The complex hosted the men's NCAA Championships a total of 24 times, the women's Championships three times and both genders five times, most recently in 2017.

The facility was officially named the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in 1993 after Bulldog great Dan Magill, who led Georgia for 34 years as head coach. Five of the Bulldogs' six National Championships in men's tennis NCAA titles were won on their home courts at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex.

UGA hosted the 2007 NCAA Championship in Athens, Ga. The Bulldogs would go on to take the title, the third under Diaz.

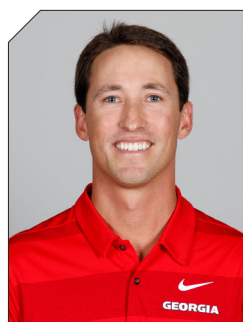

TOP HEADLINES OF 2019-20 SEASON

GEORGIA KNOCKS OFF TWO TOP-10 TEAMS IN THREE DAYS

Following a 4-2 victory over No. 10-ranked Tennessee on Feb. 29, the Bulldogs returned to the Dan Magill Tennis Complex two days later where they took down No. 3 Ohio State (4-0) on March 1.

In doubles against OSU, the No. 36-ranked tandem of sophomore Trent Bryde and freshman Tyler Zink took down Ohio State's No. 3 pair of John McNally and Robert Cash decisively, winning 6-1 to earn the first doubles win. The Georgia pair earned its highest-ranked doubles win to date and moved to 7-1 in duals play.

Shortly afterwards, the No. 22-ranked duo of sophomores Philip Henning and Blake Croyder earned the clinching point for the third time in four matches this week by downing OSU's James Trotter/Justin Boulais 6-3.

In singles, the Bulldogs extended five of the six matches to third sets. Croyder, ranked No. 95 nationally, notched the first singles win of the afternoon over No. 70 James Trotter by a 6-2, 3-6, 6-2 final. Croyder extended his streak to 15 wins in dual matches dating back to last season.

Fellow sophomore Trent Bryde, ranked No. 22 in the country, followed up with a 6-0, 3-6, 6-3 victory over No. 12 Cannon Kingsley and earned his fifth-straight win, which includes ranked victories over the No. 2 (Ito/Texas), No. 12 (Kingsley/OSU) and No. 23 (Walton/Tenn) individuals.

It was Henning who stole the show as the Bulldogs faced the brink of defeat. Down 5-1 in the first set, the South African native won 7-6 (6) in the first set and served out the winning point for a 7-6, 6-4 victory over No. 7 John McNally.

BULLDOGS CLIMB IN ITA RANKINGS

Georgia jumped 25 spots up to No. 10 nationally in this week's edition of the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Rankings.

Sophomore Philip Henning, who clinched the Bulldogs' 4-0 win against No. 3 Ohio State, stands at No. 11 in singles, while fellow sophomore Trent Bryde follows close behind at No. 12. Freshman Tyler Zink is ranked 80th and sophomore Blake Croyder is at No. 88.

In doubles, Bryde and Zink, who have bolted out to a 7-1 start at the top court, are now ranked 15th. Croyder and Henning have won five-straight matches and are now ranked 26th nationally.

As a team, Georgia stands behind USC, North Carolina, Texas, Michigan, Ohio State, Florida, NC State, TCU and Columbia. The Bulldogs made their big jump this week after knocking off No. 3 Ohio State and No. 10 Tennessee over the span of three days.

GEORGIA SWEEPS SEC WEEKLY HONORS

Freshman Tyler Zink and sophomore Philip Henning of the Georgia men's tennis team swept this week's Southeastern Conference (SEC) weekly honors. Zink was named SEC Freshman of the Week, while Henning was dubbed SEC Player of the Week.

ZINK NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Freshman Tyler Zink was recently named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 5.

The Bradenton, Fla., native has played in both the No. 2 and No. 3 singles spots, where he has tallied a 3-2 record. At No. 1 doubles, he and Trent Bryde boast a 4-1 record for the dual-match season, including two wins over nationally-ranked opponents.

YOUNG BULLDOGS START STRONG IN MIAMI

Georgia's 2020 season got off to a strong start earlier this year. The Bulldogs joined defending national champion Texas as well as Miami and Wisconsin at the Miami Spring Invite on Jan. 10-12. Georgia student-athletes totaled 21 total singles and doubles victories, including wins against some of the nation's top players. Perhaps most notably was Trent Bryde's 7-6 (10), 3-6, 6-4, triumph against No. 13-ranked Christian Sigsgaard from Texas. That win was one of three at the top four spots against the nation's No. 1 ranked team.

ZINK CAPTURES US OPEN JUNIORS DOUBLES TITLE

Bulldog freshman Tyler Zink became the first Georgia player in 13 years to win the US Open Junior doubles title this past fall. He is the first Bulldog since current associate head coach Jamie Hunt teamed with Nate Schnugg to claim the championship in 2006.

Zink and Trent Bryde are currently on a four-match win streak and boast a perfect 4-0 record for the dual-match season, including two wins against ranked opponents.

2018-19 HIGHLIGHTS & STANDINGS

TRIO OF BULLDOGS FEATURED ON ALL-SEC TEAMS

Seniors Emil Reinberg and Jan Zielinski along with sophomore Philip Henning were recognized by league coaches in the annual All-Southeastern Conference postseason awards.

Reinberg and Zielinski earned first-team All-SEC honors, while Henning placed on the conference's All-Freshman Team.

It marked Zielinski's third-consecutive All-SEC accolades in each of the past three seasons. It was the second time in four years Reinberg made the All-SEC squad.

Henning made an immediate impact during his rookie campaign. The South Africa native was a two-time SEC Freshman of the Week and went a perfect 4-0 against players ranked in the ITA national rankings at the time All-SEC awards were announced.

ZIELINSKI MAKES HISTORY

Zielinski finished his final season as a Georgia Bulldog as a top-10 record-holder in four categories.

The Warsaw, Poland, native already ranked fourth in singles wins in a single season with 38. He trails Bulldog great John Isner's 39 at the No. 3 spot.

During the 2018-19 season, Zielinski earned the No. 5 spot in two categories - career singles wins and career combined wins - with records of 124-53 and 227-107, respectively.

Zielinski is ranked ninth in career doubles wins with a 103-54 record.

JAMIE HUNT NAMED ITA SOUTHEAST ASSISTANT OF THE YEAR

Jamie Hunt was named the ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

In addition to Hunt's honor, Bulldog seniors Walker Duncan and Jan Zielinski were also recognized by the ITA. Duncan earned the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe

Jr. Award for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship, while Zielinski was tabbed the Southeast Region's Senior Player of the Year and Most Improved Senior.

GEORGIA MEN MAKE 36TH-STRAIGHT, 41ST OVERALL NCAA APPEARANCE

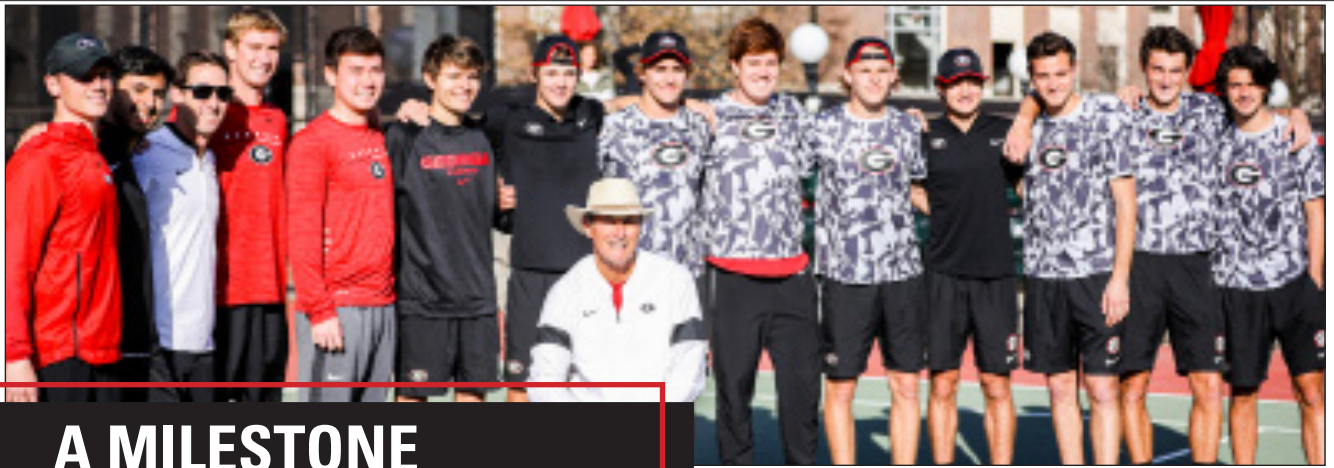
The Bulldogs earned their 36th-straight birth to the NCAA Tournament during the 2018-19 season, marking the team's 41st appearance overall. Georgia saw improvement last season, advancing to the second round of the tournament after falling in the first round during the 2017-18 campaign.

Georgia's men have won six NCAA National Championships (1985, 1987, 1999, 2001, 2007 and 2008), while a Bulldog has won the NCAA Singles Championship four times (Mikael Pernfors in 1984 and 1985; Matias Boeker in 2001 and 2002). The Bulldogs have claimed the doubles title on three occasions - Ola Malmqvist and Allen Miller in 1983, Boeker and Travis Parrott, and John Isner and Antonio Ruiz in 2005.

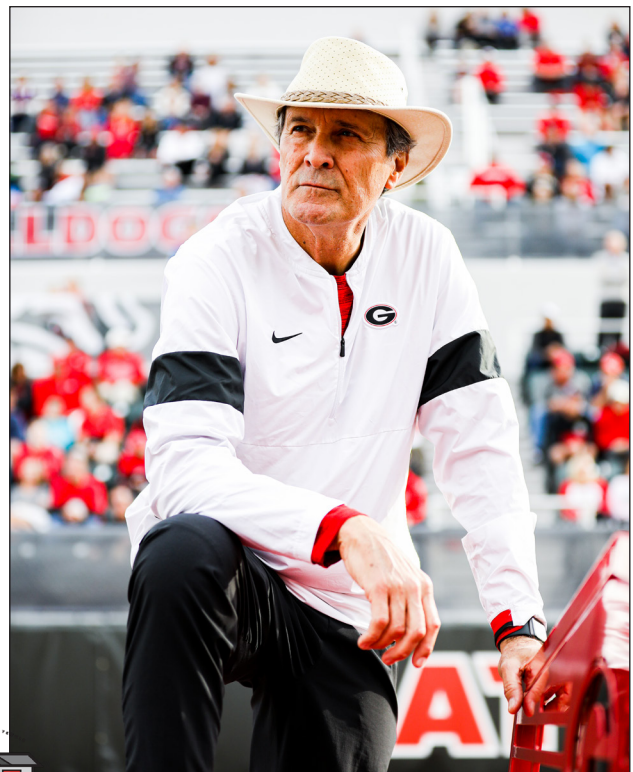


A MILESTONE MOMENT FOR DIAZ

Singles wins from a trio of sophomores lifted the University of Georgia men's tennis team to a 4-0 victory against No. 3 Ohio State Sunday, March 1, at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex to extend the Dogs' record at home to 4-0. For head coach Manuel Diaz, the victory also marked win No. 707 - the SEC-leading win record. Diaz's career at the helm began during the 1988-89 campaign. He is currently in his 32nd season.

The Bulldog head man owns a 709-172 record — an 80-percent win percentage and average of 23 wins per year. He tops only that of legendary head coach Dan Magill, who totaled a SEC-record 706 career victories.

"707 for me is about the many people I owe a great deal to," Diaz said. "There are a lot of players who earned their stripes here at the University of Georgia and played hard for me, Coach Magill and this program. That is something I went through and take a great deal of pride in."

From 1953-1989 the SEC Champion was determined by the accumulation of points in an individual flighted tournament (there was not a separate team tournament champion). In 1990, a team dual match format was instituted for the conference tournament which provided a SEC Tournament Champion. From 1990-98, the SEC Champion was determined by a total aggregate points accumulated at the conclusion of the conference tournament: one full point is awarded for each regular-season conference win, one-half point for wins in the first two rounds of the conference tournament, one-half point for receiving a first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in the conference tournament semifinals and finals. For the 1999 season, the same points system was in place with a couple of changes: one full point for first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in any round of the conference tournament. In 2000, the SEC changed the determination of its tennis regular season champion to the team with the best winning percentage in conference regular-season dual matches (11 matches).

Dan Magill (1921-2014), considered by many 'the greatest Bulldog of all-time,' served as the University of Georgia men's tennis head coach for 34 years, but his time at UGA began long before he held that title.

Magill began his 59-year involvement with UGA athletics as a baseball batboy in the 1930's before going on to become Director of Men's and Women's Tennis, Assistant Athletic Director for Public Relations and the Georgia Bulldog Clubs, and his 27-year tenure as sports information director. In 1976, Magill earned admission into the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame.

"No man ever gave more of himself to his university than Daniel Hamilton Magill, Jr.," Loran Smith said. "[He was] a damn good Dawg and a UGA icon who began and concluded every day of his life with Georgia on his mind."

He became head coach of the Georgia men's tennis program in 1954 and, over the next 34 years, led the program to a 706-183 record, the most wins by any coach in NCAA history. Magill coached his teams to 13 SEC outdoor championships, eight SEC indoor championships and two national championships.

The tennis facility at UGA is named in his honor.
