OF NOTE

• Despite their proximity, Georgia Southern and Georgia State have met just eight times before with the Panthers leading series tied 5-3. The Eagles won the first game in the series 69-31 in 2014 in Atlanta, but then the Panthers took the next three games, winning 34-7 in 2015 in Statesboro, 30-24 in 2016 in Atlanta and 21-17 in 2017 in Statesboro. GS won the next two games, 35-14 in 2018 in Atlanta and 38-10 in 2019 in Statesboro before the Panthers won 30-24 in Atlanta in 2020 and 21-14 in Statesboro last year.

• Former Georgia Southern cornerbacks coach Corey Peoples is in his third season coaching at Georgia State.

• Georgia Southern has 89 of 134 players on its roster (66.4%) from the state of Georgia.

• The Eagles are 1-1 at Center Parc Stadium. Offensive tackle Brian Miller and defensive backs Justin Birdsong and Nalee Thompson will be playing their third game in the stadium.

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 10 **Ten** players, including three true freshmen, have made their first start at Georgia Southern this season.
- 9 Sixth-year quarterback Kyle Vantrease is **ninth** in the country (FBS) in total offense, averaging 323.4 yards per contest.
- 8 **Eight** players on offense have started all five games thus far.
- 7 Junior Jalen White has scored a career-high **seven** touchdowns on the ground already this season in just five games.
- 6 The Eagles have **six** different players with a touchdown catch, led by Derwin Burgess Jr. with three.
- 5 Kyle Vantrease has thrown a touchdown pass in **five** straight games, tying the school record set by Chaz Williams in 2004 and equaled by Antonio Henton in 2008 and Jaybo Shaw in 2011.
- 4 The Georgia State game marks Georgia Southern's **fourth** road game in its first six contests of the 2022 season. In total, the Eagles will play five of their first eight games on the road before finishing with three of their last four at home.
- 3 This will be Georgia Southern's **third** game at Center Parc Stadium. The Eagles are 1-1 after winning in 2018, but falling in 2020.
- 2 Alex Raynor is **2 for 2** on field goals of 40 yards or longer this season, including a season-long 45-yarder at Coastal Carolina last week.
- 1 Punter Anthony Beck II now stands alone at **first** in school history for most career punts with 198. He is averaging a program-best 43.28 yards per punt for his career.

HEAD COACH CLAY HELTON

Clay Helton, who led USC to a Rose Bowl title in 2016, was named the 11th full-time head coach in the Georgia Southern modern football era on Nov. 2, 2021. He is in his first season as the Eagles' head coach.

The 50-year-old Helton went 46-24 (.657) as the head coach of the USC Trojans with 12 victories over AP Top 25 teams, including three in the Top 5 and four in the Top 10. He went 5-1 in a pandemic-shortened 2020 season and was 8-5 in 2019 with wins over No. 23 Stanford and No. 10 Utah. Helton went 11-3 in 2017 with wins over No. 14 Stanford twice (including in the Pac-12 Championship Game) and No. 23 Arizona, and went 10-3 in 2016 with wins over No. 4 Washington, No. 5 Penn State in a legendary Rose Bowl thriller and No. 21 Colorado.

Helton was the first USC head coach to have 10-win seasons in each of his first two full seasons, and he had more wins (21) in his first two full seasons than any USC coach. He led USC to a 13-game winning streak from 2016 to 2017 and a 13-game winning streak over Power 5 opponents from 2016 to 2017.

Helton joined the USC staff in February of 2010 as the quarterbacks coach after spending 10 seasons as an assistant at Memphis. He added the passing game coordinator role in 2012 and became the offensive coordinator in 2013.

Helton began his 10-year (2000-09) Memphis career as the running backs coach for three seasons, then coached the Tigers' receivers for the next four seasons before becoming the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the final three years. He served as Memphis' interim head coach for several months in early 2006 when head coach Tommy West had off-season heart surgery.

Before Memphis, he was the running backs coach at Houston, his alma mater, for three seasons (1997-99), working under his father, head coach Kim Helton. He began his coaching career at Duke, serving as a graduate assistant in 1995 and then the running backs coach in 1996.

Helton played quarterback at Houston in 1993 and 1994, playing for his father both seasons and captaining the Cougars as a 1994 senior. He spent 1991 and 1992 at Auburn, where he earned 1992 SEC All-Academic honors. He redshirted there in 1990.

Helton earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics and interdisciplinary science from Houston in 1994 and prepped at Clements High in Sugar Land, Texas.

Helton was born on June 24, 1972, in Gainesville, Florida. He and his wife, Angela, have three children: sons Reid and Turner, and daughter Aubrey. Turner is a true freshman quarterback at Western Kentucky.

Besides being Houston's head coach from 1993 to 1999, his father, Kim, was an assistant in college (Florida, Miami, and Alabama Birmingham), the NFL (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Houston Oilers, Los Angeles Raiders, Washington Redskins), and the CFL (Toronto Argonauts) following his playing career at Florida.

His brother, Tyson, was the quarterbacks coach and pass game coordinator at USC (2016-17) until becoming Tennessee's offensive coordinator in 2018 and is now the head coach at Western Kentucky.

NOTABLE STREAKS AND TRENDS ENTERING THE GAME

- Georgia Southern has had a 100-yard rusher in 77 of its past 105 games dating back to its move to the FBS in 2014.
- Dating back to the start of the 2018 season, Georgia Southern has won 24 of its past 31 games when having a 100-yard rusher.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Georgia Southern has had 37 100-yard rushing performances, coming from nine different players. The nine different 100-yard rushers is the most in the conference during that span.
- GS has outrushed its opponent in 73 of the past 105 games dating back to its move to the FBS in 2014.
- GS has won 19 of the past 27 games dating back to the start of the 2019 season when winning the rushing battle.
- The Eagles have won 47 of the past 50 games when they've rushed for 300 yards or more.
- The Eagles have won 72 consecutive games when rushing for at least 400 yards dating back to a 1998 loss against UMass when rushing for 457 yards in the I-AA Championship Game.
- Georgia Southern has had five 500-yard rushing performances since joining the FBS in 2014. The rest of the league has combined for three 500-yard rushing games during that span.
- The Eagles have a +30 turnover margin since the start of the 2017 season, taking the ball away 107 times against 77 turnovers.
- GS has forced at least one turnover in 49 of its past 68 games dating back to the start of the 2017 season.
- Dating back to 2017, the Eagles have won 19 of their past 25 games when not committing a turnover.
- Dating back to 2014, the Eagles have won 35 of their past 48 games when winning the turnover battle.
- The Eagles are 203-32 in the modern era (since 1983) when winning the turnover battle in a game, 69-93 when losing it, and 69-33 when the margin is tied.
- In the modern era, GS is 240-19 when scoring 30 or more points, 103-142-1 when scoring less than 30 points. As a member of the FBS (since 2014), the Eagles are 39-5 when scoring 30 or more points, 17-43 when scoring less than 30 points.
- GS is 215-1 all-time when having a lead of 18 or more points at any point in the game. That lone loss came in 2005 when the Eagles led at Texas State 35-16 in the third quarter and lost 50-35.
- The Eagles have won 65 straight games when holding a lead of 17 or more points at any point in a game dating back to that 2005 Texas State game.
- Since 1983, Georgia Southern is 198-16 when allowing 17 points or less. The last time the Eagles lost a game when allowing less than 18 points was in 2013, a 16-14 loss to Furman at home. The current streak of victories when allowing 17 or less points is at 29.

fumble and a fumble recovery that he returned 22 yards for a touchdown at Army West Point. That touchdown was especially meaningful as his father, Derrick, spent 22 years in the U.S. Army.

• He was named a Freshman All-American by both The Athletic and the FWAA, as well as a first-team All-Sun Belt corner by most outlets. According to Pro Football Focus, Canteen had the third-highest coverage grade among Group of 5 cornerbacks who played 50 percent of defensive snaps last season at an 80.8 and gave up just 32 receptions on 69 targets (46.4 percent, fourth best among G5 cornerbacks) with just two penalties.

• With the stage set for a big 2021, Canteen suffered a torn pectoral muscle against Florida Atlantic in the third game last year and missed the rest of the season. He spent the remainder of the year up in the coaches' box on games days as Coach Canteen, but is back in 2022, ready to get back to his ball-hawking ways of 2020.

High, he was diagnosed with Dermatofibrosarcoma Protuberans (DFSP) in his right shoulder. He was going in to have some scar tissue removed when the doctors diagnosed him. DFSP is a rare type of cancer, a soft tissue sarcoma that develops in the deep layers of skin. He had several surgeries to remove the mass and then had a skin graft in which they took skin from his groin and placed it on his shoulder. The cancer caused him to miss most of his final season, but he was cleared on a Thursday and played the next night, returning for the final five games of his season.

• He signed with Georgia Southern in February 2016. In 2016, Bradley-Glenn was contributing as a true freshman at both linebacker and special teams before suffering a torn ACL in pre-game warm-ups at Arkansas State and missed the rest of the season. He underwent rehab in the offseason and returned to full strength in 2017, finishing with 25 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss.

• The injury bug bit him again in 2018 and he underwent a successful meniscectomy in that same left knee after suffering a non-contact injury on the second day of preseason camp. He had the surgery on Aug. 16 and missed the first game of the season.

• He returned for the second game of the season, at No. 2 Clemson, but suffered a knee injury in his other knee a few games later against Arkansas State, sending him to the sidelines for the remainder of the season.

• After another lengthy rehab session, he returned in 2019 healthy and contributed 19 tackles on the season. He started the final four games of 2020 and tallied 24 tackles, including 1.5 for loss.

• On Dec. 9, 2020, Bradley went to the Bulloch County Courthouse to finish the process to legally change his last name to honor his stepfather, James Glenn, who has helped raise him since he was in the third grade. He surprised James pre-game with his new name on his jersey for the final home game.

• Taking advantage of the COVID ruling, Bradley-Glenn returned last year for a sixth season, but suffered a torn biceps in the first preseason scrimmage, thus sidelining him for yet another season.

• He has elected to return for a seventh year, one made possible by a hardship waiver granted to give him his 2016 season back due to the first knee injury.

• Bradley-Glenn has already graduated with a degree

in marketing and is now working on a second degree in construction engineering. He hosts a book club for several members of the team and also has a podcast called "Last of the Hard" in which he brings teammates on as guests to talk about life away from football. He's also an avid fisherman who started an anglers club amongst his friends and teammates.

• Bradley-Glenn (born June 11, 1997) is the oldest player on the team at age 25 and played as a true freshman in 2016. This year's freshman class was in the sixth grade when Bradley-Glenn took his first snaps as an Eagle in 2016.

• He signed with Georgia Southern in February of 2016 in a class that included Kindle Vildor, who is now in his third year in the NFL with the Chicago Bears.

B-MILLER

• Heading into the 2019 season, offensive lineman **Brian Miller** had earned preseason all-conference accolades from several magazines and was expected to be the anchor at right tackle for the Eagles.

• That all changed on Aug. 18 in the preseason when he suffered a dislocated right hip in a freak, non-contact injury at practice. He had surgery soon after to repair the hip and began a long road to recovery. There was doubt he would ever play again. But after a rigorous rehabilitation, which included work on a zero-gravity treadmill, Miller returned in 2020 and started six games for the Eagles.

- He was a nominee for the 2020 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year, an award won by his teammate Drew Wilson in 2019.

- In 2020, he played in 12 games, seeing action on 456 offensive snaps. He earned second-team All-Sun Belt Conference honors from Pro Football Focus and was named the Georgia Southern Comeback Athlete of the Year.

- The Savannah native came to Georgia Southern as a defensive lineman, but moved to the offensive side of the ball his redshirt season.

- In 2018, he started all 13 games in his first year on the line at right tackles and was on the field for 732 total plays (659 offensive, 73 special teams). He moved over to left tackle in 2020 and started 12 games in 2021. He elected to use his COVID year to return in 2022 and has moved to left guard. He suffered a broken finger in pre-season camp which resulted in surgery.

- Miller and his wife, Michelle, were married in 2019.

MAKING FAMILY HISTORY

- Sixth-year player **Dillon Springer** became the first member of his family to graduate from college when we walked across the state at Georgia Southern with a degree in interdisciplinary studies.

- His grandmother has 14 children and around 30 grandchildren with Springer becoming the first to graduate from college.

- Springer has played in 45 games for the Eagles, starting 26 at defensive end.

- He was born and raised in Louisiana, but attended high school at Midland High in Texas before enrolling at

Trinity Valley Community College in 2017. He enrolled at Georgia Southern in the fall of 2018.

KVT

- Georgia Southern picked up a big piece of its offensive puzzle when Buffalo graduate **Kyle Vantrease** decided to transfer to the Eagles in January.

- As a senior last season for the Bulls, Vantrease played in the first 10 games (all starts) and was 161 of 262 for 1,861 yards, eight touchdowns and six interceptions. He also rushed for three touchdowns.

- Vantrease played a variety of sports growing up in Stow, Ohio, and also helped his high school team as the punter. At Buffalo, he stepped into that role to help preserve the redshirt of another player in 2019, averaging 34.5 yards on 16 punts. In 2021, he averaged 65 yards on two punts, including an 81-yarder at Nebraska.

- Vantrease, whose mother Patti swam at Bowling Green, received his undergraduate degree from Buffalo in business administration.

- Oddly enough, Vantrease already has a pretty good feeling for several opponents on this year's schedule. In his final 14 games at Buffalo, he played five games against teams Georgia Southern will play this season: Ball State, Marshall, Nebraska, Coastal Carolina and Old Dominion.

- Nicknamed the "Ginger General" by a high school coach, Vantrease was also a competitive swimmer and is an avid bowler who once broke 280.

A MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

- **Logan Langemeier** took an odd path to Statesboro from his hometown in North Lake Tahoe, California. He signed with Jacksonville University and played two seasons with the Dolphins and then the program was discontinued following the 2019 season.

- He transferred to Georgia Southern for the spring of 2020 and has taken every snap at center the past two seasons for the Eagles.

- In all, he has started 47 straight college games (tackle at JU, center at GS) and had been on the field for 2,790 **CONSECUTIVE** offensive snaps (1,065 over 17 games at JU in 2018 and 2019; 1,725 over 25 games at GS from 2020-2022) before coming off when the Eagles had a big lead in the opener against Morgan State.

- Langemeier graduated in May with a degree in accounting and is slated to earn his Master's degree this December. He is using his COVID-19 season granted by the NCAA to return for a fifth year of eligibility.

- His mother, Loral Langemeier, has written finance books which have appeared on The New York Times Best Seller list and she has been on The Dr. Phil Show and other media outlets.

THE SWISS AMARE KNIFE

- Georgia Southern's most versatile player could be **Amare Jones**, one of 11 Eagles to use their COVID year to return in 2022.

- While listed as a receiver, Jones has seen action at running back, can line up as a punt returner and kick returner and could even be used at quarterback to get the ball in his hands. He got the start at quarterback in the 2021 opener and has seen action all over the field in his time at Georgia Southern.

THE POWER OF PAULSON

- Georgia Southern holds one of the best home-field advantages in the FBS, posting a 206-46 record at Allen E. Paulson Stadium. That winning percentage is the fourth-best out of all currently used FBS stadiums, trailing only Alabama, Boise State and Oklahoma.

- The Eagles are 28-9 all-time at Paulson Stadium when playing in front of 20,000 or more fans.

• As a star player at Frisco Heritage High in Texas, Jones averaged 126.5 passing yards per game and 130.9 rushing yards per game during his varsity career and was all over the field at Tulane. As a freshman in 2018, he ranked second among all freshmen in The American Athletic Conference with 939 all-purpose yards. As a sophomore, he finished the year with 1,611 all-purpose yards, which ranks seventh in Tulane history all-time, fifth that season in the AAC and 22nd nationally.

• Jones was one of 63 players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, which recognizes the top offensive player in Division I football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell: integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity; specifically, tenacity to persist and determination to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals. In addition, the nominee must meet one or more of the following criteria: born in Texas and/or graduated from a Texas High School and/or played at a Texas-based junior college or currently playing at Texas DI four-year college.

GOPHER TO EAGLE

• Junior kicker **Michael Lantz** grew up in Peachtree City, Georgia, but signed with Minnesota coming out of high school. His first encounter with Georgia Southern wasn't a great experience, but he hopes to get back on better ground this season.

• In 2019, Lantz was kicking for the Golden Gophers when the Eagles came to town. While he made all five PATs in the Gopher's comeback win, he had his lone field goal attempt - a 36-yarder - blocked by Reynard Ellis and returned 77 yards by Monquavion Brinson for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

• Lantz is looking to bounce back after sitting out last season with an injury and transferring to Statesboro this past offseason. He finished second on the team in scoring with 71 points (8 FG, 47 PAT) in 2019 and made a career-long 40-yard field goal in an Outback Bowl win against Auburn.

• The communications major likes to sing hymns to himself before he kicks and he's partial to "Amazing Grace."

• Georgia Southern currently has two NFL kickers in Younghoe Koo (Falcons) and Tyler Bass (Bills) and also had alum Rob Bironas (Titans) play in the NFL from 2005-2013.

• A 2022 Ray Guy Award candidate, senior punter **Anthony Beck II** is re-writing the Georgia Southern record books.

• Beck II had a 74-yard punt in the 2019 opener at LSU and set a school record the most punts downed inside the 20-yard line with 24 in 2019.

• Last season, he set a school record with 17 50-yard punts and his average of 45.02 also set a school record for a single season.

• While he still has a year to go, his performance so far has set his career average at No. 1 in school history.

• Beck, from nearby Guyton, has already graduated from Georgia Southern with a degree in management. His sister, Lt. Courtney Cronin, is in the United States Air Force.

• He attended a kicking camp this past summer in Birmingham that featured for GS and now Atlanta Falcon kicker Younghoe Koo, Carolina Panthers punter Johnny Hekker and Las Vegas Raiders punter A.J. Cole.

MORE STALLIONS IN THE STABLE

• Georgia Southern has long had a rich history at the running back position with stars like Adrian Peterson and Matt Breida, among some, roaming the field. The reigns have been turned over to a pair of juniors in **Jalen White**

and **Gerald Green**, both of whom were named preseason Doak Walker Award candidates.

• Patiently waiting his turn, White finally broke loose against Arkansas State last year, rushing 13 times for a career-high 167 yards and two scores. He rushed for 383 yards and four touchdowns in 2021, averaging 5.3 yards per rush.

• A native of Daleville, Alabama, White was a first-team All-USA selection by USA Today after leading the nation in rushing yards as a senior. In just 11 games, he posted 3,517 rushing yards, which also set an Alabama state record and he also set a state single-game scoring record with eight touchdowns (all in the first half) against Barbour County.

• White was named to the state's Super-All State team, which compiles the top 12 football players from the state regardless of classification. As a senior, he carried the ball 217 times for a 16.2-yard average and 48 touchdowns.

• Green played at East Coweta High and was an honorable mention all-state selection to the Group 7A team by the AJC after scoring over 20 touchdowns and rushing for nearly 1,500 yards as a senior.

• Green crossed the 1,000-yard mark for his career in the opener this year.

• Freshman **OJ Arnold** threw his name into the hat in the opener when he ran for 45 yards and a touchdown and also caught a touchdown pass. Arnold became the first Eagle player to record a rushing and receiving touchdown in the same game since running back Wesley Fields did it against South Alabama in 2017.

• The Quitman native was a first-team all-state selection by the AJC for the 1A Public level as a senior, earning the state's offensive player of the year for the level.

FROM FIREFIGHTING TO SNOOP DOGG

- New defensive coordinator **Will Harris** took a unique route to college coaching, perhaps unlike any in college football. It involves, in part, two fire departments, an award-winning rapper who is in the WWE Hall of Fame, and a lot of hard work.

- After completing his collegiate playing career at USC, Harris spent some time in the Seattle Seahawks camp and played for the Edmonton Eskimos of the Canadian Football League. Upon his retirement from playing, he earned his EMT certificate and began training and interviewing for jobs with the Los Angeles and Austin (Texas) Fire Departments.

- To help supplement the cost of training to become a firefighter, Harris began training local California youth in football and then got a call from Calvin Broadus - better known as entertainment legend Snoop Dogg - whom he met from his playing days at USC. Broadus encouraged Harris to join his Snoop Youth Football League - a league that helps young players through the teaching of character, integrity, discipline and teamwork gained through playing football - as a coach and mentor, which Harris did in the spring of 2013.

- Wanting to get into the college ranks, Harris put together a resume with three references: Pete Carroll (his coach at USC and now head coach of the Seattle Seahawks), three-time Super Bowl-winning linebacker Ken Norton Jr. (who was his position coach at USC), and Snoop Dogg. It worked as he caught on with Northwestern Oklahoma State in the fall of 2013.

- Harris credits a voice mail from Broadus to then head coach Alan Hall as a driving force behind him getting the job, which set in motion his quick rise up the coaching ranks.

- Harris moved to Humboldt State in 2014, to Dixie College in 2015, to San Jose State in 2016 and finally to Washington in 2018. At 35 years old, he is now one of the youngest defensive coordinators in the FBS.

- As a player, Harris was a part of four Rose Bowl teams, including the one that played Texas in the legendary 2005 BCS National Championship Game.

STEPPING OUT OF BIG SHADOWS

- New special teams coach **Turner West** is carving his own path to notoriety after standing in the shadows of some big figures growing up.

- West was a 6-1, 180 pound wide receiver and tight end at Briarcrest Christian in Memphis, helping lead his team to a state title his freshman season.

- The next season, Briarwood got a new player, a 6-5, 300-pound offensive lineman named Michael Oher and West lined up next to him many times on offense. Oher's story is well known and was the subject of the popular movie based on the book, "The Blind Side."

- Briarcrest Christian went on to win another state title, Oher went on to play at Ole Miss and in the NFL, the book was a best-seller and Sandra Bullock won an Oscar for her portrayal of Leigh Anne Tuohy in the 2009 drama.

- West played college football from 2006-09 at Memphis, where his father Tommy West was the head

ANTHONY P. TIPPINS FAMILY INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY



Ground was broken on the Anthony P. Tippins Family Indoor Practice Facility prior to the annual spring game on April 23, 2022. The \$12.3 million facility is being built adjacent to Allen E. Paulson Stadium and will serve all 17 NCAA-sponsored athletic programs.

The transformative project, which is slated for completion in early 2023, will benefit the needs of all 400 student-athletes while also creating new revenue-generating activities for the department.

The facility will feature a 91,300-square-foot practice area, highlighted by synthetic turf, fully-covered 120-yard regulation football field.

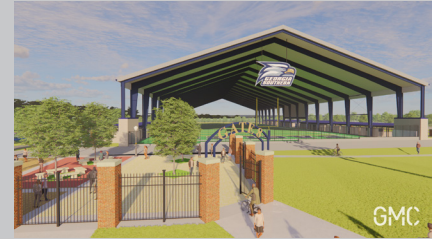
The facility will also feature an approximately 30-yard practice area for supplemental drills. An advanced netting system will be installed to further enhance training opportunities for our student-athletes, particularly football, baseball, softball, men's soccer, women's soccer and women's track and field.

The facility will have an interior height of 65 feet that will allow for a variety of practice drills (not inclusive of live punting). The practice field will have a 20-foot buffer outside the sideline perimeter that provides a safe space to conduct live play workouts.

The north and south sides of the structure will be outfitted with tailgating suites that will be utilized on game days. The south side suites will have 16 regular-size tailgating suites and two large tailgating suites and are positioned to have a close-up viewing of the Eagle Walk pre-game.

The north side of the structure will have a total of 12 regular-size suites and two large tailgating suites. In an effort to further enhance the fan experience at Paulson Stadium, turnkey tailgating will be introduced on the practice field for the 2023 football season.

More details and information on how to purchase a tailgate suite will be coming from the Athletic Foundation. Requests will be filled, in order, based on lifetime giving ranking.



A fully-integrated lightning protection system is being installed in the open-sided facility to afford year-round training. The facility design also allows for natural ventilation.

Cameras will be installed throughout the facility and will comprise a state-of-the-art filming system. Other amenities expected to be included are full protective padding at all interior vertical surfaces for enhanced player safety, restrooms, equipment storage and an audio system.

Additional landscape and pedestrian improvements are planned but the parking lot where construction will be taking place will be off-line this fall.

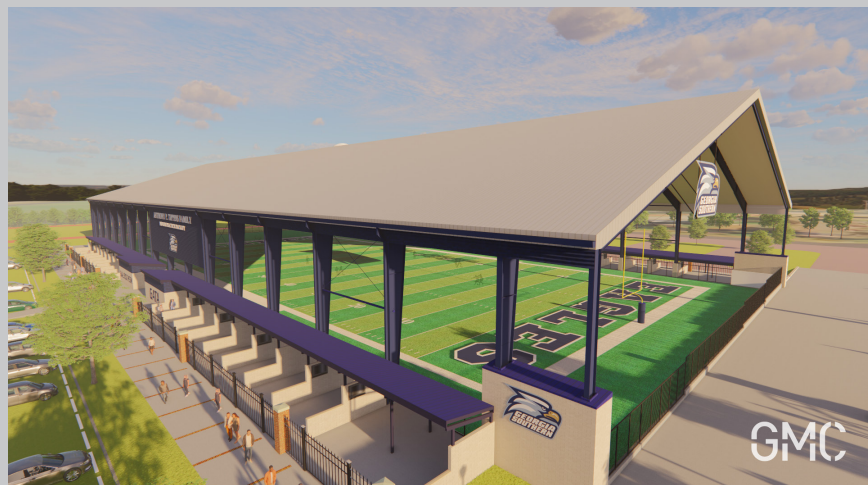

Other members of the project team include Maxwell-Reddick & Associates civil engineers, Method Engineering Group M/E/P, Sharp Engineering structural engineers and Wood Environmental for geotechnical consulting.

A generous gift from the Anthony P. Tippins Family jump-started the project and the remaining costs will be covered through fundraising and donations. Tippins, originally from Claxton, Georgia, is the current President of Coolsys Professional Solutions.

A retired 23-year Veteran and Commissioned Officer in the United States Naval Reserve and a Registered Professional Engineer in the state of Georgia, Tippins is a 1992 graduate of Georgia Southern University. Tippins earned his BS in mechanical engineering technology from GS and an Executive MBA from Emory University. After working in multiple key management and engineering roles, Tippins co-founded Aztec Energy Partners, which was sold to Danfoss in 2006. He then started Axiom Energy Solutions, which CoolSys acquired in 2018.

coach as part of a 40-year coaching career that also includes leading the program at Clemson.

YOUTHFUL - AND SUCCESSFUL - STAFF

• Head coach **Clay Helton** put together a young, but experienced, staff upon his arrival to Statesboro. Heading into the season, the average age of the five full-time offensive coaches was 33.2 years while the average age of the four full-time defensive coaches was 38.5.

• With special teams coordinator **Turner West** 34 years old, the average age of the 10 full-time assistant coaches is just 35.4 years old.

• Offensive coordinator **Bryan Ellis** turned 34 on Sept. 1 and defensive coordinator **Will Harris** is 35 (he turns 36 in December).

• When including Helton's long coaching and playing career, the 11 full-time members of the staff have coached or played in eight national championship games, 65 bowl games, have won four national championships and have made 14 NCAA/NFL/CFL Playoff appearances.

• All 11 full-time coaches have experience in the NFL or at the Power 5 level, either as a player or a coach.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

• Georgia Southern returns four of five starters on the offensive line from a year ago in **Khalil Crowder, Caleb Kelly, Logan Langemeier** and **Brian Miller**.

• When combining Langemeier's time at Jacksonville and all four's time in Statesboro, the group entered the season having played in a combined 153 games with a combined 127 starts.

• According to a survey done among FBS Football SIDs, the Eagles entered the season with the fourth most games played on the line among returning starters behind just Baylor (171), Pitt (166) and Georgia State (156) and third in games started behind Georgia State (141) and Pitt (130).

• On the flip side of things, with Miller missing the opener with an injury, **Pichon Wimbley** got the start at left guard for the Eagles. That made him the first true

freshman since Kelly in 2017 to start on the offensive line and the first true freshman to start on the line in the season opener since Dorian Byrd in 2010.

• Since the end of last season, Georgia Southern added 20 transfers to its roster, bringing talent and experience to the team.

• Of the 20 transfers, 16 have previous playing experience at an FBS or FCS program. That includes five players with playing experience at a Power Five program.

• The Eagles' 20 first-year transfers with FBS or FCS experience came into the season with a combined 289 games played and 171 starts in their careers.

POWER UNDER THE HOOD

• Senior receiver **Khaleb Hood** has quietly put together one of the great receiving careers at Georgia Southern. The McDonough native enters this week's game with 76 receptions for 989 yards and three touchdowns. His reception total ranks fifth in school history and he is just 11 yards away from becoming the ninth 1,000-yard receiver in program history.

• After graduating from Eagles Landing Christian, Hood prepped at Air Force Prep in 2018-19 where he was a military training officer while enrolled there. He enrolled at Georgia Southern in 2019 and has played in 39 games with 12 starts over his four-year career. He could return for a fifth year based on the NCAA's Covid-19 ruling giving an extra year of eligibility.

• Sixth-year quarterback **Kyle Vantrease** joins that club and will look for success in his first - and only - year in Statesboro.

• Antonio Henton (Ohio State) set the school record with 1,852 passing yards in 2008, breaking the record of 1,808 yards set by transfer Travis Clark (Southern Miss) two years earlier. • Vantrease became the first true transfer quarterback to start a game for Georgia Southern since Kado Brown (Moorpark CC) started at UMass in 2017.

• Running back/receiver **Amare Jones** (Tulane) was forced to start at quarterback in last season's opener but moved back to his natural position after the first game.

• Georgia Southern has four new transfer quarterbacks on the roster this fall.

• In the opener, Vantrease became the sixth 300-yard passer in Georgia Southern history. He finished with a 154.4 passer rating, completing 29 of 46 passes (63%) for 367 yards (fourth-most in GS history) and four touchdowns — tying a school record. It marked the first time since the Furman game of 2009 that 10 different receivers caught a pass in a game. It was also the first 300-plus game since Nov. 15, 2008 when Lee Chapple threw for 323 yards at Furman. The last time an Eagle passed for four touchdowns was Oct. 2, 2004, when Chaz Williams did it at Elon.

• Vantrease's 367 yards were a school record for a season opener and for passing yards in a first career start at Georgia Southern. His 46 attempts were at the time the third most for an Eagle quarterback in one game.

• One week later, Vantrease had a game for the record

books as Georgia Southern went into Lincoln and defeated Nebraska 45-42 behind 642 yards of total offense.

Vantrease completed 37 of 56 passes for 409 yards and a touchdown and scored the game-winner with 36 seconds left on an 8-yard draw after leading the team down the field in just under three minutes while down by four.

- Vantrease set career highs for attempts, completions and passing yards. He tied the Georgia Southern record for most attempts in a game (56), his 37 completions are the second most in program history and his 409 yards passing are the second most in program history. It was just the third 400-yard passing game in program history.

- He hit eight different receivers and became the first GS quarterback in program history to record back-to-back 300-yard passing games. For his effort, The Walter Camp Football Foundation named him the Football Bowl Subdivision National Offensive Player of the Week, making him the first Georgia Southern player to earn Walter Camp National Player of Week honors.

- He already has thrown for 1,564 yards and 10 touchdowns in just five games this season.

BURGESS BREAKING RECORDS

- Sophomore receiver **Derwin Burgess Jr.** has turned into a legitimate offensive weapon for the Eagles and is putting up record-setting numbers to support that case.

- Through five games, Burgess has 32 catches for 401 yards and three touchdowns.

- In the opener against Morgan State, he had four catches for 33 yards and a 17-yard, one-handed touchdown catch that landed him as the No. 4 play on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.

- Against Nebraska, he had 22 targets and caught a school-record 12 passes for 119 yards. He became just the third Eagle player in program history to catch 10 or more passes in a game.

- As a true freshman, Burgess Jr. played in 11 games, starting three and had 17 catches for 311 yards and a touchdown on the season. His big game came in the win at Texas State, catching five passes for 134 yards and a 46-yard touchdown and also blocked a punt that was returned for a touchdown.

- Burgess Jr., from Riverdale, Georgia, originally committed to South Carolina, but flipped to the Eagles and graduated from high school early to enroll at Georgia Southern in January of 2021.

NEBRASKA NOTES

- Georgia Southern picked up a historic 45-42 win over Nebraska on Sept. 10 in Lincoln, marking just the second win over a Power 5 program in program history. It was a memorable night on the field and on the stat sheet. Here are a few notable items from that game:

- The 45 points were the most ever scored against a Power 5 team;

- The 626 yards of total offense were the most total yards since 2014;

- The 86 plays run were the most plays run by a GS team since 2016;

- It was the second-best passing game in GS history, falling just short of the Eagles' win against Fuman in the 1985 NCAA Division I-AA National Championship Game when Tracy Ham threw for 419 yards;

40 YEARS OF MODERN FOOTBALL

The 2022 football season marks the 40th year of Georgia Southern football in the modern era.

As part of the celebration, Eagle Nation was able to select the All-40th Anniversary Team to honor the great Eagles of the past.

Georgia Southern began playing football in 1924 as Georgia Normal School but suspended the sport after the 1941 season due to World War II.

The Eagles resumed playing as an NAIA independent in 1982, and the first year of NCAA unclassified play was in 1983. In 1993, Georgia Southern joined the Southern



Conference and began transitioning to the FBS in 2013 before beginning play in the Sun Belt Conference in 2014.

Georgia Southern has won six NCAA Division I-AA national championships, 11 conference titles and three bowl games in their 40 years of uncompromised excellence.

- **Kyle Vantrease** had the second most completions (39) in program history and tied for the most attempts (56);

- **Derwin Burgess Jr.** set a school record for most catches in school history (12) and **Jeremy Singleton's** nine catches are tied for the fourth most in program history;

- The 104 points scored in consecutive games (59 vs. MSU; 45 vs. UNL) are the most since Oct 3 and 17, 2016. It's also the most points scored in the first two games of a season since 2013 (136);

- Nebraska was 254-0 all time at home when scoring 35 pts;

- Georgia Southern entered the game 1-27 against Power 5 team in the modern era;

- After losing what 30 straight games in a row when being outrushed, the Eagles won their second game in a row in that scenario;

- The 34 first downs was one off a school record (35 vs. Savannah State in 2014). The 21 passing first downs was a new school record;

- The Eagles went -2 in the turnover margin where they were 0-16 in the FBS era when finishing when that happens;

- Georgia Southern broke a nine-game skid when losing the turnover battle.

- For their effort, the Eagles were one of three Sun Belt teams (App State, Marshall) named as the Cheez-It Bowl National Teams of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN FOOTBALL TRADITIONS

- Georgia Southern has a rich tradition in the college football world, winning six Division I-AA national titles, but also has traditions that make the program unique.

BEAUTIFUL EAGLE CREEK

- When Georgia Southern resurrected the football program in 1981, traditions and spirit needed resurrection as well. So legendary head football coach Erk Russell created his own. Inspired by the gnat-infested drainage ditch that cut across the field between what was then the team's locker room and practice fields, Russell convinced his players that its stagnant water was actually "Beautiful Eagle Creek," a source of "magical" waters.

- Head coach **Clay Helton** and the freshmen had a "baptism" in the creek on the final day of camp on Aug. 27 before the game week started.

FREEDOM'S FLIGHT

- In what has become one of the most popular traditions at GS, "Freedom," a male American Bald Eagle, takes flight before each home football game. Freedom is a Southern Bald Eagle that was found knocked out of the nest in Maitland, Florida. Only weeks old and appearing like a "brown ball of fuzz", it was discovered that the young eagle had an injury to its beak and suffered from an infection. Rushed to the Florida Audubon Center for Birds of Prey, Freedom made a complete recovery from the infection but the injury to the beak was permanent, preventing his release into the wild.

- With the permission of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, GS acquired Freedom in 2004. Through the Georgia Southern University Center for Wildlife Education and Lamar Q. Ball Jr. Raptor Center, thousands of visitors young and old are embraced by the Power of Freedom.

- Under the supervision of Steve Hein, Director of the Center for Wildlife Education, Freedom is on the sidelines of all GS home games, and select road games.

- Georgia Southern's athletics teams have adopted several names throughout history, but claimed "Eagles" by a campus vote in 1959.

YELLOW SCHOOL BUSES

- When the football program was resurrected in 1981, the team needed a way to travel to practices and games. Operating on a shoestring budget didn't allow for transportation back then, let alone any luxurious travel.

- The Bulloch County Board of Education stepped in with a deal the University couldn't refuse: GS would only pay \$1 each for two yellow school buses. The football team still uses buses to this day, taking a lap around campus on game days.

ONE UNIVERSITY. THREE CAMPUSES.

- Georgia Southern has grown to three distinct campuses, serving the needs of one dynamic institution.

- The Statesboro Campus is 900 acres of Georgian-style, red-brick historic buildings and modern contemporary buildings set amid pines and oaks and home to around 20,000 students; the Armstrong Campus in Savannah (45 minutes to the east of Statesboro) is a 268-acre arboretum campus just minutes away from historic downtown Savannah and home to some 6,500 students; and a modern, state-of-the-art facility in Hinesville is geared for local and military-affiliated students.

BOUNCING BACK

- In the Modern Era of Georgia Southern Football (since 1983), Georgia Southern has had just six losing seasons, including last year when the Eagles went 3-9.

- In four of the five previous seasons, Georgia Southern has bounced back with a winning effort with three of those those four times producing a 10-win season.

RETIRED NUMBERS

- GS has retired two numbers in its football history, No. 3 for Adrian Peterson and No. 8 for Tracy Ham. Both are College Football Hall of Famers and both went to the same high school: Santa Fe in Alachua, Florida.

- Peterson, a 2017 CFB Hall of Fame Inductee, is the NCAA Division I all-time leading rusher with 6,559 yards in regular-season contests and was a four-time All-American. He led the Eagles to two national titles.

- Ham, a 2007 College Football Hall of Fame Inductee was also inducted into the Canadian Football Hall of Fame in 2010. A first-team All-American in 1986, he led the Eagles to back-to-back I-AA National Championships.

- Both still work in the Georgia Southern Athletics Department: Ham as a Senior Associate AD for Administration and Peterson as the Director of Student-Athlete Development for the football team.

STATESBORO - Kyle Vantrease threw for 367 yards and tied the school record with four touchdown passes as Georgia Southern opened the Clay Helton era and the 2022 season with a 59-7 victory over Morgan State in Paulson Stadium.

Vantrease completed 29 of 46 passes to 10 different receivers. Sam Kenerson caught seven balls for 99 yards, Khaleb Hood had six receptions for 88 yards and a score and Jeremy Singleton finished with five catches for 60 yards and a touchdown. Todd Bradley-Glenn led the Eagle defense with seven tackles, including one for loss, while Isaac Walker, Tyler Bride and Jalen Denton each intercepted a pass.

Vantrease became the first Eagle to throw for 300-plus yards since Lee Chapple threw for 323 on Nov. 15, 2008, at Furman, and his total ranks as the fourth most in a game in school history. Vantrease also set the record for passing yards in a season opener and for passing yards in a first career start at Georgia Southern, and his four TD passes is the most for an Eagle since Chaz Williams had four Oct. 2, 2004, at Elon. His 46 pass attempts is the third most in a game.

Helton became the 10th Georgia Southern head coach (full-time or interim) in the modern era to win his first game as the head man of the Eagles.

LINCOLN, Neb. - Quarterback Kyle Vantrease ran for the go-ahead touchdown with 36 seconds left and a game-tying, 52-yard field goal as time expired went wide left as Georgia Southern outlasted Nebraska, 45-42, to pick up its second win over a Power 5 program in school history at Memorial Stadium.

Vantrease completed 37-of-56 passes for 409 yards and a touchdown, and ran for the game-winning 8-yard score. Derwin Burgess Jr. notched a Georgia Southern single-game record 12 catches for 119 yards. Gerald Green rushed for 132 yards and two touchdowns on just 10 carries, while Jalen White rushed for 87 yards and two touchdowns. Marques Trent-Watson recorded a team-high 10 tackles, including seven solo, while Justin Ellis had five tackles, including a sack and a tackle for loss.

The game featured five ties, five lead changes and 1,217 yards of total offense between the two teams. Vantrease became the first Eagle to throw for 300-plus yards in consecutive games in school history. He threw for 367 yards in the season opener vs. Morgan State.

White recorded his third career two-touchdown game, while Green notched his second multiple-touchdown game.

OJ Arnold ran for 28 yards and caught four passes for 29 yards, and Wylan Free led the defense with eight tackles.

Georgia Southern fell behind 21-0 early but battled back and cut the margin to 21-14 on White's 71-yard scoring run and to 28-21 on a 1-yard run by White with 9:54 remaining. The Eagle defense forced the Blazers to go 3-and-out on their next possession, but Tyler Taylor picked off a Kyle Vantrease pass at midfield and brought it back 16 yards to the GS 33-yard line with 6:50 to go.
