Means:** The Gators failed to move to .500 for the third consecutive time, despite having an opportunity. The Gators were 1-2 when they lost at Miami. They were 2-3 when they lost at Texas A&M. And on Saturday, with an opportunity to move to 4-4, they dropped to 3-5 with four regular-season games left. To avoid a losing record, the Gators must win at least three of those remaining games: at Kentucky, at Ole Miss, and at home against Tennessee and Florida State.

**In the Spotlight:** The Gators were without their leading receiver, Vernell Brown III, and fellow receiver Aidan Mizell due to injuries. That provided junior Eugene Wilson III an opportunity to shine, and he did. Wilson led the Gators with nine catches for 121 yards. Wilson surpassed his season yardage total (118) entering the game. Wilson continued to be Lagway's favorite target in the second half after freshman Dallas Wilson left the game due to a foot injury.

**Staggering Statistic:** The Gators ran only 22 plays in the first half compared to 42 for Georgia. Still, the game was tied 10-10 at halftime. Meanwhile, Florida's lack of success on third down continued in its first game under Gonzales. The Gators finished 2 of 11 on third-down conversions and 0-for-2 on fourth down.

**Up Next:** Florida (3-5, 2-3) remains away from home with a road game at Kentucky. The Wildcats (2-5, 0-5) played Saturday night at Auburn in search of their first conference victory. The Gators have not had success in their last two trips to Lexington, losing in 2021 and 2023. The back-to-back losses came after Florida won 16 in a row at Kentucky from 1988 to 2019.

### Scott Carter's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Once upon a time, not so long ago, playing a road game at Southeastern Conference foe Kentucky was nothing more than a weekend pleasure trip for the Gators. There was nothing fun about what happened at Kroger Field on Saturday night if you were on the Florida sideline. Kentucky blitzed the Gators for 21 points in the second quarter and never looked back in a 38-7 runaway victory. The Wildcats (4-5, 2-5) snapped a 10-game home losing streak to SEC opponents, defeating a conference opponent at home for the first time since their 33-14 win over the Gators two years ago. Add the 2021 loss at Kroger Field to the list, and Florida (3-6, 2-4) has dropped three consecutive road games against Kentucky and five of eight overall since a 31-game win streak in the series was snapped in 2018. Wildcats quarterback Cutter Boley was 14 of 19 for 150 yards, completed 11 consecutive passes during one stretch, threw two touchdowns and had an interception in the first half to put Kentucky up 24-7 at the break. Meanwhile, UF quarterback DJ Lagway was 11 of 19, one touchdown and three interceptions in the opening half. That prompted Gators interim head coach Billy Gonzales to replace Lagway with freshman Tramell Jones Jr. at the start of the second half. Jones finished 9 of 17 for 60 yards. "Obviously, it wasn't anywhere close to what we wanted," Gonzales said. "Not acceptable in any terms to take a loss like we did." Trouble started for Florida when it drove to the Kentucky 44 on its opening drive, the big play a 22-yard pass from Lagway to receiver Vernell Brown III. However, three plays later, Lagway was picked off by Wildcats defensive back Ty Bryant, who returned the interception 17 yards to midfield. The Wildcats took advantage of the turnover with a 10-play, 30-yard drive that ended with a 39-yard field goal by Jacob Kauwe for a 3-0 lead. Kentucky delivered the Gators a return gift later in the first quarter. Florida took a 7-3 lead after Rocco Underwood covered a muffed punt by Kentucky's Ja'Mori Maclin at the Wildcats' 13. Three plays later, Lagway connected with running back Jadan Baugh for a 10-yard scoring pass. However, the Wildcats regained momentum on their next possession, driving 75 yards on nine plays. Boley hit J.J. Hester for a 29-yard touchdown for the go-ahead score. Kentucky then tightened its grip when a KD Daniels fumble was recovered by Cam Dooley with 9:43 left in the first half. Five plays later, Boley connected with Jason Patterson for a 15-yard scoring pass and a 17-7 lead. Before the first half was over, the Wildcats added to their lead on a 2-yard touchdown run by Seth McGowan. McGowan scored on a 5-yard run in the second half, and Dante Dowdell capped the rout with a 65-yard touchdown scamper in the fourth quarter. The 31-point loss was Florida's worst to Kentucky since a 40-6 defeat in Lexington in 1950, and the Gators' most-lopsided loss to an unranked opponent since a 46-15 loss at Alabama in 1970. "It's really shocking, honestly," linebacker Myles Graham said. "It's really embarrassing, and I did not know we were going to come out and play like that. I'm really blindsided, just like everybody else is. We gotta look in the mirror, and we got to do better. "That's completely unacceptable." Meanwhile, while the Gators need to win their final three regular-season games to avoid a losing record, who will play quarterback is unclear. Lagway walked dejectedly to the sideline after his third interception Saturday and took a seat alone on the bench. He has now thrown more interceptions (12) than touchdowns (11) this season. "We had a rough first half, and I thought it might be good for him just to gather and look at it from a coach's point from the sideline," Gonzales said. "But we need to play better all around, not just him. I think if you take a look at what we do and where we need to be, it's unacceptable, and I'm going to put me up in front and say, 'that's on me.' I'll take the blame for this loss, 100%. So, we gotta be better and I've got to be better to make sure these players can continue forward."

**What it Means:** Florida's season faces a different challenge with three games remaining — including home contests against traditional rivals Tennessee and Florida State. When it was revealed on the SEC Network's telecast that UF sophomore receiver Tank Hawkins had opted not to play Saturday to maintain redshirt status this season, it raised eyebrows considering the Gators were already without injured receivers Eugene Wilson III, Dallas Wilson and Taylor Spierto. Keeping the team together has been a talking point since the midseason coaching change, and as the losses pile up, that can become more difficult.

**In the Spotlight:** Making his 16th career start on Saturday night, Florida quarterback DJ Lagway was benched for the first time in his college career at the start of the second half. Lagway threw three interceptions in the first half and struggled to make on-target throws. The benching is the latest development in what has been a disappointing season for the sophomore from Willis, Texas. He missed the bulk of spring camp and preseason camp due to a variety of injuries and has been unable to duplicate his success from a season ago when he led the Gators to six wins in his seven starts.

**Staggering Statistic:** Florida entered the game ranked 129th among 134 FBS teams in third-down conversion rate, converting at a measly 30.4% (31 of 102) clip after going 2-for-11 in the loss to Georgia. What did the Gators do on Saturday night at Kentucky? They converted 5 of 7 third downs in the first half — and trailed 24-7. Go figure.

**Up Next:** Florida (3-6, 2-4) is back on the road again, this time for what figures to be a fascinating date at Ole Miss, chock full of pregame storylines and speculation (see Kiffin, Lane). The Rebels (9-1, 5-1) crushed The Citadel 49-0 on Saturday and remain in contention for a College Football Playoff berth. Meanwhile, the Gators must win to avoid a winless season away from The Swamp.

### Scott Carter's Quick Slant

**WHAT HAPPENED:** The Gators held up the conductor longer than many anticipated, but the Lane Train eventually pulled away in the second half as No. 6-ranked Ole Miss defeated Florida 34-24 on Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. In Florida's first game at Ole Miss since Lane Kiffin's debut as Rebels coach in 2020, rumors swirled Saturday that Kiffin could be Florida's coach next season. The Gators did little on their first two drives of the game, but they led 24-20 at halftime. However, instead of Florida (3-7, 2-5) pulling off the upset, the Rebels (10-1, 6-1) responded by shutting out the Gators in the second half as Ole Miss completed a perfect home record led by running back Kewan Lacy, who rushed for 224 yards on 31 carries. Lacy scored on 4- and 1-yard runs in the second half to account for all the scoring after halftime. Gators interim head coach Billy Gonzales, in his third game in charge of the program, complimented the way the Gators bounced back from a 31-point loss at Kentucky a week ago. "They battled," Gonzales said. "Thought they played their hearts out, to be honest with you. They've defined who they are all year long. They did it all week long, they're gonna continue to do it for the next couple games, they're gonna continue to battle." On the other sideline, Kiffin praised the way his defense answered the bell after halftime. "I thought our defense did great things in the second half," Kiffin said. Ole Miss regained the lead on the first play of the fourth quarter, a 1-yard run by Lacy that capped a six-play, 86-yard Rebels drive that took only 1:48. The Rebels started on their 14 after a 62-yard punt by Tommy Doman flipped the field. However, on the final play of the third quarter, Lacy raced 59 yards to Florida's 1, scoring on the next play. "It definitely wasn't good enough," said UF linebacker Myles Graham, who played one of the best games of his young career with nine tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack. "We beat ourselves in the run game, not making plays. The offense gave us enough points on the board, and we didn't capitalize." UF quarterback DJ Lagway's 57-yard touchdown pass to J. Michael Sturdivant put the Gators up 21-17 midway through the second quarter, and after Ole Miss kicker Lucas Carneiro connected on the second of his two field goals (27 and 23 yards) to make it 21-20, Trey Smack's 38-yard field goal with three seconds left in the first half gave the Gators a 24-20 lead. That is when the Ole Miss defense began to rise to the occasion, limiting the Gators to 326 total yards. Ole Miss piled up 538 yards. Lagway led a scoring drive late in the first quarter, highlighted by a 47-yard strike to TJ Abrams that gave UF the ball at the Ole Miss 17. Three plays later, Lagway scored on a 5-yard run with 1:13 left in the opening quarter, the first rushing score of his career. On the ensuing possession, Ole Miss quarterback Trinidad Chambliss' pass was picked off by defensive lineman Jayden Woods, who returned the interception to the Rebels' 5-yard line, setting up a Jadan Baugh 2-yard run that gave Florida its first lead, 14-10. The first quarter ended 10-7, in favor of Ole Miss, with the Gators facing first-and-goal from the 2-yard line after a facemask call on Ole Miss's Kam Franklin. The Rebels responded to take a 17-14 lead on a 43-yard TD pass from Chambliss to wideout De'Zhaun Stribling. Ole Miss' drive was kept alive after a third-down pass by Chambliss dropped incomplete out of bounds. But Gators edge rusher Tyreek Sapp was penalized for lining up in the neutral zone. The Rebels' redo resulted in Chambliss' scoring dart to Stribling, who caught the pass in the middle of the field and then split defenders and raced to the end zone.

**What it Means:** The Gators' dwindling hopes of becoming bowl-eligible or finishing with a winning record officially died on Saturday night. The defeat guaranteed a fourth losing season in five years for Florida, and it marked the program's 19th consecutive loss away from home against a ranked opponent. Florida's last win over a team ranked in the AP Top 25 that was not at The Swamp was a 44-28 victory over No. 5 Georgia in 2020 in Jacksonville.

**In the Spotlight:** Gators quarterback DJ Lagway responded well in his first game since being benched at halftime of last week's 38-7 loss at Kentucky. Lagway scored his first career rushing touchdown and finished 16 of 31 for 218 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Lagway, after throwing three interceptions at Kentucky, played a turnover-free game until a nasty break midway in the fourth quarter when his pass was tipped by Ole Miss lineman Santarine Perkins and intercepted by Wydett Williams Jr. on second-and-7 from the Rebels' 32-yard line, with the Gators down by a field goal.

**Staggering Statistic:** The Gators finished winless away from The Swamp this season, losing all six of their games outside Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. They gave No. 5 Georgia a scare two weeks ago in Jacksonville, and did the same to the sixth-ranked Rebels on Saturday. But in the end, this is the first Florida team to not win away from home since the winless 1979 team (0-10-1).

**Up Next:** Florida (3-7, 2-5) plays at home for the first time in more than a month, hosting a rare late-season matchup against Tennessee. The No. 23-ranked Vols (7-3, 4-2) beat New Mexico State on Saturday. The Gators are no longer eligible for a bowl game, but a win over the Vols would be a nice homecoming gift.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** The streak is over. No, not Florida's NCAA-record scoring streak. The Gators found a way to score, but their 10-game home win streak over Tennessee came to an ugly end in a 31-11 loss on Saturday night at sold-out Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. The No. 20-ranked Vols (8-3, 4-3) scored touchdowns on their first four possessions and opened a 31-0 halftime lead that sunk the Gators (3-8, 2-6) and quieted the crowd. "We couldn't get them off the field," Gators interim head coach Billy Gonzales said. "I guess a positive for us, if you start looking at numbers ... Jadan Baugh had an excellent game for us. Does it hurt? Absolutely. Our job is to continue to try and help these players to get better and to coach them." Florida extended its NCAA-record scoring streak to 472 games on a Trey Smack 46-yard field goal with 2:04 left in the third quarter. Smack's kick — he missed a 38-yard attempt on Florida's only significant drive of the first half — capped a 13-play, 71-yard drive that made the score 31-3. The Gators' final highlight was a 33-yard touchdown pass from DJ Lagway to Baugh midway through the fourth quarter. The Vols exploded from the start, with quarterback Joey Aguilar connecting with Ethan Davis for a 23-yard touchdown pass on the game's opening series. DeSean Bishop added a pair of 1-yard scoring runs on Tennessee's next two drives, and by that point, Tennessee had out-gained the Gators 189-1. A sign of what was to come happened on Florida's opening drive following Aguilar's throw to Davis. On the Gators' second play from scrimmage, Lagway tossed a pass to Baugh, who raced through the Tennessee defense for a 42-yard gain. However, a holding call on Austin Barber wiped out the play and led to a punt. Meanwhile, Star Thomas added a 1-yard run with 9:14 remaining in the first half for the Vols' final touchdown and Tennessee padded its lead on the last play of the first half on a 26-yard field goal by Max Gilbert. The Gators could do nothing but trudge to the locker room and search for answers. They responded with a better second half and hope to carry some of that momentum into the regular-season finale next week at home against Florida State. "They have a tough offense to stop. They spread you out. It's some tough times," senior cornerback Devin Moore said. "There's a standard here at the University of Florida. We're playing for each other. Those guys in the locker room don't want us to go out on a bad note." Aguilar finished 17 of 22 for 204 yards and a score, and Bishop rushed for 116 yards and two scores on 24 carries. The Vols, who entered the game with the No. 1-ranked offense in the Southeastern Conference (495.0 yards per game), answered the call for their first win at Florida since 2003 and 248 yards rushing, the most against the Gators this season. Tennessee finished with 452 yards and 28 first downs, and despite not scoring in the second half, was never threatened by the Gators. Lagway finished 11 of 17 for 116 yards and a score, and Baugh rushed 18 times for 96 yards. "We didn't put a ton of drives together offensively," Gonzales said. "Our players want to continue to fight. We've got to go back and obviously try to figure out what we can do to get a victory." Florida dropped to 0-4 under Gonzales on a night when Gonzales' mentor and receivers coach at Colorado State, former Gators coach Urban Meyer, was honored for his upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame. Florida also announced at the end of the first quarter, after Meyer made a brief on-field speech, that the 61-year-old Meyer will be placed into Florida's Ring of Honor in 2026. Meyer was 6-0 against Tennessee and in his first win against the Volunteers in 2005, a 16-7 UF victory at The Swamp, started the Gators' 10-game home win streak in the series that ended Saturday night. "We played a half of football," Gonzales said. "We didn't play the first half, and we came out in the second half, and played solid."

**What it Means:** The Gators' tumultuous season reached a new low on Saturday as they lost their eighth game of the season, the program's first eight-loss season since the 2013 team finished 4-8, which snapped a streak of 33 consecutive non-losing seasons for Florida dating to 1980.

**In the Spotlight:** Gator Nation. What? Let's explain. The Gators ran out of the tunnel in front of their 17th consecutive sellout. The game turned ugly from the start, but an announced crowd of 90,465 had The Swamp jumping at kickoff. Unfortunately, many fans departed at halftime with the Gators trailing 31-0, but the fans deserve a shout out for the way they have continued to show up on Saturdays. "The fans have always been great," Gonzales said. "Gator Nation and the fans are fantastic."

**Staggering Statistic:** The Vols scored four touchdowns on their first four drives and had out-gained the Gators 248 yards to 22 with 9:14 left in the first half. Meanwhile, Tennessee racked up 13 first downs before Florida managed its first on a 6-yard run by Baugh in the second quarter.

**Up Next:** Florida (3-8) closes the regular season at home against rival Florida State (5-6) next Saturday at The Swamp. The Seminoles lost at N.C. State on Friday night and are 2-6 since a 3-0 start that included a season-opening victory over Alabama.

**WHAT HAPPENED:** Sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh rushed for a career-high 266 yards and two touchdowns, surpassing the 1,000-yard season milestone along the way, allowing the Florida Gators to exit their tumultuous season with a rousing 40-21 victory Saturday night over rival Florida State at sold-out Spurrier/Florida Field. Baugh's total came on 38 carries, the most by a UF running back since Fred Taylor's 43 in the 1998 Citrus Bowl. The 266 yards marked the second-highest single-game rushing performance in UF's 119-year history, trailing only the 316 by Hall-of-Famer Emmitt Smith on Oct. 21, 1989, in a 27-21 homecoming win against New Mexico. Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway passed for 168 yards and three short touchdowns, but it was mostly Baugh's hard running that put the Gators in position to finish the drives. Baugh averaged seven yards per attempt and when his night was done had 1,170 yards on the season, making for the sixth-most by a UF back in program history. He also became the first Gator to reach 1,000 yards since Kelvin Taylor in 2015. Baugh also set the record most rushing yards ever surrendered by the Seminoles in a game. Lagway completed 15 of 24 attempts, with touchdowns of five yards to J. Michael Sturdivant, nine to tight end Tony Livingston and three to tight end Hayden Hansen, as the Gators rolled to 440 yards of total offense. Twice the Florida defense stopped Florida State on fourth-and-1 situations, with the UF offense seizing on the momentum each time by scoring touchdowns. In handing interim Coach Billy Gonzales his first victory in the five games since taking over for Billy Napier, Florida scored the game's first 10 points, then scored 17 unanswered to go ahead 34-14 early in the fourth quarter. The Gators had a Lagway-to-Vernell Brown III touchdown reception overturned on their first drive and settled for a 23-yard field goal from Trey Smack. On FSU's ensuing possession, UF linebacker Aaron Chiles stopped tailback Gavin Sawchuk for a loss on fourth-and-1 at the Florida 22. The Gators then took off on a 76-yard drive, with Lagway hitting Sturdivant for 34 yards along the way, then for five and the score a few plays later to go ahead 10-0. Florida State quarterback Tommy Castellanos completed 17 of 28 passes for 240 yards, two touchdowns and turned the ball over twice. He threw a 13-yard score to Micahi Danzy to close the Seminoles to 10-7, but the Gators came right back with a 75-yard march that Lagway finished with a short pitch to Livingston to make it 17-7. The Seminoles capitalized on a Lagway interception with late in the second quarter with a Castellanos scoring run of four yards with 1:14 to go before the half that made it 17-14. The Gators scored the next 17 points. After safety Brice Thornton and linebacker Myles Graham teamed up to shove Castellanos out of bounds for no gain on a fourth-and-1 in minus-territory, Lagway and Hansen finished a 40-yard drive with a 3-yard scoring pitch. Baugh followed with a 22-yard touchdown run and Smack added a 54-yard field goal for a 34-14 advantage before FSU scored on a 17-yard TD pass with 3:07 to play on Castellanos' pass to Lawayne McCoy. From there, it was clear the Gators wanted Baugh to finish his night in the biggest way possible. He had six consecutive touches, including two from the wildcat formation, and accounted for all 56 of his team's yards on the season's final offensive drive, ending with a 12-yard TD run with 56 seconds to play.

**What it Means:** The series now stands at 39-28-2 in Florida's favor, with two consecutive victories for the Gators. Despite the win, UF's final record of 4-8 equaled the program's worst in the last 44 years. The 2013 Gators also went 4-8.

**In the Spotlight:** Baugh became the 10th player in program history to reach 1,000 yards in a season and just the third underclassman, joining Smith, a freshman in 1987, and sophomore Errict Rhett in 1991. Baugh hit the milestone on the 198th carry of his career, making for the seventh-fastest in program history. He's the fifth Gators back this century — after Earnest Graham (2002), Ciatrick Faison (2004), Mike Gillislee (2012) and Kelvin Taylor (2015), son of Fred — to join the four-figure rushing club.

**Staggering Statistic:** Anything and everything already detailed about Baugh, who Gator fans surely will be hoping opts to return to play his junior season at Florida.

**Up Next:** The Gators will now embark on an offseason that, for now, will start with a cloud of uncertainty relative to the program's head-coaching situation. That cloud likely will dissipate in short order (stay tuned) and the rebuild will be underway.

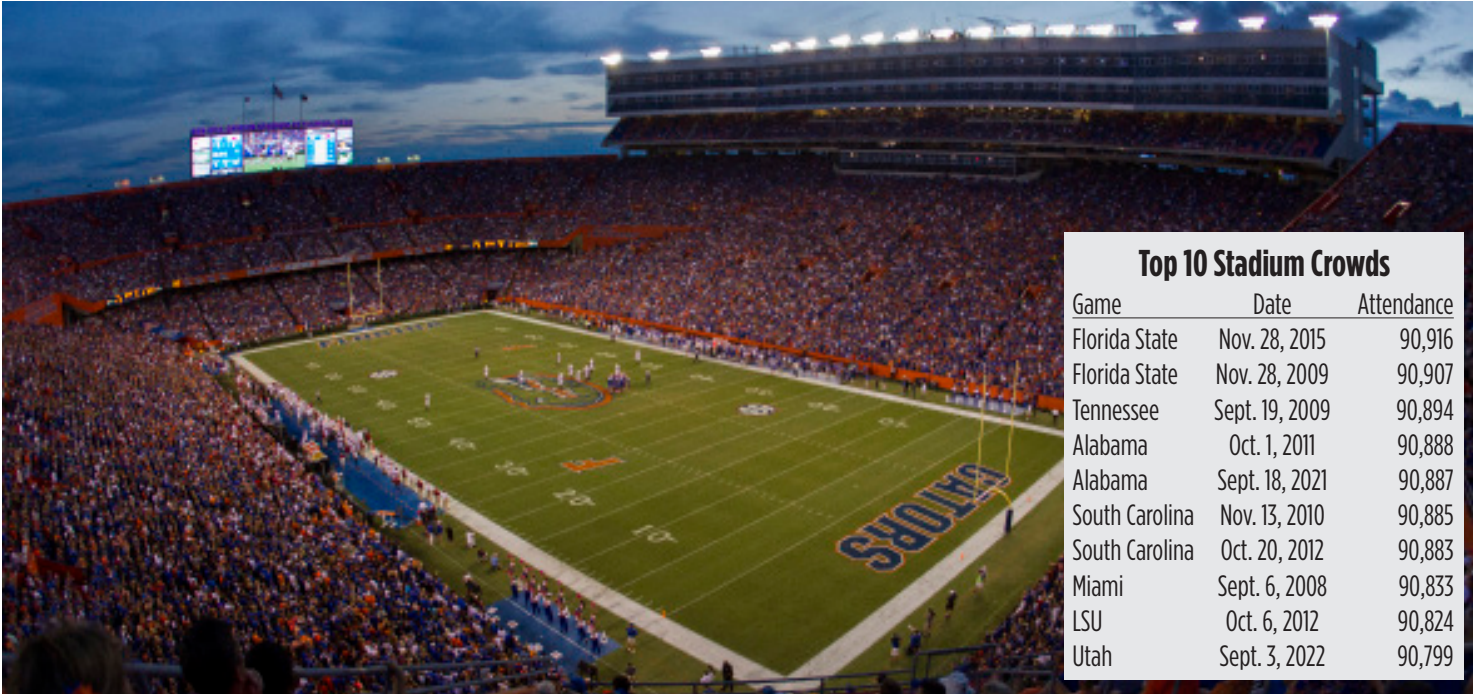

## at BEN HILL GRIFFIN STADIUM

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."
