THE SERIES: Saturday's contest is only the second-ever meeting on the hardwood between Savannah State and Georgia State- two teams located roughly four hours (250 miles) from each other.

The Panthers hold the edge, 1-0, in the series as the two teams met for the first time last year with Georgia State claiming a 76-52 victory in Savannah.

HOME COURT: A victory over Savannah State Saturday will give Georgia State back-to-back wins at home for the first time since claiming victories over Hampton and Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 19 and Dec. 29, respectively, last season.

The last time the Panthers defeated an opponent at home by 10 or more points was a 71-44 triumph over Mississippi Valley State (Dec. 29, 2005).

APPROACHING MILESTONES: Georgia State head coach **Lea Henry**, who is in her 13th season at the helm of the Panthers, is two victories away from reaching 200 wins at State. She is already the program's all-time wins leader and owns a record of 198-156 (.559).

Last season, Henry eclipsed another milestone, winning her 250th career game, which she earned

with an 89-65 win over Towson on Jan. 15th. Henry is 256-213 overall in 17 collegiate seasons.

MAKING HISTORY: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** made history Sunday after the posting Georgia's first-ever women's basketball triple-double with 14 points, 16 rebounds and 11 blocked shots at Hofstra. The feat was the first in 32 seasons of collegiate women's basketball at Georgia State.

Head's 11 blocked shots were school and Colonial Athletic Association single-game records. Her 16 rebounds were a career-high.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES: Georgia State averages 27.7 ppg in the first half and allows 33.3 ppg. The Panthers are even with their opponents in the second stanza, 33.9 to 33.9.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** was named Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week Monday after totaling a triple-double at Hofstra Sunday afternoon (14 pts, 16 reb., 11 blks.). Head averaged a double-double on the week with 14.0 points and 12.5 rebounds per game. She also made 55.6 percent of her field goals.

WE SIGNED THEM: The Georgia State women's basketball staff signed two players to National Letters of Intent

during the NCAA early signing period in November. Current high school seniors **Chandra Harris** and **Danielle Anderson** have committed to play collegiate basketball for the Panthers as freshmen beginning in the 2007-08 season.

Harris, who currently attends Northeast High School in Macon, Ga., is a 6-0 forward who was also recruited by Georgia Tech, Miami and Eastern Kentucky.

Anderson, who currently attends Smiths Station High School in Smiths Station, Ala., is also a 6-0 forward who was recruited by Vanderbilt, Troy and Alabama A&M. Anderson averaged 21 points and 15 rebounds per game as a junior.

REMEMBER DECEMBER: Georgia State is 44-57 in the month of December since the 1990-91 season and 39-34 in December under head coach **Lea Henry**.

The Panthers' of 1999-2000 produced an undefeated 6-0 mark. Over the previous five seasons, State has compiled marks of 4-2 (2005-06), 3-4 (2004-05), 3-3 (2003-04), 4-3 (2002-03) and 3-3 (2001-02).

ROLE REVERSAL: A lineup change has reaped huge benefits for the Panthers in their last four games.

By inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** at the point guard position and moving freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup, State has improved its scoring average by more than 16 points per game.

Prior to the lineup change, the Panthers averaged only 52.0 ppg and were 0-3 on the season. Since then, Georgia State is 3-1 and averaging 68.8 points per contests.

Four players are averaging double figures since the switch, led by senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen**'s 13.8 ppg. **David** and freshman **Daniell**

McKeller are posting 13.0 ppg, while sophomore **Marcquitta Head** collects 12.3 ppg and 11.3 rpg.

COMING OUT PARTY: Freshman forward **Danyiell McKeller** scored 17 points in the Panthers' first regular season game at Miami on Nov. 10. Her 17 points is the highest debut for a freshman since Monica Thomas (2002-06) totaled 12 points in 16 minutes off the bench in a 72-67 Panthers' victory at FIU on Nov. 22, 2002.

In her first collegiate start and only her second appearance of the season, freshman guard/forward **Tabitha David** scored 18 first half points, going 6-for-6 from 3-point range, en route to a game- and career-high 21 points at Norfolk State (11/21/06).

RARE COMPANY: **RaShay Rawls** and **Danyiell McKeller** are the first Georgia State freshmen to start in the first game of the regular season since Leslie McElrath (1997-2001) did it on Nov. 18, 1997 at home against Georgia Tech.

McElrath debuted with 11 points and eight rebounds in 38 minutes.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS: Georgia State's freshmen contributions have been considerable so far in 2006-07.

Consider this, a freshman has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in three of the seven games played and has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in four of the seven.

As a unit, the group has accounted for nearly half (45.9 percent -- 198 of 431) of Georgia State's total points and 36.9 percent (106 of 287) of the Panthers' rebounding total.

ON THE RECORD: Georgia State's nine made 3-point field goals at Norfolk State on Nov. 22, 2006 ranks tied for 5th all-time for team 3-pointers in a game. The Panthers' 13 blocked shots at Hofstra is second all-time in school history.

THE LAST TIME vs. Savannah State: Guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** led three Georgia State players in double figures with a game-high 16 points as the Lady Panthers defeated Savannah State, 76-52, at Tiger Arena.

Center **Vatai Smith** scored a career-high 12 points and added six rebounds and three blocked shots for Georgia State, which opened up a 13-3 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Guard Monica Thomas registered 11 points. Center **Marcquitta Head** nearly collected her first double-double after grabbing a game- and career-high 10 rebounds to go with nine points.
