Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener's third year C. All 10 players who traveled played in both games and scored, while JUCO transfer Kesheira McNeil did not travel with an injury, but may be able to play Wednesday.

The Panthers return six players who played in all 30 games last year with a combined 87 starts, so that core is in place. A pair of junior college stars and a trio of freshmen will find their roles and join those returnees to form a roster that will utilize everyone's talents and not rely on just a couple players.

Last year, the Panthers 2011-12 assets were mainly on defense and that obviously was a point of emphasis again this year:

- GSU ranked No. 1 in the CAA in steals (307, 10.5, No. 45 NCAA)  
This year, the team started with 23 steals (11.5 per game)
- GSU forced 613 turnovers last year (20.4 per game)  
This year, the team started with 51 forced (25.5 per game)
- GSU ranked No. 1 in the CAA in blocked shots (152, 5.1, No. 26 NCAA)  
This year, the team started with 8 blocks (4.0 per game)
- GSU ranked No. 5 in the CAA in FG pct. allowed (.385)  
This year, the team started on the same aggressive pace (.380)
- \* GSU ranked No. 5 in the CAA in rebounds (41.2).  
This year, the team started with 92 boards (46.0)

One 2012 goal was to increase the scoring potential of the returning players and recruit new players who were leading scorers on their teams. Two of the top 10 JUCO scorers and a trio of freshmen who each averaged better than 15 points a game will join the six returnees who had been focused on their scoring skills ever since last season ended.

GSU is finishing its final season in the Colonial Athletic Association and will move on to the Sun Belt Conference next year when football makes the move from FCS to FBS.

## COACH SHARON BALDWIN-TENER

Sharon Baldwin-Tener, named GSU's head coach in April of 2010, has known how to win as both a collegiate player and collegiate coach.



Now in her third season at GSU, the recruiting has shown some pieces are in place for a solid future.

She picked up her 200th career win as a head coach on Dec. 29, 2010 vs. Mississippi Valley State (91-65) and guided GSU to the 500th all-time win in school history on Jan. 9, 2011 in a win over Hofstra (84-70)

In eight years, she turned the East Carolina women's basketball program around, winning 126 games, while earning post-season bids to the NCAA and WNIT tournaments. The Lady Pirates of ECU won the C-USA Tournament in 2007.

Atlanta is a homecoming for Baldwin-Tener as she played her prep ball in Smyrna and her college ball at both Kennesaw State and the University of Georgia. She was an assistant coach at Georgia and a head coach at Life University in Marietta

Those eight years at ECU followed her 2001-02 season as the Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year honor in her only season at Mercer University in Macon.

She first gained notice as the NAIA National Coach of the Year at Life University, where she began that program with a final No. 7 ranking in its first year and produced a team ranked No. 1 in the national polls in her second season (2001). Her assistant coaching career was highlighted by being named the Naismith National Assistant Coach of the Year (1997) while she was in her seventh and final year at the University of Georgia under head coach Andy Landers. Baldwin-Tener enjoyed a successful playing career at both the high school and collegiate levels. At Wills High School (merged with Campbell High) in Smyrna, Ga., she averaged 21 points per contest as a senior and was named the 1985 Georgia Class 4A State Player-of-the-Year.

Baldwin-Tener earned a bachelor's degree from Georgia in 1991 and completed her master's of education in 1997, also at Georgia. She and her husband, Matt, have two children: Luke (8, Feb. 4, 2004) and Samantha (7, Oct. 28, 2005).

## HOME OPENER RECORD

Georgia State's Home Opener record is 8-6 over the past 14 seasons, but that can be traced to scheduling. Last year's opening loss to Arizona was part of the pattern of losses to ranked major teams like Florida State, Georgia Tech, Georgia, Middle Tennessee.

## GSU-JACKSONVILLE STATE SERIES HISTORY

Georgia State and Jacksonville State are only about 90 miles apart with JSU just over the state border north of I-20 and Anniston.

GSU and JSU have met 27 times before, with the Panthers holding a 22-5 all-time series lead with the Gamecocks following last year's win in Jacksonville, Ala.

In Atlanta, Georgia State has a 9-3 mark in the Sports Arena against the Gamecocks. JSU's last win in Atlanta came on Jan. 16, 1999, as JSU has lost its last six trips to Atlanta.

Overall, Georgia State has won the last six games and 14 of the last 15 games in the series. JSU's only win in that span was on Jan. 25, 2003 in Jacksonville.

## GSU OPENING ROAD TRIP

Georgia State upped its commanding series lead over UCF to 31-11 all-time, following Friday night's 64-50 win in Orlando.

The visiting Panthers jumped out to a quick 17-3 lead at UCF and never let the lead get under double digits again the rest of the way. GSU's largest lead was 24 points in the second half as the team rotated all the players who made the trip and dressed out. The defense helped limit UCF to 25 percent shooting in the first half and 29 percent for the game.

The Panthers forced 28 UCF turnovers, making 15 steals and blocking five shots. They turned the 28 turnovers into 34 points.

The offense was one basket shy of having all five players in double figures. Junior guard Kendra Long led the way with 15 points, including three 3-point baskets. Sophomore guard Kayla Nolan stepped up with a double-double with 12 rebounds and 11 points. Six-foot-three center Cody Paulk added 10 points and five blocked shots.

On Sunday at Florida, visiting GSU (1-1) won the rebound battle, 49-45, got off more shots, 73-69, but shot just 33 percent from the field in one of the big differences. Host Florida shot 44 percent and got to the free throw line 25 times, making 17, while GSU got to the line just 14 times and made 12. GSU forced 23 Florida turnovers, made eight steals and blocked three shots.

Georgia State trailed 37-25 at halftime, with Florida breaking from a 10-10 tie at 12:06 to a 25-12 advantage at 7:07 with a 15-2 run. GSU attempted 41 shots to the Gators' 29, but made just 11 for a 26.8 shooting percentage.

Kayla Nolan led GSU with 13 points, while Kendra Long netted 11 points, despite making just 5-of-18 shots. Cody Paulk led with 12 rebounds and also added nine points.

## TOURNAMENT TIME ALREADY

Georgia State will be off for a week following this game and play host to the annual Thanksgiving Holiday Tournament.

The opening game at 2 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 23, is the GSU vs. GSU Showdown between the Panthers and Eagles of Georgia Southern. The second game at 4 matches Kent State Golden Flashes from the MAC and Florida A&M Rattlers from the MEAC.

## SEASON OPENING FLORIDA ROAD TRIP

### PAULK'S SWAT MARKS

Senior center Cody Paulk is working her way toward the top of the GSU all-time list for blocked shots. With 138, she needs 27 to tie the school mark that has stood for 16 years. With 17 blocks, she moves into the Top 10 in CAA all-time history.

She is the only GSU player to have two 50-plus block seasons and will be looking for make that three in a row as well.

The Alabama native will be counted on to pick up where she left off down the stretch last season when she averaged 12.7 points per game and 5.8 rebounds over the final nine games of the season.

Paulk had personal-best scoring games of 23 and 21 points, shooting better than 50% in six of those nine games. Paulk needs 62 more points to hit 500 in her career.

She is a Capital One CoSIDA Acaemica All-District honoree as a chemistry major and math minor.

### LONG FROM LONG RANGE

Junior Kendra Long has a great name for being an outstanding three-point shooter.

In her first two years at GSU, she has become the only player in school history with two 50 or more three-point baskets made seasons.

Her 115 made has already moved her into fifth place on the school's all-time list.

The Atlanta native needs 39 more to tie the existing school career mark set just five years ago.

Long has made five three-point shots in a game four times and is obviously a marked target for opposing defenses.

She has 26 double-figure scoring games, including the two games this season.

### THIEVES AND PICK-POCKETS

Georgia State led the CAA last year with 315 steals (10.5 per game) and it was pretty much everyone on the roster doing the thievery. Nine players had 19 or more, seven had 28 or more and five had 34 or more.

The Panthers aggressive defense topped the 300-steal plateau for a fourth consecutive year. The team had 311 in 2010-11, had 327 in 2009-10 and had 354 in 2008-09 to start the streak.

GSU also has gotten the offensive transition game going with 152 blocked shots last year and 144 blocked shots in the previous year.

**DIVISION-1 TRANSFERS ADDED**

GSU has added a pair of Division I transfers who are practicing with the team this season and will begin play pending NCAA appeals either this year or next.

Both have all-conference potential and are major additions to the program.

**KYRA CROSBY** was a starter last year at Alabama after having been the NJCAA Player of the Year at Gulf Coast Community College. Crosby started 15 games last year in the SEC at Alabama, averaging 9.1 points and 4.3 rebounds. She came back from injury to play in all 16 SEC games and had 13 double-figure scoring games for the Crimson Tide.

Crosby averaged 19.5 points and 8.5 rebounds at Gulf Coast CC on a 35-1 team that won the national title.

She was an All-State prep player at McEachern HS in metro Atlanta.

Crosby will have one year's eligibility left with Georgia State.

**ALISHA ANDREWS** was a two-time All-CAA point guard at UNCW. She was also a two-time All-Defensive Team honoree.

Andrews led UNCW in scoring (11.9), as well as assists and steals. She made 132 three-point baskets in her two seasons with UNCW.

The quick point guard was the catalyst on their 24- and 20-win WNIT teams, producing 40 career double-figure scoring games. She had been the CAA Rookie of the Year.

Andrews was a prep star at Redan HS in metro Atlanta as a first-team all-state honoree. Led team on a 58-game winning streak and a state championship.

She will have two seasons left to compete for Georgia State.
