

**2006-07 GEORGIA STATE PANTHERS
SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES
GEORGIA STATE (7-4) vs. UT-MARTIN (6-4)
SAT., DEC. 29, 4 P.M., GSU SPORTS ARENA, ATLANTA, GA
GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY INVITATIONAL**

- Georgia State leads Tennessee-Martin in the all-time series, 2-1. The Panthers are 1-0 at home against the Skyhawks. State is seeking its third straight win over Tennessee-Martin.
- Georgia State is 37-18 versus teams from the Ohio Valley Conference.
- Georgia State advances to its eighth straight GSU Invitational championship. The Panthers are seeking their eighth tournament crown and third title in the last four years.
- The Panthers are 3-0 at home for the first time since the 2000-01 season. State started 6-0 at home that year and completed the season going 12-2 at the Sports Arena.
- Georgia State is seeking its fifth straight victory Saturday. The last time the Panthers won five straight was back in 2004-05.
- Georgia State is:
 - 3-0 against teams with losing records.
 - 4-4 against teams with records of .500 or better.
 - 5-0 when scoring 70 or more points in a game
 - 6-0 when out rebounding an opponent
 - 5-1 when leading at halftime (lone loss at Hofstra)
 - 6-1 when scoring 30 or more at halftime (lone loss at Hofstra)
 - 2-0 in games when the margin is 5 points or less
 - 6-0 when leading with 5:00 minutes remaining in the game
 - 7-0 when 3 or more players score 10 or more points.
- Freshman guard **Tabitha David** has made at least one 3-point basket in every game she has played (9 straight games)
- Head coach Lea Henry earned her 200th victory as Georgia State's head coach with the win over Florida A&M on Dec. 18. She is the program's all-time wins leader (202-156 in 13 seasons at Georgia State) and is 260-214 in 17 seasons overall.
- Georgia State has won seven of its last eight games.
- Since inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** and freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup on Nov. 11, 2006, Georgia State is producing 20 points (73.6 ppg) more per game over its last seven games compared to its first three contests. (52.0 ppg)
- Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is 3-18 (16.7 %) from 3-point range over the last five games. She had gone 11-35 (.314) in the first six.
- Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** totaled a season-high 20 points in Georgia State's win over Mississippi Valley State. It marked the second time she has scored 20 or more points in her career. **Roegiers-Jensen's** game-high 23 points (season-high) marked her 11th game of 20 or more points.
- Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** recorded her seventh career double-double with 20 points and 11 rebounds against Mississippi Valley State.
- Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** is 31 points away from becoming the 17th player in school history with 1,000 or more career points. She needs 27 three pointers to break the school record of 131.
