LEADING OFF: Playing five home games in six days, the Georgia State baseball team hosts Alabama A&M Thursday at 4 p.m., followed by a three-game weekend series against Grambling with contests scheduled for 4 p.m. Friday and 1 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The Panthers (2-2) opened the season by taking two of three from Butler last weekend before falling at No. 20 Georgia Tech on Tuesday.

Alabama A&M is 1-4 after losing at Samford Tuesday, 12-1. Grambling is off to an 0-4 start but suffered a close loss at Mississippi State, 2-0, Tuesday.

Georgia State enters the weekend averaging better than 10 runs per game and hitting .313 as a team, leading the Colonial Athletic Association in both categories.

Freshman outfielder Josh Merrigan of Marietta, Ga., (Walton HS), the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week, is the Panthers' leading hitter at .571 with seven runs batted in, seven runs scored and two stolen bases. Another rookie, third baseman Matt Rose of Melbourne, Fla., is right behind at .500 with four RBI, while freshman catcher Joey Roach is batting .429. Sophomore shortstop Caden Bailey, the Panthers' top returning hitter, is a .412.

Newcomer Chase Raffield (Cochran, Ga.), the junior outfielder who transferred from Gordon College, leads GSU with eight RBI.

Senior Nick Squeglia (0-0), a right-hander from Lawrenceville, Ga. (Collins Hill HS), will make his second start of the season against Alabama A&M. Also expected to start games this weekend are sophomore righty Jerry Stuckey (0-0), freshman left-hander Garrett Ford (1-0) and junior right-hander Aidan McLaughlin (0-1).

Georgia State and Alabama A&M previously met in 2008, when the Panthers swept a doubleheader, 12-2 and 19-3 in a pair of games each shortened to five innings. The Panthers will be facing Grambling for the first time.

After this weekend's four-game stretch, the Panthers will conclude their homestand by hosting Georgia next Tuesday, Feb. 26, at 4 p.m. the GSU Baseball Complex.

MERRIGAN EARNS CAA HONOR: Georgia State freshman Josh Merrigan was named Colonial Athletic Association Baseball Rookie of the Week on Feb. 19 for his play during the opening weekend.

The outfielder from Marietta, Ga., and Walton High School began his GSU career by hitting .636 (7-for-11) as the Panthers took two of three games from Butler. He drove in six runs and scored six more and also walked twice and went two-for-two on stolen bases. The left-handed hitter accomplished this while facing left-handed starting pitchers for the Bulldogs each game.

He added an RBI triple at Georgia Tech and is now hitting .571 with seven RBI and seven runs scored through four games. He leads the CAA in runs scored, total bases and triples while ranking among the conference leaders in batting average, on-base percentage, hits and RBI.

OTHER FRESHMEN IMPRESSIVE, TOO: CAA Rookie of the Week Josh Merrigan is one of several GSU freshmen who have already made an impact for the Panthers.

Third baseman Matt Rose, a 24th-round pick by Toronto, is hitting .500 with four RBI, including two hits at Georgia Tech. He leads the CAA in hits.

Catcher Joey Roach started two of the first four games and homered at Georgia Tech.

Another freshman, pitcher Garrett Ford, turned in the Panthers' best start of the opening weekend. The southpaw allowed just four hits and one earned run in six innings to earn the victory in game two against Butler.

In all, 10 freshmen have seen action for Georgia State so far, including four position players who have started games, one pinch hitter, one starting pitcher, and four relievers.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: Georgia State opened the season by scoring 37 runs in three games against Butler. The Panthers batted .351 as a team.

After four games, Georgia State leads the CAA in batting average (.313) and runs (10.5 per game).

MAKE YOUR MOVE: The 2013 campaign marks Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association as the Panthers officially join the Sun Belt Conference in all sports on July 1, 2013.

GSU was a charter member of the Sun Belt Conference in 1976 and competed in the league in baseball from 1979-82. In 1984, the Panther baseball program began competing in the Trans America Athletic Conference (TAAC), which was later renamed the Atlantic Sun Conference. The Panthers then moved to the Colonial Athletic Association for the 2006 season.

FRADY NEARS MILESTONE: Head coach Greg Frady now has 195 victories in his seventh season at the helm of the Georgia State program as he nears the 200-win plateau. He ranks second in career victories by a GSU head coach, trailing only Mike Hurst, who won 293 games in 13-plus seasons. Frady's winning percentage of .559 is the best mark in school history.

Frady has led the Panthers to four winning seasons in six years, highlighted by a school-record 39 victories, conference title and NCAA berth in 2009. Prior to his arrival, the Panther program had achieved just two winning seasons ever and had never won more than 31 games in any year.

TWO PANTHERS PREVIOUSLY DRAFTED: Two current Panthers have previously been drafted by Major League teams. Freshman pitcher-infielder Matt Rose was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 24th round of the 2012 Draft. Junior outfielder

Chris Triplett was selected in the 47th round of the 2010 Draft by the Detroit Tigers.

PEACH STATE PRODUCTS: Relying heavily on the its talent-rich home state, the Georgia State roster features 25 of 32 players from Georgia, 21 of those from the metropolitan Atlanta area.

The remaining seven Panthers hail from Florida (4), North Carolina (2) and Wisconsin.

FRADY COACHES GERMAN NATIONAL TEAM: Along with his duties at Georgia State, Greg Frady serves as the coach of the German National Team. He has won more than 100 games in international competition and was named European Coach of the Year in 2010.

Most recently, Frady guided Germany to a fourth-place finish at the 2012 European Championships and to the finals of the World Baseball Classic Qualifier. That squad featured former Panthers B.J. Roper-Hubbart, Aeden McQueary-Ennis and Eric Suttle.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE: Two members of the 2013 squad are already Georgia State alumni. Outfielder Mark Hogan completed requirements for his bachelor's degree in finance in the spring of 2012 and began work toward a second degree in managerial science. Pitcher Nick Squeglia earned his degree in criminal justice in December 2012.

IT'S ACADEMIC: The Georgia State baseball program achieved a team grade point average of 3.02 for the fall 2012 semester. Sixteen team members earned academic honors, led by senior pitcher Nick Squeglia on the President's List, signifying a semester GPA of 4.0 or higher.

TWO-SPORT STAR: Senior outfielder Mark Hogan will concentrate on baseball this spring after playing three seasons at line-backer for the Georgia State football team. He is the Panthers' career leader in tackles with 157, and he was named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-District first team.

Hogan enrolled at Georgia State in 2009 as the first scholarship player for GSU's startup football program, which played its first season in the fall of 2010.

Last spring, Hogan joined the baseball team, playing the sport for the first time since he was a senior at Lincoln-Sudbury High in Massachusetts in 2008. Still, he hit .319 in 42 games while juggling baseball and spring football practice.

David Mayo, SS-RHP, from Loganville, Ga. He led was named to the Georgia Dugout Club Top 100 list. A teammate of current freshman Garrett Ford, he helped Loganville HS to the Class AAAA state title and has pitched two perfect games in his career.

Ryan Blanton, OF, from Lilburn, Ga., and Parkview HS. The left-handed hitting outfielder helped Parkview to the Class AAAAA state title and a No. 1 national ranking by Baseball America.

Austin Parrish, OF-RHP, from Ringgold, Ga. Another Georgia Dugout Club Top 100 player who led Ringgold HS to region title.

Alex Roberts, RHP from Dalton, Ga. Last season at Middle Georgia College, he had 14 starts with four complete games and a 3.13 ERA.
