THE SERIES: Sunday's contest is the sixth meeting on the hardwood between Hofstra and Georgia State with the Pride holding a 4-1 advantage in the series.

Georgia State won the first-ever meeting between the two teams, downing Hofstra 77-43 in the consolation game of the Wagner Invitational on Dec. 29, 1989. Since then, the Pride has captured four straight contests, including a Colonial Athletic Association regular season sweep of the Panthers last year.

The Panthers fell to the Pride, 86-77, in the quarterfinals of the 2006 CAA Championships.

APPROACHING MILESTONES: Georgia State head coach **Lea Henry**, who is in her 13th season at the helm of the Panthers, is two victories away from reaching 200 wins at State. She is already the program's all-time wins leader and owns a record of 198-155 (.561).

Last season, Henry eclipsed another milestone, winning her 250th career game, which she earned with an 89-65 win over Towson on Jan. 15th. Henry is 256-212 overall in 17 collegiate seasons.

CONFERENCE HISTORY: Georgia State's women's basketball team has played in two conferences over the past 22 years.

State was a charter member of the New South Women's Athletic Conference (NSWAC) which existed for six seasons from 1985-1991. The NSWAC later changed its name to Trans America Athletic Conference (TAAC), which existed for 10 years (1991-2001) before another name change took place. The TAAC became the Atlantic Sun (A-Sun) in 2001-

02 and still exists today, entering its sixth season.

Georgia State enters its second season in its new conference, the Colonial Athletic Association, which it joined beginning in 2005-06.

CONFERENCE OPENERS: Since 1985-86, the Panthers are 7-14 overall in conference openers. The team is 6-6 in its first league game under head coach **Lea Henry**. State has won two of its last three conference openers and has triumphed in four of its last seven. Henry finished 2-3 in her first five conference openers.

Georgia State is 7-14 in conference-opener ROAD games. The team is 4-8 in conference-opener road games under Henry.

OPENER BREAK-DOWNS: Georgia State posted an 0-6 mark in its

first NSWAC games from 1985-1991. The Panthers were 5-5 in their first league games in 10 years as members of the TAAC. State finished 2-2 in four seasons to open A-Sun play. The team is 0-1 in CAA league openers.

REMEMBER DECEMBER: Georgia State is 44-56 in the month of December since the 1990-91 season and 39-33 in December under head coach **Lea Henry**.

The Panthers' of 1999-2000 produced an undefeated 6-0 mark. Over the previous five seasons, State has compiled marks of 4-2 (2005-06), 3-4 (2004-05), 3-3 (2003-04), 4-3 (2002-03) and 3-3 (2001-02).

KIN FOLK: Georgia State men's basketball NLI recruit, **Jihad Ali**, who signed with the Panthers in November, is the brother of current Hofstra junior guard, **India Ali**. Jihad is currently a 6-5, 180-pound senior guard at Martin Luther King, Jr. High School in Atlanta. Jihad and his sister, **India**, are from Lithonia, Ga.

ROLE REVERSAL: A lineup change has reaped huge benefits for the Panthers in their last two games.

By inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** into the point guard position and moving freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup, State has improved its scoring average by more than 20 points per game.

Prior to the lineup change, the Panthers averaged only 52.0 ppg and was 0-3 on the season. Since then, Georgia State is 3-0 and averaging 75.7 points per game in those victories.

COMING OUT PARTY: Freshman forward **Danyiel McKeller** scored 17 points in the Panthers' first regular season game at Miami on Nov. 10. Her 17 points is the highest debut for a freshman since

Monica Thomas (2002-06) totaled 12 points in 16 minutes off the bench in a 72-67 Panthers' victory at FIU on Nov. 22, 2002.

In her first collegiate start and only her second appearance of the season, freshman guard/forward **Tabitha David** scored 18 first half points, going 6-for-6 from 3-point range, en route to a game- and career-high 21 points at Norfolk State (11/21/06).

RARE COMPANY: RaShay Rawls and Danyiel McKeller are the first Georgia State freshmen to start in the first game of the regular season since Leslie McElrath (1997-2001) did it on Nov. 18, 1997 at home against Georgia Tech.

McElrath debuted with 11 points and eight rebounds in 38 minutes.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS: Georgia State's freshmen contributions have been considerable so far in 2006-07.

Consider this, a freshman has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in three of the six games played and has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in four of the six games played.

As a unit, the group has accounted for nearly half (48.3 percent -- 185 of 383) of Georgia State's total points and 39.5 percent (98 of 248) of the Panthers' rebounding total.

ON THE RECORD: Georgia State's nine made 3-point field goals at Norfolk State on Nov. 22, 2006 ranks tied for 5th all-time for team 3-pointers in a game.

THE LAST TIME vs. Hofstra: Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen led three Georgia State players in double figures as the No. 12 seed Lady Panthers dropped an 86-77 decision to #4 Hofstra in the quarterfinals of the 2006 Colonial Athletic Association Tournament.

Roegiers-Jensen also collected seven rebounds three steals and tied for game-high honors with six assists. **Marcquitta Head** posted 16 points and a team-high nine rebounds. **Keisha Monroe** added 11 points off the bench.

Hofstra had five players in double figures, led by Vanessa Gidden who posted game-highs in both scoring (21) and rebounding (17). Cigi McCollin nailed 19 points, Amaka Agugua totaled 15, Lizanne Murphy finished with 10 and Lana Harshaw registered 10 in reserve.

State trailed by only four at halftime, 37-33, after being down by as many as seven in the period. Both teams made significant runs throughout the second half, but the Lady Panthers could never take back the lead.
