### Game Recap

Tipping off its inaugural season in the Colonial Athletic Association, the Georgia State Panthers deoured the visiting Delaware Blue Hens at the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State dominated the boards with 44 rebounds and shot an impressive 56 percent from the field. Malcolm Manier scored 17 points on seven-of-nine shooting and grabbed eight boards and Boyd Copeland scored 18 points with seven assists.

Hanging to a 27-25 lead with six minutes left in the first half, Manier drained back-to-back three-point baskets and sophomore center Justin Billingslea added a hoop to open a 35-25 lead at 4:33.

Delaware shot the ball well in the first half but trailed at halftime 44-35. Delaware's 6-8 senior forward Harding Nana tried to keep the Hens in the game shooting eight-of-14 from the field and scoring 23 points with nine rebounds. Andrew Washington added 20 points off the bench.

State scorched the Hens defense in the second half, scoring 55 points including 12-of-15 from the foul line and a perfect three-of-three from beyond the arc.

State has won 17 straight games when topping the 80-point mark.

### Game Recap

Georgia State had it's chances against Charlotte, the newest Atlantic-10 member, coming within two points with 1:45 left in the game but a three-pointer by De'Angelo Alexander sent the 49ers on their way to a five-point victory over the Panthers.

State kept it close by shooting 50 percent from the field and making seven three-point baskets. Charlotte was just too strong on the inside with 42 rebounds to the Panthers 19.

Charlotte got a double-double from senior forward Curtis Withers who scored 24 points and grabbed 10 boards. De'Angelo Alexander added 15 points and five rebounds.

The Panthers and Charlotte closed the first half tied at 39 apiece. The score stayed close with State holding a 56-55 lead with 7:45 left in the game but Charlottes Chris Nance put back a missed shot to give the 49ers the lead for good at 7:03. State was within a bucket with 19 seconds left, but Withers made two free throws to help put State away.

Malcolm Manier led the host Panthers with 19 points, guard Boyd Copeland had 14 points with six assists, and Deven Dickerson scored nine points off the bench.

### Game Recap

With a strong second half and four players in double figures, Georgia State was able to knock off the Ragin' Cajuns of Louisiana-Lafayette in the first of two meetings this season.

Panthers freshman Rashad Chase scored 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in achieving his first career double-double. Herman Favors added 17 off the bench and guards D'Andre McGrew and Boyd Copeland scored 13 and 10 points in the victory.

With only a 34-32 lead at the half, the Panthers needed to pick up the energy and responded with some tight defense and clutch shooting taking a commanding 58-46 lead with 10:20 left to play.

Louisiana-Lafayette got 24 points and 10 rebounds from 6-10 senior center Michael Southall and 16 points and eight rebounds from senior guard Dwayne Mitchell.

Georgia State sophomore Deven Dickerson contributed nine points, five rebounds, and four blocks before fouling out.

## Game Recap

Georgia State shot just 28.6 percent from the field including three-of-19 outside the three-point-arc in its first Colonial Athletic Association loss.

With 10 minutes left in the first half, the score was tied at 12 but George Mason, led by senior guard Lamar Butler, went on a 19-5 run to give the Patriots a commanding 31-17 lead. Mason shot 63 percent from the field in the first half with nine lay-ups to States dismal 29 percent.

The Panthers cold shooting continued in the second half as George Mason sealed the game with a 13-0 run which gave them a 53-27 lead.

Deven Dickerson continued his strong play off the bench for State, scoring 10 points and grabbing eight rebounds. D'Andre McGrew added nine points and seven rebounds in the losing effort.

The Patriots Bulter scored 21 points, including five-of-eight from beyond the three-point-arc and Will Thomas scored 15 points with nine rebounds.

This was the 400th basketball game the Panthers have played in the GSU Sports Arena.

## Game Recap

Georgia State stunned the second largest home crowd in team history, opening the game on a 11-0 run by making its first five-of-six attempts. The 15th-ranked Wildcats were not fazed as they put together their own 11 point run to tie the game at 11 with 11:30 remaining in the first half.

Georgia State stayed close to Kentucky trailing at halftime 30-24. The Wildcats opened the second half on a 21-6 run to put away the Panthers for good.

The Panthers had no answer for Kentucky's 7-3 center, Shagari Alleyne, who scored 16 points to go with six rebounds off the bench. Joe Crawford added 14 points and seven rebounds.

Rashad Chase put up a season-high and career-high in points scoring 19 on eight-of-13 shooting and grabbed five rebounds but for the most part the team continued to shoot poorly including three-of-17 from three-point range and 19-of-53 from the field.

The game was shown nationally on ESPNU-TV.

Georgia State played its state rival Georgia tough but was doomed by its 22 turnovers. The Panthers held Georgia to 42 percent shooting from the field and just four-of-18 from the three-point-arc but it was not enough.

Georgia erased a 15-13 deficit with 8:00 to go in the first half with a 12-0 run sparked by two-follow-ups and two more lay-ups to make the run that proved to be the difference.

The Panthers lost both center Deven Dickerson and center Justin Billingslea to injuries. Despite not having both centers, the Panthers got some excellent contributions from seniors D'Andre McGrew who scored 19 points, Herman Favors who added 15 points, and guard Malcolm Manier who scored 10 points in the losing effort.

The Bulldogs were led by Sundiata Gaines who had 14 points, seven rebounds, and six assists.

Billy Humphrey scored 12 points and Mike Mercer added 10.

Georgia ended a two-game losing streak to Georgia State with this win on regional TV.

State was led by senior guard Herman Favors 24 points, with 14 points from freshman guard Leonard Mendez and 10 points from junior Lance Perique. Hofstra's senior forward Aurimas Kieza scored 25 points, with 20 more from junior guard Loren Stokes and 11 points from junior guard Carlos Rivera.

Both teams shot 62 percent from the field in the first half. Hofstra finished the game at 54.7 percent, while State finished at 48.9 percent from the field. Georgia State held a 28-27 rebound advantage.

Leonard Mendez became the ninth different Panther to score in double figures this season.

## Game Recap

George Mason's magical run to the Final Four almost never got started. Upset-minded Georgia State took the No. 2 seeded Patriots in overtime before a depletion of troops helped Mason to a 61-56 win.

The Panthers from Atlanta dominated early in moving to a 15-4 lead after the first seven minutes and were up 21-14 through the first 14 minutes. A three-point bank shot by reserve Hernandez and four free throws by Skinn brought Mason back to a tie and helped them secure a 27-25 halftime lead as the Patriots shot 14 free throws to zero for the Panthers as State had a pair of players with three first-half fouls.

When State made just 3 of its first 15 second half shots, it appeared Mason might take control at 40-32. But, the Panthers weren't done.

State retook the lead 43-41 with 4:15 to play after three three-point baskets, but by this point two Panthers had fouled out and two more had four fouls. Favors jumper kept State ahead, 45-43 with 3:26 on the clock.

Missed free throws in the final two minutes hurt both teams. State's Chase missed a one-and-one at 1:19 and with 32.9 Favors missed one of his three attempts that would have given State the lead again. State held Mason without a field goal the final nine minutes of regulation.

In OT, State scored first to take a 49-47 lead. But reserve Sammy Hernandez provided the heroics off the bench with a lay-up followed by a three-point bomb, his second of the game and just fifth of the season, to open a 52-49 lead.

Copeland's free throws pulled State to within one at 54-53 with 2:12 to go when Dickerson became the third Panther inside player to foul out. That left the Panthers with four guards and forward Chase on the court down the stretch. A pair of lay-ups inside with no Panther big man to challenge by Thomas provided the Patriots with the go-ahead points.

State held Mason to just 19 field goals and 23.8 shooting percentage in the second half, but the 37 free throw attempts by Mason compared to 16 for State (+21) proved the difference.
