THE SERIES: Saturday's contest is the 24th meeting on the hardwood between Jacksonville State and Georgia State with the Panthers holding an 18-5 advantage in the series.

Georgia State has won 10 of the last 11 and 12 of the last 14 meetings in the series, dating back to the 1997-98 campaign. The two teams were frequent adversaries as members of the Trans America Athletic (TAAC) and Atlantic Sun Conferences.

The combatants last met in the semifinal round of the 2003 Atlantic Sun tournament, which the Panthers won 54-47 en route to their third straight tournament crown and third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.

HIGH OCTANE: Georgia State's 91-point outburst against Norfolk State on 11/21/06 was the most for the Panthers since totaling 91 in a 91-70 home victory over (ironically) Jacksonville State on Feb. 22, 2003.

SLOW START: Through four games, Georgia State is averaging 27.5 ppg in the first half, compared to 34.8 ppg for opponents. State has been out scored 139-110 in the first period.

The Panthers are shooting 38 percent and averaging 11.8 turnovers (47) in the frame. Comparatively, opponents are shooting 37 percent in the first half and averaging 9.5 turnovers (38).

State picks up its pace in the second half as the team is shooting 34 percent and opponents are shooting 36 percent. Turnovers are also fairly even at 46 to 42. State is averaging 34.2 second half points and opponents are averaging 36.0 ppg in the second period.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Georgia State's five straight road games to start a regular season is a school record.

The previous record was three straight games on several occasions, most recently in 2001-02.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN II: The last time Georgia State played five or more straight regular season games away from the Sports Arena was back in 2004-05 from Dec. 19 to Jan. 8.

The Panthers participated at the Carolinas Challenge (Dec. 19) and had two games at the Tulane/DoubleTree Classic (Dec. 28-29). State stayed on the road for games at Mercer (Jan. 3), at Stetson (Jan. 6) and at Jacksonville (Jan. 8) before hosting Lipscomb on Jan. 13.

DEJA VU: Georgia State averaged 54.3 points per game through its first four games last season. That trend seemed to be continuing as the Panthers were averaging 52.0 ppg through its first three games this year.

State recovered from its lack of scoring last year with an 85-53 win over Norfolk State in game five. It appears as though "lightning struck twice" as the Panthers bested the Spartans 91-70 Tuesday to improve their scoring average to 61.8 ppg.

COMING OUT PARTY: Freshman forward **Danyiel McKeller** scored 17 points in the Panthers' first regular season game at Miami on Nov. 10. Her 17 points is the highest debut for a freshman since Monica Thomas (2002-06) totaled 12 points in 16 minutes off the bench in a 72-67 Panthers' victory at FIU on Nov. 22, 2002.

In her first collegiate start and only her second appearance of the season, freshman guard/forward **Tabitha David** scored 18 first half points,

going 6-for-6 from 3-point range, en route to a game- and career-high 21 points at Norfolk State (11/21/06).

RARE COMPANY: RaShay Rawls and Danyiell McKeller are the first Georgia State freshmen to start in the first game of the regular season since Leslie McElrath (1997-2001) did it on Nov. 18, 1997 at home against Georgia Tech.

McElrath debuted with 11 points and eight rebounds in 38 minutes.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS: Georgia State's freshmen contributions have been considerable so far in 2006-07.

Consider this, a freshman has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in two of the four games played and has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in three of the four games played.

As a unit, the group has accounted for 48 percent (119 of 247) of Georgia State's total points and 41 percent (70 of 170) of the Panthers' rebounding total.

ON THE RECORD: Georgia State's nine made 3-point field goals at Norfolk State on Nov. 22, 2006

ranks tied for 5th all-time for team 3-pointers in a game.

THE LAST TIME vs. Jacksonville State: The Georgia State University women's basketball squad took over sole possession of first place in the Atlantic Sun Conference North Division with a 91-70 win over Jacksonville State University at the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (13-10, 8-4) and Jacksonville State (13-10, 7-5) had been tied for the top spot in the A-Sun North since Feb. 6. The Gamecocks won this season's earlier matchup, 60-40, in Jacksonville, Ala.

The Lady Panthers made 15 of their first 21 field goal attempts in building a 36-19 lead with 7:39 left in the opening half. GSU led, 49-31, at halftime.

In the second half, Jax State could get no closer than 16 points.

Georgia State shot 55.7 percent from the field, compared to 39.7 percent for the guests.

Senior Evita Rogers led the winners with a game-high 23 points while freshman Monica Thomas contributed career bests of 22 points and eight rebounds.

Last season, Henry eclipsed another milestone, winning her 250th game, which she earned with an 89-65 win over Towson on Jan. 15th. Henry is 254-212 overall in 17 collegiate seasons.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** ranks in the top 10 of several career records lists. She sits in sixth place on the all-time list with 99 made 3-point field goals and ranks third all-time in free throw percentage at 76.6 percent (170-222). Roegiers-Jensen is 6th on the career assists list with 303.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS II: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is 123 points away from becoming the 17th player in Georgia State women's basketball history with 1,000 or more career points. She has started 67 of 92 games played and has scored 877 points in her four-year career.
