LAST GAME

Grove City rallied to take a 10-7 lead last Saturday on Homecoming but Waynesburg pulled out a 14-10 win over the Wolverines in Presidents' Athletic Conference action at Robert E. Thorn Field.

Grove City tied the game 7-7 in the third quarter when freshman running back Wesley Schools scored on a 13-yard touchdown run with 9:33 left in the period.

The Wolverines then took a 10-7 lead with 1:49 left in the third quarter on Mitch Causer's career-long 31-yard field goal.

Nick Ponikvar caught six passes for a game-high 90 yards for Grove City. Gabe Greco had a career-best eight receptions for 70 yards.

Grove City held Waynesburg to 11 first downs. The Wolverines owned a 36:25-23:35 edge in time of possession.

Jeff Croll and Jacob Armbrrecht each recorded sacks for the Wolverines while Caleb Allen recovered a fumble.

FAMILY MATTERS

Several members of the 2016 Grove City College football team have ties to other current or former Grove City student-athletes. Junior cornerback Tyler Kepple is the younger brother of former offensive guard Zach Kepple (2011-14).

Senior linebacker Jeff Croll is the son of former Grove City wide receiver/punter Travis Croll (1986-89). Travis Croll earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors as a senior.

Senior tackle Mitch Zajicek is the younger brother of former women's soccer player Madison Zajicek (2012-2015). Their mother, Monica (Yustak) Zajicek, played basketball at Grove City from 1984 to 1987 and is a 2012 Grove City College Athletic Hall of Fame inductee.

Junior center John Morris is the younger brother of former softball player Sarah Morris (2012-15).

Sophomore tight end Rob Kunst is the nephew of former Grove City linebacker Tom Kunst (1981-84) and fullback John Kunst (1985-88).

Senior defensive end Dan Dorman is the nephew of former wide receiver Dan Stoffer (1998-2001).

Freshman center Geoff Matthews is the younger brother of former defensive end George Matthews V, who played from 2008 to 2012. Freshman linebacker Andrew Horton is the younger brother of senior Jonathan Horton, who played linebacker from 2013 to 2015 and is now a student assistant coach.

WOLVERINE DISCIPLINE

Grove City is the least-penalized team in the Presidents' Athletic Conference through four games. The Wolverines average a league-low 3.6 flags and 30.8 penalty yards per game. Grove City ranks fifth in NCAA Division III in both categories.

Being ranked as the least-penalized team in the Presidents' Athletic Conference is nothing new for the Wolverine program, however. Eight times in the last 11 seasons, Grove City has finished the season as the least-penalized team in the conference.

In 2015, Grove City finished as the least-penalized team in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. The Wolverines averaged a league-low 36.6 penalty yards per game while committing only 38 penalties in 10 games. In 2013, Grove City committed just 44 infractions. The Wolverines also had a conference-low 368 penalty yards.

In 2012, Grove City led NCAA Division III in fewest penalty yards at just 34.3 yards per game.

Grove City also finished the 2011 season as the least-penalized team in the conference. The Wolverines committed just 38 penalties for 309 yards.

Grove City finished the 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008 seasons as the conference's least-penalized program.

SPECIAL FORCES

Grove City's special teams units feature several veterans this season. Senior Payton Carlucci is contending with freshmen Mitch Causer and Kelsey Tischler for placekicking duties.

Senior Anthony Marnejon is back for his fourth season as Grove City's punter. Senior quarterback Drew Chorey returns as the holder for place kicks.

Senior Brett Pinson is back as Grove City's punt returner while freshman Wyatt Hetrick is also expected to see time as a punt and kick returner. Freshman Chris Wolfe will snap for punts and place kicks.

ON THE MAP

The 2016 Grove City College football roster features players from 16 different states.

Fifty-three of the 92 players are from Pennsylvania while 17 Wolverines are from Ohio. Five players graduated from New York high schools while Maryland and New Jersey have each produced three Wolverines.

Alabama, Arizona, California, Connecticut, Illinois, Kentucky, New Hampshire, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia and Wisconsin all have one representative on this year's roster. In recent years, Grove City has also had players from Alaska, Delaware, Florida, Illinois, Michigan, North Carolina, Oregon and Vermont.

DOUBLE PLAY

Two Grove City defensive linemen also earned letters as members of the Grove City College men's track and field team last spring.

Junior defensive tackle Quinton Reed won the Presidents' Athletic Conference title in the javelin with a best throw of 172 feet, 2 inches. Reed also placed sixth in the shot put (43-9 3/4).

Junior defensive tackle Connor Lowe placed sixth at the conference championships in the discus, marking at 123-10.

200 CLUB

Last Saturday at Saint Vincent, freshman running back Wesley Schools became the sixth Grove City running back to rush for over 200 yards in a game when he ran for 236 yards against the Bearcats.

Schools joined R.J. Bowers, Clayton Hall, Blaine Miller, Steve Roberts and Doug Steiner as the only Grove City backs to rush for 200 yards or more in one game.

Steiner became the first when he ran for 257 yards against Thiel September 28, 1996.

SCHOOLS IN SESSION

Grove City freshman running back Wesley Schools earned the Presidents' Athletic Conference's Rookie of the Week award for football September 26 after rushing for 236 yards and three touchdowns at Saint Vincent.

300 GAME

Grove City College head athletic trainer Kay Mitchell Emigh worked her 300th consecutive Grove City football game September 24 at Saint Vincent.

Emigh is in her 31st year as Grove City's head athletic trainer. It is her 32nd overall season at Grove City College.

DYNAMITE DEBUTS

Grove City freshman quarterback Brett Laffoon set a program record by completing 34 passes in the Wolverines' September 3 opener against Juniata.

Laffoon's 347 passing yards are the most ever by a Grove City freshman. The 347 yards marks the fourth-highest single-game total in program history.

Freshman wide receiver Nick Ponikvar caught 14 passes for 179 yards, which are the most receptions and yards in a game for a Grove City rookie.

The 14 catches are the second-most in one game for a Wolverine receiver while the 179 yards rank fourth on Grove City's single-game list.

Sophomore linebacker Shawn Simmons made his Grove City debut against Juniata and finished with 15 tackles.

Freshman running back Wesley Schools ran for 104 yards on 22 carries September 10 at Washington & Jefferson in his first start.

Schools became the first Grove City back to rush for 100 yards since November 16, 2013, when Steve Maskrey ran for 117 yards at Thiel in the 30th Mercer County Cup game.

NICK OF TIME

Grove City freshman wide receiver Nick Ponikvar earned the Presidents' Athletic Conference's Rookie of the Week award for Week One after catching 14 passes for 179 yards and a touchdown against Juniata.

CRAFTY CONTO

In Grove City's September 3 game with Juniata, sophomore strong safety Ethan Conto intercepted a pass, forced two fumbles and recorded a sack.

Conto became the first Wolverine defender to have an interception and sack in the same game since November 11, 2006, when Ian Minster recorded that feat at Kings Point.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

The Presidents' Athletic Conference celebrated its 60th anniversary during the 2014-15 academic year. In August 2014, the conference released its 60th Anniversary Team for football.

Five former Grove City standouts earned placement on the 60th Anniversary Team: R.J. Bowers (1997-2000), Doug Hart (1985-88), Aaron Margo (2002-05), Doug Steiner (1994-97) and Mike Stone (1994-97).

R.J. Bowers -- W. Middlesex, Pa./W. Middlesex

Four-time First Team All-PAC (1997-2000); 3-time PAC MVP (1998-2000); Melberger Award (2000); Three-time AP Little All-American; Two-time AFCA All-American; Concluded career as all-time leading rusher in college football history with 7,353 yards; First 7,000-yard rusher in college football history; Finished as NCAA leader in points (562) and TDs (92); Helped Grove City to conference titles in 1997 and 1998; Played in Blue-Gray Game and Hula Bowl; Played for Carolina Panthers, Pittsburgh Steelers and Cleveland Browns in NFL (2001-03); Grove City Athletic Hall of Fame (2012).

Doug Hart -- Kettering, Ohio/Kettering

Three-time First Team All-PAC (1985-87); Second Team All-PAC in 1988; Two-time All-American (1986-87); Pittsburgh Press All-District (1986-87); Owns Grove City records for single-game field goals (4), field goals in a season (12) and career field goals (40); Ranked third in Division III history with 40 career field goals. Inducted into Grove City Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016.

Aaron Margo -- Dover, Ohio/Dover

First Team All-PAC in 2005; First Team AFCA All-American in 2005; Played in 2005 Aztec Bowl; Led Grove City with 96 tackles, 13 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles in 2005; Second on team with 4.5 sacks; Held school record for longest interception return (94 yards); 22 tackles for loss over final two seasons.

Doug Steiner -- Orrville, Ohio/Orrville

Presidents' Athletic Conference MVP in 1997; Two-time First Team All-PAC (1996-97); Earned All-America honors following 1997 season; First 1,000-yard rusher in Grove City history (1,073 yards in 1996); Rushed for 1,490 yards and 29 touchdowns in 1997; Co-captained Grove City's first PAC title team in 1997; 1997-98 Grove City College Sportsman of the Year.

Mike Stone -- Poland, Ohio/Poland

First Team All-PAC in 1997; Second Team in 1996; Named All-America following 1997 season; Anchored offensive line that cleared the way for two 1,000-yard rushers in 1997; Grove City set single-season school record with 4,249 offensive yards in '97, including 3,315 rushing yards. Team won PAC and earned first-ever ECAC bowl berth by going 9-1 overall.
