Advance notice of at least 24 hours is preferred, but every attempt will be made to accommodate all requests. No one will be available for interviews on game day, except for post game interviews.

REAGAN-REAGAN

After recording 10 kills and a team-high 17 digs on Saturday against James Madison, Reagan Barth became the first Eagle to record four consecutive double-doubles since Katie Bange did it from 9/24-10/14/16.

WE'D LOVE TO SEYMOUR OF THIS

In game two at App State, middle blocker Lydia Seymour hit .706 (12-0-17), the first Eagle to hit .700 or better on 10 or more attempts since Baylor Bumford did it on Sep. 19, 2022 against Saint Francis (.727, 8-0-11).

TROJAN TAKEDOWN

Despite snapping a 28-straight set win streak in game two, the Eagles took both matchups from Troy over the last weekend, winning a five-set thriller on Friday. Lydia Seymour (8) and Maggie Sale (6) recorded career-highs in blocks in a season-high effort of 16 for the team.

RP-HIGH

In the first RPI rankings of the season, the Eagles checked in at no. 28, higher than they have ever been in program history and pacing the Sun Belt.

DIGGING DEEP

The Eagles had five players reach double-digit digs at Marshall. Ashlyn Lovett (20), Logan Jones (14), Kirsten Barrett (12), Reagan Barth (12) and Jillian Gray (11) all reached the mark.

BARTHQUAKE

Reagan Barth was named both SBC Offensive Player of the Week and AVCA/Gamechanger Division I Player of the Week after her scorching weekend at Marshall. She averaged 6.33 kills/ set, 1.33 aces/set and 5.17 digs/set, hitting .427 through the two games with 38 kills. She is the first SBC athlete to win the honor since 2018.

TRIPLE CROWN

Kirsten Barrett earned her third SBC Setter of the Week honors after averaging 12 assists per set over the weekend at Marshall. She's the second Eagle to do it three times this season.

ASH MONEY

Ashlyn Lovett became the first volleyball player to be named SBC POTW three times in a season after winning it again in week four. She averaged 7 digs per set during the Bash in the Boro, including 30 in three sets against WCU, and is second in the NCAA in digs per set at 5.97.

DEJA VU

Kirsten Barrett and Ashlyn Lovett - again - were named SBC Players of the Week for the second time this season. Barrett averaged 11.44 assists per set and Lovett averaged over 7 digs per set. The Eagles had a player on the POTW list for three straight weeks for the first time in program history, and the first by any GS sport

since football also did so in 2014, becoming the first team to have two players on the POTW teams in consecutive weeks. Barrett was the first volleyball player to win back-to-back weekly awards since Alex Beecher in 2012.

JILL THE THRILL

Jillian Gray had 101 kills through the first eight games of the season. She was the first player in program history to record 100 or more kills through eight games since Meredith Paskert had 102 through eight games in 2012.

CAN YOU DIG IT?

Ashlyn Lovett broke the record for digs in a three-set match against North Carolina A&T with 31 digs, shattering the previous mark of 27 set by Moriah Bellissimo in 2011.

HELPING HAND

Kirsten Barrett was named SBC Setter of the Week after recording gaudy assist numbers during the GATA Challenge, averaging a leaguebest 10.14 assists per set in the two games. Her 71 assists were fourth in the conference. She recorded 30 in three sets on Thursday, followed by a season-high 41 in the win over Clemson.

GRAY AREA

Outside hitter Jillian Gray was named SBC Offensive Player of the Week after averaging 4.43 kills/set and hitting .343 (31-8-67) with 31 kills during the GATA Challenge. She started with eight kills on 18 swings against Maryland Eastern Shore on Thursday before exploding for a careerhigh 23 kills on 49 swings against Clemson, becoming the first Eagles OPOTW since 2016.

POWER PLAY

For the first time since 2016, and nearly eight years to the day, the Eagles hosted – and beat – an autonomy four opponent at Hanner Fieldhouse when it beat Clemson in four sets. The Eagles hit .248 and Jillian Gray had 23 kills in the team's first P4 win since beating Wake Forest on 9/9/16.

FROM KANSAS WITH LOVE(TT)

Ashlyn Lovett had a stellar weekend at the War Eagle Invitational, earning SBC Defensive Player of the Week honors after averaging 5.08 digs per set in the three games. Her 61 digs after the first week led the conference.

2023 SEASON RECAP

Volleyball had one of its most successful seasons in recent memory after finishing the year 23-9 (.719) and earning a trip to the Great Eight of the NIVC. It was the team's first 20-win season since 2013 and the first two postseason wins in program history. The team's ten wins in conference play were the most since joining the Sun Belt.

PRESEASON PROWESS

The Eagles earned some respect heading into the 2024 season following their strong year in 2023. Reagan Barth was named Preseason AllConference, the first Eagle to do so since 2022, and the Eagles were picked third in the East with 74 vote points behind JMU and Coastal Carolina.

WE LIKE IT, WE LOVETT

Ashlyn Lovett plays her senior season as one of the most prolific liberos in school history. She sits second all-time in digs (1,765) and second in digs per set (4.54), one of two players in program history to average over four digs per set in their career. She is 235 digs from becoming the second player to reach the 2,000 dig mark. She is currently 29th among active players in career digs.

KBOOM

Kirsten Barrett became the 15th Eagle to reach the 1,000-assist plateau after recording her 30th assist against North Carolina A&T. She surpassed Kim Foytich for tenth all-time in the win over James Madison.

BLOCK PARTY

In 2023, the Eagles were one of six teams to finish the season in the top 12 in both total blocks (eighth) and blocks per set (11th). They joined Wisconsin, Pittsburgh, Oregon, Penn State and Texas— all NCAA Tournament teams— in doing so.

NEW HOME

The Eagles bolstered their roster with two transfers for the upcoming season from Power 4 schools, adding sophomores Kayla Knowles (Houston) and Lydia Seymour (Texas Christian) to the squad.

FRESH FACES

The Eagles added three freshmen to the mix this season, welcoming outside hitter Sam Bowron (Florida), defensive specialist Mayte Camacho (Florida) and middle blocker Claire Smith (Ohio).

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

This year, GS will play against six teams that made either the NCAA Tournament or NIVC. They will take on NCAAT teams in Auburn, Wofford, Coastal Carolina and James Madison in addition to facing Winthrop and Clemson, who appeared in the NIVC.

WHEN THERE'S A WILLIS...

Last year's 23-9 record improved Chad Willis' winning percentage to .527 during his tenure, one of just three coaches to have a .500 or better win percentage in team history. His 84th career win this season surpassed J.B. Claiborne for third all-time.

ROAD WARRIORS

Since 2021, the Eagles have never finished a season below .500 on the road, recording a 21-14 (.600) mark away from Statesboro, starting 3-2 in 2024.

MAGIC NUMBERS

Last season continued what has been an incredible resurgence under Chad Willis and company for Georgia Southern volleyball. The win percentage of .719 was the team's highest since 2013 and highest since joining the Sun Belt. In addition, the team has recorded four consecutive seasons of 17 or more wins for the first time since 2010-13.

DEADLY DUO

Last season, the duo of Reagan Barth (353) and Jillian Gray (287) combined for 640 kills, the most kills by a Georgia Southern duo since Jamie DeRatt (354) and Kym Coley (310) combined for 664 in 2014.

FANTASTIC FOUR

In 2023, Georgia Southern had four players surpass the 200-kill plateau for the first time since 2014. Reagan Barth (353), Jillian Gray (287), Chamblee Russell (225) and Jordan Christy (209) all reached the mark.

HOME SWEET HOME

Since Chad Willis took over the helm, the Eagles have won at a 66-percent clip at home, going 49-25 (.662). Over the last three seasons, the team is 43-14 (.754) at Hanner Fieldhouse, starting this season 12-0 - the longest home undefeated streak to begin a season in team history.

REAGAN ADMINISTRATION

After her impressive rookie season, Reagan Barth found herself in the top-100 in two categories in the NCAA: aces per set (78th) and kills per set (87th). She finished 103rd in attacks per set.
