OF NOTE

- Southern and State have met just 10 times before with the Panthers leading series 6-4. The Eagles are 1-2 at Center Parc Stadium, dropping their past two contests in Atlanta.
- Georgia State head coach Dell McGee was an assistant coach at Georgia Southern in 2014 and 2015. He served as the interim head coach for the Eagles in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl, leading the team to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green.
- Former Eagle offensive lineman Manrey Saint-Amour serves as the offensive line coach for the Panthers.
- Georgia Southern has 87 of 125 players on its roster (69.6%) from the state of Georgia.
- This will be the first Georgia Grown Bowl between Georgia Southern and Georgia State. The Georgia Department of Agriculture and Georgia Grown has partnered to support each institution to highlight the rivalry and showcase Georgia's No. 1 industry – agriculture. After the game, Georgia Agriculture Commissioner Tyler Harper will present the winner of the match up with the Commissioner's Cup – a symbol of Georgia's excellence in agriculture, education, and athletics.

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 10 The Eagles and Panthers have met **10** previous times with Georgia State holding a 6-4 lead. This will be the fourth meeting at Center Parc Stadium with the Panthers leading 2-1 in the venue.
- 9 Georgia Southern's kickoff return team is ranked **ninth** in the FBS, averaging 30.00 yards per return. DeAndre Buchannon is ranked sixth with an average of 30.4 yards per return.
- 8 Georgia Southern is 13-3 under head coach Clay Helton when scoring **eight** or more points in the second quarter.
- 7 The Eagles have scored 14 offensive touchdowns thus far, **seven** via the run and **seven** via the pass.
- 6 Georgia Southern's kickoff defense is ranked **sixth** in the FBS, allowing just an average of 9.14 yards per return.
- 5 The Eagles and Panthers have met **five** previous times in Atlanta with Georgia Southern winning three of those games.
- 4 **Four** players have caught at least 10 passes already this season: Dalen Cobb (19), Derwin Burgess Jr. (15), Jalen White (11) and OJ Arnold (10).
- 3 Junior running back OJ Arnold threw his **third** career touchdown pass last week at Ole Miss. He has thrown one each year he's been in Statesboro and also has six career rushing touchdowns and a receiving touchdown. Arnold threw, caught and ran for a touchdown in 2022, marking the first Eagle player to do that since Jerick McKinnon in 2011.
- 2 Jalen White's five rushing touchdowns are ranked **second** in the Sun Belt Conference and 16th nationally.
- 1 Georgia State head coach Dell McGee won his **one** game as interim head coach of Georgia Southern, leading the Eagles to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl in Montgomery, Alabama.

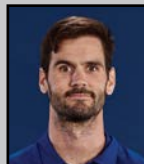

HEAD COACH CLAY HELTON

Clay Helton, who led USC to a Rose Bowl title in 2016, was named the 11th full-time head coach in the Georgia Southern modern football era on Nov. 2, 2021. He is in his third season as the Eagles' head coach.

In his first year in Statesboro, the Eagles knocked off Nebraska on the road for the school's second Power 5 win, beat a ranked James Madison team at home, and beat rival App State in double overtime to secure a bid to the Camellia Bowl. In 2023, Helton once again led the Eagles to a bowl game, as well as wins over rivals Coastal Carolina and Georgia State.

The 52-year-old Helton went 46-24 (.657) as the head coach of the USC Trojans with 12 victories over AP Top 25 teams, including three in the Top 5 and four in the Top 10. He went 5-1 in a pandemic-shortened 2020 season and was 8-5 in 2019 with wins over No. 23 Stanford and No. 10 Utah. Helton went 11-3 in 2017 with wins over No. 14 Stanford twice (including in the Pac-12 Championship Game) and No. 23 Arizona, and went 10-3 in 2016 with wins over No. 4 Washington, No. 5 Penn State in a legendary Rose Bowl thriller and No. 21 Colorado.

Helton was the first USC head coach to have 10-win seasons in each of his first two full seasons, and he had more wins (21) in his first two full seasons than any USC coach. He led USC to a 13-game winning streak from 2016 to 2017 and a 13-game winning streak over Power 5 opponents from 2016 to 2017.

Helton joined the USC staff in February of 2010 as the quarterbacks coach after spending 10 seasons as an assistant at Memphis. He added the passing game coordinator role in 2012 and became the offensive coordinator in 2013. He began his 10-year (2000-09) Memphis career as the running backs coach for three seasons, then coached the Tigers' receivers for the next four seasons before becoming the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the final three years. He served as Memphis' interim head coach for several months in early 2006 when head coach Tommy West had off-season heart surgery.

Before Memphis, he was the running backs coach at Houston, his alma mater, for three seasons (1997-99), working under his father, head coach Kim Helton. He began his coaching career at Duke, serving as a graduate assistant in 1995 and then the running backs coach in 1996.

Helton played quarterback at Houston in 1993 and 1994, playing for his father both seasons and captaining the Cougars as a 1994 senior. He spent 1991 and 1992 at Auburn, where he earned 1992 SEC All-Academic honors. He redshirted there in 1990.

Helton earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics and interdisciplinary science from Houston in 1994 and prepped at Clements High in Sugar Land, Texas. He was born on June 24, 1972, in Gainesville, Florida. He and his wife, Angela, have three children: sons Reid and Turner, and daughter Aubrey. Turner is a redshirt sophomore quarterback at Western Kentucky.

Besides being Houston's head coach from 1993 to 1999, his father, Kim, was an assistant in college (Florida, Miami, and Alabama Birmingham), the NFL (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Houston Oilers, Los Angeles Raiders, Washington Redskins), and the CFL (Toronto Argonauts) following his playing career at Florida.

His brother, Tyson, was the quarterbacks coach and pass game coordinator at USC (2016-17) until becoming Tennessee's offensive coordinator in 2018 and is now the head coach at Western Kentucky.

NOTABLE STREAKS AND TRENDS ENTERING THE GAME

- Georgia Southern is 13-3 under head coach Clay Helton when scoring eight or more points in the second quarter and 1-12 when scoring seven points or less.
- Southern is 6-3 when under Helton when scoring eight or more points in the fourth quarter.
- The Eagles are 5-1 under Helton when completing 35 passes or more in a game.
- Southern is 10-3 when having a combined 60 or more rushes and completions under Helton (3-0 with 65+).
- GS is 11-6 when rushing for 100 or more yards in a game under Helton, 3-1 when rushing for 200 or more yards. The Eagles are 8-5 when tallying 30 or more rushes in a games and 7-1 when winning the rushing battle (7-15 when losing it).
- Since 2000, the Eagles are 117-16 when they've rushed for 300 yards or more.
- Dating back to the start of the 2018 season, GS is 28-10 in games when having at least one 100-yard rusher.
- Since joining the FBS in 2014, Georgia Southern is just 8-30 when rushing for less than 150 yards in a game.
- Dating back to 2019, the Eagles have won 15 of their past 19 games when not committing a turnover.
- Dating back to 2020, the Eagles are 19-5 when winning the turnover battle, 3-20 when losing it, and 3-5 when the margin is tied. Under Clay Helton, the Eagles are 9-2 when winning the battle, 3-11 when losing it and 2-3 when it's tied.
- As a member of the FBS (since 2014), the Eagles are 48-9 when scoring 30 or more points, 19-54 when scoring less than 30 points. The Eagles are 12-5 under Clay Helton when scoring 30 or more points, 2-11 when scoring less than 30 points.
- Georgia Southern is 224-1 all-time when having a lead of 18 or more points at any point in the game. That lone loss came in 2005 when the Eagles led at Texas State 35-16 in the third quarter and lost 50-35.
- The Eagles have won 80 straight games when holding a lead of 17 or more points at any point in a game dating back to that 2005 Texas State game.
- Since 1983, Georgia Southern is 202-17 when allowing 17 points or less. The last time the Eagles lost a game when allowing 17 points or less was in 2013, a 16-14 loss to Furman at home. The current streak of victories when allowing 17 or less points is at 32.
- Georgia Southern had won 90 games in a row when scoring 40 or more points before scoring 45 points and losing to Boise State in this year's opener. Overall, the Eagles are now 150-3 all time, including 99-1 at home when scoring 40 or more points in a game. Georgia Southern is 7-1 under Helton when scoring 40 or more points in a game.

His grandfather is Jim Walsh Sr., who played at Auburn in the 1950s and coached for 25 seasons at Benedictine Military, compiling a record of 185-82-1.

• Patiently waiting his turn, White finally broke loose against Arkansas State in 2021, rushing 13 times for a career-high 167 yards and two scores. He finished the year with 383 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 5.3 yards per rush.

• A native of Daleville, Alabama, White was a first-team All-USA selection by USA Today after leading the nation in rushing yards as a senior. In just 11 games, he posted 3,517 rushing yards, which also set an Alabama state record and he also set a state single-game scoring record with eight touchdowns (all in the first half) against Barbour County.

• White was named to the state's Super-All State team, which compiles the top 12 football players from the state

regardless of classification. As a senior, he carried the ball 217 times for a 16.2-yard average and 48 touchdowns.

• He sits at 2,393 career rushing yards with 28 rushing touchdowns heading into this week's game and became the school's 20th 2,000-yard rusher at Texas State last year.

• Arnold threw his name into the hat in the 2022 opener when he ran for 45 yards and a touchdown and also caught a touchdown pass. Arnold threw, caught and ran for a touchdown in 2022, marking the first Eagle player to do that since Jerick McKinnon in 2011. He finished the year with 257 yards rushing and a touchdown, along with 10 catches for 58 yards and a touchdown.

• The Quitman native was a first-team all-state selection by the AJC for the 1A Public level as a senior, earning the state's offensive player of the year for the level. He rushed for over 2,500 yards and 42 touchdowns as a senior in leading Brooks County to a state title.

• Gibbs has had a slow return to the field while rehabbing a serious knee injury he suffered in high school. An ESPN300 recruit—the first in Georgia Southern history—the Florida, native ranked as the No. 174 overall player in the country, the No. 14 running back in the nation and the No. 22 player in the state of Florida by ESPN.com.

• He suffered a knee injury just before his junior season and missed the entire year before returning to play sparingly toward the end of his senior season. Before his knee injury, he held an offer from nearly 30 programs including the likes of LSU, Florida, Florida State, Auburn and Georgia.

BACK TO THE BORO

• Defensive coordinator **Brandon Bailey** began his career at Georgia Southern as a student assistant under Coach Jeff Monken and went to Tulane in 2016 as a grad assistant under Coach Willie Fritz. From there, he made stops at Richmond Hill (GA) High, Arkansas-Monticello, Texas A&M and finally Buffalo. He coached against his alma mater in the 2022 Camellia Bowl before getting the call in February of 2023 from Coach Clay Helton that he was offering him the defensive coordinator job.

• Bailey grew up in Dooly County and was a regular in the stands at Allen E. Paulson Stadium on game days. He says than other than when he left to coach at other schools, he's been at pretty much every Georgia Southern game since the mid 2000s. He is married to the former C.C. Rohrer, who was a cheerleader for Georgia Southern.

- Briarcrest Christian went on to win another state title, Oher went on to play at Ole Miss and in the NFL, the book was a best-seller and Sandra Bullock won an Oscar for her portrayal of Leigh Anne Tuohy in the 2009 drama.
- West played college football from 2006-09 at Memphis, where his father Tommy West was the head coach as part of a 40-year coaching career that also includes leading the program at Clemson.

TRANSFERS FIND NEW HOMES

- Several new faces to the Georgia Southern squad took advantage of the NCAA's transfer rule to come play in Statesboro.
- Since the end of last season, Georgia Southern added 15 transfers from NCAA schools (in addition to two JUCO players) to its roster, bringing talent and experience to the team.

a legitimate offensive weapon for the Eagles and has put up record-setting numbers to support that case.

- Burgess Jr., from Riverdale, Georgia, originally committed to South Carolina, but flipped to the Eagles and graduated from high school early to enroll at Georgia Southern in January of 2021.
- He suffered a broken leg in the loss at Louisiana and missed the remainder of the 2022 season but returned for spring ball and played last year at full speed. Last season, he had 74 catches for 813 yards and six touchdowns and he has caught at least one pass in 31 consecutive games. For his career, he has caught 164 passes (second-most in program history) and 15 touchdowns (second-most in program history).

RECEIVING TOUCHDOWNS - CAREER

FRAZIER VERCOMES ADVERSITY

- Transfer offensive lineman **Kyle Frazier** learned just how strong he was when in 2019, life threw him an unexpected curve ball. The Augusta, Georgia, native signed a National Letter of Intent to play football at Savannah State and was a few months from his high-school graduation when doctors diagnosed him with Hodgkin's Lymphoma.
- Hodgkin's lymphoma is a type of cancer that affects the lymphatic system, which is part of the body's germ-fighting immune system. In Hodgkin's lymphoma, white blood cells called lymphocytes grow out of control, causing swollen lymph nodes and growths throughout the body.
- Despite the pain, he persevered. In August 2019, doctors told Frazier he was declared cancer-free after chemotherapy and three surgeries, including two biopsies
- Frazier got to meet NFL star Aaron Donald over

Zoom in 2020 as part of his Make-A-Wish request. At the time, due to the pandemic, the duo could only talk remotely ... although Frazier said it helped him recover from the disease, and ultimately assisted him on his way to playing as an offensive lineman at Savannah State University.

- In early 2023, Frazier was actually able to meet with Donald in person and fulfill the rest of his Make-A-Wish request. In addition to meeting with Donald, Frazier also got to work out with the standout defensive tackle. Frazier also got to sign a one-day contract with the Rams and take in their game against the Chargers as part of his Make-A-Wish dream.

- The standout offensive lineman was named to the SIAC All-Conference team two times and transferred to Georgia Southern in January for his final season of football.

YOUTHFUL - AND SUCCESSFUL - STAFF

- Head coach **Clay Helton** put together a young, but experienced, staff upon his arrival to Statesboro. Heading into the opening game of 2024, the average age of the five full-time offensive coaches is 33.4 years while the average age of the four full-time defensive coaches is 32.3.

- With special teams coordinator **Turner West** 36 years old, the average age of the 10 full-time assistant coaches is just 33.2 years old.

- Offensive coordinator **Ryan Aplin** turned 34 in May and defensive coordinator **Brandon Bailey** is the youngest defensive coordinator in the FBS for the third year in a row at just 30 years old. The duo is the youngest coordinator duo in the FBS.

- Wimbley made the most of his opportunity in 2022 with Brian Miller missing the opener with an injury. In his place, Wimbley got the start at left guard for the Eagles.

That made him the first true freshman since Caleb Kelly in 2017 to start on the offensive line and the first true freshman to start on the line in the season opener since Dorian Byrd in 2010. He started all 13 games last year, playing 798 offensive snaps. Last year, he played 976 offensive snaps.

- Wimbley has started all 30 games in his career thus far, becoming the first Eagle offensive lineman since center Lance Wayne to start every game over his first two years. Wayne went on to start all 46 games for his career at Georgia Southern.

- Strong, a redshirt sophomore, started all 13 games at center last year, playing 1,001 offensive snaps. Both were named preseason second-team All-Sun Belt by the coaches and media this past July.

FROM THE BACK TO THE BORO

- To understand **Alex Smith** is to appreciate his unique story truly. He's more than the first Australian football player in Eagle football history. He's a former professional tennis player. He's the self-proclaimed top table tennis player on the team. He's 25 years old, making him the oldest player on Georgia Southern's football roster and the only one born before 2000. And he's figuring out college football and American life one day at a time.

- A native of Melbourne, Australia, Smith graduated from Caulfield Grammar School in 2017 and tried his hand at professional tennis, a sport he thrived at in part to his 6-foot-6 frame.

- In June 2020, he gave up tennis and the dream of playing at a Power 5 tennis school when COVID hit, so he called John A. Smith with ProKick Australia and asked about a workout. ProKick Australia is a club that has sent multiple punters to the United States, including Houston Texans punter Cameron Johnston (Ohio State) and Ray Guy Award winners Mitch Wishnowsky (Utah) and Michael Dickson (Texas).

- Smith had never played Australian football but had kicked the ball around pretty well in the yard. By his own admission, his first workout was terrible, but still, the group saw enough potential in him after working with him for a few years to place him as a commitment to Vanderbilt. Amid COVID-19 and a coaching change, Nashville didn't work out, and Smith was left in limbo. But then, he got a call that Georgia Southern was interested and signed with the Eagles in December of 2022. Soon, he was on a flight from Australia to Florida, landing in January before driving up to Statesboro. It would be his first time in the United States.

- Georgia Southern head coach Clay Helton coached Ben Griffiths, also a native of Melbourne, so he was familiar with what kind of player he was getting in Smith.

- Smith said he didn't watch much college football in Australia but watched many NFL games, especially when the other Alex Smith was quarterbacking the San Francisco 49ers.

- Adjusting to new surroundings took some getting used to for Smith. He said he didn't sleep or eat much the first week here due to the time difference (Melbourne is 14 hours ahead of Statesboro). He also said it took some time to feel comfortable being his "true Australian self with my big, thick accent," but as he got more acclimated, he's fit in more.

- Smith, who played lower-level professional tennis upon graduation from high school on the ATP Futures Tour, grew up playing tennis as a resident of Dubai and says he's always been adept at racket sports, including ping pong (or table tennis as the top-level players call it).

- Smith is the first left-footed punter in program history, although quarterback Kevin Ellison punted in a 2015 game against Troy and is left-footed even though he threw right-handed.

- Smith had an 18-yard run on a fake punt to convert a fourth down against Coastal Carolina last year that kept an eventual touchdown drive alive. It's the longest run by an Eagle punter since 1999.

CHEF'S KISS

- Sixth-year tight end **Beau Johnson** is quickly making a name around the area as an up-and-coming chef thanks to a large social media following and some hungry teammates and staff who are eager to help taste his creations.

- Raised in the Miami area, Johnson's mother was raised in the Caribbean and his father was raised in Florida, so Johnson has what he calls a "Caribbean Country" flavor to his cooking. Johnson says his mother is who got him into cooking with her great skills, but that his father, Charles, who was a two-time All-Star catcher and World Series champion with the Florida Marlins, spent plenty of times around the grill during the offseason. His brother, Brandon, plays wide receiver for the Denver Broncos.

- Johnson has cooked for the equipment room staff and many of his teammates when he has the time during

the offseason and tries to use his off day on Monday to cook one good meal.

- He says his specialties are his red velvet French Toast and his lobster mac & cheese with a seared steak on the side and he continues to expand his menu. Johnson wants to get into the restaurant business one day, maybe opening a steakhouse, a breakfast restaurant and a dessert bar.

- Johnson was featured on WJCL's "Southern Routes" with Frank Sulkowski, who called his meal "the best French Toast of my life." He also was the featured chef at Soyumi Asian Kitchen's Chef Pop Up "It's Beau Time" on Oct. 19 of last year at the Statesboro restaurant. Johnson teamed up with Adam Tsang, owner of Soyumi, to create a delicious dish that made its debut at the event.

- Johnson has already graduated from Georgia Southern with a degree in interdisciplinary studies and is working on a master's degree in management. You can see many of his concoctions on his Instagram page [instagram.com/beau_johnson23/](https://www.instagram.com/beau_johnson23/).

WELCOME BACK, SAM

- After tearing all three major ligaments in his right knee on Sept. 10, 2022 at Nebraska, **Sam Kenerson** is finally back and on the field. One of the most popular players on the team, the Baton Rouge, Louisiana, native suffered a devastating knee injury at the end of a 31-yard catch and run in the second quarter last year and had to have two surgeries to repair the damage. After an arduous 406 days, Kenerson returned to the field on Oct. 21, 2023 to play on offense against ULM. He ended up redshirting last season after playing in just one regular game, but was a full participant in spring practice.

- Kenerson came to Georgia Southern as a quarterback, but made the move to receiver early on. He is listed as a redshirt senior, but could opt to take his COVID year (2020) and his medical hardship year (2022) to give him two seasons remaining after this year.

DEDMAN WALKING TOWARD HISTORY

- In 40-plus years of modern Georgia Southern football, very few players have crossed the 60-game plateau in terms of career games played. Khaleb Hood used his COVID season to play five full seasons and set the record with 64 games played last season.

- Brian Miller took seven years to get to 62 games

played, using a redshirt season, a medical hardship and a COVID exemption to get him the eligibility needed to reach that number. The only other player in program history to reach 60 games played was Najee Thompson, who also took advantage of a COVID year to get a fifth year of eligibility and get to 60 games played.

- All three of them could be left in the dust if **Reid Dedman** has anything to say about it. The sixth-year player who has been a standout on special teams enters this week's game with 58 games played. If he stays healthy, he could break the school record in November.

- Dedman played in four games in 2019 and was able to redshirt before playing in 13 games during the COVID year of 2020. He has since played in 12 (2021), 12 (2021), 13 (2023) and four (2024) games to run his total up.

SNAPPING HIS WAY ONTO THE TEAM

- Of all the ways players have walked onto college football teams, **Bryce Bernard's** could be the most unique. After joining USF's team in 2020 as a video assistant, injuries to the Bulls' long snappers moved Bernard from the video tower to the field.

- Bernard was introduced to the team as the new long snapper following an early season practice when the coach pointed to him high in one of the video lifts and the team gave him a round of cheers.

- He became the Bulls' starter at long snapper in the game at Cincinnati and served as the long snapper in six of the Bulls' nine games during the COVID season. He played with USF for three more seasons before transferring to Georgia Southern in January after graduating from USF with a degree in mechanical engineering.

- Statesboro is not new to him as both of his parents, Brad and Kathy Bernard, went to Georgia Southern. His father was an offensive guard at Georgia Southern in the 1980s. While a player, Bernard helped the Eagles to three national championships (1985, 1986 and 1989) and then again in 1990 as a strength & conditioning coach under coach Erk Russell.

- Bernard graduated from South Florida with a degree in mechanical engineering and wants to build airplanes or automobiles once he's done playing football.

TAKING FLIGHT

- Tight end **Tyler Fromm** excelled on the field and in the classroom at Auburn and is now poised to do the same in his last season of college football.

- Fromm, from nearby Warner Robins, was a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, college football's premier scholar-athlete award after completing his bachelor's degree in professional flight management at Auburn with a 3.76 grade-point average. He is also a two-time Collegiate Sports Communicators Academic All-District honoree.

- Auburn's professional flight degree provides a solid foundation of aeronautical knowledge and piloting skills expected by professional aviation organizations and necessary for success in the aviation industry. This degree qualifies him for the attainment of the FAA Restricted Airline Transport (R-ATP) certification and he is commercially rated as a pilot.

LOOKING FOR 1K

- Georgia Southern is one of four current FBS teams (there are 134 this year) that has never had a 1,000-yard receiver in a season. Khaleb Hood set the Southern school record last year, but came up just short of the 1K milestone and finished with 948 yards.

ADJUSTING TO THE EAST COAST

- Sixth-year player **Cam Williams** is adjusting to life on the East Coast after spending most of his life in California and Washington. Williams played in four games in 2022 for the Washington Huskies before taking a redshirt to preserve his year. He entered the NCAA Transfer Portal in December and enrolled at Georgia Southern in January of 2023.

- When he entered the Portal, he had two coaches who knew him well: defensive line coach **Rip Rowan** and head coach **Clay Helton**. Rowan coached at UW before coming to Statesboro, so that was an easy connection to make. For Helton, he never coached Williams, but remembers him well from his days at USC.

- In 2019, Williams started seven games and earned Second-Team Freshman All-America honors from ProFootballFocus.com. He was also named All-Pac-12 honorable mention by the same outlet.

- On Oct. 19, Williams recorded five tackles and two interceptions in the victory over USC, then coached by Helton, at Husky Stadium in Seattle. Rowan was on the staff for that game and remembers it well. The first

pick came in the first quarter and the Huskies scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive. The final interception came on USC's drive as the Trojans tried to mount a late comeback.

- Williams made his mark in high school as a dual threat at Bakersfield High, throwing for 3,396 yards and 32 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,054 yards and seven scores. A PrepStar All-American, he was listed by 247Sports as the No. 31 safety in the nation and the No. 27 "athlete" prospect in the country by ESPN.

- He graduated from Washington with a degree in comparative history of ideas before enrolling at Georgia Southern in January of 2023. He broke his hand on an interception in the Coastal Carolina game last year, but returned for the bowl game.

REUNITED ... AND IT FEELS SO GOOD

- The last time twins **David** and **Josh Dallas** were on the field together in a game was Dec. 9, 2021 as the pair led Trinity Catholic to the GHSA 1A-Private state title with a 55-28 win over Prince Avenue Christian at Center Parc Stadium in Atlanta to cap a 14-0 season in which they averaged a whopping 53 points per game.

- With David at quarterback and Josh at wide receiver, their bonds led to the success that culminated in a phenomenal senior year for both of them. David posted 4,033 yards passing and 49 passing touchdowns to five interceptions while also contributing 350 yards rushing and seven touchdowns on the ground. Josh had 62 catches for 1,168 yards and 16 touchdowns at wide receiver while also adding 34 tackles and eight interceptions playing as a defensive back.

- For the duo, football is all about family. They grew up watching their father Kenny coach high school football, then played for him at Trinity Christian School. First as ball boys for their dad's team when they were in middle school and their oldest brother Jake was playing, to then being the stars for their father on a state championship run a few years later.

- With an older brother (Caleb) serving as assistant coaches for their dad, their younger sister (Elly) as a trainer, their youngest brother (Zech) as the ball boy, and their mother (Shannon) as the team photographer, Friday nights were truly a family affair.

- The brotherly love that Josh, who is two minutes

older, and David share meant that their dream was to play college football together. The process may have been crazy due to the way COVID affected recruiting, but it ended up working out well for them in the end. At one point, Josh was committed to Liberty and David to Western Michigan, but they wouldn't have been together so Josh flipped his commitment to WMU. On the last day of the December recruiting period, and on the way back from a visit to WMU, the entire family decided to drive to Statesboro and check out Georgia Southern. The rest, is history.

- Both brothers had surgery after their senior playing seasons, David on his throwing shoulder and Josh on his hip. Josh was back in seven months while David had to have several other procedures to finally get his shoulder right. Josh played in five games as a freshman and redshirted and then played in 12 games last year, catching four passes for 40 yards while earning a spot on the College Sports Communicators Academic All-District team.

- Meanwhile, David has bided his time and was cleared to return full this past spring. Even while rehabbing, he found time to give back to the local community. He was nominated for the prestigious Allstate Wuerffel Trophy this preseason for his work with Feed the Boro, Team IMPACT, Relay for Life, Halloween Trunk or Treat, Parents Night of Bulloch County and much more. Despite being around each other at the football center all the time, the two still share a Statesboro apartment and have many of the same hobbies such as fishing and movie watching.

- The brothers are believed to be just one of two sets of twins playing in the FBS who are a quarterback/receiver duo, joining the University of Miami's Riply (QB) and Kolby (WR) Luna.

- Now, back on the field together and playing just a few hours from home, the duo is realizing the dream they dreamt after a few obstacles got in the way.

COACHING RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- Several members of the coaching staff have strong ties to college coaching.

- Head coach **Clay Helton** has been around football his entire life. Besides being Houston's head coach from 1993 to 1999, his father, Kim Helton, was an assistant in college (Florida, Miami, and Alabama Birmingham), the NFL (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Houston Oilers, Los Angeles Raiders, Washington Redskins), and the CFL (Toronto

- His brother, Tyson Helton, was the quarterbacks coach and pass game coordinator at USC (2016-17) until becoming Tennessee's offensive coordinator in 2018 and is now the head coach at Western Kentucky.

- Special teams coordinator **Turner West** played college football from 2006-09 at Memphis, where his father Tommy West was the head coach as part of a 40-year coaching career that also includes leading the program at Clemson.

- Inside receivers coach **Clint Trickett** is the youngest of three sons of Rick and Tara Trickett. His father, a long-time, well-respected collegiate coach, has had notable stints at West Virginia, Mississippi State, Auburn, LSU, and Florida State under Jimbo Fisher, helping win the 2013 BCS National Championship. He is currently the offensive line coach at Jacksonville State and has nearly 50 years of coaching experience. His brother, Travis, is the offensive coordinator at Coastal Carolina, and his brother, Chance, is a scout for the Los Angeles Rams and was named to the 2023 BART list for the top seven college scouts in the NFL.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

- College Sports Communicators in association with The Associated Press (AP) and the Fiesta Bowl Organization is sponsoring the 2024 Comeback Player of the Year Award. Since 2018, the award has recognized college football student-athletes for overcoming injury, illness, or other circumstances. At the conclusion of each season, in a vote by a panel of college football writers, editors, and sports information directors, three college football student-athletes are honored as Comeback Player of the Year Award winners at the Vrbo Fiesta Bowl.

- This year, Georgia Southern has three on the Watch List in quarterback **David Dallas**, receiver **Sam Kenerson** and quarterback **Dexter Williams II**.

- Former Eagle offensive lineman Drew Wilson won the award in 2019 after missing the entire 2018 season with

a detached retina in his right eye, which made him legally blind in the eye. Brian Miller was a finalist for the award in 2020 after returning from a hip injury that doctors feared at first may have ended his career.

- Dallas is returning from multiple procedures on his throwing shoulder while Kenerson and Williams II are both returning from multiple knee surgeries.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN FOOTBALL TRADITIONS

- Georgia Southern has a rich tradition in the college football world, winning six Division I-AA national titles, but also has traditions that make the program unique.

BEAUTIFUL EAGLE CREEK

- When Georgia Southern resurrected the football program in 1981, traditions and spirit needed resurrection as well. So legendary head football coach Erk Russell created his own. Inspired by the gnat-infested drainage ditch that cut across the field between what was then the team’s locker room and practice fields, Russell convinced his players that its stagnant water was actually “Beautiful Eagle Creek,” a source of “magical” waters.

- Head coach Clay Helton, along with the new coaches/ staff, the seniors and the freshmen, had a “baptism” in the creek on the final day of camp before the game week started.

FREEDOM’S FLIGHT

- In what has become one of the most popular traditions at GS, “Freedom,” a male American Bald Eagle, takes flight before each home football game. Freedom is a Southern Bald Eagle that was found knocked out of the nest in Maitland, Florida.

- Only weeks old and appearing like a “brown ball of fuzz”, it was discovered that the young eagle had an injury to its beak and suffered from an infection. Rushed to the Florida Audubon Center for Birds of Prey, Freedom made a complete recovery from the infection but the injury to the beak was permanent, preventing his release back into the wild.

- With the permission of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, GS acquired Freedom in 2004. Through the Georgia Southern University Center for Wildlife Education and Lamar Q. Ball Jr. Raptor Center, thousands of visitors young and old are embraced by the Power of Freedom.

- Under the supervision of Steve Hein, Director of the Center for Wildlife Education, Freedom (20 years old) is on the sidelines of all GS home games, and select road games.

- Georgia Southern’s athletics teams have adopted several names throughout history, but claimed “Eagles” by a campus vote in 1959.

YELLOW SCHOOL BUSES

- When the football program was resurrected in 1981, the team needed a way to travel to practices and games. Operating on a shoestring budget didn’t allow for transportation back then, let alone any luxurious travel.

- The Bulloch County Board of Education stepped in with a deal the University couldn’t refuse: GS would only pay \$1 each for two yellow school buses. The football team still uses buses to this day, taking a lap around campus on game days.

WHY ARE THEY CALLED THE EAGLES?

- Eagles is the third nickname used by Georgia Southern and has been the official nickname since 1959.

- From 1924 to 1941, the school went through three name changes. From 1924 to 1928, it was called the Georgia Normal School. From 1929 to 1938, it was the South Georgia Teachers College and was then changed to the Georgia Teachers College in 1939 remaining that way until 1958.

- The nickname from 1924 to 1941 was the Blue Tide. The origin of the nickname is unknown.

- After World War II, when all sports except football were revived, the nickname was changed to Professors to coordinate with the name of the school, Georgia Teachers College.

- However, when the school was renamed Georgia Southern College in 1959, Professors no longer fit the school’s image. The department of athletics decided to let the students vote for a nickname and Eagles was selected in a narrow vote over Colonels. Georgia Southern, which moved to Georgia Southern University in 1990, has been the Eagles ever since.

RETIRED NUMBERS

- GS has retired two numbers in its football history, No. 3 for Adrian Peterson and No. 8 for Tracy Ham. Both are College Football Hall of Famers and both went to the same high school: Santa Fe in Alachua, Florida.

- Peterson, a 2017 CFB Hall of Fame Inductee, is the NCAA Division I all-time leading rusher with 6,559 yards in regular-season contests and was a four-time All-American. He led the Eagles to two national titles.

- Ham, a 2007 College Football Hall of Fame Inductee was also inducted into the Canadian Football Hall of Fame in 2010. A first-team All-American in 1986, he led the Eagles to back-to-back I-AA National Championships.

- Both still work in the Georgia Southern Athletics Department: Ham as a Senior Associate AD for Administration and Peterson as the Director of Student-Athlete Development for the football team.

THE POWER OF PAULSON

- Georgia Southern holds one of the best home-field advantages in the FBS, posting a 215-50 record at Allen E. Paulson Stadium. That winning percentage is the third best out of all currently used FBS stadiums, trailing only Alabama, Boise State and Oklahoma.

- The Eagles are 33-11 all-time at Paulson Stadium when playing in front of 20,000 or more fans.

OXFORD, Miss. - The fifth-ranked Ole Miss Rebels jumped out to a quick 17-0 lead and didn't look back in downing the Georgia Southern football squad, 52-13, in front of a record crowd of 67,505 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Rebels took the opening kickoff and scored in two plays just 31 seconds in and then the Eagles fumbled on their first play. The defense held tight to force a field goal, but the Rebels got another touchdown later in the period to take a 17-0 lead. Early in the second quarter, JC French led a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with running back OJ Arnold connecting with Derwin Burgess Jr. on a 12-yard scoring pass, the first TD scored against the Rebels on the season.

The Rebels scored the next three touchdowns to pull away, but the Eagles kept fighting. French led the team on a 10-play scoring drive late in the third quarter aided by three Ole Miss personal fouls, before Gavin Stewart capped off with a 42-yard field goal. Stewart nailed a 33-yard field goal with just less than two minutes remaining to account for the final score.

Chance Gamble led the defense with seven tackles and also had his first interception as an Eagle after picking off four at Kennesaw State. Marques Watson-Trent and Davon Gilmore also had seven tackles. Burgess Jr. had five catches for 53 yards and a score.
