GEORGIA STATE (5-4) vs. NORTH FLORIDA (2-7)
TUE., DEC. 19, 5 P.M., UCF ARENA, ORLANDO, FLA.
UCF HOLIDAY CLASSIC**

- Georgia State has never met North Florida on the hardwood.
- Georgia State is:
 - 1-0 against teams with losing records.
 - 4-4 against teams with records of .500 or better.
 - 1-3 when shooting less than .400 from the floor (1st win is against FAMU)
 - 1-4 when it is out rebounded (1st win is against FAMU)
 - 4-1 when scoring 30 or more at halftime (lone loss at Hofstra)
 - 2-0 in games when the margin is 5 points or less
 - 4-0 when leading with 5:00 minutes remaining in the game
 - 5-0 when 3 or more players score 10 or more points.
- North Florida is the first Atlantic-Sun Conference team Georgia State has faced since leaving the league following the 2004-05 season.
- A win over North Florida would give Georgia State its sixth win in 10 games. The last time State picked up six wins in its first 10 games was at the start of the 2003-04 season.
- Head coach Lea Henry earned her 200th victory as Georgia State's head coach with the win over Florida A&M Monday (200-156 record in 13 seasons at State). She is the program's all-time wins leader and is 258-214 in 17 seasons overall.
- Georgia State has won five of its last six games. The Panthers are 3-4 away from the Sports Arena.
- Since Lea Henry's first season in 1994-95, Georgia State is 19-13 in the second game involving a back-to-back contest. The team is 13-8 in the back-to-back game since the start of the 1999-2000 campaign.
- Since inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** and freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup on Nov. 11, 2006, Georgia State is producing 20 points (71.8) more per game over its last five games compared to its first three contests.
- Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is 1-13 (0.77) from 3-point range over the last three games. She had gone 11-35 (.314) in the first six.
- Georgia State's last field goal against Florida A&M occurred with 4:33 minutes remaining in the game. State missed its last six field goals, but made 3-of-4 free throws in the final minute to secure the win.
- Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** eclipsed her career-high with 12 assists vs. Florida A&M. She fell one rebound shy of a triple double against the Lady Rattlers with 14 points, 12 assists and nine rebounds. It was her second career double-double.
- Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** recorded her fifth career double-double with 14 points and 16 rebounds against Florida A&M. Her 16 rebounds ties her career-high.
- Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is 60 points away from becoming the 17th player in school history with 1,000 or more career points. She needs 29 three pointers to break the school record of 131.

THE SERIES: Monday's contest is the 22nd meeting on the hardwood between Florida A&M and Georgia State with the Rattlers holding a 12-9 advantage in the series.

The Panthers won the last meeting 94-73 in Atlanta on Dec. 7, 1996. State has six of 11 contests after dropping seven of the first 10. State is 0-1 on neutral courts against Florida A&M.

The two teams were frequent adversaries as charter members of the New South Women's Athletic (NSWAC) and Trans America Athletic (TAAC) conferences.

FAMU left the TAAC following the 1991-92 season.

LEAGUE RULES: Georgia State has played four of the 11 current teams in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). Florida A&M is the last of three MEAC schools on the Panthers' schedule (Hampton and Norfolk State are the others).

The Panthers are 14-14 versus the overall league, but 5-2 against Morgan State, Hampton and Norfolk State.

The Panthers are 9-12 versus Florida A&M. The Rattlers and Panthers had several battles as members of the New South Women's Athletic and Trans America Athletic Conferences.

ON THE ROAD: Georgia State has played six games away from the Sports Arena this season, resulting in a 2-4 record. The Panthers are away from Atlanta for the final time in 2006 as participants in the UCF Holiday Classic.

Two wins in the Classic would give the Panthers an even 4-4 mark away from the Sports Arena to close out 2006.

APPROACHING MILESTONES: Georgia State head coach **Lea Henry**, who is in her 13th season at the helm of the Panthers, is one victory away from reaching 200 wins at State. She is already the program's all-time wins leader and owns a record of 199-156 (.561).

Last season, Henry eclipsed another milestone, winning her 250th career game, which she earned with an 89-65 win over Towson on Jan. 15th. Henry is 257-213 overall in 17 collegiate seasons.

FULL THROTTLE: Georgia State has scored 90 points or more in a game twice this season. The last time the Panthers scored 90+ points twice in a season was back during the 2000-01 campaign. The 44-point margin of victory in the win over Savannah State Dec. 9 was the most for the Panthers since winning by 59 points (89-30) over Morris Brown on Dec. 14, 2002.

CAREER FAIR: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** totaled a career-best 10 assists against Savannah State on Dec. 9, while sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** also rang up career numbers with a game-high 22 points.

THE LAST TIME vs. Florida A&M: Georgia State earned its second straight homecourt win to the start the season as the Panthers avenged a loss the previous year at Florida A&M with a 19-point win in Atlanta.

Senior guard Tammy Felton had a career-high 31 points, seven rebounds and seven assists to pace a Panthers' attack that also featured four other players in double figures, including Etolia Mitchell with 20 points, Montrine Thomas with 14 and freshman Carmelita Layog with 12 in only her second collegiate game.

Pzced by Mitchell's 15 rebounds and Thomas' 14, Georgia State out rebounded its visitors from Tallahassee 55-40 and connected on 50 percent from 3-point range (7 of 14).

After opening a 48-39 lead at halftime, GSU led by at least 11 throughout the entire second half.

MAKING HISTORY: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** made history Dec. 3 after the posting Georgia's first-ever women's basketball triple-double with 14 points, 16 rebounds and 11 blocked shots at Hofstra. The feat was the first in 32 seasons of collegiate women's basketball at Georgia State.

Head's 11 blocked shots were school and Colonial Athletic Association single-game records. Her 16 rebounds were a career-high.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** wss named Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week Dec. 4 after totaling a

triple-double at Hofstra on Dec. 3 (14 pts, 16 rebs., 11 blks).

Head averaged a double-double on the week with 14.0 points and 12.5 rebounds per game. She also made 55.6 percent of her field goals.

WE SIGNED THEM: The Georgia State women's basketball staff signed two players to National Letters of Intent during the NCAA early signing period in November.

Current high school seniors **Chandra Harris** and **Danielle Anderson** have committed to play collegiate basketball for the Panthers as freshmen beginning in the 2007-08 season.

Harris, who currently attends Northeast High School in Macon, Ga., is a 6-0 forward who was also recruited by Georgia Tech, Miami and Eastern Kentucky.

Anderson, who currently attends Smiths Station High School in Smiths Station, Ala., is also a 6-0 forward who was recruited by Vanderbilt, Troy and Alabama A&M. Anderson averaged 21 points and 15 rebounds per game as a junior.

ROLE REVERSAL: A few lineup changes have reaped huge benefits for the Panthers in their last five games.

By inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** at the point guard position and moving freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup, State has im-

proved its scoring average by more than 20 points per game.

Prior to the lineup change, the Panthers averaged only 52.0 ppg and were 0-3 on the season. Since then, Georgia State is 3-1 and averaging 73.0 points per contests.

Five players are averaging double figures since the switch, led by **David's** 12.8 ppg. Senior **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is posting 12.6 ppg, while **Hollins** is registering 11.8 ppg. Sophomore **Marcquitta Head** collects 11.6 ppg and 10.6 rpg. Freshman **Danyiell McKeller** averages 11.4 ppg.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS: Georgia State's freshmen contributions have been considerable so far in 2006-07.

Consider this, a freshman has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in three of the eight games played and has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in four of the eight.

As a unit, the group has accounted for just under half (43.8 percent -- 228 of 521) of Georgia State's total points and 35.8 percent (125 of 349) of the Panthers' rebounding total.

Two of Georgia State's top three scorers and two of its top four rebounders are freshmen.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS II: Senior guard **Kecey Roegiers-Jensen** is 74 points away from becoming the 17th player in Georgia State women's basketball history with 1,000 or more career points. She has started 70 of 95 games played and has scored 926 points in her four-year career.-

REMEMBER DECEMBER: Georgia State is 45-57 in the month of December since the 1990-91 season and 40-34 in December under head coach **Lea Henry**.

The Panthers' of 1999-2000 produced an undefeated 6-0 mark. Over the previous five seasons, State has compiled marks of 4-2 (2005-06), 3-4 (2004-05), 3-3 (2003-04), 4-3 (2002-03) and 3-3 (2001-02).

COMING OUT PARTY: Freshman forward **Danyzell McKeller** scored 17 points in the Panthers' first regular season game at Miami on Nov. 10. Her 17 points is the highest debut for a freshman since Monica Thomas (2002-06) totaled 12 points in 16 minutes off the bench in a 72-67 Panthers' victory at FIU on Nov. 22, 2002.

In her first collegiate start and only her second appearance of the season, freshman guard/forward **Tabitha David** scored 18 first half points, going 6-for-6 from 3-point range, en route to a game- and career-high 21 points at Norfolk State (11/21/06).
