THE SERIES

• This will be the first football meeting between Georgia Southern and UL Lafayette, the last team in the Sun Belt for the Eagles to play.

AGAINST THE SUN BELT

• GS has played 21 Sun Belt games as it plays its third season in the conference. The Eagles are 17-4 on the field in conference games, although the 2014 win over ULM was vacated due to NCAA violations to make GS officially 16-4 in SBC games.

GEORGIA ON OUR MINDS

• Thursday's contest against UL Lafayette is the fifth of seven games in the state of Georgia for the Eagles this season.

• GS blanked Savannah State 54-0 in the season opener and held on to beat UL Monroe 23-21 on Sept. 17. The Eagles fell at Georgia Tech and lost at home to App State.

• Georgia Southern will finish the season with three straight games in the Peach State: UL Lafayette this week, Georgia State on Nov. 19 and the season finale against Troy on Dec. 3.

HOMECOMING

• Georgia Southern is 27-6 on Homecoming and has won its last five Homecoming games. This will be the first Homecoming in school history on a Thursday night.

THURSDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

• The Eagles are 5-3 all-time in games played on Thursdays, 3-1 at home. GS defeated App State and Troy in 2014 and Texas State last year. Two weeks ago, they lost to App State. The most memorable Thursday night game in program history came when the Eagles battled the elements for the victory over Middle Tennessee State in the 1989 "Hugo Bowl."

ON SHORT REST

• Georgia Southern will have a short week to prepare for the Ragin' Cajuns on Thursday night.

• Earlier this year, the Eagles lost to Appalachian State on short rest (Saturday/Thursday) and lost to App State on short rest last year. They beat Troy and App State in 2014 and in 1983, the Eagles beat Savannah State on short rest.

• GS is 3-2 all-time in short weeks (less than seven days).



COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 10 Thursday's game will be the eighth of 10 games played on artificial turf this season for the Eagles.
- 9 Linebacker Ironhead Gallon is averaging 9.0 tackles per game, fifth-best in the Sun Belt Conference.
- 8 Senior kicker Younghoe Koo has eight made field goals in his career of 40 yards or longer, including four this season.
- 7 Seven position players have started all nine games this season.
- 6 Myles Campbell's 121 yards receiving last week was the most by a GS receiver in the past six years when current Dallas Cowboy safety JJ Wilcox had 121 yards at Chattanooga in 2010.
- 5 Thursday's contest against UL Lafayette is the fifth of seven games in the state of Georgia for the Eagles this season.
- 4 Georgia Southern has blocked four kicks this season: two field goals and two punts.
- 3 The Eagles have won three of their four home Thursday games in program history.
- 2 This will be the second of two games played on short rest for the Eagles this season.
- 1 Georgia Southern and UL Lafayette will be meeting in football for the first time on Thursday night.



WEEK 11 NOTES

• Thursday's game will be Georgia Southern's fourth in 19 days (Oct. 22 at New Mexico State, Oct. 27 vs. Appalachian State, Nov. 5 at Ole Miss, Nov. 10 vs. UL Lafayette).

• Since joining the FBS in 2014, GS has the second-best record in the state of Georgia:

Georgia: 25-10

Georgia Southern: 22-12 (one win vacated by NCAA)

Georgia Tech: 18-16

Georgia State: 9-24

UL LAFAYETTE NOTES

• This will be the Eagles' first game played against UL Lafayette despite being their third season in the Sun Belt Conference. They dropped their first game against Arkansas State earlier this year. Coastal Carolina joins the league next year, but GS is 3-0 all-time against the Chanticleers.

• In the modern era ... Georgia Southern is 9-4 all-time against teams from the state of Louisiana and is 201-49-1 all-time playing in the state of Georgia. The Eagles are 87-30 all-time in the month of November and 5-3 all-time on Thursdays.

NEW OPPONENTS

• Including this week, Georgia Southern has played their first ever games against Arkansas State, Ole Miss and now UL Lafayette.

RECAPPING OLE MISS

• Myles Campbell had a career day receiving at Ole Miss, hauling in four passes for 121 yards (30.3 avg.) and a 29-yard touchdown. His 121 yards receiving were the most by a GS receiver in the past six years when current Dallas Cowboy safety JJ Wilcox had 121 yards at Chattanooga in 2010 and was just the 27th 100-yard receiving game in program history.

• Six of the Eagles' last seven games against Power 5 schools have been decided by 11 points or less: a six-point win at Florida (2013), a one-point loss at NCSU (2014), a four-point loss at GT (2014), a six-point loss in OT at Georgia (2015), an 11-point loss at Georgia Tech (2016), and a 10-point loss at Ole Miss (2016). Only a 44-0 loss at West Virginia to open last season stands as a blemish against Power 5 schools.

• Georgia Southern's 267 yards rushing were the third most against Ole Miss by a non-SEC team since 2000.

KICKIN' KOO

• Senior kicker Younghoe Koo missed a 54-yard field goal at the end of the first half last week to break his streak of made field goals at 14. His 14 straight makes is a school record for consecutive field goals made in a season over previous record-holder Tim Foley's (12 set in 1985).

• The school record for consecutive field goals remains at 19, set by Foley. Foley made his last 12 field goals of 1985 and the first seven of 1986.

• Koo has four makes of 40 yards or more, including a 53-yarder at Arkansas State. For his career, he has eight made field goals of 40 yards or longer.

• The Lou Groza Award semifinalist is 14-for-15 on the season.

(MORE) SUN BELT RUSHING NOTES

• Only seven times has a Sun Belt team ran for over 440 yards since the start of the 2015 season. The Eagles own all seven of those instances, including the 2014 game at New Mexico State (592). That figure also leads the country.

THE DYNAMIC DUO

• When counting only his FBS yards, Kevin Ellison passed the 2,000-yard rushing mark against Western Michigan, joining Taysom Hill of BYU as the only active QBs to rush for that many yards. Since hitting the mark, three other FBS quarterbacks have hit the 2,000-yard mark. Ellison's freshman year, he ran for 886 yards while the Eagles were still in the FCS.

• Ellison was joined in Week 1 by Favian Upshaw in the 1,000 yard club. They're the only active quarterback teammates to both rush for over 1,000 yards in their career.

• Ellison (3,152) and Upshaw (1,263) have combined to run for 4,415 yards in their career. This leads FBS quarterback duos.

RUNNING TOWARD SUCCESS

• Since joining the FBS in 2014, are 22-5 when outrushing their opponents, 0-6 when being outrushed and 0-0 when the rushing total is even.

• Since 2014, GS is 21-1 when rushing for 300 yards or more. The Eagles are 13-0 when rushing for 400 yards or more, 4-0 when rushing for 500 yards or more and 1-0 when rushing for 600 yards or more.

• The Eagles are 20-5 when rushing 50 times or more in a game over the past two-plus seasons.

• Additionally, GS is 19-7 when holding the time of possession battle advantage in that span.

MOVIN UP THE CHARTS

• Matt Breida passed Georgia Tech's Eddie Lee Ivory (3,517 yards; 1975-78) for fourth place all-time in the state of Georgia for career FBS/D-IA rushing yards and now has 3,599 career FBS rushing yards. His 15-yard run in 2013 when the Eagles were still in the FCS does not count toward this mark.

• Kevin Ellison sits in fifth place at GS in career passing yards (3,067) and is 10th in rushing yards (3,152). He passed Chaz Williams for 10th place all-time at GS in the South Alabama game to join Tracy Ham, Greg Hill and Jayson Foster as the only players in the top 10 for both.

• Kevin Ellison sits in fifth place in school history in career passing yards (3,076). He's 137 yards from Kenny Robinson passing fourth place.

• Kevin Ellison has the sixth-most passing completions in GS history with 105.

• With his 134 yards passing at Ole Miss, Kevin Ellison became the third Georgia Southern quarterback with 3,000 career passing and 3,000 career rushing yards (Tracy Ham, Greg Hill). He currently has 3,152 rushing yards and 3,067 passing yards.

• Matt Breida has 15 games with 100+ rush yards, which is the ninth most in Georgia Southern history. He's one game from Chaz Williams (eighth) and three from Jerick McKinnon (seventh).

• BJ Johnson III became the eighth member of the 1,000-yard receiving club at Georgia Southern with his performance at Arkansas State and now has 1,097 career receiving yards. He passed Teddy Craft (1,087) for seventh place with 20 yards receiving against Appalachian State and now needs 206 yards to pass Terrence Sorrell (1,302; 1989-92) for sixth place.

• BJ Johnson III now has 72 career receptions, good for fourth place all-time at Georgia Southern. The senior passed Terrence Sorrell (70) and Corey Joyner (71) with two catches against Appalachian State. He is nine catches away from third all-time at GS (80, Tony Belsler; 1985-88).

• Kevin Ellison has rushed for 2,226 yards in his three seasons in the Sun Belt Conference, which stands as the third-most in conference history for quarterback.

HEAD COACH TYSON SUMMERS

Tyson Summers is in his first season as the head coach of the Georgia Southern Eagles. Summers, who has ties to Statesboro from his time with the Eagles in 2006, has a coaching career that has spanned almost 15 years and seven schools and has been a part of seven bowl teams.

A native of Tifton, Georgia, Summers returns home from Colorado State, where he served as the Rams' defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2015. Under his tutelage, the Rams defense ranked 20th in the country in passing defense, giving up just 186.3 yards per game heading into the Arizona Bowl. After dropping two overtime games early in the season, the Rams closed the regular season on a four-game win streak, with three of those victories coming on the road.

Prior to his work at CSU, he spent three seasons at UCF, where he served as defensive coordinator in 2014 for a unit that ranked among the best in the nation.

In his first full season as a defensive coordinator in 2014, Summers, 36, guided the top defense in the American Athletic Conference, and one that ranked in the top 10 among FBS schools in total defense (5th, 298.5 ypg), rushing defense (6th, 104.3 ypg), scoring defense (9th, 19.2 ppg) and red zone defense (6th, 71.4%). Summers' defense helped UCF to a 9-4 record, a second consecutive American Athletic Conference title and a berth in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. The Knights held six opponents under 100 rushing yards and nine under 200 passing yards.

Three of Summers' defensive players earned first-team all-conference honors, while three more garnered second-team honors. That included cornerback Jacoby Glenn, who was The American's Co-Defensive Player of the Year and UCF's first Associated Press All-American (second team) since it joined the FBS level in 1996. Glenn signed as an undrafted free agent with the Chicago Bears in 2015.

Under Summers' leadership, linebacker Terrance Plummer earned back-to-back first-team All-American Athletic Conference honors in 2013 and 2014. He also was a two-time national defensive player of the week his final two years at UCF.

Summers was hired at UCF as a defensive assistant coach in 2012, and earned the title of linebackers coach one month later. For the 2014 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and that spring season, he was named interim defensive coordinator before being promoted to full-time defensive coordinator in April when spring camp concluded.

Summers helped call the plays in UCF's upset victory over high-powered Baylor in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, capping an unforgettable season for the Knights. The win enabled UCF to set a school record with 12 victories overall and achieve a program-high by being ranked No. 10 in the final AP Top 25 Poll. Plummer was named Defensive MVP of the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, along with his first-team all-conference honors.

In 2012, Summers tutored three Knight linebackers into consistent a group that led UCF to a Conference USA East Division crown, a Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl win and a 10-4 record. Plummer, in his first year as the Knights' middle linebacker, went on to rack up 108 tackles with seven for loss. On the outsides, Ray Shipman broke out in just his second full season as he amassed 91 tackles. Previously a running back, Jonathan Davis was named the team's Most Improved Defensive Player, capping off the year with 99 tackles, including nine for a loss.

Summers' tenure at UCF came after a five-year stint at UAB that began in December 2006. He served as the Blazers' linebackers coach and added the roles of safeties coach and co-special teams coordinator in the final season of his tenure.

In his first year working with the UAB safeties in 2011, Summers helped mentor Jamie Bender in his senior season as he led the Blazers with 119 tackles. Bender also posted 7.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, six break-ups and four forced fumbles. He was voted on to the All-C-USA Second Team for that performance. On special teams, UAB ranked 17th in the nation by allowing just 4.71 yards per punt return, while freshman kicker Ty Long was named a 2011 Freshman All-American by Phil Steele's College Football Preview.

In Summers' first year at UAB, linebacker Joe Henderson was named to the All-C-USA Second Team. In 2008, Henderson climbed up to the first team thanks to a team-high 87 tackles as well as 12.5 tackles for loss, and went on to play for the BC Lions of the CFL from 2010-11. With a new wave of linebackers under Summers' control in 2010, Marvin Burdette paced the Blazers with 114 tackles en route to All-C-USA Honorable Mention accolades. While Summers was with UAB, kicker Swayze Waters was an All-C-USA First-Team pick in 2007 and 2008, and appeared in NFL preseason games highlighted by a stint with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2011.

Summers coached the safeties at GS in 2006 a year after serving as a graduate assistant for Georgia in 2005. That season, the Bulldogs won the SEC title and earned a berth in the Sugar Bowl which was played in Atlanta after Hurricane Katrina displaced the bowl. Summers worked with the secondary and witnessed three UGA defensive backs being selected in the NFL Draft: Tim Jennings (second round, first-team All-SEC), DeMario Minter (fifth round, first-team All-SEC) and Greg Blue (fifth round, first-team All-American).

During the 2004 season, Summers was a G.A. at Troy, which reached the postseason and the Silicon Valley Classic, and in 2003, he helped guide the defensive backs at Presbyterian College. Summers earned his first coaching position at Tift County (Ga.) High where coached the defensive backs in 2002.

A four-year letterwinner at Presbyterian College, Summers earned preseason All-South Atlantic honors as a linebacker in 1999 and was selected as team captain as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in political science from PC in 2002.

Summers is married to the former Beth King, and the couple has three sons, Jake, Walker and Anderson.

DYNAMIC DUO LEADS EAGLE OFFENSE ONCE AGAIN

• Georgia Southern features one of the nation's top quarterback duos in seniors Kevin Ellison and Favian Upshaw. While Ellison has started 31 of the past 36 games, it's the quarterback who is hot and moving the chains who gets the call. In last year's GoDaddy Bowl victory over Bowling Green, Upshaw ran for 199 yards and four touchdowns to earn MVP honors of the game, but it was Ellison who ran for 134 yards and two scores and passed for 105 more to help lead the Eagles to a road win at Idaho.

• The combo of Ellison and Upshaw had the most rushing yards of any full-time quarterback duo in the FBS last year with a combined 1,291 yards. Ellison ran for 708 yards and eight TDs while Upshaw tallied 583 yards and six scores.

• True freshman quarterback Seth Shuman has earned playing time of late due to injuries to the co-starters. Shuman played for Coach Rance Gillespie at Valdosta High and was a second-team selection to the 2015 Georgia Sports Writers Association All-State Football Team after breaking the Wildcats' single-season passing record.

• The Valdosta native also played baseball, earning Region 1-6A Pitcher of the Year honors as a senior thanks to a 1.53 ERA over 59 innings with 80 strikeouts to just 15 walks.

• Shuman was selected by the Baltimore Orioles 39th round of the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft with the 1,171st pick as a right-handed pitcher and could eventually play baseball for Georgia Southern as well.

THE KOREAN CONNECTION

• The Eagles have the rare distinction of having two Korean-born players on its roster in Andy Kwon and Younghoe Koo.

• Koo, who made seven field goals and had 45 touchbacks last season, was born Aug. 3, 1994 in Seoul, South Korea, to parents Seungmae Choi and Hyunseo Koo. He was raised in Ridgewood, New Jersey, before signing with Georgia Southern in 2013.

• Kwon, whose birth name is Nam Kyu Kwon, was an all-conference offensive lineman last year at center and was born less than two months later, also in Seoul. He was born on Sept. 30, 1994 to Bruce Kwon and Anna Moon and hails from Suwanee, Georgia.

rushed for 682 yards and seven touchdowns on 101 attempts, averaging 6.8 yards per carry. He also had four receptions for 105 yards and one touchdown, including a 60-yard scoring reception against New Mexico State.

- For his efforts, he was named to the All-Sun Belt Newcomer Team and was named the Offensive MVP of the GoDaddy Bowl after rushing for 75 yards and a touchdown while also catching a 17-yard pass in the Eagles' 58-27 win over Bowling Green.

THEY CALL HIM IRONHEAD

- Senior linebacker Deshawntee Gallon has wreaked havoc on opponents the past two-plus seasons, amassing 211 tackles and four blocked kicks.

- Nicknamed "Ironhead" by his father, Shawn, at a young age, Gallon earned honorable mention All-Sun Belt honors last season after recording 81 total tackles (39u, 42a) with 1.5 sacks, two blocked kicks, 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and three pass breakups.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

- Georgia Southern lost its top receiving threat in **BJ Johnson III** last season when he went down with a broken clavicle against Idaho. Originally feared to be lost for the year, Johnson progressed quicker than anyone expected and returned to the field against Troy on Nov. 14, missing just four games. The senior has 73 receptions for 1,097 yards and four touchdowns in his career, including 23 catches for a career-high 320 yards and a score this year.

HOME-GROWN TALENT

- There are 84 players on the Georgia Southern roster who are from the state of Georgia.

HELMET TECHNOLOGY

When Georgia Southern started preseason camp in 2013, it joined an elite group of collegiate football teams employing the Helmet Impact Telemetry System (HITS), which measures and records every hit to the head during practices and games.

With funding from the Office of the Vice President for Research and Economic Development, Georgia Southern has equipped 40 helmets with the Riddell HITS system. There are six sensors inside each helmet that measure the severity of a hit to the head.

A typical impact in football lasts about 15 milliseconds, and in that instant, measurements from the sensors will be transmitted in nearly real-time to a laptop computer being monitored on the sidelines of all practices and games.

If a hit reaches a certain threshold, a pager worn by a graduate research student and the head athletics trainer will receive a notification and will follow with appropriate action and attention. If they display any unusual behavior, a clinical evaluation will be conducted to see if it is safe for him to continue playing or not.

Each impact is time stamped and can be synchronized with game video so coaches, athletics trainers and researchers can better evaluate the hits.

Less than two dozen schools are using the system around the country. Other schools to use the HITS system in their football programs include Virginia Tech, North Carolina and Oklahoma, putting GS at the forefront of concussion prevention in college football.

I LOVE L.A.

- While a lot of the attention is thrust on **Matt Breida** and his numbers, **L.A. Ramsby** helps form one of the top rushing groups in the country.

- Originally recruited as an option quarterback, the redshirt junior was moved to running back and ran for 691 yards and 12 touchdowns in 2014 as the Eagles led the FBS with an average of 381.1 rushing yards per game.

- His legal name is Alfred Ramsby Jr., but is nicknamed L.A. - for Little Al (his father is Alfred Ramsby Sr.).

- The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored at least one touchdown in the final 10 games of the 2014 season, and scored a touchdown in the final nine games of 2015.

- Ramsby has rushed for 1,788 career yards and scored 30 touchdowns thus far.

EAGLE ANALYTICS

- Georgia Southern finished 2014 - its first year in the FBS and final year of transition from the FCS - with a bowl eligible 9-3 record, but had its bowl waiver request denied by the NCAA. One of those wins (ULM) has since been vacated by the NCAA due to sanctions.
- GS joined only Nevada (1992) and Marshall (1997) to win a conference title in their first year of FBS play, and became the **first** to go undefeated in conference play in winning the title.
- In two-plus seasons at the FBS level, the Eagles have recorded 11,471 rushing yards, the most in the FBS over the past two seasons ahead of Navy's 11,038 yards.
- Last season, an FBS-high four Eagle players rushed for 600 yards or more.
- The past two years, Georgia Southern has led the country in rushing at 381.1 (2014) and 363.0 (2015) yards per contest, which were the second and fourth-best totals, respectively, since 1997.

- Georgia Southern's 7.1 YPC in 2014 and its 6.5 YPC last year ranked as the second- and ninth-highest averages, respectively, over the past 20 seasons in FBS. The 7.1 average was the second-best amongst teams in "Group of 5" leagues (Nevada, 7.4 YPC, 2009) while the 6.5 YPC average was the fourth-best during that span. The two averages are top two ever for any Sun Belt member.
- GS led the country last season with six of the top 20 rushing single games in FBS. No other team in the FBS had three (Oregon and Air Force each had two).
- Dating back to the Sun Belt's formation in 2001, GS has had three of the top five single-game rushing totals in the history of the SBC and the Eagles are just two full seasons in the league.
- GS hasn't just set Sun Belt records in rushing yards, touchdowns and yards per carry, but have done so by a significant margin in each category:

- Football operations is a critical position within a staff, a catch-all post that serves as the head coach's right-hand man, or in this case, woman. **Cymone George**, who handles the role as the Director of Football Operations for the Eagles, is responsible for taking care of all the travel arrangements, meals for the players and staff, and all the day-to-day operations of the football team.
- George is one of just eight women to hold the position of director of football operations at an FBS school (128 schools), joining Danielle Bartelstein (Virginia Tech), Amanda Gilpin (UTSA), Deborah Goldstein (Washington), Heather Henderson (Florida Atlantic), Sarah Lawless (UConn), Lois Manin (Hawaii) and Diane McPheeters (Baylor).

GEORGIA SOUTHERN FOOTBALL TRADITIONS

• Georgia Southern has a rich tradition in the college football world, winning six Division I-AA national titles, but also has traditions that make the program unique.

Yellow School Buses

• When the football program was resurrected in 1981, the team needed a way to travel to practices and games. Operating on a shoestring budget didn't allow for transportation back then, let alone any luxurious travel. The Bulloch County Board of Education stepped in with a deal the University couldn't refuse: GS would only pay \$1 each for two yellow school buses. The football team still uses the buses to this day, taking them to practices and using them on game day, as well.

Beautiful Eagle Creek

• When Georgia Southern resurrected the football program in 1981, traditions and spirit needed resurrection as well. So legendary head football coach Erk Russell created his own. Inspired by the gnat-infested drainage ditch that cut across the field between what was then the team's locker room and practice fields, Russell convinced his players that its stagnant water was actually "Beautiful Eagle Creek," a source of "magical" waters.

Freedom's Flight

• In what has become one of the most popular traditions at GS, "Freedom," a male American Bald Eagle, takes flight before each home football game. Freedom is a Southern Bald Eagle that was found knocked out of the nest in Maitland, Florida. Only weeks old and appearing like a "brown ball of fuzz", it was discovered that the young eagle had an injury to its beak and suffered from an infection. Rushed to the Florida Audubon Center for Birds of Prey, Freedom made a complete recovery from the infection but the injury to the beak was permanent, preventing his release into the wild.

• With the permission of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, GS acquired Freedom in 2004. Through the Georgia Southern University Center for Wildlife Education and Lamar Q. Ball Jr. Raptor Center, thousands of visitors young and old are embraced by the Power of Freedom.

• Under the supervision of Steve Hein, Director of the Center for Wildlife Education, Freedom is on the sidelines of all GS home games, and select road games.

Game #1: Defense Pitches Shut Out in Summers' Debut

STATESBORO – Quarterback Favian Upshaw accounted for 168 yards and four touchdowns, and Georgia Southern opened the 2016 football season and the era of new head coach Tyson Summers with a 54-0 victory over Savannah State at Paulson Stadium.

The Georgia Southern defense was stout in its season debut and pitched its first shutout since blanking Jacksonville 58-0 in the 2012 season opener in Paulson Stadium. The Eagles held Savannah State to 114 total yards, including 34 on the ground, and recorded three takeaways, four sacks and 11 tackles for loss. Ironhead Gallon posted six tackles, and Ukeme Eligwe finished with five tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.

The Eagles rolled up 420 yards and six touchdowns on the ground and unveiled a successful aerial attack to the tune of 185 yards and two scores. Upshaw completed 7-of-10 passes for 115 yards and two touchdowns, and Kevin Ellison was perfect on five throws for 70 yards. It was the most passing yards in a game since 2014, when the Eagles threw for 201 in a 47-24 win over Idaho in Paulson Stadium.

Montay Crockett was the primary beneficiary with three receptions for 73 yards, while Matt Breida and Wesley Fields each caught TD passes. Fields also ran for 87 yards and a score, and Breida carried 10 times for 68 yards and a TD. Demarcus Godfrey rushed 14 times for 124 yards, all in the second half.

The Eagles scored on their first three possessions of the contest to take control of the game early. Ellison threw to Crockett for a 25-yard pickup down to the Savannah State 2-yard line to set up the first score. Upshaw went around the right side on a keeper for a touchdown two plays later.

Eight players made their first collegiate starts night with 24 Georgia Southern players seeing their first collegiate action. Six true freshmen played in the game, including Monquavion Brinson who started at cornerback.

MOBILE, Ala. – The Georgia Southern defense held its opponent out of the end zone for the second consecutive week, and Favian Upshaw accounted for 235 total yards of offense as the Eagles opened Sun Belt play with a 24-9 win over South Alabama at Ladd-Peebles Stadium.

An interception in the end zone by redshirt freshman Jessie Liptrot with less than a minute to go sealed the win and preserved an impressive streak that began in the same stadium in the GoDaddy Bowl last December. The Eagles (2-0, 1-0 Sun Belt) have kept their opponents out of the end zone for 10 consecutive quarters and over 150 minutes, dating back to the first half of the bowl win over Bowling Green.

Ukeme Eligwe and Ironhead Gallon led the way with seven tackles apiece, and Eligwe also had a tackle for loss. Georgia Southern held the Jaguars (1-1, 0-1 Sun Belt) to 73 yards on the ground and combined for seven tackles for loss and a sack. The Eagle pressure forced South Alabama to convert on just five of its 19 third- and fourth-down chances.

On the other side of the ball, Upshaw and the Georgia Southern offense also picked up right where they left off in the GoDaddy Bowl, as the Eagles accounted for 441 total yards of offense – 304 on the ground and 137 through the air – and three rushing touchdowns. Upshaw rushed for 108 and threw for 127 off a 6-for-9 performance, and Kevin Ellison ran for 86 yards and a score. BJ Johnson III caught three passes for 63 yards, while Wesley Fields and L.A. Ramsby ran for TDs.

Trailing 24-9, South Alabama moved the ball down the Eagle 6-yard line, but Liptrot thwarted any hopes of a last-gasp comeback by leaping high in the air to pull down a Dallas Davis pass. He seemed to think about running it out but decided discretion would be the better part of valor in this scenario and went down for the touchdown.

After holding a 10-6 lead at halftime, Georgia Southern opened the second half with a nine-play, 73-yard drive, capped by a Fields 5-yard touchdown dive to put the Eagles up 17-6. The Eagles held the Jags scoreless in the third quarter, and Ellison added to the lead with a 27 yard TD run 49 seconds into the fourth.

The Georgia Southern defense forced South Alabama to turn the ball over on downs three times inside the Eagle 40-yard line in the second half and held the Jags to field goals three times after moving the ball inside the GS 25-yard line in the game.

Game #3: Murray's Blocked FG Lifts Eagles to Tight Win Over ULM

STATESBORO — Georgia Southern's RJ Murray blocked a 42-yard field goal attempt by ULM's Craig Ford with 1:18 to play, and the Eagles hung on for a 23-21 Sun Belt Conference football victory over the Warhawks before a school-record crowd of 25,735 at Paulson Stadium.

The Eagles were flagged with pass interference on 3rd-and-13 to give ULM a fresh set of downs at the GS 21-yard line with under two minutes to go. The Eagle defense dug in, and Chris DeLaRosa sacked Garrett Smith on third down to push ULM back and set up the long field goal try.

L.A. Ramsby rushed for 86 yards, and Wesley Fields churned up 84 and a touchdown to lead the Eagles (3-0, 2-0). Ironhead Gallon led the defense with 10 tackles, and Ukeme Eligwe had nine stops and an interception. Younghoe Koo made a career-high three field goals.

Smith threw for 283 yards and two touchdowns and ran for a score, and Marcus Green caught two passes for 75 yards and a TD for the Warhawks (1-2, 0-1).

With Georgia Southern leading 16-14, Fields dove into the end zone from the 2-yard line, and Koo added the PAT to extend the margin to 23-14 and open up some breathing room early in the fourth quarter. Montay Crockett gave the Eagles good field position with a 14-yard punt return, while Fields ripped off a 20-yard run and Ramsby had a 17-yard rush.

ULM came right back with a 57-yard pass from Smith to R.J. Turner, which set up a 10-yard touchdown pass from Smith to Green in the corner of the end zone. Ford added the extra point to cut the lead to 23-21 with 10:12 left in the game.

The Warhawks scored just 4:34 into the contest, when Smith hit Xavier Brown with a 32-yard touchdown pass, and it was the first touchdown against the Eagles in 155 minutes and 10 seconds, or over 10 quarters, dating back to last season. Smith then threw to Green for a 65-yard pickup over the middle, and Smith ran it in two plays later as ULM opened a 14-0 lead.

The Eagles used an up-tempo offense to drive 74 yards in 2:24 to trim the deficit in half on their next possession. Sixty-seven yards came on the ground, and Kevin Ellison ran it in from 6 yards out with seven seconds left in the first quarter.

Koo knocked in a 32-yarder with 3:58 left in the second quarter and kept moving back just like in the back yard. The senior made a 37-yarder and one from 43 yards out in the third quarter, and GS led 16-14 with 15 minutes to go. Meanwhile, the GS defense reverted to its previous form and allowed just 22 yards and a first down in the frame.

After picking up a first down on fourth-and-1, Terrell hit Carrington Thompson with an 8-yard touchdown pass to make the score 28-10 midway through the period.

Ellison and Upshaw engineered a nine-play, 83-yard drive on the next GS possession, and Upshaw found Myles Campbell over the middle for a 33-yard touchdown pass to make the score 28-17 with 3:11 left in the half.

But Western Michigan was not done, and the Broncos zipped down the field for a score in 1:36. Terrell found Thompson for a 29-yard pass down the right sideline and then hit Corey Davis for a 35-yard touchdown to push the lead to 35-17 at halftime.

STATESBORO — Taylor Lamb ran for 94 yards and two touchdowns and threw for 199 yards to lead Appalachian State to a 34-10 Sun Belt Conference football victory over Georgia Southern on a Thursday night at Paulson Stadium.

The Mountaineer defense held the Eagles to 159 total yards, 65 rushing yards and nine first downs in the game with a bulk of that coming on the Eagles' final drive of the contest. Appalachian State had the ball for over 15 minutes longer than Georgia Southern, and after falling behind 10-0 in the first quarter, the Mountaineers scored 34 unanswered points.

The Eagle defense held the Mountaineers in check for three quarters before wearing down. Ukeme Eligwe returned a fumble 90 yards for a touchdown and finished with 12 tackles and two pass breakups to lead Georgia Southern, while Jay Bowdry and Darius Jones Jr. each had an interception.

Jalin Moore rushed 15 times for 126 yards and a score, and Marcus Cox added 115 yards and a touchdown on the ground for Appalachian State (6-2, 4-0). Shaedon Meadors caught six passes for 126 yards.

Georgia Southern held the Mountaineers to 1-for-12 on third downs, but the Eagle offense managed to convert just 2-of-13 third downs.

Appalachian State broke a 10-10 tie with a 28-yard field goal by Michael Rubino with 3:03 to go in the third quarter. The drive was kept alive by a roughing the punter call on fourth-and-24, and Lamb hit Meadors with a 17-yard pass on fourth-and-4.

A.J. Howard picked off a Seth Shuman pass to give the Mountaineers the ball near midfield, and Lamb scampered for a 30-yard touchdown run two plays later to give App a 20-10 cushion.

Marcus Cox capped an 88-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown run as he took the late option pitch from Lamb, turned up field and broke a couple tackles to get into the end zone and make the score 27-10 early in the fourth quarter. Moore scored on a 15-yard run with 3:26 left in the game for the final margin.

An interception and a 22-yard return by Jones Jr. set GS up at the Mountaineer 29-yard line early in the contest. The Eagles moved the ball down to the App 1-yard line but had to settle for a 32-yard field goal by Younghoe Koo.

The Mountaineers were set to try a 31-yard field goal late in the first quarter, but the ball was snapped before holder Bentley Critcher was ready. It caromed off his hands, and Eligwe scooped it up, took off down the left sideline, picked up block from Jones, Jr. and raced 90 yards for a touchdown and a 10-0 GS lead.

Game #8: Rebels Hold Off Pesky Eagles in Oxford

OXFORD, Miss. — Akeem Judd rushed 26 times for 139 yards and a touchdown, and Ole Miss scored 21 straight points in the second quarter to earn a 37-27 football victory over Georgia Southern at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Matt Breida had 100 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries, and Myles Campbell caught four passes for 121 yards - the most for an Eagle in six seasons - and a score. Kevin Ellison rushed for 54 yards and a score and threw for 134 yards and a touchdown.

Chad Kelly threw for 226 yards and a touchdown and ran for two scores for Ole Miss before leaving the game in the third quarter. Evan Ingram caught four passes for 75 yards and a touchdown, and Damore'ea Stringfellow had five receptions for 66 yards.

Trailing by 10 points at halftime, Georgia Southern made it a one-possession game twice in the second half on a pair of field goals by Younghoe Koo, but the Eagles could not get the equalizing touchdown.

The game began to turn in the second quarter after the Eagles opened a 21-10 lead on a 68-yard touchdown run by Breida. The senior found a hole up the middle and raced untouched for the score and the longest touchdown run of the season for the Eagles.

With momentum in hand, Georgia Southern tried the surprise onside kick, but Ole Miss senior Hunter Thurley was there to make the recovery. The Rebels took advantage of the short field and after completing a 35-yard pass to Stringfellow, Kelly ran it in from five yards out to trim the lead to 21-17.

Ole Miss got the ball back at its own 40-yard line after a GS punt and gobbled up 60 yards in 1:26, taking the lead on a 9-yard touchdown run by Judd. The Rebel defense forced a three-and-out, and Kelly hit Ingram for a 38-yard touchdown pass on the third play from scrimmage, capping a 21-point surge in just over eight minutes and giving Ole Miss a 31-21 advantage at halftime.

Georgia Southern came out of the gates firing on all cylinders and rolled up 113 yards of offense while taking a 14-3 lead in the first quarter. Ellison found Campbell for a 29-yard touchdown pass and ran for a 9-yard score on the quarterback keeper. The second touchdown was set up when Malik Henry blocked an Ole Miss punt to give the Eagles the ball near midfield.
