### A QUICK GLANCE AT THE LADY BULLDOGS

- » 2021 SEC Coach of the Year Joni Taylor welcomes back three starters and 10 letterwinners off last year's team that advanced to the SEC tournament finals and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA tournament
- » Georgia's top two scorers -- Jenna Staiti and Que Morrison -- opted to return for one more season. The combo combined to average 26.4 ppg last year.
- » SEC All-Freshman Team selection Sarah Ashlee Barker is also back for the Lady Bulldogs. The former Alabama Miss Basketball made key plays in nearly all of Georgia's big wins last season.
- » Georgia adds a pair of McDonald's All-Americans with incoming freshmen Reigan Richardson and Jillian Hollingshead to go along with highly-touted freshmen Kimora Jenkins and Alina Sendar.
- » Statistically, the Lady Bulldogs will bring back 83 percent of their scoring and 77 percent of their rebounding.
- » Consistentcy has been key for Georgia under Taylor. For the sixth-straight year, the Lady Bulldogs' coaching staff will look the same with Karen Lange, Chelsea Newton and Robert Mosley back for another season.
