The victory at Towson was Georgia State's first-ever CAA win.

ON THE LINE: A win today pushes Georgia State to above .500 in CAA league play for the first time in its history at 7-6. State has posted even .500 marks four times this year, but has yet to go above .500.

The Panthers will move into no worse than a tie for fifth place in the league standings with a win.

THE LAST TIME vs. TOWSON: Senior guard **Keley Roegiers-Jensen** led five Georgia State players in double figures with a game-high 26 as the Panthers topped host Towson 87-81.

All five starters scored in double figures for the Panthers, led by

Roegiers-Jensen's 26, who also dished out a game-high 11 assists for her third career double-double. Also in double figures was freshman guard **Tabitha David**, who nailed 6-of-8 from the floor and was 4-of-5 from 3-point range to finish with 16 points.

Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** totaled 15 points for the Panthers before fouling out with 5:39 on the clock. Sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** recorded 15 points, seven assists, and six steals. Freshman forward **Danyiehl McKeller** registered 11 and a team-high nine rebounds.

Trailing 25-23 with 6:53 remaining in the first half, Roegiers-Jensen, who scored 16 first-half points, connected on a 3-pointer to open a 22-9 run to end the period, giving the Panthers a 45-34 advantage at the intermission. State held the Tigers to two field goals over the final four minutes in staking its 11-point halftime margin.

The Panthers never trailed in the second period, despite a furious rally from the Tigers. Towson climbed back to within three, 54-51, in the first eight minutes of the stanza after a made jumper from Jamell Beasley. However, David responded with a trey on the ensuing possession to ignite State's offense and pushed the lead back to double digits, 72-60, with 6:54 remaining.

The Tigers, led by 17 second half points from Kelly Robinson, managed to get within six on two occasions late in the contest, but it wasn't enough to overcome a Panthers' team that shot 58 percent from the floor and totaled 28 assists on 32 field goals.

Towson forward Kandace Davis posted a career-high 16 points and finished with a game-and career-best 11 rebounds. Guard Shanae Baker-Brice corralled 13 points, six assists and six steals. Beasley and Alexis Freeman each finished with 11 for Towson. Robinson finished with 19.

TODAY'S GAME: Georgia State hosts Towson Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. at the Sports Arena, seeking its second straight regular season sweep of the Tigers. Today's game is the second meeting between the two teams this season and is the final of two consecutive home games for the Panthers.

State posted a 2-0 record against Towson last year when the two teams met for the first time.

After their win Thursday night, the Panthers (14-9, 6-6 CAA) have a chance to post back-to-back victories in the same week for the first time in five weeks (since Jan. 4).

Georgia State has won two straight games at home and is 7-3 at the Sports Arena this season. State is 3-3 at home against conference opponents.

Towson (16-6, 7-5 CAA) is on a roll, having won two consecutive contests and five of its last six games. The lone loss during the stretch was an 87-81 loss to the Panthers in Towson, Md. on Feb. 1. The Tigers defeated Northeastern 68-63 on Feb. 4 and Drexel, 55-52, on Feb. 8, in their last two outings.

Towson is 8-3 on the road and 3-2 at conference road venues.

Towson is one of Georgia State's five permanent CAA partners through 2010-11 (for the next five seasons), which means the Panthers play a home-and-home series against the Tigers. The other partners are Northeastern, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion and Va. Commonwealth.

The Panthers made 18-of-24 free throws and shot 9-of-12 from the charity stripe in the final minute.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE: Georgia State is 113-56 overall in home games under coach Henry. The team is 72-38 in conference home games under Henry. State is 7-3 (3-3 CAA) at home this season.

“STAR” OF DAVID: Ironically, Georgia State is 12-1 when freshman guard **Tabitha David** scores in double figures. The Panthers are 2-8 when she either doesn't play or scores in single digits. The two wins were the Panthers' 82-58 victory over Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 29 and the 78-67 triumph over Drexel on Jan. 28.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK III: Georgia State freshman **Tabitha David** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week for all games played through Feb. 4. The award is the first for David this year and the third rookie of the week honor bestowed upon a Panther women's player this season.

David, a 5-10 guard/forward from Mableton, Ga., had a scintillating week from 3-point range, making 64 percent of her shots from downtown. She finished the week averaging 17.5 points and

3.0 assists per game, connecting on 9-of-14 treys and making 55 percent of her shots overall (12-of-22).

David's 3-point field goal percentage and 3-point field goals made per game rank 18th and 29th in the nation, respectively, in NCAA statistics through games of Feb. 4.

UP, UP AND AWAY: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** has seen her scoring average soar since the Mississippi Valley State game on Dec. 29, 2006 (13 games ago).

After scoring just six points against North Florida on Dec. 19 and owning a scoring average of 12.5 ppg, Roegiers-Jensen exploded for 23 against the Delta Devils.

Since then, she has scored in double figures in each of the last 13 contests, including seven games of 20 or more points and two of 30 or more. Roegiers-Jensen is averaging 21.1 points over the last 13 contests.

Since the MVSU contest, Roegiers-Jensen's scoring average has improved from 12.5 ppg to 17.3 ppg. She is listed 60th nationally in scoring average.

go down as "one-hit wonders" following impressive freshmen campaigns.

In 2005-06, the "dynamic duo" ranked as the Panthers' third and fourth top scorers, averaging 9.0 and 7.8 points per game, respectively. Head was the team's leading rebounder with 6.9 boards per contest, while Hollins led State in steals (80) with a 2.76 average.

As sophomores in 2006-07, Hollins and Head have continued to build on their solid first-year resumes. This season, Head's scoring and rebounding averages have improved to 11.0 and 8.7, respectively. Hollins averages 10.3 points and 3.4 steals per game.

Head and Hollins rank second and fourth, respectively, in scoring for Georgia State.

YOUNG & RESTLESS: Georgia State's young lineup of nine freshmen and sophomores among its 12 active players accounts for 69 percent (1080-of-1574) of the Panthers' scoring and 72 percent (675-of-940) of the Panthers' rebounding.

State's young "starting five" that includes sophomores **Brittany Hollins** and **Marcquitta Head** along with freshmen **Tabitha David**, **Danyell McKeller** and **RaShay Rawls** totals 45.6 of the Panthers' 68.4 points per game.

30-30 CLUB: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** posted back-to-back 30-plus-point games

on Jan. 18 and Jan. 21, becoming the first player since Leslie McElrath (1998-2001) to total 30 or more points in two consecutive contests. McElrath accomplished the feat in games 8 and 9 of the 1999-2000 season.

"SEASON OUTLOOK": Players approaching single-season school records include:

3-pt FGs made: Tabitha David needs 18 threes for school record (69).

Assists: Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen needs 46 assists for school record (199).

Blocked Shots: Marcquitta Head needs 4 blocked shots for school record (57).

Steals: Brittany Hollins needs 9 steals for school record (86).

THREE'S THE CROWD: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** needs 1 three-point field goal to break the school career record of 131 set last year by Monica Thomas (2003-06). She has 131 career treys.

OVERTIME: Georgia State is 15-13 all time in overtime games (32 seasons). The Panthers are 8-4 in OT contests under head coach **Lea Henry**. Four of the 12 OT games played under Henry have occurred this season where the Panthers are 3-1 on the year.

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: State's game at UNC Wilmington (Feb. 18) was the first double-overtime contest for the Panthers since dropping a 79-75 decision against Marquette in the finals of State's 2002 Hyatt Regency Atlanta Invitational (12/7/02).

The Panthers played another OT contest this season on Feb. 21 against VCU, marking the first time in school history that State has played back-to-back overtime games in a single season.

OVER THE HILL: This season marks the third time in the past four years Georgia State has played at least two overtime games in a season (2003-04 and 2005-06 were the other seasons). The last time State played three OT contests in a season was back in 1984-85.

ABOVE & BEYOND: State's overtime game against UNC Wilmington on Feb. 8 marked the first time in 32 seasons of collegiate basketball that the Panthers have played four OT games in a single season.

US AGAINST THEM: For the first time in school history, Georgia State played into overtime against the same team twice in the same season. Both of State's contests against UNCW went into OT this year.

THE FINAL COUNTDOWN: Today's game against Towson is the fifth of the final 10 regular season games for Georgia State. The Panthers are 3-1 this year in their final 10 regular season contests.

Over the past 12 seasons under head coach **Lea Henry**, the Panthers are 75-49 over their final 10 regular season games. State posted consecutive 9-1 marks in 1999-2000 and 2000-01.

CLOSE CALLS: Georgia State is being out scored by its opponents 74.0 to 72.9 over the past seven games. During that span, the Panthers have gone 4-3, including three overtime games and a one-point loss to William & Mary.

THREE THE HARD WAY: Over the first six games of the season, senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** made 11-of-35 three-point baskets for 31.4 percent. Over the next eight games (Dec. 3 - Jan. 7), she was 6-for-38 for 15.8 percent.

Since Jan. 11 at ODU (last nine contests), she has found her rhythm again, having made 23-of-60 (38.3 percent) from beyond the arc.

ACROSS THE NATION: Georgia State is ranked in the top 80 nationally in five categories, including FG percentage defense (58th), 3-point

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** ranks in the top 10 of several career records lists. She is currently ranked 9th all-time with 1,220 points in her four-year career.

Roegiers-Jensen has started 86 of 111 games played.

STREAK HALTED: Georgia State saw its six-game win streak snapped after its loss at home to James Madison on Jan. 7. The Panthers also lost for the first time at home in six meetings.

The six-game win streak was the longest of the season and longest since the 2002-03 campaign.

A DIFFERENT STREAK: Freshman guard **Tabitha David** saw her consecutive game streak of at least one 3-pointer end at 15 after going 0-2 vs. VCU (1/21). She has now made at least one 3-point field goal in 20 of the 21 games she has played. She leads the Panthers in 3-point field goals made (52) and 3-point field goal percentage (.419), ranking 33rd in the nation in 3-pointers made and 21st in 3-point FG percentage, respectively.

BALANCING ACT: Georgia State is 14-2 this season when 3 or more players score in double figures in a game. The lone discrepancies are State's 77-76 setback by William & Mary on Jan. 25, when four players scored in double figures and an 85-66 loss at Delaware on Feb. 4. By

contrast, the Panthers are 0-7 when less than 3 players score in double figures in a game.

MONTH OF FEBRUARY: Georgia State is 71-59 in the month of February since the 1990-91 season and 56-54 in February under head coach **Lea Henry**. State is 2-1 in February this season.

The Panthers' of 2001-02 produced a 7-3 mark. Over the previous eight seasons, State compiled marks of 2-6 (2005-06), 6-3 (2004-05), 3-5 (2003-04), 5-2 (2002-03), 7-3 (2001-02), 6-1 (2000-01), 6-3 (1999-2000), 6-3 (1998-99).

COACH SPEAK: Georgia State head coach **Lea Henry** was one of three coaches featured on the CAA Weekly Telephonic Press Conference scheduled on Tuesday, Jan. 23. The teleconference began at noon and lasted for approximately 20 minutes.

Henry is featured again on Tues., Feb. 13, as the Panthers host Hofstra in the CAA Game of the Week on Sunday, Feb. 18.

ROLE REVERSAL: A lineup change in November has reaped huge benefits for the Panthers.

By inserting sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** at the point guard position and moving freshman guard **Tabitha David** into the starting lineup, State has improved its scoring average by 18 points per game.

Prior to the lineup change, the Panthers averaged only 52.0 ppg and were 0-3 on the season. Since then, Georgia State is 14-6 and averaging 70.9 points per contest.

Four players are averaging double figures since the switch. Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** leads with 17.9 points per game. **David** has 11.2 ppg, while sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** collects 11.8 ppg and 9.5 rpg. **Hollins** registers 11.1 ppg.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS: Georgia State's freshmen contributions have been solid so far in 2006-07.

Consider this, a freshman has led or tied for the team lead in scoring six times and has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding 12 times.

As a unit, the group has accounted for 36.4 percent (573 of 1,574) of Georgia State's total points and 38.8 percent (365 of 940) of the Panthers' rebounding total.

Two of Georgia State's top four scorers and two of its top four rebounders are freshmen.

WE SIGNED THEM: The Georgia State women's basketball staff signed two players to National Letters of Intent during the NCAA early signing period in November.

Current high school seniors **Chandra Harris** and **Danielle Anderson** have committed to play collegiate basketball for the Panthers as freshmen beginning in the 2007-08 season.

Harris, who currently attends Northeast High School in Macon, Ga., is a 6-0 forward who was also recruited by Georgia Tech, Miami and Eastern Kentucky.

Anderson, who currently attends Smiths Station High School in Smiths Station, Ala., is also a 6-0 forward who was recruited by Vanderbilt, Troy and Alabama A&M. Anderson averaged 21 points and 15 rebounds per game as a junior.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** was named Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week Dec. 4 after totaling a triple-double at Hofstra on Dec. 3 (14 pts, 16 rebs., 11 blks).

Head averaged a double-double on the week with 14.0 points and 12.5 rebounds per game. She also made 55.6 percent of her field goals.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK II: Georgia State senior **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** was selected the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) women's basketball Player of the Week for games ending the week of Dec. 31, the league announced Jan. 2. The award is Roegiers-Jensen's first-ever weekly honor from the CAA.

Roegiers-Jensen totaled a season- and game-high 23 points in an 82-58 win over Mississippi Valley State Friday, Dec. 29, and led all scorers with 20 points in a 58-50 overtime victory against Tennessee-Martin in the Invitational final Dec. 30. She assisted on the regulation game-tying three-point basket that forced overtime versus the Skyhawks and made the first basket in the extra session that put the Panthers' ahead for good.

PW-III: Senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen** was named the league's Player of the Week for games ending Jan. 21. The award is the second weekly accolade from the CAA for Roegiers-Jensen, who was selected player of the week on Jan. 2.

Roegiers-Jensen averaged 31.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 6.0 assists, 3.5 steals and 1.0 blocked shots per game as Georgia State split its two conference contests. She connected on 44 percent of her field goal attempts and 53 percent (9-of-17) of her 3-point field goal tries. She also finished 9-of-11 (82 percent) from the charity stripe.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Freshman **Danyell McKeller** received the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) women's basketball Rookie of the Week honor on Jan. 8 for games ending the week of Jan. 7.

McKeller posted her third double-double of the season after recording 13 points and tied her career-high with 11 boards against Northeastern (Jan. 4). She also tied her career-best with three steals against the Huskies. Versus JMU (Jan. 7), she led State with a team-high nine rebounds and also chipped in seven points.

McKeller finished the week averaging 10.0 points and 10.0 rebounds. She made 53 percent of her field goals and averaged two steals per game.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK II: Freshman **RaShay Rawls** was named the Colonial Athletic Association's (CAA) Rookie of the Week on Jan. 15. The award is the first for Rawls this season.

Rawls averaged 9.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in 19.5 minutes off the bench for Georgia State which split its games. Rawls collected six points on 3-for-4 shooting and had five rebounds against ODU on Jan. 11. At George Mason (Jan. 14), she totaled a career-high 12 points on 5-for-6 shooting and finished second on the team with seven rebounds.

Rawls finished the week leading State in field goal percentage, making 80 percent of her shots (8-for-10) and tied for second in rebounding (6.0). Her 12 points at George Mason was the first double-digit effort of her collegiate career.

ON THE RECORD: Georgia State's nine made 3-point field goals at Norfolk State on Nov. 22, 2006 ranks tied for 5th all-time for team 3-pointers in a game. The Panthers' 13 blocked shots at Hofstra on Dec. 3 is second all-time in school history.

MONTH OF JANUARY: Georgia State is 91-94 in the month of January since the 1986-87 season and 57-43 in January under head coach **Lea Henry**. State is 4-4 in January this season.

The Panthers' of 2003-04 produced an 8-1 mark. Over the previous seven seasons, State compiled marks of 1-7 (2005-06), 5-4 (2004-05), 8-1 (2003-04), 4-3 (2002-03), 7-2 (2001-02), 6-2 (2000-01), 6-2 (1999-2000).

REMEMBER DECEMBER: Georgia State is 49-57 in the month of December since the 1990-91 season and 44-34 in December under head coach **Lea Henry**. State finished 5-1 in December 2006, which is its best December record since the 1999-2000 campaign.

The Panthers' of 1999-2000 produced an undefeated 6-0 mark. Over the previous five seasons, State compiled marks of 4-2 (2005-06), 3-4 (2004-05), 3-3 (2003-04), 4-3 (2002-03) and 3-3 (2001-02).

INVITATIONAL SUMMARY: Georgia State out scored its GSU Invitational opponents, Mississippi Valley State and Tennessee-Martin, 70.0 to 54.0 to capture the Georgia State University Invitational championship for the third time in four years. It was also the Panthers' eighth Invitational championship in 13 seasons hosting the event.

Four players averaged double figures, including senior guard **Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen**, who was named to the all-tournament team and

was selected the Invitational's Most Valuable Player. She concluded the event averaging 21.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 2.5 steals per game. Sophomore guard **Brittany Hollins** was also named to the all-Invitational team.

NON-LEAGUE NOTES: Georgia State finished its non-conference schedule with an 8-3 record. The eight non-conference wins are the most since posting seven non-league victories in 1999-2000. Four of the eight non-conference victories were at home.

Georgia State completed its non-conference road record with a 4-3 mark. The Panthers were 2-3 at actual road venues and 2-0 at neutral sites. Georgia State last played seven non-conference road games in a season back in 1994-95 and finished 2-5.

In 1990-91, the Panthers played 10 non-conference contests and posted a 1-9 mark.

HONORABLE MENTIONS: Georgia State's first home game on Nov. 28 was a busy one as the Panthers honored three players for outstanding past performances.

Patechia Hartman (2001-05), a two-time Atlantic Sun Player of the Year, had her jersey lifted to the rafters of the Sports Arena. Also, current Panthers' junior **Vatai Smith** was given a game ball for setting the single-season blocked shots record (57) last year. Monica Thomas (2002-06) was also honored for breaking the record for career three-pointers (131), which she set last season

COMING OUT PARTY: Freshman forward **Danyzell McKeller** scored 17 points in the Panthers' first regular season game at Miami on Nov. 10. Her 17 points is the highest debut for a freshman since Monica Thomas (2002-06) totaled 12 points in 16 minutes off the bench in a 72-67 Panthers' victory at FIU on Nov. 22, 2002.

In her first collegiate start and only her second appearance of the season, freshman guard/forward **Tabitha David** scored 18 first half points,

going 6-for-6 from 3-point range, en route to a game- and career-high 21 points at Norfolk State (11/21/06).

RARE COMPANY: **RaShay Rawls** and **Danyzell McKeller** are the first Georgia State freshmen to start in the first game of the regular season since Leslie McElrath (1997-2001) did it on Nov. 18, 1997 at home against Georgia Tech.

McElrath debuted with 11 points and eight rebounds in 38 minutes.

MILESTONE MAKER: Georgia State head coach **Lea Henry**, who is in her 13th season at the helm of the Panthers, won her 200th game as head coach of the Panthers on Dec. 18 in a 66-63 win over Florida A&M. She is already the program's all-time wins leader and owns a record of 209-161 (.565).

Last season, Henry eclipsed another milestone, winning her 250th career game, which she earned with an 89-65 win over Towson on Jan. 15th. Henry is 267-219 overall in 17 collegiate seasons.

FULL THROTTLE: Georgia State has scored 90 points or more in a game twice this season. The last time the Panthers scored 90+ points twice in a season was back during the 2000-01 campaign. The 44-point margin of victory in the win over Savannah State Dec. 9 was the most for the Panthers since winning by 59 points (89-30) over Morris Brown on Dec. 14, 2002.

MAKING HISTORY: Sophomore center **Marcquitta Head** made history Dec. 3 after the posting Georgia's first-ever women's basketball triple-double with 14 points, 16 rebounds and 11 blocked shots at Hofstra. The feat was the first in 32 seasons of collegiate women's basketball at Georgia State.

Head's 11 blocked shots were school and Colonial Athletic Association single-game records. Her 16 rebounds were a career-high.

ON THE ROAD: Georgia State is 69-85 overall in road games under coach Henry. The team is 57-53 in conference road games under Henry. State is 5-6 (3-3 CAA) on the road this season.

The 1999-2000 team recorded the best overall road mark at 10-2 under Henry's tenure and finished 8-1 in the Trans America Athletic Conference.

ON THE ROAD 2: Georgia State's five road wins bests its mark from last season when the team finished 3-9 on the road. State equalled its mark of CAA road wins from last year (2) following wins at George Mason (1/14/) and at UNC Wilmington (1/18) and eclipsed the mark after the victory at Towson (2/1).
