Coming off an impressive win on Saturday, Georgia State will travel to New York to face Hofstra on Monday night at the Mack Sports Complex. Tip-off is set for 7 p.m. in the Panthers first CAA road game of the year.

Georgia State (6-9, 1-1 CAA) snapped a five-game losing streak on Saturday with a 16-point victory against James Madison. Hofstra (3-10, 0-0 CAA) will be playing its first conference game of the year and is looking to snap a seven-game losing streak after not winning a game in December.

Despite the fact that Hofstra leads the all-time series 8-3, Georgia State won both match-ups by double-digits last season, including a 16-point win in New York and a record-setting 35-point victory in the first round of the CAA Tournament.

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who leads all CAA freshman in scoring and rebounding, is one of just five freshman in the country averaging at least 16.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. In his first two CAA games last week, he averaged 21.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and shot 55.2 percent from the floor, along with 6-of-12 from three-point range.

Hunter has already won three CAA Rookie of the Week honors this year and is a leading candidate for rookie of the year honors. He has scored 20-plus points six times this season and just missed with 19 points against James Madison on Saturday.

“The reason we won on Saturday was balanced scoring and really good defense,” commented head coach Ron Hunter. “We know that R.J., Manny and Devonta are going to have to score points for us, but we also need production from players like James Vincent and Rashaad Richardson, along with solid minutes from our bench.

“I keep telling our players that if we hold the opposition under 60 points, we are going to win a lot of games. We were able to do that on Saturday, while forcing double-digit turn-

overs. As impressive as our offense was, our defense was big too.”

R.J. Hunter, the only son of head coach Ron Hunter is averaging a team-high 16.2 points per game, seventh in the CAA, and 5.9 rebounds per game, the 15th best mark in the conference. He is also collecting 2.2 three-pointers per game, fourth best in the league and shooting 37.1 percent from beyond the arc, sixth in the conference.

Hunter is also among the CAA leaders in free throw percentage, steals, blocked shots, minutes played and defensive rebounds.

Junior point guard Devonta White, who earned Preseason All-CAA Second Team honors before the season and was also named to the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award Watch List by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, leads the CAA in minutes played (36.6) and steals per game, averaging 2.1.

White is second on the team in scoring, averaging 14.1 points per game, 12th in the CAA, while dishing out 3.1 assists, fourth in the league. The junior dished out a career-high seven assists against James Madison on Saturday.

One of three team captains, White, who missed 10 games during his freshman season due to an injury, is just 246 points away from becoming the 17th Panther with 1,000 career points. He is just off pace to eclipse that mark by the end of the year, needing to average 15.4 points per game in the remaining regular season contests.

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins has missed three double-doubles this season by just one rebound and another four double-doubles by just two rebounds, including a 15-point, 8-rebound effort against the Dukes.

From nearby Tucker, Ga., the Virginia Tech transfer is averaging 12.7 points and 6.5 rebounds per game this season, both among the top 16 in the CAA. Atkins is also shooting 76.2 percent from the free throw line, tied for the 11th best mark in the CAA. He is second in the CAA in three-point field goal percentage, hitting 42.1 percent from beyond the arc. He is also ninth in the CAA making 1.6 three-pointers per game.

Lone senior James Vincent played in his 100th career game on Wednesday night against Drexel. With eight blocked shots on Saturday, Vincent moved into the top five in GSU history in blocked shots. His eight-block performance was the third most in a single-game in school history. Earlier this year, he blocked nine shots against Monmouth to tie the school record.

He leads the CAA averaging 2.8 blocked shots per game and is among the top 25 in the league in rebounding, pulling down 4.9 per contest.

Hofstra is led by Taran Buie who is scoring 15.1 points and pulling down 3.7 rebounds per game. Steve Mejia is adding 10.1 points and 4.1 assists per contest.

In last season's CAA Tournament, Georgia State earned an impressive 85-50 first round victory against the Pride, the largest margin of victory in tournament history.

Following Monday's contest, Georgia State will return home to face Delaware on Saturday at noon. The game will air live on CSS and will serve as the Centennial Game for Georgia State University, which is celebrating its 100th year anniversary in 2013.

**A PERFECT 300**

With his 300th win earlier this season at Liberty, coach Ron Hunter joined an elite group of young coaches. He won his 300 in just his 535th game coaching. Hunter will turn 49 on April 7, 2013.

In his impressive career, Hunter has had five 20-plus win seasons and led three teams to the postseason.

**JUST A FRESHMAN?**

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who is averaging 16.2 points per game this season, is currently ninth in the nation among all freshman in scoring. Hunter has scored 20 or more points six times already this season and is averaging 21.0 points per game in CAA play.

Hunter is one of just five freshman averaging at least 16.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

UNLV's Anthony Bennett leads all freshman in scoring, averaging 19.4 points per game, pulling down 9.0 rebounds per game. Binghamton's Jordan Reed leads all freshman in rebounding, grabbing 10.0 per contest as of Jan. 3rd.



**NEW AND IMPROVED SCHEDULE**

Building his first schedule for Georgia State, head coach Ron Hunter wanted to test his team early, knowing that the squad will face a very difficult CAA schedule in January and February. The Panthers have played three teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2012, including opening at No. 8 (ESPN) Duke followed by BYU. The Panthers also hosted Southern Miss.

Georgia State already topped future Sun Belt foe South Alabama, 75-73 as the Jaguars were receiving votes in the ESPN Coaches poll at the time.

*Georgia State's strength of schedule reached as high as 19th earlier this season.*

**MOVING ON UP...**

This will mark Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association. As of July 1, 2013, the Panthers will join the highly-competitive Sun Belt Conference, led by new Commissioner Karl Benson.

Due to a 12-year old CAA rule, the Panthers, along with Old Dominion which is moving to Conference USA, will not be eligible for the CAA Tournament in March. However, Georgia State is eligible for all postseason tournaments, including the NCAA and NIT.

**WHITE NAMED TO TOP LIST**

Junior point guard and captain Devonta White was named to the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on Dec. 20, the second year in a row a Panther has been named to the list.

Before the season, White picked up a pair of preseason honors, being named to the All-CAA Preseason Second Team and College Sports Madness All-CAA Third Team.

Last season, James Fields was named to the same list as he finished his career playing the second most games in school history.

**A NEW ERA OF GSU BASKETBALL**

After being named the 15th head coach of Georgia State on March 21, 2011, Ron Hunter set out to change the culture of Panther basketball and he did that in his first year.

Compiling a 22-12 record, Hunter won the second most games in school history, only behind the 29 wins of Charles "Lefty" Driesell during the 2000-01 season that ended in the NCAA Tournament. Hunter's squad also put together an 11-game winning streak, capped with wins over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and 2011 Final Four squad VCU.

The year ended with the Panthers returning to postseason play and earning the school's second-ever postseason victory, a 74-43 thumping of Tennessee Tech to open the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

**THE SERIES WITH HOFSTRA**

Hofstra leads the all-time series 8-3, however Georgia State won both the regular season meeting and a match-up in the first round of the CAA Championship last season.

The Panthers opened the CAA Championship with an impressive 85-50 blow-out victory of the Pride, the largest margin of victory in CAA Tournament history.

Eric Buckner had 21 points and 11 rebounds for the Panthers. Buckner went 7-for-7 from the field and 7-for-8 at the free throw line and also blocked two shots. James Fields scored 14 points, and Devonta White added 13, while Josh Micheaux contributed six points, seven assists and three steals.

GSU shot a season-high 59.6 percent from the field en route to the win.

Earlier in the season in New York, the Panthers scored a 59-43 victory in the Mack Sports Complex.

**THIRD TIMES A CHARM**

Freshman R.J. Hunter is only two months into his collegiate career and he has already earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors three times this year. Hunter has equalled the total number of CAA Rookie of the Week honors earned by Georgia State in the last seven years since joining the league.

His latest honor game on Dec. 24 after averaging 23.5 points and 5.0 rebounds in two games for GSU against Southern Miss and Rhode Island.

He earned his first honor in his first collegiate game collecting a double-double of 14 points and 10 rebounds in the Panthers loss to No. 8 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

He earned the award again on Nov. 26 after leading the Panthers to three-straight wins as part of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. He scored a season-high 25 points to cap the week against South Alabama.

**BLOCK PARTY**

Senior James Vincent tied the school record with nine blocked shots against Monmouth on Nov. 19 and record eight blocked shots against James Madison on Jan. 5. Nicknamed "Oak",

the 6-10 big fella tied the record of Sylvester Morgan that was set against Mercer on Jan. 23, 2005.

He currently has 42 blocks this season, a 2.8 per game average, tops in the CAA.

**MOST IMPROVED**

Georgia State finished the 2011-12 season among the most improved in the country. The Panthers finished plus-10 in wins, concluding with the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Panthers finished the 2010-11 season 12-19.

**CENTENNIAL GAME**

Georgia State University will celebrate its 100th year anniversary during 2013. To help kick-off the festivities in January, the Panthers will play the Centennial Game on Jan. 12 against Dela-

**CLIMBING THE MOUNTAIN**

Senior James Vincent is quickly moving up the school's all-time blocked shots list. Despite being outside the top ten entering the year, he is already moved up to fifth with 42 blocked shots this season.

The school-record of 167 was set by Eric Buckner just last year. He moved ahead of Deven Dickerson with eight blocks against JMU and is now just six behind Torquin Greshman for fourth in school history.

**INAUGURATION HONOR**

Georgia State's Marching Band was selected to represent Georgia in the Presidential Inaugural Parade on Jan. 21 in Washington, D.C. The parade is televised around the world.

Each of the 50 states has one entry in the historic parade, whether it is an organization, a group, a person or a band.

It appears Georgia State will be one of five college bands, with nine high school bands or units selected. The other college bands

are from the states of Ohio, South Dakota, Virginia and Maryland.

GSU's 200-member unit will board buses to leave the campus on Friday, Jan. 18 to make the trip north to the Nation's Capital. A dress rehearsal is held Sunday, Jan. 20, and the parade steps off on Monday at 2:30 following the official Inauguration Ceremony at the Capitol.

**FROM WAY DOWNTOWN**

Freshman R.J. Hunter got things going quickly against Southern Miss, hitting three three-pointers before the first media timeout enroute to hitting 6-of-12 from beyond the arc, just one shy of entering the school's record books. Hunter scored 20 points in the first half and finished with 24, shooting 8-of-16 from the floor and pulling down four rebounds. He earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors for his effort.

**CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR**

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins has had a very special season already this year, but a rebound here or there could make it even more special.

Atkins has missed a double-double three times already this season by just one rebound, to go along with four more games that he missed by two rebounds, including Saturday against JMU.

IF he had secured all of those double-doubles, he would be tied for 11th in the country in the latest NCAA rankings.

**IF THEY'RE FREE**

Devonta White entered the season having made 17-straight free throws, trumping his streak of 16 consecutive made free throws which came to an end against Old Dominion on Feb. 22.

He pushed the streak to 20 straight by making his first three free throws at Duke in the opening game of the season. Unfortunately, he missed his fourth opportunity ending the streak as the fourth longest in school history.

The school record is 23 straight made by Nate Williams from Jan. 13-Feb. 12, 2004.

**GOING BAREFOOT**

Coach Ron Hunter will coach his sixth annual barefoot game in support of Samaritan's Feet against William & Mary in 2013 on Jan. 16 at the GSU Sports Arena.

Last year, his first with the Panthers, GSU earned a 75-61 victory over UNCW while wearing orange jerseys to help raise awareness for the cause.

Hunter has coached a game in his bare feet in each of the last five seasons in support of Samaritan's Feet, an organization that provides shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

**HELPING OTHERS**

The Georgia State basketball staff and players traveled to South Africa in early August for a different kind of overseas trip. Rather than playing games, the team, working with Samaritan's Feet, distributed shoes to children in South Africa. Coach Hunter, who is heavily involved with Samaritan's Feet, made his sixth trip abroad and first with his Panther squad. He previously brought his IUPUI team to Lima, Peru several years ago.

During the 10-day trip, Georgia State did several shoe distributions. There was also some free time worked into the trip that allowed the team to see the national aquarium, go on a safari and



visit Cape Point, where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans connect.

**STEALIN' THE SHOW**

Georgia State swiped 315 steals during the 2011-12 season, the second most in school history. The school record of 351 was set during the 2000-01 season, a season that ended in the NCAA Tournament.

The Panthers had four players with 50 or more steals and all four players ranked among the top 12 in the CAA in steals per game.

This season, the Panthers have 118 steals in just the first 15 games of the season, including a season-high 14 against Louisiana Tech and 13 at BYU. GSU ranks 93rd in the nation as of Monday with 8.1 steals per game.

**FREQUENT FLYERS**

With only a pair of games on the schedule in which the Panthers can take a bus, Georgia State will add up the frequent flyer miles again during the 2012-13 season. As the crow flies, Georgia State will travel 20,750 round-trip miles during the regular season.

Georgia State traveled to Utah for the second straight season, a short 1,884-mile venture one-way. The Panthers faced BYU in Provo on Nov. 13 to open the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

The team's shortest trip is to Troy, Ala. (182 miles one-way) to face so-to-be Sun Belt Conference foe Troy. State will make nine trips along the east coast once CAA play gets underway, the shortest being 415 miles one-way to Wilmington, N.C. to face the Seahawks.

**531 AND COUNTING**

Georgia State has made at least one three-point field goal in 531 straight games, dating back to the 1994-95 season. The last team to hold the Panthers without a trey was Stetson on Feb. 18, 1995.

**NEXT UP**

Georgia State will return to the court to face Delaware on Saturday at noon. The game will air live on CSS, the Panthers sixth televised game already this season.

**SERIES RESULTS VS. CAA TEAMS**

## HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

Ron Hunter restored the Georgia State program to national prominence in just his first year as head coach of the Panthers during the 2011-12 season. Georgia State won 22 games, the second most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Post-season Tournament, the Panthers fourth-ever postseason appearance.



Hunter has won 296 games in 18 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team might be the most special. After being named head coach on March, 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record-number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

He continued that work in Atlanta, coaching the Panthers while barefoot to victory over UNCW in front of the largest crowd in the Sports Arena since 2007.

While leading IUPUI to 25 or more wins in two of his final four seasons, Hunter began to partner with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world. On Jan. 24, 2008, he coached IUPUI against Oakland in his bare feet to help raise awareness for the cause. By tipoff, Hunter's efforts had raised more than 100,000 pairs of shoes, and to date, that number has climbed well above 250,000.

During his first season at Georgia State, Hunter led the Panthers to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, just the fourth time GSU earned a postseason bid. The Panthers opened the tournament at home, another first, hosting a postseason contest and earning an impressive 74-43 victory against Tennessee Tech.

Earlier in the year, Hunter's squad won 11 straight games, a school-record, earning impressive victories over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and at VCU. The streak included wins of 32, 32 and 31 points.

The Panthers winning ways continued in the CAA Tournament with a record-setting 35-point victory against Hofstra in the first round, the largest margin of victory in CAA Championship history.

Hunter's resume includes numerous national honors including an NABC Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Service, the 2009 Giant Steps Award from the National Consortium for Academics and Sport (NCAS), and a Minority Achievement Award from the Center for Leadership Development (CLD).

He was one of seven head coaches who served on the Division I Basketball Academic Enhancement Group, as appointed by late NCAA President Myles Brand, and he is a member of the National Basketball Coaches Association (NABC) Board of Directors.

Hunter, 48, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. He was a standout player on strong Miami teams of the mid-1980s, along with high school and college teammate Ron Harper, who went on to a long NBA career. The Redhawks were 81-30 during Hunter's four-year career and earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berths while winning two MAC championships.

Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (23) and R.J. (18).

**#8 DUKE 74, GEORGIA STATE 55**

Opening the 2012-13 season at one of college basketball's cathedrals, Georgia State fell to No. 8 Duke, 74-55, Friday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Junior point guard Devonta White, the Panthers' only returning starter, led GSU with 19 points, and freshman R.J. Hunter had 14 points and 10 rebounds in his debut.

Mason Plumlee paced Duke (1-0) with 19 points and 14 rebounds.

GSU (0-1) kept it close early, trailing just 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half before the Blue Devils started to pull away.

Georgia State, playing its first game ever in Cameron Indoor, got off to a quick start after Duke won the tip. R.J. Hunter quickly got a steal that led to a fast break lay-up to give the Panthers a 2-0 lead.

The Blue Devils followed with an 8-0 run to take an 8-2 at the first media timeout. Junior Denny Burguillos, making his GSU debut picked up two quick fouls in the first 2:22 forcing Coach Hunter to use three big men in the first half and continued to sub with James Vincent and T.J. Shipes throughout the second half.

Georgia State responded as Vincent's lay-up in the paint cut Duke's lead to 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half. Unfortunately, Duke pulled away with a 15-7 run to open up a 32-22 lead at halftime.

Duke held Georgia State to 32 percent shooting in the first half, including just 1-of-8 from three-point range.

White made his first three free throws of the second half, extending his streak to 20 straight makes dating back to last season. His streak came to an end just three shy of Nate Williams school-record of 23 midway through the second half with the miss with 11:11 to play.

Trailing by 22 with 13:19 remaining in the game, Georgia State made a run to cut the deficit to 55-40 with 9:02 remaining. Duke responded with a pair of three-pointers pushed the lead back to 21.

A free throw by Devonta White cut the deficit to 14 with 3:41 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get.

Vincent finished the game with eight points and five boards off the bench.

The Panthers were held to 37.3 percent shooting, but knocked down 4-of-6 from three-point range in the second half.

Duke shot 11-of-24 from three-point range and 51.1 percent for the game.

**BYU 80, GEORGIA STATE 62**

Marriott Center • Provo, Utah

BYU opened Tuesday night's game with a 31-2 run and Georgia State was never able to fully recover, falling to the Cougars, 80-62, at the Marriott Center in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-18 shooting, pulling down a career-high eight rebounds in the loss.

BYU (2-0) held Georgia State (0-2) to just 35.4 percent shooting and 13.6 percent from three-point range.

Despite trailing by as many as 29 with 10:31 to play in the first half, the Panthers cut the Cougars lead to just 11 points, 56-43, with 9:25 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get. BYU center Brandon Davies finished with 28 points on 10-of-14 shooting, making 8-of-10 from the free throw line and grabbing nine rebounds. Tyler Haws added 22 points, seven rebounds and five assists for the Cougars who finished the game shooting 51.7 percent from the floor.

After opening the season before a sell-out crowd at No. 8 Duke, Georgia State played in front of a hostile 13,181 tonight.

Atkins, the redshirt-junior transfer from Virginia Tech, finished with career-highs in nearly every category and sparked the Panthers second half run. He was 3-of-6 from three-point range and swiped three steals in 36 minutes of action.

Junior Devonta White added 14 points and five rebounds for GSU, while freshman R.J. Hunter scored 12 points, going 8-of-9 from the free throw line. Junior Denny Burguillos added nine points and six rebounds, going 4-of-6 from the floor.

BYU opened the game red-hot, taking a 15-0 lead and expanding it to 25-2 with 12:41 to play before the first media time-out. The Cougars hit 12 of their first 16 shots, including 5-of-5 from three-point range, forcing Hunter to use two timeouts before the first media.

Trailing by 27, 40-13, GSU used a 9-0 run to cut the deficit to 40-22 with 1:27 to play in the first half. Georgia State trailed 44-26 at halftime.

After shooting over 70 percent for most of the first half, BYU finished the first half shooting 58.1 percent, including 6-of-12 from three-point range. BYU held Georgia State to just 26.5 percent shooting and 2-of-12 from three-point range during the first 20 minutes.

Matt Carlino added 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting, dishing out seven assists and swiping four steals for BYU.

**GEORGIA STATE 62, MONMOUTH 49**

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Devonta White scored 16 points and James Vincent tied the school record with nine blocked shots as Georgia State defeated Monmouth, 62-49, Monday at the GSU Sports Arena on day one of the Coaches vs. Cancer Atlanta Subregional.

R.J. Hunter added 14 points and five rebounds for the Panthers in their home opener.

Vincent, who also had five points and eight rebounds, tied the GSU record originally set by Sylvester Morgan against Mercer on Jan. 23, 2005. As a team, the Panthers finished with 13 blocks, one off the school record of 14 set last season versus FIU.

Georgia State improved to 1-2 and won its second straight home opener under head coach Ron Hunter.

"Our defense carried us tonight," commented Hunter. "We were able to force 19 turnovers which I am happy about, but I am extremely disappointed with our team having 21 turnovers and too many missed free throws. We have to clean that up if we want to be a great team."

"I am really proud of James. He played extremely well tonight. When he plays with that type of effort, he can be one of the best big men around. James played like a senior tonight and I commend him for it."

The Panthers shot 51 percent from the field while holding Monmouth to 27.8 percent as the Hawks managed just 15 of 54 from the field.

Andrew Nicholas led Monmouth (1-3) with 10 points, while Ed Waite added a team high nine rebounds.

GSU led 30-23 at the half and then scored the first eight points of the second half to build a 15-point advantage. The Panthers built their largest lead of 17 points at 51-34 on a pair of free throws by Manny Atkins at the 11:00 mark.

Leading 51-38 with seven minutes left, Georgia State held the Hawks without a field goal for a six-minute stretch. Monmouth managed only six field goals in the second half.

Sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score eight points on a perfect 4-of-4 shooting. Junior Rashaad Richardson added nine points on 4-of-5 shooting.

In Monday's early game, Tennessee State defeated South Alabama, 67-58.

**GEORGIA STATE 59, TENNESSEE STATE 57**

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Rashaad Richardson sank a half-court heave at the buzzer to give Georgia State a 59-57 victory over Tennessee State Tuesday night on day two of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic Atlanta Subregional, played at the GSU Sports Arena.

Tennessee State's DeShawn Dockery appeared to win the game for the Tigers (1-4), coached by former GSU player Travis Williams, with a driving layup with two seconds left that put TSU ahead, 57-56. After a timeout, Manny Atkins inbounded the ball to Richardson, who caught the ball right at half court, turned and heaved the 45-foot shot into the basket.

The lead actually changed hands four times in the final 25 seconds and three times in last seven seconds. With the Panthers holding a 54-52 lead, TSU's Jordan Cyphers drained a three-pointer with 25 seconds left to put Tennessee State up, 55-54. Georgia State (2-2) then regained the lead on a pair of free throws by Cameron Solomon with seven seconds left to set up the final drama.

Devonta White scored a game-high 19 points for Georgia State, hitting 6-of-8 from the floor, including three three-pointers.

The Panthers likely could have won the game in less-dramatic fashion with better free throw shooting, as GSU went just 11-for-19 from the line and missed three crucial foul shots in the final two minutes that could have helped seal the victory.

The lead changed hands 16 times in the second half, with neither team leading by more than seven points.

Georgia State trailed 44-43 with seven minutes to play, when Solomon and James Vincent completed back-to-back three-point plays as GSU moved ahead, 49-44 with 5:56 left. A layup by Atkins pushed the Panthers' advantage to 51-44 at 4:53.

But Tennessee State reeled off eight straight points on a dunk by Robert Covington and then three-pointers by Dockery and Patrick Miller to regain the lead at 52-51 with 2:24 left.

White made one of two free throws to tie the game at 52-all, and then Vincent also made one of two for a 53-52 advantage with 1:29 on the clock. White was back at the free throw line with 37 seconds left and a change to give the Panthers a three-point lead, but he again made just one of two free throws, and GSU led 54-52.

Cameron Solomon added 10 points off the bench, making 4-of-5 free throws for GSU.

Covington led Tennessee State with 13 points, while Miller and Jordan added 12 each.

**GEORGIA STATE 75, SOUTH ALABAMA 73**

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Manny Atkins scored 26 points and R.J. Hunter added 25 as Georgia State held off South Alabama, 75-73, in the final game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic Atlanta Subregional at the GSU Sports Arena.

GSU won three games in the three-day event to improve to 3-2 on the season, while South Alabama dropped three straight to fall to 2-3, despite 31 points and 11 rebounds by Augustine Rubit.

Atkins, the transfer from Virginia Tech, scored 19 of his 26 points in the first half, while the freshman Hunter did most of his damage in the second half with 14 points in the final 13 minutes. Both players achieved career highs less than 24 hours after the duo combined to hit just three of 18 shots in yesterday's GSU win.

Atkins hit six of seven shots from the field with four three-pointers in his first-half barrage. Georgia State shot 52 percent from the field in the half, including 8-for-14 from three-point range, to open a 43-35 lead at the intermission.

The Panthers led 47-37 with 17 minutes to play when the Jaguars reeled off 10 straight points, tying the game at 47-all on Mychal Ammons' three-pointer at 14:34.

Devonta White's layup gave the Panthers a lead they would not relinquish, and then Hunter hit back-to-back three-pointers to push the GSU advantage to 55-49.

South Alabama would stay within striking distance the rest of the way. A layup by Rubit pulled the Jaguars within 64-63 at the 4:48 mark, but Hunter answered with a three-point play and then two free throws. Atkins nailed a three-pointer, his first field goal of the second half, to increase the GSU lead to 72-64 with 2:22 left.

The Jaguars had one more run. Trailing 74-67 after an Atkins bucket at 1:30, Xavier Robinson hit back-to-back three-pointers, and suddenly, GSU's lead was just 74-73 with 35 seconds to go. Hunter was fouled with 16 seconds left and made one of two free throws. South Alabama advanced the ball over half court and called timeout, but the Jaguars failed to get off a good shot in the final seconds.

Cameron Solomon joined Atkins and Hunter in double figures with 10 points off the bench for GSU, while White finished with nine.

Georgia State shot 50 percent for the game, including 11-for-18 from three-point range, but the Panthers were out-rebounded 36-26.

The Pirates moved to 5-0 on the season, while Georgia State evened its record at 3-3.

Manny Atkins led Georgia State with 15 points and eight rebounds, and Devonta White added 13 points.

Both teams shot below 40 percent from the field, but ECU outrebounded the Panthers, 47-26. The Pirates grabbed 18 offensive rebounds.

"I tip my cap to Coach Lebo and East Carolina," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the game. "My team is young and tonight we got beat by a well-coached, experienced team. Experience is the one thing you can not recruit or coach and tonight, our inexperience showed.

"East Carolina used their experience to hit the boards hard tonight and they used it to their advantage. They outrebounded us in a big way and never allowed us to get into a rhythm."

East Carolina led from the opening tip, scoring the first eight points en route to a 31-20 halftime advantage. The closest the Panthers could come in the second half was seven points, pulling within 38-31 on a bucket by Atkins with 13 minutes to play.

Georgia State was within eight at 46-38 with eight minutes left, before Robert Sampson nailed a three-pointer to begin an 8-1 run that pushed the Pirates lead to 54-39.

Sampson, an Atlanta native and the son of former NBA player Ralph Sampson, contributed a double-double for ECU with 12 points and 16 rebounds.

True freshman T.J. Shipes saw his first significant action for the Panthers and contributed six points in 16 minutes.

Shamarr Bowden added 10 points off the bench for the Pirates.

**LOUISIANA TECH 86, GEORGIA STATE 68**

Raheem Appleby scored 34 points as Louisiana Tech defeated Georgia State, 86-68, Friday at the GSU Sports Arena.

R.J. Hunter scored 23 points and Manny Atkins and Devonta White added 13 each to lead Georgia State, which dropped to 3-4 on the season. Louisiana Tech won its seventh straight game to improve to 7-1.

The Panthers played before a season-high crowd of 2,105 at the Sports Arena but could not find their shooting touch, managing to hit just 35 percent from the field. Meanwhile Louisiana Tech connected on 54 percent, including 14-for-19 by Appleby, who achieved his career high. The Bulldogs also held the rebounding advantage at 45-36.

"We just got beat by a very good Louisiana Tech team tonight," commented head coach Ron Hunter. "Our young team is not ready to play against experienced teams like that."

"The total record of the teams we have lost to this year is 22-2. I wanted to test our guys early this season and we have definitely done that. The good thing is that we are learning from these games and will continue to get better."

Hunter finished the game 9-of-19 from the floor, pulling down seven rebounds and tying a career-high with four steals. Atkins just missed a double-double for the Panthers, pulling down nine rebounds in a team-high 33 minutes of action, while White added four steals.

Georgia State took an early 14-7 lead before the Bulldogs used a 7-1 run to move ahead 21-15 and then never trailed again. Louisiana Tech led 44-30 at the half.

The Bulldogs pushed the lead to as many as 28 points with 14:57 remaining in the game, but Georgia State never gave up, cutting it to the 18-point final.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score seven points in six minutes for Georgia State, while junior Rashaad Richardson chipped in six with a pair of three-pointers.

Also in double figures for the Bulldogs were Kenneth Smith with 15 points and Cordarius Johnson with 14.

Georgia State finished with a season-high 14 steals and forced 19 Bulldog turnovers.

**GEORGIA STATE 67, LIBERTY 66**

Vines Center • Lynchburg, Va.

It wasn't a half-court shot this time, but junior Rashaad Richardson's three-pointer with less than three seconds left gave Georgia State a 67-66 win at Liberty in the Vines Center on Sunday afternoon. The win gave Panther head coach Ron Hunter the 300th of his career.

Richardson, who hit a half-court buzzer beater just 10 days ago to lift the Panthers over Tennessee State, came off a screen near the top of the arc, hitting his second three of the day.

Hunter, in his second year at the helm of the Panthers, won the 300th game in just his 535 contests.

Georgia State snapped a two-game losing streak and improved to 4-4 with the win, while Liberty fell to 0-8 on the season.

Juniors Manny Atkins and Devonta White each scored 17 points to lead Georgia State, while Davon Marshall led Liberty with 25 points.

After trailing 37-29 at the half, Georgia State opened the second half on a 9-0 run, capped by a Richardson three-pointer to give the Panthers a 38-37 lead with 16:42 remaining in the game. However, it was the final three that had everyone talking after the game.

Liberty opened the game red-hot in the first half from beyond the arc, hitting 8-of-13 to build its eight-point lead at the half. The Flames finished the game 12-of-24 from three-point range, only slightly cooling off in the second half.

The two teams traded leads seven times, including five times as the game was not decided until the final possession.

Davon Marshall's three-pointer with 49 seconds remaining gave the Flames a 63-58 lead before GSU finished the game on a 9-3 run.

Following a tip-in and free throw by senior James Vincent cut the deficit to two, Marshall hit another pair of free throws to give Liberty a four-point lead.

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who finished with 12 points and seven rebounds, followed with a dunk with free throw with 18 seconds to play to cut the deficit to one.

Liberty's Casey Roberts made the first of two free throws before the Panthers drove to half-court as Hunter called a timeout setting up the final play.

Richardson finished the game 3-of-6 from the floor, including a pair of three's for 10 points as four Panthers finished in double-figures.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon once again provided a spark off the bench, scoring eight points on 4-of-6 shooting in 21 minutes.

**GEORGIA STATE 86, SOUTHERN POLY 58**

R.J. Hunter scored 21 points and Devonta White and Manny Atkins added 16 each as Georgia State defeated Southern Poly, 86-58, Saturday afternoon at the GSU Sports Arena.

The trio of Hunter, White and Atkins also combined for 13 rebounds, 11 assists and seven steals. The GSU bench also made strong contributions as Rashaad Richardson scored 15 points, and James Vincent collected seven points, a career-high 12 rebounds, three blocked shots and three assists.

The Panthers improved to 5-4 on the season. For Southern Poly (5-5), an NAIA program, the game counted as an exhibition.

Southern Poly stayed close in the first half by hitting nine three-pointers, five of them by Chase Robinson, who scored 19 first-half points. Robinson finished with 27 points.

The Hornets took a one point lead on Devon Butler's three-pointer with 18 seconds left in the first half, but R.J. Hunter answered for GSU with trey to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 37-35 lead.

Southern Poly scored first to open the second half, tying the game at 37-37. After the teams traded three-pointers, a jumper by Hunter gave Georgia State the lead for good at 42-40.

Hunter's bucket ignited a 13-0 run for the Panthers. White hit a short jumper in the lane, then stole the ball in the back-court and converted a layup for a 46-40 lead. Hunter drained another trey, and then White passed behind his back to feed Vincent for a dunk. After GSU forced a turnover, Vincent made another layup to put the Panthers ahead, 53-40, with 14:36 to play.

Georgia State shot 51.6 percent from the field, including 56 percent in the second half, in which the Panthers outscored Southern Poly, 49-23. GSU held a 44-29 advantage on the boards.

Southern Poly shot just 34.5 percent but made 12 three-pointers to stay within 10 points until the final 10 minutes of the game.

R.J. Hunter finished 7-of-12 from the floor, including 4-of-8 from three-point range, while Atkins was 6-of-11 from the floor. White also finished 6-of-11, including 3-of-6 from three-point range.

Georgia State overcame a 14-point halftime deficit to lead late before falling to Troy, 57-56, on a free throw with 33.9 seconds left Saturday night at the Trojan Arena.

The Panthers (5-5) took a 56-51 lead on Devonta White's layup with 1:47 left. Troy answered with a three-point play by Antoine Myers with 1:16 to play to pull within two. The Trojans then came up with a steal in the backcourt, and Hunter Williams fed Myers for the tying layup with 1:05 left.

With the score tied at 56-56, GSU missed twice from close range before center James Vincent was whistled for a foul on the rebound, and Ray Chambers made one of two free throws to put Troy ahead, 57-56 with 33.9 seconds left.

After a miss by GSU and then a missed free throw by Troy, the Panthers had one final chance when Vincent was fouled with less than a second on the clock, but he could not convert from the free throw line.

"This has kind of been the story all year," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the loss. "We come out slow and then fight back, but tonight it was too little too late.

"We were just 15-of-23 from the free throw line and that is not good enough to win. We have not shot well from the line all season and tonight it proved costly."

After falling behind 30-16 at the half, GSU still trailed by nine at 42-33 with less than 13 minutes to play. The Panthers reeled off nine straight points to tie the game at 42-42 on a three-pointer by R.J. Hunter. The score was still tied at 46-46 with less than seven minutes left when a bucket by White gave the Panthers their first lead since Atkins scored the first bucket of the game.

White led GSU with 13 points, 11 of them in the second half. Atkins added 12 points and nine rebounds, and Vincent contributed 10 points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots, moving into sixth place in GSU history with 87 career blocks.

Chambers paced Troy with 18 points on 8-for-11 shooting and seven rebounds. The Trojans snapped a five-game losing streak to improve to 5-7.

Georgia State fell behind with a frigid first half in which the Panthers managed to shoot just 5-for-21 (24 percent) in the first half. GSU had more turnovers (9) than field goals in the opening half and trailed by as many as 16 points before taking a 14-point deficit into the locker room.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score nine points in 16 minutes of action.

**SOUTHERN MISS 69, GEORGIA STATE 67**

Georgia State fell to Southern Miss, 69-67, Tuesday at the GSU Sports Arena. R.J. Hunter scored 24 points for the Panthers, but Jerrold Brooks answered with a career-high 23 for the Golden Eagles, including the go-ahead three-pointer with 2:03 left in the game.

Georgia State dropped its second in a row to fall to 5-6 on the season, while Southern Miss improved to 8-3.

GSU led 63-59 after a three-point play by Manny Atkins with 3:32 to play. Norville Carey made a layup for Southern Miss, and then after a GSU turnover, Carey's jumper tied the game at 63-all with 2:39 left. He missed the ensuing free throw, but Southern Miss grabbed the rebound, and Jonathan Mills added two free throws to give the Eagles a 65-63 lead with 2:21 left.

Devonta White was fouled in the backcourt and made a pair of foul shots to knot the score again at 65-all before Brooks nailed his three to put the Eagles ahead for good, 68-65.

After a GSU miss and a Southern Miss turnover, the Panthers inbounded the ball with 24 seconds left. Manny Atkins' three-point attempt from the corner bounced around the rim but fell off, and Markus Crider tipped it in with 6.8 seconds left.

Brooks made one of two free throws, so GSU had one final chance, down 69-67 with five seconds left, but Crider's three-point attempt from the top of the circle was off the mark.

Hunter scored 20 of his points in the first half as he went 6-for-8 from three-point range. He hit three straight to open the game, and then his fifth try of the half put the Panthers ahead, 29-27, with 2:24 to play. He nailed one more with 22 seconds left to help send Georgia State into the locker room with a 34-31 halftime lead.

The Panthers led by as many as 11 points in the second half, moving ahead 52-41 on a layup by James Vincent with 12 minutes to go.

Hunter finished 8-for-16 from the field with six three-pointers, but Brooks was just as good for Southern Miss, hitting 5-of-7 from beyond the arc and 7-for-10 overall.

White and Atkins also reached double figures for GSU, scoring 13 points each.

Dwayne Davis added 12 points and five rebounds for the Golden Eagles.

As a team, Georgia State connected on 10-of-24 from three-point range but just 15-of-22 free throws. GSU shot 44.7 percent from the field while allowing Southern Miss to hit 50 percent of its shots.

**RHODE ISLAND 65, GEORGIA STATE 60**

Georgia State suffered its third straight close loss, falling 65-60 at Rhode Island Saturday afternoon at the Ryan Center in Kingston, R.I., despite 23 points by freshman R.J. Hunter.

The Panthers have dropped three straight games by a total of eight points to fall to 5-7 on the season. Rhode Island improved to 4-7 and has won three of four.

Rhode Island's Xavier Munford scored all 17 of his points in the second half, including 12 straight in a key run that put Rhode Island ahead for good.

With the score tied at 42-all and just under nine minutes to play, Munford scored 12 consecutive points for the Rams, including three straight three-pointers—one of them a four-point play—to put URI ahead 54-44 with six minutes left.

Georgia State fought back, pulling within 59-57 on a layup by Rashaad Richardson with 2:22 left, but the Rams answered with a bucket by Mike Powell to move ahead by four. URI added a free throw with 1:47 left, but after a three-point play by Manny Atkins, GSU trailed 62-60 with 1:27 to play.

After a miss by the Rams, the Panthers had a possession to tie or take the lead, but Devonta White's driving layup was blocked with 28 seconds left. But Munford made only one of two free throws giving GSU one final chance to tie, but Atkins' three-point try was off the mark with 12 seconds left.

"We just have to learn how to finish games," said GSU head coach Ron Hunter. "We played hard, but our margin of error is thin. We didn't lose the game because we played badly; we just have to make a few more plays at the end.

"These are the growing pains of building a program," Hunter continued. "Our fortunes will turn."

The Panthers got off to a slow start, missing their first seven shots from the field to fall behind 10-1. GSU trailed 22-12 with six minutes to play in the half, but a three-pointer by White and a pair of free throws by Hunter in the final minute sent GSU into the locker room with a 27-24 deficit. Hunter scored 12 of the Panthers' 24 points in the first half.

Georgia State stayed close for the first 10 minutes of the second half before final tying the game on Richardson's three-pointer with 10:40 left, but the Panthers never led in the game.

Hunter, who also had six rebounds, topped the 20-point mark for the second straight game and the fifth time this season. Atkins contributed 14 points, nine rebounds and three steals for GSU, and White added 14 points.

Georgia State managed to shoot just 39.6 percent from the field, including 4-for-17 from beyond the arc. Rhode Island was only slightly better at 44.7 percent, but the Rams made eight three-pointers. Nicola Malesevich led URI with 22 points

**GEORGIA SOUTHERN 68, GEORGIA STATE 64**

Georgia Southern rallied from 10 points down in the final two minutes to force overtime and then pulled away in the extra session for a 68-64 victory over Georgia State Saturday afternoon at Hanner Fieldhouse.

Georgia State raced to a big lead in the first half but dropped its fourth straight game in close fashion to fall to 5-8 on the season. The four losses have been by a total of 12 points. Georgia Southern improved to 6-7.

Georgia Southern's Eric Ferguson tied the game with a three-pointer with 20 seconds left in regulation to cap the Eagles' late rally. The Panthers had two final shots, but Manny Atkins' layup under the basket was swatted away with 7.5 seconds left, and Devonta White's three-point try at the buzzer was no good.

C.J. Reed's three-pointer with 2:15 to play in the overtime game gave Georgia Southern its first lead of the game at 60-57. White answered with a pair of free throws for Georgia State, but Ferguson, who finished with a game-high 24 points, nailed another three to put Georgia Southern ahead 63-59, and the Eagles held on for the win.

Four Panthers scored in double figures, led by White and R.J. Hunter with 14 points each, and Manny Atkins and James Vincent with 11 apiece. But Hunter fouled out in the final three minutes of regulation, Rashaad Richardson fouled in the overtime, and Vincent spent much of the second half on the bench after picking up his fourth foul shortly after the intermission.

Georgia State raced to a 17-point lead in the first half and still led 55-45 with under two minutes to play, but the Panthers committed four turnovers and missed two free throws, including the front end of a one-and-one.

A layup by Georgia Southern's Brian Holmes with 1:47 left made the score 55-47, White missed the front end of a one-and-one, and then Ferguson threw up a wild shot from the lane as he was fouled, and the ball dropped in. He also made the free throw to pull the Eagles within 55-50 with 1:21 still to play.

With Georgia State trying to run down the clock on offense, Atkins was whistled for a five-second violation with 58 seconds to go. Ferguson made a pair of free throws, and Georgia Southern trailed just 55-52 with 47 seconds left.

Clinging to a three-point lead, the Panthers turned the ball over on the inbounds play, giving possession back to the Eagles. Georgia Southern then gave the ball right back to the Panthers on a travelling call. Georgia State managed to inbound the ball, but White got trapped in the backcourt and the Panthers did not have a timeout left, setting up Ferguson's tying try.

**DREXEL 77, GEORGIA STATE 60**

Frantz Massanat scored 25 points as Drexel defeated Georgia State, 77-60, Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena in the Colonial Athletic Association opener for both teams.

Freshman R.J. Hunter scored 23 points for Georgia State, which trailed by just four points at halftime, but Drexel (5-8, 1-0 CAA), the preseason favorite in the CAA, dominated the second half to hand GSU (5-9, 0-1 CAA) its fifth straight loss.

The win was Drexel's 17th straight CAA regular-season victory, dating back to last season. Georgia State was the last team to hand Drexel a regular-season loss in CAA play; exactly one year ago, GSU defeated the Dragons, 58-44, at the Sports Arena. Drexel's streak equals Richmond (1988-89) for the second-longest in league history and is one shy of George Mason's record of 18 in a row over the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Hunter topped the 20-point mark for the third time in the last four games and the sixth time in his rookie season at Georgia State. A leading candidate for CAA Rookie of the Year, Hunter has already earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors three times this season. He finished the game 9-of-16 from the floor and pulled six rebounds.

"Drexel showed tonight why they were picked first in the CAA during the preseason," commented head coach Ron Hunter. "After a good first half, they played really well in the second half and we just did not have any answers."

"We will keep grinding and we will get better. For us to get where we want to though, we need a full team effort. We have to have guys step up and when they do, we will be a special team."

Sophomore transfer Cameron Solomon added a career-high 12 points for the Panthers, but Devonta White was the only other Panther in double figures with 11 points.

A tip-in just ahead of the first-half buzzer by Dartay Ruffin gave Drexel a 37-33 lead at the intermission. After Georgia State scored the first bucket of the second half, the Dragons went on a 22-4 run to open a 59-39 lead with 11 minutes to play.

Drexel shot 65 percent from the field in the second half, led by Massanat, the preseason CAA Player of the Year, who scored 17 points of his career-high 25 points after the intermission. Damion Lee added 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range, and Darryl McCoy pulled down 14 rebounds for the Dragons.

**GEORGIA STATE 68, JAMES MADISON 52**

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

R.J. Hunter scored 19 points and Manny Atkins added 15 as Georgia State earned its first Colonial Athletic Association win with a 68-52 victory over James Madison Saturday at the GSU Sports Arena.

James Vincent contributed 10 points and eight blocked shots, one off his career high, to help the Panthers (6-9, 1-1 CAA) snap their five-game losing streak and halt JMU's (7-7, 1-1 CAA) four-game winning streak.

Georgia State also got strong contributions from freshman David Travers, who had seven points and three assists in 21 minutes, his most significant playing time of his rookie season. After hitting a free throw for his first collegiate point, he nailed a pair of dramatic three-point field goals, one at the first half buzzer and another in the second half with the shot clock about to expire.

Junior Devonta White added 11 points and dished out a career-high seven assists in 36 minutes of action.

The Panthers turned in one of their better defensive efforts of the season in holding James Madison to 52 points and 30.9 percent shooting from the field, the lowest figure for a GSU opponent since Monmouth managed just 27.8 percent shooting in the third game of the season.

On the offensive end, Georgia State shot 47 percent from field, including 10-for-21 from three-point range.

With his eight blocked shots, Vincent raised his career total to 104 and moved into fifth place in school history. The senior from Columbus, Ga., leads the CAA in blocked shots.

Georgia State closed the first half with a 13-4 run to open up a 38-25 halftime lead. Hunter made a pair of treys on the run, and Travers ended the half with a three-pointer at the buzzer, falling to the ground as he made his first collegiate field goal.

The Panthers shot 53.8 percent from the field in the first half, including 8-for-13 from beyond the arc, while holding the Dukes to less than 30 percent (8-for-27). That marked GSU's highest output in a first half since scoring 43 against South Alabama on Nov. 21. Hunter (13 points) and Atkins (12) combined for 25 of the Panthers' 38 points.

In the second half, James Madison managed to pull within nine points at 53-44 with nine minutes to play, but Atkins contributed a three-point play to push GSU's lead to 56-44 and then took a charge on the other end. From there, the Panthers' lead never dipped below double-digits.

Rayshawn Goins led James Madison with 19 points and 16 rebounds. A.J. Davis came off the bench to score 10 points and grab eight rebounds for the Dukes.
