



QUARTERBACKS

Senior **Carson Beck** returns to lead Georgia after posting a 13-1 record in his first year as the Bulldogs' starting quarterback in 2023. He was a Manning Award finalist after finishing 5-1 versus top-20 opponents with a 73.9 Completion Percentage (125-169) for 1,693 yards, 13 touchdowns and only two interceptions in those contests. **Gunner Stockton** returns for his third season at Georgia after playing in four games last season and completing 63 percent of his passes for 148 yards and two scores. Early enrollee **Ryan Puglisi** arrived in January and had the spring to become familiar with the Bulldog offense after shredding defenses for more than 3,500 yards and 30 touchdowns during his last two seasons at Avon Old Farms HS (Mass.). Highly touted redshirt freshman transfer **Jaden Rashada** landed in Athens to start the summer after a year at Arizona State and will provide additional depth.

RUNNING BACKS

The Bulldogs' top two leading rushers from last year's Orange Bowl champion squad – Kendall Milton and Daijun Edwards - are now suiting up with NFL teams. With those departures, two returning running backs will have their opportunity for carries in **Roderick Robinson II** (24 carries, 196 yards, two touchdowns) and **Branson Robinson**, who tore his ACL during the 2023 preseason. In 2022, Robinson carried the ball 68 times for 330 yards and three scores in his true freshman season, including two in the CFP National Championship Game against TCU. Georgia will get an additional boost in the backfield with the addition of Florida transfer **Trevor Etienne**. The Jennings, Louisiana native, who is a rising junior, rushed 249 times for 1,472 yards and 14 touchdowns in his two seasons with the Gators while also catching 30 passes for 238 yards and one touchdown and returning 28 kicks for 671 yards. Early enrollee **Chauncey Bowens** (Port St. Lucie, Fla.) brought his more than 3,000 yards rushing and 33 scores from his prep career to Athens in January and a talented duo of **Nate Frazier** (Compton, Calif.) and **Dwight Phillips, Jr.** (Mableton, Ga.) will help give the Bulldogs a backfield with options. In addition, fourth-year junior walk-on **Cash Jones** had 22 carries for 161 yards and a touchdown in 2023 and returns. Also of note, Georgia welcomes Limestone University transfer **Gannon Hearst**, who is the son of former Bulldog All-American and Doak Walker Award winner Garrison Hearst.

TIGHT ENDS

The Bulldogs have only had a trio of three-time All-Americans in school history and one of those, two-time Mackey Award winner Brock Bowers, was selected 13th overall by the Las Vegas Raiders in the 2024 NFL Draft. **Oscar Delp** (24-284-3) begins his third year in **Todd Hart-**

ley's tight ends room and will be asked to step up with Bowers' departure. Sophomore **Lawson Luckie**, who played in half of Georgia's 14 games last season while dealing with an ankle injury, will also be in the early rotation. While both true freshmen **Jaden Reddell** and **Colton Heinrich** got an early start on the offense with their early enrollee arrival, **Ben Yurosek** joined the program in the summer after four years at Stanford. Yurosek's top season with the Cardinal was as a sophomore as he hauled in 43 catches for 658 yards and three touchdowns.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Similar to the running back position, opportunities abound for the Bulldog receivers in 2024. While Bowers, Marcus Rosemy-Jacksaint and Ladd McConkey are all transitioning to the NFL, three other receivers in Georgia's top six will be in focus. **Dominic Lovett**, who had 54 catches for 613 yards and four touchdowns in his first season with UGA last year, joins fellow **Rara Thomas** and the versatile **Dillon Bell** in the corps this fall. Thomas registered nearly 400 yards receiving in 2023 while Bell went 29-355-2 in receiving, posted 25-164-2 in rushing and threw for a touchdown during Georgia's run to the SEC Eastern Division title. Deep threat **Arian Smith**, who averaged more than 19 yards a catch, is also returning and will complement transfers **London Humphreys** (Vanderbilt), **Michael Jackson III** (USC) and **Colbie Young** (Miami). The speedy **Anthony Evans III**, who finished his freshman year with four punt returns for 55 yards, will be in the mix as well. In addition, **Nitro Tuggle** (Goshen, Ind.) and **Sacovie White** (Cartersville, Ga.) started classes at Georgia in January and are aiming to earn snaps for the fall.

OFFENSIVE LINEMEN

The 2023 unit was named a Joe Moore Award finalist for the third consecutive year after the Bulldogs averaged 40.1 points per game and 496 total yards per contest. Four of the five starters from last year's squad, including **Earnest Greene III**, **Dylan Fairchild**, **Tate Ratledge** and **Xavier Truss**, return for the 2024 season. One spot that will need to be filled is for All-American center Sedrick Van Pran, who started 44 consecutive games during a stretch that saw the Bulldogs post a 42-2 record since 2021. **Jared Wilson** will be vying for the spot in the middle of the line along with **Drew Bobo**. Georgia welcomed a massive group of linemen as early enrollees including **Michael Uini**, **Daniel Calhoun**, **Marques Easley**, **Malachi Toliver** and **Nyier Daniels** and then **Marcus Harrison** arriving in June. This group will compete with **Micah Morris** and **Monroe Freeling**, among others, for a spot in the rotation.

DEFENSIVE LINEMEN

Georgia has dedicated roster spots and concentrated on building its offensive and defensive lines into the backbone of some of the school's most successful seasons in history. This year is no different. **Nazir Stackhouse**, who has started 29 straight games, and **Mykel Williams** are two key components up front. Stackhouse finished last season with 24 stops and three tackles for loss, including a pair of sacks, and collected a pivotal interception to help the Bulldogs clinch the Missouri game. Williams was among the team leaders with 6.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks to go with a forced fumble and a recovered fumble in 2023. Another veteran, **Warren Brinson**, is expected to team with **Christen Miller**, **Jamaal Jarrett**, **Jordan Hall** and **Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins** to keep Georgia's tradition of having a respected defensive front in the coming season. In addition, South Carolina transfer **Xzavier McLeod** and early enrollees **Joseph Jonah-Ajonye** (Shenandoah, Texas), **Nnamdi Ogboko** (Durham, N.C.) and **Jordan Thomas** (Hackensack, N.J.) will add immediate depth to the unit. The June arrivals on the defensive line included **Nasir Johnson** and **Justin Greene** as the Bulldogs bulked their first line of defense.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

Chaz Chambliss started all 14 games for a Bulldog defense that kept opponents to just 15 points a game while converting on third downs only 25 percent of the time. One of Georgia's most versatile on defense is third-year linebacker **Jalon Walker**, who will also play on the inside. Walker had a team-leading five sacks in his 20 tackles last year and forced a fumble last season. A talented group of rising sophomores has shown glimpses of what Georgia's next group at the position will look like with **Sam M'Pemba**, **Gabe Harris, Jr.** and **Damon Wilson II**. Harris, Jr. led the group with three tackles for loss in 2023. **Quintavius Johnson** (Atlanta, Ga.) arrived in Athens in January and will be battling for playing time as well.

INSIDE LINEBACKERS

The Bulldogs received welcoming news for their defense when **Smael Mondon, Jr.**, who has 24 starts over the last two years, committed to return for next season. Despite battling injuries during his third season, Mondon, Jr. is the top returning tackler (No. 2 overall in 2023) with 68 stops, including five tackles for loss and three sacks. A freshman duo shined last season and are predicted to be two of Georgia's leaders on defense this season along with the aforementioned Jalon Walker. **CJ Allen** played in all 14 contests, starting the last five, and finished with 41 stops. **Troy Bowles** and **Terrell Foster** continued to become more seasoned

for the Bulldog as well at the position. Three early enrollees, **Chris Cole** (Salem, Va.), **Kris Jones** (Stafford, Va.) and **Justin Williams** (Conroe, Texas), are expected to battle for early playing time for the Bulldogs.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

Georgia has become a pipeline for the NFL with its standout members of the secondary. This year's NFL Draft was no different as Kamari Lassiter (42nd to the Houston Texans), Javon Bullard (58th to the Green Bay Packers) and Tykee Smith (89th to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers) all landed jobs in the League. The Bulldogs' current crop at the position is just as impressive with All-American **Malaki Starks** headlining the group. Starks has started Georgia's last 28 games and concluded 2023 with 52 tackles and three interceptions. **Daylen Everette** joined Starks as a 14-game starter last season and had 29 tackles, including three tackles for loss, and one pick as a sophomore. Georgia also retained a mixture of seasoned talent and rising standouts in **Joanel Aguero**, **Julian Humphrey**, **Dan Jackson**, **JaCorey Thomas**, **Chris Peal**, **Kyron Jones**, **Justyn Rhett**, **Daniel Harris** and Oregon transfer **Collin Gill** in the backfield. One of the nation's top signing classes in the secondary also included **KJ Bolden** (Buford, Ga.), **Ondre Evans** (Franklin, Tenn.), **Demello Jones** (Swainsboro, Ga.), Alabama transfer **Jake Pope** (Buford, Ga.) and **Ellis Robinson IV** (New Haven, Conn.) in its early enrollee class.

SPECIALISTS

The Bulldogs, like most programs, count on their punters to flip the field and on their kickers to bolster scoring with field goals when the unit comes up short of a touchdown. Georgia has reliable answers at both positions. Third-year Australian punter **Brett Thorson** averaged 43 yards on his 32 punts last year, helping to force 21 fair catches and ripping six that traveled 50 or more yards. Lou Groza Award semifinalist **Peyton Woodring** returns for his second season as the Bulldogs kicker. Woodring scored a team-high 134 points, going 21-for-25 on field goals and 71-for-71 on PATs. He ranked sixth nationally in Scoring and third among kickers, and his 134 points ranks third best in school history for a kicker (most for a Bulldog freshman kicker). Georgia is aiming to replace snapper William Mote who started 54 consecutive games since the 2020 season. The candidates at snapper include **Beau Gardner**, a UCLA transfer, **Will Snellings** and **Jonathan Washburn**. **Anthony Evans III** returns after his four punt returns yielded a 13.6 average and **Dillon Bell** is the top returner in the kickoff returns department with six for 160 (26.7 avg.). As usual, **Kirby Smart** is aiming to discover a new batch of talent on special teams as camp concludes and the season gets underway.

Challenging Slate Awaits Dawgs

Georgia will open its 2024 season against Clemson in the Aflac Kickoff Game in Mercedes-Benz Stadium. This will mark the Bulldogs' fourth appearance in the Kickoff Game after third-ranked Georgia dismantled 11th-ranked Oregon, 49-3, in 2022 in its latest appearance. Following the Bulldogs' home opener versus Tennessee Tech, Georgia opens Southeastern Conference play at Kentucky before having its first of two off weeks on Sept. 21. On Sept. 28, the Bulldogs return to action and face Alabama in Tuscaloosa for the first time in the regular season since 2020. The Bulldogs play host to another pair of SEC foes in Auburn and Mississippi State before making their first trip to Austin in nearly 70 years to play Texas. The Longhorns joined Oklahoma as the SEC's newest members on July 1. Georgia will have its second bye of the season (Oct. 26) before it faces Florida in Jacksonville. The Bulldogs last faced Ole Miss in Oxford during Kirby Smart's first season in 2016 and return to Mississippi on Nov. 9. Georgia concludes its campaign with a trio of games in Sanford Stadium, including a Nov. 16 SEC showdown with Tennessee and the annual matchup with in-state rival Georgia Tech.

2024 Bulldog Storylines

Experienced Signal Caller Returns

Senior **Carson Beck** returns to lead Georgia after posting a 13-1 record in his first year as the Bulldogs' starting QB in 2023. He was a *Manning Award* finalist after finishing 5-1 versus top-20 opponents with a 73.9 Completion Percentage (125-169) for 1,693 yards, 13 touchdowns and only two interceptions in those contests.

Beck's return is bolstered by the fact that four of five starters on the line return in LT **Earnest Greene III**, LG **Dylan Fairchild**, RG **Tate Ratledge** and RT **Xavier Truss**. *Joe Moore Award* finalists the last three years, the unit enabled Georgia to score 40.1 points per game while setting a school record with 7.26 Yards Per Play in 2023.

Kendall Milton and Daijun Edwards accounted for more than 1,700 yards rushing and 17 touchdowns out of the backfield last year and both departed for the NFL. Candidates to replace that duo will be Florida transfer **Trevor Etienne**, **Roderick Robinson II** and **Branson Robinson**, who was sidelined in 2023 while recovering from an ACL, among freshmen arrivals **Chauncey Bowens**, **Nate Frazier** and **Dwight Phillips Jr.** Etienne will be vying for a spot in the rotation after rushing for 249 times for 1,472 yards and 14 touchdowns in his two seasons with the Gators while also catching 30 passes for 238 yards and one touchdown and returning 28 kicks for 671 yards.

Bulldogs Target Replacements For Talented Receiving Trio

Georgia captured the 2021 and 2022 national championships and went 13-1 last season thanks in large part to three pivotal pass catchers. Two-time Mackey Award winner and three-time First Team All-American Brock Bowers, All-SEC receiver Ladd McConkey and Marcus Rosemy-Jacksaint, who finished with more than 1,000 yards receiving in his career, have all departed and are training with NFL teams.

While that trio made up three of the top four receiving leaders from 2023, the Bulldogs still welcome back a dangerous corps as receiver. **Dominic Lovett** had 54 catches for 613 yards and four touchdowns in his first year at Georgia while the versatile **Dillon Bell** hauled in 29 catches for 355 yards and two scores, ran 25 times for 157 yards and two touchdowns and even passed for a touchdown. **London Humphreys** (Vanderbilt), **Michael Jackson III** (USC) and **Colbie Young** (Miami) transferred to UGA in January and are expected to contribute as well. In addition to a pair of freshmen receivers, **Anthony Evans III**, **Arian Smith** and **Rara Thomas** are potential downfield threats for the Bulldogs.

New Faces On Coaching Staff

The Bulldogs have a host of new coaches on staff following Georgia's third straight season with at least 13 wins. **James Coley** (wide receivers), who returns for his second stint during the **Kirby Smart** era, **Josh Crawford** (run game coordinator/running backs), **Travaris Johnson** (co-defensive coordinator, safeties) and **Donte Williams** (defensive backs) are fresh additions while **Kirk Benedict** has been promoted from special teams quality control to special teams coordinator. In addition, **Will Muschamp** has transitioned into an off-field analyst for the Bulldogs.

Special Specialists

Georgia welcomes back a two-year starter in P **Brett Thorson** and sophomore PK **Peyton Woodring** after both shined in 2023. Thorson had a 43.8 average on 32 punts in 2023 including 21 that resulted in fair catches. Thanks in part to Thorson's punts and to the entire punt coverage team, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023. Woodring was a *Lou Groza Award* semifinalist after scoring a team-high 134 points, going 21-for-25 on field goals and 71-for-71 on PATs in his first year last season. He ranked sixth nationally in Scoring and third among kickers and his 134 points ranks third best in school history for a kicker and most for a Bulldog freshman kicker.

Drew Miller joined the team on campus in June and arrives as the nation's top-ranked prep punter. At kicker, graduate transfer **Charlie Ham**, a native of Atlanta, Ga., is back in Georgia after a successful undergraduate career at Duke.

Defense Aims To Remain Elite

Seven of 11 starters return from Georgia's defense that helped blitzed No. 5 Florida State 63-3 in the Orange Bowl return in 2024, including second-leading tackler **Smael Mondon** who had 68 stops in 2023. The Bulldogs will need to replace three starters from the secondary as Javon Bullard, Kamari Lassiter and Tykee Smith are preparing for their respective NFL team camps. Still anchoring the defensive backfield are All-American safety **Malaki Starks** and **Daylen Everette**, who each started all 14 games last year. Linemen **Zion Logue** and **Tramel Walthour** are also preparing for a fall season in the League so **Mykel Williams**, **Nazir Stackhouse** and **Warren Brinson** will be leaned on to lead. With Mondon, the versatile **Jalon Walker**, **CJ Allen**, **Raylen Wilson** and **Chaz Chambliss** back, the Bulldogs have the most familiar faces returning in the middle.

- * Beck was 5-1 versus top-20 opponents last season with a 73.9 Completion Percentage (125-169) for 1,693 yards, 13 TDs, 2 INTs.
- * He set a school record for Completion Percentage at 72.4, which ranked 5th nationally.
- * Beck's 302 completions ranked second in UGA single season history, trailing only Stetson Bennett, who had 310 in 2022 when the Bulldogs went 15-0 and won the national championship.

Seasoned Offensive Line Returns

- * Despite those absences, the Bulldogs return four starters on the line in **Earnest Greene III, Dylan Fairchild, Tate Ratledge** and **Xavier Truss**, along with veterans **Micah Morris** and **Jared Wilson**.
- * The unit was a *Joe Moore Award* finalist for the third season in a row in 2023.
- * Georgia set a school record averaging 7.26 Yards Per Play and 496.5 Yards Per Game ranked second all-time.
- * Exploded for a school and Orange Bowl record 637 yards of total offense during the 63-3 dismantling of No. 5 FSU to end last year.

Opportunities Abound For Running Backs

- * With Daijun Edwards, who led the 2023 rushing attack with 880 yards (5.3 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, and Kendall Milton, who had 790 yards (6.5 avg) and 14 scores last season, in NFL training camps, there will be no shortage of opportunities in the backfield.
- * Candidates to replace that duo will be Florida transfer **Trevor Etienne, Roderick Robinson II** and **Branson Robinson**, who was sidelined in 2023 while recovering from an ACL.
- * Robinson had 24 carries for 196 yards (8.2 avg.) and two scores in just five games to be the third-leading rusher last season.
- * Etienne will be vying for a spot in the rotation after rushing for 249 times for 1,472 yards and 14 touchdowns in his two seasons with the Gators while also catching 30 passes for 238 yards and one touchdown and returning 28 kicks for 671 yards.
- * Freshmen arrivals **Chauncey Bowens, Nate Frazier** and **Dwight Phillips Jr.** will also have a chance for playing time.

Options Abound At Wideout

- * Georgia featured an array of experienced pass catchers last season as 22 different Bulldogs had a reception.
- * Three out of four of the top receivers from 2023 are all preparing for their first NFL season. That group was led by TE Brock Bowers, who was selected by the Las Vegas Raiders at No. 13 overall and Ladd McConkey, who was a second round pick by the Los Angeles Chargers.
- * The Bulldogs still welcome back a dangerous corps at receiver. **Dominic Lovett** had 54 catches for 613 yards and four touchdowns in his first year at Georgia while the versatile **Dillon Bell** hauled in 29 catches for 355 yards and two scores, ran 25 times for 157 yards and two touchdowns and even passed for a touchdown.
- * **London Humphreys** (Vanderbilt), **Michael Jackson III** (USC) and **Colbie Young** (Miami) transferred to UGA in January and are expected to contribute as well.
- * In addition to a pair of freshmen receivers, **Anthony Evans III, Arian Smith** and **Rara Thomas** are downfield threats for the Bulldogs for the coming fall.
- * With Bowers' absence, junior TE **Oscar Delp** is expected to build on his 24 catches for 284 yards and three touchdowns registered in 2023.

Defense Aims To Remain Elite

- * Georgia has had 42 players drafted over the past four seasons, including 23 on defense and eight of those defenders have gone in the first round.
- * Ranked fifth nationally last year in Scoring Defense, allowing just 15.6 ppg.
- * Allowed only 93 points in the second half in 2023 for a 6.6 average and allowed a touchdown or less in the second half in eight of 14 contests.
- * Allowed just 15.2 ppg in going 5-1 versus ranked opponents.
- * Seven of 11 starters return from Georgia's defense that helped blitzed No. 5 FSU 63-3 return in 2024, including second-leading tackler **Smael Mondon, Jr.** who had 68 stops. He finished with a team-leading 76 tackles in 2022.
- * The Bulldogs will need to replace three starters from the secondary as Javon Bullard, Kamari Lassiter and Tykee Smith are preparing for their respective NFL seasons. This trio all ranked in the top six tacklers last season, tallying a combined 163 stops, six interceptions and 13 tackles for loss.
- * Still anchoring the defensive backfield are All-American safety **Malaki Starks** and **Daylen Everett**, who each started all 14 games last year. Starks completed his second season with 52 tackles and three interceptions. He was a *Bronko Nagurski Trophy* and *Jim Thorpe Award* finalist and a *Chuck Bednarik Award* semifinalist.
- * **Mykel Williams, Nazir Stackhouse** and **Warren Brinson** will be leaned on in the middle. Williams finished with a team-high 4.5 sacks in 10 starts in 2023.
- * Stackhouse collected his first career interception against No. 12 Missouri in the fourth quarter last season. Despite his 44-yard return being negated because of a chop block call on the Bulldogs, his pick helped set up **Peyton Woodring's** final field goal.
- * With Mondon, the versatile **Jalon Walker, CJ Allen, Raylen Wilson** and **Chaz Chambliss** all back, the Bulldogs have the most familiar faces returning in the middle. Chambliss started all 14 games last year and had 20 stops. Allen was worked into the starting lineup for five games and finished fifth on the team with 41 stops while Wilson had 15 tackles.
- * Walker collected two sacks in the SECCG to give him five for the year. He has seen time at ILB and OLB.

Experienced Special Teams

- * Georgia welcomes back a two-year starter in P **Brett Thorson** and sophomore PK **Peyton Woodring** after both shined in 2023.
- * Thorson had a 43.8 average on 32 punts in 2023 including 21 that resulted in fair catches. Thanks in part to Thorson's punts and to the entire punt coverage team, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023.
- * Woodring was a *Lou Groza Award* semifinalist after scoring a team-high 134 points, going 21-for-25 on field goals and 71-for-71 on PATs in his first year last season. He ranked sixth nationally in Scoring and third among kickers and his 134 points ranks third best in school history for a kicker and most for a Bulldog freshman kicker. Woodring was the first true freshman Bulldog PK to start a season since Marshall Morgan in 2012.
- * **Drew Miller** joined the team on campus in June and arrives as the nation's top-ranked prep punter. At kicker, graduate transfer **Charlie Ham**, a native of Atlanta, Ga., is back in Georgia after a successful undergraduate career at Duke.

Block That Punt...Block That Kick

- Currently, there are four Bulldogs who have blocked a kick/punt:
- * True freshman DB **Joel Aguero** blocked a Florida punt that resulted in a safety last season.
- * In 2022, DL **Nazir Stackhouse** blocked a field goal that was returned 96 yards for a touchdown by teammate Chris Smith in the opening quarter of the SEC Championship Game versus No. 14 LSU.
- * OLB **Jalon Walker** blocked a punt that resulted in a safety versus Kent State in 2022.
- * S **Dan Jackson** blocked a punt against No. 8 Arkansas in 2021.

Trifecta Of Undefeated SEC Regular Seasons

- * In 2021, Georgia posted its first perfect 8-0 mark in league play in school history. The SEC went to eight games when it split into divisions in 1992.
- * The 2022 Bulldogs followed it up with another 8-0 SEC mark, and the average margin of victory in those games was 25.5.
- * The 2023 Bulldogs made it three straight 8-0 league seasons (the only SEC school ever to accomplish that feat).
- * In school history, Georgia now has gone undefeated in league play 10 times.
