LEADING OFF: Winners of 10 of their last 12 games while displaying one of the nation's most prolific offenses, the Georgia State baseball team faces a mid-week home-and-home with long-time in-state rival Mercer. Games are scheduled for Tuesday at the GSU Baseball Complex and then Wednesday at Claude Smith Field in Macon, with a 6 p.m. first pitch both days.

Live radio coverage is available on WRAS-FM 88.5 for both games.

The Panthers have used their hot bats to post a 14-6 record, including 5-1 in the CAA after a three-game sweep of Old Dominion. Mercer took two out of three from Kennesaw State to improve to 16-5 on the season.

After playing 16 of their first 20 games at home, Georgia State now faces eight of the next 10 games on the road.

"We are about to enter a stretch over the next 10 games that will be really challenging for our team, starting with these Mercer games," said GSU head coach Greg Frady.

"We have a lot of respect for Mercer. They have a great coaching staff and a great program. It makes for some really good in-state battles."

Georgia State LEADS THE NATION in runs scored (193) while ranking second in batting average at .349.

Junior shortstop Chad Prain leads the Panthers and ranks fourth nationally with a .474 average, and he stands second in the CAA with 24 runs batted in.

"Chad Prain is a very aggressive gamer who shows up every day with a great attitude and tremendous enthusiasm," said Frady. "One of the reasons we wanted to get him on the field is that he brings so much positive energy. He's a good hitter, he's a fast base-runner, and he plays really hard. He certainly has stepped up."

Freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan, who earned his second CAA Rookie of the Week award this week, continues to impress with a .410 batting average, 20 RBI, 26 runs scored and seven stolen bases. He leads the conference in runs.

Other top hitters for the Panthers include sophomore infielder Caden Bailey, who is batting .382 but saw his hitting streak halted at 19 games, and senior catcher Scott Sarratt at .395. Junior Chris Triplett (.339) and Chase Raffield (.333) share the team lead with three homers each.

Senior right-hander Nick Squeglia will take the mound for the Panthers Tuesday, while Wednesday's starter is to be announced. Squeglia owns a 2-0 record this season and ranks ninth in GSU history with 13 career victories.

The GSU bullpen has been key during the current hot streak, especially junior left-hander Ben Burns, who leads the team with four victories, all in relief, and sophomore righty Connor Stanley, who is 2-0 with two saves and a 2.53 ERA.

PANTHERS ON THE OFFENSIVE: Georgia State has featured one of the nation's most productive offenses through the first month of the season with a .349 batting average and 9.7 runs per game. The Panthers LEAD THE NATION in run scored (193) and rank second in average.

Ten of the Panthers' 10 regulars are hitting .320 or higher, including two over .400 in junior shortstop Chad Prain (.474), who is fourth in the nation, and freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan (.410). Prain leads the CAA in average and is second with RBI, while Merrigan tops the league with 26 runs scored.

This year's GSU offense could rival the Panthers' 2010 edition that led the nation in runs scored with 10.5 per game and ranked third with a .355 batting average.

PRAIN SPARKS OFFENSE: Junior short-stop Chad Prain is enjoying one of the top offensive seasons in the nation. The Valdosta, Ga., native ranks **FOURTH IN THE NCAA** with a .474 batting average. He leads the Panthers, ranks second in the CAA and among the Top 25 nationally with 24 RBI, despite batting in the leadoff or number two spot.

WALK-OFF HEROICS: Georgia State trailed Old Dominion, 10-1, in the sixth inning before rallying for a 12-10 victory (Mar. 16), capped by a walk-off homer by Chase Raffield. The Panthers scored two in the sixth, two in the seventh and three in the eighth to pull within 10-8. In the ninth, Nic Wilson hit a solo homer with one out to make the score 10-9. With two outs, Greg Bowder drew a walk, moved to second on a passed ball and then scored the tying run on Garitt Church's infield single and an ensuing wild throw. With the game tied, Raffield belted his two-run, walk-off home run.

Ironically, this dramatic comeback came one year to the day after the Panthers scored 11 runs in the bottom of the ninth inning - 10 of them with two outs - to turn a 10-run deficit into a 13-12 victory over Northeastern on March 16, 2012.

Raffield's blast was Georgia State's second walk-off homer in three games as Caden Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning with a solo homer to break a 7-7 tie and lift the Panthers past George Mason, 8-7, on Mar. 10.

THE SERIES WITH MERCER: Mercer is by far the most frequent opponent in Georgia State history as the two schools have met more than 100 times since 1970. Mercer leads the all-time series, 62-41.

Georgia State and Mercer played as conference foes in the Trans America Athletic Conference / Atlantic Sun Conference from 1984-86 and from 1993 through 2005.

Last season, Mercer swept a pair of games, winning 11-0 in Macon and 12-5 in Atlanta. The Bears have won three in a row over GSU, whose last win in the series was a 14-5 decision at Mercer in 2011.

MERRIGAN EARNS SECOND CAA

ROOKIE AWARD: Georgia State freshman Josh Merrigan was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week on March 18 for the second time this season.

The center fielder from Marietta, Ga., and Walton High School batted .364 with one home run and three RBI in a three-game sweep of Old Dominion.

In Friday's series open, Merrigan belted his first homer of the season to tie the game at 7-7 in the bottom of the fourth inning. Two innings later, after GSU scored to move ahead 8-7, he delivered an RBI-single to give the Panthers a two-run lead, and Georgia State went on to win 13-8.

On Saturday, Merrigan and the Panthers rallied from a 10-1 deficit in the sixth inning to win 12-10 on Chase Raffield's walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth. Merrigan led off the sixth with a walk and then scored on Nic

Wilson's home run to begin the comeback. In Sunday's series finale, Merrigan drove in GSU's first run with a RBI-double, helping the Panthers to the 7-4 victory.

Merrigan earned his first CAA Rookie honor of Feb. 18 after began his GSU career by hitting .636 (7-for-11) in the opening series against Butler. He drove in six runs and scored six more and also walked twice and went two-for-two on stolen bases. The left-handed hitter accomplished this while facing left-handed starting pitchers for the Bulldogs each game.

For the season, Merrigan is batting .410 with 20 RBI, and he leads the CAA with 26 runs scored. He is the only Panther to start every game this season.

STANLEY STEAMS FROM BULLPEN:

Sophomore right-hander Connor Stanley (Oviedo, Fla.) came out of the bullpen to finish all three games in Georgia State's sweep of Old Dominion (Mar. 15-17).

On Friday, he pitched a perfect ninth inning in the Panthers' 13-8 victory. On Saturday, he got the final two outs in the top of the ninth inning against and earned the victory as GSU won 12-10 on Chase Raffield's walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth. Stanley then added a save Sunday, when he recorded the final out after entering the game with two outs in the ninth, a runner at second, two runs in and GSU leading 7-4. Actually finished all three games of the ODU sweep.

Stanley is 2-0 on the season with two saves and a 2.53 ERA.

WALK-OFF FOR BAILEY PUNCTUATES HITTING STREAK:

Sophomore infielder Caden Bailey's first career home run was a memorable one. With GSU and George Mason tied at 7-7, Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning and belted the 1-0 pitch over the left field fence for the series-clinching, walk-off victory.

Earlier in the game, Bailey delivered a two-run single to help the Panthers rally from a 6-0 deficit. That hit also extended his hitting streak to 19 games, dating back to the final three games of 2012. One game later, his streak was snapped at 19, which goes down as the fourth-longest in school history. The GSU record for longest hitting streak is 22 games by current volunteer coach Bradley Logan in 2008. Two Panthers had 21-game streaks in 2004 in Justin Newman and Tim Burgess.

FORD NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Georgia State's freshman pitcher Garrett Ford was named Colonial Athletic Association Baseball Rookie of the Week on March 18 after a standout performance in defeating George Mason (3-9-13) in game two of the CAA series.

The rookie left-hander from Loganville, Ga., took a shutout into the ninth inning to lead the Panthers to a 12-3 victory.

Over the first eight innings, Ford allowed no runs on seven hits with two walks and one strikeout. With Georgia State leading 12-0 and the bullpen depleted after Friday's 14-13 game, he started the ninth inning and allowed

three runs before giving way to the bullpen. His final line included 8.1 innings, three runs, nine hits, three walks and one strikeout. Ford has been GSU's Saturday starter since the season began. Against Boston College, he carried a shutout into the seventh inning but was the tough luck loser in a 2-0 defeat. For the season, he is 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA.

SARRATT TABBED TO BENCH AWARD

WATCH LIST: Georgia State catcher Scott Sarratt was named to the initial watch list for the 2013 Johnny Bench Award presented BaseballSaving.com, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced Mar. 11. Sarratt, a senior from Statesboro, Ga., is one of 48 catchers named to the watch for the award given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher.

The Panthers' backstop is enjoying an outstanding season, batting .395 with one home run and 13 runs batted in while providing excellent defense and leadership for Georgia State's young pitching staff.

SARRATT NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Senior catcher Scott Sarratt was named CAA Player of the Week on March 4 after the senior backstop batted .500 for the week to lead the Panthers to three wins in four games against SEC and ACC foes.

In GSU's 10-7 victory over Georgia, Sarratt doubled to lead off the second inning and then came around to score the Panthers' first run. In the Panthers' decisive four-run rally in the fifth inning, Sarratt delivered an RBI-single to bring in the first run of the inning and then scored on Chris Triplett's go-ahead home run.

On Friday, the Statesboro, Ga., native drove in two runs in Georgia State's 5-4, come-from-behind victory over Boston College. In the sixth inning, his RBI single pulled GSU within 4-2, and then in the seventh, he doubled off the wall to bring home the go-ahead run. In Sunday's series clinching win over BC, he contributed a two-out, two-run single that put GSU ahead 5-2 in game the Panthers would eventually win, 7-6.

FRADY REACHES 200-WIN MILESTONE:

Georgia State's 7-6 win over Boston College on March 3 was the 200th victory at Georgia State for head coach Greg Frady, now in his seventh season at the helm. He ranks second in career victories by a GSU head coach with 207, trailing only Mike Hurst, who won 293 games in 13-plus seasons. Frady's winning percentage of .567 is the best mark in school history.

Frady has led the Panthers to four winning seasons in six years, highlighted by a school-record 39 victories, conference title and NCAA berth in 2009. Prior to his arrival, the Panther program had achieved just two winning seasons ever and had never won more than 31 games in any year.

WHAT A WEEK: Georgia State enjoyed one of the more memorable weeks in school history by winning three out of four games

against SEC and ACC foes in a six-day span from Feb. 26 through Mar. 3. The Panthers began the week with a 10-7 win over Georgia, for the program's first victory over the Bulldogs since 2001. The GSU took two out of three from Boston College at Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg, Fla. The Panthers earned one-run victories over Boston College on Friday (5-4) and Sunday (7-6). The Eagles won the middle game, 2-0.

THE BURNS NOTICE: Left-hander Ben Burns, a junior college transfer from Daytona State, has quickly become a bullpen stalwart for the Panthers. Burns is tied for the CAA lead with four victories, all coming in relief. Most recently, he picked up his fourth victory in the Friday night win over Old Dominion (3-15-13). He came on in the fourth inning with the Panthers trailing 7-5. After immediately picking off a runner at second base he pitched 4-2/3 innings in which he gave up just one run on four hits, allowing the Panthers to rally for a 13-8 victory.

Burns allowed one run and two hits in 3-2/3 innings for a win over UNC Asheville (3-5-13). In the Friday night win over Boston College (3-1-13), he came on in the third inning and finished the game, limiting the Eagles to one run and three hits while striking out five to earn the victory. He also earned the win in relief on Opening Day against Butler.

ROUND-TRIPPERS FOR TRIPLETT: Outfielder Chris Triplett leads the Panthers with three home runs on the season, including two last week that propelled the Panthers to huge wins over Georgia and Boston College. The junior from Fayetteville, Ga. (Sandy Creek HS) belted a two-run homer in the fifth inning against Georgia that put the Panthers ahead 8-7 en route to the 10-7 win.

Three games later against Boston College, he hit another two-run blast in the third inning to give GSU a 3-2 lead in a game the Panthers eventually won, 7-6.

PANTHERS RALLY FOR 10-7 WIN OVER GEORGIA: Chris Triplett's two-run home run in the fifth inning put Georgia State ahead and sent the Panthers to a 10-7 victory over Georgia Tuesday at the GSU Baseball Complex for GSU's first win over the Bulldogs since 2001. Georgia State rallied from deficits of 3-0, 4-1 and 7-4 to snap a 12-game losing streak to the Bulldogs. After Triplett's blast put the Panthers ahead, 8-7, senior Greg Bowder delivered a two-run, pinch-hit single for key insurance runs, and relievers Jerry Stuckey and Matt Rose shut down the Bulldogs over the final five innings.

ROSE TAKES ON DUAL ROLE: Freshman Matt Rose has earned a spot in the everyday lineup, starting either at third base or first base. He is batting .359 with 14 RBI. Rose is also an outstanding pitcher who was drafted in the 24th round by the Toronto Blue Jays. The 6-3 right-hander made his first appearance on the mound with a score-

less inning in a combined shutout against Alabama A&M. Then he threw three scoreless innings against Georgia on Feb. 26, allowing just one hit and striking out two to earn the save in GSU's 10-7 win over the Bulldogs.

SQUEGLIA CLIMBS GSU VICTORIES

LIST: After missing the 2012 season with an arm injury, senior pitcher Nick Squeglia has returned to the GSU rotation. The right-hander from Lawrenceville, Ga., earned his first victory in nearly two year against Alabama A&M, when he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning. Squeglia finished with one hit allowed and a career-high eight strikeouts in six scoreless innings.

Squeglia earned his second win of the season against UNC Asheville for the 13th victory of his career to move into a tie for ninth place in GSU history.

MAKE YOUR MOVE:

The 2013 campaign marks Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association as the Panthers officially join the Sun Belt Conference in all sports on July 1, 2013.

GSU was a charter member of the Sun Belt Conference in 1976 and competed in the league in baseball from 1979-82. In 1984, Panther baseball began competing in the Trans America Athletic Conference (TAAC), later renamed the Atlantic Sun Conference. The Panthers then moved to the Colonial Athletic Association for the 2006 season.

TWO PANTHERS PREVIOUSLY

DRAFTED: Two current Panthers have previously been drafted by Major League teams. Freshman pitcher-infielder Matt Rose was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 24th round of the 2012 Draft. Junior outfielder Chris Triplett was selected in the 47th round of the 2010 Draft by the Detroit Tigers.

PEACH STATE PRODUCTS:

Relying heavily on the its talent-rich home state, the Georgia State roster features 25 of 32 players from Georgia, 21 of those from the metropolitan Atlanta area.

The remaining seven Panthers hail from Florida (4), North Carolina (2) and Wisconsin.

FRADY COACHES GERMAN

NATIONAL TEAM: Along with his duties at Georgia State, Greg Frady serves as the coach of the German National Team. He has won

more than 100 games in international competition and was named European Coach of the Year in 2010.

Most recently, Frady guided Germany to a fourth-place finish at the 2012 European Championships and to the finals of the World Baseball Classic Qualifier. That squad featured former Panthers B.J. Roper-Hubbert, Aeden McQueary-Ennis and Eric Suttle.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE:

Two members of the 2013 squad are already Georgia State alumni. Outfielder Mark Hogan completed requirements for his bachelor's degree in finance in the spring of 2012 and began work toward a second degree in managerial science. Pitcher Nick Squeglia earned his degree in criminal justice in December 2012.

IT'S ACADEMIC:

The Georgia State baseball program achieved a team grade point average of 3.02 for the fall 2012 semester. Sixteen team members earned academic honors, led by senior pitcher Nick Squeglia on the President's List, signifying a semester GPA of 4.0 or higher.

TWO-SPORT STAR:

Senior outfielder Mark Hogan will concentrate on baseball this spring after playing three seasons at line-backer for the Georgia State football team. He is the Panthers' career leader in tackles with 157, and he was named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-District first team.

Hogan enrolled at Georgia State in 2009 as the first scholarship player for GSU's startup football program, which played its first season in the fall of 2010.
