The Georgia State baseball team will look to earn its first ever conference baseball championship on Saturday as they take on UNC Wilmington at 1 p.m. It will mark the first time the Panthers have played in a conference championship final, coming just one game short in 2000 while still a member of the Atlantic Sun Conference. A win would also send them to their first NCAA Tournament.

The Panthers gave No. 27 George Mason just their 11th loss of the season on Friday. Georgia State used four home runs and a complete game effort from Ryan Moore to secure the victory. It marked Moore's second straight complete game in conference play and took just 96 pitches.

Junior Bradley Logan belted his third home run of the tournament, while McCree, Mimeault and Moniz each homered.

News and Notes

Just Win Baby!

For the second straight season, Georgia State set a new single season wins mark. With 38 wins already this season, the Panthers are five ahead of the record mark set last season. Under head coach Greg Frady, who is now in his third year as head coach, the Panthers have two of the three 30-plus win seasons in school history. A win on Saturday would be the team's 39th and send them to their first-ever NCAA Tournament next weekend.

Running of the Bulls...Panthers

With a CAA leading 467 runs scored this season, the Panthers broke the all-time school record of 446 set in 1984 in Wednesday's win over Northeastern. Speaking of running, Georgia State's 87 stolen bases are the third most in school history and are second most this season in the CAA and most of any team to make the tournament.

Get'em on and Drive Them In

Marc Mimeault, Derek Simmons and Chase Childers have all driven in more than 50 runs already this season. Only once before in program history (2000) have three players driven in at least 50 runs. That season, the Panthers fell just one game shy of reaching the Atlantic Sun Conference Championship Game. After a pair of RBIs on Thursday and Friday afternoon, Mimeault moved into the top ten in school history with 56 RBIs in a season.

It's Deep and I Don't Think It's Playable

The Panthers have hit 70 home runs this season, the second most in school history, behind the 2000 team that had four players among the top ten in single season history before Marc Mimeault and Derek Simmons both entered the top ten this season. Chad Smith set the school record in 2000 with 21 home runs and was invited to the College Baseball World Series to participate in the Home Run Derby as the Panthers hit 77 that season. State has hit seven home runs in this year's CAA Tournament.

I Come From a Land Down Under

Australian sensational sophomore Aidan Francis has been a rock in the Panthers bullpen this year and has now worked his way into the starting rotation, making three Friday starts and earning a no decision in Wednesday's opening day of the CAA Tournament. Francis made his first collegiate start and almost went the entire way, lasting 8.2 innings in State's 8-4 win over VCU. Francis struck out a career-high 10 batters and put to an end Georgia State's four-game losing streak. In his second start against Towson, Francis went into the eighth inning, but did not factor in the decision. Francis is holding opponents to a .230 batting average and is 5-1 with three saves in 20 appearances this season, which is tops on the team. Francis earned CAA Co-Pitcher and Rookie of the Week honors after his first career start.

Please Close the Door Behind You

When the Panthers have taken a lead into the ninth inning, you can all but close the door on their opponents. State is 31-1 when leading after 8 innings this season and much of it can be credited to the bullpen. Combined, the bullpen has 18 saves this season, which has already broken school record of 12 set in 2005. The newest closer, senior Robinson Polanco, closed the door on VCU both Saturday night and Sunday afternoon. Before that weekend, much of it could be credited to freshman Justin Malone and sophomore Aidan Francis. Malone has already moved into the top five in a single season with six saves, while Francis and senior John Locklear each have three. Malone leads the team with a 1.59 ERA after picking up his sixth save over UNC Wilmington on Thursday, while Francis' stands at 4.02. The duo is one and two on the team in relief appearances, combining for 31 so far this season.

Feelin' Hot, Hot, Hot!

The Panthers have had eight double-digit hit streaks this season. Seven players (Marc Mimeault twice) have reached safely in 10-plus games, including three marks of at least 15 games. Junior Carl Moniz tops the list with an 18 game streak this year, while Matt Van Horn reached 17 games and senior Derek Simmons reached 15 games. Junior Bradley Logan came into the year with a school record 22-game hitting streak, but failed to reach safely in the season opener. Michael McCree currently leads the team with an nine-game streak.

An NCAA Record Just Short

Senior Chase Childers attempt at a pair of NCAA records fell just short with a pop-up in the fourth inning against Old Dominion earlier this season. Entering his at-bat, Childers was 12-for-12 at the plate and has reached base in 15 straight plate appearances. The NCAA record for consecutive hits is 14 set by Larry Patterson of Gonzaga in 1977. The NCAA record for consecutive times on base was set by Shaun Larkin of Cal State Northridge in 2002 over a stretch of four games.

Oh Canada...Times Two

A pair of Canadians, senior Marc Mimeault and junior Carl Moniz have continued to impress at the plate this year. The roommates, who also roomed together at NE Oklahoma A&M CC and went to Edouard-Montpetit High School, are helping to start a tradition of excellent Canadian-born student-athletes to play for the Panthers. Jean-Michel Rochon-Salvas, who graduated as one of the most decorated all-around student-athletes in Georgia State history departed for professional baseball just last spring. Mimeault leads the team with 14 home runs, a .383 batting average, .453 on base percentage and a .661 slugging percentage. Moniz is third on the

Fairing Well Against Tough Competition

Georgia State has fared extremely well against tough competition this year. In two tough losses to No. 18 South Carolina and Auburn, State allowed a total of just 10 hits and six runs.

State earned a 10-1 win over No. 3 Georgia Tech on March 24th, before suffering a tough 18-2 loss to Tech on April 15th. The win against the Yellow Jackets was the highest ranked opponent that the Panthers have ever defeated. It also marked the first win over a ranked opponent since State beat those same Yellow Jackets at Russ Chandler Stadium in 2007.

The Panthers also held their own against No. 3 Georgia, falling 11-6. State was down 5-4 heading into the top of the fifth, but could not get out of a two-out, bases loaded jam as the Bulldogs took an 8-4 lead.

Georgia State earned a 9-3 win over No. 27 George Mason on Friday for their second win over a ranked opponent this season. The most wins over a ranked opponent in a year came in 2000 as State defeated Georgia, Georgia Tech, UCF and Florida Atlantic.

Last Meetings

Georgia State and UNC Wilmington did not meet during the regular season after their three-game series was canceled due to rain. The Panthers earned an 8-5 win over UNCW on Thursday to hand the Seahawks their lone loss of the championship. The Seahawks own a 7-3 all-time record against the Panthers and had won five straight before falling on Thursday.

Milestone Broken

Senior Chase Childers set the all-time walks record a month ago, eclipsing the record of 98 set by Rusty Bennett. The record came quick as Oglethorpe walked Childers four times, allowing him to tie, set and move ahead of the record all in one evening. He now has 118 walks in his career.

Ouch...That Hurt, but Thanks

Junior Bradley Logan set the school record against Towson, by being hit by a pitch for the 27th time in his career. He moved ahead of Charlie Pelt, who had been hit 26 times and now has 28 after getting hit against Alabama State. However, teammate Nick Hogan has been hit 25 times and stands third after being hit Friday night as well. Hogan holds the single season mark after being hit 16 times last year. Senior Derek Simmons tops the team this year, being hit 10 times.

Milestone Watch

Senior Chase Childers moved into a tie for sixth with Jay Langston on the all-time hits list on Thursday with 208. He became only the eighth player in school history with over 200 hits. He is now just three back of Justin Newman for fifth on the all-time list. Bradley Logan became the ninth player in school history to collect 200 hits with his seventh inning home run against Northeastern on Wednesday and now has 204 for his career.

Childers also moved into third on the career games played with 211, surpassing Jean-Michel Rochon-Salvas. He will need the Panthers to make a run into the NCAA Tournament to surpass Charlie Pelt for second, as Pelt finished his career with 214 games played. Senior Matt Van Horn also moved into the top ten recently and stands in ninth with 192 games played.

Bradley Logan moved into seventh place on the all-time list doubles list last week with 43. He now stands just one behind Rusty Bennett for sixth all-time. Senior Matt Van Horn and Childers are also just five back of Kyle Breitbach for tenth on the all-time list.

Logan also moved into sixth all-time in RBIs over the weekend and is now just two back of Rusty Bennett for fifth. Childers moved ahead of Jason Glover on Thursday for ninth on the all-time list with 131. Childers and Logan are continuing to climb the runs scored list as well. Logan recently moved ahead of Childers with 151 runs scored, while Childers is at 148. Both are chasing record holder Jean-Michel Rochon-Salvas who finished his career with 165.

Senior Nick Hogan moved into ninth on the all-time stolen base list last Friday with four steals in a doubleheader against Alabama State. Hogan stands just two back of Eric Suttle for eighth on the all-time list. What is more remarkable is that Hogan is in just his second season with the Panthers. Childers moved into tenth with a steal on Friday and now has 31 for his career.
