Simply The Best (Since 2021)

*Georgia owns the best record in the FBS since 2021 at 65-7. This run includes back-to-back CFP national titles (2021-22) and three SEC titles (2022, 2024-25). The next best is Ohio State at 59-10.

*Georgia and Ohio State are the only FBS schools to win 11+ games every season since 2021.

Dominating Dawgs

*Georgia's 2026 Senior Class owns a record of 36-6 with back-to-back SEC titles. The 2025 Senior Class went 51-6 with a national title (2022) and three SEC crowns in their career. They were the third straight class to register 50 wins, joining the 2023 group (50-4) and the record-setting 2024 class (53-5).

*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 29 seasons but has dropped its last two CFP quarterfinal matchups at the Sugar Bowl. Prior to these losses to Notre Dame and Ole Miss, Georgia had won seven straight CFP/bowl games. Overall, the Bulldogs have made 64 appearances in a bowl/CFP game with a 38-23-3 mark. The appearances and wins rank second in FBS.

*Georgia has a current winning streak over every SEC team except Ole Miss that equals 77 games. The streaks ranges from one game up to 16 straight.

Season Opener: The Bulldogs face Tennessee State for the first time in school history. Georgia is 102-27-3 in season openers including 10-0 under Smart. Georgia's biggest season-opening win in the Smart era in terms of points and margin of victory came in 2022 as the No. 3 Bulldogs beat #11 Oregon 49-3 in Atlanta. Georgia has a streak of 84 straight sellouts here too. TSU fell to Jackson State 26-24 this past Saturday.

Storylines On The 2026 Bulldogs

*The Bulldogs are preseason ranked No. 3 (AP) and among the teams with designs on advancing to the College Football Playoff and challenging for another title. Georgia will feature seven returning starters on offense including fifth-year All-SEC quarterback **Gunner Stockton** and All-SEC junior tailbacks **Nate Frazier** and **Chauncey Bowens**. Eight starters return on defense including All-American juniors **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** and veteran starters in seniors **Raylen Wilson**, **Jordan Hall** and **Gabe Harris Jr.**, plus junior **Quintavius Johnson**. Also, the special teams unit is headlined by senior All-SEC placekicker **Peyton Woodring**. In 2025, the Bulldogs were one of the youngest teams in the country with 54 percent of the roster consisting of players in their first or second season in Athens. In 2026, the Bulldogs brought in only nine scholarship transfers, the fewest in the SEC.

***Selflessness:** In the offseason, the Bulldogs studied the 2025 NBA Champion OKC Thunder and noted how they led the league in eight major defensive and team statistical categories and most importantly, "sefflessness," according to Coach **Kirby Smart**. He aims for the 2026 Bulldogs to showcase that trait.

***Going For Three In A Row:** The Bulldogs won their 16th SEC title after a 28-7 rout of No. 9 Alabama in the SEC Championship Game. This marked the first time Georgia won two straight SEC titles since it claimed three in a row from 1980-82. Georgia enters its 11th season under Smart, who has a record of 117-21 with two national titles and four SEC crowns in that span.

*Georgia's scoring defense in 2025 ranked 10th nationally at 17.6 ppg while the scoring offense averaged 32.1 ppg, good for 28th nationally. In rushing defense, the Bulldogs were fourth nationally at 81.5 yards per game. In rushing offense, Georgia finished 35th nationally at 182.1 ypg.

*The Bulldogs have a new offensive line coach in **Phil Rauscher** who spent the 2025 season assisting **Stacy Searels** who had been the OL coach since 2002. Rauscher has 16 years of experience in college and the NFL. Due to injuries, Georgia started six different offensive line units in the first six games of 2025 and eight total. The unit returns several key starters in fifth-year tackle **Earnest Greene III**, fifth-year center **Drew Bobo** and sophomore guard **Dontrell Glover** while sophomore **Juan Gaston Jr.** and junior **Malachi Toliver** made starts too. In the spring and continuing in the preseason, freshman **Zykie Helton** has made an impact. He could become another true freshman starter like Gaston (4 games including season opener) and Glover (12 games) as both did that in 2025.

*Six of Georgia's top seven pass catchers from 2025 have moved on to the NFL or graduation, and the Bulldogs will look to identify the next group of targets. The top returnees are senior wideout **London Humphreys** and senior tight end **Lawson Luckie**. A newcomer to watch here is junior transfer **Isiah Canion** (Ga. Tech). He played with Bulldogs **Rasean Dinkins** and **Isaiah Gibson** at Warner Robins HS.

*In 2025, linebackers CJ Allen and **Raylen Wilson** combined for 162 tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. With Allen now playing for Indianapolis in the NFL, look for juniors **Chris Cole** and **Justin Williams** to fill the void while sophomore **Zayden Walker** should have an expanded role. Georgia's pass rush and sack total last season were questioned almost weekly. Cole had a team-high 4.5 sacks. The Bulldogs added junior linebacker **Amaris Williams** (Auburn) to bolster the pass rush but he injured his knee in April and is out. The Bulldogs have a new OLB coach in **Larry Knight**. The native of Augusta, Ga., replaced Chidera Uzo-Diribe, who joined the Dallas Cowboys as their OLB coach.

*Georgia's secondary features preseason All-Americans **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV**, but there is competition to fill Daylen Everette's spot as he started a team-best 41 games from 2023-25 before departing for the NFL/Pittsburgh. Portal additions here include fifth-year **Gentry Williams** (Oklahoma), junior **Braylon Conley** (USC), senior Athens native **Khalil Barnes** (Clemson, 7 career INTs) and junior **Ja'Marley Riddle** (ECU, 6 career INTs). The Bulldogs welcome back a healthy **Kyron Jones** as the senior safety started the first six games last year before missing the rest of the year due to a foot injury. Junior **Demello Jones**, sophomore **Rasean Dinkins** and senior **Zion Branch** saw plenty of action in 2025.

- *Directed three 4th quarter comebacks in 2025 including over #5 Ole Miss, #15 Tennessee in Knoxville and versus Florida in Jacksonville.
- *Led Georgia to scoring drives on each of its first 8 drives in win over #5 Ole Miss, the first team to do that against an AP Top-10 team since 2016.
- *Successful home debut in the 2025 opening win over Marshall as the team's leading rusher (73 yards on 10 attempts with 2 scores) plus threw for 190 yards and 2 TDs...First Georgia player to have two passing TDs and two rushing scores in a season opener in the past 80 years per ESPN Stats.

*Puglisi made his debut in a 45-7 win over Marshall, directing four possessions in the second half with one TD drive covering 80 yards in eight plays... Finished the game 5-for-8 for 59 yards and one TD, a 23-yard strike to TE **Elyiss Williams**...Went 1-for-2 for 4 yards versus Austin Peay...Tried Hail Mary on final play of first half at No. 15 UT and resulted in INT...Played most of the second half in the win over Charlotte (7-for-11, 49 yards).

*Georgia add one more QB in 6-2, 200-pound freshman **Bryson Beaver**, a native of Murrieta, Calif. He originally signed with Oregon but entered the portal after Ducks starting QB Dante Moore opted to return to school.

Frazier & Bowens Headline Ground Attack

In 2025, Georgia averaged 182.1 rushing yards/game with 31 TDs.

***Nate Frazier** (team-high 947 yards, 6 TDs), a 3rd Team Coaches All-SEC selection, started 10 games. He had a team-best 72 rushing yards plus a three-yard TD catch in the regular season win over No. 5 OM. He went for a career-high 181 yards on just 12 carries (15.1 avg.) in a road win over MSU. It was the most yards by a Bulldog since 2018 when D'Andre Swift had 186 in a win at Auburn. Frazier's big day included a career-best 59-yard TD run. He followed that up with a team-best 72 yards against No. 10 Texas. He went for 108 yards in a win versus #23 Tech.

***Chauncey Bowens** (526 yards, 6 TDs), who earned Coaches Freshman All-SEC honors last season, made his first career start in the win over UK and provided 70 yards on a career-high 15 carries. Against No. 17 UA, he posted a career-best 119 yards on 12 carries (9.9 average). He had a 36-yard scamper for the go-ahead score in the 4th quarter over UF. Due to injury, he missed the final two games of the regular season and saw limited action in the postseason.

*Georgia also welcomes back **Dwight Phillips Jr.**, **Bo Walker** and and freshman **Jae Lamar**. UK senior transfer **Dante Dowdell** is out due to an injury.

Options Abound At Wideout

In 2025, the Bulldogs averaged 220.2 receiving yards/game with 25 TDs.

The Bulldogs will have to lean on a new cast with six of the top seven pass catchers off to the NFL or have graduated. The departed group includes junior Zachariah Branch (81-for-811 yards, 6 TDs), now with the Atlanta Falcons. He led the SEC in receptions with a Bulldog record 81 catches last year.

***London Humphreys** (18-for-276 yards, 3 TDs) is the top returning receiver. He had *THE* catch of the 2025 season. Down 38-30 with 2:38 remaining in the game at No. 15 UT, it was 4th-and-6 when he hauled in a 28-yard touchdown strike from **Gunner Stockton**.

*After limited action, the following Bulldogs will be looking for an increased role: **Sacovie White-Helton**, **Talyn Taylor**, **CJ Wiley**, **Thomas Blackshear**, **Landon Roldan**, **Tyler J. Williams** and **Jeremy Bell**.

*Bulldog newcomers include junior Georgia Tech transfer **Isiah Canion** along with freshmen **Craig Dandridge**, **Dallas Dickerson**, **Ryan Mosley** and **Tre Shields**.

Ready Or Not, It's Go Time

The offensive line had an eventful season in 2025 due to injuries. Georgia used a different starting OL unit in its first six games, then had the same unit for the next four contests before resting a pair (All-America C-**Drew Bobo**, RT-**Earnest Greene III**) in the win over Charlotte. Bobo left the game versus No. 23 Ga. Tech with a leg injury. C **Malachi Toliver** started three of the final four games for him. Micah Morris (LG) was the only linemen to start every game in final year. The Bulldogs employed three different starting RGs, two different LTs, two different Cs and four different RTs. Junior LT Monroe Freeling, a 2nd Team Coaches All-SEC selection, had the longest the starting streak at 10 games. He was a first round draft pick of the Carolina Panthers.

*Bobo, a 2nd Team Coaches All-SEC pick, and Greene III are the veteran leaders of the unit. Greene III has a team-best 32 career starts. In 2025, a pair of true freshmen saw plenty of action. **Juan Gaston Jr.** started at RG and RT while **Dontrell Glover**, who earned FWA Freshman All-America honors, started the last 10 games at RG. Georgia returns **Jahzare Jackson**, Toliver and **Michael Uini** who made spot starts last year. Two newcomers to watch will be freshmen **Zykie Helton** and **Ekene Ogboko**. Ekene is the younger brother of Bulldog DL **Nnamdi Ogboko**.

**Did You Know?* Gaston joined Andrew Thomas (RT, 2017) as the only true freshman offensive lineman to start a season opener in the Smart era. Thomas went on to be a first round pick (fourth overall selection) in the 2020 NFL draft by the New York Giants. He remains a starter for the Giants.

Tight Ends Always In The Game Plan

Tight ends have been a staple of the Bulldog offense and the player development is notable. Six former Bulldog tight ends were in the NFL in 2025, most notably Brock Bowers (Las Vegas). The Bulldogs aim to continue that trend with a stocked room in 2026 as only Oscar Delp (20 rec., 261 yards, 1 TD) graduated to the NFL and was drafted by the New Orleans Saints.

*In 2025, **Lawson Luckie** (15 rec., 158 yards, 4 TDs) and Delp led the room. **Jaden Reddell** (1 rec., 9 yards) appeared in every game in 2025 while **Elyiss Williams** (7 rec., 117 yards, 1 TD) played in 13 games as a rookie and **Colton Heinrich** saw action in four games. Against No. 5 Ole Miss, Luckie became the first Bulldog with three TD catches in a game since 2008 (Mohamed Masquoui vs. Ga. Tech).

***Ethan Barbour** went down with a leg injury in game two (Austin Peay) of his rookie season in 2025 and eventually returned for the CFP. He joined Delp in the starting lineup in the season opener while Williams notched a 23-yard TD on his first career catch.

*Georgia's additions to this room include freshmen **Kaiden Prothro**, **Brayden Fogle** and **Lincoln Keyes**.

Defense Improved During The Season

Georgia has had 55 players drafted over the past five seasons, including 30 on defense and 11 of those defenders have gone in the first round.

*Opponents scored 246 points in 2025 (17.6 ppg/10th nationally).

*In 2025, opponents scored 71 points in the 1st quarter (21 of those at #15 UT) and 53 in the 2nd quarter. However, in the 2nd half, the Bulldogs allowed a total of 122 points (plus 3 points in OT).

*The Bulldogs allowed 10 points or fewer in each of their final four games before the CFP, the longest streak in a season since an eight-game stretch during the 1971 season, according to ESPN Research.

*However, No. 6 Ole Miss scored 20 points in the 4th quarter to win the CFP quarterfinal at the Sugar Bowl 39-34.

*In the SEC Championship Game, No. 9 UA was shut out for the first three quarters and finished with a season-low 7 points, marking just the third time it has been held to single digits since 2011. UA came in averaging 33.3 points.

*No. 23 Ga. Tech averaged 35.3 points and was held to three field goals.

*No. 10 Texas averaged 29.6 points and managed just 10 points.

*No. 5 OM scored 14 in the 3rd quarter and then were shut out in the 4th quarter.

*Shut out Auburn in the 2nd half after trailing 10-3 at the half in a 20-10 win.

*Blanked No. 17 UA in the 2nd half after it scored 24 points in the first half.

*UK had seven points in the 1st half, and it's final TD came courtesy of a 23-yard drive following a turnover with 1:51 left and Georgia up 35-7.

*Georgia had a 38-7 lead at MSU before allowing 14 points in the 2nd half.

Stopping The Run Starts Up Front

Georgia ranked fourth nationally, allowing only 81.5 rushing yards a game.

***Jordan Hall** and **Gabe Harris Jr.**, are the veterans up front.

*The front must replace Christen Miller who now suits up for the New Orleans Saints after a stellar career that featured 24 starts.

*Harris Jr., had a career-high five stops at AU and made four in the win at MSU.

*Georgia welcomes back **Joseph Jonah-Ajonye**, **Nnamdi Ogboko**, **Josh Horton** and **Elijah Griffin** and **JJ Hanne**. Griffin earned FWA Freshman All-America honors last year while Horton appeared in all 14 games.

*Jonah-Ajonye posted a career-high three stops versus Austin Peay. Griffin had two tackles each against UK and AU while Horton, who has shown an ability to win one-on-one battles, made three tackles against No. 17 UA. Ogboko got his first career sack versus UK.

*Newcomers to watch here include freshmen **Carter Luckie** (younger brother of Bulldog senior **Lawson Luckie**), **Valdin Sone**, **Preston Carey**, **AJ Lonon** and **PJ Dean** while returnees **Nasir Johnson** and **Justin Greene** aim for bigger roles. Junior transfer **Amaris Williams** (Auburn) is out with a knee injury.

*In the SEC Championship Game win over No. 9 UA, the Bulldogs limited the Crimson Tide to minus three yards rushing, their second lowest total ever.

*Against No. 10 Texas, UT managed only 23 yards on 17 attempts. UT entered the game averaging 135.3 yards on the ground. In the win over No. 23 Ga. Tech, the Jackets tallied just 69 yards on 23 attempts after averaging 215 rushing yards.

Steady Linebacking Trio Sees Next Wave Emerging

The good news is two-thirds of the starting trio return in **Raylen Wilson** and **Quintavius Johnson** while All-American and tackle leader CJ Allen is off to the NFL as a member of the Buffalo Bills.

*Wilson finished third on the team with 74 tackles plus had 6.5 TFL and 2.5 Sacks. Johnson tallied 35 tackles on the year. The next wave who flashed in 2025 includes **Chris Cole**, **Justin Williams** and **Zayden Walker**.

*Cole posted a team-high 4.5 sacks as a sophomore. He saw extensive playing time against No. 10 Texas when Allen left in the first half with an injury. Cole set a career-high with a team-best seven stops in the win over the Longhorns. He made his first start against Charlotte and tallied four stops and a sack. He made six tackles with one sack and two QB pressures against No. 15 Tennessee.

*Williams, a sophomore in 2025, posted a career-high six stops versus UK, collected five tackles at MSU and made four stops against No. 10 Texas. He had a team-best five tackles against Charlotte. He recovered a blocked punt against No. 9 UA in the SEC Championship Game.

*Walker made an impact as a freshman last year. At MSU, he tallied a career-high three stops. Then, he picked up his first career sack in the win over No. 10 Texas plus forced a fumble. He had another sack in the SEC Championship Game win over No. 9 UA.

*Also, Georgia's depth here includes **Isaiah Gibson**, **Darren Ikinagbon**, **AJ Kruah** and **Chase Linton** plus freshmen **Nick Abrams**, **Khamari Brooks**, **Elijah Littlejohn** and **Terrence Penick**.

A Passing Grade In The Secondary

Georgia's opponents averaged 216.5 passing yards per game and threw for 14 TDs in 2025. The Bulldog defense had nine interceptions, all from the secondary, and generated 20 sacks (one from the secondary-JaCorey Thomas).

*The Bulldogs welcome the return of All-SEC safety **KJ Bolden** (16 career starts) and FWA Freshman Defensive Player of the Year **Ellis Robinson IV** (12 career starts) plus safety **Kyron Jones** (started the first six games of 2025 before missing the rest of the season due to a foot injury) and star **Rasean Dinkins** (started the final two games of 2025). Also, **Demello Jones**, who appeared in 12 games last year, is back plus **Zion Branch** who saw action in 11 games in 2025 including a career-best six stops in the win over UF.

*The Bulldogs made four portal additions in the secondary: senior **Khalil Barnes** (Clemson) and fifth-year **Gentry Williams** (Oklahoma) plus junior **Ja'Marley Riddle** (ECU) and junior **Braylon Conley** (USC). The Bulldogs return **Jontae Gilbert**, **Jaylan Morgan** and **Todd Robinson**. From the high school ranks, Georgia added **Justice Fitzpatrick**, **Zech Fort**, **Tyriq Green**, **Caden Harris**, **Jordan Smith** and **Blake Stewart**.

*Here's a look at some of the Georgia's top performances last year: After No. 17 UA posted a 68% conversion rate (13-of-19) on 3rd Down in the regular

season contest, Georgia limited UA to 3-of-14 conversions in the SEC title game as it finished 19-for-39 in the air. Georgia posted a 28-7 victory for another SEC crown.

*In Atlanta, No. 23 Ga. Tech finished with 181 passing yards and no TDs with just two completions over 25 yards. Robinson IV notched his team-best fourth INT, which tied him for the SEC lead, and the Bulldogs won 16-9.

*Against No. 10 Texas, the Longhorns had 251 yards on 43 attempts but only one catch was more than 25 yards. The Bulldogs cruised to a 35-10 win and had three sacks against UT who finished 2-for-12 on 3rd Downs

*The top passing attack came at No. 15 Tennessee as the Vols were averaging 352 yards, and Joey Aguilar tallied 371 yards in a shootout. Coming in to that game, the Bulldogs had not allowed a passing TD, and the Vols collected four including three big ones that covered 32, 56 and 72 yards. Still, Georgia rallied for a 44-41 victory in overtime.

We're Going For It!

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs have a 64% success rate on 4th Down Conversion attempts (96-for-149) with 17 TDs.

*In 2025, Georgia ranked second nationally in 4th Down Conversions at 75% (15-for-20) with 3 TDs. Some of the more memorable ones from last year included a 4th-and-3 at the Auburn 40 with 5:14 left in the contest. It was part of the clinching go-ahead TD drive that lasted a school record-tying eight minutes and 45 seconds. Down 38-30 with 2:38 remaining in the game at No. 15 Tennessee, Georgia converted a 4th-and-6 at the UT 28 for a TD (Stockton pass-to-Humphreys).

***Did You Know?** Prior to the UT game last year, the only other fourth quarter 4th down conversion featuring a TD pass when Georgia was behind under Smart came in 2016 at Missouri. The Bulldogs trailed 27-21 with 1:31 left in the game and faced a 4th-and-10. Jacob Eason hit Isaiah McKenzie for a 20-yard TD in a 28-27 win.

It's Miller Time

With elite distance, hang time, placement and a strong coverage unit, All-America punter Brett Thorson captured the 2025 Ray Guy Award to cap his Bulldog career. The Bulldogs ranked fourth nationally in Net Punting at 43.5. Thorson missed the 2025 opener while still recovering from offseason knee surgery and **Drew Miller** served as the punter.

*Now a junior, **Drew Miller** actually got his first taste of action in the 2025 CFP Quarterfinal at the Sugar Bowl after Thorson was injured in the 2024 SEC Championship Game.

*A native of Mediapolis, Iowa, Miller will be competing for the punting job. Georgia also returns specialists **Connor Ferguson** plus snapper **Will Snellings** and welcomes in freshman signee kicker **Harran Zureikat**.

*The returning gunners include **KJ Bolden**, **London Humphreys**, **Jeremy Bell** and **Talyn Taylor**.

Senior All-SEC specialist **Peyton Woodring**, a native of Lafayette, La., is a three-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist. In 2025, he was a 2nd Team Coaches All-SEC pick and twice named SEC Specialist of the Week.

*Woodring's Career FG% of 88.06% (59-of-67) is on track for a school record as the current mark belongs to Rodrigo Blankenship who posted an 82.47% from 2016-19, making 80-of-97 attempts. Blankenship holds the Georgia and SEC record for Career PATs, going 200-for-200. Woodring is 173-for-173 in PATs. *In 2025, he had a team-high 105 points (17-19 on FGs, 54-for-54 on PATs, 84 Kickoffs, 61 Touchbacks, 4 Out of Bounds).

*Kickoff returns under Woodring have been rare but look for **Kyron Jones**, **Raylen Wilson**, **Justin Williams** and **Chris Cole** to be among those with special teams tackles.

***Did You Know?** After missing three of his first seven field goal attempts as a freshman in 2023, Woodring has been good on 55 of his past 60 FG (4 of those misses were from 50+ yards while one was from 45 yards).

Back Deep For The Bulldogs

With the departure of All-SEC wideout/returner Zachariah Branch and senior Cash Jones, the Bulldogs will have competition in the return game. One cadidate with experience is **Sacovie White-Helton**. He had five punt returns for 57 yards last year. **Landon Roldan** has one career kickoff return for six yards.

***Did You Know?** Georgia's last punt return for a TD came in 2023 (Mekhi {MUH-kye} Mews vs. Ball State, 69 yards)

***Did You Know?** Georgia's last KOR for a TD came in 2016 (Terry Godwin @ South Carolina, 43 yards)

It's Blocked

Under Kirby Smart, the Bulldogs have blocked nine punts and eight field goals. There's one player on the current squad with a block for Georgia.

*In the 2025 opener against Marshall, **KJ Bolden** blocked a punt that led to an eventual TD after a 20-yard drive.

***Did You Know?** Georgia's last blocked field goal came in 2024 by Dan Jackson against Auburn. He is now with the Detroit Lions.

Week Two Whiteout

In the week two matchup against Western Kentucky in Athens, Georgia will wear an all-white uniform (helmets, jerseys and pants) for the first time in school history. Georgia is 4-0 in an alternate uniforms under Smart including black jerseys against Louisiana in Athens in 2016, versus Miss. State in Athens and Cincinnati in the Peach Bowl in the 2020 season. Also, to honor the 1980 national championship team, Georgia wore white jerseys and red pants in the 2020 season opener at Arkansas.

A Look At The 2026 Schedule

The SEC goes to a nine-game league slate this year, and the two-time defending SEC champion Bulldogs open league play at Arkansas on Sept. 19. Georgia's SEC home opener will be Sept. 26 with the first-ever visit by Oklahoma. The rest of the home schedule features Vanderbilt, Auburn, Missouri and Ga. Tech.

*The Bulldogs are 10-0 in their first SEC road game each year of the Smart era, winning at Tennessee (twice), South Carolina (twice), Vanderbilt (twice), Arkansas, Auburn, Kentucky and Missouri.

*Georgia has three other SEC roadtrips to Alabama, Ole Miss and South Carolina while the Florida game will be held in Atlanta on Oct. 31 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. This marks the first time since 1995 that the Bulldogs and Gators square off somewhere other than Jacksonville, Fla. Everbank Stadium is being renovated for the next two seasons. The 2027 Georgia-Florida game will be in Tampa, Fla.

*Georgia is 40-3 in its last 43 SEC regular season games with two losses to UA and one to Ole Miss.

“Hard To Kill” In 2025

In 2025, Georgia went 7-1 in the SEC gauntlet, trailing early and/or late in seven of those contests. The Bulldogs rallied to beat No. 15 Tennessee and Auburn on the road for their ninth straight victory in those series. They outlasted No. 5 Ole Miss 43-35 in Athens and never had to punt. Georgia won its fifth straight over Florida in Jacksonville. Georgia erased an early 7-0 deficit at MSU with 38 unanswered points and eventually recorded a 41-21 decision for the program’s 900th all-time win. Georgia used a 21-point fourth quarter to defeat No. 10 Texas 35-10 to close out the SEC regular season.

*The only league contest in the regular season where Georgia led wire-to-wire was a 35-14 home win over UK while the only comeback that fell short came to then No. 17 UA 24-21 in Athens.

*The Bulldogs dominated No. 9 UA in the SEC Championship Game becoming the first team to shut out their opponent for the first three quarters of the title game.

*During Georgia's school record 33-game home winning streak from 2019-2025, the Bulldogs beat 10 ranked teams including No. 1 Tennessee in 2022, No. 7 Tennessee in 2024, No. 7 Auburn in 2020, No. 8 Kentucky in 2021 and No. 9 Ole Miss in 2023.

Academic & Community Service In The Smart Era

* The University of Georgia ranked No. 19 in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2026 ranking of the best public universities in the nation, marking the 10th consecutive year that UGA has placed in the top 20.

*The 2026 Bulldogs feature 11 players who have the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform: Khalil Barnes (Clemson), Henry Bates, Micah Bell, Drew Bobo, Danny Curran, Terrell Foster, Earnest Greene III, Jordan Hall, Gunner Stockton, Gentry Williams and Raylen Wilson.

* A total of 354 players have made the SEC Academic Honor Roll including a high of 64 in 2025.

* Under Smart, Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members 22 times. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better in their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of eligibility. The most recent members were Oscar Delp, Beau Gardner and Gunner Stockton.

* Ladd McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers in 2024, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees. Oscar Delp was a 2025 Campbell Trophy semifinalist.

* Members of the football team play in the annual Bulldogs Battling Breast Cancer charity golf tournament in the summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004.

* In 2024, Malaki Starks became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually for their community service. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

The team participates in the annual Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl on night in October. It is led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and has raised close to \$3 million for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease.

* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA and the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

Dooley Field At Sanford Stadium Quick Facts

*Named for the late Dr. S. V. Sanford, former president of the University and Chancellor of the University system.

*An overflow crowd of 30,000 saw the stadium's first game on October 12, 1929, when Yale University made its only trip South. Georgia won the now famous game when a young sophomore end from Macon, Vernon "Catfish" Smith, scored all 15 of the Bulldogs' points. Final score, Georgia 15, Yale 0.

*Through the years, the stadium has experienced various projects including adding lights at field level, double-decking the stands, closing in the West End, building SkySuites on both sides, work to Reed Plaza and renovating the West End Zone.

*Sanford Stadium played host to the medal round of the 1996 Olympic men's and women's soccer, watched by over 3 billion people around the world on television.

*Prior to Georgia's 2019 home opener, the playing field at Sanford Stadium was formally renamed in honor of Vince Dooley, the Bulldogs' all-time winningest head coach. Dooley served as head football coach of the Bulldogs from 1964 through 1988 and director of athletics from 1979 to 2004.

*The latest development was completed in 2024 that featured a new press box, additional premium seating, restrooms, concessions and expanded concourse on the 100-level south side. It raised capacity to 93,033.

Mascot Facts And More About Uga XI, a.k.a "Boom"

*Georgia's Uga has established himself as the nation's most well-known mascot. The line of pure white English bulldogs, which epitomizes everything Georgia, has been owned by the Frank W. "Sonny" Seiler family of Savannah, Ga., since Uga I first graced the campus in 1956. **Uga XI**, aka "Boom" owns a record of 36-6 as he begins his fourth season in 2026.

*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

*Through the years, Uga has been defined by his spiked collar, a symbol of the position which he holds. He was given his name, an abbreviation for the university, by William Young of Columbus, a law school classmate of Seiler. Each of the Uga mascots is awarded a varsity letter in the form of a plaque, identical to those presented to all Bulldog athletes who letter in their respective sports.

*As determined and published by the *Pitt Press*, the University of Georgia is the only major college that actually buries its mascots within the confines of the stadium. Ugas I-IX are buried in marble vaults near the main gate in the embankment of the South stands. Epitaphs to the dogs are inscribed in bronze, and before each home game, flowers are placed on their graves.

*For the past 20 years, Uga's jerseys have been custom-made each season from the same material used for the players' jerseys. Old jerseys are destroyed.

*Uga's on-field home is a permanent air conditioned doghouse located next to the cheerleader's platform. The custom-made doghouse is a gift from the Bahamian Bulldog Club of Nassau, Bahamas, through the courtesy of Fred Hazlewood.
