

## AT A GLANCE

- » **Savannah Tourville** ranks first in WAC games in RBI (11) and second in WAC games in average (.480) and OBP (.545).
- » **Maddie Dowdle** ranks fifth in WAC play with a .440 batting average.
- » **Sierra Smith** ranks ninth all-time in WAC history for career triples (13).
- » **Shea Smith** is second in the WAC in bunt singles this season with eight. **Taylor Kaye** has five bunt singles.
- » **Sierra** and **Shea Smith** are second among all D-I sets of twins in combined hits (92) and are fourth among twins in combined batting average (.364).
- » **Ryan Denhart** has won WAC Pitcher of the Week honors twice this season.
- » The Lopes topped undefeated and reigning national champion #1 Florida State 5-3 on March 6. The Seminoles dropped two games over the course of that week following the loss to GCU.
- » **Sierra Smith** became the first player to hit a home run in a season opener for GCU since **Kelsey Barak** in 2015.
- » **Savannah Tourville** became the first freshman to homer in her GCU debut since **Kelsey Barak** in 2012.
- » **Ryan Denhart** struck out 14 batters against North Dakota to set a new GCU Division I record.
- » The Lopes ended the 2018 season with the No. 12 batting average in the country at .316, led by Sierra Smith's .392 mark.
- » The Lopes won 30 games or more for the third consecutive season in 2018 with 31 wins, and won 20 home games for the second consecutive year.
- » **Sierra Smith** ranked 20th and 24th in the country in hits and triples, respectively, in 2018. The infielder slapped 76 total hits and five triples in her junior season.
- » Head coach **Ann Pierson** is 24 wins away from 500 career wins. The GCU skipper has seven 30-plus win seasons and two 40-plus win seasons.

## LAST TIME OUT

- » Swept the three-game series against CSU Bakersfield capped by a 9-1 one-hitter thrown by **Ryan Denhart**.
- » Allowed just three total runs against the WAC's worst offense.

The Lopes top hitter for the past two seasons has been one of the Smith twins. In 2018 **Sierra Smith** topped the Lopes batting average leaderboard with a .392 average. In 2017, her twin **Shea Smith** led the Lopes in average with a .364 average.

The twins have started every game, each at shortstop and third base. The twins have amassed a total of 374 games in their first three seasons.

## » SECOND YEAR STADIUM. SECOND YEAR ELIGIBLE.

Excitement continues to build on the campus of GCU. After opening the brand new stadium for the first year of postseason eligibility, the Lopes will look to use their second season of eligibility to make noise in the WAC Tournament, which is hosted at home in Phoenix from May 8-11.

### THE STADIUM: GCU SOFTBALL STADIUM

The 1,200-seat GCU Softball Stadium opened Feb. 8, 2018, to surround a playing field that was installed in 2017.

In the second phase of the facility's construction, the temporary bleachers were removed and ground was broken for permanent chair-back seating and bleacher seating, an indoor press box capable of handling television and radio broadcasts, a full concession stand and full-amenity bathrooms.

The first phase of the project consisted of a new FieldTurf playing surface, relocating the field from Stapleton-Pierson Stadium to make room for a larger stadium north of the Lopes Performance Center. The first phase also included construction of spacious dugouts, batting cages and bullpens on the home and visitor sides.

The new stadium features a middle section of individual chairback seats and sections to each side with bench seating that has back supports. The northeast-facing stadium also is protected by fabric shading.

### THE ELIGIBILITY: LOPES COMPLETE FOUR-YEAR TRANSITION

In the first year of eligibility for the postseason, the Lopes made it to the WAC Tournament championship game against host and regular-season champion, New Mexico State. After losing to the Aggies in the second game of the tournament, the Lopes worked their way through the consolation bracket for a rematch with the hosts. The Lopes ended up falling by two runs in the championship, 9-7.

## » VETERAN CORE RETURNS

The Lopes will have a strong returning core of both position players and pitchers as GCU returns three starting pitchers from the 2018 staff and five starting position players, highlighted by three infielders (Sierra Smith, Shea Smith and Loriann Olson).

» 2018 ALL-WAC HONORS

After an 8-6 conference record and a fourth-place finish in the regular season, the Lopes fought their way to the WAC Tournament championship game. GCU earned five players on All-WAC postseason teams and returned three of those players, including second team pitchers Brianna Aguilar and Yessie Morrison.

Morrison had the third-best ERA in WAC games (2.12), while Aguilar had the sixth-best ERA (2.55) as the Lopes led the WAC in team ERA in conference games (2.32).

» BIG SCHOOL TRANSFERS

**Lilly Bishop** transfers from NC State where the catcher started 42 games, 34 behind the dish. The right-handed hitter smoked five home runs and 22 hits in her freshman season for the Wolfpack. Bishop recorded six multi-RBI games and five multi-hit games for NC State.

**Ryan Denhart** transferred from Maryland where the power arm struck out the most opposing hitters as a freshman for the Terps since 2006. The 93 strikeouts in 2018 came in 181 innings. Denhart was an All-American at Los Alamitos HS in Los Alamitos, Calif., and led her high school to the 2017 CIF Championship and won CIF Student-Athlete of the Year.

Ann Pierson enters her 16th season guiding the Grand Canyon softball squad in 2019. Pierson, the only head coach in the program's history, has led Lopes softball to great success on and off the field.

Under Pierson's direction, since joining the Division I ranks, the softball program has enjoyed nothing but success. She has coached 22 players who have earned WAC postseason awards, including 2014 WAC Pitcher of the Year Stephanie Pesqueira.

In 2018, Pierson led the Lopes to the WAC Tournament championship round in Las Cruces, N.M., despite falling to the loser's bracket on day two. GCU was the third seed after finishing 8-6 in regular-season conference play in its first season of full Division I eligibility. Senior Laynee Gomez was named to the Division I Academic All-America second team and became the second player in GCU history to earn the honor.

In 2017, the final year of the Division I transition, the Lopes tied a single-season record with 36 wins and shared the WAC regular-season title. Pierson was named 2017 WAC Coach of the Year for her third conference honor and her second since joining the WAC.

The 2015 and 2016 seasons included winning records with 28 and 35 wins, respectively, and a second-place WAC finish in 2015.

In the first year of the Division I transition, Pierson was named WAC Coach of the Year and led the program to a conference title.

Pierson guided the program to back-to-back Division II postseason appearances in 2012 and 2013. Prior to that, GCU went to the postseason for the first time in 2010, when the Lopes had a school-record 42 wins. The program hit the 40-win mark for the second time in 2013.

Pierson has produced four Division II All-Americans. In 2013, outfielder Kayla Henry was named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association second team and was an All-America honorable mention, as voted by CoSIDA. In 2012, shortstop Kelsey Barak also was an All-America honorable mention. In 2010, Teddy Barry was selected to the All-America first team while Randi Johns made the 2006 NCAA Independent All-America team.

While Pierson's program's on-field efforts have been exemplary, the off-the-field performance is equally or more impressive.

Four times under the veteran coach's tenure, the Lopes were at the top of the NFCA Division II Top 10 All-Academic rankings. GCU took the top spot in 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2012. The program boasts 49 players who earned NFCA All-America Scholar honors. The 2012 team registered a 3.60 team grade point average.

In 2013, Barak (second team) and Claire Zampini (third team) became the program's first CoSIDA Academic All-America Team choices. In 2014, Barak became the program's first Division I CoSIDA Academic All-America selection, after the shortstop was placed on the second team for the second year in a row.

Pierson has an all-time record of 454-351-3. She picked up her 400th win milestone in 2017 as part of a WAC co-championship season. She

notched her 300th career win in 2014 with a victory over Southern Utah in the GCU Invitational. She picked up win No. 200 in 2011, two years after the program received its first national ranking. In 2008 she reached the 100-win milestone.

Prior to coming to GCU, Pierson was the lead assistant coach at Arizona State for seven seasons. There, she was responsible for managing the recruitment process, initial eligibility and assisting with on-field coaching.

Pierson, formerly Ann Rowan, was a standout shortstop at ASU from 1988 to 1991. An outstanding hitter for the Sun Devils, Pierson's softball achievements earned her several long-standing marks in ASU's record book, including the third-most hits in a single season with 86. A second-team All-American and first-team all-region pick in 1990, Pierson is seventh in ASU history in hits (245), tied for third in triples (11), tied for 10th in stolen bases (37) and tied for 19th in doubles (24). She earned All-Pac-10 Conference honors in 1990 and 1991. In September 2006, Pierson was inducted into the Arizona State Hall of Fame for her accomplishments as a player.

In addition to her collegiate achievements, Pierson was a member of three gold medal-winning national teams. She was one of 18 players chosen from a pool of 95 players who tried out for the USA Softball National Team. Pierson earned her first gold medal as a member of the 1991 Pan American Games. Her second gold medal came as a member of the 1993 USA National Team, which won the Intercontinental Cup in Holland. Pierson's third gold-medal performance came at the 1995 Pan American Games, where she batted .500 and did not make an error. A four-time Olympic Festival selection and three-time ASA All-American, Pierson also played for the 1998 national champion California Commotion team.

Pierson is a native of Tempe, Ariz., who graduated from McClintock High School before earning a Bachelor of Science degree in therapeutic recreation from ASU. She also received her master's degree in educational psychology from Northern Arizona in 2006. Pierson and her husband, John, reside in Chandler, Ariz., and have a daughter, Jordan.

Pierson was inducted into the Arizona Softball Hall of Fame in August 2018.



The 1,200-seat GCU Softball Stadium opened Feb. 8, 2018, to surround a playing field that was installed in 2017.

In the second phase of the facility's construction, the temporary bleachers were removed and ground was broken for permanent chair-back seating and bleacher seating, an indoor press box capable of handling television and radio broadcasts, a full concession stand and full-amenity bathrooms.

The first phase of the project consisted of a new FieldTurf playing surface, relocating the field from Stapleton-Pierson Stadium to make room for a larger stadium north of the Lopes Performance Center. The first phase also included construction of spacious dugouts, batting cages and bullpens on the home and visitor sides.

The new stadium features a middle section of individual chairback seats and sections to each side with bench seating that has back supports. The northeast-facing stadium also is protected by fabric shading.
