Georgia State will play one for the history books on Saturday, facing James Madison in the Panthers final Colonial Athletic Association road game before moving to the Sun Belt Conference next season. The Panthers will square off with the Dukes at the JMU Convocation Center with tip-off set for 4 p.m.

Georgia State (14-15, 9-7 CAA) has won two of its last three, including a split of games earlier this week in Virginia. James Madison (16-13, 10-6 CAA) has also won two of its last three, falling by two to first place Northeastern on Wednesday night, 66-64.

The Panthers are looking to win their final two games and finish above .500 for the second straight season under second-year head coach Ron Hunter.

“Although we will not be playing in the CAA Tournament, we still have a lot to play for,” commented Hunter. “There is a big difference between finishing just above .500 or just below. Our team has come a long way this season and there is no doubt in my mind that they will give their full effort the last two games to finish the regular season with a winning record.”

R.J. Hunter finished with 15 points against William & Mary on Monday, while redshirt-junior Manny Atkins just missed another double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds. It marked the sixth time this season that Atkins just missed a double-double by one board.

Hunter is making a late season push for All-CAA First Team honors and Freshman All-America honors. He continues to lead all CAA freshmen in scoring and rebounding and is one of just four freshmen in the country averaging at least 17.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. The elite group includes UCLA’s Shabazz Muhammad, UNLV’s Anthony Bennett and Arizona State’s Jahii Carson. He is currently fourth in the nation among all freshmen scorers and 68th overall.

R.J. Hunter, the only son of head coach Ron Hunter, is averaging a team-high 17.3 points per game and 18.9 points in CAA-only games, both of which are third in the confer-

ence. He is also collecting 5.2 rebounds per game, 20th in the CAA, and making 2.4 three-pointers per game, third in the league. Hunter is shooting 37.2 percent from beyond the arc, fifth in the conference.

Hunter is also averaging the most points of any CAA freshmen since the 1999-2000 season. He is also on pace to score the most points of any GSU freshmen ever. With two regular season games remaining, he has scored 503 points and is just 12 points shy Matt O'Brien's 1989-90 mark of 515.

Hunter, along with Atkins are among the top four in the conference in three-point shooting, as the Panthers are second in the league making 7.1 three-pointers per game. R.J. Hunter is also among the CAA leaders in free throw percentage, steals, blocked shots and defensive rebounds.

"There is no doubt in my mind that our freshmen have really improved this season," continued Hunter. "When you see your freshmen improve over the course of the season, it makes you know that the program is headed in the right direction. Just the other night, Markus Crider and David Travers came off the bench to give us 53 minutes combined. The experience that they are getting will really help us in the years to come."

Crider played a career-high 31 minutes on Monday, finishing with eight points and four rebounds to go along with three assists and three steals against the Tribe. Travers played 22 minutes, scoring eight points on 4-of-8 shooting, while grabbing a pair of rebounds and dishing out two assists.

Junior point guard Devonta White, who earned Preseason All-CAA Second Team honors before the season and was also named to the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award Watch List by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, is third in the CAA in minutes played (36.0) and tied for sixth in steals per game, averaging 1.7 per game.

White is second on the team in scoring, averaging 14.4 points per game, ninth in the CAA, while dishing out 3.9 assists, third most in the league. He has dished out 71 assists in his last 14 games, including four games of at least seven assists.

One of three team captains, White, who missed 10 games during his freshman season due to an injury, is just 39 points away from becoming the 17th Panther with 1,000 career points. He is just off pace to eclipse that mark by the end of the year, needing to average 19.5 points per game in the remaining regular season contests.

Manny Atkins, from nearby Tucker, Ga., is averaging 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game this season, both among the top 12 in the CAA. He is third in the CAA in three-point field goal percentage, hitting 41.1 percent from beyond the arc and is eighth in the CAA making 1.8 three-pointers per game.

Lone senior James Vincent played in his 115th game on Monday to move into a tie for sixth all-time games played list. He is second on GSU's all-time blocked shots list with 129 and his 67 blocked shots this season are the third most in a single season in GSU history.

He is leading the CAA averaging 2.39 blocked shots per game, which also ranks 28th in the NCAA this year.

Junior Rashaad Richardson rounds out the Panthers starting five averaging 7.2 points and 2.6 rebounds per game. Richardson finished with 10 points and two steals at William & Mary.

James Madison is led by Rayshawn Goins, averaging 13.5 points and 7.7 rebounds per game this season. He is one of four Dukes averaging in double figures to go along with Devon Moore, A.J. Davis and Andrey Semenov.

Following Saturday's contest, Georgia State will prepare for its final regular season game of the season, hosting Northeastern for Senior Night on Wednesday. Tip-time is set for 7 p.m.

A PERFECT 300

With his 300th win earlier this season at Liberty, coach Ron Hunter joined an elite group of young coaches. He won his 300 in just his 535th game coaching. Hunter will turn 49 on April 7, 2013.

In his impressive career, Hunter has had five 20-plus win seasons and led three teams to the postseason.



TOP HONORS...NO QUESTION

Freshman R.J. Hunter is having an extremely special type of rookie season. Already a lock for CAA Rookie of the Year earning rookie of the week honors six times, Hunter is now a serious contender for CAA Player of the Year, All-CAA First Team honors and Freshman All-America honors. He earned his first CAA Player of the Week honor on Feb. 2, while also being named the Lou Henson National Player of the Week.

He is tied for the lead in the CAA with 12 games of 20 or more points this season and is one of just six players in the conference to score at least 30 points in a game this season.

Below are several notes related to Hunter this season.

NATIONAL HONORS

Hunter earned the Lou Henson National Player of the Week award on Feb. 4 as announced by CollegeInsider.com.

The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the top Mid-Major player in Division I college basketball.

Hunter swept CAA Player and Rookie of the Week honors on Monday and was also named the CAA Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

The award is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779.

A DICKIE V DIAPER DANDY

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who is averaging 17.3 points per game this season, third in the CAA and fourth in the nation among all freshmen in scoring. Hunter has scored 20 or more points 12 times already this season, including three straight with a career-high 38 against Old Dominion on Feb. 2. **He is averaging 18.9 points per game in CAA play, third in the league.**

In Dick Vitale's latest ranking of Diaper Dandy's on Jan. 8th, he mentioned:

One unsung diaper dandy is R.J. Hunter of Georgia State, a guard who is playing for his father, Ron Hunter. He is also the godson of former NBA star Ron Harper. Hunter is averaging 15.5 points and 5.8 rebounds per game for the Panthers, and posted a double-double in his college debut against Duke.

On Jan. 17th, ESPN listed its top 25 freshmen in the country with Hunter being list at No. 21, just behind Duke's Rasheed Sulimon.

Hunter is one of just four freshmen in the nation averaging at least 17.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

UNDER THE RADAR PERFORMANCE

Sports Illustrated writer Seth Davis commented on Hunter's performance after scoring 38 naming him the Under the Radar Performer of the Week. He said of Hunter:

Could it be that Doug McDermott is only the second-best player coach's son in America? If Hunter keeps playing the way he did last week, that idea might not seem so far-fetched. The son of Panthers coach Ron Hunter did his old man a solid by turning down the likes of Virginia Tech, Wake Forest and Iowa to play for Georgia State, where R.J. has averaged 17.3 points on 37.2 percent three-point shooting this season. Last week, he set a pair of career highs as he lit up league-leading Northeastern and Old Dominion for 27 and 38 points, respectively. Those performances were especially impressive considering they were both on the road. Those games marked the ninth and tenth times this season that Hunter has scored 23 points or more.

RECORD SETTING PERFORMANCE

Freshman R.J. Hunter poured in a career-high 38 points, including a school and Colonial Athletic Association record 10 three-pointers on Feb. 2 as GSU dismantled Old Dominion, 83-63.

Hunter, one of the top freshman scorers in the nation, hit 10-of-15 shots from beyond the arc and 12-of-18 overall. His 38-point effort is the high for any CAA player this season and the most by a Georgia State player since Anton Reese scored 38 against Kansas State on Nov. 28, 1998. Only six Panthers have ever scored more points in a game.

At one-point in the second half, Hunter scored 19-straight Panther points with five three-pointers, two free throws and a dunk.

The 10 treys by Hunter equalled the CAA record originally set by Dre Smith of George Mason, who hit 10 against James Madison on Jan. 19, 2008.

As a team, Georgia State nailed 16 three-pointers, the second-most in any game in school history. The GSU record is 21 versus West Florida on Dec. 12, 2003, and the Panthers had not hit as many as 16 since 2005.

AMONG THE BEST

With three three-pointers against William & Mary, freshman R.J. Hunter moved into a tie for seventh in three-pointers in a single season in Georgia State history. Hunter has already made a team-high 70 three-pointers this season and is now tied with Leonard Mendez on the single season list.

Hunter made a single-game record 10 three-pointers against Old Dominion, topping the record of nine held by Kevin Morris, Thomas Terrell and Anton Reese.

SIX-STAR FRESHMAN

Freshman R.J. Hunter is only three months into his collegiate career and he has already earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors six times this season. Hunter also earned his first CAA Player of the Week honor on Feb. 2 after averaging 32.5 points in two Panther wins against first place Northeastern and Old Dominion.

Hunter has more than the total number of CAA Rookie of the Week honors earned by GSU in the last seven years since joining the league.

He is now just two behind the CAA Rookie of the Weeks record of eight times set by Hofstra's Antoine Agudio during the 2004-05 season.

His latest honor on Feb. 4 came after averaging 32.5 points, including a career-high 38 points against Old Dominion. At the time, it was the most points scored by a freshman in the country this season. He made 10 three-pointers, a school-record which also tied for the most in CAA history. This followed a 27-point performance at Northeastern, as the Panthers became the first team to defeat the Huskies in CAA play this season.

His Jan. 28 honor came after he averaged 18.0 points and 4.0 rebounds leading the Panthers to a pair of wins. Hunter shot 84.2 percent from the free throw line while dishing out eight assists, swiping four steals and blocking three shots, hitting the game-winning shot at Towson before blocking the Tigers last second attempt at victory.

Jan. 7: he averaged 21.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in the Panthers first two CAA games on Jan. 7th.

Dec. 24: he earned the honor after averaging 23.5 points and 5.0 rebounds in two games for GSU against Southern Miss and Rhode Island.

He earned his first honor in his first collegiate game collecting a double-double of 14 points and 10 rebounds in the Panthers loss to No. 8 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Nov. 12.

He earned the award again on Nov. 26 after leading the Panthers to three-straight wins as part of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. He scored a season-high 25 points to cap the week against South Alabama.

AMONG THE BEST

Freshman R.J. Hunter is having one of the best freshman seasons in school history. He has scored 503 points this season, just 12 shy of the freshmen school record. Here is how he compares to some other GSU greats:

1989-90: Matt O'Brien set the freshman mark with 515 points in 28 games (18.4 per game). His bests were 38, 33 and 32 and he had 10 games with 20 or more points. O'Brien scored in double figures in 23 of the 28 games.

1985-86: James Andrews scored 329 points, averaging 11.8 for GSU, shooting 42.0 percent from the floor. He finished his three-year career with 1,279 points, the fourth most in Panther history.

1994-95: Rodney Hamilton (all-time leading scorer) scored 279 points in his first season en route to 1,515 for this career. He shot 41.1 percent from the floor and 77.0 percent from the free throw line during the year.

BEST CAA FRESHMAN EVER?

R.J. Hunter is playing at an incredible level for a first-year player, exceeding most people's expectations.

Hunter is the leading candidate for the CAA Rookie of the Year award. How does his season stack up to past winners? If it holds, his 17.3 points per game average would be highest since Brett Blizzard's 15.6 ppg in 1999-2000.

NEW AND IMPROVED SCHEDULE

Building his first schedule for Georgia State, head coach Ron Hunter wanted to test his team early, knowing that the squad will face a very difficult CAA schedule in January and February. The Panthers played three teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2012, including opening at No. 8 (ESPN) Duke followed by BYU. The Panthers also hosted Southern Miss.

Georgia State already topped future Sun Belt foe South

Alabama, 75-73 as the Jaguars were receiving votes in the ESPN Coaches poll at the time.

Georgia State's strength of schedule reached as high as 19th earlier this season.

IF THEY ARE FREE...

Against Delaware and William & Mary, Georgia State shot an impressive 43-47 from the free throw line, a 91.4 percent make rate. After struggling from the line earlier in the year, the Panthers are making 78.9 percent in CAA play, upping their season average to 71.9 percent.

Georgia State had a streak of 18 straight makes come to an end at Old Dominion, finishing the game 16-of-22.

MOVING ON UP...

This will mark Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association. As of July 1, 2013, the Panthers will join the highly-competitive Sun Belt Conference, led by new Commissioner Karl Benson.

Due to a 12-year old CAA rule, the Panthers, along with Old Dominion which is moving to Conference USA, will not be eligible for the CAA Tournament in March. However, Georgia State is eligible for all postseason tournaments, including the NCAA and NIT.

WHITE NAMED TO TOP LIST

Junior point guard and captain Devonta White was named to the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on Dec. 20, the second year in a row a Panther has been named to the list.

Before the season, White picked up a pair of preseason honors, being named to the All-CAA Preseason Second Team and College Sports Madness All-CAA Third Team.

He also earned College Sports Madness CAA Player of the Week honors on Feb. 18. White led the Panthers to a pair of wins against Hofstra and George Mason the week before.

Last season, James Fields was named to the same list as he finished his career playing the second most games in school history.

THE SERIES WITH JAMES MADISON

Georgia State leads the all-time series 8-5 and has won three straight and six of the last seven, including a 68-52 victory in Atlanta earlier this season.

In the first game, R.J. Hunter scored 19 points and Manny Atkins added 15 as GSU snapped a five-game losing streak.

James Vincent contributed 10 points and eight blocked shots, one off his career high, to help the Panthers.

Rayshawn Goins led James Madison with 19 points and 16 rebounds. A.J. Davis came off the bench to score 10 points and grab eight rebounds for the Dukes.

MOST IMPROVED

Georgia State finished the 2011-12 season among the most improved in the country. The Panthers finished plus-10 in wins, concluding with the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Panthers finished the 2010-11 season 12-19.

CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins has had a very special season already this year, but a rebound here or there could make it even more special.

Atkins recorded his first double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds at Drexel on Jan. 26. He picked up his second with 14 points and 10 rebounds at George Mason.

In between those, Atkins has missed a double-double six times already this season by just one rebound, including on Monday at William & Mary, scoring 11 points and grabbing nine rebounds. He has also missed four more games that he missed by two rebounds.

IF he had secured all of those double-doubles, he would be tied for 12th in the country in the latest NCAA rankings.

CLIMBING THE MOUNTAIN

Senior James Vincent is quickly moving up the school's single-season and all-time blocked shots list. Despite being outside the top ten entering the year, he is already moved up to second on the all-time blocked shots list with 129 and is third in a single-season with 67 this year.

With six blocked shots against Towson, Vincent moved into third in a single-season. He surpassed Zavian Smith for second on the all-time list with 129 with a pair of blocks against Hofstra.

The single-season and career school-records are held by Eric Buckner, set just a season ago.

CENTENNIAL GAME

Georgia State University will celebrate its 100th year anniversary during 2013. To help kick-off the festivities in January, the Panthers played the Centennial Game on Jan. 12 against Delaware, falling in a heartbreaker, 86-83.

Trailing by 11 with under two minutes to play, GSU mounted a furious comeback to tie the score at 83-all before Delaware's Devon Saddler hit a three-pointer with 0.8 seconds remaining to secure the win.

GOING BAREFOOT

Coach Ron Hunter coached his sixth annual barefoot game in support of Samaritan's Feet against William & Mary on Jan. 16 at the GSU Sports Arena. After trailing by 14 in the first half, the Panthers stormed back to earn a 74-58 victory against the Tribe.

Last year, his first with the Panthers, GSU earned a 75-61 victory over UNCW while wearing orange jerseys to help raise awareness for the cause.

Hunter has coached a game in his bare feet in each of the last five seasons in support of Samaritan's Feet, an organization that provides shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

ELITE COMPANY

With his start against Drexel on Jan. 2, James Vincent played in his 100th game in a Panther uniform. That put him in elite company and he moved into GSU's top 10 at Northeastern on Jan. 30. With two games remaining in the Panthers regular season,

TRAVERS = NO TURNOVERS

Freshman guard David Travers has played 200 minutes on the court this season and committed just eight turnovers, meaning that he commits just one turnover per every 25 minutes on the court.

Those numbers are unheard of for any player, no less a freshman guard who always has the ball in his hand when he is on the court.

HELPING OTHERS

The Georgia State basketball staff and players traveled to South Africa in early August for a different kind of overseas trip. Rather than playing games, the team, working with Samaritan's Feet, distributed shoes to children in South Africa. Coach Hunter, who is heavily involved with Samaritan's Feet, made his sixth trip abroad and first with his Panther squad. He previously brought his IUPUI team to Lima, Peru several years ago.



During the 10-day trip, Georgia State did several shoe distributions. There was also some free time worked into the trip that allowed the team to see the national aquarium, go on a safari and visit Cape Point, where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans connect.

A NEW ERA OF GSU BASKETBALL

After being named the 15th head coach of Georgia State on March 21, 2011, Ron Hunter set out to change the culture of Panther basketball and he did that in his first year.

Compiling a 22-12 record, Hunter won the second most games in school history, only behind the 29 wins of Charles "Lefty" Driesell during the 2000-01 season that ended in the NCAA Tournament. Hunter's squad also put together an 11-game winning streak, capped with wins over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and 2011 Final Four squad VCU.

The year ended with the Panthers returning to postseason play and earning the school's second-ever postseason victory, a 74-43 thumping of Tennessee Tech to open the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

FREQUENT FLYERS

With only a pair of games on the schedule in which the Panthers

can take a bus, Georgia State will add up the frequent flyer miles again during the 2012-13 season. As the crow flies, Georgia State will travel 20,750 round-trip miles during the regular season.

Georgia State traveled to Utah for the second straight season, a short 1,884-mile venture one-way. The Panthers faced BYU in Provo on Nov. 13 to open the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

The team's shortest trip is to Troy, Ala. (182 miles one-way) to face soon-to-be Sun Belt Conference foe Troy. State will make nine trips along the east coast once CAA play gets underway, the shortest being 415 miles one-way to Wilmington, N.C. to face the Seahawks.

545 AND COUNTING

Georgia State has made at least one three-point field goal in 545 straight games, dating back to the 1994-95 season. The last team to hold the Panthers without a trey was Stetson on Feb. 18, 1995.

NEXT UP

Georgia State will close out the regular season hosting first place Northeastern on Wednesday. It will mark the final regular season game for lone senior James Vincent.

HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

Ron Hunter restored the Georgia State program to national prominence in just his first year as head coach of the Panthers during the 2011-12 season. Georgia State won 22 games, the second most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Post-season Tournament, the Panthers fourth-ever postseason appearance.



Hunter has won 296 games in 18 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team might be the most special. After being named head coach on March, 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record-number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

He continued that work in Atlanta, coaching the Panthers while barefoot to victory over UNCW in front of the largest crowd in the Sports Arena since 2007.

While leading IUPUI to 25 or more wins in two of his final four seasons, Hunter began to partner with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world. On Jan. 24, 2008, he coached IUPUI against Oakland in his bare feet to help raise awareness for the cause. By tipoff, Hunter's efforts had raised more than 100,000 pairs of shoes, and to date, that number has climbed well above 250,000.

During his first season at Georgia State, Hunter led the Panthers to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, just the fourth time GSU earned a postseason bid. The Panthers opened the tournament at home, another first, hosting a postseason contest and earning an impressive 74-43 victory against Tennessee Tech.

Earlier in the year, Hunter's squad won 11 straight games, a school-record, earning impressive victories over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and at VCU. The streak included wins of 32, 32 and 31 points.

The Panthers winning ways continued in the CAA Tournament with a record-setting 35-point victory against Hofstra in the first round, the largest margin of victory in CAA Championship history.

Hunter's resume includes numerous national honors including an NABC Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Service, the 2009 Giant Steps Award from the National Consortium for Academics and Sport (NCAS), and a Minority Achievement Award from the Center for Leadership Development (CLD).

He was one of seven head coaches who served on the Division I Basketball Academic Enhancement Group, as appointed by late NCAA President Myles Brand, and he is a member of the National Basketball Coaches Association (NABC) Board of Directors.

Hunter, 48, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. He was a standout player on strong Miami teams of the mid-1980s, along with high school and college teammate Ron Harper, who went on to a long NBA career. The Redhawks were 81-30 during Hunter's four-year career and earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berths while winning two MAC championships.

Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (23) and R.J. (18).

#8 DUKE 74, GEORGIA STATE 55

Opening the 2012-13 season at one of college basketball's cathedrals, Georgia State fell to No. 8 Duke, 74-55, Friday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Junior point guard Devonta White, the Panthers' only returning starter, led GSU with 19 points, and freshman R.J. Hunter had 14 points and 10 rebounds in his debut.

Mason Plumlee paced Duke (1-0) with 19 points and 14 rebounds.

GSU (0-1) kept it close early, trailing just 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half before the Blue Devils started to pull away.

Georgia State, playing its first game ever in Cameron Indoor, got off to a quick start after Duke won the tip. R.J. Hunter quickly got a steal that led to a fast break lay-up to give the Panthers a 2-0 lead.

The Blue Devils followed with an 8-0 run to take an 8-2 at the first media timeout. Junior Denny Burguillos, making his GSU debut picked up two quick fouls in the first 2:22 forcing Coach Hunter to use three big men in the first half and continued to sub with James Vincent and T.J. Shipes throughout the second half.

Georgia State responded as Vincent's lay-up in the paint cut Duke's lead to 17-15 with 7:48 remaining in the first half. Unfortunately, Duke pulled away with a 15-7 run to open up a 32-22 lead at halftime.

Duke held Georgia State to 32 percent shooting in the first half, including just 1-of-8 from three-point range.

White made his first three free throws of the second half, extending his streak to 20 straight makes dating back to last season. His streak came to an end just three shy of Nate Williams school-record of 23 midway through the second half with the miss with 11:11 to play.

Trailing by 22 with 13:19 remaining in the game, Georgia State made a run to cut the deficit to 55-40 with 9:02 remaining. Duke responded with a pair of three-pointers pushed the lead back to 21.

A free throw by Devonta White cut the deficit to 14 with 3:41 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get.

Vincent finished the game with eight points and five boards off the bench.

The Panthers were held to 37.3 percent shooting, but knocked down 4-of-6 from three-point range in the second half.

Duke shot 11-of-24 from three-point range and 51.1 percent for the game.

BYU 80, GEORGIA STATE 62

Marriott Center • Provo, Utah

BYU opened Tuesday night's game with a 31-2 run and Georgia State was never able to fully recover, falling to the Cougars, 80-62, at the Marriott Center in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-18 shooting, pulling down a career-high eight rebounds in the loss.

BYU (2-0) held Georgia State (0-2) to just 35.4 percent shooting and 13.6 percent from three-point range.

Despite trailing by as many as 29 with 10:31 to play in the first half, the Panthers cut the Cougars lead to just 11 points, 56-43, with 9:25 to play, but that is as close as GSU would get. BYU center Brandon Davies finished with 28 points on 10-of-14 shooting, making 8-of-10 from the free throw line and grabbing nine rebounds. Tyler Haws added 22 points, seven rebounds and five assists for the Cougars who finished the game shooting 51.7 percent from the floor.

After opening the season before a sell-out crowd at No. 8 Duke, Georgia State played in front of a hostile 13,181 tonight.

Atkins, the redshirt-junior transfer from Virginia Tech, finished with career-highs in nearly every category and sparked the Panthers second half run. He was 3-of-6 from three-point range and swiped three steals in 36 minutes of action.

Junior Devonta White added 14 points and five rebounds for GSU, while freshman R.J. Hunter scored 12 points, going 8-of-9 from the free throw line. Junior Denny Burguillos added nine points and six rebounds, going 4-of-6 from the floor.

BYU opened the game red-hot, taking a 15-0 lead and expanding it to 25-2 with 12:41 to play before the first media time-out. The Cougars hit 12 of their first 16 shots, including 5-of-5 from three-point range, forcing Hunter to use two timeouts before the first media.

Trailing by 27, 40-13, GSU used a 9-0 run to cut the deficit to 40-22 with 1:27 to play in the first half. Georgia State trailed 44-26 at halftime.

After shooting over 70 percent for most of the first half, BYU finished the first half shooting 58.1 percent, including 6-of-12 from three-point range. BYU held Georgia State to just 26.5 percent shooting and 2-of-12 from three-point range during the first 20 minutes.

Matt Carlino added 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting, dishing out seven assists and swiping four steals for BYU.

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Devonta White scored 16 points and James Vincent tied the school record with nine blocked shots as Georgia State defeated Monmouth, 62-49, Monday at the GSU Sports Arena on day one of the Coaches vs. Cancer Atlanta Subregional.

R.J. Hunter added 14 points and five rebounds for the Panthers in their home opener.

Vincent, who also had five points and eight rebounds, tied the GSU record originally set by Sylvester Morgan against Mercer on Jan. 23, 2005. As a team, the Panthers finished with 13 blocks, one off the school record of 14 set last season versus FIU.

Georgia State improved to 1-2 and won its second straight home opener under head coach Ron Hunter.

"Our defense carried us tonight," commented Hunter. "We were able to force 19 turnovers which I am happy about, but I am extremely disappointed with our team having 21 turnovers and too many missed free throws. We have to clean that up if we want to be a great team."

"I am really proud of James. He played extremely well tonight. When he plays with that type of effort, he can be one of the best big men around. James played like a senior tonight and I commend him for it"

The Panthers shot 51 percent from the field while holding Monmouth to 27.8 percent as the Hawks managed just 15 of 54 from the field.

Andrew Nicholas led Monmouth (1-3) with 10 points, while Ed Waite added a team high nine rebounds.

GSU led 30-23 at the half and then scored the first eight points of the second half to build a 15-point advantage. The Panthers built their largest lead of 17 points at 51-34 on a pair of free throws by Manny Atkins at the 11:00 mark.

Leading 51-38 with seven minutes left, Georgia State held the Hawks without a field goal for a six-minute stretch. Monmouth managed only six field goals in the second half.

Sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score eight points on a perfect 4-of-4 shooting. Junior Rashaad Richardson added nine points on 4-of-5 shooting.

GEORGIA STATE 59, TENNESSEE STATE 57

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Rashaad Richardson sank a half-court heave at the buzzer to give Georgia State a 59-57 victory over Tennessee State Tuesday night on day two of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic Atlanta Subregional, played at the GSU Sports Arena.

Tennessee State's DeShawn Dockery appeared to win the game for the Tigers (1-4), coached by former GSU player Travis Williams, with a driving layup with two seconds left that put TSU ahead, 57-56. After a timeout, Manny Atkins inbounded the ball to Richardson, who caught the ball right at half court, turned and heaved the 45-foot shot into the basket.

The lead actually changed hands four times in the final 25 seconds and three times in last seven seconds. With the Panthers holding a 54-52 lead, TSU's Jordan Cyphers drained a three-pointer with 25 seconds left to put Tennessee State up, 55-54. Georgia State (2-2) then regained the lead on a pair of free throws by Cameron Solomon with seven seconds left to set up the final drama.

Devonta White scored a game-high 19 points for Georgia State, hitting 6-of-8 from the floor, including three three-pointers.

The Panthers likely could have won the game in less-dramatic fashion with better free throw shooting, as GSU went just 11-for-19 from the line and missed three crucial foul shots in the final two minutes that could have helped seal the victory.

The lead changed hands 16 times in the second half, with neither team leading by more than seven points.

Georgia State trailed 44-43 with seven minutes to play, when Solomon and James Vincent completed back-to-back three-point plays as GSU moved ahead, 49-44 with 5:56 left. A layup by Atkins pushed the Panthers' advantage to 51-44 at 4:53.

But Tennessee State reeled off eight straight points on a dunk by Robert Covington and then three-pointers by Dockery and Patrick Miller to regain the lead at 52-51 with 2:24 left.

White made one of two free throws to tie the game at 52-all, and then Vincent also made one of two for a 53-52 advantage with 1:29 on the clock. White was back at the free throw line with 37 seconds left and a change to give the Panthers a three-point lead, but he again made just one of two free throws, and GSU led 54-52.

Cameron Solomon added 10 points off the bench, making 4-of-5 free throws for GSU.

Covington led Tennessee State with 13 points, while Miller and Jordan added 12 each.

Game 5: November 21, 2012, 3 p.m.

GEORGIA STATE 75, SOUTH ALABAMA 73

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic • GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Manny Atkins scored 26 points and R.J. Hunter added 25 as Georgia State held off South Alabama, 75-73, in the final game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic Atlanta Subregional at the GSU Sports Arena.

GSU won three games in the three-day event to improve to 3-2 on the season, while South Alabama dropped three straight to fall to 2-3, despite 31 points and 11 rebounds by Augustine Rubit.

Atkins, the transfer from Virginia Tech, scored 19 of his 26 points in the first half, while the freshman Hunter did most of his damage in the second half with 14 points in the final 13 minutes. Both players achieved career highs less than 24 hours after the duo combined to hit just three of 18 shots in yesterday's GSU win.

Atkins hit six of seven shots from the field with four three-pointers in his first-half barrage. Georgia State shot 52 percent from the field in the half, including 8-for-14 from three-point range, to open a 43-35 lead at the intermission.

The Panthers led 47-37 with 17 minutes to play when the Jaguars reeled off 10 straight points, tying the game at 47-all on Mychal Ammons' three-pointer at 14:34.

Devonta White's layup gave the Panthers a lead they would not relinquish, and then Hunter hit back-to-back three-pointers to push the GSU advantage to 55-49.

South Alabama would stay within striking distance the rest of the way. A layup by Rubit pulled the Jaguars within 64-63 at the 4:48 mark, but Hunter answered with a three-point play and then two free throws. Atkins nailed a three-pointer, his first field goal of the second half, to increase the GSU lead to 72-64 with 2:22 left.

The Jaguars had one more run. Trailing 74-67 after an Atkins bucket at 1:30, Xavier Robinson hit back-to-back three-pointers, and suddenly, GSU's lead was just 74-73 with 35 seconds to go. Hunter was fouled with 16 seconds left and made one of two free throws. South Alabama advanced the ball over half court and called timeout, but the Jaguars failed to get off a good shot in the final seconds.

Cameron Solomon joined Atkins and Hunter in double figures with 10 points off the bench for GSU, while White finished with nine.

Georgia State shot 50 percent for the game, including 11-for-18 from three-point range, but the Panthers were out-rebounded 36-26.

EAST CAROLINA 62, GEORGIA STATE 53

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Maurice Kemp scored 16 points and grabbed 11 rebounds as undefeated East Carolina downed Georgia State, 62-53, Monday at the GSU Sports Arena, snapping the Panthers' three-game winning streak.

The Pirates moved to 5-0 on the season, while Georgia State evened its record at 3-3.

Manny Atkins led Georgia State with 15 points and eight rebounds, and Devonta White added 13 points.

Both teams shot below 40 percent from the field, but ECU outrebounded the Panthers, 47-26. The Pirates grabbed 18 offensive rebounds.

"I tip my cap to Coach Lebo and East Carolina," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the game. "My team is young and tonight we got beat by a well-coached, experienced team. Experience is the one thing you can not recruit or coach and tonight, our inexperience showed.

"East Carolina used their experience to hit the boards hard tonight and they used it to their advantage. They outrebounded us in a big way and never allowed us to get into a rhythm."

East Carolina led from the opening tip, scoring the first eight points en route to a 31-20 halftime advantage. The closest the Panthers could come in the second half was seven points, pulling within 38-31 on a bucket by Atkins with 13 minutes to play.

Georgia State was within eight at 46-38 with eight minutes left, before Robert Sampson nailed a three-pointer to begin an 8-1 run that pushed the Pirates lead to 54-39.

Sampson, an Atlanta native and the son of former NBA player Ralph Sampson, contributed a double-double for ECU with 12 points and 16 rebounds.

True freshman T.J. Shipes saw his first significant action for the Panthers and contributed six points in 16 minutes.

Shamar Bowden added 10 points off the bench for the Pirates.

Raheem Appleby scored 34 points as Louisiana Tech defeated Georgia State, 86-68, Friday at the GSU Sports Arena.

R.J. Hunter scored 23 points and Manny Atkins and Devonta White added 13 each to lead Georgia State, which dropped to 3-4 on the season. Louisiana Tech won its seventh straight game to improve to 7-1.

The Panthers played before a season-high crowd of 2,105 at the Sports Arena but could not find their shooting touch, managing to hit just 35 percent from the field. Meanwhile Louisiana Tech connected on 54 percent, including 14-for-19 by Appleby, who achieved his career high. The Bulldogs also held the rebounding advantage at 45-36.

"We just got beat by a very good Louisiana Tech team tonight," commented head coach Ron Hunter. "Our young team is not ready to play against experienced teams like that."

"The total record of the teams we have lost to this year is 22-2. I wanted to test our guys early this season and we have definitely done that. The good thing is that we are learning from these games and will continue to get better.

Hunter finished the game 9-of-19 from the floor, pulling down seven rebounds and tying a career-high with four steals. Atkins just missed a double-double for the Panthers, pulling down nine rebounds in a team-high 33 minutes of action, while White added four steals.

Georgia State took an early 14-7 lead before the Bulldogs used a 7-1 run to move ahead 21-15 and then never trailed again. Louisiana Tech led 44-30 at the half.

The Bulldogs pushed the lead to as many as 28 points with 14:57 remaining in the game, but Georgia State never gave up, cutting it to the 18-point final.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score seven points in six minutes for Georgia State, while junior Rashaad Richardson chipped in six with a pair of three-pointers.

Also in double figures for the Bulldogs were Kenneth Smith with 15 points and Cordarius Johnson with 14. Georgia State finished with a season-high 14 steals and forced 19 Bulldog turnovers.

It wasn't a half-court shot this time, but junior Rashaad Richardson's three-pointer with less than three seconds left gave Georgia State a 67-66 win at Liberty in the Vines Center on Sunday afternoon. The win gave Panther head coach Ron Hunter the 300th of his career.

Richardson, who hit a half-court buzzer beater just 10 days ago to lift the Panthers over Tennessee State, came off a screen near the top of the arc, hitting his second three of the day.

Hunter, in his second year at the helm of the Panthers, won the 300th game in just his 535 contests.

Georgia State snapped a two-game losing streak and improved to 4-4 with the win, while Liberty fell to 0-8 on the season.

Juniors Manny Atkins and Devonta White each scored 17 points to lead Georgia State, while Davon Marshall led Liberty with 25 points.

After trailing 37-29 at the half, Georgia State opened the second half on a 9-0 run, capped by a Richardson three-pointer to give the Panthers a 38-37 lead with 16:42 remaining in the game. However, it was the final three that had everyone talking after the game.

Liberty opened the game red-hot in the first half from beyond the arc, hitting 8-of-13 to build its eight-point lead at the half. The Flames finished the game 12-of-24 from three-point range, only slightly cooling off in the second half.

The two teams traded leads seven times, including five times as the game was not decided until the final possession.

Davon Marshall's three-pointer with 49 seconds remaining gave the Flames a 63-58 lead before GSU finished the game on a 9-3 run.

Following a tip-in and free throw by senior James Vincent cut the deficit to two, Marshall hit another pair of free throws to give Liberty a four-point lead.

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who finished with 12 points and seven rebounds, followed with a dunk with free throw with 18 seconds to play to cut the deficit to one.

Liberty's Casey Roberts made the first of two free throws before the Panthers drove to half-court as Hunter called a timeout setting up the final play.

Richardson finished the game 3-of-6 from the floor, including a pair of three's for 10 points as four Panthers finished in double-figures.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon once again provided a spark off the bench, scoring eight points on 4-of-6 shooting in 21 minutes.

R.J. Hunter scored 21 points and Devonta White and Manny Atkins added 16 each as Georgia State defeated Southern Poly, 86-58, Saturday afternoon at the GSU Sports Arena.

The trio of Hunter, White and Atkins also combined for 13 rebounds, 11 assists and seven steals. The GSU bench also made strong contributions as Rashaad Richardson scored 15 points, and James Vincent collected seven points, a career-high 12 rebounds, three blocked shots and three assists.

The Panthers improved to 5-4 on the season. For Southern Poly (5-5), an NAIA program, the game counted as an exhibition.

Southern Poly stayed close in the first half by hitting nine three-pointers, five of them by Chase Robinson, who scored 19 first-half points. Robinson finished with 27 points.

The Hornets took a one point lead on Devon Butler's three-pointer with 18 seconds left in the first half, but R.J. Hunter answered for GSU with trey to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 37-35 lead.

Southern Poly scored first to open the second half, tying the game at 37-37. After the teams traded three-pointers, a jumper by Hunter gave Georgia State the lead for good at 42-40.

Hunter's bucket ignited a 13-0 run for the Panthers. White hit a short jumper in the lane, then stole the ball in the back-court and converted a layup for a 46-40 lead. Hunter drained another trey, and then White passed behind his back to feed Vincent for a dunk. After GSU forced a turnover, Vincent made another layup to put the Panthers ahead, 53-40, with 14:36 to play.

Georgia State shot 51.6 percent from the field, including 56 percent in the second half, in which the Panthers outscored Southern Poly, 49-23. GSU held a 44-29 advantage on the boards.

Southern Poly shot just 34.5 percent but made 12 three-pointers to stay within 10 points until the final 10 minutes of the game.

R.J. Hunter finished 7-of-12 from the floor, including 4-of-8 from three-point range, while Atkins was 6-of-11 from the floor. White also finished 6-of-11, including 3-of-6 from three-point range.

Georgia State overcame a 14-point halftime deficit to lead late before falling to Troy, 57-56, on a free throw with 33.9 seconds left Saturday night at the Trojan Arena.

The Panthers (5-5) took a 56-51 lead on Devonta White's layup with 1:47 left. Troy answered with a three-point play by Antoine Myers with 1:16 to play to pull within two. The Trojans then came up with a steal in the backcourt, and Hunter Williams fed Myers for the tying layup with 1:05 left.

With the score tied at 56-56, GSU missed twice from close range before center James Vincent was whistled for a foul on the rebound, and Ray Chambers made one of two free throws to put Troy ahead, 57-56 with 33.9 seconds left.

After a miss by GSU and then a missed free throw by Troy, the Panthers had one final chance when Vincent was fouled with less than a second on the clock, but he could not convert from the free throw line.

"This has kind of been the story all year," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the loss. "We come out slow and then fight back, but tonight it was too little too late.

"We were just 15-of-23 from the free throw line and that is not good enough to win. We have not shot well from the line all season and tonight it proved costly."

After falling behind 30-16 at the half, GSU still trailed by nine at 42-33 with less than 13 minutes to play. The Panthers reeled off nine straight points to tie the game at 42-42 on a three-pointer by R.J. Hunter. The score was still tied at 46-46 with less than seven minutes left when a bucket by White gave the Panthers their first lead since Atkins scored the first bucket of the game.

White led GSU with 13 points, 11 of them in the second half. Atkins added 12 points and nine rebounds, and Vincent contributed 10 points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots, moving into sixth place in GSU history with 87 career blocks.

Chambers paced Troy with 18 points on 8-for-11 shooting and seven rebounds. The Trojans snapped a five-game losing streak to improve to 5-7.

Georgia State fell behind with a frigid first half in which the Panthers managed to shoot just 5-for-21 (24 percent) in the first half. GSU had more turnovers (9) than field goals in the opening half and trailed by as many as 16 points before taking a 14-point deficit into the locker room.

Redshirt-sophomore Cameron Solomon came off the bench to score nine points in 16 minutes of action.

Georgia State fell to Southern Miss, 69-67, Tuesday at the GSU Sports Arena. R.J. Hunter scored 24 points for the Panthers, but Jerrold Brooks answered with a career-high 23 for the Golden Eagles, including the go-ahead three-pointer with 2:03 left in the game.

Georgia State dropped its second in a row to fall to 5-6 on the season, while Southern Miss improved to 8-3.

After a GSU miss and a Southern Miss turnover, the Panthers inbounded the ball with 24 seconds left. Manny Atkins' three-point attempt from the corner bounced around the rim but fell off, and Markus Crider tipped it in with 6.8 seconds left.

Brooks made one of two free throws, so GSU had one final chance, down 69-67 with five seconds left, but Crider's three-point attempt from the top of the circle was off the mark.

Hunter scored 20 of his points in the first half as he went 6-for-8 from three-point range. He hit three straight to open the game, and then his fifth try of the half put the Panthers ahead, 29-27, with 2:24 to play. He nailed one more with 22 seconds left to help send Georgia State into the locker room with a 34-31 halftime lead.

The Panthers led by as many as 11 points in the second half, moving ahead 52-41 on a layup by James Vincent with 12 minutes to go.

Hunter finished 8-for-16 from the field with six three-pointers, but Brooks was just as good for Southern Miss, hitting 5-of-7 from beyond the arc and 7-for-10 overall.

White and Atkins also reached double figures for GSU, scoring 13 points each.

Dwayne Davis added 12 points and five rebounds for the Golden Eagles.

As a team, Georgia State connected on 10-of-24 from three-point range but just 15-of-22 free throws. GSU shot 44.7 percent from the field while allowing Southern Miss to hit 50 percent of its shots.

Georgia State suffered its third straight close loss, falling 65-60 at Rhode Island Saturday afternoon at the Ryan Center in Kingston, R.I., despite 23 points by freshman R.J. Hunter.

The Panthers have dropped three straight games by a total of eight points to fall to 5-7 on the season. Rhode Island improved to 4-7 and has won three of four.

Rhode Island's Xavier Munford scored all 17 of his points in the second half, including 12 straight in a key run that put Rhode Island ahead for good.

With the score tied at 42-all and just under nine minutes to play, Munford scored 12 consecutive points for the Rams, including three straight three-pointers—one of them a four-point play—to put URI ahead 54-44 with six minutes left.

Georgia State fought back, pulling within 59-57 on a layup by Rashaad Richardson with 2:22 left, but the Rams answered with a bucket by Mike Powell to move ahead by four. URI added a free throw with 1:47 left, but after a three-point play by Manny Atkins, GSU trailed 62-60 with 1:27 to play.

After a miss by the Rams, the Panthers had a possession to tie or take the lead, but Devonta White's driving layup was blocked with 28 seconds left. But Munford made only one of two free throws giving GSU one final chance to tie, but Atkins' three-point try was off the mark with 12 seconds left.

"We just have to learn how to finish games," said GSU head coach Ron Hunter. "We played hard, but our margin of error is thin. We didn't lose the game because we played badly; we just have to make a few more plays at the end.

"These are the growing pains of building a program," Hunter continued. "Our fortunes will turn."

The Panthers got off to a slow start, missing their first seven shots from the field to fall behind 10-1. GSU trailed 22-12 with six minutes to play in the half, but a three-pointer by White and a pair of free throws by Hunter in the final minute sent GSU into the locker room with a 27-24 deficit. Hunter scored 12 of the Panthers' 24 points in the first half.

Georgia State stayed close for the first 10 minutes of the second half before final tying the game on Richardson's three-pointer with 10:40 left, but the Panthers never led in the game.

Hunter, who also had six rebounds, topped the 20-point mark for the second straight game and the fifth time this season. Atkins contributed 14 points, nine rebounds and three steals for GSU, and White added 14 points.

Georgia State managed to shoot just 39.6 percent from the field, including 4-for-17 from beyond the arc. Rhode Island was only slightly better at 44.7 percent, but the Rams made eight three-pointers. Nicola Malesevich led URI with 22 points

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 68, GEORGIA STATE 64 OT

Georgia Southern rallied from 10 points down in the final two minutes to force overtime and then pulled away in the extra session for a 68-64 victory over Georgia State Saturday afternoon at Hanner Fieldhouse.

Georgia State raced to a big lead in the first half but dropped its fourth straight game in close fashion to fall to 5-8 on the season. The four losses have been by a total of 12 points. Georgia Southern improved to 6-7.

Georgia Southern's Eric Ferguson tied the game with a three-point with 20 seconds left in regulation to cap the Eagles' late rally. The Panthers had two final shots, but Manny Atkins' layup under the basket was swatted away with 7.5 seconds left, and Devonta White's three-point try at the buzzer was no good.

C.J. Reed's three-pointer with 2:15 to play in the overtime game gave Georgia Southern its first lead of the game at 60-57. White answered with a pair of free throws for Georgia State, but Ferguson, who finished with a game-high 24 points, nailed another three to put Georgia Southern ahead 63-59, and the Eagles held on for the win.

Four Panthers scored in double figures, led by White and R.J. Hunter with 14 points each, and Manny Atkins and James Vincent with 11 apiece. But Hunter fouled out in the final three minutes of regulation, Rashaad Richardson fouled in the overtime, and Vincent spent much of the second half on the bench after picking up his fourth foul shortly after the intermission.

Georgia State raced to a 17-point lead in the first half and still led 55-45 with under two minutes to play, but the Panthers committed four turnovers and missed two free throws, including the front end of a one-and-one.

A layup by Georgia Southern's Brian Holmes with 1:47 left made the score 55-47, White missed the front end of a one-one, and then Ferguson threw up a wild shot from the lane as he was fouled, and the ball dropped in. He also made the free throw to pull the Eagles within 55-50 with 1:21 still to play.

With Georgia State trying to run down the clock on offense, Atkins was whistled for a five-second violation with 58 seconds to go. Ferguson made a pair of free throws, and Georgia Southern trailed just 55-52 with 47 seconds left.

Clinging to a three-point lead, the Panthers turned the ball over on the inbounds play, giving possession back to the Eagles. Georgia Southern then gave the ball right back to the Panthers on a travelling call. Georgia State managed to inbound the ball, but White got trapped in the backcourt and the Panthers did not have a timeout left, setting up Ferguson's tying try.

DREXEL 77, GEORGIA STATE 60

Frantz Massanat scored 25 points as Drexel defeated Georgia State, 77-60, Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena in the Colonial Athletic Association opener for both teams.

Freshman R.J. Hunter scored 23 points for Georgia State, which trailed by just four points at halftime, but Drexel (5-8, 1-0 CAA), the preseason favorite in the CAA, dominated the second half to hand GSU (5-9, 0-1 CAA) its fifth straight loss.

The win was Drexel's 17th straight CAA regular-season victory, dating back to last season. Georgia State was the last team to hand Drexel a regular-season loss in CAA play; exactly one year ago, GSU defeated the Dragons, 58-44, at the Sports Arena. Drexel's streak equals Richmond (1988-89) for the second-longest in league history and is one shy of George Mason's record of 18 in a row over the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Hunter topped the 20-point mark for the third time in the last four games and the sixth time in his rookie season at Georgia State. A leading candidate for CAA Rookie of the Year, Hunter has already earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors three times this season. He finished the game 9-of-16 from the floor and pulled six rebounds.

"Drexel showed tonight why they were picked first in the CAA during the preseason," commented head coach Ron Hunter. "After a good first half, they played really well in the second half and we just did not have any answers."

"We will keep grinding and we will get better. For us to get where we want to though, we need a full team effort. We have to have guys step up and when they do, we will be a special team."

Sophomore transfer Cameron Solomon added a career-high 12 points for the Panthers, but Devonta White was the only other Panther in double figures with 11 points.

A tip-in just ahead of the first-half buzzer by Dartay Ruffin gave Drexel a 37-33 lead at the intermission. After Georgia State scored the first bucket of the second half, the Dragons went on a 22-4 run to open a 59-39 lead with 11 minutes to play.

Drexel shot 65 percent from the field in the second half, led by Massanat, the preseason CAA Player of the Year, who scored 17 points of his career-high 25 points after the intermission. Damion Lee added 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range, and Darryl McCoy pulled down 14 rebounds for the Dragons.

GEORGIA STATE 68, JAMES MADISON 52
GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

R.J. Hunter scored 19 points and Manny Atkins added 15 as Georgia State earned its first Colonial Athletic Association win with a 68-52 victory over James Madison Saturday at the GSU Sports Arena.

James Vincent contributed 10 points and eight blocked shots, one off his career high, to help the Panthers (6-9, 1-1 CAA) snap their five-game losing streak and halt JMU's (7-7, 1-1 CAA) four-game winning streak.

Georgia State also got strong contributions from freshman David Travers, who had seven points and three assists in 21 minutes, his most significant playing time of his rookie season. After hitting a free throw for his first collegiate point, he nailed a pair of dramatic three-point field goals, one at the first half buzzer and another in the second half with the shot clock about to expire.

Junior Devonta White added 11 points and dished out a career-high seven assists in 36 minutes of action.

The Panthers turned in one of their better defensive efforts of the season in holding James Madison to 52 points and 30.9 percent shooting from the field, the lowest figure for a GSU opponent since Monmouth managed just 27.8 percent shooting in the third game of the season.

On the offensive end, Georgia State shot 47 percent from field, including 10-for-21 from three-point range.

With his eight blocked shots, Vincent raised his career total to 104 and moved into fifth place in school history. The senior from Columbus, Ga., leads the CAA in blocked shots.

Georgia State closed the first half with a 13-4 run to open up a 38-25 halftime lead. Hunter made a pair of treys on the run, and Travers ended the half with a three-pointer at the buzzer, falling to the ground as he made his first collegiate field goal.

The Panthers shot 53.8 percent from the field in the first half, including 8-for-13 from beyond the arc, while holding the Dukes to less than 30 percent (8-for-27). That marked GSU's highest output in a first half since scoring 43 against South Alabama on Nov. 21. Hunter (13 points) and Atkins (12) combined for 25 of the Panthers' 38 points.

In the second half, James Madison managed to pull within nine points at 53-44 with nine minutes to play, but Atkins contributed a three-point play to push GSU's lead to 56-44 and then took a charge on the other end. From there, the Panthers' lead never dipped below double-digits.

Rayshawn Goins led James Madison with 19 points and 16 rebounds. A.J. Davis came off the bench to score 10 points and grab eight rebounds for the Dukes.

Georgia State overcame a 12-point second half deficit, but Stevie Mejia's lay-up with six seconds remaining gave Hofstra a 52-50 win on Monday night at the Mack Sports Complex.

Senior James Vincent's put-back with less than 20 seconds tied the game, but after Mejia's shot, junior Devonta White's three-pointer as time expired was just off the mark.

Mejia finished with 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, pulling down five rebounds for Hofstra.

With the loss, Georgia State fell to 6-10, 1-2 in the CAA. Hofstra snapped an eight-game losing streak improved to 4-10, 1-0 in the conference.

Freshman R.J. Hunter, who earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors for the fourth time this season earlier in the day, led the Panthers with 13 points, but managed to shoot just 4-of-15 from the floor and 1-of-8 from three-point range.

"I am obviously disappointed with the loss," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the game. "I thought we came out strong, but then allowed Hofstra to take control of the game."

"I was proud of the way we fought back in the second half, but we cannot allow ourselves to get down by double-digits and expect to win."

White finished with 11 points and redshirt-junior Manny Atkins added 10 points for the Panthers who shot 36.0 percent from the floor and just 2-of-20 from three-point range. GSU did hit 85.7 percent from the free throw line and outrebounded the Pride, 32-27.

Trailing 37-25 with 15:36 to play, Georgia State used an 8-0 run over a three-minute stretch to cut the deficit to four on a three-pointer by Hunter.

The Panthers cut it to one, 39-38 with 9:03 to play, holding the Pride without a field goal for nearly six minutes.

Georgia State continued to keep it close in the final few minutes and with junior Denny Burguillos two free throws with 3:46 to play, tied the game at 46. Hofstra responded with four straight points before White cut the deficit to two again.

Georgia State opened the game on an 8-2 run, but Hofstra quickly responded with an 8-0 run of its own to take an early 10-9 lead.

After the Panthers responded and took a 17-12 lead, the Pride held GSU without a field goal for nine minutes, taking a 27-19 lead with just under two minutes to play in the first half. Taran Buie added 12 points for Hofstra, while Stephen Nwaukoni came off the bench to score seven points and pull down eight rebounds in 25 minutes.

The Pride shot 45.7 percent from the floor and hit 6-of-18 from three-point range.

But Saddler, the CAA's leading scorer who finished with 29 points on the day, brought the ball across half court and nailed the trey from the right elbow.

Manny Atkins led Georgia State with 20 points, and Devonta White score 18 points, including six in the last 80 seconds to fuel the Panthers' comeback. White also contributed six assists and five rebounds.

R.J. Hunter had 15 points and eight rebounds for the Panthers, but the freshman sat out the final four minutes with a foot injury. Rashaad Richardson was the fourth Panther in double figures with 13 points.

Georgia State fell behind 81-70 after a pair of free throws by Jarvis Threatt with 1:41 left. Cameron Solomon made two free throws for GSU, and then after an offensive foul by Delaware, White's layup pulled the Panthers within 81-74 with 1:20 still to play.

After Saddler made one of two free throws, White was fouled and made both to cut the deficit to 82-76 at the 1:07 mark. Saddler again made one of two from the line, and sophomore Kevin Shaw came off the bench to nail a three-pointer for his first points of the season. That made the score 83-79 with 54 seconds on the clock.

The Panthers quickly fouled Kyle Anderson in the backcourt, and he missed both free throws. White drew another foul, and his foul shots brought the Panthers within two to 83-81 with 41 seconds left.

Delaware ran down the shot clock before Threatt missed a jumper with nine seconds left. Green grabbed the rebound and was fouled with six seconds left. Even though he had been to the line just twice in his career, he calmly sank both free throws to knot the score at 83-all.

Delaware hit 52 percent from the field, and the top free throw shooting team in the conference was able to cash in today, going to the line 37 times and making 26. Threatt was 10-for-12 at the charity stripe to score 18 points. Jamelle Hagins added 11 points, and the nation's second-leading rebounder grabbed seven today to tie the Delaware career record of 916.

GEORGIA STATE 74, WILLIAM & MARY 58

In head coach Ron Hunter's annual "Barefoot for Bare Feet" game, Georgia State overcame a 14-point deficit to earn a 74-58 Colonial Athletic Association victory over William & Mary Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena.

For the sixth straight season and second time at Georgia State, Hunter coached a game in his bare feet in support of Samaritan's Feet, an organization that distributes shoes to children in need around the world. A season-high crowd of 2,350 turned out for the game.

Manny Atkins scored 21 points and grabbed five steals for Georgia State, which improved to 7-11 overall, 2-3 in the CAA while handing William & Mary (7-9, 1-4 CAA) its sixth straight loss.

Georgia State fell behind 32-18 with three minutes left in the first half before closing with a 10-1 run as Kevin Shaw's three-pointer just ahead of the halftime buzzer brought the Panthers within 33-28 at the intermission.

The Panthers still trailed 43-40 five minutes into the second half, but Georgia State outscored the Tribe 22-5 over the next 12 minutes to build a 62-49 lead with three minutes to play.

Rashaad Richardson's jumper put the Panthers ahead for good at 44-43 with 14:36. After GSU forced a turnover, Markus Crider made a driving layup, and then Richardson added a layup off for a 48-43 lead.

Leading 50-47, Georgia State scored 10 straight points as David Travers nailed a three-pointer, Crider grabbed a steal in the backcourt and fed Atkins for a layup, and Richardson drained a three. James Vincent punctuated the spurt with a dunk off an assist from Devonta White, and the Panthers led 60-47 with less than five minutes left.

In addition to Atkins' 21 points, Richardson scored 12 for the Panthers and White added 11.

The Panthers also got strong contributions from the bench as Travers scored a career-high eight points, Crider contributed six points and a career-best eight rebounds, and Ryann Green had two points and four rebounds.

After a sluggish first half, Georgia State shot 52 percent from the field and a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line in the second half while committing just one turnover after the intermission.

For the game, the Panthers were 23-for-25 at the charity stripe and have made 43-of-48 over the last two games.

Tim Rusthoven led William & Mary with 20 points and 10 rebounds, but the Tribe made just nine field goals on 29 attempts (31 percent) in the second half.

GEORGIA STATE 69, OLD DOMINION 54

Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins scored 21 points and freshman R.J. Hunter finished with 20 to lead Georgia State to a 69-54 win at the Ted Constant Center on Saturday night.

Atkins has scored 20 or more points in three straight games, while Hunter scored 20 or more for the seventh time this season.

With legendary former head coach Charles "Lefty" Driesell in the building, the Panthers won for the first time at the Ted Constant Center and for just the second time at Old Dominion dating back to the 1977-78 season.

Devonta White added 15 points and tied a career-high with seven assists for Georgia State (8-11, 3-3 CAA). Senior James Vincent tied a career-high with 12 rebounds and blocked four shots, while also collecting three steals.

With his four blocked shots, Vincent tied Torquin Gresham for fourth most in GSU history. In his two career games in Norfolk, Vincent set career-highs in blocks both times, collecting 11 two years ago.

The loss dropped Old Dominion to 2-16, 0-6 in the CAA.

R.J. Hunter's three-pointer at the half gave Georgia State a four-point lead, 29-25, going into the locker room as the Monarchs never led.

Hunter shot 6-of-12 from the floor and made 6-of-7 from the free throw line, grabbing four rebounds and two of the Panthers six steals. The Panthers forced the Monarchs into 17 turnovers.

After building a nine-point lead at 42-33 with 16:44 to play, the Monarchs trailed just 57-51 with 5:11 to play. The Panthers finished the game on a 12-3 run.

Atkins finished the game 6-of-12 from the floor and 4-of-6 from three-point range. The redshirt-junior entered the day leading the CAA in three-point shooting, hitting 40.3 from beyond the arc.

Georgia State held the Monarchs nearly 11 minutes in the first half with just one field goal, however, ODU shot 18 free throws in the opening period, as compared to just eight for the Panthers. The trend reversed in the second half as GSU went to the line 14 times, making 12, and ODU shot just five.

Vincent played in his 105th game on Saturday, moving into a tie for 11th with Terrence Brandon, Travis Williams and Chavelo Holmes.

Atkins made the Panthers first two free throws of the game, extending the Panthers streak to 18 straight made shots dating back to last Wednesday's game against William & Mary before a miss by White in the middle of the first half.

Dimitri Batten led Old Dominion with 14 points off the bench, while Donte Hill scored 13 and pulled down seven rebounds.

Freshman R.J. Hunter's three-pointer with one-minute to play and blocked shot with less than two seconds left led Georgia State to a 71-69 win over Towson on Monday night at the Towson Center Arena.

Hunter finished with a career-high 27 points on 9-of-19 shooting, hitting four three-pointers and going a perfect 5-of-5 from the line.

In a tightly contested game that saw 14 ties and nine lead changes, neither team ever led by more than six points.

Towson (10-10, 5-2 CAA), one of the best rebounding teams in the country, was outrebounded by Georgia State (9-11, 4-3 CAA).

Devonta White added 14 points, six assists and five rebounds for the Panthers. Junior Rashaad Richardson chipping in with 11, including a trio of three-pointers, while pulling down five boards.

Georgia State extended its winning streak to three games and is now 4-4 in games decided by one possession or less.

Up by one with 1:02 remaining and the shot clock winding down, Hunter drained a three-pointer from the top of the key and from NBA-range to give the Panthers a four-point lead.

After a three-point miss by Towson's Jerome Hairston with 53 seconds left, Marcus Damas got an offensive rebound for the Tigers and Hairston followed with a jumper in the lane with 46 seconds remaining to cut the lead to two.

Hunter missed a three-pointer with 18 seconds remaining, but with Towson out of timeouts, the Tigers had to come down the court and Damas' three-pointer with less than two seconds left was blocked by Hunter as Markus Crider pulled down the rebound for GSU, securing the victory.

The Panthers biggest lead of the game was six following a pair of three-pointers by Atkins and Hunter, giving GSU a 24-18 lead with 5:28 to play in the first half. Georgia State went into the locker room leading 33-31 after Hunter hit three free throws with 1.9 seconds remaining in the half.

Towson opened the second half with two quick three's to take a 37-33 lead, their biggest lead with 18:01 to play, before Atkins responded with a three to start a 7-0 run as the Panthers went ahead 40-37 with 15:55 to play.

Atkins finished the game with nine points and six rebounds after being named CAA co-Player of the Week earlier in the day. Jerrelle Benimon led Towson with 18 points and 10 rebounds, while Hairston chipped in with 16 and Mike Burwell added 14.

Manny Atkins and R.J. Hunter scored 19 points each and Devonta White added 17 as Georgia State won its fourth straight game with an 81-63 victory over UNCW Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena.

By winning their fourth game in eight days, the Panthers improved to 10-11 overall, 5-3 in the Colonial Athletic Association.

UNCW's Keith Rendleman tied his season high with 23 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for his third straight double-double, but the Seahawks fell to 7-11, 2-4 CAA.

Georgia State shot 51 percent from the field, and the Panthers forced 17 turnovers, which they converted into 30 points.

Senior James Vincent added a pair of blocked shots to move into third place on GSU's all-time blocked shots list.

Freshman David Travers came off the bench to score five points, making a pair of baskets and a free throw in 16 minutes of action, while Rashaad Richardson chipped in with eight points on 3-of-4 shooting.

The win gave the Panthers five straight over the visiting Seahawks.

Georgia State outscored UNCW 30-7 off turnovers, forcing the Seahawks to give the ball up 17 times on 13 GSU steals, just one short of a season high.

Chris Dixon added 20 points for UNCW which fell to 0-10 on the road this season.

Georgia State overcame an 11-point first half deficit and freshman R.J. Hunter tied a career-high with 27 points as the Panthers earned a 78-73 victory over first place Northeastern at Matthews Arena on Wednesday night.

Georgia State (11-12, 6-4 CAA) won for the fifth time in six games, while Northeastern (13-8, 8-1 CAA) had its eight-game winning streak snapped as the Huskies dropped their first game in conference play.

Hunter, who helped cut the deficit in the first half with 12-straight Panther points, tied his career-high set just over a week ago, hitting 10-of-18 from the floor, including 5-of-11 from three-point range. His biggest play might have been on defense, blocking Jonathan Lee's jumper with under 20 seconds to play that would have tied game.

The two top three-point shooting teams in the CAA combined to make 22 three-pointers. The Panthers hit 42.3 percent compared to 47.8 percent for Northeastern. However, after the Huskies made 8-of-11 in the first half, went just 3-of-12 in the second half.

Rashaad Richardson and Devonta White each added 13 for the Panthers, while redshirt-junior Manny Atkins chipped in 12 points, six rebounds and five assists.

The Panthers trailed 52-42 early in the second half before responding with a 12-0 run, holding Northeastern without a point for more than six minutes to take a two-point lead with 13:55 to play.

The Huskies drought continued without making a field goal for more than 11 minutes as Georgia State built its lead to 66-54 with 7:47 to play.

Northeastern responded and had a chance to tie it down three with 1:31 to play, but Joel Smith made just one of three free throws to cut the deficit to two, 72-70.

After White made a pair of free throws for the Panthers, Lee hit a three with 10.9 seconds to play as GSU led 74-73.

White made two more free throws with 10.4 seconds to play to put GSU back up three. Lee came down the court and missed a three with five seconds to play and GSU came up with the rebound before Richardson made two free throws with 0.2 seconds to play.

Hunter kept the Panthers in the game late in the first half, scoring 12 straight Panther points. The reigning CAA co-Rookie of the Week scored 20 or more points for the ninth time this season.

Georgia State trailed the entire first half as Northeastern shot 64.3 percent from the floor and made 8-of-11 from three-point range to take a seven-point half-time lead.

Atkins extended his made free throw streak to 17 making a pair in the first half.

James Vincent, who scored four points and grabbed seven rebounds, played in his 109th career game to move into the top 10 in school history and is now tied with Rodney Hamilton.

GEORGIA STATE 83, OLD DOMINION 63

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Freshman R.J. Hunter poured in a career-high 38 points, including a school and CAA record 10 three-pointers, as Georgia State dismantled Old Dominion, 83-63, Saturday at the Sports Arena.

The Panthers won for the sixth time in their last seven games and handed Old Dominion (2-19, 0-9 CAA) their ninth straight loss to improve to 12-12, 7-4 in the CAA.

Hunter, one of the top freshman scorers in the nation, hit 10-of-15 shots from beyond the arc and 12-of-18 overall. His 38-point effort is the high for any CAA player this season and the most by a Georgia State player since Anton Reese scored 38 against Kansas State on Nov. 28, 1998. Only six Panthers have ever scored more points in a game.

At one-point in the second half, Hunter scored 19-straight Panther points with five three-pointers, two free throws and a dunk.

The 10 treys by Hunter equalled the CAA record originally set by Dre Smith of George Mason, who hit 10 against James Madison on Jan. 19, 2008.

As a team, Georgia State nailed 16 three-pointers, the second-most in any game in school history. The GSU record is 21 versus West Florida on Dec. 12, 2003, and the Panthers had not hit as many as 16 since 2005.

Manny Atkins added 16 points and nine rebounds for the Panthers, including four treys, while Devonta White had 10 points and eight assists. Rashaad Richardson chipped in with eight points and five steals. Hunter also contributed five rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.

Atkins missed a double-double by just one rebound for the fourth time this season. He has made 19 straight free throws, just four shy of the school record.

GSU shot a season-high 53.8 percent from the field.

Georgia State jumped out quickly, opening the game with four straight three-pointers to take an early 12-1 lead. ODU fought back and led briefly at 24-22 with six minutes left before the Panthers ended the half with a 33-28 advantage.

Behind treys by Hunter (two), Atkins and Richardson, the Panthers opened the second half with a 16-7 run to build a 49-35 lead at the first media timeout. From there, the Panthers led never dipped below 12 points and climbed to as many as 23.

Richardson finished with five of the Panthers 10 steals, a career-high for the junior.

DeShawn Painter led Old Dominion with 15 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. The Monarchs out rebounded Georgia State, 43-31, including 21-5 on the offensive glass, but shot just 32.3 percent from the field.

James Vincent played in his 110th career game to move into tenth on GSU's all-time games played list by himself.

Georgia State nearly overcame a 14-point second half deficit before falling to UNCW 76-72 on Wednesday night at Trask Coliseum. Freshman R.J. Hunter scored 26 points, his third straight game scoring 25 or more points.

Georgia State (12-13, 7-5 CAA) had its two-game winning streak snapped, while UNCW (9-14, 4-7 CAA) snapped its three game losing streak with the victory.

The Seahawks shot 52.9 percent from the floor and 9-of-18 from three-point range for the game, after shooting 61.5 percent in the first half.

After earning CAA Player and Rookie of the Week honors on Monday, Hunter finished the first half with 20 points, going 7-of-11 from the floor and hitting all five three-point attempts. He finished the game going 9-of-16 from the floor and 6-of-7 from three-point range.

Rendleman scored 15 points and pulled down 10 rebounds for his 13th double-double of the season. He finished 5-of-8 from the floor and 5-of-7 from the free throw line.

Junior Devonta White led the Panthers second half charge, scoring 16 of his 19 points after halftime. Redshirt-junior Manny Atkins added 12 points for GSU, while senior James Vincent chipped in with eight points and seven rebounds.

Vincent played in his 111th career game to move into a tie for ninth place on GSU's all-time list with Herman Favors.

Trailing by 10, 68-58, with 6:19 to play, Georgia State responded with an 8-0 run to cut the deficit to two, 68-66, with 3:48 to play.

After a pair of Seahawk baskets pushed the lead by to six with 2:22 to play, Hunter responded with a put-back off a White miss to cut the lead to four with 1:26 remaining. After a defensive stop, Atkins hit a pair of free throws, cutting the lead to 72-70 with 34 seconds remaining.

Craig Ponder, who finished with a team-high 17 points, made two free throws with 20.4 seconds remaining, giving UNCW a 74-70 lead.

Georgia State had one last chance as a foul by Chris Dixon sent White to the free throw line with 16.9 seconds remaining. After hitting both to cut it to 74-72, White fouled Cedrick Williams who made both shots which would seal the victory.

Atkins streak of 19 straight made free throws came to an end in the first half. The streak was just four shy of the school-record of 23 held by Nate Williams.

Hunter scored 13 straight GSU points at one point in the first half, the third straight game that he had a double-digit streak for the Panthers.

Williams finished with 14 points and six rebounds off the bench for UNCW, while Freddie Jackson finished with 10 points.

Georgia State shot 47.3 percent for the game and hit 9-of-17 three-pointers, but managed to make just 11-of-17 from the free throw line.

Georgia State's Devonta White hit a pair of free throws with 0.6 seconds left in regulation, but the Panthers fell in overtime, 90-82, to Towson Saturday at the GSU Sports Arena.

Manny Atkins tied his career high with 26 points and White scored a season-high 22, but the Panthers dropped their second straight to fall to 12-14, 7-6 in the CAA.

Rafriel Guthrie scored a career-high 23 points for Towson, which improved to 14-12, 9-4 in the CAA.

The Panthers held Jerrelle Benimon, who entered the game averaging 17.2 points, to just seven points, but five other Tigers scored in double figures. In addition to Guthrie, freshman Jerome Hairston had 17 points, Marcus Damas and Bilal Dixon scored 14 each and Mike Burwell added 12, including a three-pointer that put Towson ahead, 82-77, in overtime.

Georgia State trailed 75-70 with a minute to play in regulation when Atkins hit a three-pointer to pull the Panthers within two with 54 seconds left.

After Benimon made one of two free throws for a three-point lead for Towson, Atkins hit a pair from the charity stripe with 6.7 seconds left, and GSU trailed 76-75.

Burwell was fouled immediately on the inbounds play. He made the first but missed the second, leaving the door open. White raced up the court, drove to the basket and was fouled with just 0.6 seconds left, and the senior point guard sank the two foul shots to force the extra session.

But Towson scored the first five points of overtime, and the Panthers were unable to come back again. After Hunter and Markus Crider each hit two free throws, GSU had possession down by just one but could not regain the lead.

Georgia State led 21-12 early before Towson hit three straight three-pointers to tie the game with 8:38 left in the half. The Tigers took a 37-34 lead into the locker room.

The Panthers moved ahead 47-44 on a pair of free throws by R.J. Hunter with 15:23 left, but Hairston answered for Towson with a three-pointer, and the Tigers held their lead until White's tying free throws.

Towson shot 56.4 percent for the game, including 13 three-pointers on 21 tries, while Georgia State managed 42.6 percent from the field and was outrebounded, 37-32.

Senior James Vincent finished with six points, 10 rebounds and six blocked shots, while playing in his 112th game, tying Zavian Smith for the eighth most in school history. The six blocked shots gives him 65 for the season, the third most in a single season in school history. Vincent now has 127 for this career, just one shy of Zavian Smith for the second most in school history.

Manny Atkins had 13 points and nine rebounds and Georgia State allowed a season-low 43 points as the Panthers downed Hofstra, 61-43, Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena.

James Vincent and Devonta White added 11 points each for the Panthers, who improved to 13-14 overall and 8-6 in the CAA, while Hofstra fell to 6-19, 3-9 in the CAA.

Georgia State forced 22 Hofstra turnovers and held the Pride to just 29 percent shooting from the field. The 43 points are the fewest allowed by the Panthers since defeating Tennessee Tech, 74-43, in last year's CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

"I told the guys that there is no such thing as an ugly win," commented head coach Ron Hunter after the game. "Our offense was not producing at the rate that we like, but our defense stepped up and forced 22 turnovers. We played with a lot of effort tonight and that resulted in just giving up 43 points."

"A pair of freshmen, LaRon Smith and David Travers gave us some great minutes off the bench tonight. I makes me really happy to see the direction the program is going when our young players can give us minutes like that."

Vincent went 5-for-5 from the field and also contributed four rebounds and two blocked shots. Freshman David Travers equaled his career best with eight points off the bench.

The Panthers grabbed 14 steals, with three each by Atkins, White, Rashaad Richardson and Markus Crider.

Georgia State trailed early, 10-4, before exploding for 16 straight points to take a 20-10 lead with eight minutes left in the half. Crider started the run with a steal and layup, and the Panthers forced three more turnovers during that stretch. Georgia State harassed Hofstra into a total of 13 turnovers in the first half en route to a 28-19 lead at the intermission.

Vincent opened the second half by scoring GSU's first seven points as the Panthers built a 35-21 lead.

Steve Mejia led Hofstra with his first career double-double, finishing with 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Georgia State scored 31 points off Hofstra's turnovers and outscored the Pride 26-14 in the paint.

Georgia State shot a 53.7 percent from the floor and hit 10 three-pointers en route to a 78-60 victory at George Mason on Saturday afternoon in the Patriot Center. Freshman R.J. Hunter scored 25 and junior Devonta White added 23 for the Panthers, while redshirt-junior Manny Atkins recorded his second double-double of the season.

The win snapped a five-game losing streak to the Patriots and gave GSU its first win at the Patriot Center in its final appearance before moving to the Sun Belt Conference next season. Atkins finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds as the Panthers led by as many as 27 in the second half.

White shot 9-of-14 from the floor and a perfect 3-of-3 from three-point range, while dishing out six assists. Hunter finished 10-of-19 from the floor as Georgia State shot 62.1 percent in the first half, hitting 7-of-11 from three-point range.

Georgia State (14-14, 9-6 CAA) won for the second straight time and eighth time in the last 11 games. George Mason (15-11, 8-6 CAA) lost for an uncharacteristic third straight time at home.

Behind the hot shooting of Sherrod Wright, the Patriots took an early six-point lead, 19-13 with 12:38 to play in the first half. Wright scored 15 points in the opening half, shooting 5-of-7 from the floor and 4-of-5 from three-point range, hitting three of those three's in the first four minutes of the game.

GSU responded with a 25-5 run over the next six minutes to take a 38-24 lead with 6:24 to play in the first half. The Panthers pushed the lead to 18 with five minutes to go as the lead never fell below single digits taking a 51-36 lead into the locker room.

The 51 points scored in the first half were the most for the Panthers in a half this season, topping the 50 points scored in the second half against Old Dominion in Atlanta.

White and Hunter each scored 14 points in the first half, while Atkins and Richardson scored nine a piece.

The Panthers continued to extend the lead in the second half, leading by as many as 27 with 10 minutes to play.

Freshman Markus Crider came off the bench to score seven points and pull down five rebounds in 28 minutes. Crider's effort helped the Panthers rebound Mason 34-27.

On the defensive end, GSU swiped eight steals and forced the Patriots in 13 turnovers which led to 16 Panther points.

Wright finished with 19 points for George Mason, while Marko Gujanovic came off the bench to score 10, the only other Patriot in double-figures.

Georgia State freshman R.J. Hunter led the Panthers with 15 points, while redshirt-junior Manny Atkins just missed another double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds.

All five William & Mary starters scored in double figures, led by junior Brandon Britt's 20 points. Matt Rum added 16 points, with Tim Rusthoven scoring 11 and Kyle Gaillard and Marcus Thornton each scoring 10.

Georgia State (14-15, 9-7 CAA) had its two-game winning streak snapped, while William & Mary (12-14, 6-9 CAA) won its third straight and snapped a three-game losing streak to the Panthers.

William & Mary started the game red-hot, taking a 31-16 lead with 5:49 to play. The Tribe hit seven of its first nine three-pointers and built its lead to as many as 16 with 4:11 to play in the opening half.

The Tribe shot 62.5 percent from the floor in the opening period and made 8-of-10 three-pointers, going into halftime leading 38-27.

Georgia State had its opportunities in the first half, forcing nine William & Mary turnovers, but were outrebounded on the boards, 18-9. The Panthers did a much better job on the glass in the second half, outrebounding the Tribe 22-10 to hold a plus-two rebounding margin for the game.

William & Mary opened the second half equally hot, hitting its first three three-pointers to go ahead 47-29 with 18:40 to play before Georgia State responded.

The Panthers used a 15-1 run to cut the deficit to just four, 48-44 with 14:40 to play in the game as Hunter hit a pair of three-pointers and junior Devonta White made a pair of jumpers.

White finished the game with nine points, snapping a streak of 23-straight games scoring in double figures. The junior is now just 39 points shy of becoming the 17th Panther to score 1,000 points in a career.

After the Panthers run, the Tribe pushed the lead back to 18, 70-52 with 5:11 to play in the game. Georgia State got no closer than 12 during the remainder of the game.

Senior James Vincent played in his 115th career game, moving into a tie for sixth with Donnie Davis on the Panthers all-time list.
