For the first time in school history, Georgia State will host the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, beginning Monday at the GSU Sports Arena. After opening the season with a pair of road games, it will also mark the Panthers home opener and the first of five straight at home.

Georgia State (0-2) will welcome Monmouth (1-2), South Alabama (2-0) and Tennessee State (0-3) as the squads play six games in three days. The action begins Monday with South Alabama facing Tennessee State at 4 p.m., followed by GSU hosting Monmouth at 7 p.m.

On Tuesday, Monmouth and South Alabama will take to the court at 4 p.m., followed by Georgia State welcoming former Panther Travis Williams and his Tennessee State squad at 7 p.m. The tournament will conclude on Wednesday as Monmouth faces Tennessee State at noon, followed by Georgia State against future Sun Belt foe South Alabama at 3 p.m.

Georgia State opened the season facing arguably its two biggest challenges of the year, at No. 8 Duke and at BYU, ranked 13th in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll.

The team will now spend the next two weeks at home beginning with the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

"My team and I are proud to be participating in such a prestigious event," commented head coach Ron Hunter. "Cancer has affected everyone in some way and the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, along with the NABC have done a great job raising money for the American Cancer Society.

“We are welcoming three very good teams to the Sports Arena. Each one of them brings a different challenge. After playing in two of the toughest environments in the country, it will be good to be home knowing that our fans are making the GSU Sports Arena one of the toughest places in the country to play as well.”

Junior Devonta White, who earned Preseason All-CAA Second Team honors, leads the team in scoring (16.5 ppg) and minutes (37.0) after two games. One of three team captains, White is also averaging 3.0 steals per game and shooting 88.9 percent from the free throw line.

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins, who is in his first year playing for the Panthers after transferring from Virginia Tech, led the Panthers with 21 points and eight rebounds against BYU. Atkins is averaging 13.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and playing 34.5 minutes per game.

Freshman R.J. Hunter, the only son of head coach Ron Hunter, is also scoring 13.0 points per game, while collecting 8.5 rebounds per contest. He was named CAA Rookie of the Week last week after earning a double-double in the season opener at Duke. He is shooting 92.3 percent from the free throw line, helping the Panthers to a 78.1 percent mark at the charity stripe.

Junior Denny Burguillos, a junior-college transfer from Casper (Wyo.) College has made a pair of starts for the Panthers, averaging 17.5 minutes in two games. He scored nine points and grabbed six rebounds at BYU. He is shooting 57.1 percent from the floor, second best on the team.

Georgia State proved last year that losing the opening game or two of the season does not mean a losing season is ahead. GSU began last season 0-3 before rolling off an 11-game winning streak en route to a 22-victory season, second most in school history and only behind the 29 wins of the 2000-01 team of head coach Charles “Lefty” Driesell.

Monmouth, Georgia State’s Monday opponent, opened the season with an impressive 91-62 victory over GSU’s CAA foe Hofstra. The Hawks followed with an 84-57 loss to No. 20 Notre Dame and fell to Rider on Saturday. They are led by Andrew Nicholas who averages nearly 20 points per game.

Tennessee State, who Georgia State will play on Tuesday, has had arguably the toughest schedule of the three teams with losses at BYU, South Dakota State and Minnesota. Robert Covington leads the Tigers with 14.0 points and 6.7 rebounds per game, while Kellen Thornton is averaging 13.0 points and 8.7 rebounds per contest.

Georgia State will conclude the event facing future Sun Belt foe South Alabama. The Jaguars opened the season with an impressive 76-71 victory over No. 25 Florida State. The Jaguars have four players averaging in double figures, led by Augustine Rubit’s 16 points and five rebounds per game. In two contests, Mychal Ammons is averaging a double-double of 15.0 points and 12.0 rebounds per contest.

COACHES VS. CANCER CLASSIC

The Acura Coaches vs. Cancer Classic is one of the most prestigious early-season college basketball tournaments. Twelve teams will compete in the event with four of them serving as regional hosts. Regional Round action takes place from Nov. 9-13 with the four hosts advancing to the Championship Rounds, Nov. 16-17, at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, NY. The remainder of the field will participate in a round-robin series at one of two sub-host sites.

The Coaches vs. Cancer program is a nationwide collaboration between the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches that empowers basketball coaches, their teams, and local communities to make a difference in the fight against cancer. The program leverages the personal experiences, community leadership, and professional excellence of basketball coaches nationwide to increase cancer awareness and promote healthy living through year-round awareness efforts, fundraising activities, and advocacy programs. Since 1993 the initiative has raised more than \$85 million dollars to fund groundbreaking research, provide up-to-date cancer literacy, advocate for public health policies and deliver services to improve the quality of life for patients and their families.



NEW AND IMPROVED SCHEDULE

Building his first schedule for Georgia State, head coach Ron Hunter wanted to test his team early, knowing that the squad will face a very difficult Colonial Athletic Association schedule in January and February. The Panthers will play three teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2012, including opening at No. 8 (ESPN) Duke followed by BYU. The Panthers will also host Southern Miss, an NCAA team from a year ago, and three teams as a part of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Add to that an always demanding CAA schedule that features Drexel (NIT Elite Eight), George Mason and Old Dominion and you have a schedule that should be much tougher than a year ago.

MOVING ON UP...

This will mark Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association. As of July 1, 2013, the Panthers will join the highly-competitive Sun Belt Conference, led by new Commissioner Karl Benson.

Due to a 12-year old CAA rule, the Panthers, along with Old Dominion which is moving to Conference USA, will not be eligible for the CAA Tournament in March. However, Georgia State is eligible for all postseason tournaments, including the NCAA and NIT.

THE SERIES WITH MONMOUTH

Georgia State and Monmouth will meet for the first time on the basketball court. It will mark the third straight opponent on the Panthers schedule that they had never played before. GSU opened the season at No. 8 Duke before traveling to BYU last Tuesday.

THE SERIES WITH SOUTH ALABAMA

Former Sun Belt foes and soon to be Sun Belt foes again will meet for the 18th time and fourth since last sharing the same stomping grounds. South Alabama leads the all-time series 13-4, winning the last match-up in 2009 as a part of the South Alabama Thanksgiving Classic.

The last time the two schools played in Atlanta, Georgia State came away with an 88-56 victory in December of 2003. That snapped a 10-game Jaguar winning streak.

The two schools were members of the Sun Belt Conference from 1975 to 1982. The Panthers will rejoin the league on July 1, 2013.

THE SERIES WITH TENNESSEE STATE

Georgia State and Tennessee State will meet for just the second time. The Panthers won the previous match-up, 107-71, in one of the first games for Mike

Perry after taking over for the retired Charles "Lefty" Driesell. The Panthers legendary coach retired in early January of 2003 and the job was handed off to Perry on an interim basis for the rest of the year.

A PANTHER HOMECOMING

It will be a homecoming for a pair of former Panthers this week. Tennessee State head coach Travis Williams, who both played and coached for Georgia State, will be returning to the Sports Arena for the first time as a head coach. Williams was hired as the head coach of Tennessee State late last spring.

Williams is the first former Panther to earn a Division I head coaching position. One of his first hires was former Panther Rodney Hamilton.

A NEW ERA OF GEORGIA STATE BASKETBALL

After being named the 15th head coach of Georgia State on March 21, 2011, Ron Hunter set out to change the culture of Panther basketball and he did that in his first year.

Compiling a 22-12 record, Hunter won the second most games in school history, only behind the 29 wins of Charles "Lefty" Driesell during the 2000-01 season that ended in the NCAA Tournament. Hunter's squad also put together an 11-game winning streak, capped with wins over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and 2011 Final Four squad VCU.

The year ended with the Panthers returning to postseason play and earning the school's second-ever postseason victory, a 74-43 thumping of Tennessee Tech to open the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Hunter is currently just four wins shy of 300 for his career.

FATHER & SON

For the first time in R.J. Hunter's career, his father will be coaching him on the sidelines. Although R.J. spent plenty of time watching his dad coach while at IUPUI for 17 years, the youngest Hunter was never coached by dad Ron at any level.

The duo is one of just five pairs of father and son pairs in the NCAA this year. The group includes:

OPENING ACT - PART ONE

Freshman R.J. Hunter scored 30 points in his Georgia State debut as the Panthers defeated Life University, 85-62, in an exhibition game on Oct. 29.

Hunter followed with 22 points in 30 minutes against Albany State on Nov. 4. The freshman hit 5-of-8 from the floor, including four three-pointers, making 8-of-9 at the free throw line.

In two exhibition games, Hunter averaged 26.0 points, six rebounds and four assists, shooting 57.1 percent from the floor, 53.3 percent from three-point range and 80.0 percent from the free throw line.



OPENING ACT - REGULAR SEASON EDITION

R.J. Hunter began his collegiate career in impressive fashion, collecting a double-double of 14 points and 10 rebounds in the Panthers loss to No. 8 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Hunter finished 4-of-11 from the floor, but a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line with a pair of three-pointers.

AWARD WINNING

The season is just underway and Devonta White has already picked up a pair of preseason awards. The junior point guard was named to the All-CAA Preseason Second Team and earned College Sports Madness All-CAA Third Team honors.

White led the Panthers in scoring last season, averaging 12.9 points per game, while leading the squad on the court with a team-high 34.3 minutes per contest.

He opened the season with 19 points in 38 minutes at No. 8 Duke.

MANNY BEING MANNY

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins, who spent the 2011-12 season redshirting due to NCAA transfer rules, found his groove in the Panthers second game of the season. The former Virginia Tech guard scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-18 shooting, hitting three three-pointers, while grabbing a career-high eight rebounds at BYU. He added three steals and an assist in 36 minutes of action.

IF THEY'RE FREE

Devonta White entered the season having made 17-straight free throws, trumping his streak of 16 consecutive made free throws which came to an end against Old Dominion on Feb. 22.

He pushed the streak to 20 straight by making his first three free throws at Duke in the opening game of the season. Unfortunately, he missed his fourth opportunity ending the streak as the fourth longest in school history.

Since his miss, he has made five straight, including a perfect 4-of-4 at BYU.

The school record is 23 straight made by Nate Williams from Jan. 13-Feb. 12, 2004.

DEFENDING THE HOME COURT

Georgia State went 13-3 at home last season, the second most wins at home in a season. The 13 wins included a 10-game home court winning streak to open the season that came to a halt on Jan. 28 against VCU, falling to the Rams 59-58. It marked the second longest home court winning streak in school history.

The school record is 25 games, set from the end of the 1999-2000 season to the beginning of the 2001-02 season. When that streak ended, it was the third-longest home court winning streak in the nation.

GOING BAREFOOT

Coach Ron Hunter will coach his sixth annual barefoot game in support of Samaritan's Feet against William & Mary in 2013 on Jan. 12 at the GSU Sports Arena.

Last year, his first with the Panthers, GSU earned a 75-61 victory over UNCW while wearing orange jerseys to help raise

awareness for the cause.

Hunter has coached a game in his bare feet in each of the last five seasons in support of Samaritan's Feet, an organization that provides shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

HELPING OTHERS

The Georgia State basketball staff and players traveled to South Africa in early August for a different kind of overseas trip. Rather than playing games, the team, working with Samaritan's Feet, distributed shoes to children in South Africa. Coach Hunter, who is heavily involved with Samaritan's Feet, made his sixth trip abroad and first with his Panther squad. He previously brought his IUPUI team to Lima, Peru several years ago.

During the 10-day trip, Georgia State did several shoe distributions. There was also some free time worked into the trip that allowed the team to see the national aquarium, go on a safari and visit Cape Point, where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans connect.

MOST IMPROVED

Georgia State finished the 2011-12 season among the most improved in the country. The Panthers finished plus-10 in wins, concluding with the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Panthers finished the 2010-11 season 12-19.

STEALIN' THE SHOW

Georgia State swiped 315 steals during the 2011-12 season, the second most in school history. The school record of 351 was set during the 2000-01 season, a season that ended in the NCAA Tournament.

The Panthers had four players with 50 or more steals and all four players ranked among the top 12 in the CAA in steals per game.

This season, the Panthers have 20 steals in just the first two games of the season, including a season-high 13 at BYU.

FREQUENT FLYERS

With only a pair of games on the schedule in which the Panthers can take a bus, Georgia State will add up the frequent flyer miles again during the 2012-13 season. As the crow flies, Georgia State will travel 20,750 round-trip miles during the regular season.

Georgia State traveled to Utah for the second straight season, a short 1,884-mile venture one-way. The Panthers faced BYU in Provo on Nov. 13 to open the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

The team's shortest trip is to Troy, Ala. (182 miles one-way) to face so-to-be Sun Belt Conference foe Troy. State will make nine trips along the east coast once CAA play gets underway, the shortest being 415 miles one-way to Wilmington, N.C. to face the Seahawks.

517 AND COUNTING

Georgia State has made at least one three-point field goal in 517 straight games, dating back to the 1994-95 season. The last team to hold the Panthers without a trey was Stetson on Feb. 18, 1995.

NEXT UP

Following the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, Georgia State will continue its five-game home stand by taking on East Carolina on Monday, Nov. 26 at 7 p.m.



HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

Ron Hunter restored the Georgia State program to national prominence in just his first year as head coach of the Panthers during the 2011-12 season. Georgia State won 22 games, the second most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Post-season Tournament, the Panthers fourth-ever postseason appearance.



Hunter has won 296 games in 18 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team might be the most special. After being named head coach on March, 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record-number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

He continued that work in Atlanta, coaching the Panthers while barefoot to victory over UNCW in front of the largest crowd in the Sports Arena since 2007.

While leading IUPUI to 25 or more wins in two of his final four seasons, Hunter began to partner with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world. On Jan. 24, 2008, he coached IUPUI against Oakland in his bare feet to help raise awareness for the cause. By tipoff, Hunter's efforts had raised more than 100,000 pairs of shoes, and to date, that number has climbed well above 250,000.

During his first season at Georgia State, Hunter led the Panthers to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, just the fourth time GSU earned a postseason bid. The Panthers opened the tournament at home, another first, hosting a postseason contest and earning an impressive 74-43 victory against Tennessee Tech.

Earlier in the year, Hunter's squad won 11 straight games, a school-record, earning impressive victories over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and at VCU. The streak included wins of 32, 32 and 31 points.

The Panthers winning ways continued in the CAA Tournament with a record-setting 35-point victory against Hofstra in the first round, the largest margin of victory in CAA Championship history.

Hunter's resume includes numerous national honors including an NABC Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Service, the 2009 Giant Steps Award from the National Consortium for Academics and Sport (NCAS), and a Minority Achievement Award from the Center for Leadership Development (CLD).

He was one of seven head coaches who served on the Division I Basketball Academic Enhancement Group, as appointed by late NCAA President Myles Brand, and he is a member of the National Basketball Coaches Association (NABC) Board of Directors.

Hunter, 48, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. He was a standout player on strong Miami teams of the mid-1980s, along with high school and college teammate Ron Harper, who went on to a long NBA career. The Redhawks were 81-30 during Hunter's four-year career and earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berths while winning two MAC championships.

Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (23) and R.J. (18).

Opening the 2012-13 season at one of college basketball's cathedrals, Georgia State fell to No. 8 Duke, 74-55, Friday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Junior point guard Devonta White, the Panthers' only returning starter, led GSU with 19 points, and freshman R.J. Hunter had 14 points and 10 rebounds in his debut.

Mason Plumlee paced Duke (1-0) with 19 points and 14 rebounds.

GSU (0-1) kept it close early, trailing just 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half before the Blue Devils started to pull away.

Georgia State, playing its first game ever in Cameron Indoor, got off to a quick start after Duke won the tip. R.J. Hunter quickly got a steal that led to a fast break lay-up to give the Panthers a 2-0 lead.

The Blue Devils followed with an 8-0 run to take an 8-2 at the first media timeout. Junior Denny Burguillos, making his GSU debut picked up two quick fouls in the first 2:22 forcing Coach Hunter to use three big men in the first half and continued to sub with James Vincent and T.J. Shipes throughout the second half.

Georgia State responded as Vincent's lay-up in the paint cut Duke's lead to 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half. Unfortunately, Duke pulled away with a 15-7 run to open up a 32-22 lead at halftime.

Duke held Georgia State to 32 percent shooting in the first half, including just 1-of-8 from three-point range.

White made his first three free throws of the second half, extending his streak to 20 straight makes dating back to last season. His streak came to an end just three shy of Nate Williams school-record of 23 midway through the second half with the miss with 11:11 to play.

Trailing by 22 with 13:19 remaining in the game, Georgia State made a run to cut the deficit to 55-40 with 9:02 remaining. Duke responded with a pair of three-pointers pushed the lead back to 21.

A free throw by Devonta White cut the deficit to 14 with 3:41 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get.

Vincent finished the game with eight points and five boards off the bench.

The Panthers were held to 37.3 percent shooting, but knocked down 4-of-6 from three-point range in the second half.

Duke shot 11-of-24 from three-point range and 51.1 percent for the game.

DUKE 80, GEORGIA STATE 62

Marriott Center • Provo, Utah

BYU opened Tuesday night's game with a 31-2 run and Georgia State was never able to fully recover, falling to the Cougars, 80-62, at the Marriott Center in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-18 shooting, pulling down a career-high eight rebounds in the loss.

BYU (2-0) held Georgia State (0-2) to just 35.4 percent shooting and 13.6 percent from three-point range.

Despite trailing by as many as 29 with 10:31 to play in the first half, the Panthers cut the Cougars lead to just 11 points, 56-43, with 9:25 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get. BYU center Brandon Davies finished with 28 points on 10-of-14 shooting, making 8-of-10 from the free throw line and grabbing nine rebounds. Tyler Haws added 22 points, seven rebounds and five assists for the Cougars who finished the game shooting 51.7 percent from the floor.

After opening the season before a sell-out crowd at No. 8 Duke, Georgia State played in front of a hostile 13,181 tonight.

Atkins, the redshirt-junior transfer from Virginia Tech, finished with career-highs in nearly every category and sparked the Panthers second half run. He was 3-of-6 from three-point range and swiped three steals in 36 minutes of action.

Junior Devonta White added 14 points and five rebounds for GSU, while freshman R.J. Hunter scored 12 points, going 8-of-9 from the free throw line. Junior Denny Burguillos added nine points and six rebounds, going 4-of-6 from the floor.

BYU opened the game red-hot, taking a 15-0 lead and expanding it to 25-2 with 12:41 to play before the first media time-out. The Cougars hit 12 of their first 16 shots, including 5-of-5 from three-point range, forcing Hunter to use two timeouts before the first media.

Trailing by 27, 40-13, GSU used a 9-0 run to cut the deficit to 40-22 with 1:27 to play in the first half. Georgia State trailed 44-26 at halftime.

After shooting over 70 percent for most of the first half, BYU finished the first half shooting 58.1 percent, including 6-of-12 from three-point range. BYU held Georgia State to just 26.5 percent shooting and 2-of-12 from three-point range during the first 20 minutes.

Matt Carlino added 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting, dishing out seven assists and swiping four steals for BYU.
